## THE STARTING 5

It's deja vu all over again when #6 Oregon faces #11 Washington State Wednesday night in Las Vegas (8:30 p.m., Pac-12 Network). In the 2018 Pac-12 Tournament, Oregon was the #6 seed, defeated #11 WSU and advanced to face #3 Utah. In the 2019 Pac-12 Tournament, #6 Oregon will play #11 WSU with the winner advancing to face #3 Utah.

- 1 – For the first time in the shot clock era (1985-86 to present) Oregon has held four consecutive opponents to less than 62 points. The last time Oregon did that was 1984-85, a year before the shot clock.
- 2 – The Ducks have held three of their last four opponents to their lowest point totals of the season: Arizona State (51), Arizona (47) and Washington (47). Figure in the 61 scored by WSU and the Ducks are yielding a stingy 51.5 ppg over the last 4 games.
- 3 – No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 13-4 in Sin City with two championships (2013, 2016), four title game appearances and five semifinal appearances (Arizona also has 13 wins).
- 4 – The Ducks' win over Arizona on March 2 guaranteed a ninth consecutive winning season for Oregon. It is the first time in 87 years that the Ducks have posted nine winning seasons in a row. Oregon had 10 straight winning seasons from 1923-32.
- 5 – While Oregon's recent defensive surge can be directly linked with the switch to the "big" starting lineup (four players standing 6-9), the play of **Payton Pritchard** shouldn't be overlooked. He's got 15 steals in the last five games to go along with 25 assists. He has also scored in double figures in all five of those games.
- BENCH – **Dana Altman** is now one of six active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for the last 22 consecutive seasons (the other five - Williams, Boeheim, Izzo, Self and Coach K - are all in the Hall of Fame).

## NOTES

## DUCKS IN THE DESERT

No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 13-4 since the league moved the championship to the desert in 2013 (Arizona is 13-3). In the previous six tournaments in Las Vegas, the Ducks have played in four championship games (winning in 2013 and 2016) and have advanced to the semifinal round five times. The only year the Ducks departed Vegas prior to the semis was in 2014 after a quarterfinal loss to UCLA.

## PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STAYING POWER

Since the conference tournament returned in 2002, Oregon has won at least one game in 13 of 16 appearances and went on to take the conference crown four times (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016). The Ducks are 26-12 (.684) in 16 appearances since 2002. Oregon's only first round exits during that span came in 2008, 2009 and 2012. Including the conference tournaments from 1987-90, Oregon's overall .636 winning percentage (28-16) is third-best in the conference, while the Ducks' four titles trail only Arizona's seven.

## KING, WOOTEN, EARN PAC-12 HONORS

**Louis King** and **Kenny Wooten** were selected for Pac-12 honors. King, from Jersey City, N.J., was named to the all-freshman team and was also an all-league honorable mention selection. Wooten, a sophomore from Manteca, Calif., was named to the all-defensive team for the second year in a row. King is averaging 12.6 points and 5.6 rebounds per game. In Pac-12 games, King is the second-leading freshman scorer at 14.5 points per game. He scored in double figures in 15-of-18 Pac-12 games this season. King is the Ducks' fourth all-freshman team selection in the last five years, joining **Jordan Bell** and **Dillon Brooks** in 2015, and **Tyler Dorsey** in 2016. Wooten ranks fourth in the league in blocked shots, averaging 1.9 per game. He is already third in UO career blocks with 144. His 52 blocks this year is seventh on the UO single-season list. Wooten is averaging 6.5 points and 4.5 rebounds per game.

## OREGON'S HISTORIC DEFENSIVE STRETCH BEST OF THE SHOT CLOCK ERA

Oregon's defense over the last two weeks has not only been good, it's been historically remarkable. For the first time in the shot clock era (1985-86 to present), the Ducks held four consecutive opponents to less than 62 points. The last time Oregon did that was 1984-85, a year before the shot clock. The Ducks held five consecutive opponents below 62 - St. Martin's (42), Colorado (60), Minnesota (57), Wyoming (60) and New Mexico State (51) - in December of 1984.

