**'JACKS GO IN SEARCH OF THREE STRAIGHT:** The Stephen F. Austin Lumberjack football team will look for its third consecutive victory Saturday as it hosts North Dakota. After a heartbreaking season-opening loss at SMU, the 'Jacks have now rattled off consecutive wins over Texas College and at Western Illinois. Saturday's game is slated to kick off at 6 p.m. from Homer Bryce Stadium. Saturday's game will also serve as Parents' Weekend on the SFA campus.

**SFA vs. THE FIGHTING SIOUX:** Saturday's meeting will mark the first-ever meeting between the two schools on the football field.

**SFA ON PARENTS WEEKEND:** The Lumberjacks are 17-9 (.654) in Parents' Weekend games dating back to the 1993 season, but are looking to end a recent skid. SFA has dropped the last three Parents' Weekend games, which includes a 50-48 decision to No. 20 South Dakota State last year.

**SEEKING A STREAK:** The Lumberjacks will be in search of their third-straight victory Saturday when North Dakota comes to Nacogdoches. If SFA wins the game, it ties the team's longest win streak from last season.

**LAST NON-CONFERENCE ROAD WIN:** The Lumberjacks victory over Western Illinois marked its first victory over a non-conference opponent away from Homer Bryce Stadium since SFA defeated Southern Utah, 40-17, in Cedar City, Utah, during the 2005 season.

**CLIMBING THE CHARTS:** Junior quarterback Jeremy Moses completed 35-of-58 (.603) passes for 363 yards and four touchdowns against the Leathernecks. He now has 59 for his career, becoming only the third player in school history to throw for at least 50 touchdowns in a career. Moses needs only two more TD passes to move into second all-time at SFA, and only seven more to become the school's all-time leader (Hammel - 65).

**TALLYING THE SACKS:** SFA is only three games into the 2009 season, but has already recorded 14 sacks (4.7 pg). The 'Jacks are on pace to smash their 2008 mark of 32 sacks, which led the Southland Conference.

**BATTLE IN THE TRENCHES:** Saturday's game will pit a North Dakota starting offensive line that averages 6-5, 281 pounds, against a Lumberjack defensive line that averages 6-3, 260. The 'Jacks' offensive line enters the game averaging 6-4, 299 pounds. The Fighting Sioux defensive line averages 6-4, 264.

**THE COACHES:** J.C. Harper became the 18th head coach of the SFA Lumberjack football team in December, 2006. Harper spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator before taking over as head coach. He is 6-20 (.231) during his time at SFA. North Dakota head coach Chris Mussman is 7-5 (.583) in his second season with the Fighting Sioux.

### HEAD COACH J.C. HARPER:

J.C. Harper is in his fifth season with the Lumberjack football program and his third as the 'Jacks' head coach. Harper was named the school's 18th head coach in December 2006.

During his first season as head coach, Harper guided the 'Jacks through a season that saw its roster get decimated by injuries. After an injury-free offseason, the 'Jacks were beset by injuries in the season-opener losing five players that included four starters, three All-SLC selections and an All-American, not to mention the team's top three running backs.

In his second campaign as the head coach, Harper revitalized the program with a new-look offense, along with a new offensive coordinator and a new defensive coordinator. The changes were exactly what the doctor ordered. SFA improved by four games in the win column; the offense recorded several SFA, SLC and NCAA records; and several Lumberjacks garnered national attention for their efforts on the field.

Following the season the individual honors came pouring in for Harper's athletes. Jabara Williams, Tim Knicky and Dominique Edison each earned first-team All-SLC honors, while Edison, Knicky and receiver Contrevious Parks each garnered All-America honors. Receiver Duane Brooks was named SLC Newcomer of the Year, while Moses, offensive linemen Karl Glimp and Cameron Schacht, and punter Drew Nelson each earned honorable mention All-SLC honors.

