## FRIDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (8-2/4-2) will play its final home game of the regular-season by welcoming Hawai'i (7-3/4-2) on Friday night in the annual Ninth Island Showdown sponsored by The California Hotel ... This marks the only back-to-back home games of the season for the Rebels, who will honor their group of seniors before kickoff ... UNLV is 14-16-1 all-time on Fridays, including a win at Sam Houston in August ... UNLV has now received at least one vote in either the AP or Coaches' poll for the 31st time in the last 32 polls ... The Rebs have earned bowl-eligibility for the third straight season for the first time ever and have eight wins in the first 10 games for the third consecutive season ... UNLV leads all of college football with 10 road wins since the start of last season and are tied for the ninth-most wins in the FBS since the start of the 2024 season ... Head coach **Dan Mullen** was the first UNLV coach to begin his career in Las Vegas 6-0 since the program's inaugural season of 1968 when original coach **Bill Ireland** started 8-0 on the Division II level ... UNLV is tied for 19th overall in turnover margin at plus-7 and 12th for interceptions brought in with 12 and eighth with three defensive touchdowns ... Since falling 35-7 at eventual national champion Michigan in the second game of 2023, UNLV has scored at least 20 points in each of its last 32 regular-season games. That's the second-longest active such streak in the FBS, behind only Memphis (47 straight).

## REBELS vs. RAINBOW WARRIORS NOTES...

Hawai'i leads the overall series 19-15 but the Rebels have won 12 of the last 21 meetings, including the last two ... The home team has won this matchup in 13 of the last 16 years with only UNLV's 2016 and '24 wins in Honolulu and UH's 2019 win in Las Vegas bucking the trend ... Seven of the last 12 games have been decided by one score ... Among FBS teams, only UNR is as old a Rebel rival as Hawai'i -- both schools first played UNLV in 1969, which was just the second year of the Rebel program ... UNLV has four players who graduated from Aloha State high schools: QB **Cameron Friel** (Kailua HS), LBs **Blesyng Alualu-Tuiolemotu** (Campbell HS) and **Kamuela Kaiaihue** (Roosevelt HS) and DB **Kela Moore** (Ewa Beach HS) ... UH HC **Timmy Chang** faced UNLV twice as a record-setting QB for the Warriors, throwing for a combined 716 yards but losing both times to the Rebels (2000 and 2003) ... UH DB **Kilinahe Mendiola-Jensen** played at UNLV in 2021-22 ... UNLV DL coach **Ricky Logo** was an assistant coaching the same position at UH from 2018-19.

## REBELATIONS...

The Rebels saw their five-game home win streak snapped vs. New Mexico on Nov. 1 but have still won 15 of their last 20 outings in Las Vegas ... UNLV, which sits 16th in the nation with what would be a school-record 36.6 points per game, has scored at least 30 points in nine of its last 10 games ... UNLV's defense just posted seven total sacks vs. USU, the most in a game since getting eight at New Mexico in 2021. The Rebels have 14 total sacks in the last three games after having just one in their previous four outings combined ... The 10 points allowed at Colorado State in its last away game were the program's fewest by a UNLV Mountain West opponent in a road game since the Rebs downed BYU 24-3 in Provo in 2002. It marked the fewest vs. any MW team since a 35-7 home win vs. UNM in 2012 ... UNLV, which held CSU to 1-of-13 on third down, ranks seventh nationally in third-down conversion defense, only allowing opponents to convert at a 30-percent clip ... Of the FBS players with at least 100 rushing attempts this season, **Jai'Den Thomas** is the leader with 7.6 yards per carry. Jet's three games this season with 100+ rushing yards and fewer than 15 carries are tied for the most in the FBS (Ohio State's **Bo Jackson**, Louisville's **Isaac Brown**) ... The Rebels are 24-1 since the start of 2023 when leading after the third quarter ... The Rebels are 14-4 in true road games since the start of 2023 after only winning eight total road games in the previous six seasons (8-25) ... UNLV is currently tied for 12th nationally for the most interceptions in the nation with 12 and Rebel DBs **Aamaris Brown** and **Laterrance Welch** are both tied for ninth in the country with four interceptions apiece ... It marks the first time more than one UNLV player brought in at least four picks in the same year since three Rebels had four in 1984 ... For his efforts grabbing two INTs in the season-opener, Welch was named Week Zero's National East-West Shrine Bowl Defensive Player of the Week. Brown, meanwhile, was named the Jim Thorpe Award National DB of the Week on Sept. 9 ... In the last five games, QB **Anthony Colandrea** averages 22 completions for 297 yards and two touchdowns per outing. He set career highs vs. New Mexico with 36 completions for 382 yards (16th-most in school history and bested the junior's previous career high of 377 vs. JMU while playing for Virginia in 2023). He is one of just four FBS players to have at least 2,500 yards passing and 500 net yards rushing this season ... The 2025 Rebels defeated every non-conference opponent on their schedule for the first

time since joining a league in 1982 ... The Rebels' 28 wins in 38 games since the start of 2023 represent the most victories over any equal span since they went a combined 30-8 from 1973-76 as a member of Division II under future NFL head coach **Ron Meyer** ... After a shaky debut vs. Idaho State when he missed two of his three field goal attempts, new UNLV PK **Ramon Villela** made 10 straight three-pointers, including a 50-yarder vs. UCLA, before missing a 59-yard attempt last week vs. USU. The sophomore currently stands 13-for-17 overall ... Aussie freshman punter **Cam Brown**, who posted a career-long 71-yarder at Wyoming, averages 43.4 yards on the season but does not have enough attempts to enter the MW or NCAA stat lists ... With No. 2 signal-caller **Cameron Friel** seeing game action the last two weeks, UNLV has played four different QBs this fall: Colandrea, Friel, **Alex Orji** and **Gael Ochoa**.

