## ABOUT THE TEAMS

**Union Across the Pond:** The Union College men's hockey team held onto its #20 ranking in the USCHO poll after a 0-1-1 weekend on the road against Cornell (L, 2-1) and Colgate (T, 4-4, 2-1 SoW). The Garnet Chargers have a top-10 power play and penalty kill, and Cameron Korpi has posted three shutouts on the year in the net. Union is one of three teams in NCAA Division I men's hockey to be top-10 in penalty-kill (91.7%) and power-play percentage (25.9%).

**Pioneering Party:** The Pioneers boast the 10th-best penalty kill in NCAA Division I men's hockey at 85.4% (7-48). Sacred Heart has won three straight games and is coming off a win over Long Island University on Saturday after scoring a season-high seven goals. Felix Trudeau notched his second hat trick in a three-game span during the victory for the Pioneers.

**What Do Tigers Dream Of...?:** RIT is looking to get back on track after dropping its last two games. Prior to the mini skid, the Tigers had won their nine consecutive games prior. It was RIT's third-longest winning streak in its Division-I era.

**Not That Miami:** The Miami (Ohio) Red Hawks started the season 6-0 but are 2-4 since. Miami is coming off a 4-2 loss to St. Cloud State. Kocha Delic picked up his team-leading 14th point of the season in the loss and has at least one point in 11 of Miami's 12 games.

## INSIDE THE SERIES

- Union and Sacred Heart have met eight times, most recently on Oct. 15, 2016 when the teams tied 4-4. The past two contests between the two sides have ended in a tie, and goals have been easy to come by in the series with six of the eight games featuring six or more total goals.
- Union and Miami (Ohio) have never met! Will their paths cross in the championship of the Friendship Four?
- Union has scored 99 goals against RIT and has won seven of the last 10 meetings. RIT owns the overall advantage at 13-9-3 against the Garnet Chargers

## GAME NOTES

### The Friendship Four

The Friendship Four is an annual in-season college hockey tournament where four teams are invited to compete in Belfast, Northern Ireland, for the Belpot Trophy. The tournament has been held since 2015 at SSE Arena Belfast, the home of the EIHL's Belfast Giants. The tournament began as a cultural and economic exchange between the sister cities of Boston and Belfast, which is evident in the similarities between the Friendship Four and the Beanpot tournaments. UMass Lowell won the inaugural Friendship Four tournament in 2015, defeating Brown to take home the Belpot Trophy.

### Among Giants

Union is playing at the Friendship Four, hosted by the Belfast Giants at SSE Arena in Belfast, Northern Ireland. The Belfast Giants made history in 2000, becoming the first professional ice hockey team on the island of Ireland. After three months on the road, the team took to their home ice in Belfast for the first time in December 2000. Their momentous sell-out opening night captured the hearts of an entire nation and started an ice hockey phenomenon that remains today.

### EIHL

The Belfast Giants play in the Elite Ice Hockey League (EIHL). The EIHL is a professional league in the United Kingdom. Formed in 2003, it is the highest level of ice hockey competition in the UK. Ten teams from England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland currently compete in the Elite League. Professional ice hockey has been played in the UK since the 1930s and the Great Britain team won the Olympic gold medal in 1936. Ice hockey is now the #1 attended indoor professional sport in the UK and overall it is the third largest winter spectator sport in the UK after football and rugby union.

### Welcome to Belfast

Union flew out of Boston on Sunday and arrived in Dublin, Ireland on Monday morning, 8:30 a.m. local time. Since arriving, Union has toured Croke Park, enjoyed a bus tour of Belfast, visited the Giant's Causeway, and spent time visiting local schoolchildren in Belfast.

### We've Been Here Before

Union won the Friendship Four in 2018 and can become the first team in the tournament's history to lift the Belpot Trophy twice. Union's head coach Josh Hauge appeared in the tournament as an assistant coach for Clarkson in 2017 and won it, beating RPI and Providence. That Clarkson team lost to Princeton 2-1 in overtime of the ECAC Hockey Championship and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.

### Saturday = WINday

Union is 5-0-2 on Saturdays. The Garnet Chargers are outscoring opponents 30-10 on Saturdays with their last loss on that day of the week coming on March 15, 2025 against Dartmouth in the ECAC Hockey quarterfinals.

