REBELS ROLL IN SEASON DEBUT AT HOUSTON

HOUSTON (UNLVRebels.com) – Opening a season on the road for the first time since 2020, UNLV football (1-0) started 2024 in dominating fashion, winning 27-7 at Big 12 Conference opponent Houston (0-1) Saturday night before 25,750 fans at TDECU Stadium.

Led by a suffocating defense that logged six quarterback sacks, second-year head coach Barry Odom became the first UNLV coach to win his first two season-opening games since Tony Knap did it in 1976-77.

The Rebels, who won on the road to kick off a season for the first time since 2007, held the Cougars under wraps for nearly the entire game, as UH didn't score until one minute left after not reaching the 100-yard mark in total offense until five minutes remained in the third quarter.

All-America candidate linebacker Jackson Woodward had three sacks as part of his 11-tackle night while a new Rebel, transfer safety Jalen Cataton, had two interceptions, including one he returned 36 yards for a touchdown.

Transfer Matthew Sluka started the game after a camp-long quarterback competition and threw a pair of first-half touchdowns to returning All-American Jacob De Jesus, as the Rebels led 14-0 at halftime.

Freshman Caden Chittenden kicked two field goals for the visitors' other six points as UNLV beat a Big 12 opponent for the first time since getting by Iowa State in overtime on Sept. 20, 2008.

REBEL OF THE GAME: How do you pick between two defenders after such a stunning effort? Woodward had a game-high 11 tackles, including a career-high three sacks, while Cataton hauled in his first two interceptions as a Rebel, including the eye-popping pick-six where he tipped himself the ball.

STAT OF THE GAME: At halftime, UNLV led UH in total yards 252-59.

QUOTABLE: "I thought defensively, we played relentless all night. And I thought up front on the offensive line, we controlled the game. We did enough playing complimentary football to win a game on the road in the Big 12. Scratching the surface of where we're gonna go from there. Now there's a huge opportunity for us to go back home and play in Vegas, play in Allegiant. We're really excited about the opportunity to do that and play in front of our crowd. I want to thank the families and the fans we had that came tonight. You could hear them and feel 'em and that's fun when it's on the road."

-UNLV earned its first win over Houston after being outscored 153-23 in three previous meetings
-The Rebels downed an opponent from a P5 conference on the road for the first time since upending Vanderbilt 34-10 on Oct. 12, 2019
-The Cougars will return the game when they come to Allegiant Stadium on Sept. 9, 2028
-The Rebels notched their fourth victory over a team that was part of the Big 12 at the time of the game, previously downing Iowa State, Kansas and Baylor
-Houston if one of 10 teams from the Lone Star State to face UNLV on the football field
-This game marked UNLV's first season-opener at a Big 12 team since going to Baylor in 1988

RECORD OFFENSE PUSHES REBELS TO 2-0

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Improving to 2-0 for the first time in a quarter century, the UNLV football team set a record with 695 total offensive yards in a 72-14 victory over FCS visitor Utah Tech (0-2) Saturday afternoon.

Playing in front of the program's biggest home-opener crowd since hosting UCLA in 2015, UNLV students showed up in record numbers at Allegiant Stadium to help make up the 24,512 in attendance. That crowd also included members of the 1974 UNLV team that was honored at halftime to celebrate the 50-year

anniversary of that squad's 121 season, which ended in the NCAA Division II semifinals.

Ricky White III dominated the first quarter against the Trailblazers, who were facing the Rebels for the first time in football. The All-American senior receiver hauled in three touchdowns in the opening stanza and finished with 111 yards on five catches to go with a blocked punt on special teams.

Matthew Sluka was the first of a trio of quarterbacks to play and netted 70 yards on the ground, including a 30-yard touchdown scamper, to go with his three TD throws. Hajj-Malik Williams started the second half behind center and ran 10 times for 88 yards while not attempting a pass. Cameron Friel closed things at QB, including rushing for a score.

