The Basics: The University of Northern Iowa football program will hit the road this week to take on the South Dakota State Jackrabbits on Oct. 24. The game is set to kick off at 2 p.m. in Brookings, S.D.

About South Dakota State: South Dakota State enters the game 5-1 overall and 2-1 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. The Jackrabbits have faced three top-25 ranked teams in their last three games, defeating No. 19 Indiana State (24-7) and No. 11 Youngstown State (38-8). SDSU is ranked first in the league in scoring defense, only allowing 16.8 points per game and is sitting at No. 3 in the MVFC in scoring offense, putting up 33.2 points per game heading into the contest against the Panthers.

Panther Quick Hits:

- UNI enters the week ranked No. 22 in the STATS and No. 25 in the FCS Coaches top-25 polls.
- Senior Deiondre' Hall has been named to the 2015 STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Watch List.
- The Panthers have 75 wins over top-25 opponents and 18 over top-10 opponents since 2001.
- UNI made its 17th FCS playoff appearance in 2014, defeating Stephen F. Austin in the first round.
- Head Coach Mark Farley is in his 15th season at the helm with an overall record of 122-60 and 73-34 in conference play, making him the all-time coaching wins leader in the MVFC.
- The 2015 season marks the 40th year in the UNI-Dome. The Panthers are 197-51-1 all-time inside the historic facility.
- Finished the year in the top-25 in 11 of the last 14 seasons after ending 2014 ranked No. 10 in both polls.
- Has had 41 first-team All-MVFC selections since 2007, the most in the league.

Head Coach: Mark Farley
Alma Mater: UNI, 1986
Record at UNI: 122-60
15th Season

UNI head coach Mark Farley, once known as the “walk on from Waukon”, has led the Panthers to a mark of 122-60 in his 14 years at the helm of the program.

In Missouri Valley Football Conference play, Farley has guided the Panthers to a record of 73-34 for an impressive .682 winning percentage in league play. Farley is the MVFC’s all-time coaching wins leader with 73 league victories.

Included in that 14-year run for Farley and the Panthers are seven conference championships, eight playoff appearances, 11 top-25 final rankings, three national semifinal appearances and one national title game appearance in 2005. Farley holds the UNI record for postseason coaching victories with 11. He is 11-8 all-time in the FCS playoffs.

The Panthers reached its eighth FCS Playoff appearance and 11th top-25 final ranking under the direction of Farley in 2014 after a record breaking season on and off the field. Farley saw six different athletes get named to seven different All-America squads and 13 earn All-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors. During the 2014 season, Farley led the Panthers to wins over then undefeated Illinois State and North Dakota State, ending the Bison’s 33-game winning streak.

Out of UNI’s 13 All-MVFC selections, Farley was key in the development of All-American running back David Johnson, who broke 15 school records during the 2014 season. Johnson was named to four separate All-America squads his senior year, including earning the title of College Football Performance Awards All-Purpose Performer of the Year. On the defensive side of the ball, Farley oversaw the Panther corps earn a top-15 ranking in the FCS in eight different categories, including a No. 3 ranking in team sacks.

The Series: UNI is currently 28-19-2 all-time against South Dakota State and 6-3 in the Mark Farley era. The Jackrabbits are on a two-game winning streak against the Panthers, but UNI has picked up a win in six of the last nine games in the series that dates back to 1935.

Last Time against the Jackrabbits: UNI fell to South Dakota State in the UNI-Dome last season on a last minute field goal, securing a 31-28 lead for the Jackrabbits. The Panthers rallied late in the game after trailing by 14 points in the fourth quarter, tying it 28-28 after a David Johnson touchdown and a Ray Mitchell pick-six, but it wasn’t enough to overcome SDSU. In the last two contests against the Jackrabbits, the game has been decided by a total of six points (2013 - L, 37-34 2OT; 2014 - L, 31-28).

Tough Teams: The game against South Dakota State will mark the fifth game this season that the Panthers have faced a top-25 team. It marks the second year in a row that UNI has had five-or-more ranked opponents during the regular season. The most ranked opponents in a total season for UNI was eight during the 1996 season.

Performer of the Year: Junior quarterback has been added to the College Football Performance Awards FCS National Performer of the Year Watch List. Bailey is one of 32 athletes that have been named to the list.

Pick-Six Record: Senior corner back Deiondre’ Hall broke the school record for interception returns for touchdowns against Western Illinois (10/17). In the third quarter against the Fighting Leathernecks, Hall picked off Trenton Norvell and returned it for 32 yards to the end zone. He now has four-career pick-sixes, passing Ray Mitchell (Free Safety, 2013-14), who had three in his career at UNI. His four career pick-sixes also ranks him No. 2 in all of Division I football out of active career leaders.