### A Goal Each

Colgate and Union played to a 4-4 tie on Saturday, and neither team saw one of its players score multiple goals. It's the second time Union has played in a game where 8+ goals were scored with no multi-goal scorers this season (UMass Lowell, Nov. 14). Union played in one such game throughout the course of the 2024-25 campaign.

### What Makes This Team Special...

Union owns the #3 penalty-kill percentage (91.7%) and the #8 power-play percentage (25.9%) in NCAA Division I men's hockey. The Garnet Chargers are one of three teams to be in the top-10 of both categories. Minnesota Duluth and Dartmouth also fit the bill. Dartmouth is 5-18 on the power play and 2-18 on the kill through six games. Duluth is 6-57 on the kill and 15-58 on the power play in 16 contests.

### Buhrrr, It's Cold Outside

Brandon Buhr has 11 goals and six assists through 13 games in his senior season. He's in a tie for the fourth-most goals in NCAA Division I men's hockey and one of 11 players in the country with double-digit goals. He is tied for the 17th-most points per game in Division I and is tied with teammate Parker Lindauer for 1.31 points per game.

### The Lindy City

Parker Lindauer is tied for the team lead in points with Brandon Buhr at 17 and leads the team with 13 assists. His 1.00 assists-per-game average is tied for the fifth-best in NCAA Division I men's hockey, and his 13 assists are tied for the ninth-most in the country. He has recorded multiple points in four of his last four games and notched a season-high four points on Oct. 18 against Niagara.

### It's Called the "Man Advantage" For a Reason

Union has scored at least one goal on the power play in five consecutive games. It's the team's second five-game power-play streak of the season, and the last time the Garnet Chargers had multiple five-game power-play streaks was the 2021-22 campaign. Union had a power-play goal in six straight games from Jan. 14, 2022 - Feb. 1, 2022, and the Garnet Chargers haven't had a six-game goal streak on the man advantage since then.

### Keep Bouncing Back

Union is 2-0-1 coming off a loss this season. Union has avoided back-to-back losses throughout the first 13 games of the season for the second year in a row. The Garnet Chargers bounced back from a 2-1 loss at Cornell on Friday with a 4-4 tie at Colgate, followed up by a 2-1 win in the subsequent shootout.

### Shootout Success

Union has won two consecutive shootouts over Colgate and six of its last seven official shootouts since head coach Josh Hauge took over ahead of the 2022-23 season.

### Free Willy

Will Felicio potted first goal as a Garnet Charger on Friday in the 2-1 loss to Colgate. He is one of four Union defensemen to find the back of the net this season. Tyler Dunbar leads the Garnet Charger blue line with four goals and is second overall on the team with eight assists.

### AHA Party

Union is undefeated against AHA opponents this season (4-0-1) and has not lost a game in its last 10 matchups against AHA foes (9-0-1). The Garnet Chargers are 69-43-13 (.604) all-time against current AHA members and 20-5-4 (.759) over the last 10 years. Sacred Heart and RIT represent AHA in the Friendship Four.

### Team of the Week

Union was featured as College Hockey News' "Team of the Week" after a 2-0 weekend on Nov. 7 and Nov. 8 where it outscored UMass Lowell and New Hampshire 13-1 overall and improved to 8-2-1 on the season. During an interview with College Hockey News' editor, head coach Josh Hauge said, "I love our hockey team ... We believe we're good ... We're excited about trying to continue to grow the program and get it back to where it can be."

### Point Surge

Entering the weekend series with UMass Lowell and New Hampshire, Brandon Buhr and Parker Lindauer were both averaging 1.11 points per game. After both forwards posted back-to-back multi-point games, Buhr increased his points-per-game average to 1.45, and Lindauer's jumped to 1.36.

### All Good Things Must Come to an End

Despite beating UMass Lowell by six on Nov. 7, Union's season-long streak of never being outshot in a period came to an end in the second period. Union was outshot 11-10 during the middle stanza. The two sides finished the game with 33 shots each, marking the first time Union did not outshoot its opponent through 60 minutes all season.

