FIRST AND TEN

- Carolina is in its 135th season of football (138th year) in 2025.
- Entering the matchup with Virginia, the Tar Heels hold an all-time record of 753-580-54.
- The Tar Heels will have a noon kickoff for the second consecutive home game when they host Virginia Saturday.
- Saturday's game will air live on ACC Network with Wes Durham (PxP), Steve Addazio (Analyst) and Dana Boyle (Sideline) on the call.
- On December 11, 2024, Carolina announced the hiring of eight-time Super Bowl champion Bill Belichick as the program's new football coach.
- Belichick became the 40th coach in program history, the 12th to lead the program since joining the Atlantic Coast Conference in 1953.
- Belichick's ties to UNC date back to his father, Steve, who was an assistant coach for the Tar Heels from 1953-55.
- With the coaching transition, the 2025 Carolina Football coaching staff features more than 240 years of combined NFL experience.
- At the start of 2025, the Tar Heel roster featured 38 returners and 70 newcomers, including 40 transfers and 30 true freshmen.
- North Carolina leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally in fewest penalties with only 29 this season, two fewer than the next closest conference opponent.

A WIN OVER VIRGINIA WOULD

- Be Carolina's 754th all-time victory in program history.
- Give Belichick his third win at the collegiate level, his second win at home and first Atlantic Coast Conference victory.
- Give UNC its first ranked win since 2023 when the Tar Heels defeated No. 25 Miami. 41-31. on Oct. 14. 2023.
- Be Carolina's first victory against a top-20 opponent since a 58-55 win versus Wake Forest on Nov. 6, 2021.
- Give Carolina its 67th victory against the Cavaliers in the series.
- Be the Tar Heels' 34th win over Virginia at home in program history and 39th overall win against the Cavs in ACC play.

Omarion Hampton and J.J. Jones each scored twice and North Carolina's defense played its best game of the season as the Tar Heels smothered Virginia, 41-14, at Scott Stadium.

Carolina bullied its way to a season-high six sacks in the first half alone, limiting the Cavaliers to just 77 offensive yards, (including only four on the ground) in a dominant opening 30 minutes. The Tar Heels outscored UVA, 17-3, in the second quarter.

In the game, UNC posted 10 sacks, reaching double-digits for the first time since a 2000 game against Wake Forest. Virginia mustered just seven rushing yards overall.

The Tar Heels scored two touchdowns in the final 1:32 of the first half to blow open a close game and take control. Carolina led by as many as 32 points in the fourth quarter at 38-6.

Jones caught five passes for 129 yards and two TDs, averaging 25.8 yards per grab in the first multi-TD catch performance of his career. Tar Heel quarterback Jacolby Criswell completed 19 of 30 passes for 293 yards (second-most in his career) and two touchdowns.

Hampton ran for 105 yards and two scores on 26 carries. He has rushed for over 100 yards in seven of his first eight games this season and 16 times overall. He's the only Tar Heel to rush for 100+ yards in seven or more games in multiple seasons.

Virginia quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed 16 of 28 passes for only 156 yards as Carolina outgained the Cavaliers, 428-288.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va.- Mitch Trubisky threw a 16-yard touchdown pass on his only play of the game, giving North Carolina its first lead with 4:05 remaining, and the Tar Heels stunned Virginia 28-27 on Saturday.

Trubisky, who had been sharing the job with Marquise Williams until the last two games, was called into action when Williams was sacked and his helmet came off, setting up a third-and-15 from the 16.

Trubisky hit a wide open T.J. Thorpe to give North Carolina the lead.

Until the closing minutes, Virginia had mostly kept the red-hot Williams and Tar Heels at bay, save for three quick drives in the first half, all ending in big plays. Williams came in averaging 449 yards of offense in his last two games, but finished with 308 as the Cavaliers outgained North Carolina 443-374.

Breakout Game For Paysour

- In his first start of the season, Kobe Paysour delivered one of the best performances of his UNC career.
- Entering last Friday's game at Cal, Paysour had two catches for 18 yards on the season, but put together a strong performance on his birthday (Oct. 17) with a career-high 101 receiving yards on six receptions.
- He brought in six of his seven targets, making a couple contested catches, to record the first 100-yard receiving game of the season by a Tar Heel.
- \bullet The redshirt senior surpassed 1,000 career receiving yards in the game and now has 1,090 to his credit.

