The 2022-23 season saw the Guelph Gryphons men's soccer team field another strong team as the defending OUA Champions. After opening the season with a 3-0-2 record in their first 5 games the team would take on the 2021 OUA Silver medalist York Lions in a rematch of last season's gold medal game. After going 0-1-1 against the Lions the U of G men would close out the remaining 5 games in the season with a 3-0-2 record to finish the season with just one regulation loss. In the opening round of the OUA playoffs the Gryphons hosted the Brock Badgers where after a 2-2 tie and 30 minutes of extra time the two teams would head to penalty kicks. It was Gryphon standout Jack Sears who sent the Gryphons to the quarterfinals in the 5th round of penalties. In the semifinal round the team headed to Hamilton to take on the McMaster Marauders where, in a hard-fought match the defending champions would fall 2-1. McMaster would go on to claim the 2022 OUA banner. The Gryphons were led by a pair of OUA West First Team All-Stars in Jack Sears and Colin Gander. Gander scored 3 goals throughout the season while also providing service on most corner kicks. Sears was also the lone Gryphon U SPORTS All-Canadian, earning second team honours after a season in which he was a key distributor in the middle of the Gryphon lineup.

It was a gold medal season for the Gryphons men's soccer team as they dominated the OUA West en route to the program's third OUA championship title. Aided by fantastic goalkeeping and impressive offence and defence, the team remained undefeated to finish first overall in the OUA West with an 8-0-2 record. The No.4 nationally-ranked Gryphons entered the OUA playoffs as the first overall seed. Their gold medal playoff run began at the OUA quarterfinals with a defeat of the Ontario Tech Ridgebacks in penalties. The Gryphons earned the honour of hosting the OUA championships for the first time since 1990 after defeating the Carleton Ravens in the OUA semifinals. The gold medal match vs the York Lions ended in a Gryphon victory as the team took home their first OUA title since the 2016-17 season. The Gryphs then competed in the U SPORTS Championship where they defeated the St. Mary's Huskies but lost to the Montreal Carabins in extra time in the semifinals. The Gryphons standout season came to an end with a 2-0 loss in the Bronze medal match against the Cape Breton Capers. Aiding the offence this season was Lucas Doros, whose impressive season culminated in the OUA West Player of the Year award (the team's third straight) as well as both an OUA All-Star and U SPORTS Second Team All-Canadian status. Owen McKee (2nd-year forward) led the team in both goals and goals per game (7th in the league) while fifth-year veteran forward Evan Dick finished 6th in the OUA in assists. Goalkeeper Svyatoslav Artemenko posted an amazing season that was highlighted by 10 clean sheets: the most in the league and four more than the second-place player. The rookie allowed a mere three goals the entire regular season and finished first overall in the OUA in saves with 42. Key player Alex Zis spent most of the season out due to injury, returning just

in time for playoffs to help the team capture gold in his final season with the team. The 2021-22 season saw five Gryphon players obtain All-Star status as Harvey Marchant (OUA West Community Service Award), Ian Vidovich, Lucas Doros, Jack Sears, and Svyatoslav Artemenko were all named to the OUA West. In his 22nd season with the team, head coach Keith Mason earned his OUA West Coach of the Year award for the second time in his career.

The Gryphons came into the 2019 campaign looking to go far in the OUA Playoffs and to improve on their quarter-final result from last year. The team started hot with 3 wins and 2 ties to start the year. After a close 0-1 loss to Western, the Gryphons strung out 4 shutout

victories and 1 tie outscoring their opponents 17-2 in the process. Guelph would end the season strong with a 3-1 victory over Waterloo and would claim a bye into the quarterfinals of the OUA playoffs. They would meet Brock who they shutout 3-0 led by a two-goal effort from Jace Kostopoulos, who was returning from injury. The Gryphons showed fortitude by coming back from their heartbreaking double over-time 0-1 semi-final defeat at the hands of Carleton to dispatch Toronto 1-0 and claim an OUA bronze medal. Midfielder Alex Zis led all players in the OUA and U SPORTS with 16 assists and 24 points during the 2019 regular season. Zis's dominant season led him to receive U SPORTS First Team All-Canadian, OUA West MVP, and OUA First Team All-Star awards. Moses Kafeero was a star rookie for this team earning both U SPORTS All- Rookie Team and OUA Rookie of the Year honours. Ian Vidovich and Manveer Gill both made the OUA All-Star teams.

The Gryphons' hunger to produce a successful 2018 season was evident right from the team's training camp, which showed the mix of veteran and young players were focused on doing something big. And Guelph began the season on a high with a clean sheet in a 2-0 win over Windsor in the opener. The Gryphons suffered their first loss late in August, falling 3-2 to the powerful York Lions but the resilient side responded with a seven-match win streak that saw them outscore opponents 26-3 through that stretch. The biggest story to come from the surging Gryphons was the stunning play of fourth-year striker Jace Kostopoulos, who led an attacking group of Jon Amoo, Youssef Zaghloul, and Atchu Siva, dubbed the "Fab Four" by head coach Keith Mason. Kostopoulos scored early and often, compiling goals that earned the Gryphons critical points en route to U SPORTS Player of the month honours in September. No match better exemplified his importance than a 2-0 win over McMaster on September 9. Kostopoulos buried a crucial strike in the 75th minute to tie the all-time Guelph goal scoring record of 48 held by Robbie Murphy. And six minutes later, he added another to ice the match and take sole possession of the school record. Kostopoulos would finish the season ranked second in the country with 15 goals, while also earning U SPORTS Player of the Year honours. Guelph continued its playoff push and secured its last win of the regular season with a 1-0 road win against Western before ending the schedule with a 4-1 loss to Windsor. The second-place Gryphons met the Mustangs again in the OUA quarter-final, which proved to be an epic battle that went to kicks after a scoreless 120 minutes. Western would prevail 6-5 in penalties, eliminating the Gryphons with a cruel result.

