- UNI and South Dakota State have never met in the postseason. The Panthers won their last contest against SDSU, 38-18, back on Oct. 14 against the then seventh-ranked Jackrabbits.
- UNI has won six out of the last nine meetings in Brookings.
- Head coach Mark Farley is 8-4 all-time against SDSU.
- Last time out, UNI blew out Monmouth in the first round of the FCS Playoffs, 46-7.
- Junior Eli Dunne led UNI, with 260 yards passing and four touchdowns in his first FCS Playoff appearance at quarterback for the Panthers.
- The Panthers have scored back-to-back 40-point games for the first time since Nov. 21 and Nov. 28.

SERIES WITH SOUTH DAKOTA STATE

- UNI holds a 30-20 advantage over South Dakota State, with the Panthers winning six out of the last nine meetings in Brookings.
- The Panthers upset the Jackrabbits earlier this season, after beating SDSU 38-18 on the road to begin their turnaround.
- Since the win against SDSU this season, the Panthers have won six out of their last seven games down the stretch.
- The Panthers and Jackrabbits have never met in postseason play.

SCOUTING THE JACKRABBITS

- South Dakota State earned the fifth seed in the FCS Playoffs after finishing the season 9-2 overall and winning five-straight games to close out the season.
- UNI handed SDSU its last defeat on Oct. 14 after trouncing the Jackrabbits, 38-18.
- Although the Jackrabbits have won five-straight games, their last two contests have each been decided by three points.
- SDSU is led by quarterback Taryn Christion, who has thrown for 2,854 yards and 28 touchdowns.

UNI VERSUS THE MVFC IN THE FCS PLAYOFFS

- Against current MVFC members, the Panthers are 1-3 overall.
- UNI lost its last postseason contest to a Valley member, after North Dakota State ended the Panthers playoff run in 2015.

PANTHERS IN THE PLAYOFFS

- UNI is 24-20 all-time in postseason play and 23-18 in the FCS Playoffs. Overall the Panthers have made 21 postseason appearances and 19 FCS playoff berths.
- The Panthers are 18-5 at the UNI-Dome in postseason action, having won their last four contests and not losing since 2010's defeat to Lehigh (14-7).

FARLEY EARNS 10TH FCS PLAYOFF APPEARANCE

- Over his 17 seasons at UNI, head coach Mark Farley has led the Panthers to 10 FCS Playoff appearances overall, which tops the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Among coaches at their current schools, Farley has outpaced the pack, with only John Stiegelmeier at South Dakota State coming close with his seven appearances at South Dakota State.

PANTHER DEFENSE VERSUS THE RUN

- Last season, the UNI defense held opponents to 119.7 yards per game to rank 16th in the FCS.
- The Panthers rank 29th in the country this season, allowing 124.3 yards on the ground per game.
- This week's foe South Dakota State owns the 38th-ranked rushing attack, earning 176.8 yards on the ground per game.

PANTHERS AGAINST THE PASS

- The Panther defense has allowed a total of 235.0 yards passing per game this season, to rank 87th overall in the FCS.
- UNI has given up 20 passing touchdowns this season, with four coming against Cal Poly.
- This week's opponent South Dakota State is ranked 17th overall in the FCS for passing yards per game, collecting 272.3 per contest.

ALL-VALLEY PANTHERS

- UNI earned 10 All-MVFC selections on Monday, with four first-teamers in Elijah Campbell (FS), Jared Farley (LB), Daurice Fountain (WR) and Adam Reth (DE).
- The Panthers had three student-athletes earned second team honors, with Lee Carhart
 (C), Sam Kuhter (P) and Rickey Neal (DE) earning spots while Briley Moore (TE), Malcolm
 Washington (CB) and Marcus Weymiller (RB) claimed honorable mention.
- The four first-team selections were the most for UNI since 2015's five.

CLUTCH CATS

- This season, the Panthers have been extremely efficient in the red zone with UNI scoring on
 44 out of 47 attempts. UNI is first in the FCS for that category.
- UNI has earned the majority of its red zone scores through the air, with 19 passing TDs inside the 20. That total is tied for fourth in the FCS.

NO FLY ZONE

- The Panthers have earned 20 interceptions this season, with the bulk of those (13) coming in the last five games for UNI.
- Opposing quarterbacks have thrown seven multi-interception games against the Panthers, with UNI earning five-straight contests with at least two picks.
- Freshman Xavior Williams has collected one interception in four-straight games, while Nikholi Jaghai has snagged three picks in the last two games.