Good Hand: Deiondre’ Hall has continued his outstanding senior campaign and continued to do it with a cast on his hand. Hall has moved into seventh all-time at UNI in career interception return yards (197) and ninth all-time in career interceptions (10). He is ranked first in the MVFC in interceptions per game this season and No. 11 in the FCS. The senior is also ranked No. 5 in the FCS in active career leaders for total interceptions.

Forcing Turnovers: Brett McMakin leads the MVFC this season and is ranked No. 5 in the FCS in forced fumbles. He recorded one against Western Illinois (10/17), giving him seven in his career, tying him for seventh all-time at UNI. It also ranks him first in FCS active career leaders in the category along with him being first in career forced fumbles per game.

Completing the Move: After his 12 completions against Western Illinois (10/17), Sawyer Kollmorgen is now ranked No. 5 all-time at UNI in career completions. He has racked up 490 in his time at UNI, passing Steve Sandon (1978-81), who had 488.

Accuracy Counts: After breaking the school record in points during the 2014 season, senior placekicker Michael Schmadeke continues to add to his scoreboard. He is still the FCS active career leader for field goal percentage (.865) and field goals made per game (1.52). He currently leads the team in points with 31 this season (5-8 FG, 16-17 PAT).

Homecoming: Since 1920, UNI has recorded a mark of 63-26-7 in Homecoming games. The Panthers have won 22 of their last 28 Homecoming contests in the UNI-Dome

Good Company: Deiondre' Hall joins 24 other defensive student-athletes that have been named to the STATS FCS Defensive Player of the Year Award Watch List and is one of four athletes representing the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

40 Great Years: The 2015 season marks the 40th year of the UNI-Dome. With the Panthers currently holding a 197-51-1 record inside the UNI-Dome, just three shy of the 200-win mark, it is safe to say that tradition has thrived in the building that was constructed in 1976. UNI has gone undefeated at home in a season eight times since 1990, including four seasons under the direction of Mark Farley. The Panthers are also 78-14 in home Missouri Valley Football Conference games.

Conference Play: UNI currently holds a 145-56 overall record in the MVFC and 73-34 record during the Farley era. Farley's 73 league wins is the most by a head coach in Missouri Valley Football Conference history.

Week 5 Awards: Brett McMakin was named MVFC Defensive Player of the Week for the second time this season for his performance against North Dakota State (10/10) and also earned STATS FCS National Defensive Player of the Week honors. He racked up a game-high 13 tackles, forced two fumbles and came away with a key interception during an NDSU redzone attack.

Finding a Weakness: Heading into the weekend of Oct. 10, North Dakota State was ranked No. 1 in the FCS in rushing defense, had only allowed a total of 163 yards on the ground through four games and was only allowing an average of 40 yards rushing per game. Against the Bison, UNI racked up a season-high 277 rushing yards, averaging 7.3 yards per rush. The Panthers scored three rushing touchdowns (Malloy, 1-yd TD, Miller, 7-yd TD, Bailey (83-yd TD) with NDSU only allowing two rushing touchdowns prior to Saturday's game.

Moving Up: Sawyer Kollmorgen is now fifth all-time at UNI in passing touchdowns after his 67-yard passing touchdown to Daurice Fountain against NDSU (10/10). He has 49 total passing touchdowns in his career.

Mistakes Happen: North Dakota State was one of five schools heading into last weekend that hadn't thrown an interception. In UNI's game against the NDSU Bison (10/10), the Panthers forced quarterback Carson Wentz to throw two interception after going for 143 consecutive passing attempts untouched. Tim Kilfoy (returned 60 yards to set up touchdown) and Brett McMakin (interception on UNI 9-yard-line to stop redzone attack) both notched turnovers against North Dakota State.

Explosive Plays: Sawyer Kollmorgen's 67-yard pass to Daurice Fountain in the first quarter against North Dakota State (10/10) was the longest passing play of the season and his second-longest career pass. He threw a 70-yard pass against Iowa in 2014.

High Rankings: The Panthers have six players ranked in the top-25 in the FCS in their individual statistics through three games this season.

Losing Yardage: UNI racked up 12 tackles for loss against the Redbirds, tying for third all-time at UNI (12 vs. North Dakota State, 2013). Isaac Ales finished the game against Illinois State with three, giving him 31.0 in his career to rank him fifth all-time as a Panther.

Five For Five: Karter Schult scored a career-high 10 tackles against Illinois State, including a staggering five tackles for a loss of 18 yards. His 5.0 TFL was just 0.5 shy of tying the school record for tackles for loss in a game. John Hermann holds the record at 5.5 against Northern Arizona in 2005.

Week 3 Awards: UNI secured both the MVFC Defensive Player of the Week and Newcomer of the Week selections for the second consecutive week. Aaron Bailey was named Newcomer of the Week while Brett McMakin earned defensive honors for their performances against Cal Poly (9/19).

