SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (2-0), which received votes in both the AP and Coaches' preseason polls, returns home to host **UCLA (0-1)** on Saturday with an early evening kickoff on CBS Sports Network ... The Rebels are coming off a 38-21 victory at Sam Houston last Friday while the Bruins fell at home to Utah, 43-10, in their season-opener ... The Rebels, who are the first team in MW history to improve their win total four consecutive seasons, are also the first program in FBS history (1978) to improve in four straight seasons by multiple victories (finished with 0 in 2020, 2 in '21, 5 in '22, 9 in '23 and 11 last fall) ... To become just the fourth program in FBS history to improve their win total in five straight years, UNLV will have to do it with a largely new cast as the Scarlet & Gray entered 2025 with the fewest returning starters in the FBS with just two (RB **Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas** on offense and LB **Marsel McDuffie** on defense) ... UNLV has scored at least 20 points in each of its last 24 regular-season games. That's the second-longest active such streak in the FBS, behind only Memphis (38 straight) ... With a second straight 2-0 start to the campaign, the Rebels improved to 9-2 (82%) since the start of 2023 vs. non-conference opponents after going 19-45 (30%) during the previous 17 years since college football moved to a 12-game season in 2006 ... The Rebels sit second in the nation with five interceptions on the young season. Since the beginning of 2022, UNLV's defense has 54 picks, which is the most in the FBS during that span (Texas is second with 48) ... Offensively, the Rebels have not committed more than one turnover in 16 consecutive games, which is the longest such streak in MW history.

REBELS vs. BRUINS NOTES...

Despite the two campuses standing just 283 miles apart, UNLV and UCLA have met only twice on the football field as the Bruins won both ends of a home-and-home series a decade ago ... UNLV is scheduled to return this game at the Rose Bowl on Sept. 6, 2031 ... UCLA is the second-closest FBS school to Las Vegas with USC being just a handful of miles closer ... The Rebels have played five schools that were members of the Big Ten Conference at the time of the game and have a 2-16 record in those outings ... The most recent Big Ten team to face the Rebels was Michigan in 2023 and the last one to play at UNLV was Minnesota in 2012 ... UCLA Director of Football Operations **Ryan McNamee** served in the same role at UNLV in 2019.

