Notable: The Ducks started the season 35-0 and were the last undefeated team in the NCAA. Despite having just four losses, Oregon is looking to bounce back from series losses to UCLA and Washington. Oregon's pitching staff has been fantastic all season long. The Ducks rank fourth in the NCAA with a combined 1.21 ERA while fabulous freshman, Maggie Balint, is sixth in the NCAA individually with a 0.86 ERA. Balint also ranks No. 24 in the country, averaging 8.8 strikeouts per seven innings. On offense, senior SS Nikki Udria is leading the Ducks and ranks second in the Pac-12 with a .434 batting average.

Notable: Arizona lost for the first time in Pac-12 play over the weekend, dropping two games in a three-game series at Utah. The Wildcats rebounded with a doubleheader sweep of New Mexico State on Tuesday in Tucson. Arizona has scored an incredible 368 runs this season, an average of eight runs per game, which ranks second in the NCAA. Arizona leads the country with both a .614 slugging percentage and 1.72 home runs per game. UA's team ERA of 1.01 leads the Pac-12 and is second in the NCAA. Individually, Danielle O'Toole's 0.84 ERA is fifth in the country. Katiyana Mauga has hit 19 homers this season, the most in the Pac-12.

- All three of Oregon's games at Arizona will be broadcast live on TV. Friday's series opener will be on Pac-12 National, Pac-12 Oregon and Pac-12 Arizona. ESPN2 will air both the Saturday and Sunday games.
- KWVA 88.1 FM will broadcast all three games as well.
- Live stats for all three games are available at arizonawildcats.com.

WHEN PLAYING ARIZONA

- Arizona leads the all-time series, 82-28.
- Oregon has won 14 of the last 18 meetings with UA.
- UO has won six straight series against Arizona, going back to 2011 in Tucson. The Ducks swept the Wildcats in 2013 for the first time ever and swept them again last year in Eugene.
- Oregon has run-ruled a top-20 Arizona team once in each of the last three seasons - 8-0 in five innings last year, 15-7 in five innings in 2015 and 14-3 in five innings in 2014.
- Last season, Oregon shutout the Wildcats in each game of the series, the only time a team has ever held Arizona scoreless over a three-game series.
- Mike White is 15-6 all-time against Arizona.
- Oregon's longest winning streak in the series is just four games, both currently and in 2013-14. Meanwhile, Arizona's longest winning streak in the series is a whopping 34 games, running from 1990-99.

LAST YEAR AGAINST ARIZONA

- Last year the Ducks blanked Arizona in all three games of a three-game series in Eugene.
- The Ducks won the first game, 2-0, behind a Sammie Puentes homer and a seven innings of one-hit ball from LHP Cheridan Hawkins.
- Oregon claimed the second game, 7-0, as the Ducks belted out three homers, including two from Nikki Udria. Megan Kleist tossed a shutout with five hits allowed and two strikeouts.
- The Ducks run-ruled Arizona, 8-0, in five innings

in the third game of the series to take the sweep. The Lindvall sisters - Janelle and Lauren - went back-to-back with homers in the fourth inning while LHP Cheridan Hawkins tossed her second one-hitter of the weekend.

BIG TIME PITCHERS

This weekend's series between Arizona and Oregon will feature the top-2 pitching staffs in the Pac-12 and five of the top-40 individual ERAs in the NCAA. Oregon freshman Maggie Balint ranks seventh in the NCAA with a 0.86 ERA while Arizona ace Danielle O'Toole is fifth with a 0.84. Arizona starter Taylor McQuillin is 17th in the NCAA with a 1.15 ERA. Oregon sophomore Megan Kleist is 31st with a 1.35 ERA while UO freshman Miranda Elish is 38th with a 1.49 ERA. Collectively, Arizona's 1.01 ERA is second in the country while Oregon's 1.21 is fourth.

RPI

The Ducks rank No. 7 in this week's NCAA RPI. The Pac-12 features four of the top-7 teams in the country, with Arizona at No. 3, Washington at No. 4 and UCLA at No. 6.

season compared to just 20 walks, a 6.2-to-1 ratio.

- Sophomore RHP Megan Kleist has 92 strikeouts and just 22 walks, a 4.2-to-1 ratio.

- Freshman RHP Miranda Elish has 70 strikeouts but also only 17 walks for a 4.1-to-1 ratio.

SWIPE SISTERS

Senior Danica Mercado (18) and sophomore Alexis Mack (13) are first and third in the Pac-12 in stolen bases, respectively. As a team, the Ducks have a Pac-12-high 63 stolen bases this year, 22 more than Cal in second place.

UDRIA ON BASE

Senior Nikki Udria has gotten on base every game but one this season for the Ducks. She failed to reach base against Cal Poly back on Feb. 12. Since then, she has gotten on base in 35 straight games.

