## INSIDE THE GAME

## UND, SDSU SET TO RENEW RIVALRY IN TOP-15 BATTLE

Fresh off a victory over No. 24 Southern Illinois, No. 14 North Dakota turns its attention to another ranked foe, No. 3 South Dakota State on Saturday afternoon from the Alerus Center. Fans can watch the contest on MidcoSN2 and ESPN+ with Alex Heinert and Ryan Kasowski on the call or tune into the Home of Economy Radio Network with Jack Michaels and Tom Dosch.

This will be only the third meeting between North Dakota and South Dakota State since both programs moved to Division I and the first conference showdown between the programs since 2003. In that last meeting, UND rallied to defeat the Jackrabbits, 25-24, in Brookings. The last conference game at home for UND against the Jacks was Sept. 29, 2001, a 44-9 win by the Sioux.

UND welcomed itself to the Missouri Valley Football Conference in style, becoming only the second team to win its MVFC debut over a ranked team since the league's inaugural season in 1985. The 44 points were also the most scored by a team in its first game in the league's history.

The Fighting Hawks have seen some success against ranked opponents over the last few seasons, notching their fourth straight win at home over a team sitting inside the top-25 polls. Of UND's 12 victories over ranked teams in the FCS era, 10 of them have taken place inside the Alerus Center.

### PROGRAM NOTES

#### WINNING RECORD

North Dakota holds an all-time program mark of 656-425-30 over its 125 previous seasons of football. Over that time, UND has won 26 conference championships, three bowl invitations, 16 NCAA postseason appearances, and the 2001 Division II National Championship.

#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 207 student-athletes have received academic all-conference nods (145 NCC, 49 GWC, 13 BSC) and five nationally recognized scholar-athlete awards. UND has placed at least one student-athlete on the NFF and College Football Hall of Fame Hampshire Honor Society since moving to Division I in 2008.

#### ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Over a million fans have seen UND post an 93-27 record at the Alerus Center in its 19 seasons of existence. That mark includes a 10-1 postseason record and a school-record 23-game home winning streak from 2002 to 2005.

### FCS BEST



**OFFENSIVE POTW:** Cameron Burston, Tarleton, QB, Sr., 6-4, 200, Vallejo, California

Named the starter just hours before kickoff, Burston immediately sparked FCS newcomer Tarleton (1-1) to a 43-17 rout of FBS member New Mexico State. Burston scored on a 70-yard QB keeper and connected with Gabe Douglas for an 86-yard touchdown on the Texans' first two offensive plays. He completed 15 of 29 passes for 252 yards and two touchdowns, and had 79 yards and two touchdowns on the ground.



**DEFENSIVE POTW:** Michael Mason, Wofford, DE, So., 6-3, 255, Effingham, South Carolina

Mason left his business card in the Mercer backfield while the Terriers posted a 31-14 win in the Southern Conference - their 100th all-time at Gibbs Stadium. He collected eight tackles (seven solos) with three tackles for loss, including a pair of sacks that caused fumbles recovered by the Terriers. He also dropped a Mercer ball carrier for a one-yard loss on fourth down from the Wofford 34.



**SPECIAL TEAMS POTW:** Paxton Robertson, Western Carolina, PK/P, Fr., 6-0, 200, Knoxville, Tennessee

Robertson impressed during his brief fall debut, then provided clutch punting in the Catamounts' 35-7 loss to Furman in the Southern Conference. He averaged 44.4 yards on eight punts, including three that went for 50-plus yards and five inside Furman's 20. He also averaged 63 yards on two kickoffs.



**FRESHMAN POTW:** Mark Gronowski, South Dakota State, QB, Fr., 6-3, 200, Naperville, Illinois

The true freshman accounted for three touchdowns, including the game-winning, one-yard pass with 19 seconds remaining, as the Jackrabbits slipped past Northern Iowa 24-20 in a Missouri Valley Football Conference opener between Top 5 nationally ranked teams. He was 19 of 29 for 194 yards, also throwing for a six-yard touchdown and scoring on a five-yard run.

### MVFC BEST



**OFFENSIVE POTW:** RB Pierre Strong Jr., South Dakota State, 5-11, 210, Jr., Little Rock, Ark.

Strong tallied 142 all-purpose yards and scored the game-winning touchdown on a 1-yard pass play with 19 seconds remaining in South Dakota State's 24-20 victory at Northern Iowa on Feb. 19. The junior running back rushed 22 times for 91 yards and caught a team-high six passes for 31 yards. He added a 20-yard kickoff return to round out his performance.



