TALKING POINTS

AT A GLANCE

No. 20 Oregon will take on its second consecutive ranked opponent in its Pac-12 road opener at No. 24 California on Saturday. The Ducks are coming off a heartbreaking overtime loss to No. 7 Stanford and will look to bounce back with their first win in a Pac-12 road opener since 2015 (at Colorado). Oregon has won eight of the last nine meetings with Cal dating back to 2009 and have scored 40-plus points in seven consecutive meetings with the Bears.

STUFFIN' THE RUN

For the first time since 2003 (at Arizona, vs. Michigan, vs. Washington State), Oregon has held three consecutive opponents to less than 100 yards rushing. The Ducks rank third and fourth nationally, respectively, in rushing defense in terms of yards per carry (2.13) and yards per game (75.5). The Ducks' last three opponents have rushed for a combined 166 yards on 91 attempts.

LEADER OF THE PACK

The only player in the nation with a full sack in four consecutive games to open the season, **OLB JUSTIN HOLLINS'** three forced fumbles are tied for the most by an FBS player. Hollins is second in the Pac-12 in both sacks (4.0) and tackles for loss (7.5).

WHAT A NIGHT

Junior **WR DILLON MITCHELL** turned in one of the most memorable performances by a wide receiver in program history with 14 receptions for 239 yards against Stanford. The 14 receptions are tied for the most by an FBS player this season and are the most against a Power 5 team, while Mitchell is one of six FBS players with 200 yards receiving in a game this season.

FIRST IMPRESSION

Junior **QB JUSTIN HERBERT'S** first career Pac-12 road start came at Cal in 2016. Herbert equaled the program record with six TD passes, including five in the second half and overtime, in the double-OT thriller.

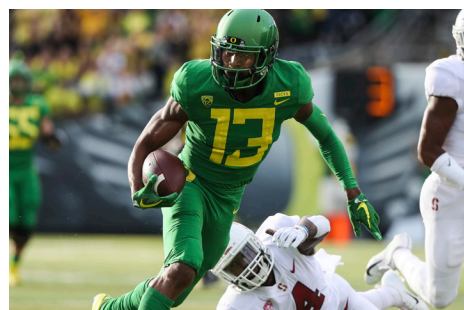

During Oregon's last win in Berkeley in 2012, **MARCUS MARIOTA** threw for 377 yards and six touchdowns to lead the Ducks to a 59-17 victory. The six TD passes tied the program record and Justin Herbert equaled the record four years later (2016) at Cal.



QB JUSTIN HERBERT 2018 QUICK HITS

- » Tied for sixth nationally in passing TDs (13) and 11th in passing yards (1,186).
- » Tied for fifth nationally with 10 first half passing TDs and second in passing TDs (2) on fourth down.
- » One of seven FBS quarterbacks (Will Grier - West Virginia, Tyree Jackson - Buffalo, D'Eriq King - Houston, Drew Lock - Missouri, Cole McDonald - Hawaii, Brett Rypien - Boise State) with three or more TD passes in each of their first three games.
- » One of four FBS quarterbacks (Dwayne Haskins - Ohio State, Will Grier - WVU, Drew Lock - Missouri) with four or more TD passes in each of the first two games.
- » Herbert along with Mississippi State QB Keytaon Thompson (vs. Stephen F. Austin) and Houston QB D'Eriq King (vs. Stephen F. Austin) are the only three players to throw for five TDs and rush for another in a game so far this season
- » Owns a streak of 19 consecutive games with a TD pass.
- » Surpassed 4,000 career passing yards, equaling the fastest to do so in Oregon history in terms of games (18 - Marcus Mariota) and starts (16 - Joey Harrington).
- » Set the program record of five TD passes in a season opener breaking the old record of four by Akili Smith (1998 vs. Michigan State) and Danny O'Neil (1994 vs. Portland State).
- » Became just the second player in program history to throw for five TD passes and rush for a TD in the same game (Marcus Mariota, vs. Colorado, 10/5/13).
- » His 10 completions against Bowling Green tied Phillip Rivers (2002, NC State at Navy) and Dale Rogers (2004, San Jose vs. Rice) for the fewest among players since 2000 with five passing touchdowns and one rushing TD in the same game.
- » Just the third FBS player since 2004 to throw for five touchdowns in a game with 10 or less completions.

