OPENING KICK

- Navy and Charlotte meet on the gridiron for the first time when the two square off on ESPN+ Saturday afternoon (2:00 pm) at a sold-out Jerry Richardson Stadium (15,000) in Charlotte, N.C.
- The Mids will play the longest regular-season schedule in the country this year. Navy played the nation's first regular-season college football game of the season on August 26 against Notre Dame at Aviva Stadium in Dublin, Ireland and will play the final regular-season game of the year on Dec. 9 vs. Army at Gillette Stadium in New England.
- Navy ranks 3rd in the country in fumbles recovered with 7, 5th in turnover margin at +1.20 and 4th in turnovers lost with 3. **Xavier McDonald** (Sr. / Striker) is 3rd in the country in forced fumbles per game (0.60), while **Luke Pirris** (So. / Raider) is 3rd in the country in fumbles recovered (2).
- Navy, Air Force and Penn State are the only 3 teams in the country that have not thrown an interception this year. The Mids are also 10th in the country in passing yards per completion, averaging 15.27.
- The Mids are fourth nationally in rushing, averaging 248.2 yards per game. **Alex Tecza** (So. / FB) is fifth in the country in rushing yards per carry (7.64).
- Navy is seventh in the country in punt returns, averaging 17.7 per return.
- Safety **Rayuan Lane** (Sr.) is fourth in the nation in passes defended (1.6 per game).
- Over the last two games (USF and North Texas), Navy has been called for 15 penalties while the opposition has been called for just 1. North Texas was the first Navy opponent not to be penalized since Army in the 2016 Army-Navy Game presented by USAA.
- Navy head coach Brian Newberry and Charlotte head coach Biff Poggi are 2 of 11 first-time head coaches in the FBS this year. Four of those 11 are in the American Athletic Conference (UAB's Trent Dilfer and USF's Alex Golesh).

- ESPN+ will broadcast Saturday's game with Richard Cross, Taylor McHargue and Morgan Uber on the call.
- The Navy Football Pregame Show with Pete Medhurst, Joe Miller, Keith Mills, Scott Wykoff and special commentary from John Feinstein will get underway at 1:00 pm on the Navy Radio Network, followed by game action beginning at 2:00 pm with Medhurst, Miller and Mills on the call.
- Following the contest, Medhurst, Miller, Mills and Wykoff will recap the day's events in a 30-minute postgame show.

- Navy has 10 players on its roster from the state of North Carolina, which is tied with Alabama for the sixth most of any state on Navy's roster.

- Charlotte enters Saturday's game against Navy with a 1-4 overall record and an 0-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference.
- Charlotte won its opener against South Carolina State 24-3, but has played a brutal stretch of four games over the last month, losing at Maryland (38-20), to Georgia State at home (41-25), at Florida (22-7) and at SMU (34-16).
- Charlotte's Jalon Jones (Sr. / QB), a transfer from both Bethune Cookman and Jackson State, leads the 49ers in both rushing and passing. Jones has rushed for 316 yards and 3 touchdowns on 62 carries, while completing 44 of his 72 pass attempts for 420 yards with 2 touchdowns and 3 interceptions. Durrell Robinson (Fr. / RB) has 166 yards rushing on 40 carries.
- Trexler Ivey (R-So. / QB) has also seen playing time at quarterback, completing 38 of his 59 pass attempts for 459 yards with 2 touchdowns and 3 interceptions.
- Colorado transfer Jack Hestera leads Charlotte in receiving, catching 22 passes for 283 yards and 2 touchdowns, while Colin Weber (So. / TE) has 14 catches for 142 yards.
- Linebacker Nikhai Hill-Green, a transfer from Michigan, leads the 49ers defense with 36 tackles, 5 tackles for loss, a sack and a pass breakup. Georgia Tech transfer linebacker Demetrius Knight II has 33 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and an interception.
- Three-time transfer Eyabe Okie-Anoma (Alabama, UT-Martin and Michigan) is 21st in the country in sacks, averaging 0.80 per contest.

- Punt returner Henry Rutledge has a punt return for a touch-down.
- Youngstown State / John Carroll transfer Grant Gonya is 11th in the nation in punting, averaging 46.1 yards per punt.
- Charlotte ranks 13th nationally in kickoff return defense (14.62) and 22nd in punt returns (14.0).
- The 49ers have 65 transfers on their roster, including Randy Franklin (R-So. / DB) from Navy.

MIDS LOSE CAPTAINS LIRION MURTEZI AND JACOB BUSIC FOR THE YEAR

- Starting center and team captain **Lirion Murtezi** was lost for the year due to a back injury.
- Murtezi played in 25 games over his career, starting seven. He played in every game as a sophomore and junior.
- Starting defensive end and team captain **Jacob Busic** is also likely out for the year with an arm injury.
- Busic had started 27-consecutive games before getting injured at the end of the Memphis game.
- Busic was named First-Team All-East and Honorable Mention All-American Athletic Conference as a junior as he finished second on the team in sacks (6), tied for second in tackles for a loss (8.5) to go along with 38 tackles on the year.

INJURY REPORT

- Starting center and co-captain **Lirion Murtezi** (Sr.) is out for the year (back). Starting defensive end **Jacob Busic** (Sr.) is likely out for the year (back), starting long snapper **Cole Williams** (Sr.) is likely out for the year (leg), second-team wide receiver **Kroy Myers** (Jr.) and second-team linebacker **Kyle Jacob** (Jr.) are both out with knee injuries.

ALL'S WELL THAT ENDS WELL

- Although Navy is 0-3 in games played in Ireland, the experience has turned out to be pretty good in the end for the first two teams that lost to Notre Dame in Dublin.
- In 1996, Navy lost to Notre Dame 54-27 in November, but went on to finish 9-3 and defeat Cal in the Aloha Bowl.
- In 2012, Navy lost to Notre Dame 50-10 in the season opener and began the year 1-3 before righting the ship to finish 8-5, win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and play Arizona State in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl.

PROTECTING THE LEAD AT HOME

- Navy has won 66-consecutive games when leading after three quarters at home, which is the longest streak in the country.
- The last time Navy lost at home when leading after three quarters was Oct. 23, 1999, when Navy led Akron 29-13 and lost 35-29.

- Navy shut out Wagner 24-0 for its first win of the year.
- It was Navy's first win in a home opener since 2019 when it walloped Holy Cross 45-7.
- It was the Mids' first shutout since Dec. 6, 2008 when Navy stomped Army 34-0.
- It was the first home shutout since Oct. 15, 1994 when the Mids beat Lafayette 7-0.
- It was the first time Navy has held an opponent without a touchdown since Oct. 19, 2019 when Navy beat USF 35-3.

- It is the first time Navy has played 3 overtime games in a single season since 2007 when the Mids lost to Ball State 34-31, beat Pitt 48-45 in double overtime and beat Notre Dame 46-44 in triple overtime.
- Navy won 2 overtime games in the same season for the first time since 2009 when the Mids beat Air Force 16-13 and won at SMU 38-35.
- Navy is 4-2 all-time in games that go multiple overtimes.

FIRST DRIVE TELLS THE TALE

- Over the last two years, Navy is 6-2 (.750) when the opponent does not score on its opening drive and 0-9 (.000) when it does.
- This year, Navy is 2-1 when the opponent does not score on its opening drive (lost to USF) and 0-2 when it does.

OPENING-DRIVE TOUCHDOWN

- Navy scored a touchdown on the opening drive against Wagner (3-yd run by Daba Fofana), marking the first time the Mids had scored on its opening drive of the game since Nov. 19, 2022 when Navy upset UCF 17-14.
- Additionally, it was the first time the Mids scored a touchdown on their opening drive of the game at home since Nov. 20, 2021, in a 38-35 loss to East Carolina.
- The Mids have scored points on its opening drive of the second half in each of the last three games scoring touchdowns against Memphis and North Texas and kicking a field goal against USF.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE

- Navy put together two touchdown drives of 43 seconds or less against Wagner, marking the first time the Mids have scored two touchdowns in a game that fast since Nov. 1, 2019 when they defeated UConn 56-10.
- The Mids came back against Memphis and had a 12-second scoring drive when **Alex Tecza** (So. / FB) scored on a 75-yard run on the first play from scrimmage.
- Against USF the Mids had a 17-second scoring drive when **Blake Horvath** (So. / QB) hit **Eli Heidenreich** (So / SB) with a 68-yard touchdown pass.
- Against North Texas, Navy had its fifth scoring drive under 1 minute when Tecza scored 6 seconds after **Luke Pirris** (So. / Raider) caused a fumble and **Colin Ramos** (Jr. / LB) recovered it. Tecza ran it in from 21 yards out to give Navy a 10-point lead in a game the Mids won by 3.

