SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

No. RV/RV UNLV (7-2/3-1) returns home for the first time in three weeks to host **San Diego State (3-6/2-2)** Saturday night on CBS Sports Network ... The Rebels are attempting to start 8-2 overall for the second consecutive season under head coach **Barry Odom** after winning their school-record seventh consecutive road game last Saturday, 29-27, at Hawai'i ... UNLV has won its first five road games in a season for the first time ever. The Rebs only won as many as five road games in a season just one time previously as the 1984 squad went 5-1 away from Las Vegas ... UNLV, which made its first-ever appearance in the Coaches Poll on Sept. 15 (reaching as high as No. 23) and then joined the AP version for the first time two weeks later, is again receiving votes in both polls this week ... UNLV won its first four games this fall for the first time since 1984 when **Randall Cunningham** was playing QB ... The 16 wins in 23 games under Odom represent the most victories over any two-season span since the Rebels went a combined 16-7-1 in 1984 and '85 ... The Rebels are 9-2 in true road games under Odom after only winning eight total road games in the previous six seasons (8-25) ... All-American WR **Ricky White III** leads the nation with his school-record four blocked punts this season, which is more than any other FBS TEAM in 2024 ... UNLV is tied for third in the nation in turnover margin at plus-12 as the Rebel defense has forced at least one turnover in 21 of 23 games under DC **Michael Scherer** ... The Rebels, who have not committed more than one turnover in any game this fall, have scored an eye-popping 74 total points off TOs while allowing just 14 such points from opponents ... **Caden Chittenden**, who leads the nation with 2.22 field goals PG, needs just two more to tie the league's freshman single-season record of 22 set by redshirt frosh **Matt Araiza** of San Diego State in 2019.

REBELS vs. AZTECS NOTES...

UNLV has played SDSU more than any other original MW team (32 times) and the Aztecs lead the series 22-10 ...The programs, however, did not meet last season after facing off during the previous 24 years ... Four of the last five meetings in this series have been decided by one score as the Rebels look to defeat the Aztecs at home for the first time since 2013 ... UNLV Director of Player Development & Community Engagement **Hunkie Cooper**, a UNLV Athletics Hall of Famer, previously spent eight seasons coaching WRs at SDSU.

MORE REBELATIONS...

The Rebels are 15-1 under Barry Odom when leading after the third quarter and 5-0 this fall when scoring first ... Both UNLV and SDSU are tied for second in the nation with just one lost fumble this fall ... With six more takedowns at Hawai'i, UNLV has already surpassed its QB sacks total from last year (26) with 28 on the season, which ranks third in the MW ... After having just one 100-yard individual rushing game in 2023, the Rebs already boast eight century-mark outings from five different players this fall, including twice having two in the same game (at USU and at Hawai'i) ... Three-time 2024 MW Defensive Player of the Week **Jackson Woodard** is currently fifth in the nation with 1.3 passes defensed per game after posting an eye-popping total of five at USU (2 INT, 3 PBU) ... UNLV is staging a historic season on the scoreboard as its 39.8 points-per-game average ranks seventh in the nation and represents the highest number during any nine-game stretch in program history ... The school record for points per game during a season is 34.9 in 1980 ... Under the current coaching staff, the Rebels have scored at least 40 points 12 times in 23 games and their three games scoring at least 50 points this season is only matched by the 1974 and 1980 squads ... The 41 points UNLV scored in the first half at USU on Oct. 11 were the most scored in any half by the Rebels vs. an FBS opponent ... The 59 points scored vs. Fresno State on Sept. 28 represented the most UNLV has ever scored against a conference opponent in a regulation game. The Rebels finished with 69 vs. Wyoming in a triple-overtime affair in 2016 at Sam Boyd Stadium ... After limiting three of its opponents to less than 70 yards rushing, UNLV sits first in the MW and 22nd nationally with 112.0 yards allowed per outing ... UNLV also leads the league in pass efficiency and sits second in pass efficiency defense ... Since UNLV's change at QB, WR **Ricky White III** has 48

receptions for 637 yards and seven TDs in the last six games and has gone for at least 100 yards in 10 of his last 14 regular-season games ... After bringing in nine in the last six games, the Rebs are tied for sixth in the FBS with 14 team interceptions. In fact, since the beginning of 2022, UNLV's defense has 46 interceptions, which is the most in the FBS during that span (Oklahoma is second with 43) ... With the win at Oregon State, the Rebels earned three victories over "A5" opponents in the same season for the first time ... With a win at Houston and a victory at Kansas, UNLV became the first non-conference team ever to have multiple road wins against Big 12 competition in the same season ... Not counting blocks, UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 23 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... However, when **Jai'Den Thomas** went 90 yards into the end zone vs. Fresno State, UNLV snapped a 13-year drought by returning a kickoff for a score for the first time since **Deante Purvis** sprinted 98 yards to the end zone vs. CSU on Oct. 29, 2011 ... Ray Guy Award candidate **Marshall Nichols** finished with the second-highest season punting average in school history last fall as his 47.1 yards per attempt ranked sixth in the nation and sat only slightly behind 1984 All-American **Randall Cunningham's** 47.5 rate. Nichols is averaging a robust 43.3 this season, which would rank 34th in the nation if he had enough attempts to qualify for the NCAA stats ... UNLV QB

A former head coach in the SEC and one of the nation's top coordinators, Barry Odom was named the new head coach of UNLV's football program on Dec. 6, 2022. Flash forward one year and Odom was the 2023 Mountain West Coach of the Year, the program's first-ever Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award finalist and oversaw the Rebels' first trip to a bowl game in a decade.

Odom came to town and promised the returning UNLV players that he did not move to Las Vegas to launch a long rebuilding job – and he immediately went out and proved it by pushing the team to the nine-victory mark for the first time since 1984, taking five games at home for the first time since 2000 and winning at least four road outings for the first time in two decades.

The Rebels eventually received votes in both major polls, earned a share of the conference regular-season title at 6-2 and grabbed the school's first-ever spot in a Mountain West Championship game – even earning the right to host

the event at UNLV's state-of-the-art home at Allegiant Stadium. UNLV was eventually selected to play in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl vs. Kansas at Chase Field in Phoenix.

In just the first season under Odom, UNLV produced three All-Americans on the field as well as its first-ever First Team Academic All-American. Place kicker Jose Pizano became the first consensus All-American for the program since 1998 and was the Rebels' first finalist for a major college football award (Lou Groza). Wide receiver Ricky White finished third in the nation in receiving yards and shattered multiple school records en route to First Team All-America honors. Kick returner Jacob De Jesus led the nation in total return yards and was tabbed Second Team All-America. Additionally, rookie runner Jai'Den Thomas led the nation among all freshmen with 12 rushing touchdowns as part of school-record 39 team rushing scores that ranked second in the country. In the classroom, the squad turned in a program-record 3.22 Grade Point Average and linebacker Jackson Woodard was voted First Team Academic All-America by the College Sports Communicators.