A WIN WOULD ...

- Be Oregon's ninth win against Cal in the last 10 meetings.
- Give Oregon its first win in Berkeley since a 59-17 victory on Nov. 10, 2012.
- Be Oregon's first in a conference road opener since 2015 at Colorado.
- Be the Ducks' first against a ranked team on the road since a 30-28 win at No. 11 Utah on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Be Oregon's first road win since a 49-13 victory at Wyoming on Sept. 16, 2017.
- Be Oregon's first Pac-12 road win since the win at No. 11 Utah in 2016.
- Give Mario Cristobal his first career Pac-12 Conference victory.

PLENTY OF FIREPOWER

Through three games, Oregon ranks 13th nationally in scoring at 46.5 points per game. Led by Heisman hopeful **QB JUSTIN HERBERT**, 12 different Ducks have rushed for or caught a touchdown, which is tied for second-most in the country.

- Oregon ranks second nationally in the second quarter scoring (18.8) and is seventh in first half points per game (29.3).
- Tied for seventh nationally among teams that have played four games with 26 total touchdowns.
- Scored a TD in 15 of 16 quarters this season.
- Herbert leads the Pac-12 and is sixth nationally with 13 passing TDs.
- **WR JOHNNY JOHNSON III** is tied for second in the Pac-12 with four receiving TDs.
- **RB CYRUS HABIBI-LIKIO** is tied for second in the Pac-12 with five rushing TDs on just seven carries.

WHAT A START

JUSTIN HERBERT wasted little time etching his name into the Oregon record books over his first three career starts in 2016.

- In 2016's Washington game, Herbert became the first true freshman to start a game at quarterback at Oregon since Chris Miller in 1983.
- Threw 12 touchdown passes to match the most over a three-game span, equaling Marcus Mariota's record set during his freshman season in 2012. He equaled the record again in the first three games of the 2018 season.
- Connected on six touchdown passes in his second start at California, which equaled the program record.
- Tied the program record with 489 passing yards during a win against Arizona State in his third start.

TEAM & OFFENSIVE NOTES

MITCHELL IS MAKING MOVES

WR DILLON MITCHELL closed the 2017 season with back-to-back 100-yard receiving games, totaling 15 receptions for 262 and two TDs. Dillon nearly matched his two-game total to end the 2017 season against Stanford with 14 catches for 239 yards.

- » Tied for the Pac-12 lead with seven receptions of 20+ yards and tied for second in first down grabs (15).
- » Has a reception in nine straight games.
- » Over his last six games, Mitchell has 35 catches for 599 yards and three TDs.
- » The 14 receptions are tied for the most by an FBS player this season and are the most against a Power 5 team.
- » One of six FBS players with 200 yards receiving in a game this season, while his 239 yards are the second-most against a Power 5 team in 2018.
- » His 239 receiving yards are the second-most in program single-game history, just three yards off of Tony Hartley's record of 242 set in 1998 against Washington.
- » It marked the most receiving yards by a Pac-12 player since Washington State's Vince Mayle had 252 in 2014, at Arizona State.
- » The 14 receptions were also the second-most in program history behind Sammie Parker's 16-catch performance against Minnesota in 2003.
- » Out of his 14 catches against Stanford, 10 resulted in first downs and five went for 20-plus yards.
- » Caught 14 of his 17 targets.
- » Had 123 yards receiving in the first half and followed with 116 in the second half.

VERDELL TAKING THE LEAD

Redshirt freshman **RB CJ VERDELL** has been Oregon's leading rusher in three of the four game this season, highlighted by a pair of 100-yard rushing performances. Verdelld is one of four Pac-12 players with two 100-yard games this season and ranks fourth in the conference with 314 rushing yards.

- » Ranks second in the Pac-12 in total first downs (22), including 18 on the ground.
- » Fifth among freshmen nationally in rushing yards.
- » Accounted for 10 first downs (6 rushing & 4 receiving) against Portland State.

50 BURGER

For the seventh straight year, Oregon opened with a 50-point performance in its season opener against Bowling Green, but for just the second time in program history (2013) it backed it up with another 50-point game in week two against Portland State. The 50-point game against Portland State was the 39th by the Ducks since 2009, good for the most by any FBS program over that span.