NAVY TRYING TO REBOOT RUSHING TRADITION WITH NEW OFFENSE

- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for a fourth-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished No. 2 in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yds/gm.
- Navy was second in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yds/gm. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy again finished No. 2 in the country, averaging 326.7 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged a then school-record 351.4 yds/gm in 2017, which was the second most in the country.
- In 2019, Navy once again led the nation in rushing with its school-record 360.5 yds/gm. The Mids outrushed second-place Air Force by 62 yds/gm.
- Since 2019, Navy has not come close to leading the nation in rushing, finishing 52nd in 2020 (177.6 yds/gm), 9th in 2021 (225.5 yds/gm) and 4th in 2022 (241.2 yds/gm).
- Navy is averaging 248.2 rushing yards per game this year, which is good for fourth best in the country.

LAVATAI MAKES IT ALL THE WAY BACK

- Tai Lavatai** (Sr / QB) suffered a devastating injury last year when he sustained a season-ending knee injury in the eighth game of the year against Temple (Oct. 29).
- He missed all of spring practice, but worked throughout the spring and off-season to be healthy for the start of fall camp. He didn't stop there. He fought for and won the starting quarterback job after starting fall camp 3rd on the depth chart.
- Lavatai had started all 22 games he's played in for Navy until the win against North Texas.
- Against Wagner, Lavatai threw for a career-high 161 yards and a touchdown on 8-13 passing, while rushing for 65 yards on 16 carries.
- Against Memphis, Lavatai completed 10 of his 19 pass attempts for 133 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 30 yards on 14 carries.
- Against USF, Lavatai carried the ball 8 times for 21 yards and 2 touchdowns, while completing 1 of his 5 passes for 7 yards.
- Lavatai was demoted to third team the week of the North Texas game, but came off the bench for an injured starter **Blake Horvath** (So.) and led Navy to a 27-24 victory. Lavatai completed 4 of his 8 pass attempts for 75 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 28 yards on 3 carries.
- Lavatai is completing 51 percent of his passes on the year (26-51) for 419 yards with 3 touchdowns and 0 interceptions. He is Navy's fourth-leading rusher with 167 yards and 2 touchdowns on 51 carries.

AIR NAVY

- The Mids are averaging 15.3 yards per completion, the 10th-best mark in the country.
- Navy is one of just 3 schools yet to throw an interception this year, joining Penn State and Air Force.

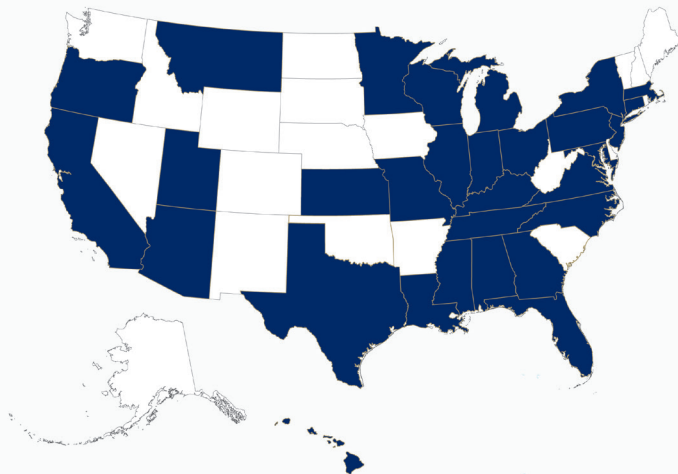
- Navy produced five of the top 50 best total offense marks in program history in 2016.

HIGH SCHOOL TEAMMATES MAKE FIRST-CAREER START AGAINST MEMPHIS

- Eli Heidenreich** (So. / SB) and **Alex Tecza** (So. / FB) were high school teammates at Mt. Lebanon High School in Pittsburgh, so it only made sense for them to make their first-career starts together at Memphis.
- Tecza ran for 163 yards and a touchdown on 15 carries, while Heidenreich caught 2 passes out of the backfield for 19 yards.
- The 163 yards by Tecza were the most by a Navy fullback since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards on Nov. 30, 2019, in a rout of Houston.
- 75 of the 163 yards came on his first carry, as he took a pitch and outran the Memphis secondary for a 75-yard touchdown. It was the longest run by a Navy fullback since then-fullback and current slot back **Anton Hall Jr.** took one 77 yards to the house in last year's Army-Navy game.
- Heidenreich caught his first-two career passes at Memphis just 5 days after leading Navy in rushing against Wagner. Against the Seahawks, he carried the ball 4 times for 66 yards, including a beautiful 46-yard touchdown run.
- Against USF, Tecza led the Mids in rushing (13 carries for 82 yds), while Heidenreich led Navy in receiving (1 catch for 68 yds and a touchdown).
- Tecza had another big game against North Texas, rushing for 137 yards and 2 touchdowns on 17 carries.
- Tecza is Navy's leading rusher with 428 yards and 3 touchdowns on 56 carries (5th nationally, 7.6 yds/carry), while Heidenreich has 8 carries for 85 yards (10.6 yds/carry) and 1 touchdown to go along with his 3 catches for 87 yards (29.0 yds/catch) and a touchdown.
- Tecza is ranked as the 9th-best running back in the FBS on running plays (min. 50 carries) by Pro Football Focus.

A TRADITION OF EXCELLENCE

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the most by a quarterback in FBS history.
- Reynolds is also the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.
- Ricky Dobbs ran for 27 touchdowns in 2009, which is tied with Collin Klein of Kansas State for the second most in FBS history among quarterbacks.
- Will Worth ran for 25 touchdowns in 2016, which is the fourth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 24 touchdowns in 2015, which is the fifth-most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Reynolds ran for 23 touchdowns in 2014, which is tied as the sixth most by a quarterback.
- Malcolm Perry's 21 rushing touchdowns in 2019 are the 11th-most single-season TDs by a QB in FBS history.

BIG PLAY KENT

- Nathan Kent** (So. / WR) scored on a 70-yard reverse on just his second-career play and first-career touch in Navy's 53-21 win over Tulsa last fall. Kent made a Tulsa player miss in the backfield and then took it to the house untouched.
- Kent is a two-sport athlete for the Mids, as he was also recruited to run track. He set the school record at Rocklin High School in Rocklin, Calif. in the 100, 200 and 400-yard dash. Both of his parents were track standouts at Azusa Pacific, including his dad, Roosevelt Jr., who was a three-time All-American triple jumper.
- After missing the 2023 season opener against Notre Dame with an injury, Kent returned to the field against Wagner and caught 2 passes for 45 yards.
- Against North Texas he caught his first-career touchdown, a 26-yard pass from **Tai Lavatai** (Sr. / QB).

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- Navy is tied for 4th in the nation in turnovers lost (3) and 5th in turnover margin (+1.20 per game).
- The Mids are also 3rd in the country in fumble recoveries with 7.

DABA DABA DO!

- Daba Fofana** (Jr. / FB), who entered last year's Tulsa game with 116-career yards rushing and 0 touchdowns, ran for a 159 yards on 21 carries and scored 3 touchdowns.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to rush for over 100 yards since slot back Carlinos Acie rushed for 155 yards in 2021 against East Carolina (Lavatai rushed for 120 yards the next week against SMU).
- He was the first Navy fullback to rush for over 100 yards since Jamale Carothers ran for 188 yards against Houston in 2019.
- Fofana was the first Navy player to score 3 touchdowns in a game since Carothers scored 5 in that same Houston game.
- Fofana rushed for 61 yards on 21 carries the next week against SMU and had 89 yards on 20 carries against Houston. He carried the ball 24 times for 63 yards and a touchdown against Temple.
- Fofana hit the century mark for a second time in 2022, rushing for 133 yards and a TD on 15 carries against Notre Dame.
- He followed up the Notre Dame game with another 100-yard day, rushing for 114 yards on 20 carries against UCF.
- Fofana was the team's leading rusher with 769 yards and 6 touchdowns on 186 carries in 2022.
- He was the first fullback in the triple-option era to have 20 or more carries in four-consecutive games (21 vs. Tulsa, 21 vs. SMU, 20 vs. Houston, 24 vs. Temple).
- Fofana was Navy's leading rusher in the 2023 opener against Notre Dame where he had 56 yards on 15 carries.
- Against Wagner, Fofana rushed for 34 yards on 8 carries with a touchdown.
- Fofana was Navy's second-leading rusher against Memphis, carrying the ball 9 times for 53 yards and catching 2 passes for 24 yards. The 2 catches were the first two of his career.
- Fofana was Navy's second-leading rusher once again against USF, running for 53 yards on 9 carries.
- Fofana was Navy's third-leading rusher against North Texas, running for 55 yards on 10 carries.
- He is Navy's second-leading rusher with 251 yards and a touchdown on 56 carries (4.9 ypc).
- Fofana carries a 3.69 grade-point average as a physics major and plays the cello.

