### Quick Hitters

UNH enters Saturday's game at Dartmouth College with a 1-1 overall record following last weekend's 39-28 victory against Holy Cross at Wildcat Stadium.

The Wildcats are 0-1 on the road this season. New Hampshire lost its season opener, 31-0, at FBS representative San Diego State University in the season opener.

UNH has a 19-17-2 series edge against the Big Green. The Wildcats have won 13 straight in the series and are unbeaten the previous 20 matchups (18-0-2) dating back to Dartmouth's 24-13 home win Sept. 25, 1976.

The last time these teams met, UNH prevailed 52-19 at Cowell Stadium on Sept. 27, 2014. Prior to that, the teams had not squared off since '09.

In the most recent trip to Hanover (09/27/08), UNH prevailed 42-6. The 'Cats have a 9-15 road record, but have won each of the last nine on Dartmouth's home field.

Other than Dartmouth, UNH has not played an Ivy League school since a 1939 matchup against Harvard University. New Hampshire last played Yale in 1935, Brown in 1931 and Cornell in 1922. Wildcat football has never played Columbia, Penn or Princeton.

**Pop Lacey**, a true freshman at cornerback, was named CAA Rookie of the Week on Monday. He recorded a game-high 14 tackles, including 12 solo stops, vs. Holy Cross.

Lacey also received Honorable Mention recognition as the STATS FCS Freshman of the Week.

Senior running back **Dalton Crossan** was an Honorable Mention honoree for the College Football Performance Awards FCS Performer of the Week. Last week against Holy Cross, he carried the ball a personal-best 24 times for a career-high 199 yards and two TDs as part of 262 all-purpose yards. In the preseason, Crossan was named to the CFPA National Performer of the Year Trophy Watch List.

Senior cornerback and captain **Casey DeAndrade**, who is on the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List, recorded his first career pick-six last week vs. Holy Cross. His 28-yard scored gave the 'Cats a 39-28 lead with 2:10 remaining in the game. He also recorded six tackles (4-2-6) and three pass breakups.

# THE MATCHUP: UNH vs. DARTMOUTH

## Series Synopsis

The New Hampshire and Dartmouth football programs have met 38 times with UNH holding a 19-17-2 series edge against the Big Green. The Wildcats have won 13 straight in the series and are unbeaten the previous 20 matchups (18-0-2) dating back to Dartmouth's 24-13 home win Sept. 25, 1976. In the most recent trip to Hanover (09/27/08), UNH prevailed 42-6. The 'Cats have a 9-15 road record, but have won each of the last nine on Dartmouth's home field.

UNH head coach Sean McDonnell has won all 11 battles against the Big Green – the teams met annually from 2000-09. The Wildcats averaged 44.3 points per game and scored 40+ points 9 of 10 games; the only exception was a 29-26 road win in 2002. Dartmouth averaged 21.1 points per game with a high of 38 (42-38 home loss in '01) and low of 6 (42-6 home loss in '08).

## Scouting Dartmouth

Dartmouth College (Hanover, N.H.) plays its 2016 season opener Saturday against UNH. The Big Green were selected third in the Ivy League Preseason Media Poll. Dartmouth went 6-1 in the Ivy last year to earn a share of the league title, and the Big Green finished at 9-1 overall for its best record since 1996 (10-0).

Last season, the DC defense led the FCS in points allowed (10.1 points per game) and turnovers gained (32). On the other side of the ball, the offense averaged nearly 29 points per game. All told, eight players received All League First Team honors.

Only one of those eight players return in 2016, however, and the Big Green lost a total of 17 starters on offense and defense. The one player is senior tri-captain Folarin Orimolade; the linebacker, named to the STATS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List and a preseason All-America selection, ranked second in the Ivy League in both sacks and tackles for loss in '15. Orimolade is the top returning tackler – he was eighth overall with 36 total tackles (19-17-36). Also gone on D are players who accounted for 14 of the 18 interceptions as well as 12 of the 14 fumble recoveries.

On offense, Dartmouth has to replace its quarterback, two top receivers, three of the top four rushers and three linemen. Stone Ryder returns in the backfield; he led the Big Green in rushing yards (375) and rushing TDs (eight) on 75 carries, which ranked third. Jack Heneghan, the projected starting QB, completed 5 of 10 passes for 39 yards in two games last season. The top returning WR is Jon Marc Carrier (23-313), but he's not listed on the preseason two-deep at any of the three WR slots. Houston Brown, who had 17 catches for 255 yards and tied for the team lead with four receiving TDs, will be one of the top targets.

**DURHAM, N.H.** (Sept. 27, 2014) – The fourth-ranked UNH football team quickly built a 17-0 lead and rolled to a 52-19 non-conference victory Saturday night against intrastate rival Dartmouth College at Cowell Stadium.

Senior QB Andy Vailas passed for two touchdowns and ran for two more, and classmates Jimmy Owens and R.J. Harris both scored twice for the Wildcats.

Vailas, who started in place of injured Sean Goldrich, rushed eight times for a career-high 112 yards. He and Owens (15 carries, 81 yards) matched personal bests with their two scores. Harris finished with 113 yards on eight receptions.

The UNH defense held Dartmouth, which amassed 391 yards of total offense in the previous week's win vs. Central Connecticut State, to 262 yards. The Wildcats had a well-balanced 531 yards of offense with 267 rushing and 264 passing.

Defense and special teams helped New Hampshire break the game open in the third quarter. UNH led 31-16 at halftime and scored a pair of TDs in just over two minutes to push the margin to 45-16. The surge started when Shane McNeely intercepted a Dalyn Williams pass. Two plays later, Vailas connected with Harris for a 29-yard score. UNH's defense then forced a Dartmouth punt that was blocked by Mike Kelly; Horace Chalstrom picked up the ball and ran nine yards into the end zone.

Back in the first quarter, Vailas scored on UNH's fourth play from scrimmage on a 69-yard TD run; Harris ran in the conversion for an 8-0 lead. The Wildcats' defense forced a 3-and-out, and on fourth down the snap sailed through the end zone for a safety and 10-0 lead. UNH took the next possession for a TD and 17-0 lead at 9:08 of the first quarter.

