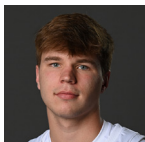

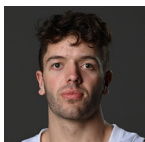

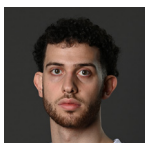

MEDIA CREDENTIALS/PARKING

Media credentials will be issued only to working media, sports information personnel, league officials or staff members of competing institutions with a legitimate need for access to the press seating. Requests for media credentials, season or single-game, must be made in advance with the UND athletic communications office. Please submit credential requests in advance with Tyler Wells (701.777.4210) in the UND Athletics Communications office. Please make requests at least one week prior to the game you plan on covering.

PRESS SEATING

Members of the media will be seated either at the courtside press row table or in an auxiliary press row in the upper level of the east grandstand. Cheering and betting on press row will not be tolerated and violators will be removed.

PRESS ROW OPERATIONS

Game programs, game notes, statistics and media guides will be available at press row prior to and during all home games. Statistics will be distributed at half time and immediately following each game via email. All working media will have access to wireless internet and phone data lines. A copy machine is also available behind press row.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photography credentials are issued to media and institutional photographers only and they must remain in designated areas.

The photographer credential process has been updated to meet the current COVID-19 safety protocols. Please contact Tyler Wells for those protocols.

RADIO/TELEVISION

The Betty Engelstad Sioux Center press row can accommodate two radio stations, and two additional stations may be accommodated in the upper press box. On-air television talent can also be accommodated in the upper press box. Radio and television stations wishing to broadcast UND home games are asked to contact basketball athletic communications director Tyler Wells at least two weeks prior to the event you are covering.

INTERVIEWS

The UND athletic communications office is eager to assist the media with student-athlete and coach interview requests. In order to help in this endeavor, it is asked that all media requests be made in advance through the basketball communications director.

Players will return phone calls once requested through the media relations office. As per UND Athletics policy, phone numbers of student-athletes will not be disclosed to members of the media.

Due to COVID-19 protocols, practices are no longer open to the general public. Any requests to attend a practice must be cleared by the basketball communications director.

The coaching staff and student athletes are also available for post-game interviews and all interviews will take place in the student-athlete lounge, adjacent to the main lobby of the Engelstad Sioux Center. The locker room, training room and weight room are closed to the media.

Next Game: vs. Omaha

The University of North Dakota will conclude its three-game homestand on Saturday with Omaha. The Fighting Hawks and Mavericks will tip-off at 1 p.m. (CT). Fans can follow all the action on Midco Sports 2 and ESPN+, as well as by tuning into Paul Ralston's call on the Home of Economy Radio Network (1440 AM/790 AM).

Series History vs. UNO

This will be the 99th all-time meeting between North Dakota and Omaha. UND has a 55-43 lead in the series and owns a 32-10 record in games played at Grand Forks. Since the two became conference rivals again in 2018-19, the Mavericks hold a 7-1 advantage, with two of those games seeing the lead change in the final 30 seconds of the contest.

In the most recent match-up on Jan. 6, the Fighting Hawks fell 98-82 to the Mavs inside Baxter Arena. Despite North Dakota winning the rebounding battle by a 40-37 margin and outscoring Omaha 42-40 in the paint, Omaha came away with the victory while only turning the ball over five times compared to UND's 11 turnovers.

Matt Norman was the leading scorer for NoDak with 20 points, two assists and a steal. Tsotne Tsartsidze netted 13 points to go with four rebounds, followed by Ethan Igbunugo and Brady Danielson finishing with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Six Mavericks finished in double-digits and were led by Grant Fickenstein pouring in 16 points.

Last Time Out

In a game where North Dakota led by as many as 19 points in the second half, Denver closed regulation on an 18-4 run to force overtime at 70-70 and come away with the 81-79 victory inside the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center on Thursday night. The Fighting Hawks drained 15 triples, while the Pioneers won the statistical categories of points in the paint (42-44), rebounds (46-37), second chance points (14-8) and blocks (5-1).