## MORE REBELATIONS...

UNLV blocked two punts that were returned for touchdowns in the win at Wyoming on Oct. 4. That came one season after UNLV WR **Ricky White III** led the nation with four blocked punts as part of the Rebels' five overall in 2024 ... Four members of Dan Mullen's first UNLV staff were members of last year's program. WR coach **Del Alexander**, who served as interim head coach and led the team to its LA Bowl victory, was retained in his original position as was CB coach **Akeem Davis** and DL coach **Ricky Logo**. New LB coach **Bam Amina** was elevated after serving last fall as a graduate assistant coach ... One new coach hired by Mullen is a familiar face in Las Vegas as longtime NFL defensive guru **Paul Guenther** was named defensive coordinator. Guenther (GUN-ther) has coached 21 seasons in the NFL with five different teams, including spending three seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Raiders, including during the franchise's first year in Las Vegas in 2020 ... Not counting blocks, UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 23 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... However, when **Jai'Den Thomas** went 90 yards into the end zone vs. Fresno State last fall, UNLV snapped a 13-year drought by returning a kickoff for a score for the first time since **Deante Purvis** sprinted 98 yards to the end zone vs. CSU on Oct. 29, 2011 ... UNLV is coming off its first double-digit win total (11-3) for only the third time in history (1974, 1984) ... All three losses last season came to teams who finished ranked (two vs. #8/9 Boise State and vs. #20/22 Syracuse) ... The Rebels finished 2024 ranked No. 23 in the AP poll, No. 24 in the Coaches poll and No. 24 in the CFP after earning their first-ever national ranking earlier in the season, rising as high as No. 19 in the AP and Coaches list on Dec. 1 ... UNLV's 24-13 win over Cal in the 2024 Art of Sport LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk marked its first bowl victory since 2000 ... In defeating Idaho State on August 23, new head coach **Dan Mullen** improved to 12-2 all-time (including six straight wins) in season openers at his three stops leading Mississippi State, Florida and now UNLV.

## THOMAS THE TD TRAIN

Despite having a nickname of "Jet," running back **Jai'Den Thomas** moved from flying under the radar into becoming the nation's top freshman scorer as a rookie in 2023. After holding just the one scholarship offer out of Westlake High School in the Atlanta area, Thomas exploded onto the scene with a dozen rushing touchdowns in 13 games and was the nation's only freshman with more than 11 rushing scores that fall. Jet's seven-yard TD vs. Wyoming gave him the UNLV single-season freshman record, breaking a tie with former quarterback **Armani Rogers** (2017). His encore campaign included leading the squad with 918 yards on the ground along with seven rushing scores. He also added his first career receiving touchdown and returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to give him 21 TDs overall heading into his junior season. After a trio of rush TDs in the opener vs. Idaho State and another score each at Sam Houston, Miami, vs. Air Force and at Boise State and CSU, he already ranks fifth in Rebel history with 27 rushing scores. Currently ranking fourth in the MW with 780 yards on 103 total carries, Jet is second in the nation with 7.57 yards per attempt. Remarkably, he has only been stopped behind the line of scrimmage three times this season for just seven

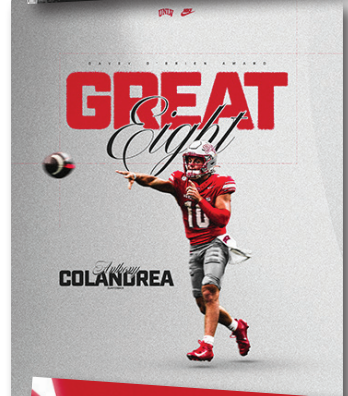

## AC TURNED UP TO HIGH

Former Virginia transfer **Anthony Colandrea** (17 starts for the Cavaliers) competed all offseason with Michigan transfer **Alex Orji** (3 starts last season for the Wolverines) for the starting quarterback position at UNLV and it turns out both signal-callers would start the opener in Week Zero. Orji took the first snap of the season and promptly pitched it to Colandrea, who had lined up wide and threw the first attempt for the Rebels vs. Idaho State. Orji would go on to complete his three attempts for 37 yards and run for 34 yards, including the go-ahead TD. Colandrea hit 15 of his 21 attempts for 195 yards along with 93 yards of his own on the ground. Colandrea then made the more traditional start in the wins at Sam Houston and vs. UCLA and Orji would suffer a season-ending injury vs. the Bruins. Colandrea, who is now backed up by veteran **Cameron Friel** (2021 MW Freshman of the Year), is turning heads across the nation, earning Old Trapper Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week in back-to-back outings as well as being included on the Week 2 Davey O'Brien Award Great 8 List. The junior from St. Petersburg, FL, then became the first UNLV QB in history to win more than one MW weekly honor in a season after completing 15 of his 21 pass attempts for 203 yards and a career-high tying three touchdowns to help UNLV down UCLA at Allegiant Stadium. He became the first Rebel signal-caller to win three MW nods in a CAREER when he was named again on Oct. 13 after throwing for the most yards at UNLV since 2018 with 361 vs. Air Force. He tossed the third-longest pass in program history (86 yards) for a score and also ran for two TDs, including the game-winner from 19 yards out with 36 seconds left. He became the first UNLV QB to win three player of the week nods in a career from any conference since **Jon Denton** earned three as part of the WAC in 1996 and '97. Colandrea was named one of eight Manning Award Stars of the Week for his efforts. The Rebel leader, who has 18 touchdown passes (sixth in UNLV single-season history) against six interceptions through 10 games, sits 26th in the nation with a 67.1 percent pass completion rate. His 2,527 yards passing (11th in Rebel history) is 22nd best nationally and he ranks second on the team with a career-high 512 net rushing yards, including seven scores. With at least three games remaining, Colandrea stands fourth in UNLV history for rushing yards in a season by a QB and needs 87 to catch **Jason Thomas** in third (599 in 2000). The school record was actually set just last season when **Hajj-Malik Williams** went for 824 for the 11-3 Rebs. On Oct. 23, Colandrea was added to the Manning Award official Watch List and on Oct. 29, he was one of just 36 quarterbacks named to the Davey O'Brien Award Class of 2025. The Davey O'Brien Foundation unveiled the list of the three dozen players now officially in contention for the 2025 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award.

