Three Weekend WCHA Series Have UND at OSU, SCSU at BSU, UW at UMD; Non-Conference Sets Find No. 1 UM at St. Lawrence, MSU Hosting Lindenwood; Ohio State Scores Historic Sweep

Buckeyes Sweep Bulldogs for First Time; Gophers Down SCSU Twice; Minnesota State Splits at UND; Badgers Pick Up Two Wins at Lindenwood; Bemidji State Splits at Providence; Latest Women's Division 1 College Hockey Polls have Minnesota at No. 1, Wisconsin at No. 3/4, North Dakota at No. 6, Ohio State at No. 10 ... Minnesota State, Minnesota Duluth Also Receive Votes

MADISON, Wis. – Defending national and conference champion Minnesota affirmed its position as the top-ranked team in the country with two home-ice victories on Oct. 5-6 and Ohio State swept a series from Minnesota Duluth for the first time in program history during the first busy weekend of the women's Western Collegiate Hockey Association season.

Minnesota State, which tied defending WCHA champion Wisconsin on the opening weekend, then went to North Dakota last weekend for a second straight league series to start the 2012-13 campaign and split, winning 3-2 with three third period goals last Friday, including the game-winner by Lauren Smith in the final :38 seconds. North Dakota battled back and prevailed in game two, however, as freshman Leah Jensen had a goal and two assists in a 4-1 triumph.

Minnesota (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 6 points), meanwhile, kept rolling by beating St. Cloud State, 7-1 and 4-0 at Ridder Arena. Amanda Kessel had two goals and two assists last Friday and Noora Rätty had her 28th career shutout in the series finale while Kessel assisted on three of the four goals. Freshman Maryanne Menefee had three goals and an assist in the sweep.

Ohio State (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 6 points) climbed into the Top 10 in the latest USCHO.com Division 1

Women's College Hockey Poll for Oct. 8 by handing Minnesota Duluth only its second ever season-opening sweep at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth. With a goal and an assist in the series, senior forward Hokey Langan is now tied for fifth all-time at Ohio State in goals and tied for seventh all-time in assists. Senior forward Minttu Tuominen gave the Buckeyes the lead twice in last Saturday's 3-2 victory. Her first goal put OSU up 2-1 in the first period and her second goal, which came late in the third period, proved to be the game-winner. Chelsea Knapp made 39 saves between the pipes for the Buckeyes, including 16 in last Friday's 3-1 victory. Knapp improved to 4-0-0 on the season and has a goals-against average of 1.25 and a saves percentage of .937.

This week's USCHO.com Division 1 Women's College Hockey Poll shows four WCHA teams are in the top ten as Minnesota is again No. 1, Wisconsin is at No. 4, North Dakota is No. 6 and Ohio State is No. 10.

In non-conference play last weekend (Oct. 5-6), Wisconsin (3-0-1, went to St. Louis, Mo., and took two victories from host Lindenwood, 7-2 and 9-1. In the first game, the Lady Lions fed off the energy of their home opener to claim a 2-0 lead over the Badgers in the first four minutes. However, Wisconsin responded with seven unanswered goals, including three by senior forward Brianna Decker for her eighth career hat trick. She also had two assists for five points in the game. In the series finale, Decker had a goal and two assists to become the fifth UW player to record 200 career points and Alev Kelter scored a hat trick.

In another non-conference series last weekend, Bemidji State went East and split two games with Providence, earning a 3-2 victory in game one and falling 5-1 in the finale. The one-goal win came after the Friars took a 2-0 lead in the second period and led 2-1 entering the third. The third period comeback win was Bemidji State's first since Nov. 5, 2005.

Bemidji State's first WCHA series of the 2012-13 season will come on Friday and Saturday, Oct. 12-13, when the Beavers (1-1-0) host St. Cloud State (0-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) in one of three conference matchups. In the two other series, North Dakota (1-1-0, 1-1-0 WCHA) is at Ohio State on Friday and Saturday while Wisconsin (3-0-1, 1-0-1-1 WCHA) visits Minnesota Duluth (0-2-0, 0-2-0 WCHA) for a Saturday-Sunday set. In non-conference play, Minnesota is at St. Lawrence and Minnesota State (1-2-1, 1-2-1 WCHA) entertains Lindenwood.