## DUCKS NEAR NINTH STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASON

Oregon is one win away from its ninth consecutive 20-win season. Currently, only nine schools nationally have won 20 games in a row for at least nine consecutive seasons.

## Teams with 9+ 20-Win Seasons:

Belmont, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, North Carolina, Saint Mary's and Vermont.

There are another six programs, including Oregon, that could join that group this season: **Oregon (19-12)**, BYU (19-13), Louisville (19-12), Arizona (17-14), Wichita State (17-13) and Iona (16-15).

## OREGON SECURES NINTH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

This is Oregon's ninth straight winning season, something that hasn't happened in Eugene in 87 years. The only other time Oregon has had nine or more winning seasons in a row was the decade between 1923-32, when the program posted 10 consecutive winning seasons under coaches **William Reinhart** and **George Bohler**.

## OREGON SETS NINE-YEAR WIN RECORD

Not surprisingly, Oregon has set the program record for wins over a nine-season period, now with 229. The Ducks passed the previous mark of 226, which was set just last year (2009-18).

## ALTMAN ENTERS NCAA CAREER TOP 30

With Oregon's win against California on Feb. 6, **Dana Altman** entered the NCAA's top 30 in all-time Division I coaching victories. He currently 29th with 639 career wins at the Division I level after passing Hugh Durham (Florida State, Georgia, Jacksonville) and Norm Sloan (Presbyterian, The Citadel, Florida, N.C. State), who both have 634. *The next coach Altman will pass is John Wooden, who had 664 career wins for Indiana State and UCLA.*

## YOUNG FRESH FELLOWS

Of Oregon's 12-player roster, 75 percent (9) are either freshmen or sophomores. Duck freshmen have logged 2,351 minutes so far this season (75.8 minutes per game). The three veteran outliers are junior **Payton Pritchard**, senior **Paul White** and senior grad transfer **Ehab Amin**.

**THE LAST TIME VERSUS WASHINGTON STATE**

Four players scored in double-figures and the Duck reserves combined for 31 points as the Oregon men's basketball team executed a complete performance MARCH 6, defeating Washington State, 72-61, at Beasley Coliseum. Hot shooting from Paul White, who scored a career-high 21 points, and Victor Bailey Jr. lifted the Ducks to their ninth win in Pac-12 play. The veterans stepped up early for the Ducks. White hit a three on the first possession of the game, foreshadowing the kind of shooting night he would have. Shortly after, the senior followed with another three to give UO a 6-5 advantage. Payton Pritchard joined the offensive picture with a cross-step layup in transition. From there, the upperclassmen duo would go on to score the first 14 points of the game for Oregon. After White and Pritchard got things rolling, the reserves came in and gave the Ducks some solid minutes. Will Richardson was the first to hit, knocking down a three in the corner to put UO up by one, 17-16. Richardson then found Ehab Amin in transition for another two followed by a Miles Norris turnaround jumper, giving the Ducks a four-point lead. But the pivotal moment of the night came at the end of the half. Louis King started off an offensive run by the Ducks with an effortless three from the same place Richardson hit earlier. Bailey Jr. kept things going by draining a three in transition on the following play, then drilling one from four feet outside the arc after that. The Ducks would go on to make their following four field goal attempts, including a layup at the buzzer by Pritchard to take a comfortable 41-30 lead to the locker room. After halftime, both Oregon and Washington State struggled to find an offensive rhythm, hovering around the same point differential created in the first frame. But at 13:33 when Bailey Jr. checked in, everything resumed for the Ducks. A minute after he checked in, Bailey Jr. hit his third three-pointer of the game, followed by his fourth at 11:44, extending the Ducks' lead to 15 points. White set a career high with 21 points. Pritchard recorded 15 points, seven assists and three steals on the night, while Bailey Jr. notched 14 points.

