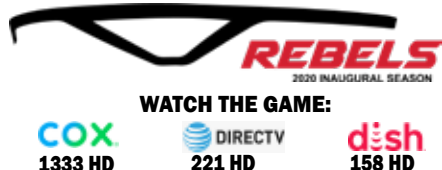

SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (0-2/0-2) plays its first day game of the season when it hosts **Fresno State (1-1/1-1)** Saturday at Allegiant Stadium ... Last week the Rebels debuted at their new home by falling to in-state rival UNR 37-19 while the Bulldogs, who are this week hitting the road for the first time in 2020, downed Colorado State 38-17 on Thursday ... UNLV looks to win its first game under new head coach **Marcus Arroyo** who was hired by UNLV in December after helping Oregon win the Pac-12 Championship (and then Rose Bowl) as offensive coordinator ... Allegiant Stadium is the fourth home of UNLV football (and the closest to campus at three miles away) ... The Rebels downed St. Mary's in their inaugural home game played at old Cashman Field in 1968; won their first game at Butcher Memorial Field vs. Southern Utah in 1970; and lost to Weber State in mid-season 1971 when opening up Sam Boyd Stadium (then known as Las Vegas Stadium), which became the program's home for the next half-century.

REBELS vs. BULLDOGS NOTES...

These programs have played each other as part of three different conferences (Big West, WAC and now MW) ... FS leads the overall series 15-7 but the teams have split their last six meetings ... FS lists two senior players who transferred home after signing with UNLV but never played for the Rebels: LB **David Tate Jr.** and DL **Leevel Tatum III** ... Two first-year UNLV assistants previously coached for the Bulldogs: OL coach **Cameron Norcross** was at Fresno State in 2012-15 and LB coach **Kenwick Thompson** was with the Bulldogs in 2018-19 ... Fresno State cornerbacks coach **J.D. Williams** worked at UNLV in 2015-16.

LIMITED FANS APPROVED FOR FIRST TWO GAMES...

UNLV Athletics' plan to allow a limited number of fans at its home football games at Allegiant Stadium was approved for the first two games by the Southern Nevada Health District as well as the state of Nevada's department of Business & Industry on Oct. 23. Although the Governor's directive for gatherings at stadiums does allow for up to 10% capacity, to comply with restrictions requiring independent section zones of 250 people or less, separated by at least 25 feet that operate and function separately without attendees leaving their zones, UNLV is limited to 3% of capacity which equates to 2,000 patrons. Game attendees must be screened upon entry, be required to wear face coverings and maintain social distance, and follow other health and safety protocols. Plans for games that occur after November 14 must be resubmitted.

yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... When senior **Max Gilliam** took the first snap October 24, he became the 12th different quarterback in the last 17 years to start a UNLV season opener. The man who started the previous three openers, **Armani Rogers**, is now at Ohio University as a graduate transfer. When Rogers went down with an injury in 2018, Gilliam was pushed into the starting role and started seven of his 11 outings that fall. He did not see the field as a junior in 2019 but drew the start against the Aztecs and tossed his 15th career touchdown for UNLV's only points on the night ... Also seeing action against SDSU were quarterbacks **Kenyon Oblad** and **Justin Rogers**. Oblad started the final eight games of 2019 while Rogers was granted immediate eligibility from the NCAA after coming over from TCU where he only appeared briefly in one game, running one series in the Horned Frogs' bowl trip in 2018 ... After a trio of QBs saw action in the opener, UNLV saw Gilliam play every down at QB vs. UNR ... Making his ninth start as a Rebel, Gilliam hit 27 of 40 pass attempts for 207 yards and two touchdowns for a completion percentage of 67.5 ... Freshman WR **Kyle Williams** also completed an attempt on a double pass for 15 yards to TE **Noah Bean** to become the fourth player to throw a pass for UNLV in the first two games ... Another TCU transfer with immediate eligibility is defensive lineman **Adam Plant Jr.**, a sophomore graduate of Bishop Gorman High School who came home to Las Vegas and is listed atop the depth chart at one end spot ... Safety **Tre Caine**, who made his Rebel debut vs. SDSU, is a junior from Michigan who sat out last year after transferring from Colgate where he played two seasons as a WR for the FCS school located in Hamilton, NY. He is currently tied with **Bryce Jackson** for the team lead with 15 total tackles ... Junior DL and former JC transfer **Eliel Ehimare** had two sacks against UNR last week and a third was wiped off the books by a UNLV offsides penalty ... After busting one for 40 yards against SDSU, WR **Tyleek Collins** stands 15th in the nation with a 25-yards-per-attempt kickoff return average ... JC transfer walk-on **Tanner Brown** made his UNLV debut at punter vs. SDSU and after two games sits third in the MW and 16th in the nation with an average of 44.6.