In this week's two Division 1 women's national polls, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association has four teams ranked among the top 10 and two others that also received votes. In the Oct. 8 USCHO.com Div. 1 Women's College Hockey Poll, Minnesota is No. 1, Wisconsin is No. 4, North Dakota is No. 6, Ohio State is No. 10 and Minnesota State and Minnesota Duluth also received votes. And in the USA

2012 Four Nations Cup Roster for Team USA Announced by USA Hockey 13 Skaters Have WCHA Ties

Sept. 27, 2012/COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Twelve Olympians highlight the 23-player U.S. Women's National Team roster that will compete in the 2012 Women's Four Nations Cup in Vantaa and Kerava, Finland from Nov. 5-10.

Also included are 13 skaters with WCHA ties. They are goaltenders Alex Rigsby (UW), Jessie Vetter (UW alum), defensemen Megan Bozek (UM), Lisa Chesson (OSU alum), Gigi Marvin (UM alum), Anne Schleper (UM alum), and forwards Brianna Decker (UW), Meghan Duggan (UW alum), Sarah Erickson (UM), Amanda Kessel (UM), Hilary Knight (UW alum), Jocelyne Lamoureux (UND), and Monique Lamoureux (UND).

"We've got a terrific team assembled to compete in the Four Nations Cup," said Katey Stone (Arlington, MA), head coach of Team USA. "I feel this tournament will provide an excellent gauge of where we are as a team as we continue to evaluate players and progress toward the 2014 Olympics."

Among the 12 Olympians are Julie Chu (Fairfield, CT), who has not only played in three Olympic Winter Games, but also in 10 previous Four Nations Cups. Others include defensemen Kacey Bellamy (Westfield, MA), Lisa Chesson (Plainfield, IL), and Gigi Marvin (Warroad, MN); forwards Meghan Duggan (Danvers, MA), Hilary Knight (Sun Valley, ID), Jocelyne Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Monique Lamoureux (Grand Forks, ND), Kelli Stack (Brooklyn Heights, OH), and Karen Thatcher (Blaine, WA); and goaltenders Molly Schaus (Natick, MA) and Jessie Vetter (Cottage Grove, WI).

"From the veteran Olympians to the newcomers, we are confident in this team's ability to give our program a great start to the 2012-2013 season," said Reagan Carey (Colorado Springs, CO), director of women's hockey for USA Hockey.

Prior to the start of the Four Nations Cup, the team will participate in a training camp at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y., from Oct. 30 - Nov. 4.

The camp will include 12 players from the team headed to the Four Nations Cup and select skaters from the 2012 U.S. Women's Under-18 Select Team player pool. At the conclusion of the camp, the 11 NCAA players who complete the U.S. roster will meet the rest of the team in Finland.

Head Coaches Tab Defending National Champion Minnesota as WCHA Favorite for 2012-13

Defending Conference Champ Wisconsin and North Dakota Chosen Second in Annual Preseason WCHA Head Coaches' Poll; Badgers' Returning Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award Winner and Forward Brianna Decker Picked as Preseason WCHA Player of the Year ... Minnesota Forward Hannah Brandt is Unanimous Choice for League Rookie of the Year

When in doubt, go with the defending national champions. That is the message from the coaches who have seen their league win the last 13 Division 1 women's national championships. The University of Minnesota swept to the NCAA Women's Frozen Four crown in a memorable playoff run last season (2011-12) and, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches released Sept. 25, the Golden Gophers are the pick to win the Western Collegiate Hockey Association title again in 2012-13.

The Gophers, who also won the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship a year ago before beating WCHA regular season champion Wisconsin 4-2 to win the national title, return 15 players this season. Minnesota collected six first place votes and 48 points in the poll of the league's eight head coaches.

