UNCG reliever Chad Sykes tops the team and all NCAA DI in ERA (0.87). He has allowed just five earned runs this season, including one in an outing versus Wofford (May 18) in the regular season finale.

UNCG picked up its third SoCon weekly honor Austin Koehn was named SoCon Pitcher of the Week. Koehn limited league foe Wofford to a .043 batting average and one hit a win. He joins Austin Embler and Zack Budzik among Spartans with SoCon Player of the Week distinctions.

UNCG had six representatives named to the All-SoCon team, including Zack Budzik, Greg Hardison, Austin Koehn, Chad Sykes, Caleb Webster and Hogan Windish. Among those six, Budzik, Sykes and Windish received multiple honors from both the coaches and media. Zack Budzik, after finishing the weekend with a hit in each of the three games against Wofford, extended his current streak to 14 games to mark the second-longest by a UNCG hitter this season. He is one hit off the pace set by Josh Madole & Coleman Sawyer.

QUICK HITS (SoCon Tournament)

► UNCG has six representatives named to the All-Southern Conference team, including Zack Budzik, Greg Hardison, Austin Koehn, Chad Sykes, Caleb Webster and Hogan Windish. Among those six, Budzik, Sykes and Windish received multiple honors from both the league's baseball coaches and media contingency.

► UNCG, which has had four straight 30-win seasons under Jarrett, had not enjoyed a span of four straight 30-win seasons since 2000-05, when the Spartans rattled off six straight 30-win seasons under then head coach Mike Gaski. Jarrett, who took over the program prior to the start of the 2013 season, is the only skipper in program history to guide UNCG to at least 35 wins in three straight seasons—a feat accomplished between 2016-18, when the Spartans won 38, 36 and 39 games in succession.

► After finishing off the 2019 regular season with a 33-18 mark, winning 14 games in Southern Conference action, the UNCG baseball team will head into SoCon Tournament as the No. 3 seed. UNCG is 7-8 under head coach Link Jarrett all-time in the SoCon Tournament and has one win over the Bucs (6-4 / May 26, 2017), entering their sixth league tournament in his tenure as coach.

► UNCG freshman hurler Austin Koehn, who limited league foe Wofford to a .043 batting average and one hit in a 1-0 victory on Thursday, May 16th, received Southern Conference Pitcher of the Week honors the league announced on Sunday. Koehn becomes the third Spartan, along with Zack Budzik and Austin Embler, to earn weekly honors from the Southern Conference this season.

► The UNCG hitting tandem of Zack Budzik and Caleb Webster, who patrol the left side of the Spartan infield as the shortstop of third baseman, respectively, own the two longest current hitting streaks on the team.

Budzik, after finishing the weekend with a hit in each of the three games against Wofford, extended his streak to 14 games to mark the second-longest streak by a UNCG hitter this season. Meanwhile, Webster has reached base via a hit in his last eight straight contests—his longest hitting streak of the season.

JACKSON, SYKES HIGHLIGHT SPARTAN BULLPEN: The Spartan pair of Chad Sykes and Corey Jackson have proved to be one of the best bullpen duos in the Southern Conference during the 2019 season.

Collectively, they have six wins and eight saves in 24 appearances for UNCG in league action. Four of the six wins belong to Jackson, who is a perfect 4-0 in SoCon action, while all eight saves belong to Sykes.

The pair ranks among the top of five in seven major statistical categories for the Spartans, including ERA (Sykes-1st, 0.87 / Jackson-5th, 4.96), wins (Jackson-1st-7, Skyes-t-2nd, 5), strikeouts (Jackson-1st, 64 / Skyes-t-2nd, 63), innings pitched (Jackson-52.2-3rd / Skyes-4th, 52.0), appearances (Jackson-1st, 29 / Skyes-3rd, 25), opposing batting average (Sykes-1st, .175 / Jackson-4th, .230) and saves (Sykes-1st, 11 / Jackson-N/A).

Along with ranking atop the UNCG staff in multiple statistical categories, Sykes is among the nation's statistical leaders in five major categories including ERA, where he is first with a 0.87, 20th in hits allowed per nine innings (5.54), 21st in saves (11), 40th in WHIP (1.00) and 71st in strikeouts per nine innings (10.90).

