INSIDE THE GAME

UND GOES FOR SEVEN STRAIGHT OVER NORTHERN COLORADO

Following a tough loss at No. 3 Weber State, North Dakota returns home to the friendly confines of the Alerus Center for a showdown with Northern Colorado on Saturday at 1 p.m. Alex Heinert and Ryan Kasowski will have the call on MidcoSN2 while the usual trio of Jack Michaels, Mike Berg, and Paul Ralston will handle the radio duties on the Home of Economy Radio Network.

This will be the 31st meeting between North Dakota and Northern Colorado, with UND owning the all-time series lead, 18-12. The rivalry has turned the Hawks' way since both teams joined Division I, as the green and white have won seven of the eight matchups, including six straight. Grand Forks has been a nightmare for the Bears, losing 10 of the 13 contests

Fans haven't been used to seeing this type of play from the Fighting Hawks on both sides of the ball, as the green and white have been struggling with the ground game. On offense, UND ranks 101st in the FCS with 113.3 yards per game. The Hawks have only rushed for 150+ yards twice this season (at EWU, vs. UCD). On defense, UND sits 94th in the FCS with 198.9 yards allowed per game. The Hawks have allowed 200+ yards rushing in six games, including four straight.

UND has been lights out in the red zone, as the Hawks lead the nation in red zone percentage. As a team, UND is 27-for-28 in red zone opportunities for a 96.4 conversion percentage. 22 of the 27 scores have been TDs while the other five have been field goals. The lone miss came against UC Davis, when the Hawks missed a field goal at the 20.

WINNING RECORD

North Dakota holds an all-time program mark of 653-424-30 over its 124 previous seasons of football. Over that time, UND has won 26 conference championships, three bowl invitations, 14 NCAA postseason appearances, and the 2001 Division II National Championship.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 207 student-athletes have received academic all-conference nods (145 NCC, 49 GWC, 13 BSC) and five nationally recognized scholar-athlete awards. UND has placed at least one student-athlete on the NFF and College Football Hall of Fame Hampshire Honor Society since moving to Division I in 2008.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Over a million fans have seen UND post an 90-27 record at the Alerus Center in its 18 seasons of existence. That mark includes a 10-1 postseason record and a school-record 23game home winning streak from 2002 to 2005.

OFFENSIVE POTW: Cole Kelley, QB, Southeastern Louisiana

Kelley has been productive off the bench all season, and he came on to lead Southeastern Louisiana to a 34-0 win at then-No. 7 Central Arkansas in the Southland Conference. The Arkansas transfer accounted for all five of the Lions' touchdowns, tying the school's single-game record with four on the ground and throwing for one more. He completed 20 of 24 passes for 273 yards and finished with 312 yards of total offense. With their second Top 10 win, the Lions moved into a four-way tie for first place in the conference.

DEFENSIVE POTW: Dylan Draka, LB, Illinois State

Draka led the way as Illinois State put the defensive clamps on then-No. 4 South Dakota State for a 27-18 victory in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. Four of Draka's five tackles were solo stops and three went for loss, and he had a forced fumble, a pass breakup and a pair of fumble recoveries. His sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery late in the fourth quarter set up a key field goal. The Redbirds limited South Dakota State well below its averages with just 81 rushing yards and 260 yards of offense.




SPECIAL TEAMS POTW: Parker Pastorello, P, Northwestern State

Pastorello had Lamar's offense nearly stopped before it got started in Northwestern State's second win of the season, 34-13 in the Southland Conference. Pastorello dropped three of his five punts inside the Cardinals' 20yard line, including two that pinned them at their 3. He averaged 47.2 yards on his punts, and Lamar's average starting field position on them was the 15.

BUBBA SCHWEIGERT

HEAD COACH

The 2019 season will be the sixth for head coach Bubba Schweigert. It will also be the end of a transition period for his program as the Fighting Hawks move from the Big Sky into a two-year stint as an FCS Independent before joining the Missouri Valley Football Conference for the 2020 season.