Paul Bruns was the most aggressive Hawk offensively with a game-high 22 points, while hitting five triples to go with five boards and a steal. Brady Danielson was the only other player for UND to finish in double figures with 11 points and five rebounds.

Most Recently for UNO

Omaha trimmed North Dakota State's lead to two after four consecutive points from Dylan Brougham with under a minute to play, but the Bison capitalized at the charity stripe in the final minute to earn the 71-64 win over the Mavericks inside the SCHEELS Center on Thursday night. North Dakota State held a 23-11 advantage in points off turnovers and won the rebounding battle by a 35-24 margin in the contest.

Felix Lemetti poured in a team-high 17 points and finished 3-of-4 from deep to lead UNO. Darrius Hughes added 12 points off the bench, while Brougham added 10 points. Frankie Fidler pulled down a team leading six boards. Lemetti paced the team with five assists, while Akol Arop recorded four steals to lead the team.

I-29 Bound

UND will be traveling plenty up and down Interstate 29 in the coming years as members of The Summit League and the men's basketball program will look to continue its success over the rivals located along that stretch. UND owns winning records against four of the other five The Summit League teams that are located on I-29: North Dakota State, Omaha, South Dakota and South Dakota State, but is 2-6 against Kansas City.

Since joining the league in 2018-19, however, I-29 was a tough place to find wins for UND, as the Fighting Hawks are 8-31 against Division I opponents along the stretch. On the other hand, the Hawks are 16-11 against conference foes not positioned on I-29.

Ouch!

North Dakota is now battling its longest winless skid in program history with 12 consecutive losses. The Hawks set the record with the 81-79 overtime loss on Thursday night to Denver inside the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center.

This season, UND's last Division I wins were back-to-back with the Fighting Hawks defeating Montana 79-77 inside the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center on Nov. 15 and then taking down Troy 74-72 in the opening game of the Paradise Classic on the campus of Florida Atlantic on Nov. 19. The last win for North Dakota was a 110-65 rout of North Central (Minn.) on Dec. 14.

The Hawks are also on track to have the least wins on the road in their Division I history, as the Fighting Hawks are currently 0-12 in away games this season and would need two road wins to have the same number of wins on the road that they did in 2017-18 (2-13).

Recently, things seemed to be starting to trend in the right direction for North Dakota with five losses in January coming by single digits and the Fighting Hawks falling by an average of 5.4 points in those contests. In three of those games, UND battled back to erase second-half deficits of 16 points (vs. Western Illinois), 14 points (at Oral Roberts) and 17 points (at Kansas City). In the lone game of February so far, the Hawks fell by two points in an 81-79 overtime decision to Denver.

Attacking the Glass

As a team, North Dakota ranks fifth in the conference in rebounds per game (36.3) and is fourth in total rebounds (863) this season. When it comes to being aggressive on the offensive glass, NoDak shines with 263 boards to sit second in league play. The only team in the Summit League with more offensive boards this season is Western Illinois with 275.

Ballin' with Bentiu

Bentiu Panoam currently leads the team with 36 consecutive starts and has dished out 43 assists, sharing the team-lead in assists with Matt Norman. Panoam has been filling the position of point guard most recently after Caleb Nero went down with an injury against San Jose State on Dec. 3. Panoam's best performance of the season came on Jan. 29 with a 19-point performance at South Dakota for a new season-high, 17 of his 19 points were scored in the second half alone. He also put together an 18-point outing at Western Illinois on Jan. 13.

Early last season, Panoam provided a spark off the bench for the Fighting Hawks and worked his way into a starting role, earning his place in the starting lineup for the final 13 games of the season. He decided to exercise his COVID-19 extra year of eligibility and is playing for the Fighting Hawks once again in 2021-22.

