The UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball program has made its mark in history. The following are key facts about a program that began play in 1958 and quickly made a name for itself in the desert.

1958-59 – The team's inaugural season under the school's first basketball coach and athletic director, Michael Drakulich. NSU played its home games at Dula Memorial Center (located at Las Vegas Blvd. and Bonanza Road).

1960-61 – Shortly into the season, the Rebels had their first on-campus home, the 2,000-seat NSU Gym. The Gym is now the Marjorie Barrick Museum with the basketball hardwood still used as the floor in the museum.

1962-63 – The Rebels posted their first-ever 20-win season with an overall mark of 21-4.

1963-64 – Ed Gregory was named the second head coach in program history. He compiled a two-year record of 40-15. UNLV played two home games in the 6,380-seat Las Vegas Convention Center. The team played a few more during the 1964-65 season.

1965-66 – Rolland Todd was named head coach and would serve five seasons. He led the Rebels to three straight NCAA playoff appearances. During his tenure, Nevada Southern University became known as UNLV, and the Rebels joined the West Coast Athletic Conference for the 1969-70 season.

1966-67 – The Rebels began playing all of their home games in the rotunda of the Las Vegas Convention Center.

Feb. 12, 1967 – Elbert Miller scored 55 points against Portland to set the UNLV individual single-game scoring record.

1970-71 – John Bayer served as head coach for the next three seasons.

Feb. 23, 1973 – Jimmie Baker pulled down 26 rebounds against San Francisco to set the UNLV individual single-game rebounding record.

1973-74 – The Jerry Tarkanian era began. Tark was hired as head coach on March 23, 1973, and in 19 seasons compiled an amazing 509-105 record (.829). He put the "Runnin'" in Rebels and led the program to postseason play 14 times, including a run of nine consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (1983-91) with four final fours. UNLV won its first-ever National Championship in 1990 and appeared in back-to-back Final Fours ('89-90, '90-91).

1976-77 – UNLV's first-ever Final Four appearance in the Omni in Atlanta, Ga. North Carolina defeated UNLV 84-83 in a heart-breaking loss for Rebel fans.

1977 NBA Draft – A UNLV-record six players are drafted in one year (Glen Gondrezick, Larry Moffett, Eddie Owens, Robert Smith, Sam Smith, Lewis Brown).

Feb. 19, 1983 – UNLV's last home game in the Las Vegas Convention Center. UNLV defeated Utah State, 111-78.

Nov. 26, 1983 – UNLV's first regular season game in the 18,500-seat Thomas & Mack Center. UNLV defeated UNR 92-71.

1986-87 – The Runnin' Rebels compiled a school-record 37 wins and advanced to their second Final Four in school history at the Louisiana SuperDome.

1989-90 – The Runnin' Rebels advanced to their third Final Four in school history at Denver's McNichols Arena.



April 2, 1990 – UNLV wins the national championship with the most lopsided score ever for a national title game – UNLV 103, Duke 73.

1990-91 – UNLV was ranked No. 1 throughout the season and looked for back-to-back NCAA Championships. The Runnin' Rebels were 34-0 when they were upset by Duke, 79-77, in the national semi-final game on March 30, 1991.

1991 NBA Draft – A UNLV-record three players are drafted in the first round (No. 1 Larry Johnson, No. 9 Stacey Augmon and No. 12 Greg Anthony) in one year.

1991-92 – Jerry Tarkanian coaches his final season at UNLV. The team was not eligible for postseason play. UNLV won its final 23 games to finish 26-2.

March 3, 1992 – Tark coaches his final game at the Thomas & Mack Center as a UNLV head coach. UNLV defeated Utah State, 65-53.

April 1, 1992 – Rollie Massimino was named head coach. He served two seasons (1992-94).

Oct. 22, 1994 – Tim Grgurich, long time assistant coach under Jerry Tarkanian, was named the seventh head coach in UNLV history. He would coach only seven games (2-5 record) and resigned on March 3, 1995 because of health reasons. Howie Landa (7 games) and Cleveland Edwards (14 games) served as interim head coaches.

March 30, 1995 to Dec. 12, 2000 – Bill Bayno was the 10th head coach in UNLV history. Bayno led four straight UNLV teams to the postseason (1998 and 2000 NCAA Tournament and 1997 and 1999 NIT).

Dec. 12, 2000 – March 29, 2001 – Max Good was elevated from assistant coach to head coach for the remainder of the 2000-01 season.

March 29, 2001 – Charlie Spoonhour was named the 12th head coach in UNLV Runnin' Rebel history. UNLV advanced to the second round of the NIT in his first season and lost in the NIT's first round in his second. Spoonhour stepped down after 21 games into his third season citing health issues. His son, Jay, who was an assistant, led the team the rest of the year. Jay led the team to the MWC Tournament's championship game and earned a NIT bid for the third straight season.

March 15, 2004 – Lon Kruger was hired as the 14th head coach in UNLV men's basketball history (the 10th full-time head coach). His first Runnin' Rebel team (2004-05) advanced to the second round of the NIT, marking the program's fourth straight trip to the postseason.