UNLV broke the 500-yard rushing mark for only the third time in school history (504) while six different players rushed for a touchdown. In fact, no less than a dozen different Rebels carried the ball at least once, led by true freshman Greg Burrell out of Las Vegas, whose 101 yards on 11 carries included a TD and marked the most rush yards by a UNLV player in a game under second-year head coach Barry Odom.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Ricky White III didn't play long – but made a huge impact – hauling in three touchdowns in a span of eight minutes (5, 55 and 7 yards) and was rewarded for his work on special teams with his first career punt block, which led to a Rebel field goal – all in the first quarter.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's 695 total yards (504 rush, 191 pass) of offense bested the 671 racked up against Idaho in 1977.

QUOTABLE: "We are excited offensively, defensively, on the progress that we made from week one to week two. It's now a race to Friday night and we are certainly excited about being 1-0 at home and 2-0 on the season. It's a short week - it's a sprint with no finish line and our guys will get to work pretty quickly."

REBELS WIN THRILLER AT KANSAS TO STAY UNDEFEATED

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Playing on Friday the 13th for the first time in history, UNLV improved to 3-0 for the first time in 40 years with a come-from-behind 23-20 win at Kansas (1-2) in front of 21,493 fans at Children's Mercy Park.

The game, which was played at the home of the MLS Sporting Kansas City because of construction on the Jayhawks' stadium in Lawrence, was shown nationally on ESPN as the Rebels improved to 2-0 against Big 12 Conference opponents this fall (also defeated Houston 27-7 on August 31).

UNLV's record on Fridays moved to 11-13-1 all-time as running back Kylin James pushed into the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the one-yard-line with under two minutes remaining. It was the visitors' first lead of the evening after methodically rallying from a 17-6 deficit in the second quarter. The Rebel defense then squashed KU's final drive.

Quarterback Matthew Sluka rushed for 124 net yards on 19 carries and threw a 31-yard touchdown to running back Jai'Den Thomas as time expired in the first half to spark the comeback.

UNLV grabbed a pair of key interceptions, one by Jalen Catalon, his third of the season, and one by Jackson Woodard, who led all tacklers with 11 total tackles, including 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

Caden Chittenden made three of his four field-goal attempts to keep his team close as the freshman from Las Vegas accounted 11 total points.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV turned in a memorable, gargantuan, 18-play, nine-minute-22-second scoring drive in the fourth quarter that covered 75 yards to finally find the end zone in the second half and earn the hard-fought victory.

QUOTABLE: "Number one, I'm proud of our team and I'm proud of our assistant coaches for putting together what I thought was a really great plan in all three phases. Early on it was tough sledding. It was ugly. Kansas is a good football team. We had to stay in the fight and just found a way. Kids made plays – (Jackson) Woodard's interception, (Jalen) Catalon's interception – and had the grittiness to go get first downs when we needed to. Special teams play was huge and how important it was to get the touchdown on that last kick. Then the players, all the credit to them on going and making huge impact plays, when we needed them. And I thought our pass rush in the second half, we affected the throws. And Coach (Mike) Scherer and his staff did a great job of putting a plan together in the second half to stop the run and we did just enough."

RANKED REBELS ROLL OVER BULLDOGS TO START

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – Playing for the first time in 15 days, No. RV/23 UNLV (4-0/1-0) opened Mountain West play by dominating Fresno State (3-2/1-1) 59-14 in front of 24,638 fans at Allegiant Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels are undefeated through the first four games for the first time since 1976 after excelling in all three phases. Quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams made his first start at UNLV and dazzled in the air and on the ground, completing 13-of-16 attempts for 182 yards and three touchdowns while rushing for

119 net yards and another score.

Ricky White III caught 10 passes for 127 yards and a pair of touchdowns and also scooped and scored on a blocked punt by Rashod Tanner for another trip to the end zone. Special teams actually accounted for two touchdowns for the home team as running back Jai'Den Thomas also returned a kickoff 90 yards for a score in the fourth quarter.