One player in Saturday's game will have a unique perspective because he's played for both teams, including one of them TWICE. Senior offensive lineman **Alani Makihele** (ah-LON-ee MAH-kah-HELL-ee) (pictured) from Anchorage, AK, arrived in Las Vegas in 2020 and eventually became a starter in 2023. He decided to transfer to UCLA and played in 12 games last fall, including two starts for the Bruins, before re-entering the portal and returning to the Scarlet & Gray, where he now starts at right guard ... UNLV has won 11 of its last 15 games at Allegiant Stadium to get above the .500 mark (15-14) at their home stadium for the first time since it opened in 2020 ... The Rebels have scored exactly 38 points in both games this season ... With the 38-21 victory at Sam Houston last week, UNLV has now won five consecutive road games vs. non-conference opponents dating back to 2023 ... The Rebels are 11-3 in true road games the last two-plus seasons after only winning eight total road games in the previous six seasons (8-25) ... The game with the Bearkats was moved to Houston's MLS stadium because of construction on SHSU's home facility in Huntsville, TX, more than 70 miles away. UNLV improved to 2-1 in soccer stadiums, having lost vs. San Diego State in Carson, CA, in 2020 and won over Kansas in Kansas City, KS, last fall ... The Rebels improved to 15-15 all-time on Fridays, including winning four straight on the road on that night ... This marked the first time in school history that the Rebels played more than one game in the month of August ... The program is 6-6 in August, including Week Zero's 38-31 home victory over Idaho State ... UNLV has now won a non-conference game in the state of Texas in three consecutive years (at UTEP in 2023, at Houston in 2024 and Sam Houston) ... In defeating Idaho State, new head coach **Dan Mullen** improved to 12-2 all-time (including six straight wins) in season openers at his three stops leading Mississippi State, Florida and now UNLV ... Rebel head coaches are now 7-7 all-time in their debuts at the school ... Things got started earlier than ever for the Rebels in 2025 as the school in July received permission to move the Idaho State game from Sept. 13 to Aug. 23 so that the historic world-championship boxing match between **Canelo Alvarez** and **Terence Crawford** can be held at Allegiant Stadium, as part of Mexican Independence Day festivities ... This marked only the second Week Zero appearance for UNLV in what was the earliest kickoff in school history, beating the Aug. 27, 2022, game -- also vs. Idaho State ... With a new coaching staff in place, UNLV is among the nation's leaders in incoming players who previously played at P4 schools. Not surprisingly, the University of Florida is the most common former school with four new Rebels having previously been Gators like their head coach, Dan Mullen. Four players also formerly attended LSU and a trio of incoming Rebs once played at Arizona State to lead the list of 33 different P4 schools, including a full dozen incoming transfers having at least one stop in the SEC ... UNLV is coming off its first double-digit win total (11-3) for only the third time in history (1974, 1984) ... All three losses last season came to teams who finished ranked (two vs. #8/9 Boise State and vs. #20/22 Syracuse) ... The Rebels finished 2024 ranked No. 23 in the AP poll, No. 24 in the Coaches poll and No. 24 in the CFP after earning their first-ever national ranking earlier in the season, rising as high as No. 19 in the AP and Coaches list on Dec. 1 ... UNLV's 22 wins in 30 games since the start of 2023 represent the most victories over any equal span since the Rebels went a combined 23-7 in 1973-74 and the start of '75 as a member of Division II under future NFL head coach **Ron Meyer** ... UNLV's 24-13 win over Cal in the 2024 Art of Sport LA Bowl Hosted By Gronk marked its first bowl victory since 2000 ... With the Rebs drawing the second-largest crowd to watch the program play at Allegiant Stadium in their 2024 home finale vs. UNR (40,122), UNLV shattered its all-time home attendance mark by averaging 32,202 over six games. The previous record was 29,281 in six games in 2007 ... UNLV, which tied for sixth in the nation in turnover margin at plus-14 last fall, is back to its old tricks in that department as it hauled in four interceptions vs. just a lost fumble vs. Idaho State and grabbed another pick vs. SHSU ... That means the Rebel D has forced at least one turnover in 27 of its last 30 games ... Newcomer **Laterrance Welch** had two interceptions in Week One, including one in the end zone, while senior captain LB **Marsel McDuffie** had his first career INT and DB **Aamaris Brown** grabbed one as well. Brown then hauled in two more at Sam Houston ... For his efforts, Welch was named Week Zero's National East-West Shrine Bowl Defensive Player of the Week.





MORE REBELATIONS...

Four members of Dan Mullen's first UNLV staff were members of last year's program. WR coach **Del Alexander**, who served as interim head coach and led the team to its LA Bowl victory, was retained in his original position as was CB coach **Akeem Davis** and DL coach **Ricky Logo**. New LB coach **Bam Amina** was elevated after serving last fall as a graduate assistant coach ... One new coach hired by Mullen is a familiar face in Las Vegas as longtime NFL defensive guru **Paul Guenther** was named defensive coordinator. Guenther (GUN-ther), who also oversees the UNLV safeties, has coached 21 seasons in the NFL with five different teams, including spending three seasons as the defensive coordinator for the Raiders, including during the franchise's first year in Las Vegas in 2020 ... Aussie freshman punter **Cam Brown** was outstanding in his debut, averaging 44.8 yards on four boots vs. Idaho State, and then averaging 40.5 on two kicks at Sam Houston ... Not counting blocks, UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 23 years -- the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was **Troy Mason**, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium ... However, when **Jai'Den Thomas** went 90 yards into the end zone vs. Fresno State last fall, UNLV snapped a 13-year drought by returning a kickoff for a score for the first time since **Deante Purvis** sprinted 98 yards to the end zone vs. CSU on Oct. 29, 2011 ... The Rebels, who were bowl-eligible in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever, are 20-1 the last two years when leading after the third quarter ... UNLV football earned 11 positions on the 2025 Preseason All-Mountain West teams announced by Athlon Sports. RB **Jai'Den Thomas** was a member of the First Team along with senior LB **Marsel McDuffie**, who is the squad's leading returning tackler. Five Rebels -- all transfers -- were named to Athlon's Third Team. QB **Anthony Colandrea** (Virginia) and WR **Troy Omeire** (Arizona State) joined center **Reid Williams** (Chattanooga) on offense while DL **Jalen Lee** (LSU) and S **Jaheem Joseph** (West Virginia) were included on defense. Four new UNLV players were on the Fourth Team: WR **JoJo Earle** (TCU) and OL **Malik McGowan** (North Carolina), DL **Chief Borders** (Pittsburgh) and DB **Aamaris Brown** (USF). On Phil Steele's 2025 Preseason MW Team, six Rebels were included. Lee, McDuffie and Thomas on the Second Team, Omeire and offensive lineman **Austin Boyd** on the Third Team and Joseph on the Fourth Team.

