After sweeping the University of New Hampshire to close out 2022, Union opens the 2023 calendar year by hosting #17/18 Cornell and Colgate.

Union's Last Time Out

Union picked up a pair of non-conference wins over Hockey East foe UNH on Dec. 30 and 31. Union took a 3-0 lead in the first game with Owen Farris, Chris Theodore, and Josh Nixon, all finding the back of the net. The Wildcats battled back to tie it going into the third. John Prokop scored his first collegiate goal on the powerplay in the final frame to win the game.

Prokop struck again in the second game of the series with a goal only 2:34 into the game. Liam Robertson and Mason Snell tallied goals in the opening stanza to give Union a 3-0 lead after 20 minutes. Liam Devlin potted two for the Wildcats in the second period, but Union hung on to take a 3-2 victory. Kyle Chauvette earned his first collegiate win in his first start at Messa Rink.

With the sweep of the Wildcats, Union improved to 7-1-0 on home ice this season.

GAME NOTES

Scouting the Big Red

After finishing the 2021-22 season in the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals, the Cornell Big Red are off to an 8-5-1 start this season, including a 5-3-0 record in conference play. The Big Red are unbeaten in their last three games, blanking Dartmouth 1-0 on Dec. 3 and earning an 8-4 win and a 3-3 tie over AIC this past week.

All 22 skaters that have played for the Big Red this season have recorded at least one point. Cornell is lead by junior Gabriel Seger who has 10 points (2-8-10) in 12 games. The former Dutchman is riding a three-game point streak going into the weekend. Seger and Zach Tupker (3-3-6) are the top two in the circle for Cornell, winning 60.1% and 60.7% of their draws, respectively.

Mitchell Travis anchors the defense with a team-leading 23 blocked shots and seven points (4-3-7) in 14 games.

Sophomore netminder lan Shane is first in the country with a 1.53 GAA and eighth with a .926 save percentage. Shane is 7-4-1 on the season with a pair of shutouts against nationally-ranked UConn on Nov. 26 to claim the Frozen Apple and against Dartmouth on Dec. 3.

Scouting the Raiders

The Raiders finished the 2021-22 season with a trip to Lake Placid for the ECAC Hockey semifinals, eventually falling to Quinnipiac, 3-1. Colgate is 9-9-2 overall and 6-2-0 in conference play through 20 games. The Raiders are riding a four-game unbeaten streak coming into the weekend with wins over Dartmouth (5-1), Harvard (6-4), Maine (5-2), and a tie on New Year's Eve with the Black Bears (1-1).

Colgate has two scorers over the 20 point mark in Alex Young (12-9-21) and Matt Verboon (9-11-20) and six total in double-digit scoring. Young is currently second in the country in power-play goals with eight.

Junior defender Pierson Brandon has a team-high 47 blocked shots in 18 games to go with five points (1-4-5).

In net, junior Carter Gylander has posted a 9-8-2 record and one shutout for the Raiders. Gylander is ranked 13th nationally with a .923 save percentage and 25th with a 2.31 GAA.

Sanda's Return

Senior Christian Sanda made his return to the lineup on Dec. 30 against UNH after an injury last February cut his junior year short. The senior winger recorded a shot and blocked a shot in his return.

Chauvette's First Win

First-year Kyle Chauvette made his first collegiate start on home ice on Dec. 31 and earned his first collegiate win between the pipes. Chauvette turned aside 34 shots, including a big post-to-post kick save in the third period. The 34 saves is tied for the second highest save total by a Union netminder this season.

No Place Like Home

Union has only played 8 of their 19 games so far at home this season, posting a 7-1 record on home ice. Union won all three games in October and all three in December. Union's lone loss was against Harvard on Nov. 12.

Lead the Way

Just over two months into the season, 17 of 62 NCAA teams are led in scoring by first-year players. First-year Nate Hanley leads the team in scoring with 16 points in 19 games.

Block Party

The Dutchmen have racked up 286 blocked shots through 19 games, averaging just over 15 blocks per game. First-year Nick Young leads the way with 26 blocked shots with senior Owen Farris (25) and first-year John Prokop (24) right behind. Six student-athletes have 20 or more blocked shots so far this season. Compared to the 2021-22 season, Union made 258 blocked shots in the same time frame.