Jackson also sits among the top 80 NCAA Division I hurlers, ranking 29th in appearances (29), 69th in strikeouts per nine innings (10.94) and 78th in victories (seven).

The two have appeared in the same game on 15 occasions for UNCG this season, most recently against Wofford on May 18th, when Jackson tossed 2.2 innings and Sykes logged 1.2 innings on the mound.

EIGHT SPARTANS HAVE AT LEAST 10 DOUBLE-DIGIT HIT GAMES: Six different UNCG sluggers enjoyed at least one multi-hit game in the regular season finale against Wofford last weekend. The Spartans now have six players with at least 15 multi-hit games and eight players with a minimum of 10 multi-hit games on the season.

One of the two players with two multi-hit games against the Terriers was senior Austin Embler, who finished 2-for-4 from the plate with a double in the second game of the series on May 17. He followed that up with a 3-for-4 performance in the series finale (May 18), coming through with a double along the way.

Greg Hardison also came through with a pair of multi-hit performances versus Wofford last weekend. Hardison, who now has 15 multi-hit games on the season, finished 2-for-4 from the plate with an RBI and a run scored in the second game of the series on May 17. The following day, Hardison finished 3-for-5 from the plate

UNCG's 6-1 win over VMI on Saturday, May 11th marked the 16th time in program history, fourth under the direction of Jarrett, that the Spartans topped the 30-win plateau.

UNCG, which has had four straight 30-win seasons under Jarrett, had not enjoyed a span of four straight 30-win seasons since 2000-05, when the Spartans rattled off six straight 30-win seasons under then head coach Mike Gaski.

Jarrett, who took over the program prior to the start of the 2013 season, is the only skipper in program history to guide UNCG to at least 35 wins in three straight seasons—a feat accomplished between 2016-18, when the Spartans won 38, 36 and 39 games in succession.

NO STRANGER TO MULTI-HIT GAMES: The Spartans have had seven games this season in which at least five batters finished with multiple hits. UNCG achieved the feat in the opening game of a three-game series with VMI last weekend, when six batters recorded multi-hit performances in a 6-5 setback to the Keydets.

Among those with multi-hit games were Josh Madole (4-5), Austin Embler (3-5), Zack Budzik (2-3), Greg Hardison (2-5), Coleman Sawyer (2-4) and Caleb Webster (2-5).

It marked the fourth time in a 34-day span that UNCG has had at least five sluggers come through with multi-hit performances in the same game.

The first came against Furman on April 6th, when five Spartans tallied multiple hits in an 11-9 (13 inn.) victory over the Paladins.

UNCG followed the feat 17 days later in a come-from-behind victory over Elon on April 23rd, when the Spartans had five batters finish with multiple hits in the game. They included Greg Hardison (2-for-4), Caleb Webster (2-for-5), Ryan Caveness (2-for-5), Zach Kuchmaner (3-for-3) and Jacquez Koonce (2-for-4). It marked the fifth time this season that UNCG has had at least five sluggers finishing with multiple hits in a game.

Four short days later, in the second game of the doubleheader against the Bulldogs, UNCG established its single-game season-high in multiple hits in a game (eight), topping the previous mark of six, which came against Quinnipiac in the season opener.

In the 16-run, 20-hit (both of which marked season-highs) outburst against The Citadel, UNCG had eight hitters with multiple hits, including Caleb Webster (4-for-5), Josh Madole (3-for-4), Zach Kuchmaner (3-for-6), Greg Hardison (2-for-5), Austin Embler (2-for-5), Hogan Windish (2-for-5), Jacquez Koonce (2-for-4) and Zack Budzik (2-for-4).

Budzik, who is tied with Greg Hardison for the second-longest hitting stretch of the season, began his streak by going 1-for-4 at Elon on April 23. He followed that with a trio of multi-hit games in the series against The Citadel (2-for-3—April 27 / 2-for-4—April 27 / 3-for-4—April 28).

Budzik put together his second series of multi-hit performances just over a week later, finishing 2-for-3 at ETSU (May 5) before going 2-for-3 and 2-for-4 in games on May 10 and May 11, respectively, as UNCG took the series against VMI.

