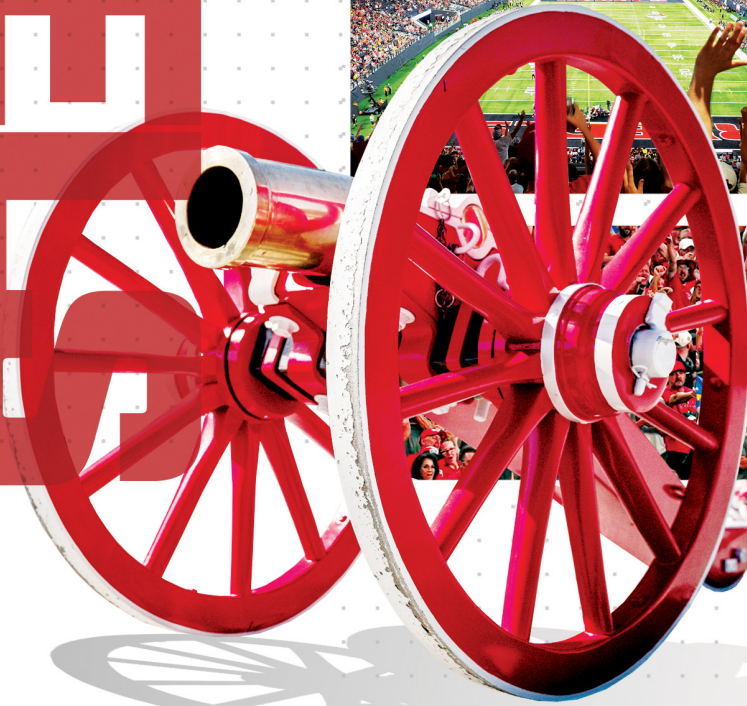
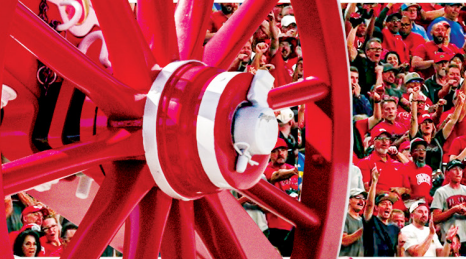

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (1-0) opened the Dan Mullen Era with a hard-fought 38-31 win over Idaho State (0-1) in a Week Zero Saturday afternoon special before a raucous crowd of 25,723 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

In by far the earliest game in program history, the Rebels had to rally after falling behind 10-0 after the first quarter. That's when All-America candidate running back Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas went to work – igniting his squad with two long touchdown runs in a span of just over three minutes. One from 39 yards

out and the other being a 70-yard race to the end zone to give the home team its first lead.

The Bengals led at halftime, 17-14, and the teams continued to trade leads until back-to-back interceptions in the fourth quarter, part of four for the squad on the day, led to quarterback Alex Orji's go-ahead 11-yard rushing touchdown on fourth down with just under nine minutes remaining.

Orji (3 of 3) and fellow-QB Anthony Colandrea (15 of 21) combined to complete 18 of 24 attempts for 232 yards and one score (no interceptions) through the air and 127 net yards and the TD on 19 carries on the ground. Jaden Bradley led all receivers with a career-high 131 yards on six receptions and new safety Jake Pope led the team with 10 total tackles while new UNLV cornerback Laterrance Welch had two of the picks to give him four in his career (two at ASU).

The Rebels have now won 11 of their last 15 home games and hold a winning record at Allegiant Stadium (15-14 since opening in 2020) for the first time ever.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Jai'Den Thomas was magic in his junior debut, rushing for a career-high 147 yards with a 14.7 YPC average, including a career-long 70-yard sprint to the end zone as part of his three-touchdown day. He also moved from ninth to seventh on UNLV's career rushing touchdown list with 22.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's defense brought in four interceptions in a game for the first time since a win over Fresno State on Sept. 28, 2024. Welch had his two, including one in the end zone, while senior captain LB Marsel McDuffie had his first career INT and Aamaris Brown grabbed one as well.

QUOTABLE: "It could have been very easy for us to find a way to lose as a team, but this team, these guys all stuck together and found a way to win when it was important. We are going to enjoy this win tonight. We are going to get into work early tomorrow and we're going to start coaching and fixing and correcting everything."

REBELS TACKLE ANOTHER TEXAS TEAM, IMPROVE TO 2-0

HOUSTON (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (2-0) improved to 11-3 in true road games since the beginning of 2023 after downing Sam Houston (0-2), 38-21, late Friday night before an announced crowd of 5,837 fans at Shell Energy Stadium.