Odom, 48, became the 13th head coach in UNLV football history but the first with previous head coaching experience on the FBS level since College Football Hall of Famer John Robinson led the Rebels from 1999-2004. In addition to the Eddie Robinson honor, Odom would be named a finalist for the College Football National Coach of the Year and one of three finalists for the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year award.

In 2018, Odom became just the fourth coach in Missouri history to lead the Tigers to a bowl game in two of his first three seasons when Mizzou earned a berth in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. Before being elevated to head coach, Odom returned to Missouri in 2015 as the program's defensive coordinator. Odom's work at Arkansas as defensive coordinator under head coach Sam Pittman included helping 2022's squad earn a bid to the Liberty Bowl one season after the Razorbacks defeated Penn State in the Outback Bowl and earned a final AP ranking of 24.

In between his stints at Missouri, Odom earned his first defensive coordinator job at Memphis in 2012, transforming the Tigers into a defensive power. Odom began his coaching career in 2000 as an assistant coach at his prep alma mater, Ada High School in Oklahoma before taking over as head coach at Rock Bridge High School in Missouri for two seasons. In 2003 he returned to Columbia as a graduate assistant on the staff of Gary Pinkel, the man he would eventually succeed as head coach of Missouri 13 years later.

Born in Lawton, Oklahoma, and raised in Maysville, Oklahoma, Odom lettered four times as a linebacker at Missouri from 1996-99, making two trips to bowl games and serving as team captain during his senior season. He ended his career ranked in the school's all-time top 10 with 362 tackles.

Odom graduated from Missouri in 1999 with a bachelor's degree and earned his master's in education from the school in 2004. He and his wife Tia have two sons, JT and Garyt, and a daughter, Anna. JT is a linebacker at UNLV.

RICKY RECORD BOOK

A former Big Ten Conference wideout who is now a returning All-American as a senior for the Rebels ... College football's leading returning receiver from 2023 with 1,483 yards as a junior ... A Biletnikoff Award, Maxwell Award and conference offensive player of the year candidate who broke multiple school records last fall ... The first UNLV player in history named to the Walter Camp Preseason Player of the Year Watch List ... Named 2024 Preseason First Team All-America by College Football Network and Second Team by AP, The Sporting News, Walter Camp, Athlon Sports and Phil Steele ... Heads into this week's game needing 99 yards to become just the third Rebel to reach the 3,000-yard career mark ... Needs one catch to move into a tie for third in career receptions at the school and five to tie for second place ... His next 100-yard game will tie him with Devonte Boyd (2014-17) for the most in school history with 14 ... Also an academic All-America candidate after earning CSC Academic All-District honors last season ... A member of the UNLV Dean's Honor List in spring 2024 ... A 2024 Mountain West Scholar-Athlete and member of the 2022 and 2023 Academic All-Mountain

West teams ... A team captain who earned his bachelor's degree in human services and is pursuing his graduate certificate as a senior ... Chosen to represent the squad's offense at the annual Mountain West Media Days in Las Vegas in July. **2023:** Named First Team All-America by the Action Network, Second Team by the College Football Network and Third Team by Associated Press, becoming just the second UNLV WR to appear on an AP team in history and first since 1981 ... Shattered a four-decade-old school record for receiving yards in a season and tied the UNLV mark for receptions in season with 88 ... The first Rebel ever to post five consecutive games with at least 100 receiving yards ... His seven 100-yard games on the year ranked second in school history ... Posted a career-high 12 receptions for 165 yards in win over Vanderbilt, including hauling in a 48-yarder to set up the game-winning field goal with just seconds remaining ... The dozen catches rank third in Rebel single-game history ... Got his first two touchdowns of the season on a seven-catch, 166-yard day in win at UNR ... His eight grabs for 165 yards and two more TDs at New Mexico earned him MW Offensive Player of the Week honors ... Turned in 144 yards on eight catches in win over Wyoming, 169 yards on eight grabs, including a 78-yard touchdown, in a victory over Air Force and then 111 yards on five receptions vs. SJSU to close out the amazing streak ... Caught seven passes for 97 yards and a touchdown in the Guaranteed Rate Bowl vs. Kansas. **2022:** Earned his first letter as a Rebel by starting all 12 games ... Transferred in from Michigan State in time for spring practice and reunited at UNLV with his senior-year high school quarterback, Harrison Bailey, who also joined the Rebels for the 2022 season (since transferred to Louisville) ... Led the team with 619 yards on 51 receptions, including four touchdowns ... Made a stunning first impression with his new program by posting 182 yards on eight catches, including

two scores, in season-opening victory over Idaho State ... The 182 yards were the 11th-most ever by a Rebel and the most since 2012 ... Caught four passes for 41 yards at Notre Dame and seven for 62 at San Diego State. **MICHIGAN STATE:** Spent two seasons at the school located in East Lansing. **2021:** Did not appear in a game for the Spartans in what became a redshirt season. **2020:** During true freshman campaign, hauled in 10 receptions for 223 yards in four games ... Averaged 22.3 yards per catch ... Missed final three games of the season due to an injury ... Posted a breakout game at arch-rival Michigan, earning Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week and Pro Football Focus National True Freshman of the Week after record-setting performance against the No. 13 Wolverines on Oct. 3 ... In that outing, set an MSU freshman single-game record with 196 receiving yards on eight catches (24.5 avg.).

FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex in 2019. The project was made possible because of the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged the initial \$10 million toward construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park, which now includes a playing surface installed last summer. The FFC is the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

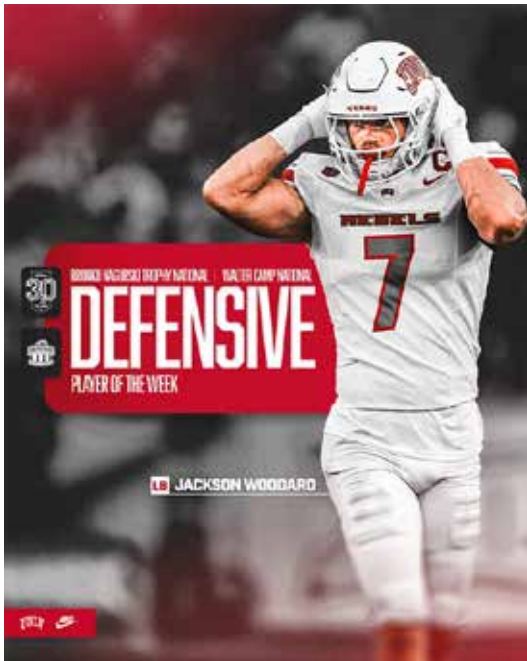

UNLV standout linebacker **Jackson Woodard** began his senior season at UNLV with a bang as the 2024 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year earned his first Mountain West Player of the Week honor after the Rebels' dominating 27-7 win at Houston. The honors kept coming, however, as Woodard (Little Rock, AR) was named the Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week and the Walter Camp Foundation National Player of the Week on defense. This followed him posting a game-high 11 total tackles, including seven solo, and surpassing his entire junior season total in quarterback sacks with three takedowns vs. the Cougars. He would win his second MW Player of the Week honor just two weeks later and then a school-record-tying third such honor in October.