He's Got the Smart: Senior defensive lineman Isaac Ales was named a semifinalist for the 2015 William V. Campbell Trophy. The award is given to the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the country. He is one of 135 student-athletes still in the running for the award.

Back To Back: UNI posted back-to-back wins against non-conference top-25 teams for the first time since the 2008 playoffs (Maine, New Hampshire). UNI won its home opener against No. 7 Eastern Washington (9/12) and then defeated No. 17 Cal Poly (9/19) on the road.

Red Zone Running: Running back Savon Huggins scored his first rushing touchdown of the season against Cal Poly (9/19), putting UNI up 7-0 early in the first quarter. It was his second of the season, notching a receiving score against Iowa State (9/5).

Timing is Key: All three of UNI's first three scoring drives against Cal Poly (9/19) were exactly seven plays long each, all under three minutes of total possession time. With the Panthers' new no-huddle offense in full force, UNI hasn't had a scoring possession over 4:00.

Receiving Praise: Daurice Fountain finished the game against Cal Poly (9/19) with a career-high 123 receiving yards on eight catches. The last time UNI had a 100-yard receiver in a game prior to Cal Poly was Oct. 19, 2013 when Chad Owens had 107 yards through the air.

High Totals: Three Panther defenders posted career-highs in tackles in the win against Cal Poly (9/19) as Jared Farley and D'Shawn Dexter tallied 13 and 12 tackles respectively while Brett McMakin finished with a game-high 15 tackles.

UNI in Non-Conference: UNI has the most victories among league members over top-25 non-conference opponents with 33 since 1985.

Top-10 Wins: UNI has 18 wins over top-10 ranked teams since 2001, including five in the last two seasons. Illinois State is one of three teams on UNI's schedule this season ranked in the top-10 in both the STATS and FCS Coaches polls.

Numbers Speak: UNI is 87-7 in the Mark Farley era (2001-present) when holding the opposition to 20 points or less. The Panthers are 78-6 in the Farley years when scoring 30 or more points in a game. UNI had won 15 consecutive games when holding the opposition to 20 points or less prior to the game against Illinois State in 2013.

Week 2 Awards: Senior Deiondre' Hall was named the College Sports Madness National Defensive Player of the Week and the MVFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance against Eastern Washington (9/12). Junior quarterback Aaron Bailey was also selected as the MVFC Newcomer of the Week.

Dual Threat: Aaron Bailey finished the game with 134 rushing yards against Eastern Washington (9/12). The last time UNI had a 100-yard rushing quarterback performance prior to Eastern Washington was on Nov. 19, 2011 when Tirrell Rennie rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries in UNI's win over Illinois State.

Dynamic Duo: Aaron Bailey (134 rushing yards) and Darrian Miller (112 rushing yards) combined for 246 of UNI's 266 rushing yards against the Eagles (9/12). The last time UNI had two 100+ yard rushers in a game was on Sept. 24, 2011 against Western Illinois (David Johnson and Tirrell Rennie)

Two for Seven: Michael Malloy and Logan Cunningham both scored their first-career touchdowns against the Eagles (9/12), two of five touchdowns scored in the high scoring game.

Helping Hand: Deiondre' Hall tied the school record for interception returns for touchdowns against Eastern Washington (9/12) with his pick-six in the fourth quarter. He now has three total in his career, tying former safety Ray Mitchell (2013-14).

Top Wins: The Panthers currently have 75 wins over top-25 ranked opponents. In the past two seasons, five of those 75 victories were against top-10 ranked foes with wins over No. 9 McNeese State (9/28/13), No. 9 Youngstown State (11/9/13), No. 6 Illinois State (11/1/14, No. 1 North Dakota State (11/8/14) and No. 7 Eastern Washington (9/12/15)

Starting Right: UNI saw six players on offense (Aaron Bailey, Daurice Fountain, Tyvis Smith, Jacob Appleman, Bryce Sweeney, Chris Schleuger) and three on defense (Jordan Webb, De'Angelo Jennings, Adam Reth) notch their first career starts against Iowa State (Sept. 5).

Dual Threat: Aaron Bailey made his starting debut for the Panthers against Iowa State (Sept. 5), finishing the game with 114 passing yards and 85 yards on the ground. The junior, a transfer from Illionis, effectively found holes in the Cyclone defense, leading the team in rushing yards and carries (22).

Back At It: Senior wide receiver Rod Hall played in his first football game since 2011 when the Panthers faced off against Iowa State (Sept. 5). For the past four years, Hall has been the starting point guard for the Clemson Tigers, but with one last year of eligibility left, he decided to go back to the gridiron for one last season of football.

High Rank: Since 1985, UNI has been the only MVFC teams ranked in a pre-season or regular-season poll every season. The Panthers finished last season 9-5 overall and ranked No. 10 in both the Coaches and Sports Network poll.