- Oregon was one of seven FBS teams (Alabama, Boise State, Boston College, Ohio State, Oklahoma State & Syracuse) to score 50+ points in each of the first two games.
- Oregon is 79-0 all-time when scoring 50+ points.
- First time since 2014 against Arizona (Pac-12 Championship) and Florida State (Rose Bowl) that Oregon scored 50-plus points in back-to-back games.
- The 62 points against Portland State were the most in Mario Cristobal's career as a head coach, while the two 50-point games this season equal the amount his FIU teams had over six seasons.

YOUNG GUNS

Oregon's youth movement is in full effect with 12 true freshman seeing action through four games. In the season opener against Bowling Green, 10 true freshmen played with **LT PENEI SEWELL** getting the start. Against Portland State, **ADRIAN JACKSON** started at outside linebacker.

- Sewell was a top 5 graded offensive tackle in the Pac-12 each of the first two weeks.
- **RB TRAVIS DYE** has 189 all-purpose yards, highlighted by 138 yards and one touchdown on 26 carries.
- Dye's 49-yard TD run in the third quarter against Portland State is Oregon's longest run this season.
- **S JEVON HOLLAND** came up with his first career interception in the first quarter against San Jose State.

INSTANT IMPACT

PENEI SEWELL became the first Oregon true freshman to start on the offensive line in a season opener since **LEE GUNDY** did so in 1997 against Arizona. Sewell is also the first Oregon freshman offensive lineman to start since **TYRELL CROSBY** made his first start against Wyoming in 2014. HOME OPENER DOMINANCE

Oregon extended its winning streak in home openers to 14 games on Saturday with a 58-24 win over Bowling Green. The streak has fueled by an offense that has averaged 57.14 points per game over that span. The Ducks scored touchdowns in all four quarters against Bowling Green and in the process extended its consecutive quarters with a touchdown in home openers to 25, dating back to the third quarter of the 2012 game against Arkansas State. The only time Oregon failed to score 40 points in the streak came in 2009 when the Ducks knocked off Purdue, 38-36.

- The Ducks have outscored their opponents in the last 14 home openers by an 800-285 margin.
- Oregon has scored more than 70 points twice, 60-plus points six times and 50 or more points nine times.
- Oregon has totaled 500+ yards of offense in nine straight home openers.
- UO has scored points in 54 of 56 quarters.
- Oregon's 30 second-quarter points against BGSU were its second most during the streak.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

LIVIN' IN THE BACKFIELD

OLB JUSTIN HOLLINS and **DE/OLB JALEN JELKS** have lived in the backfield of Oregon's opponents the last two seasons. The duo has a combined for 38 tackles for loss and 16.5 sacks since the start of the 2017 seasons (17 games). Hollins and Jelks are at it again this season and currently lead all Pac-12 duos with a combined 6.5 sacks.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT

Under defensive coordinator **JIM LEAVITT**, the Oregon defense underwent significant improvement in the national rankings from 2016 to 2017 and is back at it again this season.

- Oregon leads the Pac-12 in rushing defense, allowing just 75.50 yards per game.
- Oregon is tied for the lead in the Pac-12 in sacks with 13.0.
- The Ducks also ranked in the top four in the conference in tackles for loss (2nd), third down defense (3rd), passes defended (3rd) and interceptions (4th).

AMADI & HOLLINS ARE EVERYWHERE

Through four weeks of the college football season, a total of 16 players have recorded a full sack and an interception in the same game. Fortunately for the Oregon defense, two of those players are **S UGOCHUKWU AMADI** and **OLB JUSTIN HOLLINS**. Amadi accomplished the feat in the season opener against Bowling Green while Hollins followed suit against San Jose State. Oregon is the only team to have two players with a sack and interception in the same game this season.

- Hollins is the only player in the nation with two or more sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception this season.
- Amadi is one of six FBS players this season to record a full sack and a pick-6 in the same game in 2018.
- Amadi is one of just 14 Pac-12 players since 2000 with an interception return for a TD and a sack in the same game.