On defense, UNLV posted four interceptions in a game for the first time since picking off five at Utah State on Sept. 24, 2022. All four interceptions were by different players. Safety Jalen Catalon's interception gave him four on the season to go with a game-high 10 total tackles.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Hajj-Malik Williams, who is in his sixth season after transferring from FCS-program Campbell, completed 81.3-percent of his passes, did not get sacked and averaged 9.9 yards per rush in his debut as a starting quarterback on the FBS level.

STAT OF THE GAME: The 59 points represented the most UNLV has ever scored against a conference opponent in a regulation game. The Rebels finished with 69 vs. Wyoming in a triple-overtime affair in 2016 at Sam Boyd Stadium.

QUOTABLE: "What a great win. Exciting for our team in starting conference play. The challenge for us was to start fast this week, win the turnover margin and go in attack mode in all three phases. I thought we did. We have a mature team, the things that they handled and the way we prepared, not only during the bye week, but then in the game week, carried over. I thought we played fast and with a lot of confidence. "It's a very short week for us because of the Friday night game against Syracuse, so we need to turn the page very quickly. I'm excited that we get to play at home in Allegiant Stadium Friday night at 6 o'clock, and our guys will flip the page. I can tell in the locker room, they are ready to do that. We are excited about being 1-0 in the conference and the 4-0 start and for what our team did in how we effectively played the game from start to finish."

REBELS DROP HEARTBREAKER IN OVERTIME TO SYRACUSE

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com)—No. 25/23 UNLV (4-1/1-0) football closed its non-conference schedule with a heartbreaking 44-41 overtime loss to Syracuse (4-1/1-1) in front of 31,329 boisterous fans at Allegiant Stadium Friday night.

In the first-ever meeting between the schools, the Rebels rallied from a pair of double-digit deficits to take a 38-31 lead with under three minutes left but the Orange dodged disaster multiple times on a game-tying, 11-play, 75-yard scoring drive to send it to OT. UNLV got the ball first and kicked a 41-yard

field goal before Syracuse scored the final touchdown to end it.

Syracuse raced to a 14-0 lead before UNLV rallied with 21 consecutive points and eventually led at halftime, 21-17.

All-American wide receiver Ricky White III caught 10 passes for the second consecutive week, this time for 135 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown to put his team up 38-31. White, who is also a mainstay on special teams, blocked one punt that was recovered for a UNLV touchdown after using his speed to force the Syracuse punter to abort an attempt and be tackled for a 13-yard loss earlier in the game.

UNLV quarterback Hajji-Malik Williams, making his second start as a Rebel, was precise again, completing 21-of-25 pass attempts for 227 yards and three scores while adding 53 net yards and a TD on the ground. The 84-percent pass completion percentage was just short of the school record of 86 percent set by Caleb Herring in 2013 (24 of 28).

Defensively, safety Jalen Catalon posted 17 total tackles with a pass breakup while linebacker Jackson Woodard added 14 takedowns to go with two pass breakups and a key interception to thwart an Orange scoring threat in the fourth quarter.

REBEL OF THE GAME: In just 31 games played for the Rebels, Ricky White III moved into seventh place on the UNLV career receiving yards list with 2,490. He also moved into a tie for third place at the school with 11 career 100-yard games and a tie for sixth with 18 TD catches. He also became the first Rebel to block at least two punts in the same season since running back Ronnie Smith had two in 2006.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV was penalized for 108 yards compared to 56 for Syracuse.

QUOTABLE: "It's heartbreaking. I hate it for our team that we couldn't pull that one out. What an unbelievable environment tonight. I'm really thankful for the city responding the way they did."

REBELS EARN FIFTH STRAIGHT ROAD VICTORY

LOGAN, Utah (UNLVRebels.com)—UNLV (5-1/2-0) football won a fifth straight road game for the first time in its history, 50-34 over Utah State (1-5/0-2) at Maverik Stadium Friday night.