After Dartmouth closed within 17-13, UNH responded with two more TDs to build a 31-13 lead. Kirby Shoenthaler returned the ensuing kickoff 92 yards two the UNH 2, but the Wildcats' defense stiffened and – despite a defensive pass interference call – held the Big Green to a field goal that made it 31-16 at the half. The 'Cats built off that defensive stand and allowed just three points the rest of the night.



**MEMORABLE OPENER:** In the Sept. 10 inaugural game at Wildcat Stadium, UNH trailed Holy Cross 21-6 just 18:09 into the game but New Hampshire closed within 21-13 before halftime and outscored the guests 26-7 in the second half, including 19-7 in the third quarter, to rally for a 39-28 victory before a crowd of 13,242.

**REVERSAL OF FORTUNE:** Holy Cross scored a TD on its first three possession of the game to build a 21-6 lead. In the second half, UNH scored a TD on its first three possessions to take a 32-28 lead.

**LACEY LAUDED BY CAA:** True freshman and safety **Pop Lacey** was named CAA Football Rookie of the Week on Sept. 12 for his efforts in UNH's 39-28 come-from-behind victory against College of the Holy Cross on Sept. 10 – the inaugural game at Wildcat Stadium. Lacey recorded a game-high 14 tackles, including 12 solo stops – that was more than any other player recorded total tackles. He made five tackles (5-0-5) in the second quarter and five more (4-1-5) in the third. Lacey was also credited with one pass breakup.

**CROSSAN CARRIES THE LOAD:** Senior running back **Dalton Crossan** carried the ball a personal-best 24 times for a career-high 199 yards and two touchdowns in UNH's 39-28 victory vs. Holy Cross. He also caught two passes for 14 yards and returned three kickoffs 49 yards for a total of 262 all-purpose yards.

**GAINING GROUND:** Crossan's 199 rushing yards vs. Holy Cross marked the highest total by a Wildcat since Nico Steriti had 201 against Old Dominion on Sept. 22, 2012. New Hampshire rushed for 362 yards, which marked the most by UNH since amassing 389 in that same ODU game.

**PICK SIX:** With UNH leading Holy Cross 32-28 late in the fourth quarter, senior captain **Casey DeAndrade** intercepted Peter Pujals' pass at the HC 28 and raced down the sideline untouched for his first career pick-six with 2:10 left to play. UNH's previous pick-six was Oct. 4, 2014, when Steven Thames had a 55-yard return score at Elon.

**NATIONAL NUMBERS:** **Dalton Crossan** is No. 9 in the nation – and atop the CAA leaderboard – in all-purpose yards per game (168.5). Crossan also ranks ninth in both rushing yards (237) and rushing yards per game (118.5), as well as 14th in yards per carry (6.77); those three numbers are second in the conference.

Sophomore defensive end **Jae'Wuan Horton** is No. 12 in sacks (1.0/game).

**Pop Lacey**, a true freshman at safety, is No. 15 in solo tackles (7.0/game).

Sophomore QB **Trevor Knight** is sixth in passing yards per completion at 15.13.

**A LOT WITH A LITTLE:** Sophomore WR **Rory Donovan** caught just two passes vs. Holy Cross but was just short of 100 receiving yards with 98, including a 62-yard TD.

**TOPTARGET:** Sophomore WR **Neil O'Connor** hauled in a team-high four catches for 56 yards against Holy Cross. He recorded his first career TD catch (eight yards) and a personal long 26-yarder.

**BRYANT BUSTS ONE:** Junior RB **Trevon Bryant** had a personal long 42-yard run against Holy Cross. He finished with nine carries for 79 yards (8.8 yards/carry) and had a one-yard TD run.

**TOP 10 ON THE HORIZON:** Dalton Crossan enters Saturday's game at Dartmouth College with 1,573 career rushing yards. Jim Quinn (1979-82) is No. 10 on the program's career leaderboard with 1,947. Crossan will tie Quinn with 374 more rushing yards.

**WILDCAT STADIUM – A NEW ERA OF UNH FOOTBALL:** A new era of UNH football began Saturday, Sept. 10, when New Hampshire played its inaugural game at Wildcat Stadium against College of the Holy Cross – and prevailed 39-28 in front of 13,242 spectators.

Wildcat Stadium was built on the same site as its predecessor, Cowell Stadium, which had been erected in 1936. The stands on the east side, which had served as the home bench, remain intact and will now be the visitor's section. The new structure – including the Service Credit Union Victory Club, club seats, press box, coaches' boxes, general admission seating, 603 Eatery concession stand and souvenir store – was erected on the west side and will be the home bench.

**DANGEROUS BOOKENDS:** Sophomore defensive end **Jae'Wuan Horton** has recorded one sack in both games this season. Senior DE **Cam Shorey** sacked the quarterback in the season opener at San Diego State and **Josh Kania**, a redshirt freshman, had a sack in the second game vs. Holy Cross.

**YES, IT'S TRUE:** Three true freshmen – **Pop Lacey**, **Prince Smith, Jr.** and **Jelani Greene** – have already seen playing time this season. Smith, Jr. made four tackles, including one stop behind the line of scrimmage, in his first collegiate game – at San Diego State; he followed that with three tackles and first career interception against Holy Cross. Lacey also saw significant playing time at SDSU and was credited with two tackles; he tallied a team-high 14 tackles with one pass breakup vs. HC. Greene made his collegiate debut vs. Holy Cross but did not catch a pass.

**AVOIDING 0-2:** UNH has not lost back-to-back games at the outset of the season since 2002, when the Wildcats went 0-4 out of the gate and finished the year 3-8 overall and 2-7 in the Atlantic 10. In the Coach Mac era (since 1999), that is the only time New Hampshire started a season 0-2.

**LEADING RUSHER AND LEADING CATCHER:** Senior running back **Dalton Crossan** is a multi-purpose threat. In the season opener at San Diego State, Crossan was the top 'Cat in both rushing yards (38) and receiving yards (37). It marked the second time in his career that Crossan led UNH in both statistics. He previously accomplished the feat Oct. 31, 2015 at home against Rhode Island, when he finished with 114 rushing yards and 66 receiving yards.

Crossan has been New Hampshire's top ground gainer 14 times, including both games this season. He was UNH's top rusher all 11 games in which he played last season. The first time Crossan was the top 'Cat in rushing was Nov. 30, 2013, when he carried the ball six times for 84 yards and one TD vs. Lafayette.

