
SUPPORTING UNC GYMNASTICS


The University of North Carolina is proud of its long-standing relationship with Nike. The two parties signed a new 10-year contract in December 2018 for Nike to continue as the Tar Heels' exclusive supplier of athletic footwear and apparel through June 2028. As part of the contract, a minimum of \$600,000 per year is guaranteed for licensing, which the University directs for need- and merit-based scholarships. That's more than double the licensing guarantee of the previous contract with Nike. In addition, the University will receive \$200,000 per year in retail product for non-athletic department use, and Nike will hire four student interns each year.

ATLANTIC COAST CONFERENCE

The Atlantic Coast Conference announced on June 17, 2021, that women's gymnastics would become the league's 28th sponsored sport beginning with the 2023-24 academic year. July 1, 2023, was the first official day of the ACC sponsoring gymnastics.

According to the league's sports operation code, the ACC shall conduct a championship in any NCAA sport in which at least four member institutions field intercollegiate teams. The ACC now sponsors 15 women's and 13 men's sports and will have the most women's sports offerings of any Power 5 conference.

Danna Durante was named head coach of the North Carolina gymnastics program in June of 2021, becoming the fourth head coach in program history.

Coaching Career at UNC:

Under Durante's leadership in her first season at UNC in 2022, the Tar Heels put together one of the best seasons in program history, earning the team's first NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championship regional berth since 2017. She then guided the Tar Heels back to NCAA Regionals in 2023.

Carolina opened the 2022 season with the highest season-opening score in program history, setting a new program record for single-meet attendance. UNC then began the 2023 season with the program's highest home-opening score in history.

The Tar Heels were crowned the East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) regular season champions in back-to-back years, going a perfect 7-0 in 2022 and 6-0 in 2023 against conference opponents. UNC's third place finish at the 2023 EAGL Championships was the team's best conference finish since 2011.

Carolina recorded its highest NQS since 2004 in 2022, finishing the season with its best final NCAA ranking since 2012. As a team, the Tar Heels earned 11 All-EAGL regular-season and 12 All-Tournament honors

UNC then earned 10 All-EAGL regular-season and 15 All-Tournament accolades in 2023. Lali Dekanoidze was named the 2023 EAGL Co-Specialist of the Year after earning WCGA First Team Regular Season All-America honors.

Durante successfully led the Tar Heels into their first season in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2024. Four gymnasts earned All-ACC Championship Team honors at

the first ACC Championship in 40 years. Dekanoidze and Isabelle Schaefer, who went 1-2 on the uneven bars at the ACC Championships, garnered All-ACC First Team praise and earned individual berths to NCAA Regionals.

Durante, born in Tulsa, Okla., returned to coaching after spending four years recruiting top talent for executive teams for Fortune 500 companies and serving as the operations director for What Drives Winnina.

Durante led Georgia's gymnastics program from 2012-2017, where the Gymdogs made five straight NCAA Championship appearances (2013-17), including Super Six appearances in 2013, 2014 and 2016.

Durante coached Georgia to a fifth-place NCAA Championship finish in 2014, sixth-place finishes in 2013 and 2016, ninth in 2015 and 12th in 2017.

In 2016, she coached two NCAA individual national champions - Brandie Jay (vault) and Brittany Rogers (bars).

Twenty-four individual athletes earned 38 first-team All-America awards during her tenure at Georgia.

The Gymdogs earned a 100 percent graduation rate and 39 individuals made the SEC Academic Honor Roll. Her teams also garnered 30 NACGC Academic All-America awards, and Noel Couch earned a postgraduate scholarship in 2013.

Prior Coaching Stops:

Prior to her five-year stint in Athens, Durante served as the head gymnastics coach at the University of California in 2011-2012.

From 2002-2011, Durante spent nine seasons at the University of Nebraska and

worked as the Huskers' beam coach and choreographer. In 2007, she was promoted to associate head coach, a position she held until 2011.

Under her tutelage, Nebraska gymnasts earned 23 All-America awards and a fourth-place finish at the 2011 NCAA Championship.

Before coaching at Nebraska, Durante was an assistant coach at the University of Washington, where she guided the Huskies to a seventh-place finish at the NCAA Championship and a 1999 NCAA West Regional title. For her efforts with the Huskies, she was named the West Regional Assistant Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2002. Prior to her time at UW, she coached the Arizona Sunrays and Royal (Fla.) Gymnastics Clubs.

As a Gymnast:

An impressive gymnast in her own right, Durante was a two-time member of the U.S. Gymnastics Federation in 1988 and 1990 and qualified for the 1988 Olympic Trials. In addition to competing globally in Bulgaria, France, Germany, South Africa and Canada representing the United States, she won top honors in the allaround in the 1986 and 1987 South African

An Elite Level Judge from 1996-2000, she graduated from Arizona State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in exercise science. She turned in an illustrious collegiate career with the Sun Devils where she was an All-PAC 10 gymnast from 1992-95 and scored five perfect 10s.

Personal:

Durante and her husband, Joe, have a daughter, Samantha, and two sons, Jaxson and Jordan. Sami was a gymnast at LSU from 2017-22 and is currently an assistant coach at North Carolina.



MARIE CASE DENICK ASSOC. HEAD COACH



Marie Case Denick is in her eighth season with the Tar Heels, and fourth under head coach Danna Durante. She was elevated to associate head coach ahead of the 2024 season. Denick was named the 2022 East Atlantic Gymnastics League Assistant Coach of the Year in 2021.