**M&T Bank Center**

This season, the men's and women's Union hockey teams will call the state-of-the-art M&T Bank Center its home, becoming the primary tenant of the 100,000-square-foot multi-purpose venue. The arena holds a capacity of 2,200 for hockey games and expands to 3,600 for other sporting events, trade shows, special events, and conventions. Highlights include seven luxury suites, a spacious hospitality suite, two full-service concession stands, and an elegant bar overlooking the Mohawk River. M&T Bank Center is the 16th hockey venue in the NCAA to open in the last 10 years.

**Don't Count These Guys Out**

Union stormed back from a 3-0 deficit and scored five unanswered goals in a 5-3 win over Mercyhurst on Oct. 11. It marked the Garnet Chargers' first victory after trailing by three goals since Dec. 1, 2013, when they erased a 4-1 deficit to beat Penn State. Daniel Ciampini scored the game-winner in that comeback with three seconds left in regulation, breaking the hearts of 5,177 Penn State fans in University Park, Pa.

**Buhr Watching**

College Hockey News released its "Players to Watch" in ECAC Hockey and recognized Brandon Buhr with some high praise. *"Buhr is shifty and has a good shot, which makes him successful. He is also good at getting to the important areas of the ice, which is the way his coach, Josh Hauge, would like his team to play. Union as a whole is returning a deep group, and [Buhr] could be in the mix for Player of the Year."*

**Need a Recharge?**

The Garnet Chargers lost 12 players from its 2024-25 roster to graduation, the transfer portal, and the pros. Those departures accounted for 101 points last season, but Union still kept its top goal scorer in Brandon Buhr (19) and point scorer in Colby MacArthur (29). Not to mention, four of Union's 20-point scorers from last season are still on the squad, and Union's 78 "returning" goals are the seventh-most in Division I.

**Fresh Faces**

Hauge and his staff brought in two of each positional group to round out their recruiting class. Alex Laurenza (F), Troy Pelton (F), Etienne Lessard (D), Ollie Chessler (D) Brayden Gillespie (G), and Brendan Holahan (G) will all get their first taste of college hockey this season. Will Felicio (D, Michigan), Carter Rose (D, Clarkson), Tyler Dunbar (D, Colorado College), Cameron Korpi (G, Michigan), and Luke Buss (F, Wisconsin) end up in Schenectady as transfers after earlier stops around the Division I hockey landscape.

**What's Up Brother?**

They say your teammates are like your brothers. For Carter and Cameron Korpi, one of their teammates actually is their brother. Carter is three years older than Cameron, and this will be the first time they've played hockey on the same team together (other than knee hockey games in the basement of their childhood home).

**Professional Prokop**

It's no secret John Prokop was a massive part of the Union defense last year. In three seasons, Prokop notched 65 assists and registered 85 points. Now, the AHCA East Second Team All-American is skating professionally for the Toronto Marlies in the Toronto Maple Leafs organization. He's looking to join the likes of Nick DeSimone and Shayne Gostisbehere as former Union hockey players in the NHL.

**You Love to "C" It**

Nick Young earned captain honors in his senior season. He's been along for the ride for all of head coach Josh Hauge's tenure so far. The alternate captains on the team are Parker Lindauer and Brandon Buhr.

**High Hopes in Schenectady**

Head coach Josh Hauge told the media on Tuesday, Sept. 30 that if his team equals its No. 5 preseason ranking, then the season will be a disappointment. Union did finish fourth in the standings last year before an early exit at home to Dartmouth in the ECAC playoffs. That fourth-place finish was Union's best since placing second in 2017-18. The Garnet Chargers' most recent regular-season title came in 2013-14, the same season Union won its first national championship.

**Across the Pond**

Union will be joined by RIT, Miami (Ohio), and Sacred Heart in Northern Ireland at the end of November for the Friendship Four.

**Seniority Priority**

Union hits the ice with eight seniors, tied with Niagara and St. Thomas for the seventh-largest senior class across Division I. The Garnet Chargers' average age as a team is 22.5, making them tied for the seventh-oldest team in the country.