2006-07 – In Kruger's third season, the Runnin' Rebels won the Mountain West Conference Tournament Championship, finished with a 30-7 overall record and made a NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance - the program's first in 16 years. UNLV was ranked 14th in the nation in the final edition of the 2006-07 Coaches' Poll and 19th in the Associated Press Poll.

2007-08 – In Kruger's fourth season, the Runnin' Rebels became the first MWC school to repeat as conference tournament champions and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's second round, losing to eventual national champion Kansas. UNLV won games in back-to-back NCAA Tournaments for the first time since 1990 and 1991 and Kruger earned the league's Coach of the Year award. From 2006-08, UNLV turned in a 57-15 record and went 38-3 at home over that span. Additionally, the Runnin' Rebels finished the 2007-08 season having won 24 straight games at home against MWC foes.

(1958-63)

Michael Drakulich was UNLV's first basketball coach as well as athletic director. The first Rebel team of 1958-59 posted a 5-13 record. In five seasons, he led the team to a 68-45 record including a 21-4 mark in his final season as head coach. Drakulich coached several programs at UNLV including baseball and spent 19 seasons as the Rebel golf coach. He was chosen a charter member of the UNLV Athletic Hall of Fame in 1987.

Rolland Todd emerged at NSU and compiled an outstanding five-year record of 96-40, including three straight NCAA playoff appearances (1966-69) and the finals in 1967-68. During Todd's tenure, Nevada Southern University became the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, and the Rebels joined the West Coast Athletic Conference for the 1969-70 season. Todd left the Rebels after the 1969-70 season to become head coach of the NBA's Portland Trail Blazers.

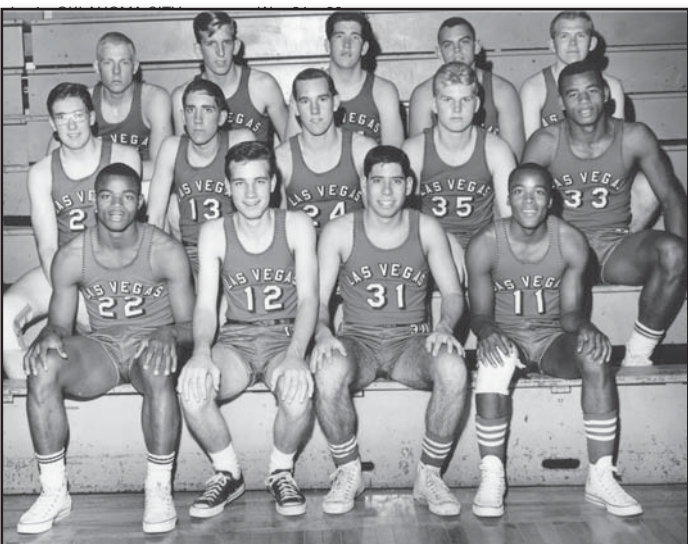

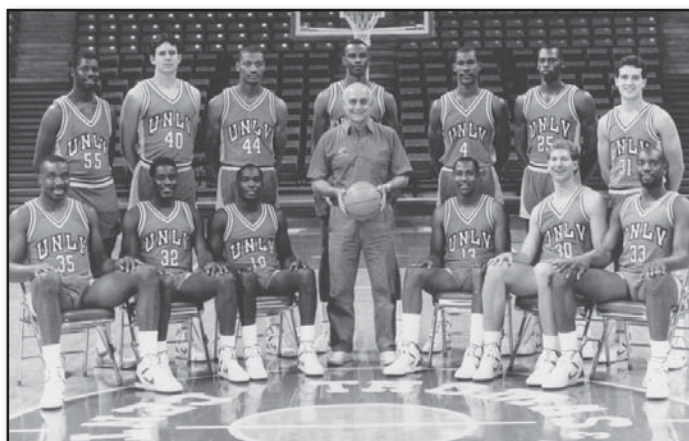

Tim Grgurich became UNLV's seventh head coach on Oct. 22, 1994. He spent 12 years as an assistant coach under Jerry Tarkanian at UNLV (1981-92). He helped Tarkanian's squads advance to the Final Four in 1987, 1990 and 1991, capturing the national title in 1990. In 1994-95, he compiled a record of 2-5 but left the team after seven games due to health reasons. Assistant coaches Howie Landa and Cleveland Edwards served as interim head coaches for the remainder of the season. Grgurich announced his resignation on March 3, 1995. He returned to the Seattle Supersonics, where he was an assistant coach, in July of 1995.

His son, Jay, who was an assistant under his father, led the team the rest of the way and turned in a 6-4 mark, leading the team to the MWC Tournament's championship game and earning a NIT bid for the third straight season.