Wisconsin and North Dakota, another NCAA tournament qualifier last season, finished tied for second place in the poll with 40 votes, including one first place vote apiece. Minnesota Duluth, with 32 points, was selected to finish fourth, followed by Ohio State in fifth place, Bemidji State in sixth, Minnesota State in seventh and St. Cloud State in eighth.

Wisconsin senior forward Brianna Decker, the 2012 Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award winner as women's college hockey's outstanding player and reigning WCHA Player of the Year, was the coaches' pre-season choice for WCHA player of the year. She had four votes, while Minnesota forward Amanda Kessel and North Dakota forward Jocelyne Lamoureux, last season's league scoring champion, each received two votes. Minnesota freshman forward Hannah Brandt is the head coaches' unanimous choice as pre-season WCHA Rookie of the Year.

WCHA Announces 2012-13 Women's Schedule

WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF, NCAA Women's Frozen Four to be Held at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis in March; 112-Game Conference Slate Launches Sept. 28-29 as Minnesota State Hosts Defending WCHA Regular Season Champ Wisconsin; Minnesota Reigns as Defending WCHA Playoff and NCAA Frozen Four Champion; Badgers Open New home in LaBahn Arena

MADISON, Wis. – Both the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF playoff championship and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be conducted at 3,400-seat Ridder Arena on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis next March, two spotlight events that highlight the 2012-13 women's composite schedule announced by the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Also of note, the University of Wisconsin opens a new home-ice facility this season in LaBahn Arena.

With a record 13 consecutive national championships under its collective belt, including last season's title earned by the University of Minnesota, the WCHA will look to continue that record streak in what should be one of the most competitive league races ever.

The 112-game conference slate, comprised of 28 games per each of the Association's eight-member teams (four games – two home and two away – vs each of other seven members), gets underway during the season-opening weekend of Sept. 28-29 when Minnesota State welcomes two-time defending league champion Wisconsin. Two other league teams will host non-conference series with Ohio State taking on Lindenwood University and Minnesota engaging Colgate University. In exhibition play, Minnesota Duluth will skate against the Minnesota Whitecaps on both Friday and Saturday.

"The Association looks forward to putting another action-packed, highly-competitive product on the ice in 2012-13," said WCHA Associate Commissioner Sara R. Martin, the guiding force of the women's league since its founding in 1999. "The commitment to fielding top-quality programs and the dedication to success that our member institutions continue to display has resulted in some of the most entertaining women's hockey in the world over the past 13 seasons and we know that will continue in the future."

"I have no doubt this coming season's league race will be one of the most intriguing yet. We anticipate our teams will improve across the board and be both competitive and successful against opponents across the country. Last season, we had four teams ranked among the nation's top 10, four of our teams win at least 21 games overall, six finish at .500 or above and six win at least 11 games in league play. We also look forward to a tremendous post-season next March when both our WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four are showcased at UM's Ridder Arena. The University of Minnesota and the facility itself have a distinguished tradition of hosting first-class events."

The 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF is set for March 8 and March 9. There will be two semi-final match ups at Ridder Arena on Friday at 4:07 pm CT and 7:07 pm CT, with the playoff championship game slated for Saturday evening at 7:07 pm CT. The winner of the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF receives an automatic bid to the national tournament. This will mark the eighth time that Ridder Arena has served as the host of the league playoff championship round, with the others occurring in 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2011.

The NCAA Women's Frozen Four, to be held at Ridder Arena on Friday, March 22 and Sunday, March 24, will be appearing in Minneapolis for the fourth time overall. Minnesota is the defending national champion. Previous Frozen Fours were held in Minneapolis in 2001 when Minnesota Duluth earned the national title, in 2006 when Wisconsin prevailed, and in 2010 when the Bulldogs claimed

the crown. This season's championship will consist of two semi-final match ups on Friday and the national title contest on Sunday.

In between the WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF and the NCAA Women's Frozen Four will be NCAA Regionals the weekend of March 15-17.

On the second weekend of the new season, Friday, Oct. 5 and Saturday, Oct. 6, five more WCHA teams will launch their league campaigns as defending national champion Minnesota hosts St. Cloud State, Minnesota Duluth entertains Ohio State and North Dakota welcomes Minnesota State. Bemidji State's first WCHA series this fall will come on Oct. 12-13 when the Beavers host St. Cloud State.