**DEFENSIVE POTW:** LB Devon Krzanowski, North Dakota, 6-2, 235, Jr., Fond du Lac, Wis.

Playing in his first Division I game after transferring from St. Cloud State, tallied two tackles for loss, recovered UND's third forced fumble of the first half and took it for a 36-yard score to put the Fighting Hawks in front, 16-7, late in that opening frame ... Helped the UND defense force five turnovers that led to 27 points in the win over No. 24 SIU, the most turnovers forced by the Hawks since a 2016 win over Montana State.



**SPECIAL TEAMS POTW:** PK Jake Reinholz, North Dakota State, 6-3, 217, Jr., Fargo, N.D.

Reinholz scored seven points in North Dakota State's 25-7 victory over Youngstown State. His two-point conversion run put NDSU ahead 8-0 late in the first quarter, and his second career field goal (from 28 yards) gave the Bison an 11-0 lead before halftime. Reinholz added a pair of extra point kicks and averaged 62.8 yards on five kickoffs with two touchbacks.



**NEWCOMER POTW:** QB Mark Gronowski, South Dakota State, 6-3, 200, Fr., Naperville, Ill.

In his collegiate debut, the true freshman accounted for all three South Dakota State touchdowns in the fifth-ranked Jackrabbits' 24-20 victory at No. 3 Northern Iowa. Gronowski completed 19-of-29 passes for 194 yards and touchdown passes of 6 yards to Jaxon Janke in the second quarter and the game-winning 1-yard toss to Pierre Strong, Jr. with 19 seconds remaining in the game that capped a 10-play, 75-yard drive. He also rushed for 24 yards on 10 carries, including a 5-yard touchdown late in the first half. Gronowski connected with seven different receivers in the game.



**OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK:** C Nathan Nguon, North Dakota, 6-3, 295, Sr., Burnsville, Minn.

Helped quarterback Tommy Schuster remain spotless in his first-collegiate start, not surrendering a sack against No. 24 SIU ... Aided the UND rushing attack to 229 yards and 5.9 yards per carry ... Overall, averaged 5.4 yards per play and totaled 347 yards of total offense.

## BUBBA SCHWEIGERT

HEAD COACH

The 2020 season will be the seventh for head coach Bubba Schweigert. It will also begin the transition as the Fighting Hawks will now enter the Missouri Valley Football Conference this season and beyond.

UND returned to its winning ways in 2019, reaching the FCS playoffs for the second time in four seasons with a 7-4 mark as a FCS Independent. The Hawks finished the home portion of the schedule with a perfect 6-0 mark and picked up wins over three ranked opponents. Against one of the most difficult schedules in the nation, UND battled seven ranked foes in 12 weeks and became one of only 25 FCS programs to reach the playoffs twice in the last four seasons.

Senior linebacker Donnell Rodgers became only the seventh linebacker in program history to receive multiple All-America selections by different publications in the same season since it began being tracked in 1930. Freshman defensive back CJ Siegel was named as a FCS Freshman All-American by Phil Steele while senior defensive end Mason Bennett earned AP All-America honors as well. Bennett also became only the fourth player in program history to be selected in the first round of the Canadian Football League (CFL) Draft, being selected eighth by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats.

Off the field, the Fighting Hawks put up another strong season in the classroom, breaking the program's GPA mark for a semester and eclipsing the 3.0 mark as a team once again. Three players were also named to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society, a place UND has been represented every year since joining Division I in 2008.

2018 was a bit of a roller coaster ride for Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks, finishing with their third winning season in the last five years (6-5) but coming up just short in reaching the FCS playoffs. The highs saw UND defeat No. 5 Sam Houston State, 24-23, to snap the FCS' longest-running home winning streak, erupt for 34 first-half points in a 44-14 drubbing over No. 22 Montana, wracking up 480 yards on the ground in a 41-15 win at Sacramento State, and battling No. 9 Washington in Seattle. However, three losses over the final four games of the season left the Hawks at 6-5 and one of the first four teams left out of the playoff picture.

Linebacker Noah Larson was named a Jerry Rice Award finalist for his efforts, defensive end Mason Bennett was named to the HERO Sports All-America Third Team entering 2019, and wide receiver Noah Wanzek was named one of the top pass catchers in the country entering 2019 by HERO Sports.

Injuries took their toll on the roster and derailed a promising 2017 season that had UND pegged to repeat as Big Sky Champions, but ended in a 3-8 campaign. All was not lost, however, as the Fighting Hawks did post their first shutout during Schweigert's tenure with a 38-0 blanking of future MVFC foe Missouri State and recorded league wins against Northern Colorado and on the road at Portland State.

Junior running back John Santiago claimed All-America honors for the third consecutive season and was joined by four other Fighting Hawks in garnering All-Big Sky accolades. The Fighting Hawks also continued their success in the classroom, matching a program record by having 18 student-athletes named to the Big Sky All-Academic team.