Oh Captains, My Captains

On Nov. 3, head coach Josh Hauge named seniors Owen Farris and Connor Murphy and junior Ben Tupker as the captains for the 2022-23 season.

He'd Be Honored

First-year Nate Hanley was named the ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Month for October. The last time a Dutchman earned Rookie of the Month honors was on January 5, 2016 when Sebastian Vidmar was recognized. Hanley leads all Union skaters in points (3-10-13).

Shut 'Em Out

Senior Connor Murphy posted his first shutout of the season and fourth since transferring to Union in the Oct. 29 6-0 win over the Engineers. In Union's Division I era, they had not blanked RPI at home. The lone shutout was back on February 23, 1924, a 7-0 win.

Murph Keeps Climbing

Senior Connor Murphy continues his climb up the Union record books. His fourth shutout at Union ties him with Keith Kinkaid '11 for sixth place in career shutouts. Murphy needs one more shutout to move into a tie for fifth place with Justin Mrazek '08. He needs 11 saves to tie Kinkaid in career saves with 1,500.

Scheerer Scores

Junior Bram Scheerer scored his first collegiate goal against UMass. After losing his freshman season to the pandemic, he saw his sophomore season cut short only eight games in with a season-ending injury against Clarkson. To date, Scheerer has appeared in 20 career games and has six points (1-5-6).

Mr. 100

Senior Chris Theodore played in his 100th career game on Friday, Oct. 21. Theodore, a transfer from AlC, has played in all 19 games for Union this season and tallied seven points (2-7-9). The 2021-22 Atlantic Hockey Player of the Year has compiled 68 points (22-46-68) throughout his career.

Reigning Rookies

Union's first-year defenders are off to a hot start. Nick Young was named the ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week on Oct. 10 after scoring his first collegiate goal and blocking five shots against nationally-ranked UConn. John Prokop earned the honor the following week after tallying an assist on five of Union's 10 goals between Oct. 13 and 15. Cal Mell picked up his first weekly honor on Oct. 31. Nate Hanley was named the Rookie of the Month after scoring a conference-leading nine points in 10 games.

Spread the Wealth

Through 19 games, Union has seen 22 of 26 skaters score at least one point. Seven of the eight first-year skaters all have at least one point.

New Kids on the Block

First-years Nate Hanley, Carter Korpi, John Prokop, and Cal Mell, as well as sophomore Josh Nixon and senior Chris Theodore all tallied their first points for Union in the opening weekend. In total, newcomers accounted for 12 of the 15 points scored (4-8-12).

New Bench Boss

Josh Hauge was named the 22nd head coach in Union hockey's history on April 15, 2022. Hauge was previously the Associate Head Coach at ECAC Hockey rival Clarkson University. Hauge earned his first coaching victory in Union's home opener, a 4-3 win over RIT on Oct. 1, 2022.

Fresh Faces

Union welcomes 13 new students to the team in 2022-23 comprising of four transfers and nine first-years representing eight states and three Canadian provinces.

Transfer Commits

The coaching staff was active in the transfer portal this offseason, committing four student-athletes: Chris Theodore (AIC), Mason Snell (Penn State), Josh Nixon (Lake Superior State) and Ben Tupker (Cornell).

Rounding Out the Staff

Joining Josh Hauge and Assistant Coach John Ronan behind the bench is Lennie Childs, who previously served as an assistant coach with the Des Moines Buccaneers of the USHL.

Set Records

Senior Connor Murphy made an immediate impact for Union in his first season. He set the program's new single-season save records with 1,060.

Looking to Surprise

Union was picked to finished eighth in the ECAC Hockey preseason coaches poll, earning 45 points. Local media were more optimistic, picking the Dutchmen to finish sixth in the preseason media poll.

Sophomore Thomas Richter and junior Mason Snell are sons of retired NHLers Mike Richter (New York Rangers 1989-2002) and Chris Snell (Toronto, Los Angeles 1993-95), respectively.

COACHING STAFF

HEAD COACH JOSH HAUGE



Josh Hauge was named the 22nd head coach of the Union College men's hockey program on April 15, 2022 and begins his first season in Schenectady in 2022-23.

Hauge is the seventh head coach in the program's Division I era, which began in 1991.