### KING LOUIE BREAKS OUT

Freshman **Louis King** opened Pac-12 play with back-to-back double-doubles and has scored in double figures in all but three league games this season. In conference games, King is the No. 2 freshman scorer (14.5 points per game). He had 17 points and 10 rebounds Jan. 5 against Oregon State, and followed that with 22 points and 10 rebounds Jan. 10 versus UCLA. Jan. 13 against USC, King had 19 points and a season-best six assists. He just missed his third double-double of the season Jan. 17 at Arizona when he had 10 points and nine rebounds. He led Oregon with 19 points Jan. 24 against Washington before matching his career high with 22 points Jan. 27 versus Washington State. King had his third 20-point game Feb. 16 at Oregon State. He led the Ducks Feb. 28 with 19 points against Arizona State and again March 1 versus Arizona with 14 points. King made his Oregon debut Dec. 8 against Omaha and made efficient use of his minutes. He scored 11 points on four-of-six shooting from the field (three-of-four 3FG) in 16 minutes. He missed the first seven games of the season recovering from a knee injury he suffered in high school.

### SECOND HALF SURGE

Under coach **Dana Altman**, Oregon has a 57-24 record (.703) during the second half of Pac-12 play. That breaks down to 4-5 in 2011, 7-2 in 2012, 5-4 in 2013, 7-2 in 2014, 8-1 in 2015, 7-2 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 5-4 in 2018 and 6-3 in 2019. No one has won more second half games over the last nine seasons. The last five years, Oregon is 29-6 after Valentine's Day in Pac-12 Conference games (credit to Pac-12 Network's JB Long for that note).

### DUCKS REACH 100 WINS AGAIN

The Jan. 31 win at Utah was Oregon's 100th victory over the last four seasons. It is the fifth time in a row that Oregon has won 100 games over a four-season span, all of which have come during the **Dana Altman** era. Those are also the only five times in program history that Oregon has won 100 games over a four-season time span.

### PRITCHARD SOARS UP CAREER STEALS LIST

With 14 steals in the last four games, junior guard **Payton Pritchard** has leapt from ninth to fourth on UO's career steals list. Saturday against Washington he passed **Luke Ridnour** (150/2000-03), who was at the game, and **Johnathan Loyd** (152/2010-14). He comes into the Pac-12 Tournament with 153 career steals, one behind **Malcolm Armstead** (154/2010-11) for third.

### PRITCHARD MAKES 100TH CONSECUTIVE START

Junior guard **Payton Pritchard** made his 100th consecutive start for the Ducks March 2 against Arizona. Pritchard came off the bench his first four games as a freshman before moving into the starting lineup for the last 102.

### PRITCHARD PASSES JACKSON, TOP SIX IN CAREER ASSISTS

With eight assists Feb. 23 at UCLA, **Payton Pritchard** passed **Luke Jackson** (424/2000-04) for sixth in UO career assists. Pritchard comes into the Pac-12 Tournament game with 446 career assists. **Johnathan Loyd** (458/2010-14) is fifth. Pritchard is just the sixth player in program history with 1,000 career points and 400 career assists.

### PRITCHARD REACHES 1,000 CAREER POINTS, ENTERS TOP 25

Jan. 17 at Arizona, **Payton Pritchard** became the 37th 1,000-point scorer in program history. Saturday at Washington, he passed **Bob Hamilton** (1,183/1943-46) and **Dick Wilkins** (1,186/1944-48) to climb to 24th in UO career scoring. Pritchard enters the Pac-12 Tournament with 1,190 points. A.D. Smith (1,234/1995-00) is 23rd. Pritchard posted back-to-back 20-point games for the first time in his career Feb. 6-10 versus California and Stanford. March 2 against Arizona, Pritchard passed **Garrett Sim** (185/2008-12) for eighth in UO career three-pointers.

## WHITE FILLS IN ON FRONT LINE

With **Bol Bol** out for the season, **Paul White** stepped up his effort, including a career-high 21 points March 6 at Washington State. He has scored in double figures 14 times since Bol's injury and is averaging a career-best 10.6 points per game. He tallied back-to-back-to-back of then-season highs of 15 points versus Oregon State (Jan. 5), 16 points against UCLA (Jan. 10) and 19 points versus USC (Jan. 13). He scored a team-high 16 points in the Ducks' Jan. 17 59-54 win at Arizona and added 18 points Jan. 27 versus Washington State, as well as 18 points (four three-pointers) Feb. 23 at UCLA.

