GAME 11

No. 22 Oregon Ducks (8-2) vs. Montana Grizzlies (3-7)

THE STARTING FIVE

Old Pacific Coast Conference rivals Oregon and Montana meet for just the third time this century when the Grizzlies visit Matthew Knight Arena on Tuesday at 7 p.m. (Pac-12 Networks).

1 Oregon has held nine straight opponents under 70 points, and has held the opposition below 40 percent shooting from the field in seven-of-10 games so far in 2016-17. The Ducks rank 16th nationally in field goal percentage defense (.370). Army, with 77 in the season opener, is the only team to reach 70 points against the Ducks so far this season.

2 SEC wins. For the first time in program history, the Ducks have defeated two teams from the Southeastern Conference - Tennessee and Alabama - in the same season.

3 The Ducks lead the nation at 8.8 blocks per game, and also lead the nation in total blocks with 88. Individually, Chris Boucher is 12th nationally in blocks per game (3.0), with Jordan Bell 25th (2.6 bpg).

4 The top two career blocked shots leaders in Oregon history are on the Ducks' 2016-17 roster. Junior Jordan Bell became UO's all-time leader in just his 50th career game and now shows 173. Nov. 21 against Georgetown, Chris Boucher passed Blair Rasmussen (116/1981-85) for second on the UO career list and now shows 140.

5 Dating back to last season, Oregon has been ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 for 14 consecutive weeks. That is the third-longest streak in school history behind 21 weeks over the 2006-07 and 2007-08 season and 18 weeks in the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons.

+ 1 With the UO women's team moving into this week's A.P. Poll at No. 25, both Duck basketball teams are ranked for the first time since Jan. 30, 1995.

WIN STREAK AT MKA REACHES 31 GAMES

Oregon's winning streak at Matthew Knight Arena is currently at 31 games, which is the longest string of home wins in UO history. Oregon last dropped a home game Jan. 8, 2015 (Arizona, 80-62). Two of Oregon's four longest home winning streaks have come under **Dana Altman**.

DUCKS' HOME WINNING STREAK THIRD NATIONALLY

Two long home winning streaks ended this month. UCLA halted Kentucky's 42-game streak Dec. 3, and Stephen F. Austin's 31-game streak came to an end Dec. 7. Oregon's 31-game home winning streak is now the third-longest in the nation (through Monday).

NON-CONFERENCE RECORD AT MKA

The Ducks are now 49-2 all-time in non-conference games at Matthew Knight Arena. Oregon's 79-73 loss to Mississippi in 2014-15 was just the second non-conference home defeat while playing at Matthew Knight Arena. The other time Oregon lost a non-conference game at MKA was on Dec. 18, 2011, when Virginia defeated the Ducks 67-54. UO won 28 non-conference games in a row at MKA between the two losses.

STAT NOTES

Oregon has held seven-of-10 opponents below 40 percent shooting from the field. The exceptions to that are Baylor (.455), UConn (.483) and Alabama (.414). The Ducks have also held nine straight opponents below 70 points.

DUCKS HAVE RECORD NIGHT VS. SAVANNAH STATE

Oregon set a number of team and Matthew Knight Arena records in its 128-59 win against Savannah State on Dec. 3, including points, field goals and assists. Here's a look at the records set: **University of Oregon TEAM and MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA records**

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Ducks are 99-13 (.884) all-time at Matthew Knight Arena since the building opened in 2011.

BIG BOARDS

Oregon grabbed its highest rebound total in decades when the Ducks corralled a Matthew Knight Arena record 67 versus Savannah State. That was the most by the Ducks in at least two decades (records are incomplete), and came within shouting distance of the school record of 77 (vs. Brigham Young, 1-28-1955). **Kavell Bigby-Williams** led Oregon's effort with 11 rebounds against the Tigers, with another seven Ducks grabbing at season six rebounds. It was Bigby-Williams' second straight game with double-digit rebounds. He had 10 Nov. 30 against Western Oregon.

DUCKS TIE BLOCKS RECORD

Oregon tied the school and Matthew Knight Arena record with 13 blocked shots in the Nov. 11 season opener versus Army. **Jordan Bell** led the way with six.

