TAR HEEL TIDBITS

- This is the 67th all-time matchup between the programs.
- The programs did not meet in the regular season, with the previous clash in 2022.
- The first showdown between the two schools came in 1967, a 5-1 Carolina victory in 1967.
- Carolina enters the matchup after defeating Syracuse, 3-1, in the semifinals of the 2023 ACC Tournament.
- Quenzi Huerman (First Team), Riley Thomas (Second Team) and Sam Williams (Third Team) collected postseason ACC honors.
- The program welcomes 14 newcomers to the program in 2023, including nine freshmen and five transfers.
- Midfielder Sam Williams was named to the 2023 ACC Preseason Watch List, the conference announced last week.
- Defender Vemund Hole Vik and forward David Bercedo collected United Soccer Coaches Players to Watch honors, the organization announced earlier this month.
- Head Coach Carlos Somoano is in year 13 at the helm in Chapel Hill.
- Assistant Coach Kyle Johnston was added to the staff in July, following previous stops at the College of Charleston and his alma mater, Sewanee.

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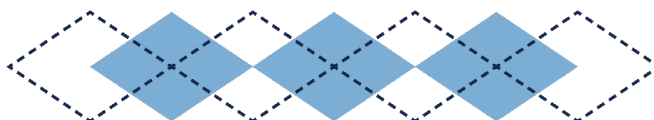

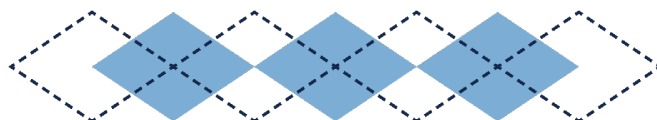

- On Wednesday, Carolina won the program's 800th contest.
- The Tar Heels became the 8th program in NCAA DI history to reach the 800 win mark.
- The Tar Heels joined Virginia, as the only Atlantic Coast Conference programs to achieve the feat.
- The Carolina men's and women's programs have combined for 1,632 wins, the most in DI history.

Postseason Honors

- On Wednesday, a trio of Tar Heels collected postseason ACC Honors
- Quenzi Huerman (First Team), Riley Thomas (Second Team) and Sam Williams (Third Team) were the Tar Heel representation in the honors.

Getting Defensive

- Entering Sunday, the Tar Heels have yet to concede more than one goal in a game this season, for the second time in program history.
- In 2012, the Tar Heels gave up just seven goals on the campaign.
- Carolina ranks fourth in the nation

with a goals against average of 0.61 goals per game.

- Goalkeeper Andrew Cordes ranks second in the country in save percentage (0.889) and third in goals against average (0.47).

New Faces in Chapel Hill

- The program welcomes 14 new student-athletes this fall.
- The newcomers include five transfers and nine freshmen.
- Transfers Vemund Hole Vik (Elon), Quenzi Huerman (Seton Hall), Martin Vician (Harvard), David Bercedo (Quinnipiac), and Collin Travasos (Cal) join Carolina after previous seasons at other institutions.
- The transfer group bring experience to the Tar Heels, with 240 career appearances.

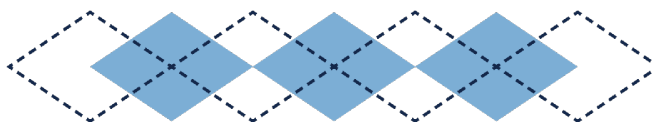

Williams Collects Preseason ACC Honors

- Midfielder Sam Williams was named to the 2023 ACC Preseason Watch List, the league announced on August 16.
- The sophomore builds on a resume which includes an ACC All-Freshman Team nod a season ago.
- Last season, Williams appeared in 17 contests, earning the start 14 times.
- The Tenafly, N.J. native finished fourth on the Tar Heels with two goals and six points, while logging 1,262 minutes of action.
- Last season, Williams played the full 90 minutes on four occasions.
 - In January, Williams was called up to the U19 Men's National Team training camp roster, being just one of two college players to earn the selection.