2018 was a bit of a roller coaster ride for Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks, finishing with their third winning season in the last five years (6-5) but coming up just short in reaching the FCS playoffs. The highs saw UND defeat No. 5 Sam Houston State, 24-23, to snap the FCS' longest-running home winning streak, erupt for 34 first-half points in a 44-14 drubbing over No. 22 Montana, wracking up 480 yards on the ground in a 41-15 win at Sacramento State, and battling No. 9 Washington in Seattle. However, three losses over the final four games of the season left the Hawks at 6-5 and one of the first four teams left out of the playoff picture.

Linebacker Noah Larson was named a Jerry Rice Award finalist for his efforts, defensive end Mason Bennett was named to the HERO Sports All-America Third Team entering 2019, and wide receiver Noah Wanzek was named one of the top pass catchers in the country entering 2019 by HERO Sports.

Injuries took their toll on the roster and derailed a promising 2017 season that had UND pegged to repeat as Big Sky Champions, but ended in a 3-8 campaign. All was not lost, however, as the Fighting Hawks did post their first shutout during Schweigert's tenure with a 38-0 blanking of future MVFC foe Missouri State and recorded league wins against Northern Colorado and on the road at Portland State.

Junior running back John Santiago claimed All-America honors for the third consecutive season and was joined by four other Fighting Hawks in garnering All-Big Sky accolades. The Fighting Hawks also continued their success in the classroom, matching a program record by having 18 student-athletes named to the Big Sky All-Academic team.

Schweigert developed a nice pattern through his first three seasons as the head coach at North Dakota. Each year his squad produced more positive results than the previous one and 2016 was no exception as he was named the Big Sky and FCS Region 5 Coach of the Year.

The Fighting Hawks shared the Big Sky Conference regular season title with Eastern Washington, reeled off a 9-game winning streak and earned the No. 7 overall seed in the Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs in 2016.

After losing the first two games of the season by a combined four points, a double-overtime victory against South Dakota launched UND into Big Sky play where the Fighting Hawks ran the table. There were tight games and lobsided games, but his team always found a way to come out on top in league play and give UND its first undefeated conference record since Dale Lennon's 2003 squad went 7-0 in North Central Conference play.

The defense was once again the top-rated run defense in the league and sixth in the FCS. The unit was also tops in the Big Sky with 20 interceptions and tied for second nationally, trailing only national champion James Madison in that category.

Four Fighting Hawks earned All-America accolades, including safety Cole Reyes, who landed on six different All-America squads. The junior captain was also named the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year. Reyes was one of 15 UND players to earn All-Big Sky honors on the field, while 18 set a program record by being named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team. Senior Brian Labat led those efforts in the classroom and also earned CoSIDA All-District 6 Team honors.

Schweigert wrapped up the 2015 season with what was the first three-game winning streak of his UND head-coaching tenure. Those three victories gave his second UND squad a 7-4 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big Sky play, which were both two-game improvements from his first season back in Grand Forks.

Schweigert's defense led the Big Sky in rushing defense for the second straight season under his watch and the offense improved immensely thanks in large part to the record-breaking production of true freshman running back John Santiago. After a 4-3 start that included the program's first victory over an FBS opponent (24-13 win at Wyoming) and first DI victory over a ranked opponent on the road (19-17 win at No. 16 Portland State), the Fighting Hawks would go on to post the program's first seven-win season since 2011.

On Dec 28, 2013, Schweigert was introduced as the head coach at the University of North Dakota during a press conference in front of a standing-room only crowd at the Alerus Center.

Santiago was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year and collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and STATS, Inc. He was also a unanimous All-Big Sky first team performer and was joined on that team by senior linebacker Will Ratelle and offensive lineman Sean Meehan, who was also named to the AFCA All-America Team.

Eight more Fighting Hawks would garner all-league honors in 2015 as the defense once again ranked among the tops in the Big Sky, ranking first in rush defense and second in total defense.

In the classroom, 17 UND football players were named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team, breaking the previous year's record by one.

In his first season back at UND, Schweigert's 2014 squad won five games overall, which was a two-game improvement from the previous season. The campaign was highlighted by a 30-28 upset of No. 22 Northern Arizona in the final home game of the season at the Alerus Center.

UND took the positive vibes from a victory that knocked NAU out of the FCS playoff hunt to Greely, Colo., the next Saturday where the team closed out the season with its first Big Sky road win of the season -- a 33-14 defeat of Northern Colorado.