Smart Football

Lee H. Roberts

Bubba Cunningham

- North Carolina ranks 10th nationally in fewest penalties with only 29 this season.
- That mark leads the ACC and is two fewer than any other conference team.
- The Tar Heels are averaging just 4.83 penalties per game under head coach Bill Belichick.

From The Notes: California Recap

- Quarterback Gio Lopez returned to the starting lineup for Carolina, making his fifth start of the season under center. Lopez was 19-of-35 for 167 yards.
- Running back Benjamin Hall put together several great runs against Cal, rushing for a career-high 68 yards in the contest. He scored his second career rushing touchdown on an 18-yard rush.
- Defensively, Tyler Thompson had a breakout game with a pair of sacks and tackles for loss.

New ACC Foes

- Last Friday's matchup between the Tar Heels and Golden Bears was the first for Carolina against the Atlantic Coast Conference's three newest additions, California, SMU and Stanford.
- Future UNC meetings against the most recent ACC additions:
 - Saturday, Nov. 8: Stanford at North Carolina
 - 2028: North Carolina at SMU
- It was also the furthest regular season matchup (2,805 miles) the Tar Heels have played since traveling to Cal in the 2018 season opener.

Max's Return

- Versus Clemson, quarterback Max Johnson earned his first start since the 2024 season opener against Minnesota.
- Johnson posted 26 completions and 213 yards against the Tigers, the most completions and passing yards for a Tar Heel in a game this fall.
- Last fall at Minnesota, the Athens, Ga. product suffered a season-ending lower body injury.

June Bursts On The Scene

- In the three games versus Charlotte, Richmond and UCF, freshman Demon June has led the Tar Heels in rushing with 250 yards on 33 carries.
- June led the Tar Heels in the win over Richmond on Sept. 13, posting 148 yards and a touchdown.
- June logged the first 100-yard game for Carolina this fall, becoming the first Tar Heel freshman to lead Carolina in rushing in back-to-back games since Michael Carter in 2017.
- The Jacksonville, N.C. native's 148 yards were the most for a freshman running back since Carter's 157 yards against Virginia in 2017.
- June's 50-yard rush on the opening drive was the longest by a Carolina freshman since Omarion Hampton's 58-yarder against Georgia State in 2022.



TAR HEEL NOTES

New Era In Chapel Hill

- On December 11, 2024, Bill Belichick was named head coach of the University of North Carolina football program.
- Belichick became the 12th head coach to lead the program since Carolina began play in the Atlantic Coast Conference (1953).
- An eight-time Super Bowl champion, Belichick won two titles as a defensive coordinator with the New York Giants, and six as the head coach of the New England Patriots.
- Belichick's father, Steve, was an assistant coach for the Tar Heels from 1953-1955, before going on to become an assistant coach for more than three decades at the United States Naval Academy.
- Belichick is the second Super Bowl winning head coach to become a college head coach after winning the Super Bowl, joining Bill Walsh.

Johnson Brother Connection

- Tar Heel quarterback Max Johnson and tight end Jake Johnson have connected on seven passes for 55 yards and a touchdown this season.
- The Johnson brother duo's touchdown in the season opener versus TCU became the first brother-to-brother touchdown in program history.
- In 2023 while the tandem was at Texas A&M, Jake's first career touchdown catch came courtesy of Max, becoming the first brother-to-brother scoring connection in Aggie history.

New Faces, New Places

- At the start of the season, the 2025 roster featured 38 returners and 70 newcomers.
- Of the newcomers, 40 arrived in Chapel Hill via the transfer portal and the 2025 Tar Heel roster includes 30 true freshmen.
- The 40-player transfer class arrives at Carolina with 662 career games played at the Division I level (FBS or FCS) entering the 2025 campaign.