VETERANS OFF THE FLOOR

Oregon has a trio of support staff members who are nearing, or have already reached milestones in 2016-17. Athletic trainer **Clay Jamieson** reached his 600th game on the Oregon bench when the Ducks faced Nov. 21 Georgetown in Maui. He's only missed three games since joining the Oregon staff in 1998-99. Oregon IMG radio announcer **Jerry Allen** is in his 30th season calling basketball games for the Ducks. The longest streak belongs to public address announcer **Don Essig**, who recently began his 50th season on the P.A.

BROOKS CLIMBING SCORING LIST

Dillon Brooks returned to the Oregon lineup in Maui after missing the first three games of the season, and has entered the UO top 30 in career scoring. He passed Nick Jones (1,087/1964-67) and Charlie Franklin (1,090/1955-58) for 28th during the Nov. 30 Western Oregon game. Brooks now shows 1,140 career points. No. 27 Terik Brown (1,152/1995-99) is next.

FORMER STUDENT-ATHLETE PHIL KNIGHT PLEDGES \$500 MILLION FOR SCIENCE

UO graduate and former track and field student-athlete Phil Knight, the co-founder of Nike, and his wife Penny in October made a half-a-billion dollar commitment to scientific research at the University of Oregon. It is the largest gift ever bestowed to a public university. "This act of philanthropy from Penny and Phil Knight is breathtaking," said University of Oregon President Michael Schill. "This is a seminal moment for the University of Oregon, an inflection point that will shape the trajectory of the university and this state for the next century and beyond." The Knight's \$500 million donation will fund the construction of a new science complex on the Eugene campus. Research at the new site will focus on life sciences such as biology, microbiology, biochemistry and other disciplines. "While not without risk, we believe the expected societal returns from such investments are high," said Knight. "And here at home in Oregon, we believe the potential to arm our talented young people with the skills and tools they will need to have a lasting impact on the world and to pursue rewarding careers makes such investments essential."

DUCKS INK NATION'S NO. 8 RECRUITING CLASS

Head coach **Dana Altman** has landed his second-straight top-12 recruiting class with the signing of three high school players to National Letters of Intent. The Ducks announced on Nov. 11 that Victory Bailey Jr., Troy Brown, Jr., and Abu Kigab have signed with the University. The trio is ranked as the No. 8 class in the nation by ESPN. Oregon's signees are ranked ninth by 247Sports.com, which listed last year's Duck class at No. 12.

VICTOR BAILEY JR., G, 6-3, 175, Austin, Texas (McNeil High School)

A four-star recruit with a scout grade of 82 according to ESPN.com... 90th-ranked player overall on ESPN's top 100, and the 24th-ranked overall shooting guard for 2017... Sixth-best player in Texas according to bustingbrackets.com... Has scored a total of 1,616 points over the course of his high school career... During his junior year he shot 50.7 percent from the field and averaged 20.3 points per game... Helped lead McNeil High School to two district titles as well as qualifying for the playoffs all three years... During his freshman season was voted District 16-5A newcomer of the year... Was voted district MVP as both a sophomore and a junior... Is the son of Olympic 400-meter hurdles bronze medalist Tonja Buford-Bailey and former NFL wide receiver Victor Bailey.

TROY BROWN JR., G, 6-7, 215, Las Vegas, Nev. (Centennial HS)

Five star recruit with a scout grade of 93 according to ESPN... Ranked 18th in ESPN's top 100, and is the fifth-ranked small forward for 2017... 247Sports tabs Brown at No. 13 overall and No. 3 nationally among small forwards... Is the top-ranked player from the state of Nevada... Named first team all-Nevada by USA Today after his junior season in 2016... All-American honorable mention both his sophomore and junior years... All-State first team as a sophomore and junior... As a sophomore was named the Northwest League Co-MVP... Maxpreps Freshman All-American second team... Selected for the 2016 USA Basketball Men's U17 World Championship Team... Averaged 19 points, 9.5 rebounds, and 6.3 assists as a junior to lead his team to the regional finals... Helped his team win the Northwest League championship his freshman and sophomore years... Is the son of Troy Sr., and Lynn Brown.

ABU KIGAB (pronounced KEY-gab), F, 6-6, 200, Napa, Calif. (Prolific Prep Academy)

A four-star recruit with a scout grade of 81 according to ESPN.com... Rated as the second best small forward in California according to Scout.com... Formerly from St. Catharines, Ontario, where he played for St. Francis Phoenix before transferring to Prolific Prep in Napa... Averaged 13.2 points, 6.8 rebounds, and 4.5 assists as a junior... Played for Canada in the FIBA Americas U18 Championship where he averaged 8.4 points per game, helping lead his team to the championship game where he went on to have 17 points and 10 rebounds... Is the son of Sultan and Mashair Kigab.