The Rebels turned in a record-breaking first half to blow the game open early as they won a second consecutive trip to Logan for the first time ever in a series that kicked off way back in 1971.

All-American WR Ricky White III was nearly unstoppable early, catching six passes for 128 yards

and two highlight-reel touchdowns as UNLV rolled up 367 yards before halftime. White would finish with seven grabs for 138 on 17 carries. The Reb defense turned a trio of first-half Aggie turnovers into 17 points as LB Jackson Woodard had a fumble recovery and interception during the first two quarters alone.

Jet Thomas became the fourth different Rebel this season to reach 100 net yards rushing in a game with a career-high 139 on 17 carries just one season after being the only UNLV player to hit the century mark in 2023. Kylin James later became the fifth Rebel to finish with 100-plus yards with 105 on 13 attempts, including two early touchdown runs that helped set the tone. James also added a 24-yard kickoff return.

QB Hajji-Malik Williams gutted out a 233-yard night on 13-of-20 passing that included a trio of touchdowns. He also finished with 65 net yards on 14 carries despite losing 40 yards on sacks.

UNLV led USU by 34 points at halftime but the Aggies outscored their guests 27-9 after the break.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Preseason MW Defensive Player of the Year Jackson Woodard was all over the field – and stat sheet. He turned in 12 total tackles, including one-half TFL, grabbed two interceptions, recovered a fumble and added three pass breakups vs. the Aggies.

STAT OF THE GAME: The 41 points were the most ever scored in any half of football by UNLV vs. an FBS opponent and overall trailed only the 52 vs. Idaho State in 2015 and 42 vs. Jackson State in 2016.

QUOTABLE: "Our turnovers on defense were huge because if we don't get those it could've been more points for them. We're excited to be 5-1 after six games. This is the first time in school history (we have won five straight road games), so I'm excited about that. Proud of our guys' effort. We have a lot to get cleaned up and fixed, but we also understand winning is hard and we've got to find a way to do it. It took good team effort in all three phases to get that done."

REBELS WIN SIXTH STRAIGHT ROAD GAME, GOING BOWLING

CORVALLIS, Oregon (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-1/2-0) football won its school-record sixth consecutive road game Saturday night, 33-25 over Oregon State (4-3/0-0), to become bowl-eligible in consecutive seasons for the first time ever. Trailing by 11 early, the Rebels posted 27 unanswered points to take control in front of 35,195 fans at Reser Stadium.

UNLV, which improved to 4-0 on the road to start a season for the first time ever, also downed its third Power Five opponent this fall – also a first.

OSU scored on its first three possessions to build a 17-6 lead with under three minutes remaining in the second quarter but UNLV QB Hajj-Malik Williams found the end zone from two yards out, which spurred the rally. His nine-yard sprint to the end zone in the third quarter gave the visitors their first lead of the night.

Williams' lone touchdown throw, a 22-yarder to Ricky White III, ballooned the lead to 33-17 in the fourth quarter before OSU scored a TD and made a two-point conversion. The Beavers eventually got the ball back on a turnover and finished the game on the UNLV six-yard line when time ran out and the Rebels earned their first victory over a Pac-12 Conference school since winning at Arizona State in 2008.

UNLV, which had six QB sacks compared to just one by OSU, was led defensively by Antonio Doyle's 3.0 sacks to go with 10 total tackles. Safety Jalen Catalon also had 10 tackles and ripped the ball loose from a runner to force UNLV's only turnover of the night. That fumble, recovered by Cameron Oliver set up the Rebels to take a lead they would never relinquish.

REBEL OF THE GAME: White III blocked his school-record third punt of the season. It was also UNLV's fourth punt block as a team in 2024. White's key play set up a Rebel field goal right before halftime to bring them to within one point at the break, 17-16.

STAT OF THE GAME: Freshman kicker Caden Chittenden continued his All-America-level season by scoring 15 points – nailing all four field goal attempts and three extra points. He now has made 17-of-19 attempts on the year to continue to build on his UNLV freshman season-total record.