Bercedo, Hole Vik Land On Watch Lists

- Forward David Bercedo and defender Vemund Hole Vik were named to the United Soccer Coaches Players To Watch, announced in August.
- Bercedo, one of six from the ACC on the forward list, enters his first season in Chapel Hill after spending the previous three seasons at Quinnipiac and his freshman campaign at Ohio Valley.
- Last season, Bercedo led Quinnipiac with 14 goals, as his 35 points on the season was the fourth-most in the nation.
- In 60 career collegiate games, Bercedo has scored 28 goals and dished out 15 assists.
- Hole Vik arrives in Chapel Hill after spending the last four seasons at Elon.
- The 2022 CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Hole Vik was an All-Atlantic Region First Team Choice, and named a Scholar All-America for efforts in the classroom.

Trio Named Top-100

- The trio of David Bercedo, Quenzi Huerman, and Vemund Hole Vik were named to the Top Drawer Soccer Preseason Top-100 list, the publication released on August 23.

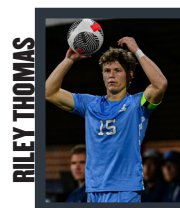
Johnston Joins Coaching Staff

- On July 13, head coach Carlos Somoano announced the addition of Kyle Johnston to his coaching staff.
- Johnston arrived in Chapel Hill after spending the past three seasons as an assistant coach and director of goalkeeping at the College of Charleston.
- Prior to Charleston, Johnston spent time as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Sewanee.
- A 2015-18 standout at Sewanee, Johnston collected United Soccer Coaches All-South Atlantic Region honors as a senior.
- Following his collegiate career, Johnston spent time playing in the USL with the Carolina Dynamo and Houston FC.

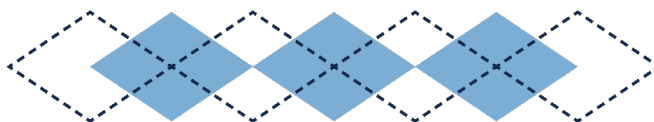

Pro Heels

North Carolina has produced 60 professional signees since the inaugural MLS Draft in 1996, including 20 first round picks. Head coach Carlos Somoano has guided 33 players – which includes 13 first round selections – to the professional rankings since arriving in Chapel Hill in 2011. The Tar Heels have had at least one player selected in the SuperDraft each season since 2005.

Most recently, goalkeeper Alec Smir was drafted in the third round of the 2022 MLS SuperDraft with the 62nd overall pick by FC Dallas and forward Tega Ikoba signed a homegrown contract with the Portland Timbers. Ikoba became the seventh Tar Heel to sign a homegrown contract. Smir was invited to the MLS AllStar Skills Challenge in August and won the Goalie Wars.

Including Ikoba (Portland), eight former Tar Heel standouts are currently on MLS rosters in 2022: Jalil Anibaba (Columbus), Sebastian Berhalter (Vancouver), Matt Hedges (Dallas), Dax McCarty (Nashville), John Nelson (Cincinnati), Mauricio Pineda (Chicago) and Jack Skahan (San Jose).

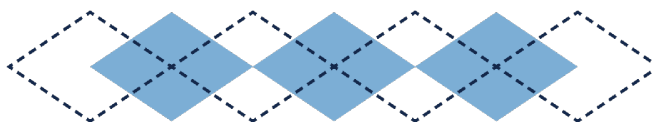
Ten UNC standouts have been on the U.S. National Team: Donald Cogsville (1988), Gregg Berhalter (1994-2007), Eddie Pope (1996-2006), Kerry Zavagnin (2000-06), Eddie Robinson (2008), Logan Pause (2009, 2011), Zach Loyd (2011-12), Matt Hedges (2015-17), Eric Lichaj (2016-17) and Dax McCarty (2016-17).

Berhalter, who played for UNC from 1991-93, was a member of two World Cup rosters and is now the head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team. He will lead the U.S. at the 2022 FIFA World Cup in Qatar beginning in

November, the team's first World Cup berth since 2014. Berhalter's squad qualified for the World Cup after a 2-0 loss to Costa Rica on the final match-day of Concacaf World Cup qualifying in March. The result led the U.S. to

finish third in the octagonal standings, tied with Costa Rica on 25 points but well ahead in goal differential. Thus, the U.S. earned one of Concacaf's three automatic berths along with Canada and Mexico.