DUCKS REACH HIGH MARK IN HUMAN POLLS

The Ducks' ranking of No. 4 by the Associated Press in the Nov. 14 poll was Oregon's highest-ever ranking by A.P. The previous high was No. 5, which happened in the 2016-17 preseason poll, as well as for two weeks in December of 2002. The No. 5 ranking was the Ducks highest ever in a preseason poll. Oregon's No. 5 preseason ranking in the USA Today Coaches' Poll is one spot shy of the all-time high of No. 4, which came in the March 14, 2016, poll.

PLAYING THE PERCENTAGES

For 2016-17, Oregon returns 69 percent of its scoring, 66 percent of its rebounding, 71 percent of its assists, 58 percent of its steals and 85 percent of its blocked shots from last season.

PERSONNEL LOSSES FROM 2015-16 FEW, BUT KEY

The Ducks graduated just two scholarship seniors from that 2015-16 team, but they were key players. All-Pac-12 forward Elgin Cook started all 38 games and averaged 14.8 points and 5.1 rebounds per contest, while forward Dwayne Benjamin was invaluable as Oregon's sixth man, averaging 7.8 points per game.

DUCKS IN THE NBA

Oregon currently has two players in the NBA, **Aaron Brooks** (ninth season) and **Joseph Young** (second season) who both play for the Indiana Pacers.

DUCKS IN THE D-LEAGUE

Oregon currently has four players in the NBA Development League. **Jason Calliste** (2014) is with the Maine Red Claws, **Elgin Cook** (2014-16) is with the Santa Cruz Warriors, **Michael Dunigan** (2009) is with the Canton Charge and **E.J. Singler** (2010-13) is with Raptors 905.

HEY MAN, NICE SHOT

Oregon has made at least one three-point field goal in 645 consecutive games. The Ducks' last game without a three-pointer was Feb. 6, 1997, versus Washington. Ironically, the Ducks held an opponent without a three-pointer for the first time in 10 seasons when Cal went 0-for-12 from three-point range on Jan. 6, 2016.

19 CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

Dana Altman is one of just six active head coaches in NCAA Division I that has posted a winning record for 19 consecutive seasons. For Altman, that streak runs from the 1997-98 season through last season, and covers his final 13 seasons at Creighton and his first six in Eugene.

ALTMAN JOINS RARE PAC-12 CLUB

Dana Altman became just the third coach in league history to win Coach of the Year honors in back-to-back seasons joining Stanford's Mike Montgomery (2003, 2004) and Arizona's Lute Olson (1988, 1989 and 1993, 1994). Altman trails only Olson (seven) and Montgomery (four) for career conference coach of the year awards.

OREGON EARNS SIXTH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

The Ducks secured their sixth straight winning season in 2015-16. It was just the fourth time in school history that Oregon strung together six or more consecutive winning seasons. The Ducks last did that from 1973-78, when **Dick Harter's** Kamikaze Kids forged six straight winning seasons. The other two such streaks are seven seasons from 1934-40 for coaches **William Reinhart** and **Howard Hobson**, and 10 consecutive seasons from 1923-32 under **George Bohler** and Reinhart.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME

Last season, Oregon finished undefeated at home (18-0) for just the fifth time in school history, and for only the second time in the last 78 years. The most recent one came in 2001-02 (16-0). The others are 1937-38 (16-0), 1925-26 (6-0) and 1911-12 (7-0)

PLAYING AT AN ELITE LEVEL

The Ducks advanced to the Elite Eight for the sixth time in school history last season (1939, 1945, 1960, 2002, 2007, 2016). Interestingly, six of Oregon's last eight NCAA Tournament losses have come to Final Four teams.

REACHING RECORD WINS

The Ducks' record of 31-7 was the program's best mark in 77 years. The 1938-39 Tall Firs, which won the first NCAA title, finished the season 29-5. Oregon's 31 wins broke the previous record of 30 set in 1945.

HISTORY MAKING CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time in school history, Oregon won both the Pac-12 regular season and tournament titles. It was Oregon's fifth all-time regular season title (1919, 1939, 1945, 2002, 2016) and fourth tournament crown (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016).