QUOTABLE: "We took a step forward today as a program. I'm really happy for our team finding a way to get that win against what I think is a good football team. I thought our offense handled the atmosphere, the noise and the things with the crowd in the great environment"

UNLV FALLS JUST SHORT AGAINST BRONCOS

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-2/2-1) football lost a tight first-place battle with No. 17/19 Boise State (6-1/3-0), 29-24, before a record crowd of 42,228 fans Friday night at Allegiant Stadium.

The Rebels bolted to a 10-3 lead but the Broncos outscored the hosts 17-0 in the second quarter, powered by the lone turnover in the game, a Rebel interception that was converted into a touchdown right before halftime. It marked just the second time this season that UNLV allowed points off a turnover and the game was just the second in the Barry

Odom era where the Rebels failed to grab an interception or fumble.

The Rebels regained the lead with a 14-3 third quarter but failed to score in the last period while the Broncos got a one-yard scoring run from Ashton Jeanty on fourth down with 12:38 remaining for the final points of the game.

Jeanty, who came in averaging a nation-leading 208 yards per game, was largely held in check, finishing with 128 net yards on 33 carries for a per-rush average of just 3.9 yards.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Punter Marshall Nichols posted a season-best 50.5-yard average on four attempts, including a season-long 63-yarder. The junior ranks among the career leaders at both UNLV and in the Mountain West.

STAT OF THE GAME: The crowd of 42,228 broke the school record set in 2002 when 42,075 were on hand at Sam Boyd Stadium to watch Wisconsin down UNLV. The previous high mark for a Rebel game at Allegiant Stadium was 35,193 vs. Iowa State in 2021.

QUOTABLE: "I want to say thank you to the city of Las Vegas and I want to say thank you to all the work that our marketing staff did as well as our athletic department. It took everybody to pull off an environment like tonight. That was a big-time game and was created not only because Boise State is a really good team, but because so is UNLV. It was two great teams going at each other."

"I figured it would come down to turnover margin and having to find a way to win in the fourth quarter. I am devastated for our team that we couldn't find a way to win that one. There are always reasons why you win a game or you lose one, and the takeaway that they created and then turned into points right at the end of the first half, we didn't play real well as a team, but our guys battled. There is no consolation. We lost the game, and I'm frustrated as a head coach that I couldn't get us in position to go win that."

REBELS WIN AT HAWAI'I, STAY PERFECT ON ROAD

HONOLULU (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (7-2/3-1) football improved to 5-0 on the road for the first time ever and won its school-record seventh straight away game dating back to last season with a hard-fought 29-27 final at Hawai'i (4-6/2-3) before a rain-swept crowd of 12,691 fans Saturday night at Clarence T.C. Ching Complex.

The Rebels improved to 15-1 under second-year head coach Barry Odom when leading after the third quarter, powered in part by a pair of 100-yard rushers who each also had a rushing touchdown

– quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams (122) and running back Jet Thomas (109).

UNLV led throughout the first half but held just a two-point advantage, 12-10, at the break in the back-and-forth affair. The visitors eventually built a nine-point advantage in the fourth quarter before UH struck back to pull within two again. However, the Rebels bullied the ball down field on the ground on a decisive drive to run out the clock and give UNLV just its fourth win in 17 all-time trips to the islands.

Defensively, All-America candidate linebacker Jackson Woodard had 2.5 of UNLV's nine tackles-for-loss while DB Johnathan Baldwin contributed one of the team's six sacks and grabbed an interception for the game's only turnover.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Ricky White III continued to move up the UNLV record books with a seven-catch, 128-yard night that included a key 37-yard touchdown. The team captain, just in his third season in Las Vegas after transferring from Michigan State, is second in 100-yard games (13), tied for third in touchdown receptions (22) and third in career receiving yards (2,901).