The defensive-minded head coach still works with the team's cornerbacks and they were part of a unit that led the Big Sky in total defense and rush defense in 2014. Two newcomers earned All-Big Sky Conference honors (KR Alex Tillman and PK Reid Taubenheim) and seven more players were named honorable mention in Schweigert's first season.

There were also 16 UND football players named to the All-Big Sky Academic team, which tied a program record for individuals honored in one season.

The Zeeland, N.D., native returned to Grand Forks after 10 years away from a program that he helped lead to the 2001 NCAA Division II national title as defensive coordinator.

Prior to his return to UND, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois for the previous six seasons (2008-13) and served as associate head coach for the last five of that stretch. His 2010 defense led the Missouri Valley in total defense and his unit finished in the top half of the league in four of his six campaigns at SIU.

In his six seasons at SIU, Schweigert coached three first team All-Americans and 20 all-conference selections (10 first team, six second team, four honorable mentions). His defensive standouts have included linebacker and 2012 graduate Jayson DiManche, currently playing for Cincinnati Bengals, and cornerback Korey Lindsey, a three-time All-American and a 2011 draft pick of the Bengals. In 2013, SIU linebacker Bryan Presume earned first team All-MVFC honors after ranking third in the league with 104 tackles. His 55 solo stops were tops in the conference.

Prior to arriving at SIU, Schweigert took on his first head coaching job at the collegiate level, leading the Division II program at Minnesota Duluth from 2004-07. He guided the Bulldogs to a 22-21 overall record during his tenure, including the program's first North Central Conference title in 2005. The NCAA playoff berth that season was the program's second in four seasons. That same season, Schweigert

was also named the D2football.com Northwest Region Coach of the Year and the AFCA Division II Coach of the Year for Region 5.

This will be the second stint at UND for Schweigert. He spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach in Grand Forks (1989-2003) where he was part of eight NCAA playoff teams and six NCC title squads.

Schweigert was elevated to defensive coordinator at UND prior to the 1997 season and left for Duluth after the 2003 UND team finished as national runner-up. Schweigert was named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In his seven seasons as UND's defensive coordinator, Schweigert's defensive players earned 14 All-America honors and 23 first-team All-NCC accolades. His 2001 defense yielded just 191.4 yards of offense and 50.3 rushing yards per game, while limiting opponents to 12.5 points per game on the way to the program's first national championship.

Schweigert began his coaching career at his alma mater, now the University of Jamestown, from 1985-1988. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Jamestown and a master's degree from UND. In 2002, he was honored with Jamestown's Rollie Greeno Award for outstanding commitment in the field of education and coaching.

Schweigert and his wife, Laura, have two sons, Alex and Cooper.

LEADERSHIP



North Dakota head football coach Bubba Schweigert announced the program's leadership selections for the

Nate Ketteringham, Donnell Rodgers, Mason Bennett, and Noah Wanzek were selected by their teammates as captains entering the season.

In his first season under center for the Fighting Hawks, Ketteringham started all 11 games and finished with 158 completions, 1,835 yards, and 16 touchdowns. The San Diego, Calif., native finished with four games with 200plus passing yards and helped UND to a pair of ranked wins over No. 5 Sam Houston State and No. 22 Montana, including a career-high four TD passes in the win vs. the Griz. Ketteringham spent his first two collegiate seasons at Sacramento State where he started 16 games, throwing for 3,391 yards and 24 touchdowns during his tenure with the Hornets. He will enter the season as the starting quarterback for the Hawks, and plans to enter the Navy to become a SEAL following the conclusion of his playing

After missing nearly the entire 2017 campaign due to an injury, Rodgers returned in a big way last season for the Fighting Hawks by leading the team in solo (49) and total tackles (72), both of which were career highs. The Woodbury, Minn., native ranked third on the team with eight tackles for loss as well as finishing with a trio of pass breakups, an interception, and a fumble recovery. The senior tallied a pair of games with eight solo tackles, including three tackles for loss vs. Idaho State. Rodgers completed his undergraduate degree in Kinesiology last spring and is currently pursuing a graduate degree.