IN THE CIRCLE

Oregon's young pitching staff has shined all year long.

- With a 1.21 team ERA, the Ducks rank fourth in the NCAA and second in the Pac-12.

- Oregon owns three of the top-7 ERAs in the Pac-12 this season, highlighted by Maggie Balint's 0.86 ERA, second-best in the Pac-12. Megan Kleist is sixth with a 1.35 and Miranda Elish is seventh with a 1.49.

- The Ducks are second in the league with 285 strikeouts and second with 46 earned runs allowed.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE

Oregon has been one of the best hitting teams in the nation over the last few seasons and this year is no exception.

- UO ranks 10th in the NCAA and second in the Pac-12 with a .331 batting average.

- The Ducks are seventh in the country and rank second in the league with a .432 on-base percentage.

- Oregon is eighth in scoring in the NCAA, averaging 6.6 runs per game.

- Oregon owns three of the top-7 individual batting averages in the Pac-12, led by Nikki Udria's .434 average. Alexis Mack is third with a .423 while Danica Mercado is seventh with a .403.

- Oregon also two of the top-5 individual on-base percentages in the conference, with Nikki Udria ranking third at .527 and Alexis Mack at fifth with a .504.

BEST START TO A SEASON IN NCAA HISTORY

Oregon started the season with a 35-0 record and was the last undefeated team in the nation. The 35 wins to start a season tied the NCAA record, also reached by UCLA in 1999.

LONGEST WINNING STREAK

With an 8-2 victory against Stephen F. Austin at the Mizzou Tournament, the Ducks set a new program record for consecutive wins with 19. The Ducks went on to shatter the record with wins in 35 straight games. Oregon won 18 straight games last season, which matched the previous record. The Ducks also won 18 straight games in 2007.

OREGON IN THE POLLS

Junior 3B Jenna Lilley was selected to join the USA Softball senior team for competition this upcoming summer. Lilley was selected after a tryout camp in January. Lilley also made the team last year, but after injuries as a sophomore, she did not play with the team in the summer of 2016. Former Oregon RHP Jessica Moore and OF Janie Takeda also made senior team again for 2017. Incoming C Mary Iakopo was named to the USA Softball junior team.

PAC-12 OPENING SERIES HISTORY

The Ducks have had remarkable success in their first weekend of Pac-12 play under head coach Mike White. Oregon is 19-5 in games on Pac-12 opening weekend in White's seven seasons at the helm, including sweeps of Stanford, Utah, OSU, Washington and Cal consecutively.

POSTSEASON HISTORY

- Oregon is 59-42 all-time in postseason play and 32-15 under head coach Mike White after reaching Super Regionals in 2016.

The Ducks also signed the No. 6 recruit in IF Shannon Rhodes (Ft. Worth, Texas) and the No. 18 recruit in 1B/OF Mia Camuso (Redding, Calif.). Oregon also signed OF Haley Cruse (San Diego, Calif.).

EUGENE REGIONAL RECAP

After winning a fourth-straight Pac-12 title in 2016, the Ducks were named the No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament and hosted regionals at Jane Sanders Stadium. Oregon won all three games it played while allowing just one total run.

- The Ducks opened regionals with an 8-0 run-rule win against Fordham. RHP Megan Kleist tossed a shutout while OF Alyssa Gillespie went 2-for-2 with a pair of RBIs.

- In the second game of regionals, Oregon defeated No. 17 Baylor, 6-0, behind a one-hitter from LHP Cheridan Hawkins.

- In the third and final game of regionals, Oregon defeated No. 17 Baylor, 8-1. The Bears had just four hits while the Ducks tallied 11 hits. SS Nikki Udria went 2-for-3 with two runs and three RBIs.

EUGENE SUPER REGIONAL RECAP

Oregon opened Super Regionals with a big win over UCLA but the Ducks' offense fizzled in the final two games, missing out on a trip to the WCWS.

- In the opening game of the series, Janelle Lindvall belted two homers to lead the Ducks to an 8-1 win.

- In the second game, UO was up 1-0 in the seventh with

one out when UCLA hit a game-tying home run to force extra innings. The Ducks lost, 2-1, in nine innings.

- In the final game of the series, the Ducks lost again, 2-1.

DUCKS CLINCH FOURTH PAC-12 TITLE

With a 5-1 win over Utah to open the series, the Ducks clinched a fourth straight Pac-12 championship last season. Oregon, which had never won a league title prior to its current streak, has gone 80-15-1 in Pac-12 play over the last four seasons, losing just two league series (UCLA last year, Arizona State in 2013). Oregon's four-year streak of championships is tied for the longest in Pac-12 history, matched only by UCLA (1988-91).