In the first-ever meeting with the Bearkats and playing in a pro soccer stadium for the second straight season, the Rebels led 24-7 at halftime and did not punt until the middle of the third quarter. Aamaris Brown had a monster game on defense, returning an interception 52 yards for a touchdown to go with

a pair of sacks and a third tackle-for-loss. Jaden Bradley was impressive in the air, posting his second consecutive 100-yard receiving game (six for 125), including a 43-yard touchdown in the game's first drive. DeAngelo Irvin Jr. caught the Rebels' other touchdown pass to notch the first of his career to help build the early lead.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Quarterback Anthony Colandrea completed his first six pass attempts and finished 19 of 23 for 249 yards and two scores. He also rushed six times for 23 yards, including a nifty 13-yard touchdown spurt in the fourth quarter.

STAT OF THE GAME: After Sam Houston scored on its opening drive of the game, the Rebel defense blanked the Kats until the fourth quarter with the help of an interception and four sacks and holding them to 1-12 on third down. Sam Houston did score two long second-half touchdowns – both on fourth-and-one.

QUOTABLE: "Here's the issue. I'm so pleased, because I think we're really coming together. We took a huge step from last week and I think that's a big deal for us. But as we did last week, when we're good, on both sides of the ball, we're really good, and then we have some errors. We're just missing that focus and that attention to detail for four quarters. There are so many positive plays to build on if we can just focus on eliminating some of the negatives."

UNDEFEATED REBELS DOWN BIG TEN BRUINS

Ramon Villela started off the scoring with a 50-yard field goal, and three different Rebels found the end zone as the home team raced to a 23-0 lead in the second quarter. The Bruins, who were playing at UNLV for just the second time and first time since 2015, added a field goal to make it 23-3 at halftime. The Bruins scored the first 10 points of the second half before the Rebels scored their only points after the break with Anthony Colandrea's 17-yard scoring toss to tight end Var'Keyes Gumms. UCLA pulled within a touchdown late and was driving for the potential game-tying score when senior linebacker Marsel McDuffie tipped a pass attempt and safety Aamaris Brown corralled the interception to secure the victory.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Quarterback Anthony Colandrea was efficient again, completing 71-percent of his passes (15 of 21) for 203 yards and three touchdown passes, which tied his career high (did it twice at Virginia). He added 59 net yards on 11 rushing attempts.

STAT OF THE GAME: Aamaris Brown's game-sealing interception was his third pick in three games of 2025.

QUOTEABLE: "Our offense really showed up tonight. It was a really efficient, good first half. We got out of rhythm in the second half, but they did a good job with getting us out rhythm, holding onto the ball in the second half, and being able to stay on the field. UNDEFEATED REBELS RALLY FOR WILD WIN OVER REDHAWKS

OXFORD, Ohio (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (4-0) scored the final 17 points of the day to win a wild rollercoaster of a road game, 41-38, over Miami University (0-3) and earn its first-ever victory in the Eastern Time Zone in 15 all-time attempts on Saturday afternoon before 12,625 fans at Yager Stadium.

Kicking off at 9 a.m. PT on ESPN, the Rebels overcame a sluggish start in what was the first-ever meeting of the programs, scoring two quick touchdowns to start the third quarter and tie the game

at 24. The RedHawks, however, scored a pair of TDs of their own in unorthodox fashion by taking the kickoff back 100 yards for a score and then later tipping a pass attempt and returning it for a long TD to suddenly regain a 14-point lead.

The Rebels, though, were simply unfazed, methodically scoring two touchdowns to tie things and then eventually passing down field to set up Ramon Villela's 23-yard field goal to take the lead with just 15 seconds remaining. Miami would hit one pass and line up for a 57-yard game-tying field goal attempt but after a bad snap, tossed the ball downfield into the awaiting hands of senior linebacker Marsel McDuffie, whose game-sealing interception went with his 10 tackles and a fumble recovery that set up the winning drive after defensive back Jaheem Joseph forced the turnover deep in his team's territory. The RedHawk offense was shut down after halftime, gaining just 89 total yards and scoring only on special teams and defense.