STAT OF THE GAME: White III's blocked punt, which resulted in a UNLV safety, added to his school single-season record – now a nation-leading four.

QUOTABLE: "We knew it was going to be a tough challenge. It's hard to win. We know that we left 14 points out there. Obviously, if we would have taken care of business there, I think we could have broken (the game) open early. We battled back and made enough plays. Great credit to a team that found a way to win in a place that UNLV hasn't won at very often. We'll build on it. We're 7-2 with three games left in November to do something really special."

REBELS IMPROVE TO 8-2 WITH HOME WIN OVER SDSU

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (8-2/4-1) football beat San Diego State (3-7/2-3) in Las Vegas for the first time since 2017 with a 41-20 victory Saturday night before a crowd of 30,386 at Allegiant Stadium.

Second-year head coach Barry Odom improved to 17-7 at UNLV, which marked the first time a Rebel coach was at least 10 games over .500 at the school since Tony Knap retired after the 1981 season.

The Rebels, who would finish with 515 yards of

offense, built a 21-0 lead in the second quarter and led 28-6 at halftime. The advantage ballooned to 29 points when quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams ran in his second score of the night to make it 35-6. Williams completed 20-of-29 pass attempts for 244 yards, which was his most as a Rebel. He also added a touchdown throw to tight end Kaleo Ballungay to open the scoring.

UNLV, which snapped a four-game losing skid to SDSU, won the turnover battle 2-1 powered by a pair of interceptions. Linebacker Jackson Woodard led all tacklers with 14, including 1.5 TFL, while safety Jalen Catalon added five takedowns to go with a QB sack and a pick.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Senior captain Jacob De Jesus, who missed the previous seven quarters of play, returned in fine fashion, leading all players with 152 all-purpose yards. The wide receiver caught seven passes for a game-leading 75 yards through the air, rushed twice for 42 net yards on the ground and returned five punts for 35 yards, with a long of 14.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV scored six times in eight red-zone trips, including five touchdowns, while SDSU was only 1-of-2 inside the Rebel 20-yard line.

QUOTABLE: "What a feeling to get this team to win number eight. That was the goal going into this week, to find a way to get to 1-0 this week and how important in the conference race it is and what we are trying to do and accomplish here as a program. We are now in a position to play another meaningful game in the month of November."

"I'm really proud of Hajj's efforts and Jackson's as well. I thought that some of the extended plays that Hajj made were big-time runs and a difference in the game. Woodard had 14 tackles and continues to have an All-American run in the way he approaches things and the way he plays. Hajj is one of the elite players, not only in our conference, but in all of college football in what he's done since he took over. It's fun to win when you are at home and now with the quick turnaround, we will get ready for San Jose State."

REBELS' ROAD REIGN CONTINUES IN RAIN

SAN JOSÉ, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) – No. 23/23 UNLV (9-2/5-1) football turned in its first 6-0 road record in program history and won at San Jose State (6-5/3-4) for the first time since 1993 despite an unrelenting rain storm Friday night before a completely soaked crowd of 13,671 fans at CEFCU Stadium.

Playing as a ranked team for the first time ever, the Rebels won their school-record eighth consecutive away game overall dating back to last season by gutting a rain rally behind the feet of their running

backs, and especially Jai'Den Thomas, who finished with 135 yards and a touchdown on 26 carries. The sophomore posted the go-ahead touchdown late in the third quarter and UNLV finished with 207 net yards rushing compared to just 31 by the home team.

The Spartans managed just 112 offensive yards on the night, the second-fewest total ever allowed by UNLV in a game, behind just the 80 posted by San Francisco in the program's inaugural season of 1968. The Rebel defense allowed just one touchdown on the nasty weather night and the visitors overcame allowing a pick-six and a safety in the first half as SJSU led 16-10 at halftime.

All-American WR Ricky White III finished with 98 yards on seven receptions, including multiple key grabs for first downs. Defensively, LB Jackson Woodard posted nine tackles, including 1.5 TFL, while five different players combined for seven pass breakups.