LINEBACKER IS A TRUE TRIPLE THREAT

UNLV senior linebacker **Jackson Woodard** is a candidate for All-America honors on three fronts -- on the field, in the classroom and in the community. He's already accomplished one of those goals as he was the first Rebel football player in history named CSC First Team Academic All-America. Highlighting his work off the field, he is the program's 2024 nominee for both the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy and AFCA Good Works Team. As for on the field, in July he became the second Rebel to earn Preseason Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year honors, joining UNLV Hall of Famer and NFL veteran cornerback **Kevin Thomas** in 2000. Also this summer Woodard became the first Rebel ever named to the official preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Also announced as a member of the 2024 watch list for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (first at UNLV in 20 years) and a member of the Butkus Award Watch List, Woodard was a 2023 First Team All-MW selection after ranking third in the conference with 117 total tackles last fall.

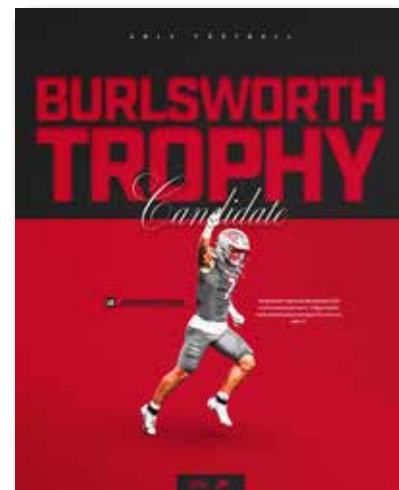

UNLV played its first overtime game in three seasons when it fell to Syracuse, 44-41, on Oct. 4. A full 14 of the program's all-time OT games have come at home (4-10). In 2016, the Rebels broke a two-game losing streak in overtime games with its historic 69-66 victory over Wyoming. It marked the only time that the Rebels won a game that went longer than one overtime period and set a school record for points in extra time with 17. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State.

WOODARD A BURLSWORTH NOMINEE

UNLV linebacker **Jackson Woodard**, already one of the most decorated players in program history, was one of 78 players nominated for the 2024 Burlsworth Trophy, organizers announced Nov. 11. The Burlsworth Trophy is given to the most outstanding collegiate football player who began his career as a walk-on and has shown outstanding performance on the field. Now in its 15th year, the trophy is named in honor of Brandon Burlsworth, former University of Arkansas walk-on and All-American offensive lineman. Burlsworth's story is also the subject of the 2016 movie, "GREATER." The Burlsworth Trophy Award Show to honor the three finalists and to announce the 2024 winner will be on Dec. 9 at Crystal Bridges Museum in Bentonville, Arkansas. Woodard, a senior from Little Rock, Arkansas, was the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and named national defensive player of the week by both Walter Camp and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy after his performance in a season-opening win at Houston. He has already tied a school record by winning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week three times this fall and currently ranks sixth in the nation with four interceptions and fourth in passes defended to go with 9.4 tackles per game, which ranks 15th nationally.



RECORD CROWD!

The UNLV vs. Boise State game on Friday, Oct. 25 drew the biggest home crowd in Rebel history as 42,228 fans filled Allegiant Stadium. That total bested the attendance of 42,074 set at Sam Boyd Stadium vs. Wisconsin in 2002. The previous record for a UNLV game in its new home at Allegiant was 35,193 vs. Iowa State in 2021.

Despite having a nickname of "Jet," running back **Jai'Den Thomas** moved from flying under the radar into becoming the nation's



top freshman scorer a year ago. After holding just the one scholarship offer out of Westlake High School in the Atlanta area, Thomas exploded onto the scene with a dozen rushing touchdowns in 13 games and was the nation's only freshman with more than 11 rushing scores in 2023. Jet's seven-yard TD vs. Wyoming gave him the UNLV single-season freshman record, breaking a tie with former quarterback **Armani Rogers** (2017). This summer he was named to the Watch List for the Doak Walker Award and Jet currently has six TDs in 2024 (four rushing, one receiving and one kickoff return).

UNLV features two sets of brothers this season with defensive backs **Johnathan Baldwin**, a senior, and little bro **Jalen Baldwin**, a redshirt freshman on defense and starting offensive lineman **Anton Ambuehl** (AM-bule), a junior and his twin brother, tight end **Davis Ambuehl**, a recent walk-on who previously played basketball at Ole Miss. UNLV is one of 20 programs with at least two sets of bro-

thers on the roster this fall with, interestingly, six of those schools being members of the Mountain West. In addition, the Ambuehls are one of 11 sets of twins playing together in the FBS. Keeping with the family facts, the Rebels are one of eight programs where the head coach has a son currently on the team as linebacker **JT Odom** is a redshirt freshman for the Rebels. In fact, Barry and JT Odom form the first father-son coach-player combo in UNLV football history.

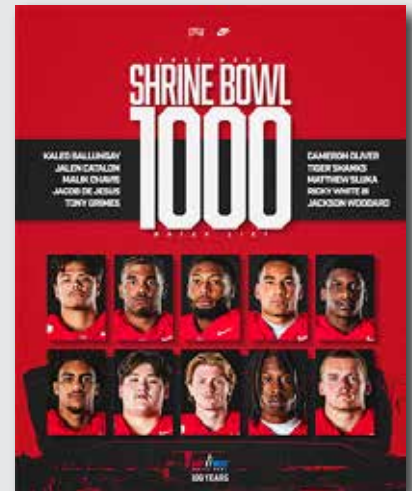

THE BIG TEN

UNLV football placed 10 players on the East-West Shrine 1000 watch list, which was released in July by the annual post-season all-star event. The list consists of the best 1,000 players throughout all of college football who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2025 East-West Shrine Bowl and the 2025 NFL Draft class. The Rebels have twice as many players on the list than any other Mountain West program and are one of only five teams located in the Pacific Time Zone to reach double figures in representatives, joining USC, UCLA, Oregon and Cal. On offense, the list includes wide receivers Ricky White III and Jacob De Jesus; offensive lineman Tiger Shanks; tight end Kaleo Ballungay; and quarterback Matthew Sluka. Defensively, the Rebels included are linebacker Jackson Woodard, and four defensive backs -- Cameron Oliver, Jalen Catalan, Malik Chavis and Tony Grimes. The 100th edition of the East-West Shrine Bowl will take place at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, on Jan. 30, 2025.