Denick served as the interim head coach for the Carolina gymnastics program in 2020-21. After one year as an assistant coach and two as the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator, Denick's impact has been evident.

Despite the shortened 2020 season due to COVID-19, Denick helped Khazia Hislop receive her third All-America recognition of her career and her first on vault. In both 2018 and 2019, Hislop earned second team All-America honors and the EAGL championship title on floor exercise. Denick also coached back-to-back EAGL champions on vault with Hislop winning the event in 2019 and Madison Nettles in 2018. In 2018, Carolina also finished the season ranked sixth in the nation in floor exercise, largely due to Denick.

Denick comes to UNC from Bowling Green State University where she served as an assistant coach the last two seasons. Her primary duties at BGSU included coaching the vault and floor exercise and coordinating the team's academics and community service. The Falcons finished second in the MAC last year, the team's highest finish in the conference since 1987. One of Denick's athletes won the floor exercise and another was the MAC's Freshman of the Year. In addition, the team improved its grade point average to 3.65 and recorded more than 1,000 hours of community service.

In Denick's first year at BGSU, the Falcons set a school record team score for a single meet and one of her athletes won the all-around at the MAC Championship.

The Erie, Pa., native began her coaching career as a volunteer assistant at her alma mater, Kent State, in 2015. She was the MAC Gymnast of the Year in 2012, 2013 and 2014, the MAC Freshman of the Year in 2011 and the conference's all-around champion as a junior and senior. She qualified for the NCAA Championships in the all-around in 2014 and was the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches Regional Gymnast of the Year.

SAMI DURANTE ASST. COACH



The 2024-25 season marks the second year for Sami Durante as an assistant coach with Carolina Gymnastics. In this role, she assumes all director of operations responsibilities as well as assists on all four events.

A standout gymnast at Louisiana State University from 2018-22, Durante specialized in bars, beam and vault. She served as LSU's anchor on bars for three straight years and earned WCGA Regular Season All-America recognition on bars in both 2021 and 2022.

She was part of an NCAA Championship squad each year during her time in Baton Rouge, finishing second in the team final as a sophomore. She was also a member of two Southeastern Conference championship teams and was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team as a rookie. Durante was twice nominated for the prestigious AAI Award, given to the nation's top gymnast.

At the conclusion of her competitive career, Durante stayed on staff with LSU as a graduate assistant during the 2022-23 season where she aided the staff with day-to-day operations of the program. The Tigers experienced a successful season with her on staff, winning their NCAA semifinal and advancing to the team final for the ninth time in school history.

A native of Athens, Georgia, Durante is a two-time graduate of LSU. She earned her bachelor's degree in sport administration with a double minor in business and leadership and human resource development in May 2021. She earned her master's in sport management in May 2023.

MATT DEGRANDPRE ASST. COACH



The 2024-25 campaign marks the first year Matt DeGrandpre is on the North Carolina gymnastics staff as an assistant coach.

DeGrandpre arrived in Chapel Hill having spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Texas Woman's University. At the conclusion of both the 2023 and 2024 seasons, DeGrandpre was part of a coaching contingent which was named the WCGA Division II Regional Co-Assistant Coaches of the Year.


During his time in Texas, DeGrandpre was the primary vault and bars coach for the Pioneers while also overseeing academic success and team travel. In 2024, DeGrandpre guided the team to their highest bars score in a decade and coached two individual athletes to school records on vault and bars, both with scores of 9.95.

Prior to his time at Texas Woman's, DeGrandpre served as a graduate assistant coach with the men's gymnastics team at Springfield College – his alma mater – from 2020-22. His duties included helping coordinate practices, planning routines and contributing to the overall success of the program.

In 2022, DeGrandpre helped lead the Pride to their first appearance in the NCAA National Collegiate Championships, becoming the first DIII program to ever compete at the meet. The Springfield coaching staff, including DeGrandpre, was named the ECAC Coaching Staff of the Year.

DeGrandpre competed at Springfield College from 2016-20 where he specialized in vault, pommel horse and floor, earning respective career-highs of 11.5, 11.8 and 12.65. He helped his team finish fourth at the ECAC Championships for three consecutive seasons.

A native of Westfield, Massachusetts, DeGrandpre received his bachelor's degree in movement and sports studies with a concentration in physical and health education from Springfield in May 2020. He earned his master's degree in athletic administration during his time as a graduate assistant. He was also named a USA Gymnastics Academic All-American as an undergraduate.

DEREK P. GALVIN GYMNASTICS TRAINING FACILITY

In 2015, the Rams Club and the UNC Athletic Department finished a complete renovation of the gymnastics practice facility within Fetzer Gymnasium. At a ceremony that November, the space was officially named the Derek P. Galvin Gymnastics Facility in honor of Carolina's long-time head coach. Galvin was just the third women's gymnastics coach in school history and was the second-longest tenured coach at UNC during his time in Chapel Hill.

The facility became a reality with the generous donations of 175 contributors who raised more than \$580,000 for the project. The Rams Club and the gymnastics program would like to specifically thank the Nassif Family, Ed and Cathe Hege, Fritz and Kevin Russ, and Claude and Sarah Snow for their generous support.

Former gymnast Claire Smith spearheaded a campaign among former letterwinners to raise more than \$200,000 for the project.

The enhancements provide the gymnastics team with a more comprehensive and efficient practice space than ever before. The floor was elevated to allow for the installation of several foam pits, specifically for training on vault and uneven bars. The gym was converted to LED lighting, and championship banners celebrating Carolina's success in the East Atlantic Gymnastics League are on display.