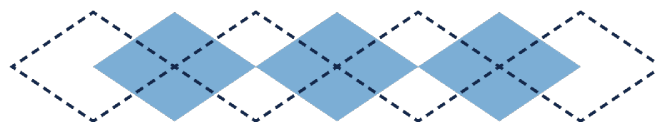

NIL activities may include autographs, promoting brands on social media, third-party media endorsements, running camps or clinics, providing private lessons, personal appearances and more. Since the beginning, Carolina has had a best-in-class NIL program available to all 28 sports and more than 800 student-athletes.

laUNCH is Carolina's comprehensive NIL program designed specifically to meet the needs of all Tar Heel student-athletes. The program provides student-athletes industry leading resources and expert education, such as digital branding, financial planning, effective networking and more, to help them enhance their personal brand and maximize new NIL opportunities and value. laUNCH is part of the Carolina Leadership Academy and integrates the Department of Athletics' values of education, opportunities, choices and commercial activity.

UNC and INFLCR – the industry-best solution to distribute videos, graphics, and real-time content directly to student-athletes to help them build brand value and expand their exposure – recently teamed up to create the Carolina NIL Exchange, an online marketplace that will connect Tar Heel student-athletes with local, national and global businesses interested in partnering on NIL opportunities.

Carlos Somoano, who ranks sixth in the nation and first in the ACC in winning in percentage among active Division I head coaches, enters his 13th year at the helm of the North Carolina men's soccer program.

Somoano reached the summit of collegiate soccer when he led UNC to the 2011 national title, becoming just the second rookie head coach in NCAA history to win a national championship. He returned to the College Cup with his Tar Heel squad in 2016, 2017 and 2020.

Somoano was named the 2011 National Coach of the Year by Soccer America as the Tar Heels posted a 21-2-3 mark en route to the national title. UNC became only the second team in Atlantic Coast Conference history to claim the treble in a single year by winning the ACC regular season title, the ACC Championship crown and the national championship in 2011.

In addition to his national coach of the year honors, ACC coaches also pegged Somoano the top head man in the league in 2011. Somoano joined former Carolina men's coach and current Carolina women's coach, Anson Dorrance, as the second coach to be named the ACC Coach of the Year in their first year at the helm.

In 2020, he led Carolina on an improbable run to its fourth College

Cup under his tutelage. Entering the NCAA Tournament unseeded, UNC advanced past Charlotte on penalty kicks in the first round, then upset fourth-seeded Stanford and fifth-seeded Wake Forest to reach the national semifinal. Carolina lost, 1-0, in the semis to eventual NCAA champion Marshall and finished the year with a 9-5-4 record.

Somoano has guided 10 of his 11 squads to NCAA postseason play and six of those teams have reached at least the NCAA quarterfinals. He owns an impressive 148-49-32 career record, good enough for a program-best .716 winning percentage.

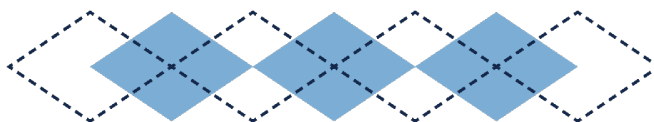
Somoano has also played a key part in developing Tar Heels into the professional ranks. Since his arrival in Chapel Hill in 2003, 40 former players have been selected in the MLS SuperDraft. Included in that group are 15 first-round draftees: David Stokes, Dax McCarty, Michael Harrington, Zach Loyd, Jalil Anibaba, Eddie Abadio, Matt Hedges, Enzo Martinez, Mikey Lopez, Jonathan Campbell, Omar Holness, Jordan McCrary, Colton Storm, John Nelson and most recently Jeremy Kelly in 2020.

Four former Tar Heels who played under Somoano have represented the United States Men's National Team, as Hedges, Loyd, McCarty and Logan Pause have all been called upon to represent their country.

Before his success as UNC's head coach, Somoano helped recruit six top-10 recruiting classes and was part of one of the most successful periods in school history as an assistant coach from 2002-10. The Tar Heels advanced to three consecutive NCAA College Cups, including the 2008 National Championship game, and amassed a 118-52-27 record with Somoano on staff. College Soccer News named him a top 20 assistant coach six times in his career as well as the NSCAA South Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2010.

A native of Seabrook, Texas, Somoano was a standout midfielder at Eckerd College from 1987-90 and was a two-time team captain. He helped pilot the team that climbed as high as No. 16 in the country and was an All-Sunshine State Conference selection and an NSCAA All-South Region performer. He was inducted into the Eckerd College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013 and the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2018.