THOMAS THE TD TRAIN

Despite having a nickname of "Jet," running back **Jai'Den Thomas** moved from flying under the radar into becoming the nation's top freshman scorer as a freshman in 2023. After holding just the one scholarship offer out of Westlake High School in the Atlanta area, Thomas exploded onto the scene with a dozen rushing touchdowns in 13 games and was the nation's only freshman with more than 11 rushing scores that fall. Jet's seven-yard TD vs. Wyoming gave him the UNLV single-season freshman record, breaking a tie with former quarterback **Armani Rogers** (2017). Last summer he was named to the Watch List for the Doak Walker Award and his encore campaign included leading the squad with 918 yards on the ground along with seven rushing scores. He also added his first career receiving touchdown and returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown vs. Fresno State to give him 21 TDs overall heading into his junior season. After a trio of rush TDs in the opener vs.

WHICH QB YOU BE?

The overall list of newcomers from P4 schools this year includes two quarterbacks vying for the starting job -- Virginia junior transfer **Anthony Colandrea** (17 starts for the Cavaliers) and Michigan junior transfer **Alex Orji** (3 starts last season for the Wolverines). Orji became the 16th different QB to start a season opener for UNLV in the last 22 years when he took the first snap of the season vs. Idaho State -- and promptly pitched to Colandrea, who had lined up wide and threw the first attempt of 2025. Orji would go on to complete his three attempts for 37 yards and run for 34 yards, including the go-ahead TD. Colandrea hit 15 of his 21 attempts for 195 yards along with 93 yards of his own on the ground. Colandrea then made the more traditional start in the win at Sam Houston.

JET LANDS ON TRIO OF LISTS

UNLV junior running back **Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas** has taken off nationally as he was included in three prestigious award watch lists this summer. Thomas was one of just 45 players in college football included on the 2025 Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List, earned a spot on the 2025 Doak Walker Award watch list and is one of just 80 players included on the 2025 Maxwell Award Watch List. The Maxwell Award is presented at the end of every season to college football's overall player of the year. Thomas (Atlanta, GA) is just the fourth Rebel player to earn a spot on the Maxwell preseason list in the last decade and the first running back since **Charles Williams** in 2020.



The Forum annually presents the award to the nation's most outstanding college running back. Thomas was previously named 2025 Preseason First Team All-Mountain West after leading the ranked Rebels in rushing yards last fall with 918 along with seven rushing scores. He also added his first career receiving touchdown and returned a kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown to give him 21 TDs overall heading into his junior season. He already ranks seventh in Rebel history with 23 rush scores and needs just one to move into a tie for sixth place.



UNLV HEAD COACH DAN MULLEN

After two years of making history on the field, UNLV football made a historic hire on Dec. 12, 2024, as longtime SEC head coach **Dan Mullen** was appointed the new head coach of the Rebel football program by Director of Athletics **Erick Harper**. A 103-game winner at the University of Florida and Mississippi State University, Mullen returns to the sidelines in Las Vegas after spending the last three seasons as an ESPN college football analyst.

"I am very excited to be a part of the UNLV family," said Mullen. "These past two years, a foundation has been set to compete for championships, including being just one game away from making the College Football Playoff, which is a great testament to where we plan on continuing to be. My expectation is to keep that excitement and momentum alive and produce a team for the University, the City of Las Vegas and the State of Nevada that is going to compete for championships on a regular basis. I look forward to creating excitement for all UNLV Athletics and our goal is to be the premier program in the Mountain West."