**READY TO START:** Redshirt freshmen **Michael Balsamo** (safety), **Rick Ellison** (safety), **Isiah Perkins** (cornerback) and **Nick Velte** (left guard) were all in the UNH starting lineup for their collegiate debuts Sept. 3 at San Diego State University. A total of nine other Wildcats – seven redshirt freshmen and two true freshmen – played in their first career game in that season opener at SDSU.

**DOUBLY GOOD DEBUT:** Making his collegiate debut just 72 miles from his hometown of Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif., free safety **Rick Ellison** tied for the team lead with 10 tackles against the Aztecs of San Diego State at Qualcomm Stadium. Ellison made five tackles on SDSU's initial drive of the third quarter.

**PEDINOFF'S INTO PUNT:** Junior punter **Max Pedinoff** punted 11 times in the Sept. 3 season opener at San Diego State. His punts averaged 38.4 yards with a long of 43 yards and five boots inside the 20, including at

the 2- and 4-yard line. No Wildcat had recorded double digits in punts the previous decade (2006-15).

New Hampshire punted a total of 12 times vs. the Aztecs. In the prior decade, UNH punted double digits in a game just one time – 11 at Ball State University on Sept. 12, 2009.

**SAN DIEGO SHUTOUT:** San Diego State held the Wildcats scoreless to mark the first time since Nov. 2, 2013 that UNH was shut out; that aforementioned game was a 17-0 loss at College of William & Mary.

**DEANDRADE SETS DEFENSIVE TONE:** Senior cornerback and captain **Casey DeAndrade** received a total of eight preseason accolades, including STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List. He has 12 tackles (8-4-12), an interception and three pass breakups in two games this season.

DeAndrade earned three All-America Team accolades following the 2015 season – including STATS FCS All-America Second Team. He has been a CAA All-Conference First Team honoree at both cornerback and punt return each of the past two years.

DeAndrade led the 2015 'Cats in both tackles (76) and pass breakups (10); to put his 55 solo tackles in perspective, only two teammates had more total tackles than DeAndrade had solo tackles. He was also atop the team leaderboard in punt returns (20) and punt return yards (226), and that included a 90-yard TD return at nationally-ranked College of William & Mary. His 11.3-yard punt return average led the CAA and ranked No. 15 in the nation.

**ANOTHER GAME, ANOTHER START:** DeAndrade has started all 42 games in which he has played in his three-plus years as a Wildcat – his consecutive start streak is at 37 games since a DNP against Villanova in 2013. To put that streak in perspective, only four other UNH players started all 12 games last year; of those three returning letterwinners (**Curtis Nealer**, **Jordan Powell**, **Cam Shorey**), Nealer and Shorey now have 14 consecutive starts.

**KNIGHT RISES:** Entering camp this August, the battle for the position of starting quarterback was close as could be between senior captain **Adam Riese** and sophomore **Trevor Knight**. Head coach **Sean McDonnell** announced Aug. 29 that Knight, a native of Amherst, N.H., would be the starter in the Sept. 3 season opener at San Diego State.

It marked the second time the past four years a New Hampshire native was UNH's starting QB in the season opener – Andy Vilais (Bedford) took the first snap of the 2013 season. Prior to that, the last Granite Stater to begin the season as the Wildcats' starting QB was Ryan Day (Manchester),



who is the San Francisco 49ers' quarterbacks coach this season.

**INSIDE THE QB BATTLE:** In the Blue-White scrimmage (Aug. 25), Knight completed 15 of 20 passes for 234 yards and three TDs. Riese compiled comparable numbers – 12 of 18 for 202 yards and two TDs.

Last year as a redshirt freshman, Knight played in 6 of 12 games. In limited action, he completed 10 of 19 pass attempts for 124 yards and one touchdown, as well as one interception; those numbers calculate to a .526 completion percentage and 114.29 passer efficiency rating. Knight was highly effective on two-point PATs, where he went a perfect 3-for-3 with one run and two passes.

Riese played in 10 of 12 games with three starts last season. He completed 54 of 79 passes (68.4%) for 513 yards and six TDs with two INTs. Riese's 142.90 passer efficiency rating was best among UNH's four quarterbacks.

**ALL-PURPOSE PERFORMER:** Explosive senior running back **Dalton Crossan**, who was named to the 2016 FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy Watch List (by CFPA), is a versatile weapon and workhorse for the Wildcats. At SDSU last week, he rushed the ball 11 times for 38 yards and had two catches for 37 yards for a team-best 75 all-purpose yards.

He was named to the CAA All-Conference Third Team as both a running back and kickoff returner in 2015, when he was the Wildcats' leader in rushes (172), rushing yards (885), rushing touchdowns (13), TDs (16), kickoff returns (19), kickoff return yards (482) and all-purpose yards (1,708). He tied for second in receptions (46) and ranked fourth in receiving yards (341).

With those numbers, Crossan ranked 10th in the nation – and second in the CAA – in all-purpose yards per game (155.27). He was also among the best in the country at No. 17 in rushing TDs, and those 13 scores ranked fourth in the CAA. Crossan averaged a conference-best 25.4 yards per kickoff return and was fourth in the CAA in points responsible for per game (8.7) as well as fifth in yards per carry (5.15).

**PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK:** Three seniors, a junior and a red-shirt freshman comprise the starting offensive line entrusted to protect the quarterback and open holes for the running backs.

The veterans up front are left tackle **Andrew Lauderdale**, center **Tad McNeely** and right guard **Curtis Nealer**. McNeely, who missed the last 10 games of the 2015 season because of injury, has started since his redshirt freshman season and was a CAA All-Conference Second Team selection as a sophomore in 2014. Nealer was the only offensive lineman to start every game a year ago, while Lauderdale was in the starting lineup nine times, including the last seven of the season.

Junior **Will McInerney** saw action in 7 of 12 games a year ago and was in the starting lineup five times – three at right tackle and two at left guard. He is slotted at right tackle for the 2016 season opener.

The youngster of the front line is **Nick Velte**. Three other redshirt freshmen are backups; there is also one sophomore and a junior on the offensive line's two-deep.

**SENIORS STABILIZE CENTER OF DEFENSE:** Three seniors – including one of the team's leading tacklers his first two years – will lead the line-backing crew into action.