In 2020-21, the Anchorage, Alaska, native netted double-figure performances in five of his last six starts, recording back-to-back 20+ point games in that stretch. Panoam recorded a new career-high with 25 points against South Dakota and set a new career-high in made triples with five at Omaha.

Fearless Freshman

Freshman Paul Bruns has played a key role for UND this season and has 17 collegiate starts. He currently leads all freshmen in the Summit League, averaging 14.2 points per game and 15.6 points per game as a starter. In the conference, Bruns ranks 13th out of all Summit League players with his 14.2 points per game this season and is eighth in games played within the conference with 16.1 points per game.

Bruns had a highlight-reel performance at North Dakota State on Dec. 22, pouring in a season-high 27 points and pulling down 11 boards for the first double-double of his career. He has 17 double-digit scoring performances and five 20-point performances this season. He has made a team leading 52 made trifectas and averages 2.2 made triples per game to rank ninth in the Summit League in that category.

Bruns is also sixth in the league in average steals per game with 1.2, which is also a team high.

Stormin' Norman

Sophomore transfer Matt Norman worked his way back into the starting lineup and led NoDak with a career-high 27 points against Western Illinois on Jan. 13, netting 20 points alone in the second half.

After adding 11 points at Oral Roberts on Jan. 20, Norman now has eight double-digit performances as a Hawk and three 20-point performances, including a 23-point game in 110-65 victory over North Central on Dec. 14, burying seven shots from beyond the arc and dishing out a career-best six assists in the victory.

Norman currently ranks second on the team in made triples with 38 makes from deep and is a 31.9 percent three-point shooter. Along with this, he now shares the team-lead with Bentiu Panoam for assists this season with 43.

Defensive Danielson

Brady Danielson has played in more games than any other player on the active roster, playing in 81 games and starting 13 of them. Despite being best known for his defense, Danielson threw in a season-high 10 points and corralled seven rebounds at Omaha on Jan. 6.

At Oral Roberts on Jan. 20, Danielson paced the team on the glass with a career-high 11 boards and dished out a career-best five assists. He also netted six points and drew one charge.

This season alone, Danielson has drawn a team-high 13 offensive fouls. He drew a season-high three charges against Dixie State on Dec. 18.

Last season, Danielson appeared in 25 games off the bench and averaged 13.0 minutes per game while putting in just under two points per game and just over one rebound per game. He dished out a career-high four assists at Minnesota last season.

In his career, Danielson erupted for 18 points at Oregon State, while making a career-best six field goals.

Finding A Groove

Sophomore transfer Tsotne Tsartsidze is coming into his own at post and had a highlight reel performance against Dixie State, rejecting a career-best four shots and just missing out on a double-double with 13 points and nine rebounds.

On Jan. 20, Tsartsidze was second on the team in rebounds with seven, while being responsible for three assists and six points in the game. On Jan. 13, Tsartsidze cleaned the glass against Western Illinois with a career-high 13 rebounds to go with seven points, while also pacing the offense with three assists. On Dec. 22 against the Bison, Tsartsidze knocked down a career-best seven shots for a new career high of 18 points.

Tsartsidze has eight double-digit scoring performances this season and is third on the team in total points scored this year with 191. His 18 total blocks this year currently sits sixth in the Summit League. Tsartsidze averages 5.7 rebounds per game to rank eighth in the conference in that category and his 136 total rebounds currently sits seventh in league play.

Let's Go Igbanugo

Ethan Igbanugo recently put together three highlight reel performances in a row. At South Dakota State on Jan. 27, Igbanugo poured in a career-high 24 points while going 7-for-7 at the free throw line. The week prior, he helped North Dakota erase second-half deficits of 14 (at Oral Roberts) and 17 (at Kansas City). At Oral Roberts, Igbanugo was second in scoring for NoDak with 17 points, 13 of them coming in the second half alone. Against the Golden Eagles, Igbanugo also led the team defensively with two steals and a block. At Kansas City, Igbanugo led the Fighting Hawks with a career-high tying 18 points on 50.0 percent shooting while also rejecting one shot.