Schweigert developed a nice pattern through his first three seasons as the head coach at North Dakota. Each year his squad produced more positive results than the previous one and 2016 was no exception as he was named the Big Sky and FCS Region 5 Coach of the Year.

The Fighting Hawks shared the Big Sky Conference regular season title with Eastern Washington, reeled off a 9-game winning streak and earned the No. 7 overall seed in the Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs in 2016.

After losing the first two games of the season by a combined four points, a double-overtime victory against South Dakota launched UND into Big Sky play where the Fighting Hawks ran the table. There were tight games and lopsided games, but his team always found a way to come out on top in league play and give UND its first undefeated conference record since Dale Lennon's 2003 squad went 7-0 in North Central Conference play.

The defense was once again the top-rated run defense in the league and sixth in the FCS. The unit was also tops in the Big Sky with 20 interceptions and tied for second nationally, trailing only national champion James Madison in that category.

Four Fighting Hawks earned All-America accolades, including safety Cole Reyes, who landed on six different All-America squads. The junior captain was also named the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year. Reyes was one of 15 UND players to earn All-Big Sky honors on the field, while 18 set a program record by being named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team. Senior Brian Labat led those efforts in the classroom and also earned CoSIDA All-District 6 Team honors.

Schweigert wrapped up the 2015 season with what was the first three-game winning streak of his UND head-coaching tenure. Those three victories gave his second UND squad a 7-4 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big Sky play, which were both two-game improvements from his first season back in Grand Forks.

Schweigert's defense led the Big Sky in rushing defense for the second straight season under his watch and the offense improved immensely thanks in large part to the record-breaking production of true freshman running back John Santiago. After a 4-3 start that included the program's first victory over an FBS opponent (24-13 win at Wyoming) and first DI victory over a ranked opponent on the road (19-17 win at No. 16 Portland State), the Fighting Hawks would go on to post the program's first seven-win season since 2011.

Santiago was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year and collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and STATS, Inc. He was also a unanimous All-Big Sky first team performer and was joined on that team by senior linebacker Will Ratelle and offensive lineman Sean Meehan, who was also named to the AFCA All-America Team.

Eight more Fighting Hawks would garner all-league honors in 2015 as the defense once again ranked among the tops in the Big Sky, ranking first in rush defense and second in total defense.

In the classroom, 17 UND football players were named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team, breaking the previous year's record by one.

In his first season back at UND, Schweigert's 2014 squad won five games overall, which was a two-game improvement from the previous season. The campaign was highlighted by a 30-28 upset of No. 22 Northern Arizona in the final home game of the season at the Alerus Center.

UND took the positive vibes from a victory that knocked NAU out of the FCS playoff hunt to Greeley, Colo., the next Saturday where the team closed out the season with its first Big Sky road win of the season -- a 33-14 defeat of Northern Colorado.

The defensive-minded head coach still works with the team's cornerbacks and they were part of a unit that led the Big Sky in total defense and rush defense in 2014. Two newcomers earned All-Big Sky Conference honors (KR Alex Tillman and PK Reid Taubenheim) and seven more players were named honorable mention in Schweigert's first season.

There were also 16 UND football players named to the All-Big Sky Academic team, which tied a program record for individuals honored in one season.

The Zeeland, N.D., native returned to Grand Forks after 10 years away from a program that he helped lead to the 2001 NCAA Division II national title as defensive coordinator.

Prior to his return to UND, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois for the previous six seasons (2008-13) and served as associate head coach for the last five of that stretch. His 2010 defense led the Missouri Valley in total defense and his unit finished in the top half of the league in four of his six campaigns at SIU.

In his six seasons at SIU, Schweigert coached three first team All-Americans and 20 all-conference selections (10 first team, six second team, four honorable mentions). His defensive standouts have included linebacker and 2012 graduate Jayson DiManche, currently playing for Cincinnati Bengals, and cornerback Korey Lindsey, a three-time All-American and a 2011 draft pick of the Bengals. In 2013, SIU linebacker Bryan Presume earned first team All-MVFC honors after ranking third in the league with 104 tackles. His 55 solo stops were tops in the conference.

Prior to arriving at SIU, Schweigert took on his first head coaching job at the collegiate level, leading the Division II program at Minnesota Duluth from 2004-07. He guided the Bulldogs to a 22-21 overall record during his tenure, including the program's first North Central Conference title in 2005. The NCAA playoff berth that season was the program's second in four seasons. That same season, Schweigert was also named the D2football.com Northwest Region Coach of the Year and the AFCA Division II Coach of the Year for Region 5.

This will be the second stint at UND for Schweigert. He spent 15 seasons as an assistant coach in Grand Forks (1989-2003) where he was part of eight NCAA playoff teams and six NCC title squads.