## UNLV HEAD COACH DAN MULLEN

After two years of making history on the field, UNLV football made a historic hire on Dec. 12, 2024, as longtime SEC head coach **Dan Mullen** was appointed the new head coach of the Rebel football program by Director of Athletics **Erick Harper**. A 103-game winner at the University of Florida and Mississippi State University, Mullen returns to the sidelines in Las Vegas after spending the last three seasons as an ESPN college football analyst.

"I am very excited to be a part of the UNLV family," said Mullen. "These past two years, a foundation has been set to compete for championships, including being just one game away from making the College Football Playoff, which is a great testament to where we plan on continuing to be. My expectation is to keep that excitement and momentum alive and produce a team for the University, the City of Las Vegas and the State of Nevada that is going to compete for championships on a regular basis. I look forward to creating excitement for all UNLV Athletics and our goal is to be the premier program in the Mountain West."

The 14th head coach in UNLV history, Mullen, 53, boasts nearly three decades of coaching experience, including 13 as a head coach. He spent nine years at the helm of MSU and a combined eight years at Florida, first as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and returning to Gainesville to lead the program from 2018-21.

Mullen has an 103-61 (.628) overall record, a 7-3 bowl game record while leading a program and has seen 76 players under his guidance drafted in the NFL.

"We are ecstatic to announce the hiring of Dan Mullen, who is both an innovator and nationally respected leader in the sport of football," said Harper. "The momentum of UNLV football continues to skyrocket with Coach Mullen coming aboard and is even more proof that our university is serious about success. Rebel Nation came alive while watching this program reach new heights the last two seasons and we are excited to keep it moving forward under the leadership of someone the caliber of Dan Mullen."

Mullen compiled an overall 34-15 mark in Gainesville over four years and led UF to national prominence in just his first season. He and the Gators took the next step in his second and third seasons with an SEC Championship Game appearance to highlight the 2020 campaign. Registering an 11-2 record in 2019, Mullen and the Gators finished at No. 6 in the final Associated Press Poll, their highest finish since 2009 at No. 3. On the national stage, Mullen became the first head coach in FBS history to win BCS/New Year's Six bowl games in both of his first two seasons with a program. Mullen, who served four seasons (2005-08) as the Gators' offensive coordinator, played a major role in the program winning two SEC and BCS National Titles (2006, 2008), spent nine seasons overseeing the Mississippi State program from 2009-17 before returning to Gainesville. In 2014, Mullen was honored as the National College Football Coach of the Year by the Maxwell Football Club. He also garnered honors as the SEC Coach of the Year in the same season. His tenure with the Bulldogs saw the program ascend to a No. 1 ranking during the regular-season and play in a school-record eight consecutive bowl games.

Before heading to Gainesville for the first time, Mullen coached in the Mountain West as the quarterback coach for former MW-member Utah with head coach **Urban Meyer**, with whom he had spent 10 seasons. While coaching the Ute quarterbacks, Mullen helped develop NFL standout **Alex Smith** - the first overall selection in the 2005 Draft. The 2004 season culminated with Smith earning National Player of the Year honors while also becoming the Utes' first-ever Heisman Trophy finalist.

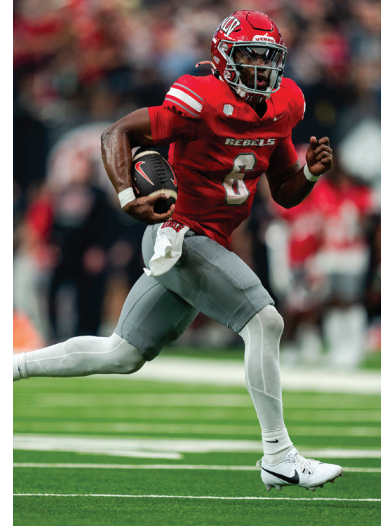
## QB1(HUNDRED)

When **Haji-Malik Williams** (pictured) finished with 104 net yards rushing vs. UNR in Game 12 of 2024, he became just the second UNLV quarterback to post at least four century-mark game on the ground during his

career, joining **Armani Rogers**, who had six from 2017-19. When Williams went for 119 vs. Fresno State earlier in the fall, he became the 14th different signal-caller to finish with at least 100. There have been only 24 such games in history but a full 16 of those have happened since the start of the 2016 season.

## IT'S THE NINTH NINTH ISLAND SHOWDOWN

Beginning with the 2017 game, which the Rebels won 31-23, the UNLV and Hawai'i football programs now annually take part in the Ninth Island Showdown. Sponsored by The California Hotel, the winner of the Mountain West matchup gets rights to the Island Showdown Trophy, which includes both a pineapple – a Vegas-style gold pineapple – and a variation of the Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas sign. Las Vegas has earned the nickname “The Ninth Island” for its long-standing popularity with Hawaiian visitors and transplants. UNLV and Hawai'i first squared off in football on Oct. 25, 1969, which marked just the second year of existence for the Rebel program. The schools have faced each other 34 times with the Rainbow Warriors leading the all-time series 19-15. However, UNLV's 29-27 win last November means the Rebels currently possess the golden pineapple trophy and have tied the series at 4-4 since its introduction. This marks just the second rivalry trophy for UNLV, which also plays in-state rival UNR for rights to the famous Fremont Cannon.