DEFENSIVE NOTES

DISRUPTIVE FORCE

Senior **OLB JUSTIN HOLLINS** has lived in the opponent's backfield in the first four games. Hollins was one of just seven FBS players with a full sack in three straight games to open the year and became the only one to do it in the first four games with a sack against Stanford. Dating back to last season, Hollins has a sack in five consecutive games and his 5.0 sacks over that span is more than the sack total he produced over the first 38 games of his career (4.5).

- Hollins is tied for the lead nationally with three forced fumbles.
- He has six forced fumbles in his last eight games in September.
- Hollins is Oregon's active leader in career tackles for loss (29.5) and forced fumbles (6).

DEFENSE DOES IT AGAIN

Senior **S UGOCHUKWU AMADI'S** 38-yard interception return for a touchdown against Bowling Green extended Oregon's streak of scoring a defensive touchdown to three games dating back to last year's Civil War win over Oregon State. During that stretch, the Ducks' defense scored four touchdowns with two coming on interceptions and two coming on fumble recoveries. The touchdown was the second of Amadi's career and the fifth by the Ducks' defense in the last two seasons. Amadi's first career TD came on a fumble recovery against Utah last season.

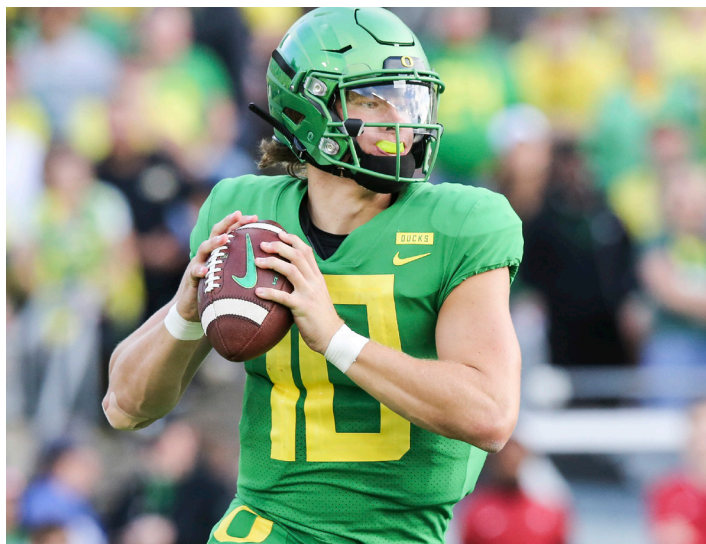

Mario Cristobal was named the University of Oregon's 34th head football coach on Dec. 8, 2017.

Cristobal, who possesses nearly 20 years of coaching experience along with an extensive track record of success as one of the nation's best offensive line coaches and an elite recruiter, was named the Ducks' head coach after spending the 2017 season as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator and offensive line coach.

In his first year at Oregon, the run-game was a major factor in the up-tempo Duck offense that tied for the Pac-12 lead with seven 40-point performances. The Ducks scored 40 rushing touchdowns during Cristobal's first season, the most since 2014. Royce Freeman ranked 11th nationally with 1,475 yards and tied for 12th with 16 rushing touchdowns. The Ducks finished the regular season with more than 3,000 yards on the ground, averaging 268 yards rushing per game. The Ducks' rushing offense ranked eighth in the FBS at the end of the regular season.

In seven starts by sophomore quarterback Justin Herbert, the Ducks averaged more than 49 points per game, and the offensive line allowed him to be sacked just six times. Under Cristobal, standout senior left tackle Tyrell Crosby allowed only three quarterback hurries and no sacks on his way to being named an Outland Trophy candidate and the recipient of the Morris Trophy as the top offensive lineman in the Pac-12. Freeman, center Jake Hanson and tackle Calvin Throckmorton also earned All-Pac-12 honors under Cristobal.

Cristobal's streak with an offensive lineman selected in the NFL Draft extended to five consecutive years when Crosby was taken by the Detroit Lions in the 2018 NFL Draft, while Freeman was selected in the third round by the Denver Broncos.

A renowned recruiter, Cristobal led Oregon's relentless effort to sign the nation's No. 13 class in 2018, according to 247Sports, just under two months after being named the head coach. The 24-member class featured 11 ESPN300 signees, which ranked ninth nationally, and the top player in the states of Arizona, Colorado, Oregon and Utah. Included in the ESPN300 signees were three offensive linemen, which tied for the most nationally.