PANTHER RECORD WATCH

- For his career, wide receiver Daurice Fountain is fourth all-time in catches (147), sixth
 all-time in receiving touchdowns (22) and ninth all-time receiving yards (2.049). Fountain is
 tied for fifth all-time in single-season receiving touchdowns (11) and is one reception and 78
 yards shy of cracking the top-10 for catches (63) and yards (915) in a season.
- Junior quarterback Eli Dunne is 10th all-time for career passing touchdowns (32), while his 25 touchdowns through the air this season is tied for fifth-most in a single season. Dunne has also completed 198 passes this season, which rank seventh-most at UNI.
- Senior linebacker Jared Farley is tied for eighth all-time at UNI for career tackles (303).

WEYMILLER'S COMEBACK

- Over the last seven games, Marcus Weymiller has earned 750 yards rushing on 187 carries and eight touchdowns. Weymiller had not run the ball this season before the Oct. 14's game against South Dakota State.
- The 42 carries for Weymiller against SDSU in his first game back with the Panthers rank as the most by any player in the FCS this season.
- Weymiller also became the first Panther back since David Johnson to earn at least two 170yard rushing performances for his career. The back-to-back 100-yard rushing games for Weymiller are the first for a Panther since Aaron Bailey in 2015.

FOUNTAIN LEAPS INTO RECORD BOOKS

- Senior Daurice Fountain has put up monster numbers in his final season at UNI. The 6-foot-2 receiver has hauled in 11 touchdowns this season, with 915 yards receiving.
- This season, Fountain has earned four 100-yard receiving games, with the most recent coming against Monmouth.
- The senior has 147 catches as a Panther, which ranks fourth all-time, while his 22 career touchdowns rank sixth all-time at UNI. Additionally, Fountain is ranked ninth all-time at UNI with 2,049 receiving yards in his career.
- For a single season, Fountain is tied for the fifth-most receiving touchdowns (11) in UNI history.

MULTI-TOUCHDOWN GAMES FOR DUNNE

- Dunne has earned 11 multi-touchdown games for his career, with eight coming in 2017.
- The junior has thrown four touchdowns three times this season, with Dunne earning four against Cal Poly, Western Illinois and Monmouth.

NEAL SACKS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- Junior Rickey Neal earned a career-high 3.5 sacks for UNI as the Panthers sacked Youngstown State a total of 10 times back on Oct. 21.
- The 10 sacks were one shy of UNI's single-game record, while the number is tied for the most in the FCS this season since Eastern Washington recorded 10 quarterback take downs against Fordham on Sept. 16.
- Neal's 3.5 sacks against YSU is tied for fourth most in one game this season by any FCS player and ranks first for MVFC players.

BROOKINS' BREAKOUT

- Redshirt senior and Wisconsin transfer Keelon Brookins has made an impact for the Panthers over the last few weeks. The defensive back/linebacker hybrid has earned 28 tackles, 3.0 sacks, four pass breakups and two interceptions.
- Brookins' interception return for a score helped vault the Panthers past No. 6 South Dakota 34-29 on Nov. 4, while also helping the senior claim the MVFC Defensive and Newcomer Player of the Week honors.

FARLEY NAMED CAMPBELL SEMIFINALIST

- Senior linebacker Jared Farley was named a semifinalist for the 2017 William V. Campbell Trophy late September, which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.
- Farley is one of 181 semifinalists the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) has chosen for the award. The Cedar Falls native is also one of 36 representing the FCS and one of seven from the MVFC.
- The senior is the ninth Panther to be named a semifinalist for this "academic Heisman", joining James Lindgren (2006), Chad Rinehart (2007), Josh Mahoney (2009), Ben Boothby (2011), Kyle Bernard (2012), David Johnson (2012), Isaac Ales (2015) and Karter Schult (2016).

UNI CLOSES REGULAR SEASON AT NO. 20/21 IN POLLS

- UNI continued its climb in the STATS FCS Top 25 to close the regular season, as the Panthers
 jumped up four spots to No. 20 overall.
- The Panthers finally cracked the top 25 for the FCS Coaches Poll, after spending the last few weeks receiving votes.
- The Panthers have defeated two teams from this week's FCS Coaches Poll, No. 6 South Dakota State (No. 7 on Oct. 9) and No. 18 South Dakota (No. 6 on Nov. 4).
- Overall, UNI has played against five teams currently ranked in the FCS Coaches Poll Top 25 with No. 4 North Dakota State, No. 6 South Dakota State, No. 10 Western Illinois, No. 13 Southern Utah, No. 18 South Dakota and after this Saturday, No. 23 Monmouth.