Bennett wreaked havoc on opposing offenses during the 2018 season, pacing the Fighting Hawk defense in sacks (9.0), tackles for loss (15), and quarterback hurries (7). His nine sacks were just two shy of the single-season record for sacks at UND, set in 1999 by Wes Atkinson and tied in 2001 by current defensive coordinator Eric Schmidt. The Winnipeg, Man., native recorded multiple sacks in four games this season as well as a pair of contests with three tackles for loss. Over his career, Bennett has 14.5 total sacks to place 10th all-time in program history. He is currently completing his degree in communications.

Wanzek followed a breakout 2017 season by once again pacing the UND receiving corps with 52 receptions, 685 yards, and six touchdowns. His receiving yards and touchdown marks were a new career high, as the Jamestown, N.D., native has led UND in catches, yards, and receiving scores each of the last two years. Wanzek set a new best with 10 catches against Weber State, finishing with 111 yards and a score in the contest. He also hauled in the game-winning catch at No. 5 Sam Houston State to halt the FCS' longest active home-winning streak (21). Over his career, Wanzek ranks second in UND's Division I history (2008-present) in receptions (129), yards (1,700), and touchdown receptions (14) while his 1,721 all-purpose yards rank 10th. He is currently finishing his degree in management.

SERIES NOTES

HEAD COACH EARNEST COLLINS JR.

- Head Coach Earnest Collins Jr. was named the 16th football coach in school history on December 28, 2010. He returned to his alma mater to serve as head coach. In 1996, Collins received his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Northern Colorado after playing for the Bears from 1991-94, where he amassed 978 punt return yards, then the school record and still second alltime. His 497 punt return yards from his senior season are still atop the school's leaderboard.
- During his time as the head man at Northern Colorado, five Bears have earned time with NFL teams in Jace Davis, Seth Lobato, Lexington Smith, Kyle Sloter and Frank Stephens. Collins has also coached 64 All-Big Sky players during his seven seasons with UNC.
- Collins and the Bears struggled in his first season at the helm going winless but then turned it around with a 5-6 season in 2012. Following two down seasons in 2013 and '14, he led the team to its first winning season as a Division I program in 2015 at 6-5. Northern Colorado repeated the feat in 2016 with another 6-5 season. Injuries riddled Collins' seventh season in charge of UNC leading to a 3-7 record. Against a grueling 2018 schedule that featured eight teams either ranked or receiving votes the Bears went 2-9.
- After a stellar career at Northern Colorado, where he lettered every season from 1991 through 1994 and earned all-conference honors in 1994, Collins spent 1996-99 at Northwest Missouri State as the secondary and assistant special teams coach, helping the Bearcats to the 1998 and 1999 NCAA Division II National Championships. In both seasons, Collins and the Bearcats got the best of the Bears in the playoffs, winning the quarterfinals in 1998 in Maryville (42-17) and then winning the 1999 semifinals at Nottingham Field (41-35).
- From 2000-03, Collins returned to Greeley where he served as the secondary and special teams coach. In 2002, the Bears reached the NCAA Division II Semifinals and had the top-ranked defense in the North Central Conference (NCC) and No. 8 defense among Division II (249.8 yards per game).

- After his second coaching stint with UNC, Collins became the special teams and cornerbacks coach at Kansas from 2003-06. The Jayhawks advanced to two bowl games and he coached a pair of All-Americans in the defensive backfield.
- He spent 2007 at Central Florida before heading to Alcorn State in 2008 as the associate head coach. In 2009, he was promoted to head coach at Alcorn State.
- In two years at the helm of Alcorn State, the Braves went 8-12 with significant signs of improvement.
 Alcorn State ranked 30th in FCS in scoring offense in 2010, averaging 29.64 points per game.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

- Jacob Knipp is back for a sixth year for the Bears after receiving a waiver from the NCAA after suffering an injury that ended his 2018 season early. In UNC's homecoming game against Portland State, Knipp became the team's first QB to run for 100-plus yards since becoming a Division I program. He led the team with 127 yards on the ground and added 300 more through the air. Knipp enters this week ranked second in career yards and touchdowns in Northern Colorado's Division I record book.
- Luke Nelson has become the defensive QB for Northern Colorado over the past two seasons. The now senior has raked up tackle after tackle over the years to rank third in DI total tackles with 260.
- Opposing quarterbacks will think twice before passing to the side of the field that senior corner back Michael Walker is covering. Walker became the program's Division I leader in pass breakups against Eastern Washington passing Courtney Hall. Walker has twice been named the Root Sports Defensive Player of the Week. First for his performance against Idaho when he had a pair of interceptions in the red zone to help the Bears in their comeback win. The other came against Idaho State when he had another two pick day, including a 35-yard pick-six and he also forced a fumble in another LINC win

SERIES RECORD

 This will be the 31st meeting between North Dakota and Northern Colorado, with UND owning the all-time series lead, 18-12. The rivalry has turned the Hawks' way since both teams joined Division I, as the green and white have won seven of the eight matchups, including six straight. Grand Forks has been a nightmare for the Bears, losing 10 of the 13 contests.

