Senior Celebration

The Spartans will honor the careers of Fernando Garcia, Theo Quartey, and Matthew Cutler during a pre-match ceremony. This special senior group departs UNCG having helped the Spartans win a Southern Conference regular season championship, a postseason tournament title, 36 matches, a national ranking which was as high as 16th in the country earlier this month, participate in the NCAA Tournament, and beat second-ranked Clemson.

A Look At UNCG

UNCG comes into the match after beating USC Upstate 7-1 on Tuesday ... Theo Collomb scored two goals and added an assist to pace a balanced UNCG attack ... Sam Coad and Jack Birch scored their first career goals ... The Spartans are leading the nation in goals (43), assists

(40), scoring offense (3.07) & total points (126) ... UNCG has scored at least five or more goals in a match four times this season ... Joey Skinner leads UNCG in assists with seven ... Skinner and Basile Marc are on the College Soccer News' Top 100 Freshman list ... J.C. Ngando and Theo Quartey have scored four goals each for the Spartans ... UNCG has had at least 15 different players score a goal this season.

A Look At Wofford

In their win over High Point, the Terriers got goals from Oliver Sheikhi and Magnus Kjoller ... The win over High Point stopped a six-match winless streak for the Terriers ... Brandon Oddy leads Wofford with seven goals ... Mitchell Myers has two goals and six assists ... Wofford's lone conference win was an 8-1 victory over VMI ... The Terriers also tied ETSU, 3-3.

MATTHEW CUTLER

**Bahama, North Carolina / Northern
5-10 / Defender / Communications**

Matthew Cutler from Bahama, North Carolina. One of the top defenders in the Southern Conference, Cutler has been a two-way threat for the Spartans. On defense, he's helped UNCG post 24 shutouts during his career. He has scored two goals and recorded 10 assists during his time as a Spartan. He earned SoCon Player of the Week honors on March 8, 2021. Through his work ethic, attitude and character, Matthew has been a major contributor to the UNCG men's soccer success with his consistency. Matthew is majoring in communications. Matthew is being supported today by his parents Darryl and Melissa.

2021 Spring Season (Junior)

Started all 14 matches and played 1,205 minutes ... A defensive stalwart who also scored two goals and had four assists for a total of eight points ... He scored in the 89th minute to help UNCG tie Mercer on the road on March 13 ... He had a goal and an assist in a win over Gardner Webb on Feb. 24 ... He also recorded assists in games against Belmont-Abbey on Feb. 17 and Furman on March 20 ... Played a season-high 110 minutes against ETSU on April 3 ... Was named SoCon Player of the Week on March 8 ... He helped UNCG win the Southern Conference Tournament championship, and make its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in over a decade ... In addition, the Spartans received votes in the final United Soccer Coaches poll of the 2021 spring season ... UNCG finished with a 9-3-2 record and a .714 winning percentage, the best since 2005 (.717) ... UNCG finished the season ranked 30th in the final College Soccer News

Top 30 poll.

2019 (Sophomore)

Appeared in 17 of the Spartans' 19 matches in 2019, making a total of 10 starts ... finished with six assists, tying for a team-high in helpers and fourth in the SoCon ... had two helpers and a shot on goal in UNCG's 5-1 win at UNC Asheville (9.18) ... tallied his third assist of the season against VMI (10.12) ... played every minute of the Spartans' three shutout wins over Wofford (10.19), ETSU (10.26) and Mercer (10.29) ... had another two-assist performance against ODU (11.2), including a helper on the game-winner ... picked up his sixth assist of the season against Belmont (11.10) in the Southern Conference tournament semifinal.

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2018 (Freshman)

Appeared in 16 games with start to earn his first career letter at UNCG.