Igbanugo has always been known as a sharpshooter and that has continued this season, with knocking down 32 trifectas on 98 attempts to rank third on the team in made triples. His shooting percentage from beyond the arc is currently 32.7 percent. He knocked down a career-high five shots from deep against Dixie State on Dec. 18.

The Lakeville North Product appeared in every game last season with 16 starts, averaging 27 minutes per game. He was a cool customer from downtown, leading the team in made triples with 40 and hitting a three in every game except one.

Wishes Granted

Reid Grant has been earning more playing time recently and his effort showed already this week, with him putting together a season-high 15 points while playing in a season-high 31 minutes against the Jackrabbits on Monday. Of his 15 points, 10 of them came in the second half alone while also going 5-of-5 at the charity stripe. Grant also dished out a team-leading four assists.

Against Denver on Thursday, Grant paced the team with seven assists for a new season-high in that category, while also adding six points, four rebounds and two steals.

Prior to this week, Grant's season-high point total was six points against Eastern Washington on Dec. 11. His high for assists was five at Kansas State on Nov. 28.

Mathews Knocks Them Down

Freshman Brian Mathews is seeing additional minutes with Mitchell Sueker out with a season-ending injury, and he is making the most of it. In Brookings on Jan. 27, Mathews was second in scoring for the Kelly Green and White with 10 points.

The week prior, Mathews erupted for 16 points at Kansas City to tie for second on the team in scoring in the game. Of his 16 points, 12 of them came at the free throw line where Mathews shined, going 12-of-13 in the game to go with seven rebounds and two assists.

Mathews' season-high scoring output was a 17-point performance against North Central (Minn.) on Dec. 14. In that game Mathews knocked down seven of his eight shots from the field and corralled five boards.

Needing Nero

Caleb Nero is starting to return to action after going down with an injury at San Jose State on Dec. 3 and missing nine games. Most recently, Nero knocked down three shots for eight points at SDSU and hauled in a rebound at USD in limited action. On Thursday against Denver, he was responsible for two assists and one rebound in five minutes of action.

Despite playing sparingly recently and not playing in the nine games before Jan. 20, Nero remains third on the team in points per game with 9.2 and leads the team in both assists per game (2.8) and free throw percentage (85.2).

Nero appeared in all 26 games last season and started 13 of them. The Tulsa, Okla., native proved to be a leader off the bench last season, leading all players off the bench with 8.7 points per game and 22.9 minutes per contest. He also led all guards on the team with a shooting percentage of 41.8 percent from the field and was second on the team in crunch time with an 83.3 percentage from the charity stripe.

In his career, Nero has piled up 25 games where he has netted double digits in points and has 17 games where has dished out three assists or more. In the season finale last season, Nero poured in 11 points in 21 minutes while grabbing three rebounds against Oral Roberts in the Summit League Quarterfinals.

Playing the Stretch Without Sueker

North Dakota will be playing down the stretch with a key piece of the offense missing with Mitchell Sueker out with a season-ending injury. Sueker battled through injuries and recently played in limited action at Denver on Jan. 8 where he scored eight points. Despite the missed time with injury, Sueker ranks sixth on the team in total points this season with 149.

Prior to injury, Sueker continued his hot streak from the end of last year and has seven double-digit scoring performances in 2021-22, averaging 9.9 points per game. He remains fourth on the team in free throw makes this season with 32 and is an 80.0 percent free throw shooter. Last season, Sueker drained 56-of-67 at the charity stripe to lead the team with an 83.6 percentage at the free throw line. In his career, the Marshall, Minn., native is 202-260 at the stripe, good for a free throw percentage of 77.7 percent.