The 14th head coach in UNLV history, Mullen, 53, boasts nearly three decades of coaching experience, including 13 as a head coach. He spent nine years at the helm of MSU and a combined eight years at Florida, first as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and returning to Gainesville to lead the program from 2018-21.

Mullen has an 103-61 (.628) overall record, a 7-3 bowl game record while leading a program and has seen 76 players under his guidance drafted in the NFL.

"We are ecstatic to announce the hiring of Dan Mullen, who is both an innovator and nationally respected leader in the sport of football," said Harper. "The momentum of UNLV football continues to skyrocket with Coach Mullen coming aboard and is even more proof that our university is serious about success. Rebel Nation came alive while watching this program reach new heights the last two seasons and we are excited to keep it moving forward under the leadership of someone the caliber of Dan Mullen."

Mullen compiled an overall 34-15 mark in Gainesville over four years and led UF to national prominence in just his first season. He and the Gators took the next step in his second and third seasons with an SEC Championship Game appearance to highlight the 2020 campaign. Registering an 11-2 record in 2019, Mullen and the Gators finished at No. 6 in the final Associated Press Poll, their highest finish since 2009 at No. 3. On the national stage, Mullen became the first head coach in FBS history to win BCS/New Year's Six bowl games in both of his first two seasons with a program. Mullen, who served four seasons (2005-08) as the Gators' offensive coordinator, played a major role in the program winning two SEC and BCS National Titles (2006, 2008), spent nine seasons overseeing the Mississippi State program from 2009-17 before returning to Gainesville. In 2014, Mullen was honored as the National College Football Coach of the Year by the Maxwell Football Club. He also garnered honors as the SEC Coach of the Year in the same season. His tenure with the Bulldogs saw the program ascend to a No. 1 ranking during the regular-season and play in a school-record eight consecutive bowl games.

Before heading to Gainesville for the first time, Mullen coached in the Mountain West as the quarterback coach for former MW-member Utah with head coach **Urban Meyer**, with whom he had spent 10 seasons. While coaching the Ute quarterbacks, Mullen helped develop NFL standout **Alex Smith** - the first overall selection in the 2005 Draft. The 2004 season culminated with Smith earning National Player of the Year honors while also becoming the Utes' first-ever Heisman Trophy finalist.

When **Haji-Malik Williams** (pictured) finished with 104 net yards rushing vs. UNR in Game 12 of 2024, he became just the second UNLV quarterback to post at least four century-mark game on the ground during his

career, joining **Armani Rogers**, who had six from 2017-19. When Williams went for 119 vs. Fresno State earlier in the fall, he became the 14th different signal-caller to finish with at least 100. There have been only 24 such games in history but a full 16 of those have happened since the start of the 2016 season.

In fact, no less than 20 different states and three different countries are represented on this year's roster. While a majority of Rebels naturally hail from California (21), Texas (18), Nevada (14) and Florida (10) have all produced double-digit players. Five natives of Louisiana have come to Las Vegas along with four from Hawai'i and Arizona. Meanwhile, Missouri, Oklahoma and North Carolina are home to no less than three current Rebels while Tennessee, Washington, Utah and Illinois supply two each. Alaska, Colorado, Connecticut, South Carolina and Mississippi all are home to one UNLV player while P **Cam Brown** hails from Australia and OL **James Faminu** is from England.

RECORD CROWD!

The UNLV vs. Boise State game on Friday, Oct. 25, 2024, drew the biggest home crowd in Rebel history as 42,228 fans filled Allegiant Stadium. That total bested the attendance of 42,074 set at Sam Boyd Stadium vs. Wisconsin in 2002. The previous record for a UNLV game in its new home at Allegiant was 35,193 vs. Iowa State in 2021.

FERTITTA FOOTBALL COMPLEX: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex in 2019. The project was made possible because of the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged the initial \$10 million toward construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park, which now includes a playing surface installed last summer. The FFC is the day-to-day home of the program and includes an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center, player lounge and even a barbershop.