Somoano earned his bachelor's in biology with a concentration in pre-medicine from Eckerd in 1992 and received his master's in sport management from Richmond in 2000. He is married to the former Martina Nedelkova and the couple has two daughters and a son: Sofia, born May 6, 2006; Gabriela, born Dec. 24, 2007; and Alexander, born April 24, 2011.

GRANT PORTER ASST. COACH



Grant Porter begins his 13th year as UNC's assistant coach in 2023. A key figure in both national titles in school history, the 2004 UNC graduate helped lead the Tar Heels to their first national championship as a player in 2001 and again as a coach in 2011.

His 15 combined years with the UNC program as both a player and a coach is stellar. Along with the two national titles, he has seen 14 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. He has also been a member of six ACC regular season championship programs and two ACC title teams.

With Porter on staff, UNC has routinely brought in top-10 recruiting classes in recent years: No. 3 in 2012, No. 4 in 2013, No. 7 in 2015, No. 1 in 2016, No. 2 in 2017 and No. 1 in 2019. He played alongside 16 MLS draft picks as a player and has helped guide 27 players into professional soccer since becoming an assistant coach in 2011.

A four-year starter during his playing time in Chapel Hill from 2000-03, Porter made the game-winning assist in the 2001 national championship game and was awarded the UNC Coaches Award. A team captain as a senior, helped the Tar Heels win the 2000 ACC title and led North Carolina to back-to-back 21-win seasons in 2000 and 2001.

MICHAEL HARRINGTON ASST. COACH



Former Tar Heel and two-time All-ACC defender Michael Harrington enters his fifth season on the sidelines at his alma mater in 2023.

The No. 3 overall pick in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft by Kansas City, he enjoyed a 12-year professional career before retiring in 2018. He was selected as an alternate for the 2008 Beijing Olympics and participated in the full National Team Training Camp in January 2014 as the U.S. prepared for the 2014 World Cup in Brazil.

During his playing career at UNC from 2003-06, Harrington started in 81 of the 82 matches in which he played. He helped lead the Tar Heels to the postseason all four years, including a trip to the NCAA quarterfinals during his junior season in 2005.

A native of Greenville, N.C., he was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team in 2003 and the All-ACC First Team in 2006. Harrington was tabbed to the All-ACC Second Team in 2005 in addition to earning NSCAA/adidas All-South Region honors.

Before his junior year, he played for the U.S. U20 National Team at the FIFA World Youth Championship in Holland. Prior to enrolling at UNC, he was a member of the U.S. U14, U16 and U17 National Teams.

KYLE JOHNSTON ASST. COACH



Kyle Johnston enters his first season as an assistant coach for North Carolina men's soccer in 2023.

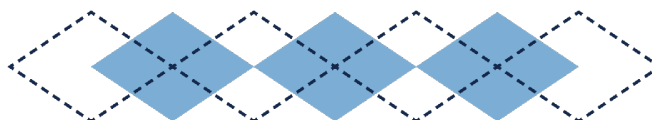
Johnston arrives in Chapel Hill following a three-year stint at the College of Charleston where he served as an assistant coach and director of goalkeeping. In 2021, he guided the Cougars' starting goalkeeper to All-Colonial Athletic Association honors and two CAA Defensive Player of the Week awards.

Prior to his time in Charleston, Johnston worked at Sewanee: University of the South – his alma mater – in the same capacity. The Tigers experienced their best season in program history with Johnston on staff. He was part of the Southern Athletic Association Coaching Staff of the Year and coached the team's goalkeeper to all-conference praise.

Johnston, who had a standout playing career of his own at Sewanee from 2015-18, garnered United Soccer Coaches Association All-South Atlantic Region Third Team accolades as a senior. The two-time team captain was tabbed an all-conference performer each season.

Following his collegiate career, Johnston played in the USL for Carolina Dynamo and Houston FC.

Johnston earned his bachelor's degree in international and global studies from Sewanee in 2019. Additionally, he holds United Soccer Goalkeeping Level I and II diplomas, a U.S. Soccer D license and an ISSPF professional certificate in goalkeeping coaching science.