PANTHERS AGAINST RANKED FOES

- UNI has 85 wins over Top-25 opponents all-time and 23 over Top-10 foes.
- In 2016, the Panthers were 1-5 against ranked teams. Four of the five ranked losses (No. 14 Montana, No. 8 Eastern Washington, No. 11 Youngstown State, No. 4 North Dakota State) were decided by an average 4.5-point margin.
- This season, the Panthers are 4-2 after wins over No. 6 South Dakota, No. 7 South Dakota State, No. 9 Youngstown State and No. 23 Monmouth.

FARLEY CLAIMS MVFC DEFENSIVE POW HONORS

- After a stellar game against Cal Poly, senior linebacker Jared Farley earned MVFC Defensive Player of the Week honors.
- With the game tied at 7-7, Farley scooped up a fumble and took it 48 yards to put the Panthers ahead. The return was Farley's first of his career, while the fumble recovery was his fifth at UNI.
- Farley finished the game posting II total tackles, with four solos and seven assists as well as
 one tackle for a loss.
- Farley has won Defensive POW honors twice as a Panther. The last time came after his sensational game against lowa State during last season's 25-20 victory.

COACH FARLEY CONTINUES RECORD WIN TOTAL

- After defeating the Cyclones last season, head coach Mark Farley set the program record for career wins at UNI. The win over lowa State gave Farley 130 for his career at UNI, before finishing the season at 134.
- In addition to being UNI's all-time winningest coach, Farley also holds the most league wins
 in MVFC history after earning an impressive 83-38 mark over his storied coaching career.

TOP OF THE LEAGUE

 UNI has had 5I student-athletes named to the MVFC All-Conference First Team since 2007, the most in the league. Last season, Karter Schultz continued the tradition after claiming First Team All-MVFC honors following his sensational final season with the Panthers.

PRESEASON ALL-MVFC

- UNI is represented by seven members on the 2017 Missouri Valley Football Conference's preseason squad. Senior defensive back Malcolm Washington and senior linebacker Jared Farley were each named to the first team heading into the 2017 season.
- The Panthers posted a league-high five members on the honorable mention preseason All-MVFC Team. Sophomore running back Trevor Allen, junior offensive lineman Cal Twait, senior defensive back Elijah Campbell, senior punter Sam Kuhter and sophomore return specialist Jalen Rima were all named as honorable mention selections to the preseason squad.





UNI head coach Mark Farley, once known as the "walk on from Waukon", has led the Panthers to a mark of 134-67 in his 16 years at the helm of the program.

Entering his 17th season as the head coach of the UNI Panthers, Farley is eager to lead a mixture of energized youth and veteran student-athletes to new heights in 2017.

In Missouri Valley Football Conference play, Farley has guided the Panthers to a record of 82-38 for an impressive .683 winning percentage in league play. Farley is the MVFC's all-time coaching wins leader with 82 league victories.

Included in that 16-year run for Farley and the Panthers are seven conference championships, nine playoff appearances, 12 top-25 final rankings, three national semifinal appearances and one national title game appearance in 2005. Farley holds the UNI record for postseason coaching victories with 13 with an overall playoff record of 13-9.

Through his leadership, the Panthers returned to the glory days when they won seven straight conference titles and made seven consecutive FCS playoff ap-

pearances in the decade of the '90s. In Farley's 16 years at the helm, UNI has won at least a share of seven Missouri Valley Football Conference titles. UNI has also advanced to the quarterfinals (2003, 2007, 2011, 2015), semifinals (2001, 2008) and the national title game (2005) in seven of those nine playoff appearances. Twelve of Farley's 16 previous Panther teams have finished the season rank in the top-25, defeating 80 top-25 ranked foes in the process.

The Panthers kicked off the 2016 season with a win over lowa State, giving Farley 130 career victories, making him the all-time coaching wins leader at UNI. He passed former head coach Stan Sheriff, with whom he tied the record in 2015 with UNI's playoff win over No. 5 Portland State, giving him 129. Despite finishing the 2016 season 5-6 overall, UNI ended the season ranked in the top-35 in the FCS in 18 different statistical categories. UNI faced off against six top-25 ranked opponents throughout the year, beating #19 Western Illinois on the road and was one of just 10 FCS teams to beat an FBS opponent in 2016.