**Go Big Blue?**

Three Garnet Chargers previously played college hockey at the University of Michigan. Cameron Korpi and Will Felicio both played for Michigan last season, and Brendan Miles transferred to Union after the 2023-24 campaign. Tyler Dunbar, Miles, and Cameron and Carter Korpi all hail from Michigan as well. Across Division I men's hockey, there are 91 players from The Wolverine State.

## GARNET CHARGER SPOTLIGHT

**#3 Cal Mell - Sr. - D - Alpharetta, Ga.**

Cal Mell played in his 100th game as a Garnet Charger on Nov. 14 against UMass Lowell. While he did not record a point in the 7-1 win over the River Hawks, that game was part of a four-game stretch where the senior posted three points.

Mell was the ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week on Oct. 31, 2022 and has been a member of the league's all-academic team all three seasons so far in his career.

Before Union, Mell spent two seasons with the Janesville Jets of the NAHL, appearing in 60 games for Janesville in 2021-22, logging 39 points (3-36-39) in 60 games from the blue line. He served as team captain and was named NAHL Defenseman of the Month in November 2021. Mell played in the 2021 and 2022 NAHL Top Prospects Tournament, finishing with 49 points in two seasons with Janesville.

## LAST TIME OUT

**#20 Union Falls to #19/17 Cornell**

Union College vs Cornell University | L, 2-1 | Friday, Nov. 21, 2025



ITHACA, N.Y. – #19/17 Cornell University overcame an early goal from #20 Union College men's hockey sophomore Will Felicio and rallied to defeat the Garnet Chargers 2-1 on Friday evening at Lynah Rink.

Union (8-3-1, 2-3-0 ECAC Hockey) entered the game against Cornell (5-2-0, 4-1-0 ECAC Hockey) riding a three-game winning streak and

had scored a power-play goal in all three of those wins. While the Garnet Chargers were not able to extend their winning streak, they did extend their goal streak on the man advantage thanks to a wrist shot just past the blue line from Felicio. Junior Tyler Dunbar and sophomore Ben Muthersbaugh set up Felicio for his first goal in a Union sweater. The Holden, Mass. native scored twice during his first-year campaign at University of Michigan.

Dunbar earned his seventh assist of the season, which is tied for the most among ECAC hockey defensemen. Muthersbaugh's assist gives him double-digit points so far in his sophomore campaign.

Cornell knotted up the game with a power-play goal at the 12:47 mark of the first, snapping Union's streak of 17 straight chances without allowing a goal while a man down. The Big Red later doubled its lead in the second stanza after outshooting Union 7-4. Union's four shots were its fewest in a single period all season long.

The Garnet Chargers earned the first power play of the third period at the 3:00 mark, but it was cut short after a hooking call was charged to sophomore Lucas Buzziol.

Union was not a man up on the ice again until pulling sophomore goaltender Cameron Korpi with 1:44 remaining in regulation. Korpi, the reigning ECAC Hockey Goalie of the Week, made 21 saves on the night. However, he ended up being dealt his third loss of the season after Union was unable to convert either of its two shots in the final 104 seconds of regulation.

Union lost its first game of the season while sporting a national ranking. Union was tabbed 20th in the USCHO poll on Monday, appearing in that poll for the first time since 2019. Union also suffered its second loss of the season when scoring the first goal of the game.

HAMILTON, N.Y. – Sixty-five minutes was not enough to settle the score between the #20 Union College men's hockey team and Colgate University for the second season in a row on Saturday night at Class of 1965 Arena, as the two teams skated to a 4-4 tie with the Garnet Chargers winning the ensuing shootout 2-1.

Union (8-3-2, 2-3-1 ECAC Hockey) has won two consecutive shootouts over Colgate (5-7-2, 3-2-1 ECAC Hockey) and six of its last seven shootouts since head coach Josh Hauge took over ahead of the 2022-23 season.

Senior Parker Lindauer tucked away the deciding shootout score in the fifth round of attempts. The senior forward also led his team with two points on the night, dishing out a pair of assists to bring his yearly total to 13.

Union's two points in the ECAC Hockey standings were not guaranteed, especially early on as Colgate scored two quick goals within 23 seconds of each other early in the first period.