CHATMAN MAKES PLAYS

- Brandon Chatman** (So. / SB) had a solid collegiate debut in the season opener against Notre Dame.
- Chatman carried the ball 8 times for 30 yards, while catching a pair of passes for 41 yards, including a 39-yard reception that set up Navy's lone score.
- Against Wagner, he carried the ball 5 times for 31 yards and caught 2 passes for a yard while making his first-career start.
- Against Memphis, Chatman caught a career-long 58-yard pass from Tai Lavatai.
- Against USF, Chatman carried the ball 6 times for 35 yards and caught 1 pass for 8 yards.
- Against North Texas, Chatman caught 2 passes for 38 yards and carried the ball 4 times for 16 yards.
- Chatman is Navy's leading receiver with 7 catches for 146 yards (20.9 yds/catch).

LIMITING NEGATIVE PLAYS

- Navy's offensive line has done a nice job this season of not giving up negative plays. The Mids are 16th in the country in sacks allowed (1.0 per game) and 19th in tackles for loss allowed (4.00 per game).
- Connor McMahon** (Jr. / OT) has the 12th-best run blocking grade by Pro Football Focus for tackles with at least 275 snaps (75.5).

PIRRIS THE PLAYMAKER

- Luke Pirris** (So. / Raider) got his first real playing time of the season against USF after **Jordan Sanders** (Jr.) left with the injury and all he has done since being inserted into the lineup is make plays.
- Against USF, Pirris made 6 tackles, had a sack, recorded 2.5 tackles for loss, recovered a fumble and broke up 2 passes.
- He made his first-career start last week against North Texas and garnered AAC Defensive Player of the Week recognition after finishing with a career-high 9 tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, setting up Navy's game-winning score.
- His 2 fumble recoveries this fall are tied for the 3rd most in the country.

HARBOUR OFF TO A FAST START

- Will Harbour** (Sr. / LB) recorded 8 tackles, including a tackle for loss, in Navy's season opener against Notre Dame.
- Against Wagner, Harbour recorded 5 tackles, 1 tackle for loss and forced a fumble, while at Memphis he posted 7 tackles, 0.5 sacks and 0.5 tackles for loss.
- Harbour recorded a career-high 11 tackles against USF to go along with 1.5 tackles for loss, a sack and a quarterback hurry.
- Harbour had 5 tackles, 2 tackles for a loss and 1 sack in Navy's win over North Texas.
- Harbour leads the team with 36 tackles and 6 tackles for a loss.
- Harbour is averaging 5.0 solo tackles per game, which is good for 24th in the country, while teammate **Colin Ramos** (Jr. / LB) is 16th in solo tackles at 5.2 per game.

SACK PARTY

- Navy recorded a school-record 8 sacks against North Texas, beating the previous record of 6 (Rice in 2005 and Temple in 2006).
- Clay Cromwell** (Sr. / DT) led the way with 2, his first two of the year, while **Luke Pirris** (So. / Raider), **Andrew Duhart** (So. / CB), **Will Harbour** (Sr. / LB), **Xavier McDonald** (Sr. / Striker) and **Justin Reed** (Jr. / DE) had 1 apiece. **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr. / S) and **Landon Robinson** (So. / NG) shared a sack.
- Navy ranks 19th in the country in sacks, averaging 3.0 per game. The Mids finished 21st in the country last year in sacks with 2.83.

MCDONALD NAMED TO ALLSTATE GOOD WORKS TEAM, NOMINATED FOR TWO ADDITIONAL AWARDS

- Xavier McDonald** (Sr. / Striker) is one of 11 FBS players who has been selected to the 2023 Allstate American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team. He has also been nominated for the Football Writers Association Courage Award and appears on the watch list for the Wuerffel Trophy, college football's premier award for community service.
- The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team was established in 1992 by the College Football Association, recognizing the extra efforts made by college football players and student support staff off the field. The AFCA became the governing body of the award in 1997 and continues to honor college football players who go the extra mile for those in need. Allstate worked to present the award starting with the 2008 season.
- The Courage Award was first presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA) in 2002. A select group of writers from the FWAA vote on the winner each year. The requirements for nomination include displaying courage on or off the field, including overcoming an injury or physical handicap, preventing a disaster or living through hardship. The winner of the award will be included in festivities during Capital One Orange Bowl week and receive his trophy at an on-field presentation.
- McDonald, who is the starting striker on the Navy defense has completed nearly 50 hours of community service over the last year. He has made several visits to the Naval Academy Primary School in Annapolis to talk to the kids about his upbringing and provide a story of hope. He has also served as a tutor at the Naval Academy in thermodynamics.
- He overcame an enormously challenging childhood to become a high achiever in both academics and athletics in high school. He somehow managed to excel in football, track and field and academically, while working 30 to 35 hours a week and taking care of four younger siblings.
- He took on that heavy responsibility as a freshman in high school after both of his parents were incarcerated simultaneously.
- To help support himself and his siblings, McDonald got a job as a cashier at Winn-Dixie. During football season, he would ride a bicycle from Northeast High to the grocery store and work from 5:30 p.m. to 11 p.m. He then rode the bike home and studied, sometimes until 2 a.m. Despite the dire situation, McDonald was even more determined to succeed. He made the Northeast High varsity football team and started at safety as a sophomore, leading the team in tackles that season. He also maintained a 3.5 GPA.
- Allstate will honor the Good Works Team on Jan. 1 at the Allstate Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, an annual tradition provided courtesy of Allstate as an additional honor for being selected to the team. The trip will span 3-days and include a variety of events.
- Last year, McDonald was among the semifinalists for the sixth annual Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year, a group that included 20 of the nation's top leaders in college football.
- Compiled by a subset of the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Selection Committee, the semifinalists demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.
- McDonald is off to a great start on the field recording 25 tackles, 3 tackles for loss, 3 sacks, forcing 3 fumbles and recovering a fumble. He is 3rd in the country in forced fumbles per game (0.60).

- In Newberry's 5 years at Navy, the Mids are 16-4 (.800) when they "Get 6" (8-0 in 2019 / 2-0 in 2020 / 2-2 in 2021 / 2-1 in 2022 / 2-1 in 2023).

THE LANE TRAIN

- If you ask the Navy coaches to point out the best player on the field for the Mids, more often than not they would point to **Rayuan Lane III (Jr. / S)**.
- Lane has started 23-consecutive games over his career (6 Fr / 12 So / 5 Jr).
- As a freshman, Lane III finished with 37 tackles, 2 tackles for a loss, broke up 4 passes, intercepted a pass and forced a fumble.
- As a sophomore, he finished third on the team in tackles (71) and pass breakups (4). He also forced 2 fumbles, recovered 2 fumbles, recorded 2.5 tackles for loss and had a sack.
- This season, Lane III has 27 tackles (3rd on the team), 1 tackle for loss, 0.5 sacks, has accounted for both Navy interceptions (entered 2023 with 1 career INT), has 6 pass breakups (entered 2023 with 8-career PBUs), a fumble recovery and forced a fumble.
- In the season opener against Notre Dame, Lane III showed he was as good as anybody on the field, making 5 tackles, breaking up 2 passes and causing a fumble.
- Against Wagner, he recorded 4 tackles, broke up 2 passes, picked off a pass and assisted on a tackle for loss.
- At Memphis, Lane III had 6 tackles, an interception that gave Navy a chance to win the game and broke up 2 passes for the third-straight game.
- Against USF he had 6 tackles and a forced fumble.
- Against North Texas, he had 6 tackles and a half sack.
- His 8 passes defended in 5 games (6 pass breakups, 2 interceptions) are the 4th most in the country (1.6 per game).