AMES, lowa – Despite a hard-fought effort in front of a hostile crowd of 61,500, the Northern lowa Panthers (D-1) fell to the lowa State Cyclones (1-0) 42-24 to open the season on Saturday night in Ames.

UNI took an early 7-0 lead after scoring on the opening drive, but turnovers shifted the momentum to ISU as the Cyclones took a 21-10 lead into halftime. ISU would push the advantage to as much as 35-10, but the Panthers stormed back to outscore the Cyclones 14-7 over the last 16:36 of the game.

UNI finished the game with 378 yards of total offense, to ISU's 405. The Panthers and Cyclones were almost neck-and-neck in every other statically category with UNI rushing for 119 yards and throwing it for 259 yards.

Junior Eli Dunne finished Saturday's opener going 23-for-38 for 259 yards, while throwing three touchdowns and three interceptions. Sophomore Trevor Allen was the overall leading rusher in the game, going for 87 yards on the ground.

Three different receivers caught touchdown passes for the Panthers as Isaiah Weston (four catches, 72 yards), Jaylin James (three catches, 44 yards) and Aaron Graham (two catches, 24 yards) all had scores.

On the defensive side, Jared Farley was the leading tackler with 14 stops while Duncan Ferch finished the game with nine tackles and an interception.

CEDAR FALLS, lowa – Propelled by career days from quarterback Eli Dunne and wide receiver Daurice Fountain, the 21st-ranked Northern lowa Panthers (1-1) defeated Cal Poly (0-3) in a shootout, 45-38, to open the home slate on a high note.

Dunne and Fountain connected for three scores – including the game winner – as the Panthers earned their first overtime victory since 2011 (Nov. 19 at Illinois State).

Dunne finished the game going 25-for-40 with 325 yards passing and four touchdowns through the air. The four scores were the most for Dunne since tossing three last week against lowa State.

Fountain capped his stellar game after catching five passes, for 75 yards and three touchdowns. The senior recorded his second game with three touchdown grabs, matching 2016's total against Southern Illinois.

UNI out gained Cal Poly through the air (325-238), but the Mustangs controlled the ground attack (305-94).

On the defensive side, linebacker Duncan Ferch finished with a career-high 15 total tackles to lead both teams on Saturday. Defensive end Adam Reth turned in a stellar performance as well, making 14 stops.

CEDAR CITY, Utah – Despite a valiant effort on the road, No. 18 Northern Iowa (1-2) fell to Southern Utah (2-1) in a tight contest, 24-21.

The game was tied, 21-21 until SUU made a 26-yard field goal with 1:50 remaining as the Thunderbirds hung on to win the game, 24-21.

The Thunderbirds jumped out to a 14-D lead to begin action on Saturday, as SUU earned scores on the ground and through the air. SUU would control most of the first half, before Seth Thomas energized the UNI sideline after rumbling to the end zone for a 15-yard interception touchdown.

Trailing, 14-7 in the third quarter the Panther defense sparked UNI once again after Adam Reth's big hit resulted in a sack and strip. The Panthers would turn the fumble into points, following Austin Errthum's 42-yard field goal.

Inching closer and only trailing 14-10, SUU would swing momentum after James Felila scored his second touchdown of the night – this time a 20-yard score – with 4:35 remaining in the third quarter.

Trailing 21-10 late, the Panthers would mount a comeback as UNI scored II-unanswered to tie the game at 21-21. UNI's Dunne would master a seven-play drive to get the Panthers in the end zone, following a 21-yard pass to Trevor Allen. A Jared Farley interception return inside Thunderbird territory would also lead to points as Errthum nailed a 30-yard field goal to knot the score at 21-21.

The Panthers would be in position again for more points following a turnover on downs, but a long, 53-yard field goal from Errthum was blocked and returned to the 17. The Panther defense would hold the Thunderbirds to three points, after a 26-yard field goal, but SUU would hold on to the lead this time for the 24-21 win.

Eli Dunne led the Panthers in Carbondale, after throwing for 266 yards and three scores. Senior Daurice Fountain was Dunne's favorite target on the night, the 6-foot-1 receiver caught seven passes for 106 yards and a touchdown.