Sueker averaged 7.7 points and 4.0 rebounds per game last year and has career-highs in points (32), rebounds (12) and assists (5). His best free throw performance came against Kansas City last year when he went 11-for-12 at the line in the 52-45 win.

Heat Check

North Dakota proved the three-point threat exists on Dec. 14 against North Central University, breaking the school record for made triples in a game with 17. The previous UND record for made shots beyond the arc in a single game was 16, which was tied three times, most recently on Dec. 17, 2019, in a 109-50 victory over Northland College inside the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center.

The Fighting Hawks are familiar with shots from deep and that has not changed this season, with the Kelly green and white firing off 628 shots from beyond the arc and knocking down 202 of them for an average of 32.2 percent made from three-point land. In the record-breaking game vs. NCU, the Hawks finished 17-of-31 from deep for an average of 54.8 percent.

North Dakota has hit at least one triple in every game dating back to March 1, 2018. The last time the Hawks did not make a three came on Feb. 24, 2018, when UND went 0-for-8 from downtown at Northern Colorado in a 79-66 loss. North Dakota has hit at least one three in each of the last 117 games played.

Keeping Things Even

North Dakota had five returners in 2021-22 and eight newcomers and so far, they are keeping things close as a team. The Fighting Hawks have scored 1,675 points this season with the newbies pouring in 962 of them and the returners amassing 713 points. In total, the newcomers have scored 57.43 percent of UND's total points this season, while the returners have accounted for 42.57 percent of North Dakota's made shots.

Shaking Things Up

North Dakota has utilized eight different variations of its starting lineup so far this season and may try its ninth different starting lineup on Saturday. On the team, Bentiu Panoam has the most active consecutive starts currently with 36, followed by Paul Bruns with 17. The next most common starter based on active streaks is Tsotne Tsartsidze with 13, trailed by Matt Norman with 10 and Brady Danielson with six.

Record Rewind

The North Dakota men's basketball program holds a 1,614-1,128 all-time record since Dr. George Sweetland led the first team onto the court in 1904-05. UND is 971-305 all-time when it comes to defending its home court. The 2021-22 season is the 14th at the Division I level for the program (2008-09) and the Fighting Hawks are 194-240 in those contests.

UND is 0-11 since 2000 against ranked Division I opponents, with the 2019 matchup at No. 8/7 Gonzaga being the highest-ranked regular season opponent since the No. 3 ranking held by Kansas when the Jayhawks visited Grand Forks in 2001.

Rolling with the Changes

North Dakota has already had three games rescheduled due to COVID-19 protocols and is constantly dealing with a changing schedule. The Hawks have already made up two of their previously scheduled contests, falling in a 75-68 decision to South Dakota on Monday, Jan. 10, and stumbling 70-64 vs. South Dakota State on Monday, Jan. 31.

The current last upcoming rescheduled home game is against St. Thomas in a game that was originally scheduled to be played on Jan. 15. The Hawks will now host the Tommies on Tuesday, Feb. 22, at Noon (CT). That game will be carried by UND Insider and aired on the Home of Economy Radio Network.

If the rescheduled games are still unable to be made up due to COVID-19 protocols, those will be considered a "no contest".

For seeding purposes regarding The Summit League Basketball Championships, if teams have played in a different number of League games due to no contests, winning percentage will be used as the first criteria to determine seeds. St. Thomas is not eligible for the Summit League Tournament this season, so the top eight teams in the conference will earn bids to the Summit League Basketball Championships at the conclusion of the regular season.

PAUL SATHER

University of North Dakota Director of Athletics Bill Chaves announced the hiring of Paul Sather on May 30, 2019 to fill the head men's basketball post. Sather comes to UND following a very successful stint at Northern State (Aberdeen, S.D.) where he was back-to-back conference coach of the year, leading the Wolves to the NCAA Division II championship game two seasons ago. He will be entering his second season at the helm for the Fighting Hawks in the 2020-21 season.