LAST MEETING

GROUND GAME DOMINATES IN BLOWOUT WIN AT NORTHERN COLORADO

Visiting North Dakota used a methodical offense and a stifling defense to dominate Northern Colorado, 38-13, Saturday afternoon at Nottingham Field. UND, playing without star John Santiago, got big contributions from Brady Oliveira (123 yards rushing, 2TD) and James Johannesson (career-high 141 yards rushing) to record its second straight road win.

Santiago sustained an injury in last week's game against Idaho State and was a gametime decision Saturday. He ultimately did not play and gave way to Oliveira and Johannesson to do the damage. The duo combined for 264 yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns as the Fighting Hawks out-gained the Bears, 474-201.

It was textbook clock control as North Dakota held the ball for 38:51 and rushed the 61 times in the win. That attempt total was tied for the most-ever by a team at Nottingham Field and UND's 351 net rushing yards ranked second all-time.

Ketteringham finished 9-for-16 passing for 123 yards and two rushing touchdowns. The Fighting Hawks defense totaled nine tackles for loss with Austin Cieslak and Tanner Palmborg each garnering 2.0 TFLs.

HIGHLIGHTS

NO FLY ZONE

- UND has been stout against the pass this season, boasting one of the FCS' top secondaries.
- The 55 yards allowed through the air and the 2.5 yards per pass to Drake were the lowest on record since at least 2006.
- UND was stout through the air against the high-octane passing offense of Sam Houston State, surrendering only 118 yards through the air and 280 total yards.
- Eric Barriere of EWU, who entered the game against UND as the nation's leading passer, was held to just 93 yards and zero touchdowns through the air. The total is his lowest since taking over as the starter in 2017 and the fewest by an EWU team since Oct. 31, 1998.
- UND has held its opponent under 200 yards passing through four straight games for the first time since 2007 when UND was still a member of Division II.
- In eight total games this season, UND has surrendered 200 yards or fewer in six of those games, but over 300 in two contests.
- UND currently ranks 16th in passing defense with 182.6 yards surrendered per game.

A WHOLE LOTTA RANKING

- UND is 3-3 this season against ranked foes, picking up wins over No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, No. 12 UC Davis, and No. 9/9 Montana State while falling to No. 1/1 North Dakota State, No. 21/21 Eastern Washington, and No. 3/3 Weber State.
- The No. 12 ranking by UC Davis was the second-highest ranked opponent UND has defeated in the DI era at the time, only to be eclipsed by UND's most-recent win over No. 9/9 Montana State (No. 5 Sam Houston – 2018).

RUSHING WOES

- Fans haven't been used to seeing this type of play from the Fighting Hawks on both sides of the ball, as the green and white have been struggling with the ground game.
- On offense, UND ranks 101st in the FCS with 113.3 yards per game. The Hawks have only rushed for 150+ yards twice this season (at EWU, vs. UCD).
- On defense, UND sits 94th in the FCS with 198.9 yards allowed per game. The Hawks have allowed 200+ yards rushing in six games, including four straight.

THE CANDY MAN

 Junior Jordan Canady hauled in his fourth career interception against Drake to place him tied for fifth in UND's DI era for picks. His three INTs last season paced the Fighting Hawk defense while his **17** total breakups ranked **seventh** in the DI era.

HOME COOKIN'

- While the Alerus Center has had a strong reputation for being a tough place to play, the Fighting Hawks have started 4-0 at home for only the third time in the DI era, with the most recent time coming in 2016.
- UND has also knocked off three ranked opponents at home for the first time in the DI era.
- The No. 9 ranking by Montana State was the highestranked opponent UND has defeated at home since Dec. 6, 2003 vs. North Alabama in the DII playoffs.