Schweigert was elevated to defensive coordinator at UND prior to the 1997 season and left for Duluth after the 2003 UND team finished as national runner-up. Schweigert was named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In his seven seasons as UND's defensive coordinator, Schweigert's defensive players earned 14 All-America honors and

23 first-team All-NCC accolades. His 2001 defense yielded just 191.4 yards of offense and 50.3 rushing yards per game, while limiting opponents to 12.5 points per game on the way to the program's first national championship.

Schweigert began his coaching career at his alma mater, now the University of Jamestown, from 1985-1988. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Jamestown and a master's degree from UND. In 2002, he was honored with Jamestown's Rollie Greeno Award for outstanding commitment in the field of education and coaching.

Schweigert and his wife, Laura, have two sons, Alex and Cooper.

## FCS PLAYOFFS

The fall championship, usually culminating in an early January title game, is still planned to be played — albeit in the spring this year.

The championship is currently scheduled for April 18-May 15, with 16 teams making the playoff field as opposed to the usual 24.

In this 16-team bracket, 10 teams will automatically qualify via conference championships. The remaining six will be at-large selections.

Schools that opted to play games in the fall will have their results considered in the selection process for the spring championship field.

The last regular season games of the spring schedule, including conference championships, must come no later than April 17.

Once regular season play concludes, the 16-team playoff bracket will be revealed on Sunday, April 18. The four rounds will be conducted each of the next four weekends, ending with the national championship game on Saturday, May 15.

## LEADERSHIP



University of North Dakota head football coach Bubba Schweigert and the Fighting Hawks team have announced the leadership group for the 2020-21 season on Wednesday.

Defensive back Jordan Canady, wide receiver Garrett Maag, offensive lineman Nathan Nguon, former tight end Hunter Pinke and linebacker Jaxson Turner were selected by the team following the conclusion of the fall practice session.

"We are excited to announce the captains for the 2020-21 season," said Schweigert. "We are looking forward to the leadership these individuals will provide for our team both on and off the field as we compete in our inaugural year in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. These five young men have invested much time and effort into the Fighting Hawk football program and team culture and are very deserving of the distinction as team captain."

Canady returns to the Fighting Hawks having started the last 28 games at safety over his career and will enter 2021 as the team's returning leading tackler with 87 stops and a team-best 53 solo tackles. The New Berlin, Wis., native currently ranks fifth in UND's Division I history (2008-present) with four career interceptions and sixth with 18 pass breakups. Last season, he set a new career high with 14 total tackles against No. 1 North Dakota State. Canady is a management major.

An 11-game starter at wide receiver a season ago, Maag returns as UND's leading pass catcher with 59 grabs, 610 yards and five touchdowns in a playoff season for the Hawks. The Inver Grove Heights, Minn., native had his best days against the top competition in 2019, grabbing six catches for 76 yards at No. 1 North Dakota State, hauling in a TD in the win over No. 24 Sam Houston State and finishing with a career-best 81 yards on 10 catches and a score in the victory over No. 12 UC Davis. Maag is a marketing major.

Nguon has been a Swiss Army knife along the offensive line for UND over his entire career, having started games at four of the five positions along the line. The Burnsville, Minn., native spent 2019 at left tackle, right tackle and center, helping the Hawks set offensive records in the passing game for the program. Nguon is an operations and supply chain management major.

Pinke will serve as a captain off the field for the Hawks, after suffering a career-ending injury following the 2019 season. The Wishek, N.D., native currently has an internship with the UND Alumni Association and is working to finish his mechanical engineering degree.

After an injury-riddled season in 2019, Turner will look to get back to his quarterback-sacking ways in the spring. The Esko, Minn., native finished sixth on the team with 44 tackles and second with 4.5 sacks. He was crucial in the win over No. 24 Sam Houston State, registering a season-best nine tackles and a pair of sacks. The linebacker enters the campaign with 11 career sacks, placing him fourth in UND's DI era. Turner is a communication major.