Armed with a collegiate coaching résumé that includes 23 years— including 20 at South Dakota schools— Sather has built a pair of national-contending basketball teams at his two head coaching stops. Prior to that, he was a six-year assistant at NSU, his alma mater, under legendary head coach Don Meyer before later embarking on a 15-year head coaching course that features a 297-169 (.637) record.

In a year that featured a global pandemic and new challenges across all of collegiate athletics in 2020-21, Sather navigated a tough non-conference schedule and a new-look league schedule to help guide the Fighting Hawks to their highest finish in the Summit League since joining the league in 2018-19. The 8-8 mark helped UND finish in fifth place before falling to eventual Sweet 16 participant Oral Roberts in the Summit League Tournament.

Flip Rebraca etched his name in program history by earning a spot on the All-Summit League Second Team following finishing seventh in the league in scoring at 17.3 ppg and fourth in rebounding at 8.2 rpg in league play while becoming the 39th player to score 1,000 points in his career at UND. Off the floor, Rebraca was named to the Summit League All-Academic Team and a CoSIDA Academic All-District Team selection.

Sather led a Fighting Hawks team to new heights in his first year behind the bench in 2019-20, becoming only the third coach in Summit League history to reach the tournament title game in their first year as head coach. Along the way, UND picked up a win over Big Ten foe Nebraska, the first since 1933, started 2-0 in league play for the first time since 2005, and knocked off North Dakota State in the final home game of the year.

Marlon Stewart became the 38th 1,000-point scorer in program history that season, also reaching the top-10 in the program record books for single season assists and points per game to earn the first All-Summit League First Team distinction in UND history. Filip Rebraca also broke the UND Division I single-season record for double-doubles in a season to be named to the All-Summit League Honorable Mention Team while De'Sean Allen-Eikens broke the program's scoring record by a freshman.

Off the court, the Fighting Hawks topped all of Division I in community service hours by a men's basketball program as well as set new highs in GPA marks.

In his final year at Northern State, the Wolves were the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Tournament champions, finishing the league schedule with an 18-4 record, part of a 30-6 league mark in the past two seasons. Sather's team led the NSIC in scoring defense, scoring margin, 3-point field goal percentage defense, and assists. In addition, NSU sat sixth nationally in 3-point field goal percentage.

A year prior, an early 18-game winning streak propelled the Wolves to a program-record 36 wins and all the way within a missed buzzer-beater of an NCAA Division II championship. He was named both the NSIC and NABC Central Region Coach of the year. His team was again among the elite in the country in a myriad of statistical categories, finishing in the top 20 in scoring defense (66.1) and rebounding margin (+7.8), in the top 10 in scoring margin (+14.1) and in the top five schools in field goal percentage (51.2).

Sather launched his head coaching career at Black Hills State (Spearfish, S.D.) in 2005. In five years there, Sather was instrumental in turning the BHSU program around from a 10-19 season in 2006-07 to an NAIA Final Four contender in 2008-09. The Yellow Jackets also qualified for the national tournament in 2009-10 and compiled an overall conference record of 46-25 in the five years under Sather, including winning two Dakota Athletic Conference championships.

As an assistant at Northern State, his teams recorded three league titles, a pair of NCAA Tournament bids with 10-league players, two of whom would also be named All-America. He then spent a year as an assistant at the University of Colorado.

After earning his bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1996 from Northern State, he served as physical education teacher and assistant boys' basketball coach at Sidney High School in Nebraska from 1996-1997. The following year he was a graduate assistant at Wayne State College while he earned his master's degree in sports administration.

Originally from Princeton, Minn., Sather had a stellar career collegiate career as a Wolf from 1990-1994. He was team captain for NSU when it earned back-to-back NAIA national runner-up finishes in 1993 and 1994.

Sather's family includes his wife, Kelsie, and their two children, Sam and Becca.
