The New Orleans athletic department and the Privateers women's basketball program would like to thank their six seniors playing in their final game at the Lakefront Arena this evening. Congrats to Rehema Franklin, Kyla Malone, Vaquela Pimpton, Kayla Thomas, Whitley Larry and Asia Woods!

• CAN'T GUARD FRANKLIN

Guard Rehema Franklin has been the force behind the Privateer scoring attack as she leads the team with an average of 13.7 points per game (eighth in the conference). She has 18 double-digit scoring games in total and has gone over the 20-point plateau in eight contests so far this year, including a career-high of 33 back on Dec. 28, 2019, which is the third-best total posted this season by a Southland athlete.

• PRIVATEERS SET PROGRAM RECORD FOR CONFERENCE VICTORIES

The New Orleans women's basketball team set the school record with their 12th conference victory last game. With the win over Northwestern State on Wednesday, the Privateers recorded their 12th Southland win on the year, the most the team has ever recorded in school history.

• CLINCHED THE FIFTH SPOT IN THE UPCOMING SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

While the opponent is still up in the air, New Orleans clinched the No. 5 spot in the upcoming Southland Tournament. That means that the Privateers will take to the court for their opening round game on Thursday, March 12 at 11 AM CT.

ABOUT NEW ORLEANS

New Orleans has advanced to the Southland Conference Championships for the fourth consecutive year this season. The Privateers are coming off a 12-16 campaign which included a mark of 8-10 in conference play. The group made it to the first round of the Southland tournament before getting knocked out by No. 6 A&M Corpus-Christi.

The roster is veteran filled and will really look to put an emphasis on the defensive end, like it has in year's past. Look for the team to run a bunch of different sets throughout the game to try to confuse opposing offenses. The team returns 10 letterwinning athletes from a season ago to go with three talented newcomers.

ABOUT SOUTHEASTERN LADY LIONS

Southeastern is coming off a year in which the team posted marks of 9-20 overall and 4-14 in conference play. The Lions did not advance to the Southland Conference Championships last year. Southeastern is in a much better place this season as Lions are 12-16 overall with a mark of 9-10 in conference, already over double the conference wins posted last year. Southeastern has won two of its last three contests coming in today's game. The group is heading to the Southland Tournament for the first time since 2012.

THE SERIES

New Orleans leads the all-time series against Northwestern State by a 9-12 margin. The Privateers won their last game against the Lady Demons as they picked up a 77-63 victory at Northwestern back on Jan. 29, 2020. New Orleans has now won the past three matchups against Northwestern State.

LAST GAME OUT: NEW ORLEANS SETS PROGRAM RECORD FOR CONFERENCE WINS IN VICTORY OVER NORTHWESTERN STATE

The New Orleans women's basketball team set a new program record with their 12th conference win of the season as the Privateers collected an 82-76 Southland Conference victory against visiting Northwestern State at the Lakefront Arena on Wednesday evening.

- RECAP -

- Rehema Franklin led the scoring charge once again as she finished with 21 points (on 9-of-15 shooting) to go with four rebounds and two assists. It was the senior guard's 18th double-digit scoring output of the season along with being the eighth time that she has reached the 20-point plateau so far this year.
- Asia Woods returned to her usual strong form with 14 points as she shot 7-of-11 from the field to go along with five boards, two assists and a block.
- Jada Duncantell made her first start in the last five games and provided the Privateers with the spark they were looking for as she posted totals of 12 points, three assists and two rebounds.
- Dionjhae Thomas picked up 11 points to go with a career-high tying six steals. She also had three assists, two boards and a block.
- Vaquela Pimpton and Mia Deck each wrapped up their night with nine points apiece. Pimpton had three steals and two assists while Deck concluded her evening with two assists and two boards.
- New Orleans and Northwestern State played a very close opening quarter with the Privateers ending the first with a slight 16-14 edge.
- It was all Privateers in the second as they were able to score 30 points on 11-of-19 shooting (57.9 percent) to go with a 4-of-7 mark from beyond the arc. A Duncantell buzzer-beating three at the horn sent the Privateers to the half with a 46-35 advantage.
- The third quarter was just as close as the first, as this time the Lady Demons were able to record a one-point advantage (21-20) as the teams went into the fourth with the Privateers still up, 66-56.
- The Privateers played a conservative fourth to close out the 82-76 victory.
- The victory gave the Privateers 12 conference wins on the year, the most the team has ever recorded in a single-season in program history.