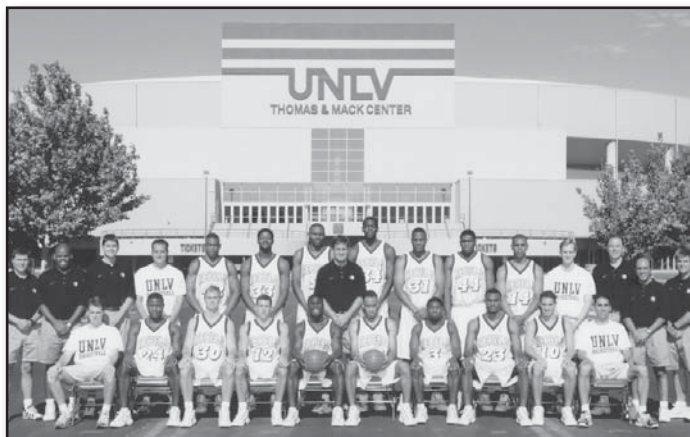

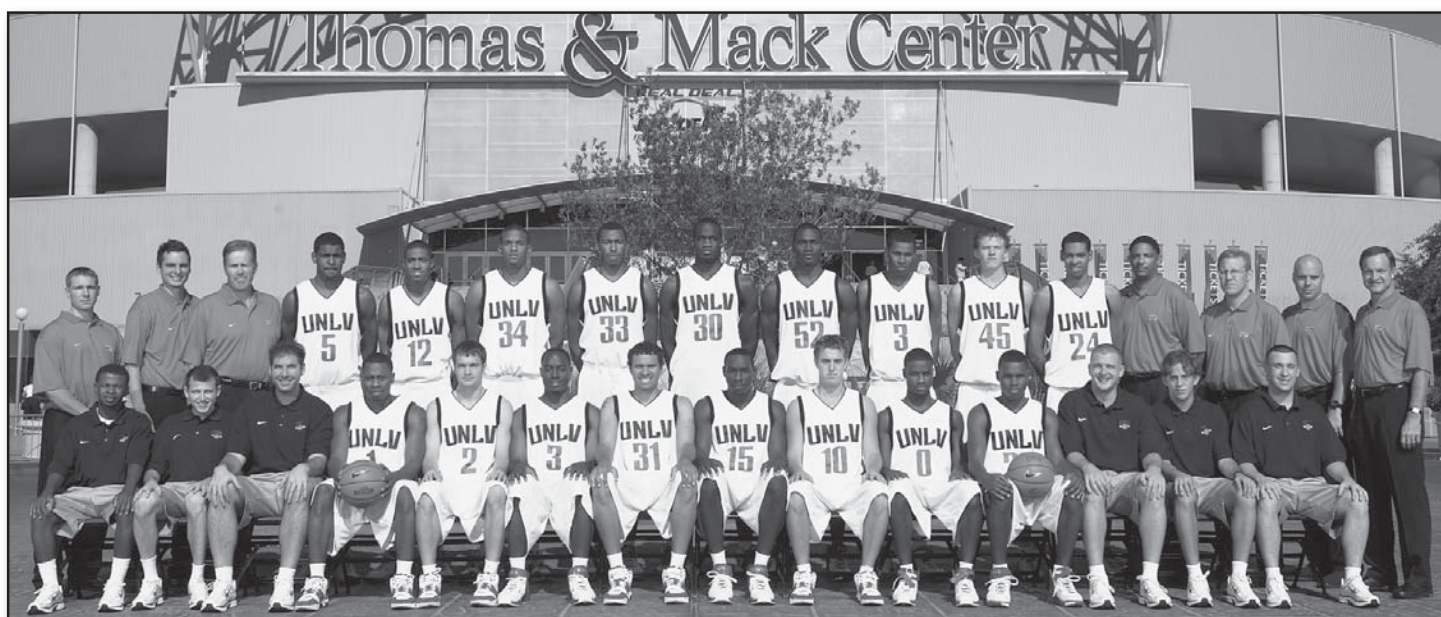

(2004-pres.)

Lon Kruger was hired as the 14th head coach in UNLV men's basketball history (the 10th full-time head coach) in 2004. His first Runnin' Rebel team (2004-05), recorded a 17-14 mark and advanced to the second round of the NIT, marking the program's fourth straight trip to the postseason. In his second season, the team went 17-13 and won 10 MWC games for the first time since 1999-00. His third season was UNLV's best in 16 years as the team finished 30-7 overall, won the MWC Tournament Championship, and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament - the first time for the program since 1991. The 2006-07 Runnin' Rebels also finished the season ranked in the polls (14th in Coaches' and 19th in AP) for the first time in 14 years and recorded a 12-4 MWC mark. In Kruger's fourth season (2007-08), UNLV became the first MWC school to repeat as conference tournament champions and advanced to the NCAA Tournament's second round, losing to eventual national champion Kansas. UNLV won games in back-to-back NCAA Tournaments for the first time since 1990 and 1991 and Kruger earned the league's Coach of the Year award. From 2006-08, UNLV turned in a 57-15 record and went 38-3 at home over that span. Additionally, the Runnin' Rebels finished the 2007-08 season having won 24 straight games at home against MWC foes. A veteran of two-plus decades as a head coach on the collegiate and professional levels, Kruger came to Las Vegas after a four-year stint in the NBA. Following 18 years as one of the nation's most successful college coaches, Kruger spent three seasons as the head coach of the Atlanta Hawks and then part of 2003-04 on the New York Knicks coaching staff.