The Panther defense did their part as well after holding the Salukis below their season average for yards per game, while also forcing three key turnovers down the stretch. Senior Jared Farley led UNI with nine tackles.

SIU trimmed the UNI lead late in the third quarter after Sam Straub floated it to Darrell James for a 29-yard touchdown. The Panthers would again respond to a Saluki score with one of their own after Trevor Allen juked his way to the end zone following an II-yard pass from Dunne.

A fumble near midfield by the Panthers in the fourth quarter gave SIU a golden opportunity, before the Salukis cashed in the turnover for seven points after Straub found Jacob Varble for a five-vard touchdown.

Three SIU scoring opportunities were halted by turnovers late in the fourth quarter after the Panthers earned a fumble and two interceptions. Korby Sander forced a fumble before Suni Lane picked up the grounder early in the fourth quarter for the first turnover. The two picks came after Jake Hartford snagged a tipped pass, while Malcolm Washington picked off a throw to put the final nail in the coffin with under a minute remaining.

WIU was led by Sean McGuire, who threw for 334 yards and three touchdowns. Jaelon Acklin was his favorite target on the night, catching seven passes for 158 yards and two score.

UNI's Eli Dunne turned in another big passing day, throwing for 342 yards and four touchdowns. With the performance, Dunne is the first Panther quarterback to throw for at least 23 completions, 259 yards and a touchdown in each of his first five games to start a season.

Elias Nissen scored three times for the Panthers – to continue his hot streak at tight end – while Daurice Fountain caught a career-high nine passes for 103 yards.

On the defensive side, senior Jared Farley led the Panthers with a career-high 14 tackles while junior Rickey Neal recorded two key sacks to go along with his seven total tackles.

Trailing 14-5 in the third quarter, the Leathernecks turned a Panther interception into seven points after a Steve McShane's one-yard score. McGuire threw back-to-back touchdowns to give the Leathernecks a 25-14 lead late in the third quarter.

The fourth quarter would see a combined 35 points scored between the two teams, with the Panthers scoring twice to claw their way out of the 25-14 deficit and take a 25-22 lead. The two UNI scores would be on 18 and 16-yard passes from Dunne that found Nissen and Aaron Graham.

With only 1:12 remaining in the game, WIU would march down the field and earn a go-ahead score with six seconds left as McGuire and Acklin hooked up again – this time from 20 yards out. WIU's Michael Bishoff scooped up a Panther fumble on the ensuing kickoff, bringing the final score to 38-29 in favor of the Leathernecks.

BROOKINGS, S.D. – Propelled by 17D yards rushing from junior Marcus Weymiller, Northern Iowa (3-3, 2-1 MVFC) dominated No. 7 South Dakota State (4-2, 1-2 MVFC) on the road, 38-18.

The Panthers have knocked off a top-10 Jackrabbit team in two out of the last three seasons, with the last also coming in Brookings on Oct. 24, 2015 (10-7). The 20-point win against SDSU ranks as the largest margin of victory over a ranked foe since upsetting No. 1 North Dakota State (23-3) on Nov. 8, 2014.

UNI's Weymiller led the Panthers, with 170 yards rushing and two scores, while Eli Dunne threw two touchdowns through the air for 169 yards passing. The 170 yards for Weymiller were the most for the junior since gaining 171 against Indiana State on Nov. 5, 2016. Weymiller had not carried the ball this season before Saturday's game.

On the defensive side, the Panthers forced three turnovers with Elijah Campbell earning an early interception while Alfonzo Lambert II and Joe Friedrich scooped up two fumbles for UNI.

Despite the cold weather, UNI came out of the gates on fire Saturday to earn an early 17-0 lead after one quarter of play. The Panthers began the scoring with a 41-yard field goal from Sam Drysdale, which was followed by a Christian Jegen one-yard score after Elijah Campbell returned an interception down to the two-yard line.

With the lead at 10-0, the Panthers would break out the "wildcat" as Weymiller raced around the edge for an 11-yard touchdown to end the first-quarter scoring. SDSU responded in the second quarter after Taryn Christion found Jake Wieneke for a touchdown. The first SDSU-kicking miscue of the day would rear its head as the Jackrabbits missed the extra point.

Dunne turned in a pair of touchdowns in the final quarter of Saturday's game, after finding Daurice Fountain and Isaiah Weston for 18 and 11-yard scores. The Jackrabbits made a futile push with the Panthers leading big, to bring the final score tot 38-18 after a two-yard touchdown run late.