Belichick With Washington Last Season

- New Carolina defensive coordinator Steve Belichick spent the 2024 campaign in the same role at the University of Washington, leading the defense in head coach Jedd Fisch's first season with the Huskies.
- With the transition from Washington to Carolina, Belichick brought along Armond Hawkins as the Carolina cornerbacks coach, along with defensive transfers Thaddeus Dixon (No. 1), Khmori House (No. 7) and Peyton Waters (No. 17).
- A season ago, Dixon earned honorable mention All-Big Ten as a cornerback for the Huskies, and House collected College Football Network All-America recognition at linebacker.
- Washington's pass defense numbers nationally during the 2024 season:
 - Passing Yards Allowed: Fifth (166.8/game)
 - Opponent Yards Per Pass Attempt: Third (5.68/attempt)
 - Total Passing Yards Allowed: Fourth (2,001)
 - Total Completions Allowed: 14th (194)

- Carolina entered the 2025 season with six quarterbacks on the roster, four who throw left handed:

Under Center

- The Tar Heels have two quarterbacks holding considerable experience under their belts, Max Johnson and Gio Lopez.
- Johnson, in his second year with the program, started for the Tar Heels in the season opening win at Minnesota a year ago, before suffering a season-ending lower-body injury.
- Johnson arrived in Chapel Hill after spending four years as the primary starter at LSU and Texas A&M.
- The son of Super Bowl champion Brad Johnson, Max's brother, Jake, is a tight end for the Tar Heels.
- Lopez begins his first season in the Carolina Blue, joining the program after the spring transfer portal window.
- In 2024 at South Alabama, Lopez started 11 of 13 games for the Jaguars, earning All-Sun Belt honorable mention honors.

Replacing Omarion

- Carolina looks to replace running back Omarion Hampton, who scattered his name throughout the Tar Heel record book in three seasons.
- In his three-year career, Hampton rushed for 3,565 yards (fourth all-time) and 36 rushing touchdowns (third all-time).
- Last fall, Hampton posted 1,660 yards (second all-time) and 15 touchdowns, becoming the ninth Tar Heel with multiple seasons of 1,000-or-more yards.
- A two-time All-ACC selection and two-time Doak Walker Award Finalist,
 Hampton collected All-America honors 10 times during his final two years as a Tar Heel.
- Hampton was selected 22nd overall in the first round of the 2025 NFL Draft in April, by the Los Angeles Chargers. Omarion became the third Carolina running back selected in the first round of the NFL Draft, the first since 1971:
 - 2025: Omarion Hampton (22nd overall to the LA Chargers)
 - 1971: Don McCauley (22nd overall to the Baltimore Colts)
 - 1965: Ken Willard (2nd overall to the San Francisco 49ers)



TAR HEFT NOTES

Lombardi's 2024 At Oregon

- Quarterback coach Matt Lombardi arrived in Chapel Hill after spending last season on staff at Oregon, as an offensive analyst working with the quarterbacks.
- Lombardi worked alongside former Ducks' signal caller Dillon Gabriel, who finished the season as a Heisman Finalist and Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, throwing for a career-high 3,857 yards and 30 touchdowns.
- Last season with Lombardi on staff, Oregon secured the Big Ten Championship and the No. 1 seed in the College Football Playoff.
- Before his stop in Eugene, Lombardi worked with the Las Vegas Raiders (2023), Carolina Panthers (2020-22) and Miami Dolphins (2019) in the NFL, also working in the college ranks at Baylor (2017-18) and Louisville (2014-16).

Heading Abroad In '26

- Carolina will open the 2026 season against TCU in Dublin, Ireland, participating in the 2026 Aer Lingus College Football Classic at Aviva Stadium.
- The 2026 matchup against the Horned Frogs will be the fifth all-time meeting in the international series, as the Tar Heels will become the fourth ACC team to compete in the classic.
- Next year's opener will be the first international game in program history, and the second all-time game outside of the continental United States, joining the 1986 Aloha Bowl in Hawaii.

Weight Room Warriors

- Head coach Bill Belichick added former New England Patriots strength coach Moses Cabrera to staff as the program's Director of Sport Performance.
- Cabrera spent 13 seasons with the Patriots, as an assistant strength coach (2011-15) before being promoted to head strength coach (2016-23). Prior to this time in New England, Cabrera spent time in the college ranks at Fresno State (2004-09) and Colorado (2010).

- Anderson, a freshman defensive back, begins his first season with the football and lacrosse programs at UNC, after graduating from Calvert Hall College High School in Maryland.