## HE'S MULLEN A SPOT ON BEAR'S LIST

UNLV head coach **Dan Mullen** was one of 28 names making up the American Heart Association's 2025 Paul “Bear” Bryant Coach of the Year watch list, which was released on Oct. 15. The award is given each January to a college football coach for contributions that make the sport better for athletes and fans alike by demonstrating grit, integrity and a winning approach to coaching and life – both on and off the field. In his debut season at the school, Mullen guided the Rebels to their first 6-0 start since 1974 after defeating every non-conference opponent in the same season for the first time ever. UNLV has also scored at least 30 points in seven straight games for the first time in history. This marks the fifth time Mullen has been on a Bryant Award watch list as he was named in 2014 while at Mississippi State and three times while leading Florida (2018-20).





## FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex in 2019. The project was made possible because of the largest single gift in its history as the Feritta Family pledged the initial \$10 million toward construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park, which now includes a playing surface installed last summer. The FFC is the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

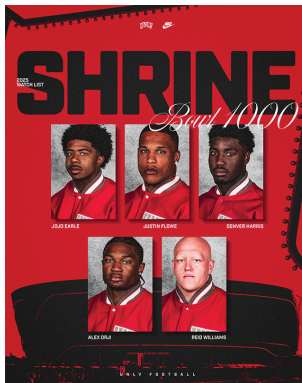

## SHRINE SHINE

UNLV football placed five players on the East-West Shrine 1000 watch list, which was released this summer by the annual postseason all-star event. The list consists of the best 1,000 players throughout all of college football who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2026 East-West Shrine Bowl and the 2026 NFL Draft class. On offense, the list includes WR **JoJo Earle**, QB **Alex Orji** and C **Reid Williams**. Defensively, DB **Denver Harris** and LB **Justin Flowe** made the cut. The five representatives ranked second in the Mountain West this time around. Two Rebels on last year's list were later selected to play in the postseason game – current Seattle Seahawks WR **Ricky White III** and Houston Texans LB **Jackson Woodard**.



## HIGH EXPECTATIONS

UNLV football tied a school record by being picked to finish second in the Mountain West in the preseason media poll. The Rebels, who received four first-place votes and 415 points overall, only trailed Boise State's 643 total points. Those same two teams played in the last two Mountain West Championship games. The only other times UNLV was picked to finish as high as second was last year and also before the 2001 season after **John Robinson's** Rebels downed Arkansas in the 2000 Las Vegas Bowl.

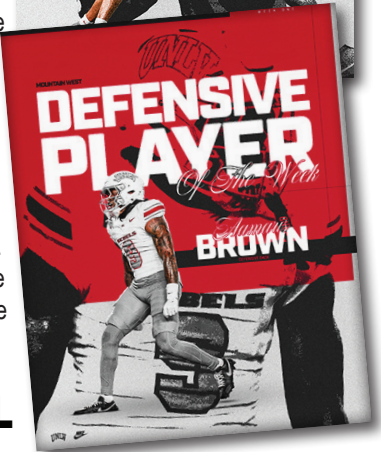

## COLANDREA & BROWN EARN MW HONORS

UNLV football earned both the Old Trapper Mountain West Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week awards in the same week for the first time in nine seasons as quarterback **Anthony Colandrea** and defensive back **Aamaris Brown** were cited by the league September 1. It was the first time the Rebels grabbed both honors since quarterback **Kurt Palandech** and cornerback **Torry McTyer** were announced after UNLV's thrilling, 69-66 three-overtime victory over **Josh Allen**-led Wyoming at Sam Boyd Stadium in November 2016. Colandrea (St. Petersburg, FL) completed 19 of his 23 pass attempts for 249 yards and two touchdowns to help UNLV down Sam Houston 38-21 on Friday. The junior signal-caller, who transferred in from Virginia, also ran for 23 net yards, including a game-sealing 13-yard scamper into the end zone in the fourth quarter. Colandrea, who is the program's first offensive honoree since 2023, is also the first Rebel quarterback to earn the MW weekly kudo since **Doug Brumfield** on Aug. 29, 2022. Brown (Tampa, FL) was impactful throughout the night in Houston, with no play bigger than a 52-yard interception return for a touchdown in the middle of the second quarter. The former South Florida transfer had four solo tackles, three tackles-for-loss and two quarterback sacks. One came on third down to force a Bearkat punt and the other came on fourth down and resulted in a turnover on downs that allowed the Rebels to run out the clock in victory formation.



## FRIEL LISTED FOR WUERFFEL AND GOOD WORKS TEAM

UNLV quarterback **Cameron Friel** is part of the official nominees list for both the 2025 AFCA Allstate Good Team and Allstate Wuerffel Trophy. College football student-athletes and head coaches from all levels of the sport are recognized for their commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron. Friel, a senior from Kaneohe, Hawaii, returns for his fifth and final season this fall with the Rebels. The 2021 Mountain West Freshman of the Year currently has the highest pass completion percentage in UNLV history at 64.0 and is the squad's top community service performer off the field. For the second year, Allstate is partnering with the Wuerffel Foundation to align two of college football's most meaningful honors: the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy. Together, they recognize student-athletes who demonstrate excellence in community service, academics and athletics.



## TYLER ROSE TARGETS TEXAS TRIO

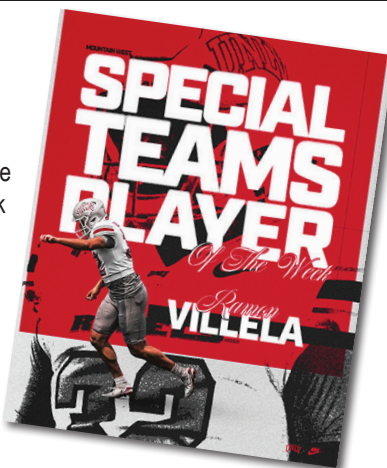


The 13th annual Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List included three UNLV players this summer. The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award recognizes the top offensive player in Division I football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define **Earl Campbell**: integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity; specifically, tenacity to persist and determination to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals. In addition, the nominee must meet one or more of the following criteria: Played football at and graduated from a Texas high school and/or currently playing at Texas D1 four-year college. The Rebels included were junior quarterback **Alex Orji**, who attended Sachse High School in the Lone Star State, senior wide receiver **Troy Omeire**, who attended Fort Bend Austin High School and senior wide receiver **JoJo Earle**, who graduated from Aledo High School.