REBELATIONS...

Senior RB **Charles Williams** needs just 33 rushing yards this weekend to pass **Kirk Jones** (2,656 from 1983-86) into fifth place on UNLV's career list ... Despite having made just 21 total starts as a Rebel, the Chuck Wagon heads into the Fresno State game standing 13th in the FBS with 2,624 net rush yards ... Williams, a native of Fresno, has rushed for 356 yards in three appearances against the Bulldogs (118.6 YPG) ... The Rebels converted 5 of 6 fourth-down attempts against UNR and currently rank 15th in the nation at 80% on the year ... UNLV features an entirely new coaching staff in 2020 but one that brings unprecedented combined on-field experience to Las Vegas. Not only is head coach **Marcus Arroyo** the first former Power Five coordinator to take over the Rebels, of his 10 full-time assistant coaches, eight came directly from P5 programs spread out among the Pac-12 (4), Big 12 (2), SEC (1) and Big Ten (1). UNLV's head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator also boast NFL experience on their resumes. Arroyo was the interim offensive coordinator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2014, defensive coordinator **Peter Hansen** spent three years with the San Francisco 49ers in between stints at Stanford, and offensive coordinator **Glenn Thomas** spent six years with the Atlanta Falcons ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 19 years -- believed to be the longest drought in the nation.

The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52

The UNLV football program has a new coach, a new stadium, a new schedule – and now it has a brand new look for the 2020 season. After becoming the Rebels' 12th head coach in history last December, **Marcus Arroyo** went to work with

Nike in creating a new line of uniforms from head to toe that were first worn on the field during the opening game vs. San Diego State. The Rebels wore all white against the Aztecs, including donning white helmets for the first time in their 53-year history.

"I am so fortunate to have developed some deep relationships with some amazing people and pioneers at Nike that inspired me to 'stretch the possible,'" said Arroyo, who moved to Las Vegas after helping lead Oregon to the Pac-12 championship and a Rose Bowl victory as offensive coordinator last season. "With Nike, we have the important opportunity to create these different and personalized combinations, all of which help us share who we are, where we are from, and where we are going together."

The iconic UNLV arch, first introduced by legendary head coach **John Robinson** in 1999, remains but major changes include a move from silver helmets to instead featuring the darker anthracite color. In addition, a fourth color has been introduced up top as the Rebels now have a white helmet as part of their repertoire.

"This is the beginning of a new chapter – a fresh slate -- with a chance to write our own legacy here and to take this program somewhere it's never been," said Arroyo. "Introducing a white helmet is symbolic of our steps into the future."

Each jersey will proudly display REBELS in a custom font along the chest while the pants show off another, smaller UNLV arch opposite the famous Nike swoosh. Also, jersey numbers appear on each shoulder sleeve. Other features include both white and chrome face mask choices and a new, cherry-gloss Rebel Red helmet.

"We live, work and study in Las Vegas, Nevada, which is in The Silver State. According to NASA, Las Vegas, with our city lights on - is the brightest spot on Earth. We need to embrace and be a reflection of that bright image." With four helmets, three jerseys and two sets of cleats, UNLV's new look includes at least 180 possible combinations for game day. "Everything we do in this program, including how we present ourselves, has meaning," said Arroyo.

"The same is true of our uniform choices. The anthracite gray continues the use of a primary school color and is a reminder that we represent the University, faculty and staff, all current and former students – and particularly former players. It's a constant reminder of who we are as a Rebel family."