RETRO REBELS



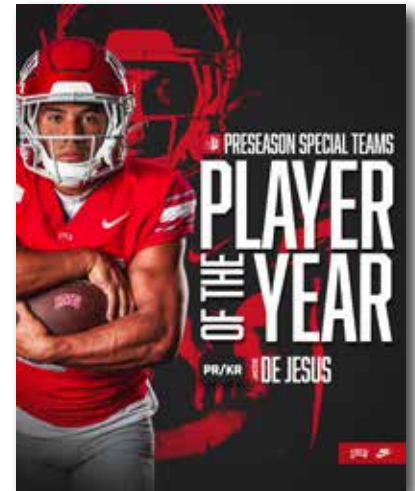
UNLV is now 3-0 under Head Coach **Barry Odom** while wearing a throwback helmet design. In the 2024 home-opening victory over Utah Tech, the Rebels (above) sported a UNLV "sunburst logo" from the 1970s in honor of the 50th anniversary of the 1974 team that went 12-1 and reached the NCAA Div. II semifinals. Those '74 Rebels wore blank red helmets so the modern version used the athletics and university logo from that year displayed in bold Rebel Red on a white helmet. In the 2023 season-opening win over Bryant, UNLV wore throwback helmets (below) featuring the REBELS font from the mid-1980s when future CFB Hall of Famer **Randall Cunningham** was running the offense. Then, in a victory at UTEP, the Rebels sported a decal inspired by the ones that adorned the silver helmets from 1987-89. The block N and Las Vegas script helmets are most remembered as ones worn by legendary Rebel running back **Ickey Woods** when he led college football in rushing with 1,658 yards in 1987 before shuffling off to the Cincinnati Bengals.

TEAM JACOB: SAY HELLO TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S MOST VERSATILE PLAYER

Senior wide receiver/kick returner/punt returner (and sometimes running back) **Jacob De Jesus** -- all five-feet-seven-inches of him -- was one of 48 players named to the official watch list for the 2024 Paul Hornung Award, which annually goes to the nation's most versatile player. De Jesus, who twice made the weekly Hornung Award Honor Roll during his junior season, is the second Rebel to be part of the Hornung preseason list since it was founded in 2010, joining former receiver Tyleek Collins in 2021. In July, De Jesus was named the 2024 Preseason Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year and First Team All-MW at both kick returner and punt returner. A 2023 First Team all-league pick at both return spots, De Jesus led the nation in total return yards with 1,079 last fall. The only player to rank in the top 15 nationally in both kick returns and punt returns was a finalist for the Jet Award and named Second Team All-America by USA TODAY. The wide receiver, who also caught 60 passes as a junior, was tabbed a 2024 Preseason Second Team All-American by ESPN and Phil Steele and Third Team by Athlon Sports. Also on this fall's Watch List for the Jet Award, given to the country's top return man, he was just the second Rebel to earn preseason player of the year on special teams, joining kicker **Sergio Aguayo** in 2006.



CATALON GRABS TWO DEFENSIVE AWARDS

UNLV safety **Jalen Catalon** was honored by the Mountain West on both Oct. 21 and Sept. 30 as Defensive Player of the Week. A transfer from Texas, he earned his first league award after grabbing his nation-leading fourth interception on a stunning play at the Rebel one-yard line vs. Fresno State. He also turned in a game-high 10 total tackles and a pass breakup. He earned his second nod after another 10-tackle night at Oregon State that included a key forced fumble and a quarterback sack. That marked the school-record fifth defensive honor already collected by the Rebels in 2024.

LOCAL PRODUCT BURRELL RUNS AWAY WITH HONOR

UNLV rookie runner **Greg Burrell**, a product of Las Vegas' Desert Pines High School, was named Mountain West Freshman of the Week, the conference announced September 9. The true freshman led all players with 101 net rushing yards in the Rebels' record-setting 72-14 victory over Utah Tech at Allegiant Stadium. It took only 11 carries for Burrell to compile the most yards (since exceeded) in a single game since head coach **Barry Odom's** arrival last season (exactly one yard more than **Jai'Den Thomas** rolled up at UTEP last fall). As one of an eye-popping six different Rebels who ran for a touchdown vs. the Trailblazers, Burrell had a long of 42 yards and scored his first collegiate touchdown from four yards out. His efforts helped his squad earn a school-record 695 total offensive yards and tie for the second-most points in a game. Burrell became the first UNLV non-quarterback to win the MW Freshman of the Week Award, which started in 2021.



ROOKIE BOOTER LEADS NATION IN FIELD GOALS

On October 21, UNLV freshman placekicker **Caden Chittenden** earned not one but two conference weekly awards when he was named both Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week and MW Freshman of the Week. The local product from Las Vegas' Faith Lutheran High School scored 15 points, including a season-best four field goals, in his team's win at Oregon State. It actually marked the second time the rookie won both awards this fall as he was also tabbed on September 16. That was after he scored 11 of UNLV's 23 points in the win at Kansas, nailing three field goals and two extra points. He also kicked off five times and earned a Jayhawk touchback on three of them. Two weeks later, Chittenden won his second of three Freshman nods after scoring another 11 points in the team's 59-14 victory over Fresno State. His day also included eight touchbacks on 10 kickoffs. He currently leads the nation with 20 made field goals and was named a Midseason Freshman All-American by 247Sports. Chittenden, who was UNLV's first kicker to earn a Freshman of the Week nod since the award started in 2021, has already shattered the program record for fields goals in a season, which was 11 by **Sergio Aguayo** in 2004. He is also just two field goals shy of tying the MW freshman record of 22.

WHITE WINS ONE FOR SPECIAL TEAMS

All-American wider receiver **Ricky White III** became the first UNLV player to earn a Mountain West Player of the Week honor in more than one category during his career when he was named the league's Special Teams Player of the Week on October 7. White, who was tabbed MW Offensive Player of the Week during his record-setting receiving campaign on Nov. 6, 2023, earned the nod this time for his work on the Rebels' punt return vs. Syracuse at Allegiant Stadium. In the first half, the senior broke through the line to force an abandoned punt attempt that resulted in a loss of 13 yards and turnover on downs, which UNLV quickly converted into a touchdown. In the second half, White blocked an Orange punt attempt and saw the ball travel backwards more than 40 yards into the end zone where it was recovered for a game-tying touchdown by linebacker **Charles Correa**. White, who also blocked a punt vs. Utah Tech on Sept. 7 and recovered another blocked punt Sept. 28 vs. Fresno State, was the first Rebel to get a hand on two in the same season since running back **Ronnie Smith** did it in 2006. He broke the school single-season mark when he got to another punt in a win at Oregon State to put him in the national lead with three and then added to it with a fourth block in a win at Hawai'i. He became just the second UNLV winner of the MW special teams award who was not a punter, kicker or kick returner, joining tight end **Greg Estandia** who won the award in 2003 after blocking a field goal in a home win over Toledo.



WELCOME BACK

REBELS HONOR 1974, 1994 TEAMS



UNLV celebrated the anniversaries of two of its most historic football teams this fall at Allegiant Stadium. During the Utah Tech game on Sept. 7, the 1974 squad's 50-year anniversary was recognized as members of the NCAA Division II semifinalists, led by quarterback **Glenn Carano**, were on-hand. Those Rebels (above), coached by **Ron Meyer**, went undefeated during the regular-season and still hold the record for most victories at the school with a final mark of 12-1. Three weeks later, the 1994 Rebels came out en masse to celebrate the 30-year anniversary of the most-recent UNLV football conference championship. Led by first-year head coach **Jeff Horton**, the '94 team (below) upset heavily favored UNR in the league finale on November 19 at Sam Boyd Stadium to earn a piece of the conference crown. The thrilling 32-27 final not only returned the fame Fremont Cannon to the southern part of the state but also created a three-way tie at the top of the Big West Conference standings at 5-1 and secured UNLV a spot in the Las Vegas Bowl. The Rebels would finish with a 7-5 overall record by crushing Central Michigan 52-24 in the bowl game on December 15.

