UNLV: One of the top booters in school history, he is quickly emerging as a legitimate candidate for the Lou Groza Place-Kicker Award ... A preseason honorable mention All-American by NationalChamps.net ... A preseason first team All-MWC selection by Sporting News, Phil Steele's and Blue Ribbon ... A second team pick by Lindy's and Athlon ... Ranked the No. 9 PK in college football by Sporting News ... A clutch performer who drilled two game winners last year ... Has a chance to own every kicking record in Rebel history ... Already ranks fifth on program's record list with 23 career field goals made ... Heads into junior year ranked first in career extra-point percentage at .980 (48-49) and second in field-goal percentage with .742 (23-31). **2005:** Voted team's special teams MVP ... A two-time MWC Player of the Week honoree ... Earned honorable mention All-MWC ... Made 12-16 field goal attempts, including a pair from 52 yards in the same game ... The 52-yard bombs both came in the fourth quarter against San Diego State with the second one clearing the uprights with nine seconds left, lifting UNLV to a 13-10 win ... Previously added a 41-yard game winner against Idaho as time expired for the Rebels' first win of the year ... Missed his first career PAT in the season opener against New Mexico, but never missed again, hitting on 21-straight attempts ... Handled kickoff duties for the first time in his career ... Led team in scoring with 57 points ... Named preseason second team All-MWC by both Athlon and Lindy's and third team by Phil Steele's. **2004:** Started as a redshirt freshman and made 11-15 field goal attempts, including eight of his final nine chances ... Honorable mention All-MWC ... Led team in scoring with 60 points ... Second Rebel ever to finish perfect in extra points (27-27) in a season ... Broke school freshman records for field goals made, extra points made, kicking points scored in a season and in a game (11 vs. UNR) ... Replaced four-year starter Dillon Pieffer. **2003:** Redshirted. **HIGH SCHOOL:** A 2002 graduate of San Jacinto HS... 2002 honorable mention All-Region by PrepStar ... Selected as a preseason All-America candidate by Street & Smith's ... A three-year letterman for the Tigers as a kicker ... Made 40 of 50 career field goal attempts, which ranked fourth all-time among Golden State prepsters ... Earned first team all-CIF and all-state honors as a senior ... Made 11-16 FGA, which included a 55- and a 57-yarder for coach Bill Powell ... Hit 23-25 PATs and boasted a 92 percent touchback percentage in final season ... Also a standout soccer player for the Tigers. **PERSONAL:** Sergio Aguayo was born on Nov. 30, 1984 ... The son of Yolanda and Arturo Aguayo ... Majoring in university studies.



UNLV: A member of team's group of young, talented receivers ... Penciled in as the co-starter at X receiver spot heading into fall but will also compete at H-back ... Led all receivers with four catches for 48 yards in spring game. **2005:** Earned first letter as a Rebel by appearing in nine games as a true freshman, including starting the final three ... Finished seventh on team with 14 receptions for 205 yards and one score ... First career grab was a five-yarder at Wyoming and first-ever start came vs. BYU ... Breakout game came against Utah when he hauled in four balls for 92 yards, including a season-long 50-yarder ... Scored first career TD vs. Utes on a 10-yard pass from Jarrod Jackson. **HIGH SCHOOL:** A 2005 graduate of Birmingham HS in Van Nuys, CA ... A PrepStar All-West Region honoree at receiver after starring on both sides of the ball for coach Ed Croson ... Named First Team All-San Fernando Valley as a WR by the Los Angeles Times ... Led the Patriots to their second L.A. City Section Championship in three years with a 10-4 final record ... Caught 56 passes for 1,413 yards and scored 10 touchdowns as a senior, averaging an impressive 100.9 YPG through the air ... Caught seven balls for 217 yards in a game vs. Valencia ... Grabbed six for 180 yards and two touchdowns in a playoff game vs. Narbonne ... Returned a kickoff 95 yards for a score vs. Granada Hills ... Also totaled eight interceptions as a DB in the West Valley League. **PERSONAL:** Corey Anderson was born on Dec. 7, 1986 ... The son of Christine and Terry Anderson ... Part of the Immokalee (FL) HS connection forged by UNLV offensive coordinator and former Florida QB Noah Brindise ... A member of the 2006 Rebel Leadership Committee. **2005:** Redshirted. **HIGH SCHOOL:** A 2005 graduate of Immokalee HS ... Helped the Indians to an 11-2 final record and 2A Florida state championship as IHS downed Madison County 17-15 in Gainesville on Dec. 10, 2004 ... 2006 REBEL SIGNING CLASS

UNLV's second football recruiting class under head coach Mike Sanford was announced on the initial day of the national signing period with 25 student-athletes making up the list. The group consisted of student-athletes whose hometowns were spread among 10 states and one U.S. territory across six time zones: eight from California, four from Hawaii, three from Florida, two apiece from American Samoa and Texas, and one each from Nevada, Arizona, Washington, Utah, Oklahoma and South Carolina. After the 2005 class was exclusively from the mainland, this year's haul had a heavy island presence. "We've certainly gone a lot of different places to collect talent," Sanford said. "UNLV is going to continue its commitment to recruit Nevada and California first, but then we are going to get players from places like Hawaii and Arizona and Florida, and now Texas with the addition of TCU to the Mountain West." The recruits list featured 18 true freshmen and seven junior-college players. Three of the JC players signed during December's early period and enrolled at UNLV in time for spring practice. "We have a good mixture of people that are going to help us immediately and building blocks that we will develop for the future," said Sanford. "To build a football program, you work from within and then bring in new blood from the outside and this class brings us a lot of new blood that will help for us for years to come." While split relatively evenly between defense (14 players) and offense (11) this year's class tilts heavily toward linemen on both sides of the ball. In fact, the total of eight offensive linemen may be the most in school history. The breakdown was as follows: 8 OL, 6 DL, 4 DB, 3 LB, 2 WR, 1 RB and one player listed as a DL/LB. "It's a cliché but football games are won along the offensive and defensive lines so we were committed to getting that need met this year and I think we did a great job. Most importantly, we went out and recruited guys who love to play football — high character people who know how to win. There are a lot of guys from teams that played for championships and that was important to us."