THE FEW, THE PROUD

- Navy has four former Navy football players on its staff, including three on the coaching staff. All four either served in the Marine Corps or are currently serving in the Marine Corps.
- Cornerbacks coach **Robert Green** is a 1998 graduate of the Naval Academy and was a four-year letter winner at cornerback. He served 20 years in the Marine Corps and retired as a Lt. Col. He's in his 11th season with the football program.
- Slot backs coach **Marcus Thomas** is a 2014 grad and earned four varsity letters as a slot back. Thomas is the school record holder for career kickoff return yardage with 2,338 yards. He served five years in the Marine Corps and is in his second year with the football program.
- Wide receivers coach **Mick Yokitis** is a 2006 grad and was a three-year letterwinner as a wide receiver for the Mids. Yokitis served in the Marine Corps before being medically discharged. He is in his 13th year with the football program.
- Director of Player Development **Capt. Jalen Wade** is a 2017 graduate of the Naval Academy and is an active duty Marine. Wade played linebacker and fullback at Navy and earned one varsity letter. He is in his second year with the football program.

ROBINSON THE ONLY NOSE GUARD IN THE FBS ON THE KICKOFF TEAM

- **Landon Robinson** (So. / NG) is the only nose guard and one of just 11 defensive linemen on the kickoff team in the FBS.
- Robinson, who appeared on this year's Freaks List by Bruce Feldman in *The Athletic*, squats 600 pounds, bench presses 420 pounds and has a 33-inch vertical, all while gaining 30 pounds in the off-season.
- Robinson, who backs up **Donald Bernard Jr.** at nose guard, has recorded 13 tackles, 1.5 tackle for loss and 1 sack on the year.

RIETHMAN ON PACE TO SET SCHOOL RECORDS, NAMED TO RAY GUY WATCH LIST

- **Riley Riethman** (Jr. / P) is on the 2023 watch list for the Ray Guy Award which honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FBS.
- Riethman's 43.6 career average (115 punts, 5,010 yards) is the best average in school history (min. 50 attempts).
- Riethman has had two of the five-best single-game performances in Navy history (min. of 5 punts), averaging 50.6 yards per punt against Notre Dame in 2021 and 50.2 yards per punt against UCF in 2022.
- He averaged 42.7 yards per punt as a freshman.
- He followed up by averaging 43.8 yards per punt in 2022 which is tied for the third-best average in school history.
- Riethman is averaging 44.7 yards per punt this season, which would be the second-best average in school history if he had enough punts.
- Riethman has been named to the Ray Guy Award Great 8 weekly honor roll following his performance in 2 of Navy's first 4 games (Wagner and Memphis).

HASSAN'S HEROICS

- **Amin Hassan** (Jr) had a career-long 57-yard punt return in Navy's 53-21 victory over Tulsa in 2022.
- The return was the longest punt return by a Navy player since 1996 when Ross Scott returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown in Navy's 1996 Homecoming win over Duke (64-27).
- Hassan averaged 8.8 yards per punt return in 2022 which was the 18th-best average in the country.
- This year, he has 3 punt returns for 53 yards (17.7 yds/return).

MURTEZI, HARBOUR, BUSIC AND UMBARGER NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

- Navy head football coach **Brian Newberry** announced at the annual Navy Football Senior Salute that seniors **Lirion Murtezi** and **Will Harbour** were voted team captains for the 2023 season by their teammates.
- "Our players have spoken and I couldn't be more pleased with the two captains they have chosen to lead and represent our program," said Newberry. "Player-led teams are the best teams and Will and Lirion will be exceptional in their roles both on the field and in Bancroft Hall. They personify everything the Naval Academy and Navy football are all about."
- Newberry announced on July 29 that **Jacob Busic** and **Jayden Umbarger** would join Murtezi and Harbour as team captains for the 2023 season. It's just the third time (2019, 2021) in school history Navy has had four team captains.
- "Some years it's hard to pick captains," said Newberry. "Some years you pick captains and you aren't sure how it's going to go, but this year it was extremely easy. I could have told you at this point last year that these four guys would be captains this year and I couldn't be more excited about how they are going about their business right now. They are the most respected players on the team because they have done the work."

REED NAMED WINNER OF ADMIRAL MACK AWARD

- **Justin Reed** (Jr. / DE) was named the winner of the 2023 Admiral Mack Award, which is awarded to the most improved player during spring football practice.
- Reed has played in all 24 games his first-two years, starting a pair of contests. He has recorded 19 tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, 1 sack and 1 fumble recovery. He had a career-high 4 tackles last year against Notre Dame.
- The Vice Admiral Mack Award was established in 1976 and is named in honor of the Naval Academy Superintendent from 1972-75. Admiral Mack was a strong supporter of the school's intercollegiate athletic program.
- Reed is the fourth-consecutive defensive player to be chosen and the 27th overall over the past 46 years. He is the sixth defensive end to win the award and the first since Jackson Perkins in 2019. Reed's teammate, co-captain **Will Harbour** (Sr / LB), won the award last year.

- **Eavan Gibbons** (Sr / S) was named a 2022 Second-Team Academic All-American by College Sports Communicators. It is the fourth-consecutive year a Navy football player has earned Academic All-America honors.
- Gibbons, who started all 12 games in 2022 and recorded 54 tackles, 5 tackles for loss, 1 sack, 1 fumble recovery and 2 forced fumbles, carries a 3.53 grade-point average as an ocean engineering major.

NAVY EARNS AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

- Navy, Air Force, Boston College, Northwestern, Stanford, Toledo and Vanderbilt shared the American Football Coaches Association's 2022 Academic Achievement Award, presented by the Memphis Touchdown Club.
- All seven schools recorded a 100 percent graduation rate for members of their 2015 freshman football classes.
- It marked the 11th time the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate (GSR) formula was used to select the winner. From 1981 to 2007, the award was presented based on a formula used by the College Football Association (CFA) and the AFCA. From 2008-17, the criteria for the AFCA's Academic Achievement Award was based on the highest NCAA GSR, and a Federal Graduation Rate of 75 percent or better. For 2018 and 2019, the AFCA used the NCAA's single-year APR. The AFCA returned to the NCAA GSR for 2022.
- The GSR is based on a six-year graduation window for student-athletes and holds institutions accountable for transfer students, unlike the federal graduation rate. The GSR also accounts for mid-year enrollees and non-scholarship students at schools that do not offer athletics aid. Under GSR calculation, institutions are not penalized for outgoing transfer students who leave in good academic standing. These outgoing transfers are passed to the receiving institution's GSR cohort.
- The Academic Achievement Award was established by the CFA in 1981. The award recognized the CFA-member FBS institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. When the CFA disbanded in 1997, the AFCA stepped in to present the award.

THE AMERICAN WELCOMES SIX DISTINGUISHED UNIVERSITIES

- As the American Athletic Conference celebrates its 10th anniversary, it enters its second decade poised to continue its remarkable ascension to national prominence.
- As of July 1, The American will consist of 15 prestigious institutions: Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), Charlotte, East Carolina, Florida Atlantic (FAU), Memphis, Navy (football only), North Texas, Rice, South Florida (USF), Southern Methodist (SMU), Temple, Texas at San Antonio (UTSA), Tulane, Tulsa and Wichita State (basketball, Olympic sports).
- "I want to issue a warm welcome to our six distinguished schools as they officially enter our conference," said Commissioner Mike Aresco. "UAB, Florida Atlantic, Charlotte, North Texas, Rice and UTSA are going to be great additions to our powerful conference. Together with our nine outstanding incumbent universities, we will continue to elevate our brand and to make our mark on college athletics at the highest level. The 15 schools of our reinvented American Athletic Conference join together to celebrate our remarkable first decade and to look forward to the next decade with renewed determination and commitment. The future is bright."
- In the 2023-24 season, The American will be the only Division I conference to have a New Year's Six bowl winner (Tulane) and an NCAA Men's Final Four participant (Florida Atlantic) in its ranks. In football, The American will be one of four FBS conferences (along with the Big Ten, Pac-12 and SEC) to have at least two 11-win teams from last year (Tulane, UTSA).
- The six incoming schools combined to win 14 championships in their previous conference last year, while the nine incumbent members from the American won 13 conference titles in the 2022-23 season.
- The American's new configuration will contribute to a legacy that includes four NCAA championship teams, a College Football Playoff semifinalist, four New Year's Six bowl champions, two NCAA Men's Final Four participants, six Women's Final Four Teams, a College World Series team, an NIT champion and 15 NCAA individual champions - all since the start of the 2013-14 season.
- Individually, student-athletes from the incumbent schools in The American have won the National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy as the top scholar-athlete in college football, the Bednarik Award and the Nagurski Trophy as the nation's top defensive player, a fifth-place finish in the Heisman Trophy race, a Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete, two Academic All-America of the Year selections and a Rhodes Scholarship.
- The reconfiguration of The American further concentrates the league in major metropolitan areas and recruiting strongholds. The league has four teams in the state of Texas, two each in Florida and North Carolina and one each in Pennsylvania, Maryland, Louisiana, Tennessee, Alabama, Oklahoma and Kansas. That results in a presence in four of the top 10, six of the top 25 and 12 of the top 52 Nielsen media markets.
- It also allows for The American to enjoy a lucrative and comprehensive media rights partnership with ESPN, giving the conference a significant presence on the Worldwide Leader's primary television networks (ABC, ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU) and an all-sports presence on ESPN+, the industry's leading streaming service with more than 25.3 million subscribers.