## SERIES NOTES

## HEAD COACH JOHN STIEGELMEIER

- John Stiegelmeier, the winningest football coach in South Dakota State history, has built the Jackrabbit program into a yearly contender within the Missouri Valley Football Conference and the Football Championship Subdivision.
- Overall, Stiegelmeier has led the Jackrabbits to a 167-105 record (.613 winning percentage) in 23 seasons. With Coach Stig at the helm, SDSU has reached the FCS playoffs nine times (2009, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019) and is one of only two FCS programs to reach the postseason each of the past eight seasons. The Jackrabbits won playoff contests in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017 and 2018, and have finished in the top 25 of both major FCS polls in 11 of the last 14 years.
- Stiegelmeier's 67 victories in MVFC play rank third in league history, while his 99 overall wins since joining the league in 2008 are fourth among all-time league coaches. SDSU has never had a losing record in MVFC play in the 12 seasons it has played in what has proven to be the toughest FCS conference.
- During the 2019 season, SDSU continued to rank among the FCS elite, maintaining a top-five ranking for much of the campaign. The Jackrabbits earned the No. 7 seed in the FCS playoffs before ending the year with an 8-5 overall record.
- Stiegelmeier, 63, is the 20th head coach for the Jackrabbits. His tenure of 23 years as head coach is the longest head coaching stint for football in school history.
- The Selby, South Dakota, native first became acquainted with the Jackrabbit football program as a student assistant under John Gregory during SDSU's only NCAA Division II playoff season in 1979. After graduating from SDSU with degrees in mathematics and physical education, Stiegelmeier enrolled in graduate school at the University of Northern Iowa, where he served on the coaching staff of a Panther squad which posted a 7-4 mark in 1981.

## SCOUTING THE JACKRABBITS

- South Dakota State enters Saturday's matchup with a 1-0 record, defeating No. 3 Northern Iowa by four, 24-20, last Friday in the season opener.
- True freshman QB Mark Gronowski made his first-collegiate start in the win over the Panthers, throwing for 194 yards and two scores. Gronowski led the Jackrabbits on a 10-play, 75-yard game-winning drive that consumed more than five minutes. SDSU, which had not picked up first down in its five previous second-half drives, moved the chains three times before the decisive score, the last coming on a 43-yard pass from Gronowski to tight end Zach Heins down the left sideline to the UNI 3.
- Returning All-MVFC running back Pierre Strong Jr. tallied 91 yards on 22 rushing attempts and led SDSU with six receptions, including the game-winner, for 31 yards. In 2019, he became the seventh running back in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons and averaged over seven yards per carry.
- Logan Backhaus, named the team's defensive MVP in 2019, returns to anchor the linebacking core for the Jackrabbits this year. The senior totaled five tackles, including two for loss, in the win over Northern Iowa last week. He finished third on the team in 2019 with 79 total tackles.

## SERIES RECORD

This will be the 86th all-time meeting between North Dakota and South Dakota State, with UND owning a 46-35-5 record in the previous 85 contests. SDSU has claimed the lone games in the Division I era, defeating the Sioux, 21-0, in Brookings during the 2010 season and picking up a 35-28 win over UND in Grand Forks in 2013. This will be the first meeting as conference foes since 2003, a 25-24 win in Brookings by UND. North Dakota has only lost once at home to South Dakota State since 1989.

## LAST MEETING

## UND RALLY FALLS SHORT AS NO. 6/7 SDSU PREVAILS

**Grand Forks, N.D.** – The North Dakota football team saw its spirited fourth-quarter rally fall just short as No. 6/7 South Dakota State held on for a 35-28 victory in the 48th annual Potato Bowl Saturday at the Alerus Center. The loss snapped a 10-game Potato Bowl winning streak for UND (1-1), while SDSU (2-0) picked up its first win in four tries in the annual contest.

This game belonged to both team's All-Americans – South Dakota State running back Zach Zenner and UND wide receiver Greg Hardin. But, it was Zenner who held the spotlight at the end, equaling the school's single-game record for rushing yards with 295.

Zenner added four touchdowns and it was his last one – a 46-yard scamper on a fourth-and-short early in the final quarter that proved to be the game-winner in the first matchup between the schools in Grand Forks since the 2001 season.

Hardin and his resilient teammates did not go down without a fight. The senior finished with seven catches for 207 yards and a pair of touchdowns as he surpassed 200 receiving yards in a game for the second time in his career.

## 8 2020-21 NORTH DAKOTA FOOTBALL

### HIGHLIGHTS

#### ALL THE WEAH

- Playing in his first game since Nov. 2018, sophomore running back **Otis Weah** busted out for a career performance in the win over No. 24 Southern Illinois.
- The Moorhead, Minn., native ran for a career-high 91 yards on a personal-best 13 carries and a touchdown to spearhead a multi-faced attack on the ground.
- As a team, UND accounted for 229 yards on the ground, the most since a 490-yard performance at Sacramento State on Oct. 20, 2018

#### A WHOLE LOTTA RANKING

- UND finished 3-4 last season against ranked foes, picking up wins over No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, No. 12 UC Davis, and No. 9/9 Montana State while falling to No. 1/1 North Dakota State, No. 21/21 Eastern Washington, No. 3/3 Weber State and No. 19/19 Nicholls State.
- The No. 12 ranking by UC Davis was the second-highest ranked opponent UND has defeated in the DI era at the time, only to be eclipsed by UND's most-recent win over No. 9/9 Montana State (No. 5 Sam Houston – 2018).
- 2019 marked the first time in UND's DI history that the Fighting Hawks have been ranked or receiving votes in at least one poll all season.
- UND kept it rolling this season, moving to 1-0 this season with the win over No. 24 Southern Illinois on Feb. 20. The victory was the fourth straight at home over a ranked foe.
- Following the win, UND jumped to No. 14 in the STATS Poll, the highest the Hawks have been since Sept. 11, 2017 when they were 10th.