SENIORS WIN FOUR PAC-12 TITLES

Oregon's group of four-year seniors - LHP Cheridan Hawkins, C Janelle Lindvall, OF Koral Costa, OF Alyssa Gillespie and IF Stevie Jo Knapp - won a Pac-12 title each year of their careers - 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016.

RECORD-BREAKING OFFENSE

Last season, Oregon set single-season program records for home runs (95), doubles (103), total bases (946), slugging (.619) and runs per game (7.60).

2016 ALL-AMERICANS

The Ducks had three All-Americans in 2016. OF Koral Costa was a first team All-American while SS Nikki Udria was second team and LHP Cheridan Hawkins was third team. Hawkins joined former UO great OF Janie Takeda as the only three-time All-Americans in program history. Udria will be back in 2017 for her senior season.

2016 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

In addition to earning All-American status last season, both LHP Cheridan Hawkins and OF Koral Costa were named Academic All-Americans. Costa was a first team selection while Hawkins was a second team choice. Hawkins was already the first player in program history to be twice named a Academic All-American before earning her third honor in 2016. Players at Oregon who earn academic All-American honors get their names etched into the floor at the Jaqua Center, the Ducks' academic center for student-athletes.

2016 PAC-12 POSTSEASON AWARDS

Oregon nearly swept the Pac-12's individual postseason awards. LHP Cheridan Hawkins was named Pac-12 pitcher of the year for the third straight time, becoming the first in league history to win the award three times in a career. Her protégé, RHP Megan Kleist, was named co-Pac-12 freshman of the year. Catcher Janelle Lindvall earned the league's defensive player of the year honors while head coach Mike White was named the conference's coach of the year for the third time in seven seasons with the Ducks. In addition to their individual awards, Hawkins and Kleist were named first team all-Pac-12 along with OF Koral Costa and SS Nikki Udria. Lindvall earned second team recognition along with OF Alyssa Gillespie and OF/RHP Geri Ann Glasco. 3B Jenna Lilley and 2B/UTIL Lauren Lindvall were named third team all-conference.

After leading the Oregon softball program to the top of the Pac-12, head coach Mike White has now established Oregon as one of the top teams in the country. Not surprisingly, his .779 winning percentage (328-93-1) is the best all-time among Oregon head coaches (No. 2 is .571). In the postseason, the Ducks are 32-15 in seven seasons under White, compared to a 25-21 ledger prior to White's arrival.

The Ducks won a fourth straight Pac-12 title in 2016 and White was rewarded with his third Pac-12 coach of the year honor. White guided the Ducks to an 80-15-1 record in Pac-12 play during the four-year winning streak, losing just two league series. Under the former pitcher's guidance, lefty Cheridan Hawkins was named Pac-12 pitcher of the year in 2016, her third straight year taking home the honor. No other pitcher in the long and storied history of the Pac-12 had won the award more than twice. In 2016 the Ducks swept rival Washington for a second straight season and shut out Arizona over a three-game series for the first time in the Wildcats' history. Oregon hit a NCAA-best .353 in 2016 and also led the Pac-12 with a 2.14 team ERA.

White guided Oregon to its third straight Pac-12 title in 2015 and a program-record 21 conference victories. The Ducks remained a perfect 18-0 in regional games and advanced to their sixth straight Super Regional under White. Oregon made its third Women's College World Series appearance in the last four years. The Ducks visited their third WCWS under White in 2015. The Ducks won their third straight Pac-12 title after going 21-3 in league play and 51-8 overall. Oregon closed out old Howe Field with a super regional sweep of NC State before moving on to Oklahoma City for the third time in four seasons.

Oregon had a magical run in 2014, as White guided the Ducks to their most successful season in program history with a 56-9-1 record and 20-3-1 Pac-12 mark. Oregon won a program-record 56 games in 2014 while advancing to the WCWS for the third time in program history. The Ducks were the No. 1 team in the nation for the first time in program history as well and held on to the No. 1 ranking in both the NFCA poll and USA Softball poll for the final seven weeks of the regular season. Oregon ended the year ranked No. 3 in both polls after advancing to the semifinals of the WCWS. White was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the second straight season after leading the Ducks to their second consecutive Pac-12 title. Oregon did not lose a Pac-12 series in 2014, with a 1-1-1 draw against then No. 3 Arizona State the closest the Ducks came to defeat. Oregon swept Stanford, Oregon State and California but the biggest in 2014 was the program's first ever sweep of Washington, which ranked No. 5 at the time. The Ducks didn't sweep No. 1 ranked UCLA, but taking 2-of-3 from the Bruins pushed the to No. 1 in the nation for the first time ever. Oregon's 20-3-1 record in Pac-12 play was the best in program history as the Ducks outscored league opponents 207-78 in 24 games. Oregon's offense clicked all season long, but most notably against Oregon State and California. The Ducks scored 11 runs in the first inning against the Beavers in an 18-0 win, just one run off the biggest scoring margin in UO single-game history. Later in the week, White and the Ducks posted 15 runs in the fourth inning against Cal, the most in an inning in UO history, the third most in Pac-12 history and the 10th most in NCAA history. Individually, White saw senior third baseman Courtney Ceo lead the nation in batting average at .493 in 2014 as she also became the all-time UO career leader in hits (288) and runs scored (193).