**DeVaughn Chollette**, who missed almost half of last season with an injury, will look to get back to the production he put up as a redshirt freshman and sophomore. Chollette totaled 63 tackles his first season and 67 the next. He was out most of the second half of last season, returning to play on special teams in the FCS playoff game against Colgate.

Chollette made six tackles, including a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss, in the opener against San Diego State. He made three stops vs. Holy Cross.

Senior captain **Ryan Farrell** and **Kevin McNally** are the other two seniors contending for starting spots.

Farrell, penciled in as the starter alongside Chollette, had an increased role last year. In 12 games – six starts – he compiled 45 tackles (4.0 tackles

for a loss, including 3.0 sacks), two interceptions, two recovered fumbles and one forced fumble. In the last five games, he averaged 5.8 tackles and tallied one INT, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble.

McNally played in 11 of 12 games with two starts and made 35 stops. Sophomore **Jared Kuehl** will also vie for playing time. Kuehl saw action every game a year ago and recorded 14 tackles.

Kuehl finished with a game-high and personal-best 10 tackles, eight of the solo variety at SDSU. Farrell made seven stops (2-5-7) while McNally was credited with three tackles.

**YOUTHFUL D-LINE:** Five of the eight players listed on UNH's two-deep at defensive line are sophomores (three) and redshirt freshmen (two). The leader of the pack is veteran **Cam Shorey**. Shorey, 6-5 and 260 pounds, totaled 42 tackles last season. The defensive end led the team with 12.5 tackles for a loss, including a team-best 7.5 sacks; those numbers ranked sixth in the CAA in sacks and ninth in TFL.

Starting at the opposite end is sophomore **Jae'Wuan Horton**, who stepped into a starting role last year as a redshirt freshman. Horton matched Shorey's 42 total tackles, had nine tackles for a loss and 3.5 sacks.

Shorey and Horton each tallied a sack to account for the team's two sacks at San Diego State. Shorey had a total of two tackles while the sack marked Horton's only stop vs. the Aztecs. Horton once again accounted for one of the team's two sacks vs. Holy Cross.

Adding depth on defensive end are sophomore **Kyle Reisert** and redshirt freshman **Josh Kania**, who recorded two tackles behind the line of scrimmage, including one sack, in the Blue-White scrimmage.

None of the four defensive tackles on the two-deep have started a game. Junior **Rick Holt**, who played on both sides of the trenches a year ago, and sophomore **Ryan Sosnak** will be backed up by junior **Odaine Franklin** and redshirt freshman **Sean Burns**. Franklin is making the transition from linebacker this season.

Of those six players, Holt led the way with three tackles at SDSU.

**IN THE RUNNING BACK STABLE:** Dalton Crossan fronts a deep and veteran running game that includes juniors **Trevon Bryant** and **Donald Goodrich**. Bryant carried the ball 60 times for 297 yards (4.9 yards/carry) last season and also had six receptions for 58 yards (9.7 yards/catch). Goodrich finished with 111 yards on 30 rushes (3.7 per carry) as well as five catches for 44 yards (8.8 per catch).

Classmate **Jerickson Fedrick** transferred to UNH from Maine and **Evan Gray** is a redshirt freshman. Fedrick is coming off a strong spring while Gray's development could give the 'Cats five options at running back.

**BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE:** It was only a scrimmage, but the performance of wide receiver **Neil O'Connor** in the Blue-White scrimmage could be an indication that the sophomore is ready for a breakout season. O'Connor hauled in TD passes of 62 and 74 yards as part of his five-catch, 146-yard performance – in the first half.

On the big stage of Qualcomm Stadium, O'Connor hauled in a 13-yard reception on the Wildcats' second play from scrimmage. He did not, however, have another catch the rest of the game.

**A SAFE PLACE:** Heading into the 2016 season, the three safeties in UNH's starting lineup had a combined zero career starts. Redshirt freshmen **Michael Balsamo** and **Rick Ellison** are starters in two of three safety positions, while the other starting safety is junior **D'Andre Drummond-Mayrie**, who played in 9 of 14 games as a true freshman in '14, then played in 8 of 12 last season.

All three were in the starting lineup at San Diego State and vs. Holy Cross. Ellison tied for the team lead of 10 tackles at SDSU, and Drummond-Mayrie's seven tackles against HC ranked second.

**IN A TIGHT SPOT:** Senior **Jordan Powell**, who will miss the first six games of the season, returns at tight end following a highly-productive 2015 season in which he garnered Madness All-America Third Team, College Sporting News Fabulous Fifty All-America Honorable Mention, ECAC All-Star Second Team and All-CAA Football First Team accolades.

Powell led all UNH pass catchers with 461 receiving yards and five touchdowns; he had 46 receptions for an average of 10.0 yards. He had five catches for 45 yards and two scores against fifth-ranked Richmond and followed that with a 10-catch, 96-yard, 1-TD performance at Albany. Through two weeks, no tight ends have a reception.

UNH did not have a tight end on its first play from scrimmage in the 2016 season opener. **Justin Malone-Woods**, **John DiCaro** and **Matt Torrey** all saw playing time, but a tight end was targeted just once (Malone-Woods). **Nick Derocher**, sidelined by injury for the SDSU game, was in the starting lineup one week later vs. Holy Cross. DiCaro also saw playing time vs. HC.

**WILDCAT SPORTS RADIO NETWORK:** Wildcat Sports Properties, a property of Learfield Sports, is the multimedia rights holder for UNH Athletics. The Wildcat Sports Network consists of flagship station WGIR-AM 610 (Manchester), which has been the headquarters for UNH play-by-play since 2008, as well as affiliates WQSO-FM 96.7 (Portsmouth) and WPKX-AM 930 (Rochester).

**Bob Lipman**, a four-time and reigning N.H. Sportscaster of the Year, is in his third season as the Voice of the Wildcats and fourth season with the Network in 2014. Lipman is the longtime voice of the New Hampshire Fisher Cats baseball team and former voice of Dartmouth College football.

**Tim O'Sullivan** joined the Wildcat Sports Network in August 2014 and will be the color analyst for UNH football games this fall. The award-winning sportswriter from the *Concord Monitor* has covered UNH football since 2003.