.The Panther defense recorded 10 sacks on Saturday, coming within one quarterback take down from tying the program record. The 10 sacks are tied for the most by any FCS team this season, with Eastern Washington also earning 10 against Fordham on Sept. 16.

Junior Rickey Neal earned a career-high 3.5 sacks for UNI, while Keelon Brookins and Hezekiah Applegate added 2.0. Duncan Ferch earned 1.0 sack, along with Elijah Campbell, while Seth Thomas rounded out the stat sheet with a half sack.

UNI held YSU well below its season average for rushing yards, as the Panthers only gave up 47 on the ground. Coming into Saturday, the Penguins sported the ninth-ranked rushing attack and earned 248.5 yards per game.

Junior Marcus Weymiller poured in 133 on the ground for the Panthers, while scoring both of UNI's touchdowns. Weymiller became the first Panther to rush over 100 yards in back-to-back weeks since 2015 when Aaron Bailey achieved the feat against Missouri State (Nov. 14) and Southern Illinois (Nov. 21). Quarterback Eli Dunne had another mistake-free day throwing the ball, with 151 yards on 9-of-20 passing.

Much like last week's upset of No. 7 South Dakota State, the Panthers jumped out to an early lead against their top-10 foe. This time, UNI plowed ahead for a 10-0 lead with 11:31 remaining in the second quarter following Weymiller's 1-yard plunge.

The Penguins bounced back to score a touchdown of their own after a deep throw from Nathan Mays to Damoun Patterson found the end zone. With the lead trimmed to 10-7, UNI went back to Weymiller as he bounced outside for a six-yard score to extend the lead to 16-7 following the failed extra point.

A late surge from the Penguins through the air scored another touchdown – this time from Ricky Davis to Alvin Bailey – for 15 yards. YSU attempted a last gasp outside kick to follow, but Weymiller pounced on the ball and UNI went into the victory formation.

FARGO, N.D. – Despite a strong defensive effort on the road, No. 25 Northern lowa's upset bid fell short against No. 2 North Dakota State as turnovers doomed the Panthers on the road. 30-14.

UNI fell to 4-4 overall and 3-2 in MVC play, while the undefeated Bison extended their record to 8-0 overall and 5-0 in the MVC.

The Panther defense forced two early turnovers against the Bison, while also blocking two first quarter field goals but couldn't cash in on the early opportunities. The UNI defense held NDSU to 28 rushing yards at halftime, before the Bison gained 141 in the second half.

To begin the game, UNI's defense held its own against the No. 2 scoring offense in the FCS as the Panthers picked off NDSU's twice in the first half, while blocking two field goals. Both interceptions were snagged by Elijah Campbell, with Adam Reth knocking down both field goals.

UNI got on the board first, with Dunne lobbing a pass to Fountain in the back of the end zone to go up, 7-0 with II:14 remaining in the second quarter. The Bison defense would earn NDSU's first points of the day, after Robbie Grimsley returned a Dunne interception 27 yards for a touchdown.

Knotted at 7-7 at halftime, NDSU came out of the break and scored on its first drive following an eight-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 22-yard Ty Brooks touchdown run. After the Bison earned their second fumble of the day following a strip of Dunne, NDSU converted the turnover into three points with 7:54 remaining in the third quarter.

With a 17-7 lead, the Bison used a pair of penalties to fuel an eight-play, 93-yard drive that ended with a 31-yard touchdown toss from Stick to RJ Urzendowski. The Bison would miss the extra point, to continue special team woes for NDSU.

The Bison would earn another touchdown after the NDSU offense would be set up at the 26 following a strip sack. The Bison ran in a one-yard score from Bruce Anderson to go up 30-7.

The Panthers wouldn't quit, despite trailing by four scores as UNI struck for a 32-yard touchdown after Dunne found Fountain once again. The score moved Fountain into a tie for eighth all-time at UNI for career touchdown receptions (18).

CEDAR Falls, Iowa – Sparked by three fourth-quarter turnovers, Northern Iowa surged past No. 6 South Dakota as the Panthers stormed into FCS Playoff contention with the 34-29 upset.

The Panthers improved to 5-4 overall and 4-2 in the MVFC, while the Coyotes dropped to 7-2 overall and 4-2 in the MVFC.