In 2013, the Pac-12 Coach of the Year led Oregon to its first-ever Pac-12 title, its second-highest overall win total (50), and its best rankings in both coaches polls (No. 3) in the regular season's final edition. UO advanced to its fourth straight Super Regional appearance (and fourth ever), and were 16-0 at home at Howe Field during the regular season. Overall on the season, Oregon sported a 17-10 mark vs. top-25 foes and a 28-10 ledger vs. NCAA Tournament qualifiers. Team-wise, Oregon led Pac-12 rankings in stolen bases (82), lowest

ERA (1.64), lowest opponent batting average (.192), batters struck out (456), fewest hits allowed (283) and fewest walks allowed (96). Three Ducks led Pac-12 individual categories - Janie Takeda (batting, .442; stolen bases, 31; hits, 92), Alexa Peterson (.527) and Cheridan Hawkins (saves, 6; games finished, 19; lowest opposing batting average, .128; games in relief, 20). In national rankings, UO stood top 15 in six categories - win-loss percentage (fourth, .845), ERA (fifth, 1.58), slugging (sixth, .538), batting (ninth, .332), home runs (12th, 1.36 per game) and scoring (13th, 6.31 runs per game). Fueled by one of the nation's most powerful teams, the squad combined for 80 homers - nine better than the previous school record - and also set school season bests for batting (.329), runs (366) and slugging (.526).

In 2012, UO firmly convinced the nation of its prowess as a elite program with its second-ever Women's College World Series trip. Oregon racked up its then-second-most wins ever (45), and ended the season ranked a best-ever fifth nationally in both the NFCA and USA Softball polls. The Ducks ranked top 25 all season long after being tabbed No. 14 in both preseason editions (and part of a streak of 42 straight weeks since 2010). In the postseason, UO opened regional play with a 3-0 mark for the third straight year (and successfully hosted its first ever postseason tilts in Eugene). A week later, the Ducks logged their first-ever NCAA Super Regional victories en route to a 2-1 mark and upset at #6 seed Texas. In its first trip in 24 years to the ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City, #11 seed Oregon beat #5 seed Tennessee in the WCWS, while its other hard-fought losses came to #1 and #3 seeds California and Arizona State. Afterwards, two Ducks - Samantha Pappas and Alexa Peterson - were honored to the All-WCWS Team for their impressive stats.

In 2011, the Ducks polished off another amazing season with its second straight year-ending No. 14 national ranking. Earlier in the campaign, UO made its second straight (and ever) Super Regional trip after it scored its then-best Pac-12 Conference finish and record (third-tie, 11-10). UO won nine of its last 12 league tilts and claimed its last four Pac-12 series. The Ducks took three-game sets from No. 12 UCLA and No. 10 Stanford for the first time since 2005 and 2007, claimed its first Civil War sweep of Oregon State since 1994, and took a series from eight-time national champion Arizona for only the third time in the rivalry dating back to 1984.

In 2010, an ESPN national audience watched the upstart Ducks claim their first-ever Super Regional bid to cap an amazing campaign. The Ducks shocked the NCAA Tournament's eighth seed, Georgia Tech, with 11-2 and 4-3 eight-inning regional wins on the Yellow Jackets' own turf to advance to Columbia, Mo., to play seventh-seeded Missouri in Supers.

Before his current Duck tenure, Oregon fans also fondly remember his two-season stint as an assistant coach in 2003 and 2004 when his pitchers and catchers helped Oregon advance to an NCAA regional final in both campaigns. Before his collegiate coaching career, White was already well-known in softball circles as an International Softball Congress (ISC) Hall of Fame pitcher and 30-year coaching veteran. As a player, White was a top pitcher on U.S. National teams before he retired in 2007. A New Zealand native, he became a U.S. citizen in 1994 and helped guide the USA to a bronze medal in the 2000 World Championships when he went 2-0 with a 0.89 ERA and 19 strikeouts. In 1999, the U.S. won the silver medal at the Pan Am Games, and he was 3-2 with a 0.68 ERA and 35 strikeouts. Altogether, he has helped teams claim two gold medals, three silver medals and one bronze in his four trips with New Zealand and two with the United States. The Wellington, New Zealand native (11/19/61) earned his bachelor of arts degree in marketing and management from Mount Mercy College (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) in 1989. He is married to the former Lisa Revers, and the couple have three daughters; Nyree (1992), Kenzie (1995) and Sidney (1997).