With its first-ever win on the road vs. a MAC opponent, UNLV extended its Mountain West record streak of defeating non-conference opponents. Quarterback Anthony Colandrea finished with 293 yards passing and two scores while running back Jet Thomas posted 118 rushing yards and a score as one of four different Rebels to find the end zone on offense.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Safety Aamaris Brown grabbed his nation-leading fourth interception and posted his second pick-six of the season. The senior transfer also added a pass breakup and a tackle. His big play in the second quarter sparked the Rebels after originally falling behind 14-0. He is the sixth player in Mountain West history to record at least one pick in four consecutive games played by his team.

STAT OF THE GAME: Until running the ball to set up for the game-winning field goal, UNLV was 9-for-9 on third-down attempts in the second half. The Rebels finished 12-for-17 on third down.

QUOTEABLE: "The best act's the final act it seems like when we're playing. I couldn't be more proud of these guys..."

UNLV FOOTBALL EARNS HAIL OF ROAD WIN

LARAMIE, Wyo. (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (5-0/1-0) won its first five games in a season for the first time since 1974 and opened Mountain West play with a 31-17 road win over Wyoming (2-3/0-1) in front of a chilled Homecoming crowd of 19,861 fans at War Memorial Stadium.

Playing on a white-swept field after a massive hail and thunder storm that briefly delayed the start of the game, the Rebels fought off the wild weather conditions to score two touchdowns on blocked punts in the first half to build a 24-3 lead.

UNLV was out-gained by 102 yards but was perfect in three red-zone trips and forced three turnovers against losing just one fumble to fight off the Cowboys.

REBEL OF THE GAME: The special teams combination of WRs Kayden McGee and Jaden Bradley accounted for two touchdowns to set the tone for the desert dwellers. First, Bradley blocked a punt that McGee returned 16 yards for a score and then McGee blocked a punt that Bradley ran 13 yards into the end zone.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV leads the nation with nine road victories since the start of the 2024 season.

QUOTABLE: "Our special teams were huge tonight and the conditions were tough. You have to win with offense, defense, and special teams and our special teams certainly won us the game. I thought defensively we played well. Offensively, when we needed some good drives we delivered, but we had some inconsistency and mistakes, we'll take being 5-0."

UNLV CLIPS AIR FORCE TO REMAIN PERFECT

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-0/2-0) became bowl-eligible for a third straight season for the first time in history with a wild 51-48 win over Air Force (1-5/0-4) on Saturday afternoon before 32,932 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

The four-hour, 15-minute affair featured a stunning 11 lead changes as UNLV downed Air Force at home for the first time since 2012.

The Rebels, who are 6-0 for the first time since 1974, scored 38 points in the second half and still needed

to watch the Falcons miss a 40-yard field goal attempt as time expired. UNLV, which scored on every possession after halftime, trailed by four with 1:13 remaining but marched right down field for the go-ahead touchdown on a 19-yard run into the end zone by quarterback Anthony Colandrea. The transfer from Virginia rushed for 62 net yards and a pair of TDs while completing 20-of-32 passes for 361 yards, including a stunning 86-yard scoring strike to DaeDae Reynolds.

Wide receiver Jaden Bradley caught three passes for 73 yards and tossed a 16-yard touchdown to tight end Var'Keyes Gumbs. Ramon Vilella nailed all three of his field goal attempts as part of his career-high 13-point day. Running back Jet Thomas netted 88 yards on the ground and 58 through the air on a career-high six receptions. His 51-yard sprint to the end zone gave his team a 44-41 lead with under five minutes remaining. Defensive back Andrew Powdrell led all tacklers with 13 to lead four Rebels with double-digit takedowns.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Anthony Colandrea overcame a rough start to complete 65-percent of his passes and throw for the 19th-most yards in a game by a Rebel and the most since Max Gilliam threw for 387 at San Jose State in 1978. The junior also coolly led his team to the winning score with under a minute to go, capped by his own TD run.

STAT OF THE GAME: The teams combined for 65 total points in the second half, including UNLV's five touchdowns and one field goal.

QUOTABLE: "Heck of a team win. So proud of our team. I want to give Air Force a lot of credit. That's a really good football team. They were 1-4 coming in, but had only been outscored by eight points or something on the season. Every game has come down to the wire. We knew they were an explosive offense and that we were going to have to score. Yards were 603 to 597. It was a back-and-forth game and could have gone either way. Heck of a football game. But so proud of our guys."

BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-1/2-1) saw its seven-game overall win streak snapped by a familiar foe as Boise State (5-2/3-0) prevailed going away, 56-31, in front of a sun-baked sold-out crowd of 32,927 at Albertsons Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Rebels, wearing white from top to bottom, were driving with a chance to take the lead early in the third quarter but punted it away on fourth and short and the Broncos scored three straight touchdowns in the next nine minutes, including one on a pick-six, to take control and earn its nation-leading 16th consecutive home victory.