Since his 2-for-4 outing against the Keydets on May 11, which resulted in a pair of doubles, Budzik has managed one hit in each of his last five contests. He is hitting .412 (21-of-51) during his current 14-game streak, recording 15 runs, 13 RBI, four doubles and a .588 slugging percentage.

Webster, who is in the midst of his fifth hitting streak of at least five games this season, began his current eight-game streak in Johnson City, Tenn., on May 5 when he went 1-for-4 from the plate with a double and an RBI. He has posted enjoyed a trio of multi-hit games in that stretch, including a 2-for-5 outing against VMI on May 10.

Webster put together his fourth game with at least three hits in the series finale against VMI (May 12), finishing 3-for-4 from the plate with two RBI and a run scored, highlighted by his fourth home run of the season. He added a 2-for-5 outing against Winthrop (May 14) before coming through with three singles in the series opener against Wofford (May 16).

Webster is hitting .400 from the plate (14-for-35) during his current streak and has been responsible for seven RBI and four runs along with a .543 slugging percentage. He has three extra-base hits to his credit, including two doubles and a single, resulting in 19 total bases.

SPARTANS FACE ETSU IN SoCon TOURNAMENT: After finishing off the 2019 regular season with a 33-18 mark, winning 14 games in Southern Conference action, the UNCG baseball team will head into SoCon Tournament as the No. 3 seed. UNCG finished the 2019 regular season winning seven of its last 10 games.

The Spartans wrapped up the three-game regular season series against the Bucs with a combined 12 extra-base hits, taking advantage of 11 doubles and a home run. UNCG pitchers held ETSU to 26 hits and nine earned runs (3.00 ERA), while recording 25 strikeouts.

UNCG is 7-8 under head coach Link Jarrett all-time in the SoCon Tournament and has one win over the Bucs (6-4 / May 26, 2017), entering their sixth league tournament in his tenure as coach.

Jarrett guided the Spartans to the first postseason league title in program history in 2017, after earning a 13-1 win over Furman. The Spartans have won two of their last three games in the tournament, posting an 11-7 victory against VMI (May 24) and a 15-7 win over Wofford (May 25).

UNCG will face either Wofford or VMI in the second round of play. Under Jarrett, the Spartans are 1-1 against VMI in tournament play and 2-0 when taking on Wofford. Furman is the most common opponent for UNCG in the postseason under Jarrett, with the two teams squaring off five times since the 2014 season.

<SIX SPARTANS RECEIVE ALL-SoCON ACCOLADES>

UNC Greensboro baseball has six representatives named to the All-Southern Conference team, including Zack Budzik, Greg Hardison, Austin Koehn, Chad Sykes, Caleb Webster and Hogan Windish. Among those six, Budzik, Sykes and Windish received multiple honors from both the league’s baseball coaches and media contingency.

Sykes was named as the Pitcher of the Year and First Team All-SoCon by the league’s coaches, while earning First Team All-SoCon by the media. Sykes joins Matt Frisbee as the only two Spartans to ever win SoCon Pitcher of the Year award from the coaches. The redshirt-senior reliever, who owns the lowest ERA (0.87) among all NCAA Division I pitchers, finished the regular season with a 5-3 mark and 11 saves in 52 innings. He surrendered just 32 hits, six runs (five earned), 20 walks and converted 63 strikeouts in 25 appearances for the Spartans.

Sykes’ effectiveness in league play resulted in a 1.20 ERA, 2-2 record and eight saves. He made 13 appearances over the course of SoCon action, logging 30 innings, allowing just 14 hits and four earned runs. The Creedmoor, N.C., native fanned 32 opposing hitters among the eight different league opponents that he faced. Sykes recorded multiple strikeouts in 11 of the 13 SoCon games he pitched, including a season-best five at Mercer where he earned his third save.

Windish also snagged three honors for the Spartans including Second Team All-SoCon and All-Freshman Team honors from the coaches and Second Team All-SoCon by the media. He closed out the regular season hitting .295 (38-for-129) with 27 runs, 23 RBI, six doubles, six home runs and a triple as he owned a .496 slugging percentage and .355 on-base percentage.