In his first season on campus, Harper was given the task of guiding a youthful defensive unit through the rigors of one of the nation's toughest schedules. During his second year on the job, Harper began to see some of the fruits of his labor. Harper turned a defense that finished near the bottom in every statistical category in 2005 into the most effective defense in the league. The 'Jacks led the Southland Conference in scoring defense, rush defense and total defense during league games in 2006.

The 2006 season marked the second consecutive year that SFA had produced the league's top tackler. Former Lumberjack Ryan Luedecke made the switch to linebacker as a senior and recorded a career year in 2005. Luedecke led the SLC in tackles on his way to honorable mention All-America honors.

Harper's athletes have been recognized at the regional and national level throughout his time at SFA. Harper has produced seven All-Americans, two all-region selections and 23 All-SLC honorees, including five first-team selections.

A 20-year veteran of collegiate coaching, Harper has spent time serving on the coaching staffs at Western Michigan, Northwestern State, McNeese State, Southwest Missouri State, North Carolina and at Notre Dame.

Harper and his wife, Marcie, are the parents of a son, Michael (4).

### LEFTOVERS FROM THE WESTERN ILLINOIS GAME .....

- **Junior Jeremy Moses** completed 35-of-58 (.603) passes for 363 yards and four touchdowns against the Leathernecks, which marks the second time this season, and the 12th time in his career that Moses has recorded at least 300 yards passing in a game. It also marks the second time this season, and the ninth time in his career that he has thrown for at least four touchdowns in a game.

- **Freshman kicker Evan Engwall** recorded a career-high 14 points against the Leathernecks, which included a 4-of-5 night in field goals. Engwall set a new career-long with a 51-yarder in the second quarter. He followed that up with a 50-yard field goal a few minutes later, becoming the first Lumberjack to record at two feild goals from at least 50 yards outs in the same game since Ryan Smith booted a 50 and 51-yarder against Nicholls in 1997.

- **Senior Tim Knicky** recorded only three tackles against Western Illinois, but he made each one count. Knicky recorded three sacks on the night, only one shy of his career-high four against South Dakota State last season.

- **Senior Vincent Pervis** led the SFA ground attack with a career-high 17 carries for a career-high 105 yards. SFA recorded 133 yards rushing as a team, which ties for the most rushing yards against an FCS opponent since the 'Jacks switched to the spread offense.

- **Three 'Jacks** finished the game with at least 80 yards receiving against WIU. Duane Brooks hauled in 10 passes for 85 yards, Contrevious Parks had eight catches for 83 yards and Aaron Rhea caught five balls for 86 yards. Both Parks and Rhea each added two TD receptions.

### BITS and PIECES.....

- **The Lumberjacks** are 7-14 (.333) in televised games dating back to the 1998 season. SFA lost four of its first five televised games during that stretch, and is 4-9 (.333) in its last 13. The 'Jacks went 0-2 in televised games this season.

- **SFA** is 6-14 (.300) all-time when junior Jeremy Moses is the starting quarterback.

- **Since 1993, SFA** holds a 24-26-1 (.480) record in November. The 'Jacks are 23-25-1 (.480) in November regular-season games.

- **The 'Jacks are 5-15** (.250) in their last 20 games at Homer Bryce Stadium. The Lumberjacks went 4-2 at home in 2005, but have gone 4-14 (.222) in the past three seasons. SFA is 1-0 at home this season.

- **SFA** is 59-34-1 (.633) in games at Homer Bryce Stadium since 1993.

- **The 'Jacks** are 62-37 (.626) against unranked Division I FCS (Formerly I-AA) teams since 1992.

- **SFA** scored 40 points at Western Illinois. The 'Jacks have now scored in 91 of their last 92 games.

- **Since 1995**, the Lumberjacks are 16-27 (.372) against teams ranked in the NCAA Division I FCS (Formerly I-AA) top 25. SFA has struggled lately losing 13 of its last 15 games to teams ranked among the Sports Network Top 25. SFA lost all four games against ranked teams in 2007, and went 0-4 last season.