## LISTEN TO THE RAMON: VILLELA KICKS WAY TO LEAGUE HONOR

UNLV sophomore kicker **Ramon Villela** (v-EL-ah) was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 22. The native of Upland, California, scored a career-high 11 points in the Rebels' historic 41-38 win at Miami (OH), including the game-winning field goal. His 27-yard three-pointer in the second quarter got his team on the board after falling behind 14-0 to the RedHawks and then his fifth extra point of the day tied things at 38 late in the fourth quarter. Finally, with just seconds remaining, he nailed a 23-yarder to give his team its first lead of the game. It marked the first time in history that UNLV swept its non-conference schedule and the first victory in 15 all-time trips to the Eastern Time Zone. Villela was the first special teams winner for UNLV this season but the fourth overall weekly winner in 2025 but marked the fourth straight season that a UNLV kicker earned at least one MW weekly nod (**Daniel Gutierrez** in 2022, **Jose Pizano** in 2023 and **Caden Chittenden** in 2024).



## OH SAY, OSE

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame on Sept. 24 announced UNLV senior DE **Ose Egbase** (OH-say egg-BAH-say) was one of 179 semifinalists for the 2025 William V. Campbell Trophy®, college football's premier scholar-athlete award. The impressive list of candidates, from all NCAA divisions and the NAIA, boasts a 3.60 average GPA. Celebrating its 36th year, the Campbell Trophy® recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation for his combined academic success, football performance and exemplary leadership. Egbase (Encino, CA) became a member of the semifinal list just one year after UNLV saw its first-ever finalist for the prestigious Campbell award -- former LB **Jackson Woodard**, who earned a post-graduate scholarship as a NFF National Scholar-Athlete.

UNLV won its first overtime game in six seasons when it downed Utah State, 29-26, on Nov. 15, 2025. A full 15 of the program's all-time OT games have come at home (5-10). In 2016, the Rebels broke a two-game losing streak in overtime games with its historic 69-66 victory over Wyoming. It marked the only time that the Rebels won a game that went longer than one overtime period and set a school record for points in extra time with 17. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State.

## PICK U.?

Since the start of the 2022 season, only one program in the nation has grabbed more interceptions than UNLV. The Rebels, who have 12 INTs this season through 10 games, have a total of 61 picks in the last three-plus seasons, bested only by Notre Dame's 62. Individually, DB **Aamaris Brown** (pictured below) and his teammate **Latarrance Welch** both have four picks. The school record for a season is seven set by former All-American and NFL vet **Kevin Thomas** in 2001.

## KAYDEN "BIG PLAY" LIVES UP TO NICKNAME ON SPECIAL TEAMS

UNLV redshirt rookie wide receiver **Kayden McGee** was named the Old Trapper Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week as well as the Freshman of the Week on Oct. 6. The native of Muskogee, Oklahoma, turned in a total of four special teams highlights in the first half of Saturday's 31-17 win at Wyoming. With the score at 7-3 in favor of the Rebels, he picked up a punt blocked by teammate **Jaden Bradley** and raced into the end zone to give UNLV an 11-point lead. In the second quarter, McGee and Bradley swapped circumstance as McGee blocked a Cowboy punt attempt that Bradley picked up and score on from 13 yards out. McGee also pushed a **Cam Brown** punt towards the field of play where it was downed at the seven-yard line instead of going for a touchback and also downed another Brown boot that went 71 yards before resting on the Wyoming two-yard line.



## A.B. SEE! BROWN A MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Senior DB **Aamaris Brown** was named a member of The Sporting News Midesason All-America team along with second team Midseason All-America by the AP. Back on Oct. 2, the Chuck Bednarik Award, given annually to college football's most outstanding defensive player, announced that he was a midseason addition to its official Watch List. Brown (Tampa, FL), who transferred in this year from South Florida, set a Rebel record by grabbing a pick in four consecutive outings to begin the year. He returned two of those for touchdowns to help UNLV remain undefeated and ranks third in the country with 117 interception return yards to go with 40 total tackles, three tackles-for-loss, two sacks and seven pass breakups. The Bednarik Award has been presented to the College Defensive Player of the Year since 1994 and is named in honor of Chuck "Concrete Charlie" Bednarik, who was an All-American player at the University of Pennsylvania. Semifinalists for the Bednarik Award will be announced on Nov. 11 and the winner will be announced as part of the ESPN Home Depot College Football Awards Show held on Dec. 11. The formal presentations of the award will be made at the Maxwell Football Club Awards on March 14, 2026, in Atlanta, Georgia.



## JET LANDS ON TRIO OF LISTS

UNLV junior running back **Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas** has taken off nationally as he was included in three prestigious award watch lists this summer. Thomas was one of just 45 players in college football included on the 2025 Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List, earned a spot on the 2025 Doak Walker Award watch list and is one of just 80 players included on the 2025 Maxwell Award Watch List. The Maxwell Award is presented at the end of every season to college football's overall player of the year. Thomas (Atlanta, GA) is just the fourth Rebel player to earn a spot on the Maxwell preseason list in the last decade and the first running back since **Charles Williams** in 2020. The Forum annually presents the award to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Thomas was previously named 2025 Preseason First Team All-Mountain West after leading the ranked Rebels in rushing yards last fall with 918 along with seven rushing scores. He also added his first career receiving touchdown and returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to give him 21 TDs overall heading into his junior season.