The 33rd Team

- Since his hiring, Coach Belichick has detailed his vision to make Carolina the "33rd NFL team", with everything in the program centered around a professional mindset.
- The Tar Heels' staff in the Kenan Football Center embodies the message, with more than 240 years of combined NFL experience.

Grass Is Back

- Kenan Stadium returned to its roots in 2025, as natural grass was reinstalled prior to the season.
- The footprint, which includes a synthetic turf perimeter, mirrors the look of Kenan Stadium's natural grass field from 2017-19.
- The project, funded by The Rams Club, included 67,000 square feet of sod, installed by Carolina Green.

Classroom Success

- In May, the NCAA announced its annual Academic Progress Rate, collecting a four-year rate of 996 (out of 1,000).
- The metric ranked first in the Atlantic Coast Conference and third nationally among football programs.



IN LOVING MEMORY OF TYLEE CRAFT

2001-2024

Tylee Craft, a graduate student from Sumter, S.C. and wide receiver on the Carolina football team, passed away on Oct. 12, 2024 after a two-year battle with cancer at the tender age of 23.

As a player, Craft appeared in 11 games over his first two seasons in 2020 and 2021. He was diagnosed with stage four large cell neuroendocrine carcinoma, a rare form of lung cancer, in March of 2022. Craft was subsequently named the 2022 Disney Spirit Award winner as the most inspirational figure in college football and was also a member of the Uplifting Athletes Rare Disease Champion Team.

Craft fought courageously and was an inspiration to UNC's campus, his coaches and teammates, and everyone who knew him and drew strength from his determination and spirit.

In his honor, the UNC football nutrition office was re-named the Tylee Craft Nutrition Center.

Eight-time Super Bowl champion Bill Belichick, architect of one of the greatest sports dynasties of all time and renowned as one of the top leaders to ever coach the game, was named the University of North Carolina's new head football coach on December 11th, 2024.

Belichick, the second-winningest coach in NFL history, agreed to a five-year deal.

"This is an exciting day for Carolina football and our university," said Chancellor Lee H. Roberts. "Carolina is committed to excellence and to creating an opportunity to succeed in everything we do, from the classroom to the field of competition. I know after speaking with Coach Belichick that he shares that commitment. His legacy speaks for itself, and we look forward to working together on the next chapter of Carolina football."

Said Carolina Director of Athletics Bubba Cunningham: "We know that college athletics is changing, and those changes require new and innovative thinking. Bill Belichick is a football legend, and hiring him to lead our program represents a new approach that will ensure Carolina football can evolve, compete and win -- today and in the future. At Carolina, we believe in providing championship opportunities and the best experience possible for our student-athletes, and Coach Belichick shares that commitment. We are excited to welcome him to Chapel Hill."

Belichick, who holds the NFL record for most Super Bowl wins (six with the New England Patriots as head coach and two more with the New York Giants as a coordinator), said: "I am excited for the opportunity at UNC. I grew up around college football with my Dad and treasured those times. I have always wanted to coach in college and now I look forward to building the football program in Chapel Hill."

A three-time AP NFL Coach of the Year (2003, 2007, 2010), Belichick has an all-time NFL head coaching record of 333-178 (.652) and is only 14 NFL wins away from the overall wins record. He is a member of the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s and the 2010s, and he also was a member of the NFL's 100th Anniversary All-Time Team and holds the record for most NFL Playoff victories (31)

Belichick began his coaching career in 1975 as an assistant for the Baltimore Colts and became the defensive coordinator of the New York Giants in 1985, where he won two Super Bowls under Bill Parcells. He was named head coach of the Cleveland Browns in 1991 and was at the helm for five seasons. He also coached with the New England Patriots and New York Jets before becoming the head coach of the Patriots in 2000.

In 24 seasons, New England won 17 AFC East titles, made 13 AFC Championship appearances, and nine Super Bowl appearances.

Belichick also has ties to North Carolina.

Belichick's father, Steve, was an assistant football coach for the Tar Heels from 1953-55 before going on to become assistant football coach for more than three decades at the United States Naval Academy. There, Bill Belichick attended team meetings and film sessions with his father. He knew how to diagram complex plays before he became a teenager and credits his dad for teaching him the details of football at a young age.