BROCKSTAR FORMATION

- Despite being moved to wide receiver, Brock Boltmann has spent some time at his former position of quarterback during the season in a special formation.
- Dubbed the "Brockstar Formation," the sophomore busted a run for 15 yards to begin a scoring drive as well as completing a pass against No. 1 NDSU.
- The formation was in full effect vs. No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, as Boltmann broke off a 56-yard run for a touchdown against the Bearkats. The run was the longest of the sesaon for the Fighting Hawks.
- The sophomore had his best game as a Fighting Hawk in the win over No. 12 UC Davis, running for 47 yards and catching five passes for 54 yards and a touchdown.
- Boltmann threw for his first-career touchdown in the win over No. 9/9 Montana State, tossing a 36-yard strike to **Travis Toivonen** for the score.
- With a passing, rushing, and receiving touchdown, he becomes the first play since Mitch Sutton in 2009 to score a TD in all three ways.

SIEGELS ARE BALL HAWKS TOO

 Redshirt freshman CJ Siegel has been thrusted into a starting role at defensive back this season due to an injury to Evan Holm, and has shined. His 10 defensed passes are tied for 40th in the FCS.

RED ZONE, BLUE ZONE

- UND has been lights out in the red zone when it comes to turning opportunites into points, as the Hawks lead the nation in red zone percentage.
- As a team, UND is 27-for-28 in red zone opportunities for a 96.4 conversion percentage. 22 of the 27 scores have been TDs while the other five have been field goals. The lone miss came against UC Davis, when the Hawks missed a field goal at the 20.

NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo was unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker and the UND football team played under that nickname in its 2015 season finale at Cal Poly -- a 45-21 victory over the Mustangs.



The 2019 season will be the fourth of the program's new helmet look. The 2016 unveiling marked the first time since the 1969 season that UND helmets were adorned with a new logo. The interlocking ND had been emblazoned on both sides of the helmets for the past 47 seasons, but were replaced in 2016 by the athletic department's new Fighting Hawks logo. The new logo appears on the right side, while the players' number appears on the left side.

HIGHLIGHTS

IT'S BENN-ETT A MINUTE

- Defensive end Mason Bennett opened eyes nationally with his play in 2018 by pacing the Fighting Hawk defense with 9.0 sacks. The Winnipeg, Man., native finished just two sacks shy of the single-season record for sacks at UND, set in 1999 (Wes Atkinson) and tied in 2001 by current defensive coordinator Eric Schmidt (11.0).
- The senior is now just 2.5 sacks away from becoming the program's Division I all-time leader and is now fourth all-time with 17.0 sacks.
- Bennett left the game at Cal Poly with an injury, his status is currently **probable** for the contest vs. UNC.

SACKLED OR SHACKLED

- After going back-to-back games without a sack for the first time since 2013, UND broke out in the win at Cal Poly. The Hawks sacked the QB twice in the fourth quarter before adding three more against No. 9/9 Montana State to move their season total to 18.0.
- On the offensive side, the UND o-line has done a nice job protecting their quarterbacks, surrendering only 15 sacks through eight games to rank tied for 34th in the nation.

THE GREAT NATE

- Last season, quarterback Nate Ketteringham threw for 1,835 yards, 16 TDs, and completed 54.7% of his passes to help lead the Fighting Hawks to a 6-5 record. The hurler had a pair of games with four-or-more touchdowns, including throwing for a tetrad of scores and running for another in a 41-14 victory over No. 22 Montana.
- It was shaping up to be another sparkling debut for Ketteringham vs. Drake, but the senior was forced to leave the contest on the opening drive of the third quarter due to an undisclosed injury. His status for this week's contest is unknown. Prior to exiting the game, Ketteringham threw for 152 yards and a touchdown on 19 completions. His 76.0 completion percentage vs. the Bulldogs is a career high.
- Ketteringham bounced back in a big way vs. No. 12 UC Davis, throwing for 279 yards and three scores to help engineer the victory. The senior completed 72.5% of his throws, 29-of-40, to seven-different receivers and only committed one turnover.
- The senior had a strong game at Idaho State despite a tough outcome, throwing for 360 yards and two scores on 33-of-55 passing. The 360 yards the most through the air under Bubba Schweigert (since 2014)
- Ketteringham eclipsed the 3,000-yard mark through the air in his UND career with a 20-for-30 day for 234 yards and two scores in the win at Cal Poly.
- The senior has done a strong job of taking care of the ball over the last three games, going 70-for-104 (67.3%) for 758 yards, six TDs, and zero turnovers.