In Madison this season, the Wisconsin Badgers will call LaBahn Arena their new home. With seating for approximately 2,400 spectators, the on-campus facility, which is located adjacent to the Kohl Center, will feature a 200 x 90 ice sheet for women's competition, women's and men's hockey practice, women's and men's team locker rooms and a visiting team locker room, offices for the women's hockey staff and an underground connection to the Kohl Center. Wisconsin will play its first two-game series in LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19 & 21 vs WCHA foe Bemidji State.

There will be a total of seven weekends this coming season that feature all eight teams engaged in league action. Those occur on Oct. 19-21, Nov. 16-18, Jan. 11-13, Jan. 18-19, Feb. 8-10, Feb. 15-17 and Feb. 22-23. The Feb. 22-23 slate will also mark the final regular season match ups as Minnesota State visits Ohio State, Wisconsin travels to Bemidji State, Minnesota Duluth entertains North Dakota and St. Cloud State hosts Minnesota.

The pursuit of the annual WCHA playoff championship will get underway the weekend of Friday, March 1 thru Sunday, March 3 with four first round, best-of-three, playoff series. The top four ranked teams in the final regular season standings will host the bottom four in the first round, with the No. 8 playoff seed at the No. 1 playoff seed, No. 7 playing at No. 2, No. 6 at No. 3 and the No. 5 seed at the No. 4 seed. The four first-round conference playoff winners will then advance to the 2013 WCHA FINAL FACE-OFF on March 8-9 at Ridder Arena.

Following the league's playoff championship, four NCAA Division 1 Women's Regional tournaments will be contested the weekend of Friday, March 15 thru Sunday, March 17 at sites to be determined.

The four NCAA regional winners will earn a trip to the 2013 NCAA Women's Frozen Four at Ridder Arena the weekend of March 22-24.

WCHA-member teams will also engage in a number of non-conference pairings this season. By team, those are:

The Bemidji State Beavers (1-1-0, 0-0-0 WCHA) began their 2012-13 season with a trip to Providence last weekend, their longest road trip of the season, and earned a 3-2 victory in game 1 and fell 5-1 in the weekend finale ... the 3-2 win came after the Friars took a 2-0 lead in the second period and led 2-1 entering the third ... the third period comeback win was Bemidji State's first since Nov. 5, 2005 when it overcame a 1-0 deficit in the final frame to top Minnesota State 2-1 ... On the Oct. 5-6 weekend, freshman Kaitlyn Tougas, sophomore Kayleigh Chapman, and junior Alex Ehler each notched their first collegiate goals ... Freshmen Kaitlyn Tougas and Megan Lushanko earned their first collegiate points with assists last Friday ... Senior goaltender Jessica Havel made her first start and got her first win on Oct. 5, stopping 24 of 26 shots ... Sophomore transfer (from Niagara) Abby Rypanski made her Bemidji State debut on Saturday (Oct. 6), taking a loss by allowing five goals on 26 shots ... The Beavers played both games without the services of 2011-12 leading goal-scorer Emily Erickson and Kristin Huber, who led the team's newcomers in points last year ... BSU is now 2-1-1 all-time against Providence ... Before opening Wisconsin's new LaBahn Arena on Oct. 19, Bemidji State will open its WCHA schedule with a home series against St. Cloud State this weekend (Oct. 12-13) at Sanford Center ... The Beavers have won their last 10 meetings with the SCSU Huskies ... all-time, BSU is 26-26-7 against St. Cloud State with 14-10-4 mark at home and an 8-3-1 ledger in the month of October ... Under seventh year head coach Steve Sertich, Bemidji State is 13-11-3 against SCSU with a 7-4-1 record at home.

Minnesota

The top-rated Golden Gophers (4-0-0, 2-0-0 WCHA, 6 points) are off to a perfect 4-0 record to start the 2012-13 season, which is the seventh time in the 16-year history of the Minnesota program ...