Against SoCon foes, Windish was one of four UNCG hitters with a .300 batting average or better (.304), recording 14 runs, 11 RBI, four home runs and four doubles. Additionally, he owned a .536 slugging percentage and a .333 on-base percentage in league play, finishing with eight multi-hit performances along the way. His best outing against SoCon opposition came on April 27 versus The Citadel, where he finished 3-for-4 with two runs, two RBI and a home run in the opening game of the series. Later that afternoon, in the second game of a doubleheader, he went 2-for-5 from the plate against Bulldog pitching.

Budzik also brought home multiple honors, earning First Team All-Freshman honors from the coaches and being named as First Team All-SoCon shortstop by the media. Budzik, who posted the second-highest batting average (.341) on the team, capped off his first season with 31 hits, 17 RBI, eight doubles and two home runs as he owned a .516 slugging percentage and a .380 on-base percentage.

Budzik was the Spartans’ top hitter in SoCon play, finishing with a .379 average (25-for-66), while recording six doubles, one triple and two home runs. As a result, he scored 15 runs, recorded 14 RBI, owned a .591 slugging percentage and .408 on-base percentage. Budzik first became a regular in the Spartan lineup on April 3 against High Point and would go on to start 25 games over the remainder of the season. He managed nine two-hit performances in those 25 starts, including a 3-for-4 outing against The Citadel (April 28), setting his single-game season-high in hits.

Hardison, UNCG’s top hitter throughout the course of the regular season, earned Second Team All-SoCon honors from the league’s media. Hardison ended the season with a .351 batting average (52-for-148) in 37 games, as he connected on 14 doubles, two home runs and one triple. He was responsible for a .500 slugging percentage, .429 on-base percentage to go along with 35 runs and 22 RBI.

In league play, Hardison was 23-of-65 (.354 batting average) from the plate, accruing 17 runs and 10 RBI by way of 10 doubles, two home runs and one triple. He topped the UNCG lineup in slugging percentage (.631) and on-base percentage (.417). After missing 17 games due to an injury sustained against Wake Forest (March 26), Hardison had seven multi-hit games against league opposition. That includes a trio of three-hit performances against ETSU (May 3), VMI (May 11) and Wofford (May 18), giving him 15 multi-hit games on the slate.

Koehn earned a spot on the All-Freshman team, as voted on by the league coaches, after finishing the regular season 4-2 with a 3.33 ERA in 13 starts. He topped all UNCG pitchers in innings pitched (73) and tied Sykes for second-most-strikeouts (63). Against SoCon competition he was 2-1 with a 3.43 ERA, recording a team-best 40 strikeouts in a team-high 44.2 innings.

Koehn recorded at least five strikeouts against seven of the eight SoCon opponents he faced, recording six versus Furman (April 7), Samford (April 20), The Citadel (April 27) and Wofford (May 16). In his fourth win of the season, which came against Terriers in the final series of the regular season, Koehn limited Wofford hitters to one hit over seven innings to notch his second one-hitter of the season.

Webster drew Second Team All-SoCon honors from the league’s coaches after finishing the regular season with a .322 batting average that included most hits (67), runs (40), RBI (32) and doubles (15) for the Spartans. He also owned the fourth-highest on-base percentage (.462) and had a .371 on-base percentage, while swiping 11-of-13 bases.

Against SoCon competition, Webster finished the regular season with a .307 batting average, as he led the team with 31 hits and was second in RBI (15). The junior, who leads all UNCG sluggers with 19 multi-hit performances, had eight against conference foes. Among them included one of his two four-hit performances, which came against The Citadel (April 27) where he recorded a pair of doubles and finished 4-of-5 from the plate with two runs scored.



<UNCG SNAGS THREE PLAYER OF THE WEEKS IN 2019>

BUDZIK BRINGS HOME SoCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK: After a week in which he finished 7-of-14 from the plate (.500 batting average) and was responsible for four RBI, four doubles and a walk-off home run, UNCG freshman Zack Budzik was named Southern Conference Player of the Week for all games April 1-7.

Budzik, who had not gotten a hit on the season in three at-bats, capped off the four-game stretch against High Point (one game) and Furman (three games) by amassing a .929 slugging percentage and a .563 on-base percentage, drawing just one walk in the four games, while swiping two bases.