All games will be broadcast live, with the pregame show beginning 30 minutes prior to kickoff.

**SPECIAL TEAMS:** New Hampshire has a couple of dangerous returners in **Casey DeAndrade** and **Dalton Crossan** – DeAndrade is an All-CAA Football First Team punt returner and Crossan and Third Team kick return – which is why the Wildcats rank third in the CAA in kickoff returns (23.3 yard average, which is .3 behind the leader) and rank second in punt returns (11.6 yards average).

DeAndrade and Crossan have helped put UNH's punt and kickoff return numbers near the top of the league the past couple of seasons. The Wildcats were second in punt return average at 11.1 yards per return last season and third at 8.3 in 2014. They were third in kickoff return at 22.5 yards per return last year and led the league at 22.4 in 2014.

In the Sept. 3 opener at San Diego State, the Aztecs either kicked deep into the end zone in DeAndrade's direction or kicked away from UNH's dangerous return man.

**Neil O'Connor** and **Jerickson Fedrick** also lined up to return kickoffs at SDSU. Fedrick recorded the longest return of 16 yards, while O'Connor had one kickoff return for 12 yards.

While DeAndrade and Crossan have been very productive as returners during their careers, the flip side of the special teams equation – the student-athletes kicking the ball – are less proven.

Junior **Morgan Ellman** is in the No. 1 spot at kicker, a position he took over late last season. Ellman made all five of the field goals he attempted, the longest of which was 25 yards. He did not have the opportunity to attempt a field goal or PAT at SDSU.

Classmate **Max Pedinoff** has secured the job as starting punter. Pedinoff punted 16 times last season and averaged 37.2 yards per boot with a long of 54 and five kicks inside the 20. His right leg got a workout in San Diego; Pedinoff punted 11 times with an average of 38.4 yards, long of 43 and five boots inside the Aztecs' 20.

**BLUE-WHITE GAME RECAP:** Quarterbacks **Trevor Knight** and **Adam Riese** passed for five touchdowns and 436 yards between them as the UNH football team broke in its brand-new Wildcat Stadium and closed out fall camp with the Blue-White scrimmage on Aug. 25.

Sophomore **Neil O'Connor** led all receivers with five catches for 146 yards and a pair of scores.

Knight completed 15 of his 20 passes for 234 yards and three scores. Riese was 12-for-18 passing for 202 yards and a pair of scores. O'Connor caught both of Riese's TD passes.

Senior WR **Anthony Pante** had five catches for 46 yards and a TD.

Junior RB **Trevon Bryant** caught a 22-yard scoring pass from Knight.

Sophomore placekicker **Morgan Ellman** nailed a 45-yard field goal in the second quarter.

Redshirt freshman defensive end **Josh Kania**, junior defensive end **Mike Boryeskne**, sophomore defensive tackle **Ryan Sosnak** and sophomore defensive end **Kyle Reisert** each had a quarterback sack.

The defensive units combined to record four sacks but did not produce a turnover.

**NATION-LEADING 12 STRAIGHT FCS POSTSEASONS:** UNH has qualified for the NCAA FCS Championship tournament 12 consecutive years, the longest active streak in the nation; the next longest active streak of six is held by North Dakota State.

The Wildcats have advanced to the semifinals each of the last two years, and that marks the deepest the team has advanced.

The 'Cats have compiled an 11-11 postseason record during the streak. It all began in 2004 with a first round upset (27-24 win) at Georgia Southern.

New Hampshire has a 12-16 lifetime record in the postseason and that includes 11-13 in the I-AA/FCS tourney.

UNH has a 4-4 postseason record at Cowell Stadium, including 3-1 the past two years.

**A LOT TO LOSE:** The Wildcats lost 13 starters – six on offense and seven on defense – from the 2015 squad that went 7-5 overall (5-3 CAA) and lost in the first round of the NCAA tournament.

Graduated is quarterback Sean Goldrich, who left the UNH program No. 5 in career passing yards (7,536), No. 5 in career pass attempts (1,068) and No. 3 in career completions (654).

Goldrich's top target from a year ago, Jared Allison, is also gone. He had a team-high 53 catches for 433 yards.

Defensively, five of the top six tacklers are not on this year's roster.

# HEAD COACH SEAN McDONNELL



Sean McDonnell '78 is in his 18th season as head coach of his alma mater in 2016. The native of Saratoga Springs, N.Y., has a career record of 134-79 (.629 winning percentage) that includes an 84-55 conference mark (.604). He has guided the Wildcats to 12 consecutive winning seasons – with six double-digit win totals – and the 'Cats advanced to the NCAA Division I FCS tournament each of those 12 years, which is the longest active streak in the nation.

UNH put together a staggering streak of 162 straight weeks ranked in the STATS FCS Top 25, a streak that began Sept. 6, 2004, and lasted until Oct. 12, 2015.

McDonnell's collegiate accolades include Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year (2005, 2014), AFCA National Coach of the Year (2014), AFCA District Coach of the Year (2004, '05, '12, '14),

CAA Coach of the Year (2004-14), New England Football Writers Coach of the Year (2005, '08, '10, '12, '14) and Gridiron Club of Greater Boston Head Coach of the Year (2000, '04, '09, '12).

The 2015 Wildcats rallied to win their final four games to extend their playoff streak to 12 years. The winning streak included an upset of No. 5 Richmond (30-25) and a convincing 22-6 defeat of rival Maine in the final regular-season home game in the 79-year history of Cowell Stadium. The 'Cats recorded victories in their final 15 regular season games in The Dungeon, which gives way to the new Wildcat Stadium in 2016.

On Dec. 15, 2014, McDonnell became the third two-time recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award (FCS National Coach of the Year); he previously won the award in 2005. It marked the fourth Coach of the Year accolade in '14 for McDonnell, who was also honored as AFCA Region Coach of the Year, New England Coach of the Year and CAA Coach of the Year.

Coach Mac guided the 2104 Wildcats to their second consecutive national semifinal appearance with a 12-2 record that included school records for most wins in a season and consecutive wins (12), as well as five wins against nationally-ranked teams, including four in the Top 10. The Wildcats posted a perfect 8-0 record in the CAA to claim their third league championship under McDonnell (2005-12-14) and first outright title since 1994.

