REBELS GEAR UP FOR MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY

With the non-conference slate in the rearview mirror, UNLV women's soccer will begin its Mountain West stretch this weekend, playing its league opener on the road Friday, September 21 at Utah State before returning home for its MW home opener Sunday against Boise State. The Rebels head into their conference slate at 6-2-1 and sit in third in the standings as one of just five teams with two losses or fewer. The Scarlet and Gray will be looking to get back in the win column after Sunday's 1-0 loss at UC Riverside, which ended a four-game win streak and a three-game shutout streak. Despite getting shut out for just the second time this year at UCR, the Rebels still rank in the top-15 in the country in total points (66) and top-six in total assists (24), while their offense remained the top unit in the Mountain West during non-conference play.

Following the road-home split this weekend, the Scarlet and Gray will head out on the road for week two of MW play, taking on Colorado College and Air Force in Colorado Springs, Sept. 28 & 30.

NEWS & NOTES

- The 1-0 loss to UCR ended a four-game win streak and three-game shutout streak.
- The 6-2-1 non-conference record marks the third straight year under Shaw that the Rebels have finished with two losses or less during non-league play.
- Rebels were held to a season-low six shots against the Highlanders, who have only given up one goal in nine games this year. It was just the second time this year the Rebels were held under 10 shots in a single game and marked the first time they had been out-shot by their opponent.
- UCR's goal in the 12th minute was the first scored on freshman keeper Emberly Sevilla in four games - which ended a streak of 357 scoreless minutes.
- UNLV finished its non-conference home slate a perfect 4-0. Since the start of the 2016 season, the Rebels are 20-2-2 on their home field.
- UNLV will be looking to win its conference opener for the first time since 2013 and first time under Shaw, who is 0-4 in MW openers. Rebels are 7-9-3 in MW openers all time.
- The Rebels swept the Mountain West weekly awards on Sept. 11 as Caitlyn Kreutz was named Offensive Player of the Week and Emberly Sevilla was named Defensive Player of the Week, the first career awards for both and first for UNLV this season.
- With a 2-0 win at home against Montana on Sept. 9, head coach Chris Shaw recorded his 55th career win at UNLV to make him the winningest coach in program history, breaking the old mark held by former head coach Dan Abdalla, who went 54-38-8 from 2000-04.
- For the first time since 2013, the Rebels have a new face in goal with the graduation of four-year starter Jordan Sallee. Las Vegas local and freshman Emberly Sevilla graduated high school early to enroll in the spring, earned the starting role and has gone 6-1-1 with three straight shutouts heading into the final non-league game.
- UNLV went 2-0 on the opening weekend of the season for the third consecutive year and for the fourth time in five seasons under head coach Chris Shaw.
- The Rebels won their season-opener for the eighth straight year and are a perfect 5-0 in season-openers under Shaw.
- 2018 marks the 20th season in UNLV women's soccer history.
- The Rebels were picked to finish fourth in the Mountain West preseason coaches poll, marking the second straight year they've appeared in the top four in that poll.
- Shaw entered his fifth season with a 49-29-7 overall record. In 2016, Shaw led the Rebels to MW regular season and tournament titles for the first time in program history in addition to earning the program's third Coach of the Year honor.
- Senior Caitlyn Kreutz played with the Philippine National Team in a World Cup Qualifying tournament in Jordan in April.
- Associate head coach J.J. Wozniak is in his fourth year under Shaw.
- In August, Shaw added former Rebel Michaela Kelsey, who was a senior in 2017, to his staff as an assistant coach, replacing Kaley Shlaes, who served under Shaw the past two seasons.

REBELS IN THE RANKINGS

- **Mountain West:** Rebels continue to rank first in every major offensive statistical category in the MW with 151 shots (next closest is Wyoming with 112), 21 goals, 24 assists and 66 points. UNLV's three shutouts are tied for third, while the Rebels are tied for second with 44 saves. Senior Caitlyn Kreutz leads the team with five goals - four of them game-winners - which both rank second in the MW. Kreutz is also tied with teammate Kaila Brinkman for the second-most points in the league with 10 a piece. True freshman Emberly Sevilla leads the MW in save percentage (.863) and is second with 44 saves.
- **NCAA:** UNLV currently ranks in the top-30 in the country in three categories: tied for 26th in total goals (21), tied for 14th in total points (66) and tied for sixth in total assists (24).

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT

- *Utah State*
 - Have struggled this year at 1-6 with their only win coming over Towson; Have been shut out for three straight games heading into Friday
 - Offense has struggled, scoring just eight goals all year, while the defense has give up 18
 - Rebels may have revenge on their minds after falling to the Aggies 2-1 in double overtime last year in Logan
- *Boise State*
 - The Broncos sit atop the Mountain West after a 6-2 record in non-league play, with their only two losses coming to Arizona and UC Santa Barbara, who are both receiving top-25 votes
 - The BSU offense has been productive with 15 goals (second behind UNLV), while its defense has been stout with four shutouts
 - Boise St is dangerous with reigning MW Player of the Year Raimee Sherle again leading the attack. Sherle currently leads the conference in shots (41), goals (9) and points (18)
 - UNLV was embarrassed in Boise a year ago, with its 6-1 loss being one of its worst under Chris Shaw, which should add fuel to the fire for UNLV

UNLV WOMEN'S SOCCER 20TH SEASON CELEBRATION

The Rebels are celebrating a special milestone this year as 2018 marks the program's 20th season, with the official recognition weekend taking place on Friday, Oct. 5 as UNLV takes on Fresno State at 7 p.m. A special tailgate with free food and drinks will take place in honor of the celebration, while Rebel alum, including the inaugural team, will be invited back to be honored at halftime.