He graduated in 1975 from Wesleyan University, where he played football and lacrosse. He has three children: Amanda, Stephen and Brian.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C.—TCU overcame an early deficit and scored 41 consecutive points to beat North Carolina, 48-14, on Monday night in Kenan Stadium, spoiling the college debut of first-year Tar Heel head coach Bill Belichick in the process.

The game proceeded according to a Carolina script in the early going. The Kenan Stadium faithful roared after a dominant opening drive by the Tar Heels, who marched 83 yards in seven plays for a 7-0 lead just minutes into the season.

Very little went right for UNC (0-1) afterward, however, as the Horned Frogs (1-0) dominated the rest of the first half and led, 20-7, at the break. The Tar Heels managed just 20 offensive yards before halftime after their opening drive.

On the first play of the second half, Kevorian Barnes ran off-tackle to the right side for a 75-yard score to make it 27-7 TCU and suck the life out of the Carolina crowd.

"There was a great atmosphere here for the game tonight," Belichick said. "The fans had tremendous energy, and I know we played competitively, but then [we] just couldn't sustain it. So obviously, we have a lot of work to do. We need to do a better job all the way around—coaching, playing, all three phases of the game. And I know we're a lot better than that, so we need to work on those things and show it on Saturday and turn it around. But give TCU credit, they came in and did a good job, and they were clear that their team tonight deserved to win, and they did it decisively."

Horned Frog quarterback Josh Hoover completed 20 of 25 passes in the first half and finished 27 for 36 for 284 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. Jordan Dwyer caught nine passes for 136 yards and a TD, and Barnes ran 11 times for 113 yards and a score as the Frogs averaged 7.4 yards per carry and piled up 258 yards on the ground.

TCU out-gained Carolina, 542-222 (including 258-50 on the ground), and won its fifth game in a row.

Gio Lopez started under center for Carolina and completed 4 of 10 passes for 70 yards and an interception in two-plus quarters of work. He went to the injury tent after a sack in the third quarter and did not return to the contest.


Max Johnson relieved Lopez and led the Tar Heels to a score in his inspirational first appearance since nearly losing his leg after an injury in the 2024 season opener at Minnesota. Johnson connected with his brother, Jake Johnson, for a two-yard score to cap an 80-yard drive.

Jordan Shipp caught four passes for 84 yards to lead the UNC receivers. Caleb Hood led Carolina on the ground with 10 carries for 31 yards.

CHARLOTTE— North Carolina limited Charlotte to 21 yards rushing and beat the 49ers, 20-3, on Saturday night at Jerry Richardson Stadium.

The victory was Bill Belichick's first as a college head coach and improved Carolina to 1-1 this season. Charlotte fell to 0-2 before the largest home crowd in its history.

UNC allowed its fewest points since blanking Idaho in 2012 and didn't permit a touchdown for the first time since 2020.

Four different Tar Heel players ran five or more times in a balanced offensive attack that posted 148 yards on the ground. Meanwhile, UNC's defense held the 49ers to 21 yards on 29 rushing attempts (a paltry 0.7 yards per carry) after allowing 258 yards and 7.4 yards per carry in its loss to TCU.

Gio Lopez started again under center for Carolina despite leaving the TCU game with a second-half injury. On Saturday night, he began with a bang, connecting with Chris Culliver for a 51-yard touchdown in the opening minute. Lopez posted an efficient, 17-for-25 passing game, throwing for 155 yards and a score while also rushing nine times for 44 yards.

Nine different Tar Heels caught passes from Lopez, including three each by Culliver, Caleb Hood and Javarius Green.

Former Tar Heel Conner Harrell, who transferred to Charlotte after the 2024 season, started at quarterback for the 49ers and completed 17 of 29 for 140 yards. Grayson Loftis relieved Harrell and connected on 8 of 12 for 110 yards with two interceptions.

Carolina took a quick, 7-0 lead in the first minute on a 51-yard touchdown catch by Culliver and led the entire game. The Tar Heel defense held the 49ers under 25 yards rushing in the opening two quarters but allowed Charlotte to mount long drives while controlling the clock late in the half.