- **An overtime win** over Louisiana Tech in 2000 was the first ever win over an NCAA Division I FBS (formerly I-A) team by the Lumberjacks. The 'Jacks are 2-8 (.200) all-time versus FBS opponents. That mark includes a 21-10 loss to Louisiana-Monroe in 1998, and the win over the Indians to open the 2003 season. Despite six SFA turnovers, SMU had to rally in the fourth quarter to defeat SFA, 31-23, in the 'Jacks' lone game against an FBS opponent this season.

- **SFA is 6-2** (.750) all-time in overtime games. The 'Jacks had overtime wins over Central Oklahoma (38-31) and Louisiana Tech (34-31) in 2000, and beat Cal State Northridge (30-27) and Jacksonville State (44-37) in 2001. SFA added its fifth overtime game with a victory over Northern Arizona in 2004. SFA defeated Nicholls, 27-21, to pick up an overtime win in 2005. SFA dropped a 34-31 overtime contest to Sam Houston State last season.

- **Since joining Division I FCS (Formerly I-AA)** in 1986, SFA is 23-3 (.880) against non-Division I teams. The 'Jacks lost to Angelo State, 28-24, in 1990 and dropped a 17-14 decision to Delta State last year. SFA opened the 2007 season with a 27-24 overtime loss to Tarleton State.

### THE OPPONENT

The North Dakota Fighting Sioux enter Saturday's contest looking to move above the .500 mark for the first time all season. After starting off the year with a tough 38-13 setback at Texas Tech, UND rallied to knock off Southland Conference foe, Northwestern State, 27-20, Saturday night in Natchitoches.

North Dakota is averaging 238 yards of total offense on the season, but has surrendered nearly 440 yards per game to its opponents. Although UND averages close to 155 pass yards per game, the Fighting Sioux's ground game is averaging 84.5 yards per game. North Dakota's rush defense has been very strong holding opponents to less than 82 yards per contest.

Junior quarterback Jake Landry has completed nearly 67 percent of his passes on the season for 290 yards and a score. He has also thrown only one touchdown, but UND averages only 24 pass attempts per game.

Landry's favorite target is 6-0, 188-lbs., sophomore Ismael Bamba who leads the team with nine catches for 121 yards and a touchdown.

Mitch Sutton leads the Fighting Sioux ground attack. The redshirt freshman from Plover, Wisc., has carried the ball 26 times for 106 yards and two touchdowns. He is averaging 4.1 yards per carry, and 53.0 yards per game.

Defensive back Kris Ankenbauer leads the UND defensive effort. The Plano, Texas, native has recorded 15 tackles on the season, and is one of 12 UND players who have recorded a sack on the season. Junior Joel Schwenzfeier is currently second on the team with 12 tackles, including 10 solo stops.

### SFA vs. DIVISION I-A

The Lumberjacks have posted a 2-8 (.200) record all-time versus NCAA Division I FBS (formerly I-A) opponents. SFA first played an FBS opponent in 1988 when it traveled to Hattiesburg, Miss., to take on Southern Miss and Brett Favre. The Golden Eagles beat SFA, 21-7.

In 1990, SFA dropped a 31-22 decision to Louisiana Tech in Ruston. SFA then skipped all the way to the 1998 season before facing an FBS opponent again when they took on UL-Monroe, in Monroe. The Indians handed SFA a 21-10 loss. The 'Jacks turned right around the next year and took on Utah State in 1999. The Aggies beat the Lumberjacks 51-17. SFA claimed its first ever win over a FBS opponent in 2000, beating Louisiana Tech 34-31 in overtime.

Ryan Rossner, a freshman at the time, kicked a 35-yard field goal in the second overtime period for the win. The win boosted the 'Jacks to a No. 10 national ranking.

SFA closed out the 2001 season against Texas Tech, dropping a 58-3 decision to the Galleryfurniture.com Bowl-bound Red Raiders. SFA opened the season with a 67-7 setback at TCU to start the 2008 campaign.