BOOK OF NOAH

- Freshman linebacker Noah Larson finished the season with 64 total tackles, second-most on the team. He added five tackles for loss, including a pair of sacks and a fumble recovery, starting all 11 games for the Fighting Hawks. He was named as a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award as the FCS' top freshman.
- Larson teammed up with **Donnell Rodgers** for the game-winning stop vs. No. 24/21 Sam Houston State on 4th and 2. The duo stuffed the QB in the backfield and forced a fumble to seal the victory. The sophomore also recorded his first-career interception and nine tackles in the win.
- The sophomore had another pick to set up a scoring drive by the Fighting Hawks in the win over No. 12 UC Davis. Larson also finished a trio of stops and a tackle for loss.
- Larson was dynamic against the triple option of Cal Poly, finishing second on the team with career-high 14 tackles in the win. The sophomore recorded the gamewinning tackle on fourth down as well.

BLACKJACK

- North Dakota's 24-23 win at No. 5 Sam Houston State (Sept. 15, 2018) snapped the nation's longest home winning streak at 21 games, handing the Bearkats their first loss at home in nearly three years (Sept. 19, 2015 to Lamar). The victory also marked the highest-ranked opponent that North Dakota has defeated in the DI era (2008-present).
- The Fighting Hawks tripped up the No. 24/21 Bearkats again, this time at the Alerus Center, with a 27-23 victory. UND also clipped No. 9/9 Montana State, 16-12, to post its biggest win at home in the DI era. Sam Houston State, Cal Poly, and now Montana State have been defeated twice by UND when ranked.
- UND is 11-27 against ranked opponents in its Division I era and 12-27 all-time against ranked FCS schools.

BULLDOGS CAGED

 The 129 total yards allowed are the fewest surrendered by UND since at least 2006 and marks the fourth time during that span they have given up fewer than 200 total yards.

INVADER ZIM

- Senior quarterback Andrew Zimmerman was sparkling in relief for the Fighting Hawks following the injury to Nate Ketteringham. The Monroe, Wash., native finished 7-of-9 for 132 yards and a pair of touchdown passes.
- The 132 yards are tied for the third most in his career and were the most since he threw for 179 yards and two scores in relief vs. Sacramento State on Oct. 21, 2017
- Zim made his first-career start against No. 1 NDSU last Saturday, throwing for 150 yards and completing 59.3% of his passes. The senior was picked off twice, including

once off a deflection.

 The senior looked to be off to a nice start against No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, but was injured in the first quarter and forced to leave the game. His status is currently out.

THE M STANDS FOR MONEY

- Sophomore wide receiver Garett Maag has created a knack for making all of his catches count as the Inver Grove Heights, Minn., native caught two passes for 43 yards and a touchdown in the season opening win vs. Drake
- Maag put on a show against No. 1 NDSU, eclipsing a new career high with 76 receiving yards on six catches, including a team-long 30-yard catch from Zimmerman.
- He once again made his two catches count with a 4-yard touchdown reception from Zimmerman against No. 24/21 Sam Houston State. Maag became the fastest receiver since Greg Hardin (2010-13) to seven touchdown catches in his career.
- Maag hauled in five catches for 72 yards, including a season-long 43-yard strike from Ketteringham, at No. 21 Eastern Washington.
- The sophomore exploded for a career day vs. No. 12 UC Davis, hauled in a career-high 10 catches and 81 yards while also striking for a touchdown in the win.

GO RIGHT HOLM

- 2018 marked a breakout campaign for current senior defensive back Evan Holm, as he took on some of the toughest assignments in the FCS last season. His 10 pass breakups on the season are the fifth most in the program's Division I history and his 17 career pass deflections are seventh since moving to DI.
- In the victory last season at No. 5 Sam Houston, Holm was credited with four pass breakups, including several in the endzone as the Hawks held the Bearkats to its lowest scoring output at home since 2014.
- His 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on Oct. 27
 of last year against No. 4 Weber State was the first UND
 kickoff return for a score since John Santiago turned
 the trick against Weber State as well two seasons ago
 (100 yards).
- After missing the first seven games of the season, Holm returned to action against No. 9/9 Montana State and broke up a trio of passes.