RECORD REBELS

After three years of exactly zero honorees, UNLV football set a program record in July when the Rebels earned six total spots on the 2024 Preseason All-Mountain West Team, which was released to kick off the league's annual Media Days at Circa Resort. The Rebel contingent was led by Preseason Co-Defensive Player of the Year **Jackson Woodard** at linebacker and Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year **Jacob De Jesus**, who earned the nod at both punt returner and kickoff returner. Joining them on the All-MW team was senior wide receiver **Ricky White III**, senior offensive tackle **Tiger Shanks** and senior cornerback **Cameron Oliver**. Woodard, a 2023 First Team All-MW selection, was just the second Rebel to earn the preseason player of the year honor on defense, joining UNLV Athletics Hall of Famer and NFL veteran cornerback **Kevin Thomas** in 2000. De Jesus, a 2023 First Team All-MW pick at both return spots, was just the second Rebel to earn preseason player of the year on special teams, joining kicker **Sergio Aguayo** in 2006. The previous high for UNLV players on a preseason All-MW team was four in 2001. The most recent player to earn a spot on the team before this year was running back **Charles Williams** in 2020.

Whitfield**, Director of Athletics **Erick Harper** and Rebel Head Coach **Barry Odom** to unveil the area's new name in front of a throng of media members.

NEW QB1 ON RECORD RUN

UNLV's **Haji-Malik Williams** was one of just 35 players named to the Davey O'Brien Quarterback Class of 2024 on Oct. 29. Each member of the group is now an official candidate to win the 2024 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. After making his first start at the FBS level in Game Four, Williams was named to the Great 8 list of the Davey O'Brien Award and one of eight Manning Award Stars of the Week. Williams dazzled both in the air and on the ground in leading the Rebels to a 59-14 win over Fresno State on Sept. 28 to open Mountain West play. The former Campbell transfer completed 13-of-16 attempts for 182 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for 119 net yards and another score. This all came without a turnover or sack as his team scored its most points ever against a conference opponent in a regulation game. He followed that up by completing 21-of-25 attempts for 227 yards and another trio of TDs through the air and one more on the ground in an OT loss to Syracuse. Williams then took his show on the road, engineering the highest scoring half vs. an FBS opponent in UNLV history as the Rebels led Utah State 41-7 at the break in a 50-34 final. In Logan, HMW completed 13-of-20 attempts for 233 yards and another three touchdowns while rushing for 65 net yards, including a team season-long 62-yard sprint down field to set up a field goal. He became the first UNLV quarterback in history to throw for at least three touchdowns in each of his first three starts behind center and his pass efficiency number ranks ninth in the nation this week. Counting his six rushing scores, Williams' 19 total touchdowns amassed in just six starts currently rank sixth in the Mountain West.



MOORE HONORS

UNLV football on made its first-ever appearance as one of 22 members named to the 2024 Midseason Honor Roll of the Joe Moore Award, which is presented annually to the most outstanding offensive line unit in college football. UNLV's offensive front, overseen by second-year assistant coach **Vance Vice**, was cited by the committee for posting the most rushing yards for any team this season (504 against Utah Tech), having allowed only six total sacks (through five games) for an offense that averaged 13.5 yards per pass attempt (third in the FBS), and helped the team average 50 points in the three games after having to start a new quarterback.



WOODARD MAKES IT THREE

UNLV standout linebacker **Jackson Woodard** became just the second Rebel football player in history to earn three Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week honors in the same season, the league announced Oct. 14. In UNLV's 50-34 win at Utah State, Woodard (Little Rock, AR) made 12 total tackles, including a half-tackle-for-loss, was responsible for three turnovers and posted a stunning five passes defended, which ties with one other player in the country for the most in the game this season. His night in Logan included recovering a fumble and grabbing two interceptions – all of which led to 17 points for the Rebels. Woodard, who joins former Rebel linebacking great **Beau Bell** (2007) in earning three MW nods, is now tied for sixth in the nation with four interceptions and fifth in the country in passes defended per game. The team captain also ranks 15th nationally with 9.4 tackles per game.

WOODARD MAKES HISTORY

UNLV linebacker **Jackson Woodard** is one of 16 finalists for the William v. Campbell Trophy and will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship as a member of the 2024 National Football Foundation National Scholar-Athlete Class Presented by Fidelity Investments®. The NFF and College Hall of Fame made the announcement Oct. 23 about college football's premier scholar-athlete award that annually recognizes an individual as the best in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. The first UNLV player to be named a finalist, Woodard is the recipient of the General Robert R. Neyland Scholar-Athlete Award, endowed by the Haslam Family Foundation. 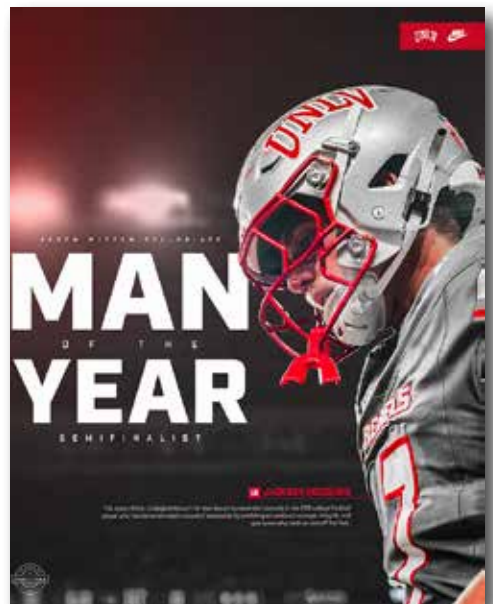
UNLV TAKES NINTH ISLAND SHOWDOWN AGAIN

Beginning with the 2017 game in Las Vegas, which the Rebels won 31-23, the UNLV and Hawai'i football programs now annually take part in the Ninth Island Showdown. Sponsored by The California Hotel, the winner of the Mountain West matchup gets rights to the Island Showdown Trophy, which includes both a pineapple – a Vegas-style gold pineapple – and a variation of the Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas sign. Las Vegas has earned the nickname "The Ninth Island" for its long-standing popularity with Hawaiian visitors and transplants. The Rebels improved to 2-0 in the rivalry contest under head coach **Barry Odom** after their 29-27 win in Honolulu on Nov. 9, which marked just the fourth UNLV victory on the islands in history and first since 2016. UNLV and Hawai'i first squared off in football on Oct. 25, 1969, which marked just the second year of existence for the Rebel program. The schools have faced each other 34 times with the Rainbow Warriors leading the all-time series 19-15. This marked just the second rivalry trophy for UNLV, which also plays each fall against in-state rival UNR for rights to the famous Fremont Cannon.