Eli Dunne tallied 228 yards through the air on 14 of 24 passing, with both of his touchdown tosses going to freshman Isaiah Weston. The scores for Weston marked the first time this decade the Panthers have had a freshmen wideout score at least two touchdowns in a game.

The defense carried UNI to victory however, as the Panthers earned three crucial turnovers late to keep the Coyotes caged. Jared Farley's fumble recovery set up a Marcus Weymiller eight-yard score, while Keelon Brookins' interception return for a touchdown put the Panthers ahead 34-23 with 2:23 remaining in the game.

USD opened the game with a quick, seven-play drive that ate up only three minutes off the clock as Chris Streveler found Josh Hale for a 16-yard touchdown reception.

The Panthers and Coyotes traded four field goals before UNI finally found the end zone on a 59-yard strike from Dunne to Weston as the score become knotted up at 13-13 with 4:50 remaining in the second quarter. The Coyotes pulled back ahead with 35 seconds remaining after a 33-yard kick sailed through the uprights to give USD a 16-13 lead heading into the locker room.

A short punt set up the Coyotes with a four-play, 46-yard scoring drive as USD's Brett Samson scampered up the middle for an 11-yard touchdown run. With the Panthers trailing 23-13, UNI capped a six-play, 62-yard drive after Dunne found Weston in the back of the end zone for a four-yard score to close out the third quarter.

Trailing late in the fourth quarter, Farley would scoop up a loose ball and return it to the 11-yard line as Weymiller bounced it outside for the go-ahead touchdown with only 3:02 remaining. The Panther defense forced another turnover the following drive, but this time turned it into six points as Brookins sprinted in for a 29-yard touchdown to ignite the home crowd.

USD's Streveler threw a one-yard touchdown to give the Coyotes a glimmer of hope, but that was quickly stomped out after UNI recovered an onside kick to seal the 34-29 win.

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. – Despite losing junior Eli Dunne at quarterback in the first quarter on Saturday, 25th-ranked Northern lowa battled against adversity to claim a 25-10 victory over Missouri State on the road.

Dunne left the game with 5:01 remaining in the first quarter after being hit at the end of a scramble. Fellow junior Colton Howell replaced Dunne under center for the rest of the game.

Howell finished Saturday with 129 yards through the air on 12-of-20 passing in relief. The appearance for Howell was his first since last season's game against Indiana State (Nov. 5, 2016).

The Panthers gained 185 yards on the ground to aid Howell, with Marcus Weymiller leading the way with 131 yards rushing. The 100-yard game was Weymiller's third of the season.

On the defensive side, UNI held MSU to only 215 yards on the day while forcing a key interception that was returned for a touchdown by Elijah Campbell. The Panthers were able to hold MSU's Peyton Husling to 151 yards through the air and 46 yards on the ground, while picking off the Bear QB twice.

Weymiller capped a nine-play, 75-yard drive after walking in from two-yards out to open the game's scoring. The extra point would be missed by the Panthers, with the score at 6-D early. Dunne would be knocked out of the game following a hit late in the first quarter, with junior Howell called off the bench to lead the offense.

Despite missing the extra point early. Sam Drysdale bounced back to nail back-to-back field goals of 20 and 47 yards to extend the UNI lead to 12-0 late in the second guarter.

With the Bears hanging around late in the second quarter, the UNI defense made a huge impact on the game as Rickey Neal hit MSU's Huslig to send his pass fluttering like a duck in the direction of Campbell. The senior safety took the gift 35 yards for the score as UNI jumped ahead 19-0.

With the lead at 19-0, the Bears would muster a drive of their own after going 75 yards in 10 plays to score on a Jason Randall six-yard rushing touchdown. Following a short kickoff before halftime, UNI's Howell lobbed a 32-yard pass to Isaiah Weston to set up a 37-yard field goal from Drysdale to give the Panthers a 22-7 lead at the break.

After trading punts for most of the third quarter, the Bears put together a string of big pass plays with 3:05 remaining to set up a chip shot from the 25 yards out to trim the UNI lead to 22-10.

A 12-play, 70-yard drive ate up over six minutes on the clock late in the ball game, with the Panthers tacking on a Drysdale 22-yard field goal to move the final margin to 75-10

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa. – No. 24 Northern Iowa blew past Indiana State on Saturday, as the Panthers dominated the Sycamores in impressive fashion to earn a 41-3 victory on Senior Day.