## 500th BOARD MEANS EXCLUSIVE CLUB FOR AMIN

Reaching the 500-rebound plateau Jan. 17 at Arizona, **Ehab Amin** is now one of only four active college players with 1,000 career points, 500 career rebounds, 200 career assists and 200 career steals. The others are Josh Reaves of Penn State, Chris Clemons of Campbell and Purdue-Fort Wayne's John Konchar. Amin, who led the NCAA in steals as a junior at Texas A&M Corpus Christi in 2016-17, is eighth in the Pac-12 at 1.5 steals per game. Amin has shown a burst of offense at times as well. He scored 25 points Nov. 15 against Iowa, 23 points Dec. 29 at Boise State and added 13 Jan. 31 at Utah.

## WOOTEN MOVES INTO TOP THREE IN UO CAREER BLOCKS

**Kenny Wooten** swatted 11 shots during the Feb. 6-10 week against California (4) and Stanford (7). He matched his career high with seven against the Cardinal. With three blocks Jan. 31 at Utah, Wooten passed **Blair Rasmussen** (116/1981-85) for third on the UO career blocks list and now shows 144. On the season, Wooten has 52 blocks, which is seventh in UO single-season history. Wooten matched a career high with 20 points Jan. 27 against Washington State. Prior to breaking his jaw at Baylor, which caused him to miss the next four games, Wooten set a career-high 20 points Dec. 8 versus Nebraska-Omaha. Wooten's 92 blocks as a freshman ranked third on both the UO single-season list, and the Pac-12 freshman list.

## BAILEY JR ON THE REBOUND

After a rough stretch in January and early February that saw him held below double figures in six straight games, **Victor Bailey Jr.** rebounded with double-figure scoring outputs in four of the last eight games, including 14 March 6 at Washington State. Bailey Jr. had 11 points Feb. 10 against Stanford and then contributed 10 points Feb. 21 at USC before contributing 13 points Feb. 23 at UCLA.

## RICHARDSON RISES

Freshman **Will Richardson** recently scored in double figures off the bench in back-to-back games. He netted 12 points March 2 against Arizona and 11 March 6 in Pullman. He set a season high with 19 points Jan. 31 at Utah. He also blocked a career-best three shots. He dished out a season-high nine assists Feb. 6 versus California. Earlier this year, Richardson had 16 points at Houston, and 11 points and a season-high six assists Jan. 10 versus UCLA. On the year, Richardson is dishing out 2.6 assists per game.

## SECOND HALF LEADS

Though Oregon is 10-8 in league play, the Ducks led in the second half in 16 of 18 Pac-12 games. The Ducks have had the lead with less than two minutes to play in three of those eight losses.

## CONSISTENT COACHING STAFF

Success on the court often goes hand-in-hand with continuity off the court. During the nine-year **Dana Altman** era, Oregon has seen just one change on its coaching staff. That came following the 2013-14 season, when assistant coach **Brian Fish** accepted the head coaching job at Montana State, and was replaced by current assistant **Michael Mennenga**. Oregon's two other assistants, **Kevin McKenna** and **Tony Stubblefield**, have been with Altman at Oregon since day one. The Ducks' continuity extends even beyond the assistant coaches with director of operations **Josh Jamieson** in his 15th year and athletic trainer **Clay Jamieson** in his 21st season in Eugene.

## STARTING ROTATION

Dec. 29 at Boise State, **Francis Okoro** became the 10th different Duck to start a game this season. That's a single-season high during the **Dana Altman** era, and the most for the Ducks since 2009-10, when 11 different Ducks made at least one start.

## DUCKS ALMOST HIT TRIPLE 20

The Ducks nearly achieved an interesting mark Jan. 27 against Washington State. **Louis King** scored 22 points, **Kenny Wooten** had 20 and **Paul White** added 18. If White would have scored two more points, the Ducks would have had three players with 20 or more points for the first time in 17 years. Oregon last had three players with 20 or more points in the 2002 NCAA Tournament versus Wake Forest when **Luke Jackson** scored 29, **Luke Ridnour** had 28 and **Fred Jones** netted 24.