#### HOME COOKIN'

- The Hawks capped off the fifth perfect regular season since moving indoors to the Alerus Center with a 6-0 mark in 2019. (2003, 2004, 2007, 2016, 2019)
- UND has also knocked off three ranked opponents at home for the first time in the DI era.
- The No. 9 ranking by Montana State was the highest-ranked opponent UND has defeated at home since Dec. 6, 2003 vs. North Alabama in the DII playoffs.
- The victory over No. 24 Southern Illinois was the 10th over a ranked team at home since 2008 and the second-largest margin of victory in that span.

#### BROCKSTAR FORMATION

- Despite being moved to wide receiver prior to the 2019 season, **Brock Boltmann** spent some time at his former

position of quarterback during the year in a special formation.

- Dubbed the "Brockstar Formation," the sophomore busted a run for 15 yards to begin a scoring drive as well as completing a pass against No. 1 NDSU.
- The formation was in full effect vs. No. 24/21 Sam Houston State, as Boltmann broke off a 56-yard run for a touchdown against the Bearkats. The run was the longest of the season for the Fighting Hawks.
- The sophomore had his best game as a Fighting Hawk in the win over No. 12 UC Davis, running for 47 yards and catching five passes for 54 yards and a touchdown.
- Boltmann threw for his first-career touchdown in the win over No. 9/9 Montana State, tossing a 36-yard strike to **Travis Toivonen** for the score.
- With a passing, rushing, and receiving touchdown, he becomes the first play since **Mitch Sutton** in 2009 to score a TD in all three ways.
- Boltmann has been sidelined with an injury to begin the 2020-21 season.

#### RED ZONE, BLUE ZONE

- UND was lights out in the red zone when it came to turning opportunities into points, as the Hawks finished tied for second in the nation in red zone percentage.
- As a team, UND went 33-for-35, with the lone misses being a missed FG vs. UC Davis and a kneel down to end the win vs. Northern Colorado.
- UND started the new season off on the right foot, going 6-for-6 in the red zone in the 44-21 win over No. 24 Southern Illinois.

#### HELLO, OLD FRIENDS

- Entering the Missouri Valley Football Conference, UND is set to dust off some old rivalries and opponents for the first time in a long time.
- This will be the first time UND has battled North Dakota State and South Dakota State as conference opponents since 2003, a year that saw the Fighting Sioux clip both teams in back-to-back weeks by a combined eight points.
- Furthermore, UND will square off against Southern Illinois for the first time since 2008, Western Illinois since 1979, Youngstown State since 1962 and Illinois State since 1979.
- Only USD and Missouri State have been regulars on the UND schedule since 2008, with the Hawks and Coyotes facing off six times over that stretch, including as members of the Great West Conference from 2008-2011. UND matched up with the Bears twice, once coming 2014 and in Grand Forks during the 2017 season.

## NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo was unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker and the UND football team played under that nickname in its 2015 season finale at Cal Poly -- a 45-21 victory over the Mustangs.



The 2020-21 season will be the first of the program's new helmet look. The 2016 unveiling marked the first time since the 1969 season that UND helmets were adorned with a new logo. The interlocking ND had been emblazoned on both sides of the helmets for the past 47 seasons, but were replaced in 2016 by the athletic department's new Fighting Hawks logo. The new helmets for this season feature the new logo on both sides of the helmet for the first time.

## HIGHLIGHTS

## O-LINE RETURNS IN FULL

- One position that will be at a strength entering the 2020-21 season will be the offensive line, as UND returns five players that all played significant time.
- Kyle Hergel, Ryan Tobin, Donny Ventrelli, Nathan Nguon and Matt Waletzko** all return after each started at least eight games, with Waletzko only starting six due to a season-ending injury suffered at Idaho State in October.
- As a group, they surrendered only 17 sacks on the season in 2019, a number that sat inside the top-20 among all offensive lines in the FCS.
- That group shined in the opening win over No. 24 Southern Illinois, not surrendering a single sack and Nguon earning MVFC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors.