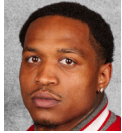

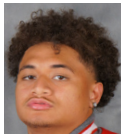

### REBELS FIGHT OFF BENGALS IN MULLEN'S DEBUT

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (1-0) opened the Dan Mullen Era with a hard-fought 38-31 win over Idaho State (0-1) in a Week Zero Saturday afternoon special before a raucous crowd of 25,723 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

In by far the earliest game in program history, the Rebels had to rally after falling behind 10-0 after the first quarter. That's when All-America candidate running back Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas went to work – igniting his squad with two long touchdown runs in a span of just over three minutes. One from 39 yards

out and the other being a 70-yard race to the end zone to give the home team its first lead.

The Bengals led at halftime, 17-14, and the teams continued to trade leads until back-to-back interceptions in the fourth quarter, part of four for the squad on the day, led to quarterback Alex Orji's go-ahead 11-yard rushing touchdown on fourth down with just under nine minutes remaining.

Orji (3 of 3) and fellow-QB Anthony Colandrea (15 of 21) combined to complete 18 of 24 attempts for 232 yards and one score (no interceptions) through the air and 127 net yards and the TD on 19 carries on the ground. Jaden Bradley led all receivers with a career-high 131 yards on six receptions and new safety Jake Pope led the team with 10 total tackles while new UNLV cornerback Laterrance Welch had two of the picks to give him four in his career (two at ASU).

The Rebels have now won 11 of their last 15 home games and hold a winning record at Allegiant Stadium (15-14 since opening in 2020) for the first time ever.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Jai'Den Thomas was magic in his junior debut, rushing for a career-high 147 yards with a 14.7 YPC average, including a career-long 70-yard sprint to the end zone as part of his three-touchdown day. He also moved from ninth to seventh on UNLV's career rushing touchdown list with 22.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** UNLV's defense brought in four interceptions in a game for the first time since a win over Fresno State on Sept. 28, 2024. Welch had his two, including one in the end zone, while senior captain LB Marsel McDuffie had his first career INT and Aamaris Brown grabbed one as well.

**QUOTABLE:** "It could have been very easy for us to find a way to lose as a team, but this team, these guys all stuck together and found a way to win when it was important. We are going to enjoy this win tonight. We are going to get into work early tomorrow and we're going to start coaching and fixing and correcting everything."

### REBELS TACKLE ANOTHER TEXAS TEAM, IMPROVE TO 2-0

HOUSTON (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (2-0) improved to 11-3 in true road games since the beginning of 2023 after downing Sam Houston (0-2), 38-21, late Friday night before an announced crowd of 5,837 fans at Shell Energy Stadium.

In the first-ever meeting with the Bearkats and playing in a pro soccer stadium for the second straight season, the Rebels led 24-7 at halftime and did not punt until the middle of the third quarter. Aamaris Brown had a monster game on defense, returning an interception 52 yards for a touchdown to go with

a pair of sacks and a third tackle-for-loss. Jaden Bradley was impressive in the air, posting his second consecutive 100-yard receiving game (six for 125), including a 43-yard touchdown in the game's first drive. DeAngelo Irvin Jr. caught the Rebels' other touchdown pass to notch the first of his career to help build the early lead.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed his first six pass attempts and finished 19 of 23 for 249 yards and two scores. He also rushed six times for 23 yards, including a nifty 13-yard touchdown spurt in the fourth quarter.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** After Sam Houston scored on its opening drive of the game, the Rebel defense blanked the Kats until the fourth quarter with the help of an interception and four sacks and holding them to 1-12 on third down. Sam Houston did score two long second-half touchdowns – both on fourth-and-one.

**QUOTABLE:** "Here's the issue. I'm so pleased, because I think we're really coming together. We took a huge step from last week and I think that's a big deal for us. But as we did last week, when we're good, on both sides of the ball, we're really good, and then we have some errors. We're just missing that focus and that attention to detail for four quarters. There are so many positive plays to build on if we can just focus on eliminating some of the negatives."

### UNDEFEATED REBELS DOWN BIG TEN BRUINS

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – PUNLV (3-0) defeated a Big Ten Conference team for the first time in 22 years and Dan Mullen became the first head coach to win his first three games at the school since 1976 as the Rebels downed UCLA (0-2), 30-23, Saturday night before a crowd of 36,117 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

UNLV improved to 10-2 since the start of the 2023 season vs. non-conference opponents by building a huge lead and doing just enough late in the game to post the win.

Ramon Villela started off the scoring with a 50-yard field goal, and three different Rebels found the end zone as the home team raced to a 23-0 lead in the second quarter. The Bruins, who were playing at UNLV for just the second time and first time since 2015, added a field goal to make it 23-3 at halftime. The Bruins scored the first 10 points of the second half before the Rebels scored their only points after the break with Anthony Colandrea's 17-yard scoring toss to tight end Var'Keyes Gummies. UCLA pulled within a touchdown late and was driving for the potential game-tying score when senior linebacker Marsel McDuffie tipped a pass attempt and safety Aamaris Brown corralled the interception to secure the victory.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Quarterback Anthony Colandrea was efficient again, completing 71-percent of his passes (15 of 21) for 203 yards and three touchdown passes, which tied his career high (did it twice at Virginia). He added 59 net yards on 11 rushing attempts.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** Aamaris Brown's game-sealing interception was his third pick in three games of 2025.

**QUOTABLE:** "Our offense really showed up tonight. It was a really efficient, good first half. We got out of rhythm in the second half, but they did a good job with getting us out rhythm, holding onto the ball in the second half, and being able to stay on the field. But we did what we needed to do to finish the game out at the end. Couldn't be more proud of our guys."