EMBLER NAMED SoCON PLAYER OF THE WEEK: After putting together a week where he finished 7-for-14 from the plate (.500 batting average) and accumulating five RBI, two doubles and a home run, UNCG redshirt-senior second baseman Austin Embler earned Southern Conference Player of the Week honors for all games May 5-12. It marks the second time in Embler's career he has won the award and first since March 13, 2017.

Embler capped off a three-game stretch against VMI by finishing with an .857 slugging percentage and a .533 on-base percentage after posting seven hits, including three for extra bases. Enter the final week of the regular season,

KOEHN EARNS SoCON PITCHER OF THE WEEK: UNC Greensboro freshman hurler Austin Koehn, who limited league foe Wofford to a .043 batting average and one hit in a 1-0 victory on Thursday, May 16th, received Southern Conference Pitcher of the Week honors the league announced on Sunday. Koehn becomes the third Spartan, along with Zack Budzik and Austin Embler, to earn weekly honors from the Southern Conference this season.

Koehn picked up his fourth win of the season after striking out six Terrier hitters and allowing just one hit in seven innings on the mound. The Bel Air, Md., native has recorded at least five strikeouts in his last eight appearances for the Spartans, dating back to a five-strikeout performance against Western Carolina on March 31st. Six of those games, including outings against Furman (April 7), George Mason (April 14), Samford (April 20), The Citadel (April 27) and Wofford (May 16), resulted in six strikeouts for Koehn.

<RECAPING LAST THREE GAMES FOR THE SPARTANS>

SPARTANS NOTCH 15 HITS IN A SEASON FINALE AGAINST WOFFORD: The UNC Greensboro baseball team came through with five runs on 15 hits, but it was three multi-run innings by visiting Wofford made the difference as the Terriers emerged with a 14-5 victory on Senior Day for the Spartans. The Spartans recognized the 2019 Senior Class of Austin Embler, Zach Kuchmaner, Jake Mayhew and Chad Sykes.

UNCG (33-18, 14-10 SoCon), which eclipsed double-digit hits for the 25th time this season, received at least one base knock from every starter in the lineup. Three Spartan hitters, Greg Hardison (3-5, run), Embler (3-4, RBI, double) and Coleman Sawyer (2-4, 2 RBI), tallied multiple hits in the game.

The Spartans sent seven hurlers to the mound, including senior starter Jake Mayhew, who dropped to 3-1 in the loss. He was followed by Corey Jackson, Jack Voigt and Jeremiah Triplett, who recorded two strikeouts, allowed four runs and six walks in a combined 6.2 innings.

Senior reliever Chad Sykes tossed 1.2 innings, taking over for Triplett in the seventh, allowing one hit and one run while striking out two of the eight Terrier (33-23, 14-9 SoCon) hitters he faced. The combination of Austin Parsley and Colin Best worked the ninth for the Spartans.

After surrendering five runs in the top of the first, UNCG got two of those runs back in the bottom of the frame after back-to-back hits from Hardison and Embler was followed by an RBI single off the bat of Caleb Webster. Embler came home on a grounder back to the pitcher by Josh Madole, making for a 5-2 contest.

The Terriers scored one run each in the second and third, stretching their lead to 7-2, before UNCG came through with a run in the fourth. Zack Budzik singled to short and Hardison followed with a single to left, putting runners on the corners with Embler at the plate. Embler delivered a single to centerfield, scoring Budzik for the third Spartan run.

After Wofford's second multi-run inning of the game in the seventh, UNCG retaliated for two runs on three hits in the home half of the frame. Madole and Kuchmaner opened with singles to right, moving into scoring position on a wild pitch, before a single to centerfield by Sawyer plated the pair for fifth run of the game.

Wofford tallied five runs over the final two innings to make for the 14-5 final.

UNCG-WOFFORD FAST FACTS (Game 3)

UNCG HAS 11 HITS, SCORES 10 RUNS VERSUS TERRIERS: The UNC Greensboro offense eclipsed double-digit runs for the eighth time this season, but a 10-run fourth inning by visiting Wofford proved to be the difference as the Terriers evened the series at 1-1 with an 18-10 victory over the Spartans on Friday evening at the UNCG Baseball Stadium.