WOODARD A WITTEN SEMIFINALIST

UNLV LB **Jackson Woodard** is one of 20 semifinalists for the eighth annual Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award, announced Oct. 22. The Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award is presented annually to the FBS college football player who has demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field. The award honors the type of exemplary character and commitment to community, family and teammates demonstrated by **Jason Witten**, the 2012 NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year. Three finalists will be named on December 16 and the winner will be announced at the award ceremony at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, on Feb. 12, 2025. Woodard, a senior from Little Rock, Arkansas, was the league's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year has already tied a school record by winning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week three times this fall. The former walk-on at Arkansas is also a member of the official watch lists for the Nagurski Trophy as well as the Butkus Award and Chuck Bednarik Award. The first First Team Academic All-America winner from UNLV football, the two-year team captain was also on the watch list for the Wuerffel Trophy and the team's nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team for his work off the field.

REBELS ROLL IN SEASON DEBUT AT HOUSTON

HOUSTON (UNLVRebels.com) – Opening a season on the road for the first time since 2020, UNLV football (1-0) started 2024 in dominating fashion, winning 27-7 at Big 12 Conference opponent Houston (0-1) Saturday night before 25,750 fans at TDECU Stadium.

Led by a suffocating defense that logged six quarterback sacks, second-year head coach Barry Odom became the first UNLV coach to win his first two season-opening games since Tony Knap did it in 1976-77.

The Rebels, who won on the road to kick off a season for the first time since 2007, held the Cougars under wraps for nearly the entire game, as UH didn't score until one minute left after not reaching the 100-yard mark in total offense until five minutes remained in the third quarter.

All-America candidate linebacker Jackson Woodard had three sacks as part of his 11-tackle night while a new Rebel, transfer safety Jalen Cataton, had two interceptions, including one he returned 36 yards for a touchdown.

Transfer Matthew Sluka started the game after a camp-long quarterback competition and threw a pair of first-half touchdowns to returning All-American Jacob De Jesus, as the Rebels led 14-0 at halftime.

Freshman Caden Chittenden kicked two field goals for the visitors' other six points as UNLV beat a Big 12 opponent for the first time since getting by Iowa State in overtime on Sept. 20, 2008.

REBEL OF THE GAME: How do you pick between two defenders after such a stunning effort? Woodard had a game-high 11 tackles, including a career-high three sacks, while Cataton hauled in his first two interceptions as a Rebel, including the eye-popping pick-six where he tipped himself the ball.

STAT OF THE GAME: At halftime, UNLV led UH in total yards 252-59.

QUOTABLE: "I thought defensively, we played relentless all night. And I thought up front on the offensive line, we controlled the game. We did enough playing complimentary football to win a game on the road in the Big 12. Scratching the surface of where we're gonna go from there. Now there's a huge opportunity for us to go back home and play in Vegas, play in Allegiant. We're really excited about the opportunity to do that and play in front of our crowd. I want to thank the families and the fans we had that came tonight. You could hear them and feel 'em and that's fun when it's on the road."

RECORD OFFENSE PUSHES REBELS TO 2-0

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Improving to 2-0 for the first time in a quarter century, the UNLV football team set a record with 695 total offensive yards in a 72-14 victory over FCS visitor Utah Tech (0-2) Saturday afternoon.

Playing in front of the program's biggest home-opener crowd since hosting UCLA in 2015, UNLV students showed up in record numbers at Allegiant Stadium to help make up the 24,512 in attendance. That crowd also included members of the 1974 UNLV team that was honored at halftime to celebrate the 50-year

anniversary of that squad's 12-1 season, which ended in the NCAA Division II semifinals.

Ricky White III dominated the first quarter against the Trailblazers, who were facing the Rebels for the first time in football. The All-American senior receiver hauled in three touchdowns in the opening stanza and finished with 111 yards on five catches to go with a blocked punt on special teams.

Matthew Sluka was the first of a trio of quarterbacks to play and netted 70 yards on the ground, including a 30-yard touchdown scamper, to go with his three TD throws. Haji-Malik Williams started the second half behind center and ran 10 times for 88 yards while not attempting a pass. Cameron Friel closed things at QB, including rushing for a score.

UNLV broke the 500-yard rushing mark for only the third time in school history (504) while six different players rushed for a touchdown. In fact, no less than a dozen different Rebels carried the ball at least once, led by true freshman Greg Burrell out of Las Vegas, whose 101 yards on 11 carries included a TD and marked the most rush yards by a UNLV player in a game under second-year head coach Barry Odom.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Ricky White III didn't play long – but made a huge impact – hauling in three touchdowns in a span of eight minutes (5, 55 and 7 yards) and was rewarded for his work on special teams with his first career punt block, which led to a Rebel field goal – all in the first quarter.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's 695 total yards (504 rush, 191 pass) of offense bested the 671 racked up against Idaho in 1977.

QUOTABLE: "We are excited offensively, defensively, on the progress that we made from week one to week two. It's now a race to Friday night and we are certainly excited about being 1-0 at home and 2-0 on the season. It's a short week - it's a sprint with no finish line and our guys will get to work pretty quickly."

REBELS WIN THRILLER AT KANSAS TO STAY UNDEFEATED

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Playing on Friday the 13th for the first time in history, UNLV improved to 3-0 for the first time in 40 years with a come-from-behind 23-20 win at Kansas (1-2) in front of 21,493 fans at Children's Mercy Park.

The game, which was played at the home of the MLS Sporting Kansas City because of construction on the Jayhawks' stadium in Lawrence, was shown nationally on ESPN as the Rebels improved to 2-0 against Big 12 Conference opponents this fall (also defeated Houston 27-7 on August 31).

UNLV's record on Fridays moved to 11-13-1 all-time as running back Kylin James pushed into the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the one-yard-line with under two minutes remaining. It was the visitors' first lead of the evening after methodically rallying from a 17-6 deficit in the second quarter. The Rebel defense then squashed KU's final drive.

Quarterback Matthew Sluka rushed for 124 net yards on 19 carries and threw a 31-yard touchdown to running back Jai'Den Thomas as time expired in the first half to spark the comeback.

UNLV grabbed a pair of key interceptions, one by Jalen Catalon, his third of the season, and one by Jackson Woodard, who led all tacklers with 11 total tackles, including 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

Caden Chittenden made three of his four field-goal attempts to keep his team close as the freshman from Las Vegas accounted 11 total points.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV turned in a memorable, gargantuan, 18-play, nine-minute-22-second scoring drive in the fourth quarter that covered 75 yards to finally find the end zone in the second half and earn the hard-fought victory.