JOHNSON SELECTED TO NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION AND COLLEGE HALL OF FAME

- Former Navy football head coach Paul Johnson is the 25th person that either played or coached at the Naval Academy to be selected to the College Football Hall of Fame and the fifth coach joining Gil Dobie (1917-19), William Ingram (1916-18), Wayne Hardin (1959-64) and George Welsh (1973-81).
- Capitalizing on his patented spread option offense – one of the most innovative offensive schemes in all of college football – Paul Johnson took three programs to the top of their respective conferences and the national rankings, winning two national titles, five conference championships and making 18 bowl appearances. The Newland, North Carolina, native now becomes the first coach from Georgia Southern, the fourth coach from Georgia Tech, and the fifth coach from Navy to enter the College Football Hall of Fame.
- In his last stop at Georgia Tech, Johnson went 82-60 during 11 seasons, and the Yellow Jackets appeared in the final national rankings in 2008 (No. 22), 2009 (No. 13), and 2014 (No. 8). He led Georgia Tech to nine bowl games, including two New Year's Six bowls (Orange 2009, 2014). The Yellow Jackets appeared in three ACC Championship games during his tenure and won the ACC Coastal Division four times. His Georgia Tech teams led the ACC in rushing offense every year, and he was named ACC Coach of the Year three times (2008, 2009, 2014). He is the fourth-winningest coach at Georgia Tech behind John Heisman, William Alexander, and Bobby Dodd, who are all in College Football Hall of Fame. He coached two of nine total 10-win seasons and one of five 11-win seasons in Georgia Tech history.
- At Navy, he inherited a program that had gone 1-20 in the previous two seasons. Johnson transformed the program, and during his six seasons in Annapolis, the Midshipmen went 45-29, landing at No. 24 in the Associated Press poll in 2004. He coached Navy to five bowl berths. Johnson went 11-1 in Commander-In-Chief's trophy games, winning five CIC trophies, which represents the annual winner of the Air Force-Army-Navy round-robin. He never lost to Army, going 6-0 against the Black Knights, and in 2007 he led Navy to a victory over Notre Dame for the first time in 43 years.
- In his five seasons at Georgia Southern, the Eagles notched a 62-10 record, making five FCS playoff appearances and winning the FCS championship twice (1999 and 2000). He won the Southern Conference with Georgia Southern every year. He was twice named Southern Conference Coach of the Year (1997 and 1998) while heading the Eagles program. The 1999 team led the nation in scoring, rushing and total offense, and set the NCAA single-season record for average rushing yards per game (419.0) while breaking 197 schools records. Johnson was inducted into the Georgia Southern Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.
- Johnson coached 11 First-Team All-Americans and one First-Team Academic All-American. He coached 1999 Walter Payton Award winner and 2017 College Football Hall of Fame inductee Adrian Peterson at Georgia Southern and 2010 Burlsworth Trophy recipient Sean Bedford at Georgia Tech.
- Johnson was recognized as the CBS National Coach of the Year in 2008, the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in 2004, and the Eddie Robinson Award winner as the I-AA National Coach of the Year in 1998. He was twice named the AFCA NCAA Division I-AA National Coach of the Year (1999, 2000).
- Before becoming a head coach, Johnson served as offensive coordinator at Navy (1995-96), Hawaii (1987-94), Georgia Southern (1985-86) and as defensive line coach at Georgia Southern (1983-84). During his first stint at Georgia Southern, he was part of the coaching team that won consecutive FCS National Championships (1985-86) with the Eagles, and as the offensive coordinator at Georgia Southern, he mentored College Football Hall of Fame inductee Tracy Ham. His coaching career began with roles as an offensive coordinator at Avery County (N.C.) High School from 1979-80 and at nearby Lees-McRae College from 1981-82.
- He has participated in a wide variety of charitable endeavors at each of his schools over the years, including his annual participation in the Bobby Dodd and Chick-fil-A charity

golf tournaments, which raises money for the Bobby Dodd Foundation, WinShape Homes and the schools' scholarship funds. Johnson earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina in 1979 and his master's in health and physical education from Appalachian State in 1982.

GLADCHUK A MEMBER OF THE CFP COMMITTEE

- The College Football Playoff (CFP) Management Committee appointed NC State Athletics Director Boo Corrigan as selection committee chair for the 2022 football season, replacing Gary Barta (Iowa).
- Hancock also announced the Management Committee has appointed **Chet Gladchuk**, athletics director at the Naval Academy; Jim Grobe, longtime head coach at Ohio, Wake Forest and Baylor; Warde Manuel, athletics director at Michigan; and Kelly Whiteside, longtime sportswriter for USA Today, Sports Illustrated and Newsday, to the CFP Selection Committee.
- Gladchuk is in his 22nd year as Director of Athletics at the Naval Academy. He arrived in Annapolis in 2001 from Houston, where he had been the Director of Athletics for four years.
- Before Houston, Gladchuk led his alma mater, Boston College, as its the Director of Athletics, Intramurals and Recreation for 7 years. Prior to rejoining Boston College, he served as Director of Athletics at Tulane from 1987-90 after a 1985-87 stint as an Associate AD at Syracuse.
- Gladchuk lettered in football at Boston College and after graduating went on to earn a master's degree from Massachusetts-Amherst, where he began his career in intercollegiate athletics. He also had served as Director of Athletics and head football coach for the New Hampton (Prep) School in New Hampshire prior to leaving for UMass.

FUTURE ARMY-NAVY SITES ANNOUNCED

- The Army-Navy Football Game presented by USAA, "America's Game," will be played in 5 different cities over the next 5 years it was announced by Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk and Army West Point Director of Athletics Mike Buddie.
- Boston / Foxborough will serve as the 2023 host (Dec. 9), Washington, DC / Landover, Md. will host the 2024 game on Dec. 14, Baltimore will host the 2025 game on Dec. 13, New York City / East Rutherford, N.J. will host the 2026 game on Dec. 12 and Philadelphia will host the 2027 game on Dec. 11. All five games will be televised nationally by CBS.
- The 2023 game will be hosted in the Boston region in conjunction with the 250th anniversary of the Boston Tea Party and the 225th anniversary of the USS Constitution's maiden voyage. This will be the first time the Army-Navy game has been played in the New England region and Navy will serve as the home team.
- The nation's capital will be the backdrop for the 2024 game, which will also be the 125th playing of the Army-Navy game. This will be just the second time the game has been played in the D.C. region and the first since 2011, a game in which Navy won 27-21. Army will serve as the home team.
- The game will return to Baltimore in 2025 with Fort McHenry, the site where Francis Scott Key penned the lyrics to the national anthem, serving as the backdrop. It will be the seventh time Baltimore has hosted the game and the first time since 2016. The two teams are 3-3 in games played in Baltimore. Navy will serve as the home team.
- New York / New Jersey will host the 2026 game as part of the 25th anniversary of 9/11. It will be the 19th time the game has been played in New York or New Jersey and the sixth time it has been played at the Meadowlands Complex. Navy is 4-1 against Army in games played in East Rutherford, including a 17-13 win in 2021. Army will serve as the home team.
- Philadelphia will host the annual Army-Navy game for the 91st time in 2027. Navy leads the all-time series 45-42-4 in games played in Philadelphia. Navy will be the home team in 2027.