In 2013, McDonnell was honored by the Joe Yukica-New Hampshire Chapter of the National Football Foundation with the Andy Mooradian Award for his contributions to amateur football. That season UNH won multiple playoff games (three) in a single season for the first time in program history en route to the Wildcats' first appearance in the FCS semifinals. The 'Cats recorded five wins against nationally-ranked foes, including three vs. the Top 10, to finish with a 10-5 overall record as well as a 6-2 CAA mark for the third consecutive year. New Hampshire recorded a six-game win streak for the second consecutive season and went a perfect 6-0 at home.

After a 1-3 start, the 2013 season turned when Coach Mac's Wildcats went for – and converted – a 2-point PAT with 14 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter to defeat 12th-ranked Villanova, 29-28. UNH closed the regular season with a convincing 24-3 win at Cowell Stadium against fourth-ranked Maine to retain the Brice-Cowell Musket before recording playoff wins against Lafayette (45-7 at home), eighth-ranked Maine (41-27) and seventh-ranked Southeastern Louisiana (20-17).

The 2012 Wildcats earned a share of the CAA championship – the second in Coach Mac's career (2005) – with a 6-2 league mark. The 'Cats compiled an 8-4 overall record that included an NCAA second-round game at Wofford. McDonnell reached coaching milestone victory No. 100 with a 44-21 win against Georgia State at the Georgia Dome on Oct. 6, 2012. Senior linebacker Matt Evans became the school's all-time tackle leader (460) when he surpassed Steve Doig on Nov. 3, 2012, in Coach Mac's first career victory against William & Mary (28-25). Evans had his No. 52 retired at the team awards banquet in March 2013, and fellow senior Chris Zarkoskie (OL) was the recipient of the CAA's inaugural Chuck Boone Leadership Award.

The 2011 Wildcats matched a school record for the second straight year by knocking off five ranked opponents en route to an 8-4 mark, including 6-2 in the CAA. The 'Cats put a bow on their rivalry with Massachusetts by knocking off the Minutemen, 27-21, in the second Colonial Clash at Gillette Stadium, which was also the 74th and final scheduled meeting between the longtime rivals. UNH reclaimed the Brice-Cowell Musket with a 30-27 defeat of Maine in the regular-season finale and came within a blocked PAT of forcing overtime in a playoff loss at Montana State. Junior linebacker Matt Evans became the first Wildcat to ever be named the nation's top defensive player when he won the Buck Buchanan Award, and senior quarterback Kevin Decker was crowned the CAA Offensive Player of the Year.

In 2010, McDonnell's Wildcats collected victories against five ranked opponents, a University record, en route to an 8-5 campaign. UNH advanced to the quarterfinal round of the NCAA postseason for the sixth time in seven years after dispatching Bethune-Cookman, 45-20, in a second-round encounter before suffering a 16-3 quarterfinal loss at eventual national championship game participant Delaware. McDonnell was feted as the 2010 Division I FCS Coach of the Year by the New England Football Writers, his third such honor (2005, '08). During the course of the '10 campaign, the 'Cats earned their 12th straight home victory – a school record – by shutting out No. 11 Richmond, 17-0, on Homecoming. Two weeks later, UNH made history by topping No. 12 UMass, 39-13, in the inaugural Colonial Clash at Gillette Stadium. The game was witnessed by 32,848 fans, the largest football crowd in CAA history.

UNH finished 10-3 in 2009 and won its second straight CAA North Division championship. The Wildcats continued to be giant killers by knocking off an FBS opponent for the fifth straight time, securing a hard-fought 23-16 triumph at Ball State. Previous FBS opponents to feel the wrath of the Wild-

cats during the amazing upset run were Army (2008), Marshall ('07), Northwestern ('06) and Rutgers ('04). UNH was the only team to defeat eventual FCS national champion Villanova (28-24) on Homecoming. The Wildcats also posted an impressive win on the road at McNeese State, defeating the Cowboys, 49-13, in the first round of the NCAA playoffs.

New Hampshire notched a 10-3 record in 2008, including a defeat of Southern Illinois in the first round of the NCAAs before a quarterfinal-round setback at Northern Iowa. UNH finished the season ranked No. 7 in most national polls, and McDonnell was honored as the New England FCS Coach of the Year for the second time.

In 2007, the Wildcats were 7-5 overall and nearly upset No. 1 Northern Iowa in the first round of the NCAAs, losing on a last-minute TD, 38-35, at the UNI Dome. The Wildcat offense, ranked 16th in the nation, averaged more than 400 yards per contest.

The Wildcats were ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation in 2006 and finished the season ranked sixth after defeating Hampton, 41-38, in the first round of the NCAAs. Among the regular-season highlights was senior All-America wide receiver David Ball making history by surpassing legendary Jerry Rice with 58 career TD receptions and junior quarterback Ricky Santos claiming the Walter Payton Award as the FCS football national player of the year.

In 2005, McDonnell was honored as the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year by The Sports Network after leading his Wildcats to a record-breaking 11-2 season, an Atlantic 10 Championship, a second straight NCAA appearance in the I-AA quarterfinals and the country's No. 1 ranking at the end of the regular season. The Wildcats played host to two nationally-televised NCAA postseason games on ESPN at Cowell Stadium, beating Colgate in the first round before succumbing to Northern Iowa in the NCAA quarterfinals.

McDonnell's hard work rebuilding the program paid off in 2004 with a 10-3 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the Atlantic 10, which earned the team the Northern Division championship and a bid to the NCAA I-AA Championships for the first time since 1994. The 'Cats advanced to the quarterfinals for the first time in the history of the program by winning the first-ever NCAA tourney contest under McDonnell, a 27-23 upset at Georgia Southern. McDonnell was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year and was selected District Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

In 2003, UNH began turning the corner by winning three of its last four contests, including an upset victory over nationally-ranked Maine. The team's 5-7 record could have easily been above .500, as the 'Cats narrowly lost to No. 1 Delaware on a missed field goal in the closing seconds, and UNH was driving for a potential game-winning TD late at Division I-A Central Michigan before running out of time.

In 2002, McDonnell's offense was one of the most prolific in I-AA football and averaged 449.2 yards per contest and 36.7 ppg. In victories over the likes of Hampton, James Madison, Dartmouth and Massachusetts the 'Cats scored 37 points/game and scored over 40 points in two of the victories. UNH finished with a 4-7 overall record in 2001.