QUOTABLE: "Number one, I'm proud of our team and I'm proud of our assistant coaches for putting together what I thought was a really great plan in all three phases. Early on it was tough sledding. It was ugly. Kansas is a good football team. We had to stay in the fight and just found a way. Kids made plays -- (Jackson) Woodard's interception, (Jalen) Catalon's interception -- and had the grittiness to go get first downs when we needed to. Special teams play was huge and how important it was to get the touchback on that last kick. Then the players, all the credit to them on going and making huge impact plays, when we needed them. And I thought our pass rush in the second half, we affected the throws. And Coach (Mike) Scherer and his staff did a great job of putting a plan together in the second half to stop the run and we did just enough."

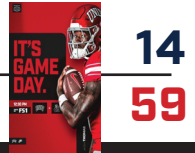

RANKED REBELS ROLL OVER BULLDOGS TO START

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Playing for the first time in 15 days, No. RV/23 UNLV (4-0/1-0) opened Mountain West play by dominating Fresno State (3-2/1-1) 59-14 in front of 24,638 fans at Allegiant Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels are undefeated through the first four games for the first time since 1976 after excelling in all three phases. Quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams made his first start at UNLV and dazzled in the air and on the ground, completing 13-of-16 attempts for 182 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for

119 net yards and another score.

Ricky White III caught 10 passes for 127 yards and a pair of touchdowns and also scooped and scored on a blocked punt by Rashod Tanner for another trip to the end zone. Special teams actually accounted for two touchdowns for the home team as running back Jai'Den Thomas also returned a kickoff 90 yards for a score in the fourth quarter.

On defense, UNLV posted four interceptions in a game for the first time since picking off five at Utah State on Sept. 24, 2022. All four interceptions were by different players. Safety Jalen Catalon's interception gave him four on the season to go with a game-high 10 total tackles.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Hajj-Malik Williams, who is in his sixth season after transferring from FCS-program Campbell, completed 81.3-percent of his passes, did not get sacked and averaged 9.9 yards per rush in his debut as a starting quarterback on the FBS level.

STAT OF THE GAME: The 59 points represented the most UNLV has ever scored against a conference opponent in a regulation game. The Rebels finished with 69 vs. Wyoming in a triple-overtime affair in 2016 at Sam Boyd Stadium.

QUOTABLE: "What a great win. Exciting for our team in starting conference play. The challenge for us was to start fast this week, win the turnover margin and go in attack mode in all three phases. I thought we did. We have a mature team, the things that they handled and the way we prepared, not only during the bye week, but then in the game week, carried over. I thought we played fast and with a lot of confidence. "It's a very short week for us because of the Friday night game against Syracuse, so we need to turn the page very quickly. I'm excited that we get to play at home in Allegiant Stadium Friday night at 6 o'clock, and our guys will flip the page. I can tell in the locker room, they are ready to do that. We are excited about being 1-0 in the conference and the 4-0 start and for what our team did in how we effectively played the game from start to finish."

REBELS DROP HEARTBREAKER IN OVERTIME TO SYRACUSE

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – No. 25/23 UNLV (4-1/1-0) football closed its non-conference schedule with a heartbreaking 44-41 overtime loss to Syracuse (4-1/1-1) in front of 31,329 boisterous fans at Allegiant Stadium Friday night.

In the first-ever meeting between the schools, the Rebels rallied from a pair of double-digit deficits to take a 38-31 lead with under three minutes left but the Orange dodged disaster multiple times on a game-tying, 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to send it to OT. UNLV got the ball first and kicked a 41-yard

field goal before Syracuse scored the final touchdown to end it.

Syracuse raced to a 14-0 lead before UNLV rallied with 21 consecutive points and eventually led at halftime, 21-17.

All-American wide receiver Ricky White III caught 10 passes for the second consecutive week, this time for 135 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown to put his team up 38-31. White, who is also a mainstay on special teams, blocked one punt that was recovered for a UNLV touchdown after using his speed to force the Syracuse punter to abort an attempt and be tackled for a 13-yard loss earlier in the game.

UNLV quarterback Haji-Malik Williams, making his second start as a Rebel, was precise again, completing 21-of-25 pass attempts for 227 yards and three scores while adding 53 net yards and a TD on the ground. The 84-percent pass completion percentage was just short of the school record of 86 percent set by Caleb Herring in 2013 (24 of 28).

Defensively, safety Jalen Catalan posted 17 total tackles with a pass breakup while linebacker Jackson Woodard added 14 takedowns to go with two pass breakups and a key interception to thwart an Orange scoring threat in the fourth quarter.

REBEL OF THE GAME: In just 31 games played for the Rebels, Ricky White III moved into seventh place on the UNLV career receiving yards list with 2,490. He also moved into a tie for third place at the school with 11 career 100-yard games and a tie for sixth with 18 TD catches. He also became the first Rebel to block at least two punts in the same season since running back Ronnie Smith had two in 2006.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV was penalized for 108 yards compared to 56 for Syracuse.

QUOTABLE: "It's heartbreaking. I hate it for our team that we couldn't pull that one out. What an unbelievable environment tonight. I'm really thankful for the city responding the way they did."

REBELS EARN FIFTH STRAIGHT ROAD VICTORY

LOGAN, Utah (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (5-1/2-0) football won a fifth straight road game for the first time in its history, 50-34 over Utah State (1-5/0-2) at Maverik Stadium Friday night.

The Rebels turned in a record-breaking first half to blow the game open early as they won a second consecutive trip to Logan for the first time ever in a series that kicked off way back in 1971.

All-American WR Ricky White III was nearly unstoppable early, catching six passes for 128 yards

and two highlight-reel touchdowns as UNLV rolled up 367 yards before halftime. White would finish with seven grabs for 138 on the night. The Reb defense turned a trio of first-half Aggie turnovers into 17 points as LB Jackson Woodard had a fumble recovery and interception during the first two quarters alone.

Jet Thomas became the fourth different Rebel this season to reach 100 net yards rushing in a game with a career-high 139 on 17 carries just one season after being the only UNLV player to hit the century mark in 2023. Kylin James later became the fifth Rebel to finish with 100-plus yards with 105 on 13 attempts, including two early touchdown runs that helped set the tone. James also added a 24-yard kickoff return.

QB Haji-Malik Williams gutted out a 233-yard night on 13-of-20 passing that included a trio of touchdowns. He also finished with 65 net yards on 14 carries despite losing 40 yards on sacks.

UNLV led USU by 34 points at halftime but the Aggies outscored their guests 27-9 after the break.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Preseason MW Defensive Player of the Year Jackson Woodard was all over the field – and stat sheet. He turned in 12 total tackles, including one-half TFL, grabbed two interceptions, recovered a fumble and added three pass breakups vs. the Aggies.

STAT OF THE GAME: The 41 points were the most ever scored in any half of football by UNLV vs. an FBS opponent and overall trailed only the 52 vs. Idaho State in 2015 and 42 vs. Jackson State in 2016.

QUOTABLE: "Our turnovers on defense were huge because if we don't get those it could've been more points for them. We're excited to be 5-1 after six games. This is the first time in school history (we have won five straight road games), so I'm excited about that. Proud of our guys' effort. We have a lot to get cleaned up and fixed, but we also understand winning is hard and we've got to find a way to do it. It took good team effort in all three phases to get that done."