DUCKS ALSO SCORE HIGH ON COMPUTER TESTS

Oregon's computer numbers were among the best in the nation. The Ducks finished the regular season as the No. 2 RPI team in the NCAA, CBSports and ESPN indexes. The Ducks also played the second-toughest schedule in the nation according to ESPN. In addition to the RPI and SOS, the Ducks led the nation with 22 ESPN RPI top-100 wins.

DUCKS SET BLOCKS RECORD, SURPASS OLD PAC-12 MARK

Thanks to **Chris Boucher's** efforts, for the second straight season and for the fourth time in six years under **Dana Altman**, Oregon broke the school's single season blocks record with 221 in 2015-16. The year before, Oregon blocked an all-time high 157 shots. That broke the 2012-13 mark of 146, which broke the record of 121 from 2011-12. Boucher was seventh nationally at 2.9 blocks per game, while former single-season record-holder **Jordan Bell** had 53 blocks on the season. Further, the Ducks' 221 blocks on the season surpassed the previous Pac-12 mark of 211 set by Arizona State in 2013. However, it was not a Pac-12 record as Washington had 224 blocks on the year.

THE SWATTERBOY

Chris Boucher was seventh nationally in blocked shots in 2015-16, averaging 2.9 per game. He blocked at least four shots 12 times during the season, including six Feb. 4 against Colorado and seven at Arizona State Jan. 31. Boucher - and yes, it's pronounced the same as Adam Sandler's iconic character Bobby Boucher - was playing just his fourth season of organized basketball and speaks four different languages. He became the UO single-season blocked shots leader March 2 at UCLA and finished with 110 on the year, which ranked fifth on the Pac-12 single season list. He is also third on the UO career list with that same 110 total. Boucher broke the UO single-game record with nine blocks Nov. 25 versus Arkansas State, snapping one of Oregon's longest standing records. That was one better than the eight blocked by **Blair Rasmussen** Dec. 27, 1984, versus Davidson, and matched last season by **Jordan Bell** against Arizona State. Boucher helped Oregon break the school single-game record for blocked shots with 13, which was one better than the 12 against Portland State last year. Both marks were also Matthew Knight Arena records.

BOUCHER'S BLOCKS AND THREES

Chris Boucher is the first player in Pac-12 history - and just the third in the NCAA since 1996-97 - to have 100 blocked shots and made 35 three-point field goals in a single season. Boucher had 110 blocks and 39 threes in 2015-16. The other two players with those numbers are K.J. McDaniels of Clemson (100/42, 2013-14) and Eddie Griffin of Seton Hall (133/41, 2000-01).

TAKE IT EASY

Casey Benson has always had a solid assist-to-turnover ratio in his career, but that was taken to extremes in 2015-16. He had just 24 turnovers in 1,091 minutes played, compared to 117 assists, to lead the nation with a 4.9-to-1 assist to turnover ratio. At one point during the season, Benson's ATO was 15.5-to-1. Benson had a career-best nine assists (no turnovers) Dec. 15 versus UC Irvine. He helped Oregon defeat Utah Jan. 14 by scoring a career-high 15 points. March 5, he scored 12 points against Washington as the Ducks finished a perfect 18-0 season at home. He was one assist shy of a career high, as well as the UO NCAA Tournament record, with eight assists and 11 points in the Sweet 16 against Duke. Benson also has the best career A-TO average in Pac-12 history (4.00-to-1).

YOUNG AMERICANS

Not to be outshined by his Canadian teammates, **Tyler Dorsey** was one of the top producers among Pac-12 freshmen at 13.4 points per game. He was also 10th in the conference in three-point field goal percentage (.406). Dorsey reached double figures in 27 games in 2015-16 and had six 20-point games, including a career-high tying 25 Feb. 20 against Oregon State. March 2 at UCLA, Dorsey netted 20 points with a career-best nine rebounds and four three-pointers, and followed that with 19 points March 5 at USC. He dropped in 23 in the Pac-12 Tournament championship game versus Utah and came up big with 14 points in the second round of the NCAA Tournament against Saint Joseph's.

FINISHING STRONG

Under Coach **Dana Altman**, Oregon has a 38-16 record (.704) during the second half of Pac-12 play. That breaks down to 4-5 in 2011, 7-2 in 2012, 5-4 in 2013, 7-2 in 2014, 8-1 in 2015, and 7-2 in 2016. Only Arizona (41) has won more over the last six seasons.