The Lumberjacks opened the 2009 season at SMU, and jumped out to a 23-14 fourth-quarter lead, only to see the Mustangs score 17 unanswered in the game's final 14 minutes for the win.

#### **On his team's performance against Western Illinois ...**

*"What a great victory for our guys. I'm so proud of the effort they gave Saturday night. They came into a very tough place to play and remained focused on the game plan. I really thought our defense did a another great job of slowing down a very strong (Western Illinois) offense."*

#### **Regarding the upcoming game against North Dakota ...**

*"They are a very good team, and very well coached. North Dakota was one of the premier teams at the Division II level, and they are currently in the transition phase for NCAA Division I status. They played Texas Tech very tough to start the season, and last week they traveled to Natchitoches, La., and beat Northwestern State."*

Despite six SFA turnovers, the Mustangs had to rally to defeat the Lumberjacks, 31-23, at Gerald J. Ford Stadium in Dallas.

The start of the game was a quarter of big plays for both sides. After a Jeremy Moses interception, senior Cory Barlow returned the favor by picking off an SMU pass and returning it 75 yards to set up the 'Jacks first score of the season.

After consecutive failed drives by each team, SMU tied the game when Emmanuel Sanders returned a Drew Nelson punt 79 yards for the score. Despite the face SFA was intercepted three times in the first quarter, the punt return was the only SMU score in the opening 15 minutes.

SFA battled right back to reclaim a three-point advantage when freshmn Evan Engwall drilled a 46-yard field goal, but SMU took a lead into the locker room, 14-10.

SFA scored the first 13 points of the second half, and owned a nine-point lead, 23-14, heading into the fourth quarter. But SMU scored the final 17 points of the game for the victory.

Moses finished the game 31-of-52 for 391 yards and two touchdowns, but also had five interceptions. Rhea was SFA's top target hauling in eight passes for 167 yards and a TD. SFA racked up 460 yards, while holding SMU to 355. Haynes led the SFA defense with seven tackles and an interception. Barlow added six stops, and an pick.

SFA scored a school-record 92 points to defeat Texas College, 92-0. The 'Jacks (1-1) overpowered the Steers with four first quarter touchdowns and never looked back.

SFA racked up 603 yards of total offense, while the Lumberjack defense held Texas College to 92 yards. Jeremy Moses finished the night a perfect 12-of-12 for 285 yards, and tied a career-high with six touchdown passes, while Dalton Williams completed 6-of-7 for 153 yards and two touchdowns.

Moses threw TD passes to five different receivers including Duane Brooks who hauled in four passes for 146 yards and two scores. Freshman Romonté Hampton led the ground attack with 10 carries for 88 yards, and three touchdowns.

Freshman Ryan Epperson recorded a career-high 11 tackles to lead a defense that held the Steers to -29 rushing yards. SFA also recorded nine sacks and 14 tackles for a loss on the night.

SFA never trailed in the contest against Western Illinois, spoiling the Leathernecks home opener, 40-30. The victory moved SFA to 2-1 on the season, while the Leathernecks fell to 1-2. SFA recorded 496 yards of total offense including 133 yards on the ground, while holding their hosts to 270 total, and 39 on the ground.

The 'Jacks jumped out a 14-point lead in the first quarter, only to see Western Illinois battle back to tie the game. SFA waived no time regaining the advantage as Jeremy Moses connected with senior Aaron Rhea on a 51-yard scoring strike to give SFA back the advantage, 20-14.

The 'Jacks tacked on nine more points in the second quarter off the leg of freshman kicker Evan Engwall. Engwall hit on 4-of-5 attempts including kicks of 51 and 50 yards. SFA took a 29-17 lead into the locker room.

WIU cut the lead to five points, when they opened the half with a 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. The TD pass cut the SFA lead down to two points, 32-30, but responded by scoring eight unanswered to close out the scoring.

Moses finished the game 33-of-54 for 390 yards, and four touchdowns. Senior Vincent Pervis carried the ball 16 times for 105 yards.