In 2000, the Wildcats were ranked as high as 23rd in the nation and knocked off three top-25 opponents, including Hampton (31-17), Massachusetts (24-16) and No. 2 Delaware on Nov. 4 (45-44 OT). Injuries squashed UNH's chances for a playoff berth down the stretch, but UNH opened the campaign with a 4-0 record, its best start since 1977 when the Wildcats won seven straight games. UNH finished the season with a 6-5 record and finished tied for fourth in the Atlantic 10. McDonnell was named the Gridiron Club Of Greater Boston College Head Coach Of The Year.

In his rookie season, McDonnell led the Wildcats to a 5-6 overall record and oversaw a wide-open offensive attack that led the Atlantic 10 with an average of 457.3 yards per game.

McDonnell was named the 19th head coach of the UNH football program April 22, 1999. McDonnell replaced legendary head coach Bill Bowes, who retired after 27 years as the mentor of the Wildcats.

McDonnell served eight seasons as a Wildcat assistant and completed his fifth year as the team's offensive coordinator in 1998. McDonnell rejoined the Wildcats as an assistant coach before the 1991 spring camp and worked with the quarterbacks and receivers for his first three seasons. In 1997, McDonnell was named the recipient of "The College Assistant Coach Award" by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in recognition of his quality of performance, loyalty and longevity.

McDonnell was a standout defensive back for UNH. He started for the 1975 and 1976 Yankee Conference championship teams and came back to start for the 1978 squad. After his graduation from UNH, he spent one year as an assistant coach at Manchester (N.H.) Memorial High School and followed that up with a three-year stint at Manchester West (1980-82). McDonnell worked as the defensive coordinator at Hamilton College for two seasons (1983-84) and subsequently spent three years (1985-87) coaching the receivers and tight ends at former conference-rival Boston University. During the 1988 campaign, McDonnell served as a graduate assistant coach at Boston College. He spent two seasons as an assistant at Columbia (1989-90) prior to his coaching debut in Durham.

Sean and his wife, Jenny, reside in Durham and are the parents of two sons: Tim and Tom, a 2015 UNH graduate who played four seasons on the Wildcat men's basketball team.

# COACHING STAFF

## RYAN CARTY

## OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS

Ryan Carty is in his 10th season on the UNH coaching staff, including his fifth consecutive year as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. In 2015, Carty oversaw an offense that averaged 358.8 yards/game that included 211.8 passing yards/game and 146.9 rushing yards/game. The Wildcats scored 23.9 points/game and totaled 35 TDs. Under Carty's tutelage, Sean Goldrich graduated among New Hampshire's all-time great QBs; he's ranked third in completions (654), fifth in passing yards (7,536) and fifth in attempts (1,068). In 2014, the Wildcats were once again one of the nation's best offenses. The 'Cats ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense (36.0 points/game), 12th in first downs (315), eighth in 3rd down conversion percentage (48.0%), 11th in completion percentage (65.0%) and 17th in passing efficiency (147.0). In the CAA, the 'Cats were second in scoring offense and passing efficiency, third in rushing offense (169.5 points/game) and passing offense (269 yards/game), and fourth in total offense (438.5 yards/game). The Wildcat offense featured All-CAA honorees in receiver R.J. Harris, who ranked first in receiving yards (1,551), and running back Nico Steriti, who was first in scoring TDs (14 rushing, 4 receiving). The 2013 Wildcats boasted a pair of 1,000-yard receivers for the first time in program history, and had both a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver for only the second time (previously in '93). Carty began his coaching career at UNH after playing quarterback at the University of Delaware. He was voted captain in his 2006 senior campaign and played on the national championship squad in 2003.

## MICHAEL FERZOCCO

## WIDE RECEIVERS/SPECIAL TEAMS

Michael Ferzocco is in his ninth season on the UNH coaching staff and was elevated to the role of wide receivers coach/special teams coordinator in 2016. Ferzocco spent six seasons (2010-15) as the running backs coach after serving as linebackers coach his first two seasons (2008-09). The 2015 Wildcats' backfield was led by junior Dalton Crossan, who rumbled for 885 yards on 172 carries (5.1 yards/rush) and 13 of UNH's 19 rushing TDs. In 2014, the Wildcats' running game finished top three in the CAA in rushing offense for the third straight year (169.5 yards/game). Senior Nico Steriti, who gained All-CAA honors for the third straight year, ranked first in the CAA with 14 rushing TDs. In 2013, the Wildcats featured a running game led by Steriti, who garnered All-CAA Second Team for the second consecutive year and became the first UNH back since 2002 to eclipse 1,000 rushing yards; the 'Cats ranked third in rushing in the CAA for the second consecutive year.

## ALEX MILLER

## OFFENSIVE LINE/ RUNNING GAME COORDINATOR

In 2016, Alex Miller is in his sixth season as an assistant coach at UNH and fifth year in charge of the entire offensive line. He added the responsibility of run game coordinator in 2016, which puts him in command of game-planning all running plays. In 2015, Miller mentored a unit that did not use the same starting lineup more than two games in a row the entire season and dealt with an injury that held 2014 All-CAA Second Team guard Tad McNeely to only two games. In his first season at left tackle, Austin Heter earned All-CAA First Team and All-New England Team accolades in his senior campaign. In 2014, the offensive line helped UNH rank second in the CAA in scoring (36.0 points/game), third in both rushing offense (169.5 yards/game) and pass offense (269.0 yards/game). Led by All-CAA First Team Mike Coccia and Second Team Tad McNeely, the Wildcat offensive line ranked third in the CAA in sacks against (1.93 per game). Prior to joining the Wildcats, Miller served a three-year tenure at the University of Oregon. As a student-athlete, Miller starred as a center at the University of Massachusetts, where he was feted as an All-America in his senior campaign.

## CHRIS ZARKOSKIE

## TIGHT ENDS

Chris Zarkoskie is in his second season as tight ends coach in 2016. Under his tutelage, junior Jordan Powell enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2015. Powell hauled in 46 receptions (tied for second on team) for a team-leading 461 yards (10.0 yards/catch) and five TD grabs, which also led the team. He worked with the football program in 2014 as a strength & conditioning intern for the UNH athletic department. Zarkoskie attended the fifth annual NFL and NCAA Coaches Academy in February 2015. He was the recipient of CAA football's inaugural Chuck Boone Leadership Award in spring 2013 for embodying the highest standards of leadership, integrity, teamwork and sportsmanship in his academic and athletic achievements.