Cristobal came to Oregon with a reputation as one of the nation's top recruiters. He was named the National Recruiter of the Year by 247Sports in the 2015 cycle and was ranked as the nation's No. 2 recruiter by 247Sports at the time of his hiring based on the final haul he brought to Alabama. His 2015 class included 2018 NFL first-round picks Minkah Fitzpatrick (Miami Dolphins), Da'Ron Payne (Washington Redskins) and Calvin Ridley (Atlanta Falcons).

Prior to arriving in Eugene, Cristobal spent four seasons (2013-16) at Alabama as the assistant head coach, offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator, helping the Crimson Tide to the CFP National Championship following the 2015 season, as well as a runner-up finish after the 2016 season.

Cristobal's offensive lines at Alabama produced a plethora of standout players and NFL draft picks. Over Cristobal's four seasons, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft, good enough to tie for the second-most from one program over that span. Included were three in the top two rounds, highlighted by 2016 first-round selection Ryan Kelly (Indianapolis Colts).

In each of his four seasons, a different offensive lineman earned first-team All-America honors, while Kelly won the Rimington Trophy as the nation's top center and was named the SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2015. The following year, Cam Robinson claimed the Outland Trophy. Both Kelly and Robinson won the Jacobs Blocking Trophy as the SEC's top offensive lineman.

In 2015, Cristobal's offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award as the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit in college football. The physically-dominating group helped Derrick Henry break Herschel Walker's SEC single-season rushing record en route to winning the Heisman Trophy, Walter Camp Award and the Doak Walker Award.

Alabama's offense ranked in the top-25 nationally in time of possession three times and in rushing offense twice from 2013-16. The Crimson Tide also had the SEC Player of the Year three times over that span in Amari Cooper (2014), Henry (2015) and Jalen Hurts (2016).

Prior to joining Nick Saban's staff at Alabama, Cristobal spent six seasons (2007-12) as the head coach at Florida International (FIU), solidifying his standing as one of the country's top young college football coaches and recruiters after taking over a program under heavy NCAA sanctions and coming off a winless season. Cristobal led the Panthers to the most successful year in school history in 2011, capturing a program-record eight wins, including a road win at eventual Co-Big East Champion Louisville.

Cristobal was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year in 2010, after leading FIU to its first Sun Belt Conference championship and a bowl victory over MAC champion Toledo. He finished his FIU career having produced NFL talents such as T.Y. Hilton and Jonathan Cyprien.

Cristobal coached at Miami (Fla.), his alma mater, under Larry Coker for three years before accepting the head job at FIU. As the tight ends coach for the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he helped develop multiple players into NFL draft picks, including first-round pick and All-Pro Greg Olsen. In 2006, Cristobal took over a Miami offensive line that featured four new starters and saw a 39 percent decrease in sacks allowed from the previous season (36 to 22).

Cristobal spent three years (2001-03) at Rutgers under head coach Greg Schiano, working with the offensive tackles and tight ends for the first two seasons before shifting his focus solely to the offensive line in 2003. Cristobal was a critical factor in Rutgers' resurgence to competitiveness and helped lay the foundation in recruiting and coaching for a program that went from obscurity to college football's upper echelon in a matter of five years. Cristobal helped Rutgers to a 5-7 mark in 2003, the school's best record since 1998. One of Cristobal's most accomplished pupils was tight end L.J. Smith, the Philadelphia Eagles' second-round pick in the 2003 NFL Draft.

Cristobal began his coaching career in 1998 as a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the Hurricanes for three seasons under Butch Davis. He joined the Hurricanes' staff six years after finishing a four-year playing career at Miami as a standout offensive lineman under Hall of Fame coach Jimmy Johnson. Cristobal was a first-team All-Big East selection in 1992 and helped the Hurricanes to a pair of national championships (1989, 1991).

A native of Miami and a prep standout at Christopher Columbus High School, Cristobal graduated from Miami in 1993 with a bachelor's degree in business administration and later earned a master's degree from Miami in 2001. Following his college career, Cristobal signed a free-agent contract with the Denver Broncos in 1994 and then played for the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe in 1995 and 1996.

Cristobal and his wife, Jessica, were married in June 2006 and have two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