FARGO FREIGHT TRAIN SET FOR LARGER LOAD

- The Fargo, N.D., native had a strong junior season for the Fighting Hawks, finishing second on the team with 657 yards and four rushing touchdowns, which included a stretch of three straight 100-yard games.
- Johannesson's greatest game in a UND uniform to date came on Oct. 20 of last season when he exploded for 213 yards on just 11 carries and two scores at Sacramento State. The mark broke Dave Osborn's school record for yards per carry while his 90-yard touchdown scamper was the longest in the program's DI history.
- Johannesson broke out at No. 21 Eastern Washington, scampering for 107 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown. The senior had a season-long 56-yard run to setup UND's first score of the day.
- With six scores on the ground, he became the first player since Ryan Chappell in 2007 to start the year with a touchdown in the first four games of the season.

MR. RODGERS NEIGHBORHOOD

 Senior linebacker Donnell Rodgers returned from a season-ending injury in a big way during the 2018 year by leading the Fighiting Hawks in solo (49) and total tackles (72). The 72 total tackles are tied for eighth in DI history for the Fighting Hawks for total stops in a single season, while his solo mark of 49 tackles rank sixth.

- Rodgers was all over the field at No. 1 North Dakota State, leading the team with 16 total tackles, a new career high.
- The senior was strong again for the Fighting Hawks in the win over No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, leading the team in tackles with 10, tallying a sack, and a tackle for loss to seal the win over the Bearkats.
- Rodgers reached double figures and led the team for the third straight game at No. 21 Eastern Washington, recording 11 total tackles and 2.5 stops for loss.
- He made it four consecutive games with at least 10 tackles vs. No. 12 UC Davis, leading the squad with 13 stops, 0.5 TFLs, three pass breakups, and a forced fumble.
- Rodgers just missed a career-best day against Cal Poly, tallying a team-high 15 tackles, a sack, and a TFL.
- His 62 assisted tackles this season have passed Will Ratelle for the most in a single season in UND's DI history while his 96 total tackles are fourth and ninth in the FCS.
- He is currently second in UND's DI history with 111
 asssisted tackles in his career, places third with 211
 total tackles, and is ninth with 100 solo stops.

TOMMY TOUCHDOWN

- Thrust into action at the midway portion of the first quarter, Tommy Schuster shined in his debut for the Hawks in the win over No. 24/21 Sam Houston State.
- The freshman's 17 completions are the most in a debut since Joey Bradley's 18 vs. Drake (Sept. 1, 2011) and his 165 yards in a debut are the most since Ryan Bartels' 212 yards vs. Valparaiso (Aug. 29, 2013).
- With the injury to Zimmerman, Schuster has taken over the backup duties for the foreseeable future.

MAGIC WAND-ZEK

- Current senior wide receiver Noah Wanzek led the Fighting Hawks in receptions (52), receiving yards (685) and receiving touchdowns (6). He set a new career high in receptions with 10 against Weber State (Oct. 27), accumulating 111 yards and a score in the contest. The Jamestown, N.D., native has led UND in catches, yards, and receiving TDs in back-to-back years.
- Wanzek had a stellar debut against Drake, leading the UND receiving corps with nine catches for 86 yards and a touchdown.
- The senior matched a game-high six catches against the No. 1 Bison, accounting for 46 yards.
- Wanzek finished just shy of a new career high in catches (9) and yards (109) against No. 21/24 Sam Houston State.
- He busted out for a career-high 124 yards and a touchdown on six catches at Idaho State.
- The senior eclipsed 2,000 yards receiving vs. No. 12 UC Davis, becoming only the second player to accomplish the feat in the Division I era.
- Wanzek saved his best for Weber State once again, as the senior set a new career-high with 140 yards on seven catches and a touchdown vs. the Wildcats.
- While you can see how high the Jamestown native is on the DI charts, Wanzek is also making his mark on UND's all-time records as well. He currently ranks third all-time with 2,410 receiving yards, tied for ninth with 17 TDs, and fourth in career catches with 181.