REBEL OF THE GAME: RB Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas posted his third 100-yard rushing game of the season and his 25-yard sprint to the end zone gave his team a lead it would not relinquish. It marked his 20th overall score as a Rebel in less than two full seasons.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV scored in three of its four red-zone trips while SJSU did not reach the red zone once.

QUOTABLE: "I'd like to give a lot of credit to our team for staying in the game through ugly and terrible conditions. We showed really good resolve and toughness, and they stood together. We overcame some things that didn't go our way, and to find a way to go win against what I think is very good team in San Jose, shows a lot about who we are -- what our character is -- within the team. There were a lot of guys who stepped up and made huge plays in the second half when we needed it."

"To find a way to go 6-0 on the road this year -- it's a big thing for us. It's our first win here since 1993. Those are all things that just keep breaking down walls and things that good programs do."

REBELS DOMINATE CANNON CLASH, HEAD TO TITLE TILT

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – No. 21/21 UNLV (10-2/6-1) rolled over in-state rival UNR (3-10/0-7) 38-14 before 40,122 fans at Allegiant Stadium Saturday night to post the program's first 10-win season in 40 years.

With the win, the Rebels earned a spot in the 2024 Old Trapper Mountain West Football Championship Game vs. Boise State on Friday at 5 p.m. PT, marking a rematch of the 2023 game staged in Las Vegas.

After honoring 29 players during Senior Night festivities, UNLV jumped out to a 24-7 halftime lead and cruised to its third straight win vs. the Wolf Pack in what was the 50th all-time Battle for the Fremont Cannon. UNLV also earned three points in the Silver State Series presented by America First Credit Union.

Quarterback Hajj-Malik Williams ran for 104 yards and a touchdown and threw for 168 and two more scores while Jai'Den Thomas posted 135 yards and a TD to lead a potent rushing attack that ended with 351 net yards on the ground as part of 519 yards of total offense.

Jacob De Jesus closed his regular season with a team-leading six receptions for 84 yards as part of his 121 all-purpose total. All-American WR Ricky White III's five catches for 55 yards allowed him to become the first UNLV player in history to post two 1,000-yard receiving yards seasons in a career.

LB Jackson Woodard scored the first touchdown of his career by recovering a fumble in the end zone and added six total tackles, two TFL and one pass breakup to bolster his All-America-level season.

The Rebel defense finished with six sacks and 12 tackles-for-loss as a team while Cameron Oliver hauled in his 13th career interception, which ranks fourth all-time at the school.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Hajj-Malik Williams completed 14-of-21 attempts for 168 yards and averaged 10.4 yards on 10 rushes to lead the ultra-efficient offense. He threw at least one score and ran for at least one score in the same game for the seventh time in his nine starts as a Rebel. He also became just the second Rebel signal-caller to post four 100-yard rushing games in a career -- in just one season.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV reached double digits in victories for only the third time in history (12-1 in 1974 as part of Division II, and 11-2 1984).

QUOTABLE: "Thrilled for our seniors, our team, our university, athletics department and the city of Las Vegas. To get 10 wins in college football is really hard to do. It speaks volumes about the leadership of our football team with our players, their toughness, their resolve, the willingness to continue to work, and everything we put out in front of them they have tried with everything they had to go achieve it."

REBELS DOWNED IN MW CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com) – In what was only the sixth-ever matchup of two Mountain West teams both ranked in the AP top 20, No. 20 UNLV (10-3-6-1) football lost the conference championship game to No. 10 Boise State (12-1-7-0) for the second consecutive year, this time 21-7 before a chilled crowd of 36,663 at Albertsons Stadium Friday night.

Playing in below freezing temperatures and even some fog, the Rebels saw their opening drive derailed at midfield by a penalty and later watched a field-goal attempt hit the crossbar as the Broncos slowly built a

21-0 lead at halftime.