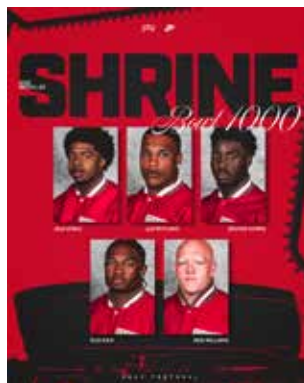

SHRINE SHINE

UNLV football placed five players on the East-West Shrine 1000 watch list, which was released this summer by the annual postseason all-star event. The list consists of the best 1,000 players throughout all of college football who are currently all-star game eligible for the 2026 East-West Shrine Bowl and the 2026 NFL Draft class. On offense, the list includes WR **JoJo Earle**, QB **Alex Orji** and C **Reid Williams**. Defensively, DB **Denver Harris** and LB **Justin Flowe** made the cut. The five representatives ranked second in the Mountain West this time around. Two Rebels on last year's list were later selected to play in the postseason game – current Seattle Seahawks WR **Ricky White III** and Houston Texans LB **Jackson Woodard**.



HIGH EXPECTATIONS

UNLV football tied a school record by being picked to finish second in the Mountain West in the preseason media poll. The Rebels, who received four first-place votes and 415 points overall, only trailed Boise State's 643 total points. Those same two teams played in the last two Mountain West Championship games. The only other times UNLV was picked to finish as high as second was last year and also before the 2001 season after **John Robinson's** Rebels downed Arkansas in the 2000 Las Vegas Bowl.

COLANDREA & BROWN EARN MW HONORS

UNLV football earned both the Old Trapper Mountain West Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week awards in the same week for the first time in nine seasons as quarterback **Anthony Colandrea** and defensive back **Amaris Brown** were cited by the league September 1. It was the first time the Rebels grabbed both honors since quarterback **Kurt Palandech** and cornerback **Torry McTyer** were announced after UNLV's thrilling, 69-66 three-overtime victory over **Josh Allen**-led Wyoming at Sam Boyd Stadium in November 2016. Colandrea (St. Petersburg, FL) completed 19 of his 23 pass attempts for 249 yards and two touchdowns to help UNLV down Sam Houston 38-21 on Friday. The junior signal-caller, who transferred in from Virginia, also ran for 23 net yards, including a game-sealing 13-yard scamper into the end zone in the fourth quarter. Colandrea, who is the program's first offensive honoree since 2023, is also the first Rebel quarterback to earn the MW weekly kudo since **Doug Brumfield** on Aug. 29, 2022. Brown (Tampa, FL) was impactful throughout the night in Houston, with no play bigger than a 52-yard interception return for a touchdown in the middle of the second quarter. The former South Florida transfer had four solo tackles, three tackles-for-loss and two quarterback sacks. One came on third down to force a Bearkat punt and the other came on fourth down and resulted in a turnover on downs that allowed the Rebels to run out the clock in victory formation.



FRIEL LISTED FOR WUERFFEL AND GOOD WORKS TEAM

UNLV quarterback **Cameron Friel** is part of the official nominees list for both the 2025 AFCA Allstate Good Team and Allstate Wuerffel Trophy. College football student-athletes and head coaches from all levels of the sport are recognized for their commitment to community service and leadership beyond the gridiron. Friel, a senior from Kaneohe, Hawaii, returns for his fifth and final season this fall with the Rebels. The 2021 Mountain West Freshman of the Year currently has the highest pass completion percentage in UNLV history at 64.0 and is the squad's top community service performer off the field. For the second year, Allstate is partnering with the Wuerffel Foundation to align two of college football's most meaningful honors: the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy. Together, they recognize student-athletes who demonstrate excellence in community service, academics and athletics.



TYLER ROSE TARGETS TEXAS TRIO



The 13th annual Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List included three UNLV players this summer. The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award recognizes the top offensive player in Division I football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define **Earl Campbell**: integrity, performance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity; specifically, tenacity to persist and determination to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals. In addition, the nominee must meet one or more of the following criteria: Played football at and graduated from a Texas high school and/or currently playing at Texas D1 four-year college. The Rebels included were junior quarterback **Alex Orji**, who attended Sachse High School in the Lone Star State, senior wide receiver **Troy Omeire**, who attended Fort Bend Austin High School and senior wide receiver **JoJo Earle**, who graduated from Aledo High School.