HEAD COACH @COACHARROYO

Marcus Arroyo was formally introduced Dec. 13, 2019, as the new head coach of the UNLV football program during a media conference at the new, \$34.8 million Fertitta Football Complex on campus. Arroyo, who turned 40 in January, became the 12th man charged to lead Rebel football, after most recently serving as assistant head coach and offensive coordinator at the University of Oregon, which he helped win the Pac-12 Conference Championship and the 2020 Rose Bowl over Wisconsin. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks went 28-12 overall, including winning 15 their last 17 outings. One of his players, offensive lineman Penei Sewell, last season became the first Oregon player to win the Outland Trophy, which is awarded to the most outstanding interior lineman in college football. Arroyo was also instrumental in the development of quarterback Justin Herbert, the Rose Bowl MVP who is now the starting quarterback for the NFL's Los Angeles Chargers. Arroyo's 2018 offense was one of just nine FBS teams to have a 3,000-yard passer, 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver. In 2017 as co-offensive coordinator, he helped Oregon lead the Pac-12 with seven performances of 40-plus points while finishing 12th nationally with 251 rush yards per game.

Arroyo joined Oregon after spending two years as the running backs coach at Oklahoma State, and brought experience as a coach for every offensive position except the offensive line. His second year with the Cowboys, OSU went from averaging 3.6 yards per carry and 126.8 yards per game to averaging 4.52 yards per carry and 170.9 yards per game in 2016. Arroyo was also instrumental in grooming running back Justice Hill, who was the nation's top freshman rusher with 1,142 yards. Hill earned first team All-American honors and was the Associated Press Big 12 Freshman of the Year. Overall, Arroyo helped the Cowboys' offense become one of just two teams in the nation to have a 4,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher.

Prior to going to Stillwater, Arroyo spent the 2014-15 season in the NFL as interim offensive coordinator and play-caller for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He originally went to Tampa Bay to coach quarterbacks, but after a health procedure sidelined Bucs offensive coordinator Jeff Tedford, Arroyo took on the offensive coordinator duties. Arroyo earned the minority coaching internship with the Atlanta Falcons in 2013, working with quarterbacks under head coach Mike Smith and offensive coordinator Dirk Koetter.

Before making the move to the NFL, Arroyo spent the 2013 college football season as the offensive coordinator and outside receivers coach at Southern Mississippi. Arroyo's first stint in the Pac-12 saw him spend 2011 and 2012 as the passing-game coordinator and play-caller at California. He spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns at Wyoming as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, developing quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels into the Mountain West Freshman of the Year in 2009.

Prior to his time in Laramie, Arroyo was the co-offensive coordinator for two seasons and quarterbacks coach for three campaigns at his alma mater, San Jose State. He was the quarterbacks coach and play-caller for the Spartans in 2006, and added co-offensive coordinator duties for 2007 and 2008 under head coach Dick Tomey.

Arroyo began his coaching career with the Spartans in 2003 as an undergraduate assistant coach. He was the offensive coordinator at Prairie View A&M in 2004 before returning to San Jose State as a graduate assistant in 2005.

A native of Colfax, California, Arroyo was a three-year letterman at San Jose State, where he played quarterback from 1998-2002. In 2000, he passed for 2,334 yards and 15 touchdowns while leading the Spartans to seven wins, their most in eight seasons.

Arroyo graduated from San Jose State in 2003 with a degree in kinesiology. He is married to the former Kelly Thoni and the couple has one daughter, Cruz, born in Hattiesburg, Mississippi, in 2013.

A veteran tailback who is the defending regular-season rushing champion of the Mountain West and potential 2020 All-America ... Named to the official 2020 watch list of the Doak Walker Award (top running back) and Maxwell Award (top overall player) ... Named Preseason First Team All-MW by the media, Athlon, Phil Steele's and Street & Smith's, which also listed him as the league's Most Elusive Running Back ... The "Chuck Wagon" currently ranks sixth in school history with 2,624 yards ... Needs 376 more yards to become just the fourth Rebel to reach 3,000 on the ground ... A unanimous choice for Preseason All-MW by preview magazines after earning becoming just the fourth Rebel to lead a conference in rushing yards during the regular season, joining former UNLV backs **Dominique Dorsey** (2004), **Ickey Woods** (1987) and **Kirk Jones** (1984) ... Tied for seventh in school history with nine career 100-yard rushing games and tied for 10th for career rushing touchdowns with 15 ... The top freshman running back in the conference in 2016 earned the starting spot as a sophomore in 2017 but suffered a season-ending injury in the opener and was instead awarded a medical redshirt ... Also an impressive student who already earned his bachelor's degree in May in journalism & media studies and is currently pursuing a master's in general studies ... UNLV's nominee for the 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy, which is most prestigious and desirable academic award in college football ... Voted to the 2019 CoSIDA Academic All-District 7 Team and a member of the UNLV Dean's Honor List for all four previous semesters ... Named Academic All-Mountain West in both 2018 and '19 ... The fourth UNLV running back to be named First Team All-MW, joining **Lexington Thomas** in 2017, **Dominique Dorsey** in 2004 and **Jeremi Rudolph** in 2000 ... His net total of 1,257 yards during the regular season was the seventh-most in school history and ranked 24th in the nation ... His six 100-yard outings include a career-high 186 yards in UNLV's win over San Jose State in the home finale ... His 11 rushing touchdowns ranked second in the MW and tied for sixth in UNLV history.