NAVY PICKED NINTH IN THE AAC PRESEASON POLL

- The Tulane Green Wave, which won its first American Athletic Conference title as part of a history-marking 2022 season, was chosen as the 2023 favorite as the conference unveiled its preseason media poll as part of The American's Football Media Days at the Live! by Loews resort.
- Tulane received 20 of a possible 34 first-place votes to finish with 457 points in the poll, while UTSA, the 2022 Conference USA champion, was second at 440 points. The Roadrunners, who are among the six new members of The American as of the 2023 season, had nine first-place votes.
- Tulane enters the season as the favorite in The American after the Green Wave completed the greatest single-season turnaround in college football history last year, improving by 9.5 wins from 2021 (2-10) to 2022 (12-2). Tulane returns 14 starters from last year's squad, which finished the season ranked No. 9 in the national polls on the heels of a thrilling 46-45 win against USC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.
- Among the returning starters for Tulane is quarterback Michael Pratt, a junior who passed for 3,009 yards and 27 touchdowns while adding 10 rushing TDs a year ago. Head Coach Willie Fritz will have four returning starters on the offensive line and eight starters back from a defense that ranked third in the conference in total defense (360.4 ypg) and second in scoring defense (22.2 ppg).
- UTSA was tabbed for second in the preseason poll after the Roadrunners went 11-3 and claimed its second-consecutive Conference USA title. Jeff Traylor's squad has gone 23-5 in the last two seasons and has been ranked in the top 25 six times during that stretch. The 23 wins trails only Georgia (29), Michigan (25) and Alabama (24) among FBS teams in the last two seasons. UTSA will have 18 starters and 50 letterwinners back in 2023, including veteran quarterback Frank Harris, who was the 2022 Conference USA Most Valuable Player.
- SMU was picked third by the media as the Mustangs had three first-place votes. The Mustangs return 16 starters and 40 letter winners from last year's 7-6 squad and bolstered the roster with a number of established FBS transfers in the offseason. Head Coach Rhett Lashlee's offense averaged 37.2 points and 472.9 yards per game last season.
- Memphis, which has had nine consecutive seasons at .500 or better, was fourth in the preseason poll. The Tigers, who went 7-6 last year, will be led by junior quarterback Seth Henigan, who has turned in back-to-back 3,000-yard seasons.
- Florida Atlantic was fifth in the poll as Tom Herman begins his tenure as the Owls' head coach. Herman returns to The American as the conference's career winning percentage leader after he went 22-4 in two seasons at Houston (2015-16). He has a 2023 squad with 18 returning starters, including running back Larry McCammon, who had 1,004 yards and seven touchdowns last season.
- The American continued to live up to its status as one of the top FBS conferences in 2022. Tulane's top-10 finish was the sixth by an American Athletic Conference team in the league's first 10 seasons, while the Green Wave gave the conference its fourth New Year's Six bowl win. The American has sent a team to either the New Year's Six or the College Football Playoff seven times in nine seasons of the CFP era and eight times in the 10-year history of the conference.

NAVY NAMED ONE OF THE TOP SPORTS INFORMATION OFFICES IN THE COUNTRY FOR A SIXTH TIME

- Two first-time winners and nine previous ones comprise the 14th Super 11 Awards, which the Football Writers Association of America presents annually to the best performing College Sports Communicators departments in the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision.
- As for the 2022 CSC department awards, Clemson and Colorado each collected a 10th award and Nebraska a ninth. Navy won for the sixth time, Kansas State and Pitt each a fifth time and South Carolina, UAB and West Virginia each a second time.
- Navy has now won the award in four of the last five years. It was also honored in 2010, 2016, 2018, 2019 and 2021.
- The first-time recipients in the 2022 Super 11 award, which dates back to the 2009 season, are BYU and TCU. Seven of the 10 FBS Conferences and one Independent are represented among the 11 winners this season.
- Last year, with the pandemic a lesser concern, in-person press access to college football teams improved dramatically. But work for access still remains.
- The 2022 winners were deemed to have had excellent accessibility during the week of the game and after the game--with a program's players, coaches and assistant coaches -- along with other listed criteria.
- FWAA members provided input during the season when press boxes were judged on how well they were run and maintained in terms of neutrality, pool reporters, noise level and accessibility to the press box that could affect a media person's ability to his or her job.
- In addition, Virginia has been awarded a special commendation for its media access after the tragic shooting deaths last fall on campus of three Cavalier football players and the injuries of two others.
- In January 2009, the FWAA formed the first Super 11 Committee. The concept is supported by the College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA).
- Founded in 1941, the Football Writers Association of America consists of journalists, broadcasters, publicists, photographers and key executives in all areas of college football. NAVY HEAD COACH BRIAN NEWBERRY

FIFTH SEASON AT NAVY | FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH



On Dec. 19, 2022, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk introduced **Brian Newberry** as the program's 39th head football coach. Newberry had served as the defensive coordinator at Navy the previous four seasons.

Navy closed out the 2022 campaign ranked third in the

nation against the run which is even more impressive when you consider it was the only defense ranked in the top 25 that faced 3 of the top-10 rushing offenses in the country. Navy also finished third in fewest first downs allowed, 23rd in sacks, 22nd in fumbles recovered and 32nd in total defense.

Striker John Marshall ('23) finished third in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss per game while setting school records for single-season and single-game sacks. Marshall was the only unanimous First-Team All-American Athletic Conference selection in 2022.

In 2021, the Navy defense acquitted itself well by finishing #32 in the nation in rushing defense, #34 in total defense and #34 in red zone defense. Linebacker Diego Fagot was distinguished with All-America honors, First-Team All-American Athletic Conference and was named All-East. He was also named MVP of the East-West Shrine All-Star Game.

In 2020, after a slow start due to COVID, the defense finished the year with a flurry, holding Memphis, Tulsa and Army to under 300 yards of total offense. It was the first time a Navy defense had achieved that feat since 1997.

In 2019, Newberry's first year on the job, Navy made massive improvements on the defense.

Navy ranked 20th in third down defense (121st in 2018), 10th in rushing defense (90th in 2018), 39th in passing defense (75th in 2018), 16th in total defense (86th in 2018) and 34th in scoring defense (103rd in 2018).

Newberry, a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, presented annually to the best assistant coach in college football, and his defensive staff installed a "Get 6" culture within the Navy defense that took off. Newberry told the defensive players if they got a combination of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops, turnovers and defensive touchdowns in a game, the Mids would win. In 2019, Navy was 8-0 when it managed to "Get 6."

The Mids finished 10th in the nation against the run despite facing the #2, #3 and #11 rushing offenses in the country. Navy forced the opposing offense off the field in 3 plays or less in 36 percent of its drives, which was the nation's 10th-best average. Navy also gave up just 15.2 first downs per game, which was tied for third best.

Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Newberry served as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kennesaw State from 2015-18, leading the Owls to the FCS quarterfinals in each of his last two seasons.

Newberry joined the Kennesaw State coaching staff after spending the 2012 season as defensive coordinator at Northern Michigan. Prior to his one season at Northern Michigan, Newberry served as defensive coordinator/linebackers coach at the University of the South in 2011 where the Tigers improved their scoring defense by 16 points per game and total defense by 85 yards a contest.

Newberry's coaching experience also includes 4 seasons (2007-10) as defensive backs coach at Elon and 5 years (2004-06, 2001 and 2002) as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach at Washington & Lee. He also served as a graduate assistant/defensive line coach at Rice during the spring of 2004, spent one season (2003) as an assistant defensive backs coach at Lehigh and began his coaching career at Southern Arkansas where he was a graduate assistant coaching the defensive backs and wide receivers in 1999 and 2000.

In 2004, Newberry's Washington & Lee defense produced a school-record 43 sacks and ranked among the Division III leaders in rushing defense. The Generals' defense led the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in pass defense, rush defense and scoring defense in 2005 and in 2006, Washington & Lee forced 30 turnovers and ranked among the nation's leaders in pass defense.

Newberry played collegiately at Baylor and graduated in 1998 with a Bachelor of Science in education. He helped lead the Bears to the Southwest Conference Co-Championship and an appearance in the 1994 Alamo Bowl. In 1995, Baylor was ranked #5 in total defense.