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (6-2/2-2) saw its five-game home win streak snapped by New Mexico (6-3/3-2), 40-35, in front of a crowd of 25,972 at Allegiant Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Lobos jumped out to a 21-0 lead only to see the Rebels tie it in the second quarter on a pick-six. UNM, which ended a three-game losing skid to UNLV, then scored 10 quick points to take a 31-21 lead into halftime.

UNLV continued to fight back and eventually took

its only lead of the game, 35-34, with 6:35 remaining on quarterback Anthony Colandrea's third touchdown pass of the day. The visitors, however, took the lead for good and then held off two final drives by the home team, which actually had nine more first downs on the day (25-16).

REBEL OF THE GAME: Despite battling the flu, Anthony Colandrea had his best statistical game as a Rebel, completing a career-high 36 passes on 46 attempts for 382 yards and three TDs. He also led the Scarlet & Gray in rushing with 40 net yards on eight carries. The passing total tied for the 16th-most in school history and bested the junior's previous career high of 377 vs. JMU while playing for Virginia in 2023.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV fumbled six times and lost three of them after coming into the game having lost just two all season.

QUOTABLE: "I'll give New Mexico credit, they put together a great plan. They're a team that plays extremely hard and they executed in all phases. FORT COLLINS, Colo. (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (7-2-3) won in this city for the first time in 23 years, 42-10 over Colorado State (2-7-1-4) on a chilly Saturday night before an announced crowd of 27,970 at Canvas Stadium.

The Rebels, who improved to 7-2 through nine games for the third straight season, broke a seven-game losing streak playing at the Rams in what was the final matchup of the teams as Mountain West rivals. UNLV, which tallied 571 total yards, has scored at least 30 points in every game this season, extending its school record to nine straight outings reaching that mark.

CSU led 7-0 after the first quarter before UNLV won the second quarter, 21-3, powered by three rushing touchdowns – all by different players – as part of a 320-yard night on the ground. The Rebels built an 18-point lead early in the third when Anthony Colandrea found Troy Omeire, who raced 68 yards to the end zone. Colandrea also ran for two touchdowns. UNLV, in fact, would end up scoring the game's final 35 points.

The Rebel defense posted eight tackles for loss while holding the Rams to the fewest points by a UNLV opponent since winning 27-7 at Houston to open the 2024 season. The 10 points were the fewest allowed to a MW opponent since beating New Mexico 35-7 in 2012.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Junior RB Jet Thomas ignited the Rebel offense with two long runs in the second quarter en route to his eighth career 100-yard outing. His 57-yard touchdown scamper got his team on the board and then his 59-yard bolt on the next drive set up another score. He ran for 121 yards on just four carries in the first half and finished with 131 yards on seven attempts for an eye-popping per-carry average of 18.7.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's defense held CSU to just 1-for-13 on third down.

QUOTABLE: "I'm really proud of the guys and how they respond as a team. Like I've said for a while, I think we do some of the tough things really, really well, like we stick together as a team. You don't see much finger pointing going on. I'm really pleased with our guys because we keep grinding on the little things. I still think we made some mistakes, a couple of penalties. There are still going to be a couple of missed assignments we're not going to be really pleased about, but overall, I really thought we played well defensively... And offensively, I thought up front, we played really well. Of course they're going to blitz you all over the place. They're going to get their blitz that much, you get to the second level and there's no one left if you're going to blitz. And we hit them on some really big runs that way."

REBELS WIN WILD DOUBLE-OT GAME OVER USU

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (8-2-4-2), which was without leading rusher Jai'Den Thomas because of injury, survived in double-overtime, 29-26, over Utah State (5-5-3-3) on a rainy Saturday night before 31,682 fans at Allegiant Stadium.

UNLV trailed 13-10 at halftime but retook the lead in the third on QB Anthony Colandrea's 18th touchdown pass of the season, this one to DaeDae Reynolds in the back of the end zone. USU eventually regained the advantage in the fourth quarter, 23-20, before Ramon Villela's 32-yard field goal tied things with just

over two minutes left in regulation. The Aggies would go on to miss a potential game-winning field goal to send the teams to overtime.

The Rebels failed to score, missing from 39 yards out, but then saw USU miss its third attempt of the ballgame and send it to a second session. This time the Aggies made the kick, from 39 yards out, to lead 26-23. On its first play of the second OT, Colandrea handed off to WR Kayden McGee who dashed through the defense and dove for the end zone to end the nearly four-hour game.