While there have only been 16 games in history that saw a UNLV quarterback rush for at least 100 net yards EIGHT of those have happened since the start of the 2016 season. That list includes five from former Rebel **Armani Rogers** -- highlighted by a school-record 193-yard effort in a win at New Mexico in 2017. Rogers' 103-yard night vs. UTEP meant he joined **Jason Thomas** as the only Rebel signal-caller to reach the mark three times in a career and then his 122 vs. PVAMU gave him the school record.

STATES OF THE PROGRAM

From Hawaii to Florida, from Alaska to Australia -- the 2020 Rebels come from hometowns spread across the continent and beyond. In fact, no less than 20 different states and two countries were represented on this year's preseason roster. While a vast majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (47) and Nevada (18), a state that continues to become even more fertile recruiting ground is Texas. Currently seven UNLV players are products of the Lone Star State. Meanwhile, nearby Arizona is home to no less than five current Rebels and talent-rich Louisiana, Georgia and Washington state supply four apiece. Hawai'i and Oregon are next up with three Rebels each while Colorado and South Carolina both have two. Florida, Alaska, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Tennessee and Utah all are home to one UNLV player. In addition, new punter **Charlton Butt** became the first Aussie to sign a scholarship

PRIME CHUCK



UNLV senior running back **Charles Williams** was one of just 91 players in the nation named to the Maxwell Award Watch List, which is given to college football's top player at the end of each season. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow** won last year's Maxwell Award. Williams is just the second Rebel in the last six years to earn a spot on

the prestigious annual list, joining former UNLV quarterback **Armani Rogers** in 2018. Williams was previously named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List and a member of the official Preseason All-Mountain West Team. The "Chuck Wagon" was just the fourth UNLV player to have won a conference regular-season rushing title, finished with 1,257 yards and 11 touchdowns as a junior last fall.





FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On Oct. 3, 2019, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC is now the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

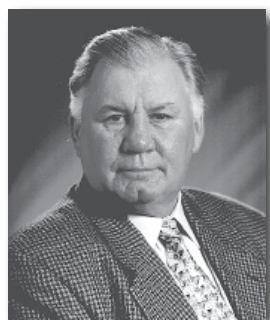
Missing a good number of players for a good number of different reasons, UNLV went young on its trip to play San Diego State in the opener -- really young. No less than 19 players made their debut for the Rebels, including seven true freshmen and two redshirt rookies hitting the field for the first time. A foursome of newbies found themselves in the starting lineup: redshirt **Lief Fautanu** took over at center; **Nohl Williams** debuted at cornerback and had four tackles, one pass breakup and a fumble recovery on punt return; safety **Sir Oliver Everett** totaled three tackles; and wide receiver **Kyle Williams** (who was moved from jersey No. 10 to No. 1 just before the opener) caught three passes for 33 yards. A quartet of transfers from four-year schools also made an impact for UNLV: former Colgate WR **Tre Caine** started on the other side of the ball at strong safety and tied for the team lead with nine total tackles, including one TFL, and one PBU; former TCU player **Adam Plant Jr.** started at DE and picked up his first career sack on the game's opening drive en route to a six-tackle night; fellow-former Horned Frog **Justin Rogers** took over at QB for two drives in the second quarter and completed half of his four pass attempts and added a 12-yard rush; and USC grad transfer **Clayton Bradley** started at left tackle for his new school.