ONE OF THE BEST DEFENSES IN THE SOUTHLAND

New Orleans enters today's contest eighth in the Southland in defensive scoring as the team has allowed 64.5 points per game to its foes. Teams have shot .400 against the Privateers (fifth-best in conference) and have held opponents to just a .286 clip from beyond the arc (third). The group has forced 20.7 turnovers per contest (third) to go with 10.36 steals per game (fifth). New Orleans is also third overall in blocked shots with an average of 3.82 per game.

SELECTED EIGHTH IN CONFERENCE IN SOUTHLAND PRESEASON POLL

The New Orleans women's basketball program was selected to finish eighth overall in the 2019-20 Southland Conference Preseason Poll released by the conference office.

Last year the Privateers were picked seventh and went on to conclude their season with the program's third consecutive appearance in the Southland Conference Tournament at the predicted seventh seed after finishing 12-16 overall (8-10 Southland). New Orleans returns 10 of its 13 letterwinners from a season ago which includes three of its five starters. The group also added three newcomers.

STRETCH RUN TO MAKE THE PLAYOFFS LAST SEASON

The Privateers went 7-3 over their last 10 games to secure a spot in the Southland tournament for the third straight year. Included in that stretch were season sweeps of Southeastern and Northwestern State along with wins against McNeese, UIW, and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

FORMER PRIVATEER RANDI BROWN CONTINUES PRO CAREER; SIGNS WITH ICELAND'S HAUKAR

One of the best New Orleans women's basketball athletes in program history, Randi Brown, will continue her professional career overseas after she signed a contract with Haukar of the Dominos League in Iceland during the offseason.

Brown was a four-year letterwinner with the Privateer program during the 2014-18 campaigns. She ended her career as a three-time All-Southland Conference selection which included back-to-back first team appearances on the teams during her junior and senior seasons. She was also named the 2016-17 Southland Player of the Year.

Brown ranks second in program history in total points (2,130) after she averaged 22.0 points per game during her senior season. The point total was good enough for fifth all-time in Southland Conference history.

She is also first in school history in three-pointers made (256), third in made field goals (710), fifth in minutes played (3,387) and seventh in steals (181). Brown ended her career with averages of 18.8 points, 3.5 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.6 steals per game over 113 contests.

Brown is entering her second professional season after she most recently played at HyPo in Finnish Korisliiga last year. In 34 games the former Privateer was the best scorer on her squad where she posted 24.3 points per game to go with 6.4 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 2.0 steals. She was a main factor in her team winning the regular season with a 20-7 record and advancing all the way to the league's semifinals.

With her performance, Brown was awarded Eurobasket.com All-Finnish League Guard of the Year to go with a First-Team selection and All-Imports Team honors.

WELCOME TO OUR BLOCK PARTY

Whitley Larry finished up the regular season with 55 total blocks last season. Her 2.0 rejections per game ranked second in the Southland and ranks as the ninth-best single-season total in program history. The block total is the highest single-season mark since 2006-07 when Andrea Williams recorded 63. She enters tonight's contest with 45 blocks so far on the season, good for 1.7 per game, third overall in the Southland.

ASIA WOODS CLAIMS SOUTHLAND WEEKLY HONOR AFTER MONSTER WEEK

New Orleans women's basketball senior forward Asia Woods was named the Southland Conference Women's Basketball Athlete of the Week after she led the Privateers to a perfect 2-0 record with a monster week.

The Houston, Texas native started the week off hot with 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting to go along with nine rebounds, five assists and a perfect 4-for-4 mark from the charity stripe in an 85-73 win over Central Arkansas on Wednesday.

She followed it up with an even bigger stat line in a 61-57 victory over UIW on Saturday. Woods recorded 20 points, 15 rebounds (with an almost unheard of 13 alone on the offensive end), five assists and two steals. It was her sixth double-double of the season.

In total, she averaged 19 points on 62.5 percent shooting, 12 rebounds and five assists during the two wins. Her 13 offensive rebounds against UIW were the most recorded by a Privateer since the team has joined the Southland Conference.

It is the third time this season that a Privateer has captured the conference weekly honor as Woods joins senior guard Rehema Franklin who won the award back on Nov. 18 and Dec. 30. It is also the first time New Orleans has collected three Southland Athlete of the Week awards in a single-season since 2016-17.

PROGRAM REWIND

The New Orleans women's basketball team came into existence in 1975. The date of their first game was December 12, 1975 at Dillard University in New Orleans. Originally known as the Buck-ettes, the team's first head coach was John Hamilton.