## CHRIS SETIAN

## RUNNING BACKS

Chris Setian is in his first season as running backs coach in 2016. Setian was a four-year letterwinner for the Wildcats (2010-13) who served as a co-captain during his senior season when he ranked second on the team with 458 rushing yards (on 90 carries) and tied for the team lead with eight rushing TDs to earn the coveted Bill Bowes Coaches Award. Setian was a two-time winner of the CAA Commissioner's Academic Award and a two-time member of the CAA Academic All-Conference Team. Setian spent a year as an offensive coaching intern under the direction of former UNH assistant coach Joe Conlin at Yale University (2014) for the No. 1 offense in FCS football. He was the interim running backs coach that spring before joining the UNH staff in a non-coaching capacity in 2015.

## JOHN LYONS

## DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR/DEFENSIVE BACKS

The 2015 season marks John Lyons' sixth as defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach for the Wildcats. Lyons, the second-winningest head football coach in Dartmouth College history, was hired Jan. 21, 2011. He was inducted into the Northwest Catholic (Conn.) High School Hall of Fame on April 27, 2013. In 2015, Lyons oversaw an opportunistic defensive unit that recovered 11 fumbles and tallied 12 interceptions to help the 'Cats to a +6 turnover margin (No. 3 in CAA). Junior CB Casey DeAndrade tied for second in the league in passes defended. Led by junior DE Cam Shorey, the stout defense racked up 31 sacks (No. 3 in CAA) and boasted the league's third-ranked red zone defense (76.7 %). Shorey tied for fourth in the league with a team-high 7.5 sacks. In the 2014 national statistics, UNH ranked 22nd in scoring defense (21.2 points allowed per game), 15th in sacks (2.79/game) and 17th in turnovers gained (27), which included 15th in fumbles recovered (13). In the CAA, the Wildcats were No. 2 in scoring defense and No. 3 in passing efficiency defense. UNH's secondary was led by All-America honoree Casey DeAndrade, a sophomore corner back who was one of six 'Cats to receive All-Conference recognition. In 2011, LB Matt Evans won the Buck Buchanan Award as the nation's top defensive player – the first Wildcat to ever accomplish that feat. As head coach at Dartmouth (1992-2004), Lyons earned 60 career wins and two Ivy League titles ('92, '96). He was named the 1996 Division I N.E. Coach of the Year by the Gridiron Club of Boston. Lyons worked at Kimball Union Academy as football coach (2005-10) and A.D. (2008-10). He spent three years (2005-07) in NFL Europe with the Cologne Centurions. He served as defensive coordinator at Boston U. (1985-87) and at his alma mater, Penn ('84). He played three years for the Quakers and was an All-Ivy League Second-Team selection.

## SCOTT JAMES

## SAFETIES

Scott James, a native of Eliot, Maine, is in his fourth season as safeties coach in 2016. Last season, James oversaw a senior-laden group that featured Hayden Knudson, Lamar Edmonds, Daniel Rowe and Keith Parkinson, all of whom ranked among the Top 11 on the team in total tackles. In the 2014 season, UNH's safeties helped the defensive unit to a No. 3 ranking in the CAA in pass defense efficiency. Three of coach James' protégés ranked in the top seven on the team in tackles. Daniel Rowe led the safeties and was third overall with 70 tackles; Nick Cefalo tied for fifth (67) and Hayden Knudson tied for seventh with 44. Senior Manny Asam led the way for James' safeties in 2013; he was tabbed to the All-Conference Third Team after finishing the season third in tackles with 101, as well as eight pass breakups.

## PETER McCARTY

## DEFENSIVE LINE

Peter McCarty, who has been coaching for over 30 years, is in his third season as defensive line coach in 2016. The 2015 Wildcats' defense ranked third in the CAA with 31 sacks. Junior DE Cam Shorey collected 7.5 sacks and 12.5 TFL to rank fifth in the league in both departments, and senior DT Jullian Turner added 11.0 TFL (10th in CAA). In 2014, McCarty helped guide the UNH defense to a CAA-best 39 sacks. Led by All-CAA Second Team selection Cody Muller and All-CAA Third Team Matt Kaplan, the defense ranked second in the CAA and 22nd nationally in scoring defense (21.2 points/game). Muller ranked second in the CAA in fumbles recovered (four), fifth in sacks (10.0), and eighth in tackles for loss (13.0), while Kaplan ranked ninth in tackles for loss (12.0). McCarty's extensive coaching experience at the college level includes stops at Stanford, Georgia Tech, Maryland, Illinois, Syracuse, Cornell, Western Michigan, Central Florida and Holy Cross.

## GARRETT GILLICK

## LINEBACKERS

Garrett Gillick is in his third year as the linebackers coach at UNH in 2016. Last season, Gillick's understudy Akil Anderson earned All-CAA Third Team and Wildcat team defensive MVP norethynodrel Gillick's tutelage in the 2014 season, both Akil Anderson and Shane McNeely earned CAA All-Conference honors as they ranked 1-2 on the team in tackles with 82 and 75, respectively. The linebacking corps helped UNH rank second in the CAA in scoring defense (21.2 points/game). Prior to coming to Durham, Gillick had a three-season stint (2011-13) at Bentley University, including two years as defensive line coach and one year (2013) as secondary coach.

## KYLE McALLISTER

## DEFENSIVE LINE ASSISTANT

Kyle McAllister is in his third season as the assistant defensive line coach at UNH in 2016. The 2015 Wildcats' defense ranked third in the CAA with 31 sacks. Junior DE Cam Shorey collected 7.5 sacks and 12.5 TFL to rank fifth in the league in both departments, and senior DT Jullian Turner added 11.0 TFL (10th in CAA). In 2014, McAllister helped lead a D-Line that earned the CAA's No. 2 ranking for scoring defense (21.2 points/game). The 'Cats racked up a league-leading 39 sacks, which ranked 15th nationally. Senior defensive end Cody Muller tallied 10.0 sacks and added four fumble recoveries to lead the front four.