## TOMMY TOUCHDOWN

- Thrust into action at the midway portion of the first quarter last season, **Tommy Schuster** shined in his debut for the Hawks in the win over No. 24/21 Sam Houston State.
- The freshman's 17 completions are the most in a debut since Joey Bradley's 18 vs. Drake (Sept. 1, 2011) and his 165 yards in a debut are the most since Ryan Bartels' 212 yards vs. Valparaiso (Aug. 29, 2013).
- The redshirt freshman anchors a quarterback room for the Fighting Hawks that is on the youthful side, featuring a pair of true freshmen, Schuster, and a sophomore transfer QB from Moorpark College in California. He is only one of those four players to throw a collegiate pass at the Division I level entering Saturday.
- Schuster was solid in his first-career start against No. 24 Southern Illinois, throwing for 118 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on a 15-for-23 day through the air.
- He is now 2-0 in his career with both wins coming over ranked opponents.

## FLOCK OF SIEGELS

- In his redshirt freshman season, **C.J. Siegel** burst onto the scene and became one of the top corners in the FCS.
- He led all UND defensive backs in tackles, pass deflections and interceptions, hauling in his first pair of picks in the win over No. 12 UC Davis.
- His 12 passes defended ranked inside the top-50 among all defensive players in the FCS and cracked the top-10 among rookies.
- Siegel was honored with a selection to the 2019 Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American Team at the end of the season.

## BOOK OF NOAH

- Over his first two years at UND, inside linebacker **Noah Larson** has been the anchor for the Fighting Hawks. During that stretch, Larson has started all 23 games and has made 148 total tackles.
- Larson teamed up with **Donnell Rodgers** for the game-winning stop vs. No. 24/21 Sam Houston State on 4th and 2 last season. The duo stuffed the QB in the backfield and forced a fumble to seal the victory. He also recorded his first-career interception and nine tackles in the win.
- He had another pick to set up a scoring drive by the Fighting Hawks in the win over No. 12 UC Davis. Larson also finished a trio of stops and a tackle for loss.
- Larson was dynamic against the triple option of Cal Poly, finishing second on the team with career-high 14 tackles in the win. He recorded the game-winning tackle on fourth down as well.
- In 2019, his 54 assisted tackles were second and his 82 total tackles sat sixth in the DI single season record book.

## BLACKJACK

- North Dakota's 24-23 win at No. 5 Sam Houston State (Sept. 15, 2018) snapped the nation's longest home winning streak at 21 games, handing the Bearcats their first loss at home in nearly three years (Sept. 19, 2015 to Lamar). The victory also marked the highest-ranked opponent that North Dakota has defeated in the DI era (2008-present).
- The Fighting Hawks tripped up the No. 24/21 Bearcats again, this time at the Alerus Center, with a 27-23 victory. UND also clipped No. 9/9 Montana State, 16-12, to post its biggest win at home in the DI era. Sam Houston State, Cal Poly, and now Montana State have been defeated twice by UND when ranked.
- UND is **12-28** against ranked opponents in its Division I era and **13-28** all-time against ranked FCS schools.

## THE M STANDS FOR MONEY

- Incoming junior wide receiver **Garett Maag** has created a knack for making all of his catches count over his first two years at UND.
- Maag put on a show against No. 1 NDSU, eclipsing a new career high with 76 receiving yards on six catches, including a team-long 30-yard catch from QB Andrew Zimmerman.
- He once again made his two catches count with a 4-yard touchdown reception from Zimmerman against No. 24/21 Sam Houston State. Maag became the fastest receiver since Greg Hardin (2010-13) to seven touchdown catches in his career.
- Maag hauled in five catches for 72 yards, including a season-long 43-yard strike from Ketteringham, at No. 21 Eastern Washington.
- The sophomore exploded for a career day vs. No. 12 UC

Davis, hauled in a career-high 10 catches and 81 yards while also striking for a touchdown in the win.

- Maag grabbed his 10th career touchdown pass in the win vs. Southern Utah, joining teammates **Noah Wanzek** and **Travis Toivonen** as the first trio in UND's DI history to each score 10 receiving touchdowns in their careers.

### GO RIGHT HOLM

- 2018 marked a breakout campaign for current senior defensive back **Evan Holm**, as he took on some of the toughest assignments in the FCS last season. His 10 pass breakups on the season are the fifth most in the program's Division I history and his 20 career pass deflections are sixth since moving to DI.
- In the victory at No. 5 Sam Houston in 2018, Holm was credited with four pass breakups, including several in the endzone as the Hawks held the Bearcats to its lowest scoring output at home since 2014.
- His 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown on Oct. 27, 2018 against No. 4 Weber State was the first UND kickoff return for a score since John Santiago turned the trick against Weber State as well two seasons ago (100 yards).
- After missing the first seven games of the season, Holm returned to action last year against No. 9/9 Montana State and broke up a trio of passes.
- Holm collected his first interception of the season against Southern Utah, adding another pass breakup in the win.
- After ending the 2019 season with turnovers in two straight games, Holm carried the momentum over into 2020-21, hauling in his first interception of the season in the win over No. 24 Southern Illinois.