With the win, UNI closed out the regular season with a 7-4 record overall and 6-2 in the Missouri Valley Football Conference. ISU ended the season winless, going 0-11 and 0-8 in league play. The Panthers won five out of their last six games down the stretch, as UNI officially finished second in the MVFC.

Junior Colton Howell made the start in place of an injured Eli Dunne at quarterback, as Howell finished with a career-high 216 yards passing on 17-of-26 throwing the ball, two scores and an interception. Senior Daurice Fountain was Howell's favorite target, catching five passes for 80 yards and two touchdowns. Junior Marcus Weymiller earned his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season, as the running back racked up 109 yards and found the end zone twice.

Defensively, the Panthers were just as dominating as UNI picked off the Sycamores three times, while holding the Sycamores to 247 total yards and just three points. The three points allowed were the lowest total score against a UNI defense since shutting out Missouri State on Nov. 4, 2015.

The Sycamores struck first in the game, but their success would be short-lived as the Panthers reeled off 41 unanswered. The first Panther touchdown came through the air as Howell found Fountain for a four-yard score to cap a 10-play, 68-yard drive.

The Panther special teams spoiled the next Sycamore scoring attempt, after UNI's Seth Thomas blocked a 39-yard field goal. UNI capitalized with three points of its own, after a Sam Drysdale 24-yarder put the Panthers up 10-3. Xavior Williams' third pick in the last three games set up the next Panther score as Weymiller punched in a 22-yard touchdown to bring the lead to 17-3 late in the first quarter.

UNI stretched its lead to 24-3 after scoring 10 more points in the second quarter, with a 23-yard field goal by Drysdale followed by another Howell-Fountain connection – this time for 23 yards.

Out of the break, UNI continued to pound the ball as the Panthers ate up 9:12 on the clock to open the half. UNI ran the ball 14 times, to stretch out the 17-play, 75-yard drive that Weymiller closed out with a five-yard touchdown on the ground. The Panther dominance spilled over in to the fourth quarter as senior J'Veyon Browning scored his first rushing touchdown on the ground in almost a year as he up UNI up by the final margin of 41-3.

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa. – Visiting Monmouth (9-3) was no match for Northern Iowa (8-4) on Saturday, as the No. 20/21 Panthers blew past the No. 23 Hawks to win their first round FCS Playoff game in dominating fashion, 46-7.

With the victory, UNI advances to the second round of the FCS Playoffs as the Panthers travel to No. 5 South Dakota State on Saturday, Dec. 2 at 2 p.m. CT.

Junior Eli Dunne shredded the Hawk defense after completing 18-of-26 passes for 260 yards and four touchdowns. Senior Daurice Fountain was Dunne's favorite target, as he caught 10 passes for 139 yards and two scores. Senior J'Veyon Browning led UNI on the ground as the running back earned a career-high 136 yards rushing.

UNI racked up a season-high 246 rushing yards, while throwing for 274 yards through the air. The Panther offense scored on their first nine possessions as UNI rolled up MU early and often.

The Panther defense earned four interceptions on Saturday, while holding the Hawks to 202 total yards for the game and not allowing a point until 8:00 minutes left in the game. MU could only manage 61 rushing yards against UNI's stout defense.

Leading the way for UNI was sophomore Nikholi Jaghai, who snagged two interceptions and recorded three tackles following his third-straight start at safety. Freshman Xavior Williams and senior Elijah Campbell each picked off MU's Kenji Bahar once to cap the nightmarish day for the Hawk quarterback.

The Panthers began the blowout after Jaghai picked off MU's Bahar for the first time on the night to set up a seven-play. 47-yard scoring drive that was capped by a 16-yard throw from Dunne to Isaiah Weston. Jared Farley turned in a spectacular one-handed grab for the next touchdown, as Dunne floated it to the linebacker to put UNI up 14-0 to close out the first quarter.

Dunne and Fountain hooked up twice (on scores of 17 and 14 yards) in the second quarter, while Sam Drysdale added two field goals to put UNI up 33-D going into the break.

With an insurmountable lead, the Panthers held their foot on the gas as UNI scored 13 more points to add to its lead. Drysdale and Austin Errthum each kicked a field goal, while Colton Howell scampered in for a 17-yard score in mop up duty. The Panthers would allow just one touchdown late, with the Hawks finding the end zone to bring the final margin to 46-7.