While the Raiders had the advantage on the scoreboard after 20 minutes of play, Union outperformed Colgate on draws, winning 12 of the 15 faceoffs in the opening period. After one of Colgate's three faceoff wins at the 16:26 mark of the first, Lindauer intercepted a pass and dumped it back behind the Colgate net. That possession resulted in Lindauer picking up a rebound after a shot from junior Carter Rose and finding senior Brandon Buhr on the doorstep. Buhr shoveled Lindauer's pass home for his 11th goal of the season. Union is unbeaten (8-0-1) in the nine games in which Union's alternate captain has recorded a point, and Lindauer has assisted on six of Buhr's 11 goals.

After neither team was called for a penalty in the first, Union earned the game's first power play midway through the second period. The Garnet Chargers did not score on their first trip on the man advantage but were outplaying the Raiders throughout the entire second stanza. They outshot Colgate 16-11 and broke through for their second goal of the game at the 15:38 mark. Sophomore Lucas Buzziol led his team into its offensive zone and left the puck for senior Carter Korpi, who snuck the puck through Reid Dyck's five-hole. Korpi registered his second score of the year and was one of 11 Garnet Chargers with a point on the night.

Lindauer secured his fifth multi-point game of the season when he assisted on senior Colby MacArthur's power-play goal at the 16:49 mark of the second. Union has scored on the man advantage in five straight games, marking Union's second separate five-game streak with a power-play goal this season.

Colgate had a golden chance to net a power-play goal or two of its own with a 5-on-3 that spanned from the end of the second to nearly a minute into the third. However, Union successfully thwarted the Raiders' first chance to answer back after Union took a 3-2 lead.

While Colgate eventually did tie up the game and then take the lead midway through the third, Union once again had another answer for the Raiders' scoring outburst. This time it was sophomore Drew Sutton who scored his first goal of the year when he beat his classmate Ben Muthersbaugh to a loose puck in the crease.

Neither team could light the lamp one last time for a game winner, but both teams benefited from 30-save performances from their goaltenders. Union's goalie sophomore Cameron Korpi finished the night with exactly 30 stops, and Dyck denied 32 Union shots.

After Colgate failed to score on a power play during overtime, Buhr started the shootout with a goal, then Korpi made four saves to set up Lindauer for his clinching score.

## COACHING STAFF

## HEAD COACH JOSH HAUGE



Josh Hauge returns for his fourth season at the helm of the Union College men's hockey team in 2025-26.

In his third year at the helm in 2024-25, Hauge's program continued to show improvement posting a 19-14-3 record and earning a top-four finish in the ECAC Hockey standings with a 12-8-2 conference mark, the program's most conference wins in a season since 2017-18 and the sixth most in Union's Division I era. The team started off the year with a 6-1-0 record to earn the program's first national ranking since 2019 and spent much of the year receiving votes in the USCHO rankings. Highlights of the season included keeping the Mayors' Cup trophy in Schenectady for the fourth straight year as well as sweeping the season series from Cornell University for the first time since 2013-14. Following the season, three Garnet Chargers (John Prokop, Brandon Buhr and Kyle Chauvette) earned All-ECAC Hockey third-team honors and first-year Ben Muthersbaugh was named to the ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team, while Hauge was named a finalist for the ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year award.

Hauge led Union to a 16-18-3 record in his second season behind the bench and a trip to the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals. The season was highlighted by a win on the road over nationally ranked Cornell as well as the first win at Harvard since 2015. The penalty kill unit ranked second in the country at 87.3 percent with eight short-handed goals. Prokop was a unanimous ECAC Hockey First Team and CCM/AHCA All-America Second Team East selection.

The seventh head coach in the program's Division I era, Hauge took command of a roster that featured 13 new faces, and he led Union to a 14-19-2 record and a home playoff game in the first round of the ECAC Hockey Tournament. The team posted 11 victories at Messa Rink during the season, tied for the third most by the team since 2013-14, including a 3-2 win over nationally ranked Northeastern University in December, and also kept the Mayor's Cup in Schenectady with a decisive 6-0 victory over Rensselaer in January at MVP Arena. Four of the team's top five scorers on the year were newcomers to the program, and first-years John Prokop and Nate Hanley became the first rookie tandem to lead the team in scoring since 2007-08.