REBELS WIN SIXTH STRAIGHT ROAD GAME, GOING BOWLING

CORVALLIS, Oregon (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-1/2-0) football won its school-record sixth consecutive road game Saturday night, 33-25 over Oregon State (4-3/0-0), to become bowl-eligible in consecutive seasons for the first time ever. Trailing by 11 early, the Rebels posted 27 unanswered points to take control in front of 35,195 fans at Reser Stadium.

UNLV, which improved to 4-0 on the road to start a season for the first time ever, also downed its third Power Five opponent this fall – also a first.

OSU scored on its first three possessions to build a 17-6 lead with under three minutes remaining in the second quarter but UNLV QB Haji-Malik Williams found the end zone from two yards out, which spurred the rally. His nine-yard sprint to the end zone in the third quarter gave the visitors their first lead of the night.

Williams' lone touchdown throw, a 22-yarder to Ricky White III, ballooned the lead to 33-17 in the fourth quarter before OSU scored a TD and made a two-point conversion. The Beavers eventually got the ball back on a turnover and finished the game on the UNLV six-yard line when time ran out and the Rebels earned their first victory over a Pac-12 Conference school since winning at Arizona State in 2008.

UNLV, which had six QB sacks compared to just one by OSU, was led defensively by Antonio Doyle's 3.0 sacks to go with 10 total tackles. Safety Jalen Catalan also had 10 tackles and ripped the ball loose from a runner to force UNLV's only turnover of the night. That fumble, recovered by Cameron Oliver set up the Rebels to take a lead they would never relinquish.

REBEL OF THE GAME: White III blocked his school-record third punt of the season. It was also UNLV's fourth punt block as a team in 2024. White's key play set up a Rebel field goal right before halftime to bring them to within one point at the break, 17-16.

STAT OF THE GAME: Freshman kicker Caden Chittenden continued his All-America-level season by scoring 15 points – nailing all four field goal attempts and three extra points. He now has made 17-of-19 attempts on the year to continue to build on his UNLV freshman season-total record.

QUOTABLE: "We took a step forward today as a program. I'm really happy for our team finding a way to get that win against what I think is a good football team. I thought our offense handled the atmosphere, the noise and the things with the crowd in the great environment"

UNLV FALLS JUST SHORT AGAINST BRONCOS

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-2/2-1) football lost a tight first-place battle with No. 17/19 Boise State (6-1/3-0), 29-24, before a record crowd of 42,228 fans Friday night at Allegiant Stadium.

The Rebels bolted to a 10-3 lead but the Broncos outscored the hosts 17-0 in the second quarter, powered by the lone turnover in the game, a Rebel interception that was converted into a touchdown right before halftime. It marked just the second time this season that UNLV allowed points off a turnover and the game was just the second in the Barry

Odom era where the Rebels failed to grab an interception or fumble.

The Rebels regained the lead with a 14-3 third quarter but failed to score in the last period while the Broncos got a one-yard scoring run from Ashton Jeanty on fourth down with 12:38 remaining for the final points of the game.

Jeanty, who came in averaging a nation-leading 208 yards per game, was largely held in check, finishing with 128 net yards on 33 carries for a per-rush average of just 3.9 yards.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Punter Marshall Nichols posted a season-best 50.5-yard average on four attempts, including a season-long 63-yarder. The junior ranks among the career leaders at both UNLV and in the Mountain West.

STAT OF THE GAME: The crowd of 42,228 broke the school record set in 2002 when 42,075 were on hand at Sam Boyd Stadium to watch Wisconsin down UNLV. The previous high mark for a Rebel game at Allegiant Stadium was 35,193 vs. Iowa State in 2021.

QUOTABLE: "I want to say thank you to the city of Las Vegas and I want to say thank you to all the work that our marketing staff did as well as our athletic department. It took everybody to pull off an environment like tonight. That was a big-time game and was created not only because Boise State is a really good team, but because so is UNLV. It was two great teams going at each other.

"I figured it would come down to turnover margin and having to find a way to win in the fourth quarter. I am devastated for our team that we couldn't find a way to win that one. There are always reasons why you win a game or you lose one, and the takeaway that they created and then turned into points right at the end of the first half, we didn't play real well as a team, but our guys battled. There is no consolation. We lost the game, and I'm frustrated as a head coach that I couldn't get us in position to go win that."

REBELS WIN AT HAWAII, STAY PERFECT ON ROAD

HONOLULU (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (7-2/3-1) football improved to 5-0 on the road for the first time ever and won its school-record seventh straight away game dating back to last season with a hard-fought 29-27 final at Hawaii (4-6/2-3) before a rain-swept crowd of 12,691 fans Saturday night at Clarence T.C. Ching Complex.

The Rebels improved to 15-1 under second-year head coach Barry Odom when leading after the third quarter, powered in part by a pair of 100-yard rushers who each also had a rushing touchdown

– quarterback Haji-Malik Williams (122) and running back Jet Thomas (109).

UNLV led throughout the first half but held just a two-point advantage, 12-10, at the break in the back-and-forth affair. The visitors eventually built a nine-point advantage in the fourth quarter before UH struck back to pull within two again. However, the Rebels bullied the ball down field on the ground on a decisive drive to run out the clock and give UNLV just its fourth win in 17 all-time trips to the islands.

Defensively, All-America candidate linebacker Jackson Woodard had 2.5 of UNLV's nine tackles-for-loss while DB Johnathan Baldwin contributed one of the team's six sacks and grabbed an interception for the game's only turnover.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Ricky White III continued to move up the UNLV record books with a seven-catch, 128-yard night that included a key 37-yard touchdown. The team captain, just in his third season in Las Vegas after transferring from Michigan State, is second in 100-yard games (13), tied for third in touchdown receptions (22) and third in career receiving yards (2,901).

STAT OF THE GAME: White III's blocked punt, which resulted in a UNLV safety, added to his school single-season record – now a nation-leading four.

QUOTABLE: "We knew it was going to be a tough challenge. It's hard to win. We know that we left 14 points out there. Obviously, if we would have taken care of business there, I think we could have broken (the game) open early. We battled back and made enough plays. Great credit to a team that found a way to win in a place that UNLV hasn't won at very often. We'll build on it. We're 7-2 with three games left in November to do something really special."

- UNLV's safety was its first since a similar blocked punt out of bounds by Spencer Briggs vs. North Texas on Sept. 17, 2022
- Caden Chittenden made two of four field-goal attempts to give him 20 on the season, which ties for third in school history
- UH is UNLV's oldest current rival as they faced each other for the first time in year two of the Rebel program in 1969
- Seven of the last 12 games between these two teams were decided by one score
- UNLV had two non-offense touchdowns wiped out by penalty in the first quarter. A long kickoff return for a touchdown by DeAngelo Irvin Jr. (holding) and a pick-six by Antonio Doyle (roughing the passer)