UNLV's defense posted seven total sacks on the night, the most in a game since getting eight at New Mexico on Nov. 6, 2021.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Kayden "Big Play" McGee lived up to his nickname again as the redshirt freshman took his three carries for a team-leading 54 yards on the ground, including the game-winner. McGee previously won Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week after blocking a punt and scoring on another blocked punt at Wyoming.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV won its first overtime game since a thriller at UNR in 2019. The Rebels had lost two straight OTs coming in and are just 7-12 overall all-time in extra sessions. This marked the first time UNLV won in two overtimes. The Rebels' only previous win in a game that went longer than one OT period was a triple-OT victory at Sam Boyd Stadium vs. Wyoming and QB Josh Allen in 2016.

QUOTABLE: "What a great win for our guys, we continue to believe in our guys and they're fun to coach. They find ways to stick together and continue to make plays in critical moments. It's different people stepping up... You never know when your number will be called. Kayden's was called today in overtime and he delivered."

PINEAPPLE STAYS IN VEGAS AS REBS ROLL OVER HAWAII

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (9-2/5-2) stayed alive for a potential spot in the Mountain West Championship game with a 38-10 win over Hawaii (7-4/4-3) on Friday night before the biggest crowd of the year at Allegiant Stadium (37,106).

UNLV improved to 5-0 when it scored first this fall as Ramon Villela nailed a 44-yard field goal on the opening drive. The Rainbow Warriors then took their only lead of the night on a 72-yard pass play. The Rebels responded with an eight-yard score from Anthony Colandrea to Jaden Bradley to put the

home team in front for good. It marked UNLV's first first-quarter touchdown in the last five games and head coach Dan Mullen's squad never looked back in reaching the 30-point mark for a school-record 10th time in 2025.

The Rebel defense dominated, blanking UH completely in the second half. Fifth-year senior captain LB Marsel McDuffie led the way with eight tackles while DB Aamaris Brown added five takedowns, including 1.5 sacks, while safety Jake Pope corralled his first collegiate interception, which his team converted into a touchdown.

UNLV won its third straight over the Rainbow Warriors and took a 5-4 lead in the series since it became known as the Ninth Island Showdown in 2017, featuring the beloved golden pineapple Island Showdown Trophy. UH still leads the overall series 19-16.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Junior QB Anthony Colandrea was tremendous again, completing 81-percent of his pass attempts for 253 yards and three touchdowns to three different receivers. His 21 TD passes this fall rank fifth in school single-season history and his total of 2,780 yards through the air is in sixth place..

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV outgained the high-powered Hawaii offense 470-231 in total yards as the Rainbow Warriors never reached the red zone.

QUOTABLE: "That was a great win for us tonight as a team. We talked about senior night, our last home game of the year. We wanted to come out and play our best game of the season. Why not come out and do that? Why not play to the level we can play at? I thought for the most part that we did that... This is a big win for our team. There is a standard of which we expect to play and we want to keep improving. We want to be playing our best football at the end of the year. We are going to enjoy this win tonight, give the guys two days off, and get ready for another huge rivalry game next week. And then if we can compete at the end of the year, hopefully we have a chance to play for a championship and play our best football right when the days get shorter, the nights get longer, and the games get bigger."

REBELS TIE FOR REGULAR-SEASON MW TITLE, KEEP CANNON

RENO (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (10-2/6-2) made sure the beloved Fremont Cannon remained painted red and finished in a four-way tie for first place in the Mountain West with a dominating 42-17 victory at UNR (3-9/2-6) on Saturday night before a crowd of 17,912 at Mackay Stadium.

The Rebels reached the 10-win mark for the fourth time in history and in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever. UNLV, which downed the Wolf Pack for the fourth consecutive season, scored three times – each from 17 yards out – in its first four possessions

to take command early. Head coach Dan Mullen's team also earned three points in the Silver State Series presented by America First Credit Union.

Jai'Den Thomas rushed for two first-half touchdowns, racking up 87 yards on six carries before the break and then adding two more scores in the second half. Quarterback Anthony Colandrea became just the fourth Rebel in history to reach the 3,000-yard mark passing in a season, finishing with 270 yards vs. UNR.