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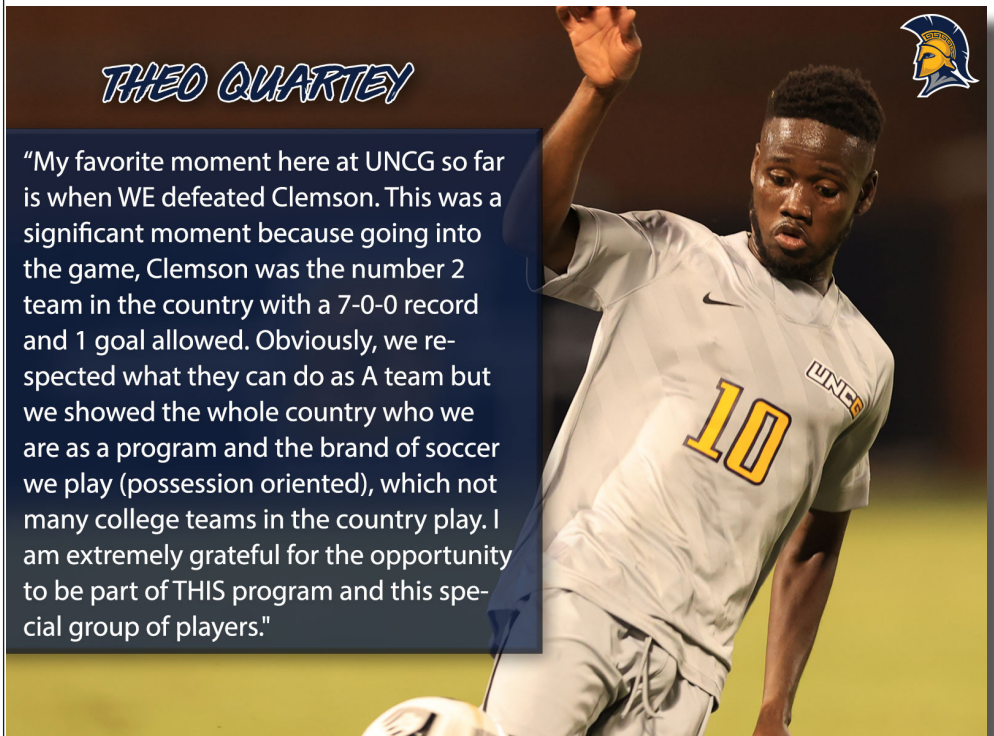

Competing with relentless passion, Fernando has been a key contributor for the Spartans since joining the program last year. He was named a First Team All-SoCon selection this past spring after scoring five goals and finishing with 10 points. He led the SoCon in goals per game (0.62) and was second in points per game (1.25). He was a preseason All-SoCon selection. This season, he has one goal and three assists. Fernando is majoring in sociology and minoring in criminology. Fernando is being supported today by his parents Marco Garcia and Rosalinda Rodriguez.

2021 Spring Season: Played in 14 games and made seven starts ... Named First Team All-SoCon ... Finished the season with five goals and 10 points ... Scored two goals each in wins over Belmont-Abbey and VMI ... Tallied another goal against Elon ... Took 29 shots on the season in 934 minutes ... Played a season-best 104 minutes against ETSU ... Led SoCon in goals per game (0.62) and was second in points per game (1.25) ... He helped UNCG win the Southern Conference Tournament championship, and make its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament in over a decade ... In addition, the Spartans received votes in the final United Soccer Coaches poll of the 2021 spring season ... UNCG finished with a 9-3-2 record and a .714 winning percentage, the best since 2005 (.717) ... Played 24 minutes against Belmont in the SoCon championship match and 33 minutes against Omaha in the NCAA Tournament.

While one of his main goals is to play

soccer professionally, Garcia has a great backup plan. The criminal justice major who has a minor in sociology wouldn't mind being a criminal defense attorney. He loves watching Law and Order.

"I always want to be in command and lead as much as possible," Garcia said with a smile. "I try to improve every time I step onto the field in everything I can. Whatever I give, I want to receive so if I am yelling at you, I expect you to yell back at me because at the end of the day, I am sharpening you and you're sharpening me."