- UNLV is scheduled to return this game at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 6, 2031
- Dan Mullen is the first UNLV coach to start his career in Las Vegas 3-0 since Tony Knap started 4-0 in 1976
- The 23 first-half points were the most ever scored by UNLV vs. a Big Ten opponent in a regulation half and the 30 total points were also the most vs. a team from the conference
- UNLV improved to 16-14 all-time at Allegiant Stadium after winning 12 of its last 16 outings in its new home
- UNLV has scored at least 20 points in each of its last 25 regular-season games. That's a school-record and the second-longest such streak in the FBS

### UNDEFEATED REBELS RALLY FOR WILD WIN OVER REDHAWKS

OXFORD, Ohio (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (4-0) scored the final 17 points of the day to win a wild rollercoaster of a road game, 41-38, over Miami University (0-3) and earn its first-ever victory in the Eastern Time Zone in 15 all-time attempts on Saturday afternoon before 12,625 fans at Yager Stadium.

Kicking off at 9 a.m. PT on ESPNU, the Rebels overcame a sluggish start in what was the first-ever meeting of the programs, scoring two quick touchdowns to start the third quarter and tie the game

at 24. The RedHawks, however, scored a pair of TDs of their own in unorthodox fashion by taking the kickoff back 100 yards for a score and then later tipping a pass attempt and returning it for a long TD to suddenly regain a 14-point lead.

The Rebels, though, were simply unfazed, methodically scoring two touchdowns to tie things and then eventually passing down field to set up Ramon Villela's 23-yard field goal to take the lead with just 15 seconds remaining. Miami would hit one pass and line up for a 57-yard game-tying field goal attempt but after a bad snap, tossed the ball downfield into the awaiting hands of senior linebacker Marsel McDuffie, whose game-sealing interception went with his 10 tackles and a fumble recovery that set up the winning drive after defensive back Jaheem Joseph forced the turnover deep in his team's territory. The RedHawk offense was shut down after halftime, gaining just 89 total yards and scoring only on special teams and defense.

With its first-ever win on the road vs. a MAC opponent, UNLV extended its Mountain West record streak of defeating non-conference opponents. Quarterback Anthony Colandrea finished with 293 yards passing and two scores while running back Jet Thomas posted 118 rushing yards and a score as one of four different Rebels to find the end zone on offense.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Safety Aamaris Brown grabbed his nation-leading fourth interception and posted his second pick-six of the season. The senior transfer also added a pass breakup and a tackle. His big play in the second quarter sparked the Rebels after originally falling behind 14-0. He is the sixth player in Mountain West history to record at least one pick in four consecutive games played by his team.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** Until running the ball to set up for the game-winning field goal, UNLV was 9-for-9 on third-down attempts in the second half. The Rebels finished 12-for-17 on third down.

**QUOTABLE:** "The best act's the final act it seems like when we're playing. I couldn't be more proud of these guys..."

## UNLV FOOTBALL EARNS HAIL OF ROAD WIN

LARAMIE, Wyo. (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (5-0/1-0) won its first five games in a season for the first time since 1974 and opened Mountain West play with a 31-17 road win over Wyoming (2-3/0-1) in front of a chilled Homecoming crowd of 19,861 fans at War Memorial Stadium.

Playing on a white-swept field after a massive hail and thunder storm that briefly delayed the start of the game, the Rebels fought off the wild weather conditions to score two touchdowns on blocked punts in the first half to build a 24-3 lead.

UNLV was out-gained by 102 yards but was perfect in three red-zone trips and forced three turnovers against losing just one fumble to fight off the Cowboys.

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-0/2-0) became bowl-eligible for a third straight season for the first time in history with a wild 51-48 win over Air Force (1-5/0-4) on Saturday afternoon before 32,932 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

The four-hour, 15-minute affair featured a stunning 11 lead changes as UNLV dominated Air Force at home for the first time since 2012.

The Rebels, who are 6-0 for the first time since 1974, scored 38 points in the second half and still needed

to watch the Falcons miss a 40-yard field goal attempt as time expired. UNLV, which scored on every possession after halftime, trailed by four with 1:13 remaining but marched right down field for the go-ahead touchdown on a 19-yard run into the end zone by quarterback Anthony Colandrea. The transfer from Virginia rushed for 62 net yards and a pair of TDs while completing 20-of-32 passes for 361 yards, including a stunning 86-yard scoring strike to DaeDae Reynolds.

Wide receiver Jaden Bradley caught three passes for 73 yards and tossed a 16-yard touchdown to tight end Var'Keyes Gummies. Ramon Vilella nailed all three of his field goal attempts as part of his career-high 13-point day. Running back Jet Thomas netted 88 yards on the ground and 58 through the air on a career-high six receptions. His 51-yard sprint to the end zone gave his team a 44-41 lead with under five minutes remaining. Defensive back Andrew Powdrell led all tacklers with 13 to lead four Rebels with double-digit takedowns.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Anthony Colandrea overcame a rough start to complete 65-percent of his passes and throw for the 19th-most yards in a game by a Rebel and the most since Max Gilliam threw for 387 at San Jose State in 2018. The junior also coolly led his team to the winning score with under a minute to go, capped by his own TD run.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** The teams combined for 65 total points in the second half, including UNLV's five touchdowns and one field goal.

**QUOTABLE:** "Heck of a team win. So proud of our team. I want to give Air Force a lot of credit. That's a really good football team. They were 1-4 coming in, but had only been outscored by eight points or something on the season. Every game has come down to the wire. We knew they were an explosive offense and that we were going to have to score. Yards were 603 to 597. It was a back-and-forth game and could have gone either way. Heck of a football game. But so proud of our guys."

**BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com)** – UNLV (6-1/2-1) saw its seven-game overall win streak snapped by a familiar foe as Boise State (5-2/3-0) prevailed going away, 56-31, in front of a sun-baked sold-out crowd of 32,927 at Albertsons Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels, wearing white from top to bottom, were driving with a chance to take the lead early in the third quarter but punted it away on fourth and short and the Broncos scored three straight touchdowns in the next nine minutes, including one on a pick-six, to take control and earn its nation-leading 16th consecutive

### REBELS' HOME WIN STREAK SNAPPED

**LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com)** – UNLV (6-2/2-2) saw its five-game home win streak snapped by New Mexico (6-3/3-2), 40-35, in front of a crowd of 25,972 at Allegiant Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Lobos jumped out to a 21-0 lead only to see the Rebels tie it in the second quarter on a pick-six. UNM, which ended a three-game losing skid to UNLV, then scored 10 quick points to take a 31-21 lead into halftime.