REBELS FIGHT OFF BENGALS IN MULLEN'S DEBUT

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (1-0) opened the Dan Mullen Era with a hard-fought 38-31 win over Idaho State (0-1) in a Week Zero Saturday afternoon special before a raucous crowd of 25,723 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

In by far the earliest game in program history, the Rebels had to rally after falling behind 10-0 after the first quarter. That's when All-America candidate running back Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas went to work – igniting his squad with two long touchdown runs in a span of just over three minutes. One from 39 yards

out and the other being a 70-yard race to the end zone to give the home team its first lead.

The Bengals led at halftime, 17-14, and the teams continued to trade leads until back-to-back interceptions in the fourth quarter, part of four for the squad on the day, led to quarterback Alex Orji's go-ahead 11-yard rushing touchdown on fourth down with just under nine minutes remaining.

Orji (3 of 3) and fellow-QB Anthony Colandrea (15 of 21) combined to complete 18 of 24 attempts for 232 yards and one score (no interceptions) through the air and 127 net yards and the TD on 19 carries on the ground. Jaden Bradley led all receivers with a career-high 131 yards on six receptions and new safety Jake Pope led the team with 10 total tackles while new UNLV cornerback Laterrance Welch had two of the picks to give him four in his career (two at ASU).

The Rebels have now won 11 of their last 15 home games and hold a winning record at Allegiant Stadium (15-14 since opening in 2020) for the first time ever.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Jai'Den Thomas was magic in his junior debut, rushing for a career-high 147 yards with a 14.7 YPC average, including a career-long 70-yard sprint to the end zone as part of his three-touchdown day. He also moved from ninth to seventh on UNLV's career rushing touchdown list with 22.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's defense brought in four interceptions in a game for the first time since a win over Fresno State on Sept. 28, 2024. Welch had his two, including one in the end zone, while senior captain LB Marsel McDuffie had his first career INT and Aamaris Brown grabbed one as well.

QUOTABLE: "It could have been very easy for us to find a way to lose as a team, but this team, these guys all stuck together and found a way to win when it was important. We are going to enjoy this win tonight. We are going to get into work early tomorrow and we're going to start coaching and fixing and correcting everything."

REBELS TACKLE ANOTHER TEXAS TEAM, IMPROVE TO 2-0

HOUSTON (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (2-0) improved to 11-3 in true road games since the beginning of 2023 after downing Sam Houston (0-2), 38-21, late Friday night before an announced crowd of 5,837 fans at Shell Energy Stadium.

In the first-ever meeting with the Bearkats and playing in a pro soccer stadium for the second straight season, the Rebels led 24-7 at halftime and did not punt until the middle of the third quarter. Aamaris Brown had a monster game on defense, returning an interception 52 yards for a touchdown to go with

a pair of sacks and a third tackle-for-loss. Jaden Bradley was impressive in the air, posting his second consecutive 100-yard receiving game (six for 125), including a 43-yard touchdown in the game's first drive. DeAngelo Irvin Jr. caught the Rebels' other touchdown pass to notch the first of his career to help build the early lead.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed his first six pass attempts and finished 19 of 23 for 249 yards and two scores. He also rushed six times for 23 yards, including a nifty 13-yard touchdown spurt in the fourth quarter.

STAT OF THE GAME: After Sam Houston scored on its opening drive of the game, the Rebel defense blanked the Kats until the fourth quarter with the help of an interception and four sacks and holding them to 1-12 on third down. Sam Houston did score two long second-half touchdowns – both on fourth-and-one.

QUOTABLE: "Here's the issue. I'm so pleased, because I think we're really coming together. We took a huge step from last week and I think that's a big deal for us. But as we did last week, when we're good, on both sides of the ball, we're really good, and then we have some errors. We're just missing that focus and that attention to detail for four quarters. There are so many positive plays to build on if we can just focus on eliminating some of the negatives."

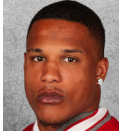

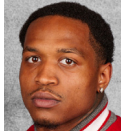