The Tar Heels seized momentum when Charlotte missed a field goal after a six-minute drive late in the second quarter. Carolina took over with 2:51 to go and punched the ball downfield for the biggest score of the game. Davion Gause's 12-yard touchdown run with 13 seconds remaining in the second gave the Tar Heels a 17-3 lead at the break.

The UNC defense excelled in the final 30 minutes. The 49ers moved 55 yards on 10 plays before punting on the first possession of the second half, but Carolina held Charlotte to three consecutive punts and back-to-back interceptions on five second-half possessions.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C.— North Carolina dominated from the opening whistle and rolled past Richmond, 41-6, on Saturday afternoon at Kenan Stadium.

Carolina scored on its first four possessions and had out-gained Richmond by a margin of 169 to -2 by five minutes into the second quarter. The Spiders mounted a handful of offensive drives to make things more respectable the rest of the way, but the game's outcome was essentially decided before halftime.

The Tar Heels (2-1) won their second game in a row and gave first-year head coach Bill Belichick his first collegiate home victory. Richmond fell to 1-2.

In its last two games, the UNC defense has held back-to-back opponents to just three points each while allowing a combined 145 rushing yards on 77 attempts, an average of just 1.9 yards per carry.

The Tar Heels have held two consecutive opponents without a touchdown for the first time since 2012, and Carolina has won 26 consecutive games over FCS opponents since 2000.

UNC's defense controlled the action throughout on Saturday, overwhelming the Richmond offensive line for two early sacks and helping the Tar Heels out-gain the Spiders, 136-12, in the opening 15 minutes. Richmond eventually mounted some offense late in the first half, only to see Carolina lead, 20-3, at the break.

UNC scored three consecutive touchdowns to start the second half and had a goal line stand on defense to put the game away.

The Tar Heel offensive line played well and opened holes while wearing down the smaller Spiders on a warm afternoon in Chapel Hill. Richmond controlled time of possession by almost 16 minutes but averaged just 3.2 yards per play in a frustrating offensive day.

True freshman running back Demon June gutted the Richmond defense, running 14 times for 148 yards and a score, averaging 10.6 yards per carry to lead seven UNC rushers. June had 59 yards on his first two carries of the game and was equally dominant in the fourth quarter, when he dashed almost untouched for a 45-yard score.

Gio Lopez started at quarterback for the third game in a row for UNC, completing 10 of 18 passes for 119 yards and two touchdowns while also running 11 times for 40 yards and a TD.

Jordan Shipp caught four passes from Lopez for 52 yards and two scores. Five different Carolina receivers caught Lopez's 10 completions.

The UNC first-half defense gave Spider quarterback Kyle Wickersham fits until Ashten Snelsire replaced him midway through the second quarter. Wickersham eventually returned to the game before heading to the locker room at the end of the third quarter with an apparent injury. Richmond passers completed 9 of 15 attempts for 75 yards with an interception in the game.

ORLANDO - UCF dominated throughout and defeated North Carolina, 34-9, on Saturday afternoon at the Acrisure Bounce House.

Knights quarterback Tayven Jackson compiled 289 yards of total offense for UCF. He completed 25 of 32 passes for 223 yards and a touchdown while also running 10 times for 66 yards and score.

The Knights built a 20-3 halftime lead and never allowed the Tar Heels to mount a significant offensive threat in the first meeting between the two schools.

UCF (3-0) snapped Carolina's (2-2) two-game winning streak and starts its season with three consecutive wins for the second year in a row.

"I really liked the intensity our defense came out with to start the game," said Knights head coach Scott Frost afterward. "You know, the good thing on that side of the ball is that we got a lot of guys that can make game-changing plays and impact the game."

Gio Lopez threw two first-half interceptions to create short fields for UCF, while Jackson completed 16 of 20 passes in the first half for 148 yards and a touchdown.

In the second half, the Knights outscored Carolina, 14-6.

Overall, Lopez completed 11 of 14 attempts for 87 yards with two interceptions. Max Johnson replaced an injured Lopez late in the third quarter and finished 11 for 19 for 67 yards and a touchdown in mop-up duty.

UNC ran the ball 25 times for 63 yards, an average of 2.5 yards per attempt.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - Clemson exploded for a 28-3, first quarter lead and cruised to a 38-10 win at North Carolina on Saturday afternoon at Kenan Stadium.