Despite committing eight off-sides penalties, the UNLV defense turned in its fourth straight strong effort, including holding a second consecutive opponent under 20 points. DB Jaheem Joseph led the way with five total tackles, two quarterback sacks and a forced fumble.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Junior running back Jai'Den "Jet" Thomas scored his 28th, 29th, 30th and 31st career rushing touchdowns, which ranks fifth in program history. He finished with 103 yards on just 11 carries and added three receptions for 24 more yards. It marked his ninth career 100-yard rushing game while his four rushing touchdowns made him just the second Rebel in history to pull off the feat twice in a career, joining former All-American Mike Thomas (1973-74).

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV scored at least 20 points for the 34th consecutive regular-season game, which leads college football after former leader Memphis failed to reach 20 on Thanksgiving night. The Rebels also surpassed the 30-point mark for a school-record 11th time in 12 games this season.

QUOTABLE: "I'm really proud of our guys for how we came out and played. We wanted to play a great game and I think we did that in every facet except for one - a couple personal fouls and the off-sides penalties. Offensively I thought we executed pretty clean. Overall, it's huge to get a rivalry win. I know how big this game is. It's great to keep the Cannon red, great for the city of Las Vegas, for UNLV and alumni to get this win and have the pride that this is our state for another year."

REBELS AWAIT BOWL, FALL IN MW CHAMPIONSHIP

BOISE, Idaho (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (10-3-6-2) fell to Boise State (9-4-6-2) in the Mountain West Championship game, 38-21, in front of 27,152 fans at rainy Albertsons Stadium Friday night.

The Rebels saw their four-game win streak snapped in what could be the program's final trip here as the Broncos exit the Mountain West.

The visitors fell behind 21-0 before quarterback Anthony Colandrea capped a 95-yard scoring drive with his ninth rushing touchdown of the season

from five yards out. He then threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Troy Omeire to make it 28-14 at the break. UNLV made it a one-score game with another methodical drive, capped by a direct-snap rushing TD by WR JoJo Earle. BSU, however, started off the fourth quarter with another score and then added a field goal.

UNLV will now wait to see which bowl game it will play in when the Sunday announcement is made. The Rebels will look to bounce back as they appear in a bowl game for the third consecutive season for the first time in program history.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Anthony Colandrea continued to be the only player in college football this season to throw for at least one touchdown and finish with at least 15 net rushing yards in every game this season. His 66 yards rushing moved him into third place at the school for ground yards in a season, passing Jason Thomas (2000), with 621.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV has only six losses in the last two seasons – four of them coming at the hands of the Broncos.

REBELS COME UP SHORT IN FRISCO BOWL

FRISCO, Texas (UNLVRebels.com) – UNLV (10-4-6-2) could not overcome multiple self-inflicted wounds and fell to Ohio (9-4-6-2), 17-10, in the Scooter's Coffee Frisco Bowl in front of 6,521 fans at Ford Center at the Star late Tuesday night.

The Rebels, who were shut out in the first half in a bowl game for the first time ever and first time overall since the 2024 Mountain West Championship game vs. Boise State, turned the ball over twice, had a punt partially blocked and a touchdown wiped out by penalty in the first half alone and trailed 6-0 at the

break. The Bobcats took the opening drive and made it 14-0 and held on to win their seventh-straight bowl game.

The Rebels, who were making a third-straight bowl trip for the first time in program history, failed in their quest to reach 11 wins in back-to-back seasons but have 30 total wins in the last three campaigns.

Ramon Vilella finally got his team on the scoreboard with a UNLV bowl-record 50-yard field goal during the first drive of the third quarter. The previous long by a Rebel was 48 yards by Caden Chittenden in last year's LA Bowl win over Cal. With under five minutes remaining, quarterback Anthony Colandrea found the end zone (his 10th rushing score of the season) from two yards out on fourth-and-goal to draw the Rebels to within seven points but never got the ball back to attempt the equalizer.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Senior linebacker Marsel McDuffie, who played high school football in nearby Grand Prairie, led all tacklers with nine and recovered a fumble in the first half. He finished his final season as a Rebel with 112 total tackles.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV lost to a Mid-American Conference opponent in a bowl game for the first time in three all-time matchups. The Rebels previously defeated Toledo (1984 California Bowl) and Central Michigan (1994 Las Vegas Bowl).

QUOTABLE: "I didn't do a good enough job of preparing us for this game. Our goal was to come out and start fast, so that's on me and the preparation that I need to have everybody clicking and rolling (but) I don't take anything away from Ohio. They're a really good football team. They came out and executed the game they wanted to, and we didn't execute the game we wanted to.

"We're going to continue to grow, continue to build and continue to raise that standard of being a program that's going to compete for championships year in and year out."