Hauge came to Union after seven seasons on the bench at fellow ECAC Hockey member Clarkson University, including the last three years as the associate head coach alongside Casey Jones. In that time, Hauge played a large role in recruiting and player development for the Golden Knights, helping Clarkson post five 20-win seasons, capture the 2019 Whitelaw Cup as the ECAC Hockey Tournament champions, and appear in two NCAA Tournaments.

Before his time in the North Country, Hauge spent four seasons in the USHL, first as the head coach and general manager of the Tri-City Storm before assuming the roles of assistant coach and director of scouting for the Fargo Force. He also previously coached the Fairbanks Ice Dogs of the NAHL for five years as well, compiling a 131-58-45 record (.656) that included the 2011 Robertson Cup.

Hauge played collegiately at Division III Bethel University, appearing in 76 games over three seasons for the Royals. A native of Rosemount, Minn., Hauge is joined in the Capital Region by his wife, Allison, and two sons, Hanley and Landry.

## ASSISTANT COACH JOHN RONAN



John Ronan returns for his 12th season as a coach with the Union College men's hockey team in 2025-26. Ronan served as a volunteer assistant coach during Union's 2013-14 national championship season, then rejoined the staff in a full-time capacity in 2016. He served as interim head coach of the program for the final 17 games of the 2021-22 season, guiding the team to a Mayor's Cup victory over rival Rensselaer.

In his first season back in Schenectady, the Dutchmen ranked fourth in Division I in goals per game (3.76) and 12th in power play percentage (21.1 percent), while senior forward Mike Vecchione and junior forward Spencer Foo finished first and fourth in the nation in scoring, respectively. Vecchione and Foo were both named Hobey Baker Top-10 Finalists, and Vecchione became the program's first-ever Hobey Baker Hat Trick Finalist.

Ronan returned to Union after spending one season at Mercyhurst University in 2015-16, helping lead the Lakers to an overall record of 17-15-4. He worked primarily with the forwards and power play, helping produce the league's fourth-highest scoring offense (3.00 goals per game) and the third most efficient power play (18.5 percent).

During the 2013-14 season, Ronan was a volunteer assistant coach with the Dutchmen, helping the program to a Whitelaw Cup, a Cleary Cup and the program's first-ever national title. During the season, his primary responsibilities were the power play and forward lines, which finished second in the country in scoring offense.

A native of South Boston, Mass., Ronan skated four seasons (2001-05) at the University of Maine. As a forward for the Black Bears, Ronan compiled 25 goals, 22 assists and 47 points in 132 career games. He was named team captain as a senior and earned a Bachelor of University Studies from Maine in 2013.

Ronan played seven full seasons in the professional ranks, spending time with the Alaska Aces (ECHL), Florida Everblades (ECHL), Rocky Mountain Rage (CHL), Austin Ice Bats (CHL), Evansville IceMen (CHL), Flint Generals (IHL) and Huntsville Havoc (SPHL). John also had a stint with the Netherlands-based Geleen Smoke Eaters.

John resides in Clifton Park with his wife Robin and daughter Camryn.

## ASSISTANT COACH MIKE ZANNELLA



Mike Zannella begins his first season as an assistant coach with the Union College men's hockey team in the 2024-25 season.

Zannella comes to Union from the Lincoln Stars in the United States Hockey League where he served as an assistant coach the last two seasons and helped guide the team to a 62-59-6-3 record. In the 2022-23 season, Zannella coached current sophomore DJ Hart in his final year of junior hockey.

Prior to his time with the Lincoln Stars, Zannella spent five years as an assistant coach with Elmira College. During his time with the Soaring Eagles, the team improved year after year, culminating with the 2021 UCHC conference title and the UCHC Pat Thompson Trophy. Zannella was also instrumental in the team qualifying for the 2021-22 NCAA Tournament for the first time in a decade.

A native of Ithaca, N.Y., Zannella began his coaching career at Skidmore College in the 2016-17 season after playing two years of professional hockey.

Zannella played four years of collegiate hockey for Buffalo State University where he served as a three-year captain of the Bengals. As a senior, he led his team to the most wins of any class and finished his collegiate career ranked 10th all-time in points.