#27: HONORING A LEGEND - JOE BELLINO

- In August of 2019, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced that Joe Bellino's #27 would be placed on the turf at the 27-yard line at both ends of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium facing Navy's sideline as a tribute and in memory of the 1960 Heisman Trophy winner, who passed away on March 27, 2019.
- Additionally, Navy wore a helmet sticker in Bellino's memory during the 2019 season.
- He was the first Navy player to win the Heisman Trophy and the first to have his number retired.
- Bellino, a native of Winchester, Mass., was known as the player who was never caught from behind. In just three seasons, he scored 31 touchdowns, rushed for 1,664 yards on 330 carries, returned 37 kicks for 833 yards and set 15 school records.
- Bellino was a unanimous All-America selection at halfback in 1960 and was also the winner of the Maxwell Award. His end zone interception preserved Navy's 17-12 win over Army that season. The Midshipmen were ranked as high as fourth in the country and went on to play in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1961.
- He was also an outstanding catcher and outfielder on the Navy baseball team. He hit .428 in 22 games in 1959 and led the Eastern Intercollegiate League in stolen bases. He had a .320 average in 1960 and was the baseball team captain in 1961.
- Army partisans can hardly forget the 1959-60 academic year for what Bellino did to the Cadets. In addition to his three-touchdown performance in the 1959 Army-Navy football game, he was equally sensational in the Army-Navy baseball game in 1960. Bellino went 4-for-4 at the plate, drove in three runs, stole two bases and threw out two Army runners attempting to steal as Navy carved out a 9-1 win.
- Bellino capped off his senior year (1960-61) by winning the school's top two athletic awards, the Thompson Trophy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. It marked the first time in 41 years that one midshipman received both of these awards.
- Bellino's #27 football jersey was retired after the 1960 season. He had a three-year stint with the Boston Patriots after he had completed his four-year service obligation. He stayed in the Navy Reserves for 24 more years and reached the rank of Captain.
- He was a 1977 inductee into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was named to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial All-Stadium Team. During its annual season-ending football banquet, Navy presents the Joe Bellino Award to the varsity football player whose inspiring on-field performance made a significant impact on the team and contributed to its overall success during the season.

SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS IN NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM HISTORY

- Sept. 26, 1959** – Navy defeats William & Mary 29-2 in the first game played at the stadium.
- Sept. 24, 1960** – President Eisenhower watches as the Midshipmen defeat Villanova 41-7.
- Nov. 12, 1960** – Heisman Trophy winner Joe Bellino of Navy sets a school record by scoring four touchdowns in a 41-6 win over Virginia.
- Oct. 26, 1963** – Heisman Trophy winner Roger Staubach leads the Mids to a 24-12 win over unbeaten Pittsburgh by completing 14-of-19 passes, seven to Jim Campbell.
- Sept. 23, 1967** – Navy receiver Rob Taylor sets school records for most catches (10) and most yards receiving (140) in a game, as Navy beats Penn State 23-22 when Taylor catches a 16-yard TD pass with 57 seconds left.
- Nov. 12, 1977** – Navy beats Georgia Tech 20-12 as Naval Academy alumnus President Jimmy Carter watches.
- Sept. 12, 1981** – Navy defeats The Citadel for its 500th all-time win.
- Nov. 7, 1981** – Eddie Meyers sets a Navy record for most rushing yardage in a game with 298 yards and four touchdowns in the Mids' 35-23 win over Syracuse.
- Nov. 17, 1984** – Navy defeats second-ranked South Carolina 38-21 in one of the biggest upsets ever for the Mids. It marks only the third time Navy has beaten an opponent ranked this high.
- Sept. 22, 1990** – Alton Grizzard becomes Navy's all-time career total offense leader in a 23-21 win over Villanova.
- Oct. 5, 1996** – The Mids explode for 64 points to top Duke 64-27 on Homecoming.
- Nov. 9, 1996** – Navy clinches its first winning season since 1982 with a 30-14 victory over Delaware.
- Sept. 13, 1997** – Chris McCoy ties an NCAA record by rushing for three touchdowns on consecutive carries, as Navy defeated Rutgers 36-7.
- Oct. 18, 1997** – Gerald Wilson returns an interception 95 yards for a touchdown, as Navy defeats VMI 42-7. The 95-yard interception return is a stadium record and second longest in school history.
- Nov. 22, 1997** – Pat McGrew had a 91-yard touchdown run, second longest in school history and longest in stadium history, as Navy rolls over Kent State 62-29.
- Nov. 22, 2003** – Quarterback Craig Candeto directed touchdown drives on all eight possessions he played as Navy destroyed Central Michigan 63-34 in front of a Senior Day crowd of 29,527. The win made Navy bowl eligible for the first time since 1996.
- Nov. 20, 2004** – Kyle Eckel, Aaron Polanco and Eric Roberts rushed for two touchdowns apiece as Navy routed Rutgers 54-21, in front of a Senior Day crowd of 33,615. Navy, which scored 47-consecutive points in the game, rushed for 476 yards and 613 yards of total offense. The victory gave Navy an undefeated record at home for the first time since 1996.
- Oct. 8, 2005** – On a day that was already special because of the rededication of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, Joey Bullen made it even more memorable by drilling a 46-yard field goal with four-tenths of a second remaining to give Navy a thrilling 27-24 comeback victory over Air Force.
- Aug. 30, 2008** – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and 3 touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.
- Nov. 1, 2008** – Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs' 1-yard run in OT gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 victory over Temple.
- Oct. 3, 2009** – Navy shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while Joe Buckley drilled 3 field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.
- Oct. 20, 2012** – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana, 31-30, on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parrish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.
- Oct. 26, 2013** – One week after missing an extra-point against Toledo in the second overtime, Nick Sloan booted a 30-yard field goal against Pitt as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.
- Nov. 15, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record 6 touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.
- Sept. 19, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds ran for 5 touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut, 45-21.
- Oct. 3, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.
- Nov. 14, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record scoring 4 rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of SMU. The 4 rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.
- Dec. 28, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career by rushing for 3 scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 win over Pitt in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with La. Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, setting a school record (at the time).
- Oct. 8, 2016** – Will Worth ran for a touchdown and threw for 2 more, while Josiah Powell picked off a pass and returned it 34-yards for a touchdown to lead Navy to a 46-40 upset of #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a top 10 opponent since beat #2 South Carolina in 1984.
- Oct. 7, 2017** – Zach Abey fired a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds remaining to give Navy a thrilling 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792. It was the highest scoring game in the history of the Navy-Air Force series.
- Nov. 11, 2017** – Making his first career start at quarterback, Malcolm Perry rushed for 282 yards and 4 touchdowns on 33 carries to lead Navy to a 43-40 victory over SMU. Perry had a stadium-record 92-yard touchdown run in the game.
- Oct. 5, 2019** – Malcolm Perry scored on a 3-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds left to give Navy a 28-25 lead, and Tony Brown recovered an Air Force fumble on the ensuing possession and ran 8 yards for a touchdown to give Navy a stunning 34-25 victory over Air Force.
- Oct. 26, 2019** – Bijan Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a 41-38 victory over Tulane. The Nichols field goal is believed to be the longest to win a game in Navy history (final 1:00 of regulation or overtime).
- Nov. 23, 2019** – Malcolm Perry rushed for 195 yards and 2 touchdowns on 38 carries, while completing 9 of his 15 pass attempts for 162 yards and a touchdown as Navy upset No. 21 SMU, 35-28. Perry's 70-yard touchdown run on third-and-10 with 6:11 left put Navy up for good.

- Hartman threw touchdown passes of 35 and 20 yards to Jaden Greathouse, 14 yards to Jayden Thomas and 25 yards to Deion Colzie as he showed why he is one of the Heisman Trophy favorites this year. Audric Estime added 95 yards rushing and a touchdown on 16 carries as the Irish piled up 444 yards of total offense.
- Navy was able to move the ball at times on Notre Dame, but struggled to finish drives and was hurt by 49 yards of negative plays thanks to a bad snap and a sack that reduced its rushing yards from 175 yards to 126 yards.