Victory was first tasted on February 17, 1976 in the 16th game of the season. New Orleans defeated crosstown foe, Tulane, 49-37. Wins against Nicholls and Dillard followed in the inaugural season.

After four years with Connie Duncan at the helm, New Orleans would welcome its longest tenured coach in program history when Joey Favoloro came to the Lakefront in 1980.

Favoloro made an immediate impact, winning 20 games in his first season with New Orleans. In his second season, he guided the now Privateers to a Louisiana Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (LAIAW) championship.

It was the 1982-83 season that will forever be most remembered. With a loaded roster that included Sandra Hodge, Michelle Anderson, and Cathy Stiles, New Orleans made a run to the WNIT championship which was sealed with a 68-58 win over Memphis State in the title game.

Favoloro went on to coach until 2004 and had a career record of 382-303 at the Lakefront. He was replaced by Amy Champion who had to weather the effects of Hurricane Katrina, which struck in her second season as head coach.

The program was in limbo after leaving the Sun Belt, but new administration halted the move to Division II which started in Champion's last year.

Privateer alum, Keeshawn Davenport (1997-2001) took the reigns in 2011 with a program that was starting over. When Davenport started, she only had three scholarships available.

Davenport continued to lay the foundation as the Privateers joined the Southland Conference in 2013. Over the last three seasons, Davenport has guided New Orleans to 28 conference victories.

Two seasons ago, the Privateers enjoyed their 500th win in program history when they defeated Incarnate Word 52-50 on January 20, 2018. A buzzer beater by Randi Brown sealed the victory.

COACH KEESHAWN DAVENPORT

Keeshawn Carter Davenport is entering her ninth season at the helm of her alma mater. Davenport was hired for the job in 2011 after eight seasons as a player and assistant coach.

In 2016-17, Davenport guided the Privateers to the Southland Conference tournament for the first time since joining in 2013. New Orleans earned a five-seed in the tournament. Davenport followed that with an 11-7 conference record in 2017-18. In that two-year stretch, the Privateers went 20-8 at home.

The 11 conference wins under Davenport in 2017-18 also broke a program record. The previous high for conference victories in a season was 10, achieved twice (1991-92 and 1996-97).

Under Davenport's guidance, Randi Brown placed herself in the record books. Brown was the first conference Freshman of the Year in program history. Brown was a three-time All-Southland selection and finished her collegiate career second in points. She also broke the school record for most three-pointers made.

Over the summer, Brown signed a professional contract to continue her playing career in Finland with Hyvinkaan-Ponteva.

Shania Woods entered the top ten in rebounding in the third game of her senior season. Woods is seventh in career field goal percentage entering the 2018-19 campaign and has 617 rebounds over her first three seasons.

Davenport took the job with only three scholarship players on the roster. By 2012-13, three players were named CollegeSportsMadness.com Independent Player of the Week: Mechel'le Thomas, Amber Clay, and Keri Thomas.

In 2013, Davenport oversaw another transition when the Privateers officially joined the Southland Conference after being an independent in transition the prior two years.

Coach Davenport has some firsts of her own: she was the first full-time third assistant in Privateer history (2003) and was the first alum to be named head coach of the Privateers (2011).

Community service has been one of the hallmarks under Davenport's tenure. Davenport and her team have been involved with community initiatives with many organizations including Second Harvest Food Bank, Einstein Charter Schools, and Children's Hospital.

A four-year letterwinner, Davenport saw action in 100 contests and made 32 starts for the Privateers during her undergraduate years on the Lakefront. Davenport averaged 6.1 points and 3.6 rebounds per contest over her career while serving in the role of co-captain during her senior season. Davenport also garnered recognition on the Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll.

In 2005 Davenport received her master's degree in education from UNO with a focus on psychosocial aspects of sport and exercise.

Davenport went to high school at East St. John where she graduated as the all-time leading scorer while guiding the school to its first playoff win and first-ever district title during her senior season. A two-time team captain, Davenport earned All-State and Academic All-State Honorable Mention honors in her senior season and was a three-time all-district selection.

Davenport and her husband, Deon reside in Kenner, La. The couple has one son, Deon Jr. and one daughter, Zoe Na'el.

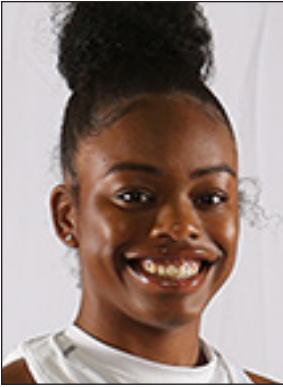