The Tigers snapped their two-game losing streak, improving to 2-3 overall and 1-2 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Tar Heels dropped their second game in a row and fell to 2-3, 0-1 in their conference opener.

Clemson started with a splash, taking a 7-0 lead just 11 seconds into the game on its first play from scrimmage, a 75-yard scoring toss from wide receiver Antonio Williams to T.J. Moore on a double pass that started with quarterback Cade Klubnik.

After the Tar Heels responded with a field goal, the Tigers moved quickly for another touchdown, this one on a 35-yard pass from Klubnik to Adam Randall to cap a three-play, 75-yard drive and make it 14-3 Tigers just over six minutes into the first quarter.

Clemson made it 21-3 on another splash play, this time a 45-yard toss from Klubnik to Christian Bentancur. Another score with just a second left in the first quarter made the score 28-3, and the Tigers led, 35-3, at halftime.

"Today was a disappointing outcome for us," UNC head coach Bill Belichick said. "I thought we had a good week. I think we were ready to go, but unfortunately, we gave up some big plays early in the game and that really tilted the game, and we're just not ready to be able to recover. The big plays in the passing game, I mean, we probably gave up 200 yards of passing on five plays."

Clemson posted 367 total yards in the first half to 78 for Carolina with advantages of 326 to 66 in passing yards and 14 to 5 in first downs.

Things didn't get much better for UNC in the second half. Neither team scored in the third quarter. Clemson took a 38-3 lead on a field goal with 13:20 left in the game, and Carolina scored its only touchdown on an 11-yard rush by Benjamin Hall with 10:25 remaining to cut the deficit to 38-10.

Klubnik shined for the Tigers, completing 22 of 24 passes for 254 yards and four touchdowns before leaving the game in the third quarter. Thirteen different Clemson players caught passes in a dominant day through the air, including eight with multiple receptions.

With quarterback Gio Lopez missing the game due to injury, Max Johnson made his first start of the season, his second start as a Tar Heel and his first since his devastating knee injury in the 2024 season opener at Minnesota. Johnson finished 26 for 42 through the air for 213 yards without a touchdown or interception.

Jordan Shipp led Carolina with five catches for 41 yards, while Shanard Clower added four catches and Demon June had four grabs along with five carries for 16 yards.

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. - Cal recovered a North Carolina fumble in the final four minutes just as the Tar Heels were poised to take their first lead, preserving a 21-18 win over UNC on Friday night at California Memorial Stadium.

With Carolina controlling the momentum and seemingly poised to take the lead with 3:48 to play, the Golden Bears forced Nathan Leacock to fumble at the one-yard line, just as it appeared he was ready to give the Tar Heels a late lead. Cal recovered the ball in the end zone to preserve its 21-18 advantage.

UNC played one of its better games of the season overall and put forth its best effort of the Fall against a major college opponent but dropped its third consecutive game to fall to 2-4, 0-2 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Cal improved to 5-2, 2-1 ACC.

"Obviously, a real competitive game here," Tar Heel head coach Bill Belichick said in his postgame press conference. "A couple of big mistakes hurt us, but a lot of things we could have done better in all three phases. So just came up a little bit short today, here, couple of inches, I guess, on the touchdown, on the fumble. But just keep working on things that obviously we need to do a better job of. Third-and-long on defense, third-down conversions on offense, ball security, things like that."

Carolina's second-half rushing attack gave it the advantage in time of possession by the late stages of the game despite Cal's early-game offensive success.

The Tar Heels mounted their second consecutive 11-play drive midway through the fourth quarter and were within a yard of taking the lead before Leacock's red zone fumble

UNC ran for 120 yards, averaging 4.1 yards per carry, while limiting the Golden Bears to 2.6 yards per attempt.

Gio Lopez returned to the lineup at quarterback for Carolina, starting the game and going the distance after missing the Clemson game due to injury. Lopez completed 19 of 35 passing attempts for 167 yards. Benjamin Hall ran 14 times for 68 to lead UNC on the ground.

Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele connected on 21 of 39 attempts for 209 yards and a touchdown for Cal. Kendrick Raphael ran it 22 times for 81 yards and a score, and Jacob De Jesus caught 13 passes for 105 yards and a TD.