- Tai Lavatai** (Sr / QB) gained 227 yards of total offense, including 161 yards through the air, and 1 touchdown to lead Navy (1-1) to a 24-0 victory over Wagner (0-2) at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The win marked the first for Navy head coach Brian Newberry and it was Navy's first shutout since beating Army 34-0 in 2008.
- The game was delayed twice for a total of 1 hour and 32 minutes due to lightning in the area. The first delay was 22 minutes before the game even started and the second was 1 hour and 10 minutes in the third quarter.
- Lavatai was sharp early, leading the Mids on a 7-play, 77-yard drive on the Mids' first possession that was capped off by a 3-yard touchdown run by **Daba Fofana** (Jr / FB). The big play on the drive was a 45-yard pass from Lavatai to **Anton Hall Jr.** (Jr / SB).
- The Mids led by just a 10-0 score late in the second quarter, but Lavatai led the Mids on a 5-play, 80-yard drive in just 40 seconds, capping off the furious race down the field with a 12-yard touchdown pass to **Camari Williams** (Sr / WR), the first of his career, to give Navy the 17-0 lead at the break. Lavatai was 5-for-5 passing on the drive, hitting **Nathan Kent** (So / WR) twice for 45 yards, **Alex Tecza** (So / FB) for 14 yards and Williams on the final two plays for 21 yards.
- The defense dominated the Seahawks' offense all day, allowing just 227 yards of total offense. Wagner gained 84 yards on the ground on 32 attempts and 143 yards through the air. **Clay Cromwell** (Sr / DT) led Navy with a career-high 8 tackles, while **Elias Larry** (Jr / CB) had a career-high 7 stops and **Mbiti Williams Jr.** (Jr / S) tied his career high with 7 tackles.
- Navy was able to preserve the shutout by forcing two turnovers in the red zone. The first was a forced fumble by **Will Harbour** (Sr / LB) that was recovered by **Jacob Busic** (Sr / DE) and the second was an interception by **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr / S) in the end zone. It was Navy's first shutout at home since beating Lafayette 7-0 in 1994.
- Eli Heidenreich** (So / SB) capped off the scoring with a 46-yard touchdown run with 10:44 left in the fourth quarter. Heidenreich led the Mids in rushing with 66 yards on just 4 carries.
- Wagner was led by Zachary Palmer-Smith with 52 yards rushing on 13 carries, while Rickey Sprull gained 26 yards on 10 carries. Second-team quarterback Damien Mazil came off the bench for an injured Steven Krajewski and completed 11 of his 23 pass attempts for 100 yards.

- Quarterback Seth Henigan completed 23 of 35 passes for 218 yards and a touchdown while running for 2 more to lead Memphis to a thrilling 28-24 win over Navy at Simmons Bank Liberty Stadium in Memphis. The game featured 3 ties and 2 lead changes.
- Memphis jumped out to a 7-0 lead on a 13-play, 90-yard drive on its first possession of the game with Blake Watson scoring from 7 yard outs.
- The Mids would answer on the next play as **Alex Tecza** (So / FB) took a pitch and ran by the Memphis secondary for a 75-yard touchdown run.
- After the Navy defense came up with a stop, the Mids would roll down the field on a 6-play, 77-yard drive and take the lead on a 16-yard touchdown pass from **Tai Lavatai** (Sr / QB) to **Regis Velez** (Jr / WR). It was Velez's first career catch.
- Henigan led Memphis on an 8-play, 56-yard drive in 56 second that was capped off by a 7-yard touchdown pass to Roc Taylor to tie the game at 14.
- The Mids gambled to start the second half, calling for an onside kick and the play was there but **Evan Warren** (Jr) kicked the ball out of bounds to give the Tigers the ball on the Navy 47. Seven plays later Memphis had regained the lead on a one yard run by Henigan.
- Navy fought back as Lavatai led Navy on an 85-yard drive that was capped off by an **Anton Hall Jr.** (Jr / SB) 2-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 21 with 9:08 left in the third quarter.
- The fourth quarter was a wild one. Henigan gave the Tigers a 28-21 lead at the start of the fourth on his second touchdown run of the night, this one from 3 yards.
- After Navy's third-straight three-and-out, the Mids went to **Blake Horvath** (So / QB), who led Navy on a drive that ended with a 36-yard field goal by **Nathan Kirkwood** (So / K).
- Memphis looked like it put the game away on the next series when Watson broke through the Navy defense for a 69-yard run, but **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr / S) ran Watson down and knocked him out at the one-yard line. On the next play, Henigan fumbled the handoff to Watson and the ball was recovered in the end zone by **Justin Reed** (Jr / DE) to give the Mids life.
- On second-and-seven at the Navy 38-yard line, Horvath fumbled after picking up 5 yards and Memphis recovered at the Navy 43.
- On third-and-11, Henigan threw the ball over the middle and it was intercepted by Lane III, who returned the pick 25 yards to the Navy 49-yard line.
- Navy would get the ball down to the Memphis 13, but on fourth-and-6 from the Mids' 15 Lavatai would hit **Jayden Umbarger** (Sr / WR) with a slant over the middle. It was initially ruled a first down at the Memphis 9, but replay overturned the spot of the foul and ruled that Umbarger was a yard short giving Memphis the win.

- USF quarterback Byrum Brown completed 26 of his 34 pass attempts for 338 yards and 3 touchdowns to lead the Bulls to a 44-30 victory over Navy in Annapolis.
- Brown, who entered play as the #1 rushing quarterback in the nation (87.8 yds/gm) was held to -27 yards rushing thanks to a Navy defense that recorded 6 tackles for loss and 4 sacks. Brown, however, hurt the Mids through the air, including an 88-yard touchdown pass to Sean Atkins that gave USF its first lead of the game at 21-14 with 8:20 left in the second quarter.
- The game couldn't have started any better for the Mids as USF muffed a punt and the fumble was recovered by a hustling **Rayuan Lane III** (Jr / FS). Four plays later, **Tai Lavatai** (Sr / QB) scored on a quarterback sneak from the 1 to make the score 7-0.
- On the ensuing possession, the Bulls went for it on 4th-and-1 from their own 30 and Brown was stoned by the Navy defense with **Colin Ramos** (Jr / WILL) and **Mbiti Williams Jr.** (Jr / Bandit) finishing him off for no gain to give Navy the ball back.
- It took just 4 plays for Navy to score as **Daba Fofana** (Jr / FB) ran for 20 yards on 3rd-and-4 from the USF 24 and then Lavatai scored from 4 yards out to give Navy a 14-0 lead.
- USF would answer with 21-straight points on three-straight drives as Brown hit Atkins with a 1-yard touchdown pass, Nay'Quan Wright scored from 10 yards out and Brown hit Atkins with the bomb to make it 21-14 Bulls.
- After a 14-yard run by **Alex Tecza** (So / FB) got the ball down to the 6, the Mids would only gain 4 yards on the next 3 plays to set up a fourth-and-goal at the USF 2. **Blake Horvath** (So / QB) rolled left and evaded 2 defenders to hit **Anton Hall Jr.** (Jr / SB) with a 2-yard TD pass.
- Disaster struck on the tying extra-point as the snap by reserve **Rayne Frye** (Fr) was a tad high and holder **Kellen Grave de Peralta** (Jr) was unable to catch it. USF's Jhalyn Shuler picked up the errant snap and took it to the end zone for 2 points to give USF a 23-20 lead at the half.
- The Mids took over on the USF 39-yard line. Navy would gain just 12 yards on the drive and settled for a career-long 44-yard field goal by **Nathan Kirkwood** (So) to tie the game at 23.
- After both teams traded punts, USF would regain the lead on a 3rd-and-8 pass from Brown to Michael Brown-Stephens for a 15-yard touchdown.
- Navy put together its best drive of the day on the ensuing possession driving to the USF 28-yard line, but on 3rd-and-1 the Mids mishandled the snap and Tramel Logan picked it up and returned it 70-yards for a touchdown to make the score 37-23.
- Following a missed 44-yard field goal by Navy, USF easily moved down the field for an 11-yard touchdown run by Michael Dukes to make the score 44-23.
- The Mids would get a late touchdown on a 68-yard touchdown pass from Horvath to **Eli Heidenreich** (So / SB), but wouldn't get the ball back.

- Quarterback Tai Lavatai (Sr) came off the bench to throw for 75 yards and a touchdown, while the defense recorded a school-record 8 sacks to lead Navy to a 27-24 victory over North Texas at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Lavatai, who was playing in his 23rd-career game and the first as a non-starter, took over for an injured **Blake Horvath** (So / QB) late in the second quarter and immediately led Navy on a touchdown drive.