It was always going to be tough for the Gryphons to follow up a dream 2016 season. After winning a satisfying OUA championship and taking a bronze medal as host of the U SPORTS national tournament a year ago, Guelph faced an uphill battle, made even more difficult by some key player departures. But head coach Keith Mason had his new-look Gryphons firing throughout 2017, showing their prowess at both ends of the pitch, with a versatility that caused headaches for opponents. Third-year striker Jace Kotsopoulos was the early catalyst, scoring seven goals (many of them crucial) in Guelph's first four matches to get the side off to a sensational 3-0-1 start. Kotsopoulos would miss a significant stretch with a leg injury but the Gryphons persevered, with massive offensive contributions from players like Atchu Siva, Youssef Zaghoul and Johnson Amoo. A stingy backline, led by veteran Zachary Rushe and rookie Ian Vidovich, both OUA all-stars, played well in front of second-year goalkeeper Simon Norgrove, meaning goals were at a premium for opponents. Guelph was clinical in an opening round 2-0 playoff win over Windsor but the reigning OUA champions were eventually dethroned by a nemesis. McMaster was the only team to defeat Guelph in both meetings during the regular season – and they did it again in the playoffs, advancing with a narrow 1-0 win over a Gryphon team that enjoyed an incredible run.

2016 was a magical year for the Gryphons men's soccer team. After setting school records for wins (12) and points (38) during the regular season, the Gryphons entered the OUA playoffs in search of their first OUA title in 26 years. After a convincing 3-1 win over McMaster in the Quarterfinals, the Gryphons booked a spot in the OUA Final Four, hosted by Ryerson at Birchmount Stadium in Scarborough. There, the Gryphons picked up a 3-0 win over Ryerson followed by a 3-1 win over three-time defending champs York to claim U of G's first OUA title in men's soccer since 1990.

For just the third time in school history, and for the first time since 1992, the Gryphons played host to the U Sports/CIS Championship tournament for men's soccer. The Gryphs entered the tournament as not only OUA Champions but also the No. 1 seed overall. In their national quarterfinal matchup, the Gryphons got past Acadia in a shootout to earn a spot in the medal rounds. After a heartbreaking 3-2 loss to UQAM (l'Université du Québec à Montréal) in the semi-finals, the Gryphons responded with a 3-0 win over the Cape Breton Capers to earn a Bronze medal.

A total of four Gryphons earned OUA All-Star recognition, while fifth year senior and team captain Justin Springer was the lone Gryphon to be recognized at the national level as he was named a CIS Second Team All-Canadian.

The Gryphons men's soccer team put together a solid 2015-2016 campaign, qualifying for the playoffs by finishing 4th in the OUA West division. In the opening round of the OUA playoffs, the Gryphons picked up a convincing 3-0 win over the visiting Western Mustangs thanks in large part to the play of team captain Justin Springer. The fourth year centre back chipped in offensively with a pair of goals to help the Gryphons pick up their first playoff win since the 2012-13 season.

In the OUA quarter-finals, the Gryphons traveled to York to face the two-time defending OUA champion Lions. On three separate occasions, the Gryphons fought back to find the equalizer, with the latter of those coming in stoppage time to tie the game at 3-3. In extra time, the Gryphons would ultimately fall 4-3 to the Lions in what was a thrilling game from start to finish. York would go on to win both the OUA championship and CIS championship.

A trio of Gryphons was named OUA West All-Stars. Veterans Justin Springer and Ethan Danielli landed on the First Team and Second Team, respectively. While breakout rookie Jace Kotsopoulos earned a spot on the OUA West Second Team after he burst onto the scene in 2015 in his first year in the OUA, scoring a team-high 11 goals putting him in a tie for 4th in the CIS amongst the country's leading scorers.

The men's soccer team finished the regular season with an impressive 9-2-5 record, good for a third place finish in the OUA West standings. The Gryphons hosted the Laurier Golden Hawks in an OUA quarterfinal matchup and fell just short, losing 3-2 in extra time.

The top ranked team in the country and eventual CIS Champions, the York Lions, were the only team in 2014-2015 that upset the Gryphons in regulation. The Gryphons were especially impressive at home, as they won seven of their 10 regular season matches played at the Gryphon Soccer Complex. As a team, the Gryphons scored 49 goals during the season, second only to York's 59.

Individually, several Gryphons had standout seasons, none more impressive than third year striker Jared Agyemang. Agyemang put together one of the most impressive goal scoring seasons in Gryphon history. Agyemang led the OUA with 16 goals during the regular season was named a Second Team All-Canadian and an OUA West Division First Team All-Star for his efforts. Agyemang was one of three Gryphons to be named an OUA All-Star as he was joined on the First Team by captain, Justin Springer, while Timothy Flynn was named an OUA West Division Second Team All-Star. Flynn finished second on the team with seven goals, while Michael Bijman and Estevan Carles each scored five. First year midfielder Ryan Vyrostko was named the OUA West Division's Rookie of the Year.

In his 11th season as head coach, this is Mason's first time winning the award. Mason also became the first Guelph men's soccer bench boss to be recognized by his CIS peers as CIS Men's Coach of the Year.