AJIAKE EARNS WIESNER AWARD



Before UNLV's home-opening football game vs. UNR, junior linebacker **Austin Ajiake** (AH-g-kay) was recognized as this year's recipient of the Tom Wiesner Award (pronounced "WEEZE-ner). For the 19th consecutive year, the football team selected the player who best exemplifies the courage, enthusiasm, dedication and toughness of the late Mr. **Tom Wiesner**. Ajiake, out of Fremont, California, is a two-time Academic All-Mountain West honoree. He appears on defense and on special teams for the Rebels and is only the second linebacker to earn the Wiesner. A Wisconsin native and

three-time letterman on the Badger football team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen, philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.

REBELS FALL IN SEASON OPENER

CARSON, CA (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV football finally opened its 2020 season Saturday night and fell 34-6 to San Diego State in a game staged in front of no fans at Dignity Health Sports Park 110 miles north of the Aztecs' campus.

The Rebels, playing for the first time under new head coach **Marcus Arroyo**, used three quarterbacks in the first half but saw the hosts jump to a 27-0 lead at the break. UNLV did not waste time getting on the scoreboard in the second half, however, taking the kickoff and driving 81 yards in 13 plays, capped by Max Gilliam's four-yard touchdown pass to Steve Jenkins for the visitors' only points of the evening.

STAT OF THE GAME:

After SDSU won the first down battle 17-1 in the first half, UNLV controlled the ball in the second half and posted 10 first downs to just four for the Aztecs.

QUOTABLE:

"The guys are obviously upset but we played a really, really good football team tonight. Hats off to coach (Brady) Hoke. (With not much time to prepare) we finally got to see some speed and live tackling and it took some time for us to adjust. We calmed down in the second half and did things we were practicing. We'll do better at that moving forward."

REBEL NOTES

- UNLV wore white helmets in a game for the first time in its 53-year football history. The program started the season as one of just 11 in the FBS to have not done so.
- The Rebels fell to 24-29 all-time in season openers and 6-20 when they happen away from Las Vegas
- Senior quarterback **Max Gilliam** saw the field for the first time since 2018 by making his eighth career start. He finished 13 of 21 for 105 yards and was sacked four times
- Sophomore QB **Kenyon Oblad** and sophomore TCU transfer signal-caller **Justin Rogers** also played in the first half before Gilliam returned. Both completed half of their four pass attempts
- Safety **Tre Caine**, who sat out after transferring to UNLV from Colgate last year, made his first career start on defense and tied for the team lead with nine total tackles
- Another transfer from TCU, Las Vegas native **Adam Plant Jr.**, made his presence felt on his first series as a Rebel, recording his first collegiate sack
- All-time UNLV head coaches fell to 5-7 in their debut games

REBELS DROP ALLEGIANC OPENER

LAS VEGAS, NV (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV football (0-2/0-2) debuted in its spectacular new home at Allegiant Stadium on Halloween night and fell 37-19 to arch-rival UNR (2-0/2-0) in front of the 2,000 fans allowed by health officials - the first large-scale gathering in Southern Nevada since mid-March.

After playing three quarterbacks in the first half alone last week, senior **Max Gilliam** went the distance behind center and finished with a completion percentage of 67.5

Senior running back **Charles Williams** ran for 99 yards, which moved him past Michael Morton (1978-81) into sixth place on UNLV's career list with 2,624

PLAYER OF THE GAME:

Quarterback **Max Gilliam**, making his ninth start as a Rebel, was coolly efficient, hitting 27 of 40 pass attempts for 207 yards and two touchdowns.

STAT OF THE GAME:

UNLV and UNR faced each other on Halloween - the anniversary of the Silver State joining the Union in 1864 - for the first time in the series, which kicked off in 1969.

QUOTABLE:

"I'm proud of some of the improvement, but again we're not into moral victories. It's exciting to come into a great and amazing venue that people worked so hard to get us into, so we're really grateful for that. Allegiant Stadium is amazing and the people that put the blood, sweat and tears into putting this together did a phenomenal job to get this ready for all of us in a really tough time. So we're excited about that. But we're hurting."

- In its first game inside Allegiant Stadium, UNLV wore the same interlocking UN helmet decal that it wore when it opened its last home - Sam Boyd Stadium (then known as Las Vegas Stadium) on Oct. 23, 1971
- UNLV fell to 32-21 in home lid-lifters and saw its two-year win streak snapped
- The Wolf Pack earned the first three points in this year's Silver State Series presented by IBEW Local 401 and Nevada Donor Network. UNLV has won the annual all-encompassing competition between the two schools in seven of its eight years