The Spartans pounded out 11 hits in the setback, marking the 24th time this season they have recorded at least 10 hits. Individually, UNCG was led by the combination of Josh Madole (1-for-5, 3 RBI, triple) and Ryan Caveness (1-for-2, 3 RBI, HR), who accounted for six of the nine RBI.

After scoring three runs in the first two innings of the game, Wofford took advantage of a 10-run third to move in front 13-0 through the top of the third. Zack Budzik energized the UNCG lineup with a leadoff triple to left-centerfield and after a walk of Austin Embler and Caleb Webster being hit by a pitch the bases were loaded for Madole.

With Madole at the plate, Budzik came home on a wild pitch, which also advanced both runners. Madole followed with a grounder to first, plating Embler for the second run of the third. Caveness continued the inning with a two-run blast over the right field wall, which sliced the Terrier lead to 13-4 through three.

After a scoreless fourth by Wofford, UNCG's offense returned to the plate and used a leadoff single by Jacquez Koonce to again kickstart the lineup. Two batters later, Hardison singled through the right side of the infield to bring home Budzik from second. Embler dropped a single to center, putting two on for the Spartans, ahead of a double to right-centerfield by Webster that plated Hardison for the sixth UNCG run.

Madole again came through in the clutch for the Spartan offense, driving a bases-clearing triple down the right field line to score both Webster and Embler on the play. Caveness picked up his third RBI of the game with a sacrifice fly to account for the ninth unanswered UNCG run.

Wofford added one run in the seventh and a scored its final two runs in the top of the ninth to assume an 18-9 lead. The Spartans retaliated with one run in the bottom of the ninth. Coleman Sawyer led off the frame with a walk, moving to third on a single by Kuchmaner. David Flores reached on a fielder's choice that got Kuchmaner at second, allowing Sawyer to move home for the 10th run of the game.

UNCG-WOFFORD FAST FACTS (Game 2)

- UNCG sent six pitchers to the mound in the game and finished with four strikeouts. Starter Phillip Sanderson recorded two of the four K's.
- Zack Budzik extended his hitting streak to 13 straight games as he finished 1-for-4 from the plate with two runs and a triple.
- Spartans had four extra-base hits in the game, which came from Caleb Webster (double), Josh Madole (triple), Zack Budzik (triple) and Ryan Caveness (home run).

KOEHN, SYKES COMBINE FOR ONE-HITTER VERSUS WOFFORD: The UNC Greensboro pitching combination of Austin Koehn and Chad Sykes limited visiting Wofford to one hit as the Spartans earned a 1-0 victory in the opening game of the series between the two Southern Conference foes on Thursday, May 16th. It is the second shutout of the season for UNCG, who also did not allow a run to George Mason (April 14).

Koehn (4-2) picked up his fourth win of the season after striking out six Terrier hitters and allowing just one hit in seven innings on the mound. It is the eighth time in as many outings that Koehn has recorded at least five strikeouts for the Spartans.

Sykes (S, 11) took over for the Spartans in the top of the eighth, facing seven batters over the next two innings, where he issued one walk and recorded two strikeouts. The strikeouts accounted for the final two outs of the game as Sykes extended his streak of consecutive appearances with at least one strikeout to 62, dating back to March 9, 2016.

UNCG scored the lone run of the game in the bottom of the fourth. The inning began with a single up the middle by Caleb Webster. Two batters later, Ryan Caveness moved Webster to third on a double to right field. After a fielder's choice bunt by Zach Kuchmaner got Webster at third for the second out, Hogan Windish drove a single into centerfield to plate Caveness for the 1-0 advantage.

Earlier in the fourth, Wofford's Brett Rodriguez reached on a single to third, moving teammate Mike Brown to third on the play. Koehn fanned Lawson Hill for the second out of the inning and got John Dempsey to ground to short, ending the scoring threat.

The Spartans picked up their fourth straight win in the series with Wofford after collecting seven hits in the game. Three of those hits came from Caleb Webster, who finished 3-for-4 from the plate. Windish (2-3) also tallied multiple hits in the game, including his sixth double of the season. Ryan Caveness, who finished 1-for-3 with a run scored, also had a two-base knock for UNCG. The remaining hit came from Zack Budzik, who wrapped up the game 1-for-3.