### KRZANOWSKI SHUSHES THE DOUBTERS

- In his first game at the Division I level, **Devon Krzanowski** quieted the doubters after joining the program from St. Cloud State in the win over No. 24 Southern Illinois.
- The junior recorded five tackles, including a stop behind the line of scrimmage, to sit fifth on the team in the win. He also recovered the third forced fumble of the first half and took it 36 yards to the house for the score and a 16-7 lead.

### FRESH TURNOVERS FOR SALE

- North Dakota forced five turnovers by Southern Illinois in the win on Feb. 20, the most in a game by the UND defense since a 17-15 win at Montana State on Sept. 24, 2016.





**GRAND FORKS, N.D.** – North Dakota forced five turnovers and rushed for 229 yards to blow past No. 24 Southern Illinois, 44-21, on Saturday afternoon from the Alerus Center in Grand Forks.

UND (1-0, 1-0 MVFC) opened its Missouri Valley Football Conference history in strong fashion, outscoring the Salukis (1-1, 0-1 MVFC) 28-7 in the second half to turn a 16-14 halftime lead into the 44-21 victory.

It was a good balance on the offensive side for the Fighting Hawks, amassing 347 yards of total offense. Tommy Schuster was solid in his first-career start at quarterback, throwing for 118 yards and three scores while completing 15 of his 25 passes. On the ground, Otis Weah spearheaded a multi-faced attack with 91 yards and a score on 13 carries. Luke Skokna also added some punch with 70 yards and a touchdown on just nine carries.

Seven-different Hawks caught a pass, led by true freshman Bo Belquist's four and a touchdown. Junior Garrett Maag hauled in three catches for a team-high 40 yards while Dalton Gee and Brett Finke also grabbed scores through the air.

It was the defense who made the biggest statement, forcing five turnovers that led to 27 of UND's 44 points. Evan Holm and Sammy Fort came down with interceptions in the second half and a trio of fumbles in the first half helped hold the vaunted Saluki rushing attack to just 90 yards on 35 carries.

Devon Krzanowski, playing in his first Division I game after transferring from St. Cloud State, tallied one tackle for loss, recovered UND's third forced fumble of the first half and took it for a 36-yard score to put the Fighting Hawks in front, 16-7, late in that opening frame. Jordan Canady led all players with eight tackles.

After SIU took the opening drive 84 yards for a score to take a 7-0 lead, the UND defense started to dig its heels in over the next few possessions. Graham DeVore burst through the line and stripped wildcat QB Javon Williams Jr. and Noah Larson pounced on the ball to put the Hawks in scoring position at the SIU17 with just under five minutes to play in the first quarter.

Quincy Vaughn, taking his first snap at quarterback as a collegiate athlete, took the snap and powered through the defense for 13 yards before Schuster found Finke on the play-action pass to knot the game at 7.

On the next possession, the UND defense made another stand. Chandon Pierre stripped and sacked Kare Lyles before Graham DeVore recovered the second fumble of the afternoon to halt the SIU drive at the UND35. The Hawks sucked seven minutes off the clock and Adam Stage connected from 27-yards out to move the hosts in front, 10-7, with just over four minutes left in the first half.

Just five plays later, C.J. Siegel came untouched on the blitz and forced a fumble that was picked up by Krzanowski and took it 36-yards to the house to put the Hawks in front, 16-7, just moments before the end of the half. SIU ended the frame with some momentum, scoring on an 8-play, 75-yard drive to send the game into the break at 16-14.

UND came out of the halftime break on fire, scoring on each of its first three possessions to blow the game wide open. Weah took over on the opening drive with five carries, capping the drive off with a 1-yard touchdown scamper to make it 23-14 North Dakota.

Following a three-and-out, it was the rushing attack who dominated the next possession once again, with the three-headed attack of Gee, Skokna and Weah combining for 40 of the 45 yards and Gee catching a 5-yard pass out of the backfield from Schuster for the score and a 30-14 lead for the Hawks.

Turnovers started again on the next drive, with Holm picking off new quarterback Nic Baker and returning it 27 yards to the SIU12. Two plays later, Schuster fired his third TD of the game, this time to freshman Bo Belquist, from 9-yards out for his first-collegiate score and 21 straight points by the hosts.

Fort got in on the turnover party moments later, hauling in his first-career pick to end the third quarter before Skokna got in on the touchdown action with a 1-yard run to push the lead to 44-14 with 12:57 to play.



Southern Illinois added a late touchdown, but North Dakota came away with its 34 straight win in home openers, 44-21, and fourth straight home victory over ranked foes.

North Dakota returns to action on Saturday, Feb. 27 at noon against South Dakota State on MidcoSN2.