In the third quarter, UNLV's Kylin James broke through for an 86-yard sprint downfield – tied for the fourth-longest rush in school history and the longest play from scrimmage in MW Championship history – but was tackled at the five-yard line and the Rebels eventually turned it over on downs.

UNLV finally broke through in the fourth quarter when on fourth-and-one, freshman Greg Burrell out of Las Vegas rumbled 31 yards into the end zone to close the scoring as the Rebels held the Broncos scoreless in the second half.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV, which went undefeated on the road during a six-game regular-season for the first time in history, saw its school-record eight-game away winning streak snapped. The Rebels lost in a true road game for the first time in 14 months (at Fresno State on Oct. 28, 2023).

QUOTABLE: "I want to make sure I say publicly how proud I am of our football team and our program on the steps that these guys have taken to build on a national stage – a relevant team and two years in a row now competing for a championship. From where we started to where this group has brought us, I'm forever thankful and grateful for the things that they have done every single day.

REBELS WIN LA BOWL FOR HISTORIC 11-3 FINAL RECORD

LOS ANGELES (UNLVRebels.com) – No. 24 UNLV (11-3) football won its first bowl game since 2000 and reached 11 wins in a season for the first time in 40 years, 24-13 over California (6-7) Wednesday night in the Art of Sport LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk before 24,420 fans at SoFi Stadium.

The Rebels, who were led by interim head coach and Los Angeles native Del Alexander, held a 14-13 lead at halftime and shut out the Golden Bears in the second half to improve to 8-1 this season when ahead at the break.

UNLV used a 49-yard passing touchdown, the first ever caught by true freshman Kayden "Big Play" McGee, to take a 7-3 lead. A thrilling fake punt, which turned into a 52-yard pass from punter Marshall Nichols to cornerback Cameron Oliver, then set up Jacob De Jesus taking it in from nine yards out to make it 14-10 Rebels. Cal kicked its second field goal of the first half and that marked its final points of the night. Kylin James rushed in from 23 yards in the third and Caden Chittenden tied the UNLV record with his 26th field goal of the season, from 48 yards out, to close the scoring.

De Jesus was named the game's Offensive MVP with 142 all-purpose yards while All-American linebacker Jackson Woodard closed out his remarkable Rebel career with Defensive MVP honors after posting 11 total tackles and three pass breakups. The 2024 Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year finished his season with 135 total tackles, which ranks third in UNLV single-season history.

STAT OF THE GAME: The Rebels converted the only turnover in the game, a recovered fumble, into a touchdown. That gave UNLV a stunning 98 points off turnovers this season compared to just 28 by its opponents.

QUOTABLE: "How's that for a substitute teacher? Fortunately, it was a big reward for us and our players. They're outstanding young men. They're full of character and integrity, and they work their tails off and to stand in front of them and look in their eyes, they gave me every piece of the motivation that I needed to work tirelessly as a first-year interim head coach and to give them everything that I got.

"I was there at (the 2000 win over) Arkansas. It's a big deal. And it's a big deal for these guys right now. It's an experience that will last their entire lives. I've lived it. For them to feel it and to get the reward from the work, and establish a legacy, hats off to them."

-The Rebels finished with an overall record of 11-3, which marked just the third time in history and first time in 40 years that UNLV reached double-digits in wins
-UNLV snapped a two-game losing streak in bowls to improve to 4-2 all-time in bowl games. The most-recent postseason win for the Rebels before Wednesday came vs. Arkansas in the 2000 Las Vegas Bowl
-UNLV evened its all-time series vs. Cal at 1-1. The teams are scheduled to face each other again in Las Vegas in 2026
-UNLV expanded its conference-record streak of not having more than one turnover in a game. The number is now at 14.
-The Rebels forced at least one turnover in 25 of 28 games under defensive coordinator Michael Scherer
-Senior QB Hajj-Malik Williams' two touchdown passes gave him 19 on the year, which ranked fifth in school single-season history and were the most since Caleb Herring tossed 24 in 2013