UNLV continued to fight back and eventually took

its only lead of the game, 35-34, with 6:35 remaining on quarterback Anthony Colandrea's third touchdown pass of the day. The visitors, however, took the lead for good and then held off two final drives by the home team, which actually had nine more first downs on the day (25-16).

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Despite battling the flu, Anthony Colandrea had his best statistical game as a Rebel, completing a career-high 36 passes on 46 attempts for 382 yards and three TDs. He also led the Scarlet & Gray in rushing with 40 net yards on eight carries. The passing total tied for the 16th-most in school history and bested the junior's previous career high of 377 vs. JMU while playing for Virginia in 2023.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** UNLV fumbled six times and lost three of them after coming into the game having lost just two all season.

**QUOTABLE:** "I'll give New Mexico credit, they put together a great plan. They're a team that plays extremely hard and they executed in all phases. On our end, we made too many mistakes in different situations. The consistency of our performance is not where it needs to be. I give our guys credit for battling back after being down 21-0, but I have to make sure we eliminate the errors and the mistakes that cost us the game today."

## REBELS ROLL OVER RAMS, IMPROVE TO 7-2

FORT COLLINS, Colo. (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (7-2/3-2) won in this city for the first time in 23 years, 42-10 over Colorado State (2-7/1-4) on a chilly Saturday night before an announced crowd of 27,970 at Canvas Stadium.

The Rebels, who improved to 7-2 through nine games for the third straight season, broke a seven-game losing streak playing at the Rams in what was the final matchup of the teams as Mountain West rivals. UNLV, which tallied 571 total yards, has scored at least 30 points in every game this season, extending its school record to nine straight outings reaching that mark.

CSU led 7-0 after the first quarter before UNLV won the second quarter, 21-3, powered by three rushing touchdowns – all by different players – as part of a 320-yard night on the ground. The Rebels built an 18-point lead early in the third when Anthony Colandrea found Troy Omeire, who raced 68 yards to the end zone. Colandrea also ran for two touchdowns. UNLV, in fact, would end up scoring the game's final 35 points.

The Rebel defense posted eight tackles for loss while holding the Rams to the fewest points by a UNLV opponent since winning 27-7 at Houston to open the 2024 season. The 10 points were the fewest allowed to a MW opponent since beating New Mexico 35-7 in 2012.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Junior RB Jet Thomas ignited the Rebel offense with two long runs in the second quarter en route to his eighth career 100-yard outing. His 57-yard touchdown scamper got his team on the board and then his 59-yard bolt on the next drive set up another score. He ran for 121 yards on just four carries in the first half and finished with 131 yards on seven attempts for an eye-popping per-carry average of 18.7.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** UNLV's defense held CSU to just 1-for-13 on third down.

**QUOTABLE:** "I'm really proud of the guys and how they respond as a team. Like I've said for a while, I think we do some of the tough things really, really well, like we stick together as a team. You don't see much finger pointing going on. I'm really pleased with our guys because we keep grinding on the little things. I still think we made some mistakes, a couple of penalties. There are still going to be a couple of missed assignments we're not going to be really pleased about, but overall, I really thought we played well defensively... And offensively, I thought up front, we played really well. Of course they're going to blitz you all over the place. They're going to get their blitz. But I know if we could cover them up when they blitz that much, you get to the second level and there's no one left if you're going to blitz. And we hit them on some really big runs that way."

## REBELS WIN WILD DOUBLE-OT GAME OVER USU

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (8-2/4-2), which was without leading rusher Jai'Den Thomas because of injury, survived in double-overtime, 29-26, over Utah State (5-5/3-3) on a rainy Saturday night before 31,682 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

UNLV trailed 13-10 at halftime but retook the lead in the third on QB Anthony Colandrea's 18th touchdown pass of the season, this one to DaeDae Reynolds in the back of the end zone. USU eventually regained the advantage in the fourth quarter, 23-20, before Ramon Villela's 32-yard field goal tied things with just

over two minutes left in regulation. The Aggies would go on to miss a potential game-winning field goal to send the teams to overtime.

The Rebels failed to score, missing from 39 yards out, but then saw USU miss its third attempt of the ballgame and send it to a second session. This time the Aggies made the kick, from 39 yards out, to lead 26-23. On its first play of the second OT, Colandrea handed off to WR Kayden McGee who dashed through the defense and dove for the end zone to end the nearly four-hour game.

UNLV's defense posted seven total sacks on the night, the most in a game since getting eight at New Mexico on Nov. 6, 2021.

**REBEL OF THE GAME:** Kayden "Big Play" McGee lived up to his nickname again as the redshirt freshman took his three carries for a team-leading 54 yards on the ground, including the game-winner. McGee previously won Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week after blocking a punt and scoring on another blocked punt at Wyoming.

**STAT OF THE GAME:** UNLV won its first overtime game since a thriller at UNR in 2019. The Rebels had lost two straight OTs coming in and are just 7-12 overall all-time in extra sessions. This marked the first time UNLV won in two overtimes. The Rebels' only previous win in a game that went longer than one OT period was a triple-OT victory at Sam Boyd Stadium vs. Wyoming and QB Josh Allen in 2016.

**QUOTABLE:** "What a great win for our guys, we continue to believe in our guys and they're fun to coach. They find ways to stick together and continue to make plays in critical moments. It's different people stepping up... You never know when your number will be called. Kayden's was called today in overtime and he delivered."