Hauge finished his seventh season on the bench at fellow ECAC Hockey member Clarkson University in 2021-22, including the last three years as the associate head coach alongside Casey Jones. In that time, Hauge played a large role in recruiting and player development for the Golden Knights, helping Clarkson post five 20-win seasons, capture the 2019 Whitelaw Cup as the ECAC Hockey Tournament champions, and appear in two NCAA Tournaments.

Before his time in the North Country, Hauge spent four seasons in the USHL, first as the head coach and general manager of the Tri-City Storm before assuming the roles of assistant coach and director of scouting for the Fargo Force. He also previously coached the Fairbanks Ice Dogs of the NAHL for five years as well, compiling a 131-58-45 record (.656) that included the 2011 Robertson Cup.

Hauge played collegiately at Division III Bethel University, appearing in 76 games over three seasons for the Royals.

A native of Rosemount, Minn., Hauge will be joined in the Capital Region by his wife, Allison, and two sons, Hanley and Landry.

ASSISTANT COACH JOHN RONAN



John Ronan returns for his ninth season as a coach with the Union College men's hockey team in 2022-23. Ronan served as a volunteer assistant coach during Union's 2013-14 national championship season, then rejoined the staff in a full-time capacity in 2016. He served as interim head coach of the program for the final 17 games of the 2021-22 season, guiding the team to a Mayor's Cup victory over rival Rensselaer.

In his first season back in Schenectady, the Dutchmen ranked fourth in Division I in goals per game (3.76) and 12th in power play percentage (21.1 percent), while senior forward Mike Vecchione and junior forward Spencer Foo finished first and fourth in the nation in scoring, respectively. Vecchione and Foo were both named Hobey Baker Top-10 Finalists, and Vecchione became the program's first-ever Hobey Baker Hat Trick Finalist.

Ronan returned to Union after spending one season at Mercyhurst University in 2015-16, helping lead the Lakers to an overall record of 17-15-4. He worked primarily with the forwards and power play, helping produce the league's fourth-highest scoring offense (3.00 goals per game) and the third most efficient power play (18.5 percent).

During the 2013-14 season, Ronan was a volunteer assistant coach with the Dutchmen, helping the program to a Whitelaw Cup, a Cleary Cup and the program's first-ever national title. During the season, his primary responsibilities were the power play and forward lines, which finished second in the country in scoring offense.

A native of South Boston, Mass., Ronan skated four seasons (2001-05) at the University of Maine. As a forward for the Black Bears, Ronan compiled 25 goals, 22 assists and 47 points in 132 career games. He was named team captain as a senior and earned a Bachelor of University Studies from Maine in 2013.

Ronan played seven full seasons in the professional ranks, spending time with the Alaska Aces (ECHL), Florida Everblades (ECHL), Rocky Mountain Rage (CHL), Austin Ice Bats (CHL), Evansville IceMen (CHL), Flint Generals (IHL) and Huntsville Havoc (SPHL). John also had a stint with the Netherlands-based Geleen Smoke Eaters.

John resides in Clifton Park with his wife Robin and daughter Camryn.

ASSISTANT COACH LENNIE CHILDS



Lennie Childs was named an assistant coach with the Union College men's hockey team on August 11 and begins his first season on the bench with the Dutchmen in 2022-23.

With his hire, Childs becomes the third active black men's assistant coach in NCAA Division I hockey, joining Leon Hayward of University of St. Thomas and Paul Jerrard at University of Nebraska Omaha.

Childs most recently served as an assistant coach with the Des Moines Buccaneers of the USHL where he primarily led player development, the penalty kill units, and offensive zone production. Prior to his time with the Buccaneers, Childs spent two seasons with the Janesville Jets as an assistant coach before being promoted to associate head coach in his third season. In addition to player development and working with the defense, he was responsible for camps, recruiting, and the day-to-day operations of the team. Under his coaching, the Jets had one of the best defensive cores in the NAHL, with the second-ranked penalty kill in the 2020-21 season.

During the 2017-18 season, Childs served as the head coach for the Skipjacks Hockey Club of the USPHL where he guided the team to a 27-10-7 record.

Childs played four years of collegiate hockey at Concordia University of Wisconsin where he graduated in 2016 with a degree in marketing.