## NBA DRAFT NOTES

For the first time since 2007, an Oregon Duck was selected in the first round of the NBA Draft (**Troy Brown Jr.**, No. 15, Washington). Brown Jr. was the highest Duck selected since **Luke Jackson** went 10th to Cleveland in 2004. Brown Jr. was Oregon's first One-and-done player.

## NBA ROSTER NOTES

Oregon has five alums playing in the NBA. World Champion **Jordan Bell** is in his second season with the Golden State Warriors. Other players off the Ducks' 2016-17 NCAA Final Four team now in the NBA include second year pros **Chris Boucher** (Toronto), **Tyler Dorsey** (Memphis) and **Dillon Brooks** (Memphis). **Troy Brown Jr.**, the NBA first round selection of Washington, is in his first season with the Wizards. Additionally, **Elijah Brown** is in his first season with the G League's Grand Rapids Drive, while **MiKYLE McIntosh** is with Raptors 905.

## FOR THE DEFENSE

Under **Dana Altman**, Oregon is 158-19 when holding opponents under 70 points, including a 123-11 mark the last six seasons.

## HEY MAN, NICE SHOT

Oregon has made at least one three-point field goal in 742 consecutive games. The Ducks' last game without a three-pointer was Feb. 6, 1997, versus Washington. The Ducks last held an opponent without a three-pointer in 2015-16 when Cal went 0-for-12 from three-point range on Jan. 6, 2016.

## ALTMAN PASSES HALL OF FAMER HOBSON

**Dana Altman** needs seven more wins to become the school's all-time winningest coach. With Oregon's 80-65 defeat of No. 15 Syracuse on Nov. 16, Altman passed Basketball Hall of Famer **Howard Hobson** for second in UO coaching victories with 213. Hobson, the head coach at Oregon for 11 years (1936-47) including the 1939 NCAA Championship, won 212 career games with the Ducks. **Ernie Kent** won 235 games in 13 seasons (1998-2010).

## ALTMAN ONE OF SIX COACHES WITH 22 CONSECUTIVE WINNING SEASONS

With Oregon's victory over Arizona on March 2, **Dana Altman** earned his 22nd consecutive winning season as a head coach. Altman is one of six active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for the last 22 consecutive seasons (the other five are in the Hall of Fame). For Altman, that streak runs from the 1997-98 season through 2017-18, and covers his final 13 seasons at Creighton and his first nine in Eugene.

### DUCKS ACCEPT BID TO 2019 BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS

Oregon will make its inaugural appearance in the Bad Boy Mowers Battle 4 Atlantis next season in Nassau, Bahamas. The Ducks will be joined in the 2019 field by Alabama, Gonzaga, Iowa State, North Carolina, Michigan, Seton Hall and Southern Mississippi. This will be Oregon's first appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis, which will be played over the Thanksgiving holiday in the Imperial Arena at the Atlantis Paradise Island hotel. In addition to the Battle 4 Atlantis, Oregon's 2019-20 non-conference schedule will include games in Eugene versus Baylor, Boise State and Houston.

### DUCKS' SPLIT IN MANHATTAN YIELDS RARE TOP-25 WIN

Graduate transfer **Ehab Amin** led the Ducks with a season-high 25 points and three steals against Iowa in the semifinals of the 2K Empire Classic at Madison Square Garden. Freshman **Bol Bol** then topped that with 26 points in the consolation final against No. 15 Syracuse. Bol also scored 14 points against Iowa and had eight total blocked shots and was named to the all-tournament team. The defeat of No. 15 Syracuse marked the Ducks' first win over a top-15 non-conference opponent during the regular season since Oregon took down No. 14 Kansas, 84-78, on Dec. 7, 2002, in front of 20,762 fans at the Rose Garden in Portland, the biggest crowd to ever watch a college basketball game in the State of Oregon.

## FORMER S-A PHIL KNIGHT PLEDGES \$500 MILLION FOR SCIENCE

UO graduate and former track and field student-athlete Phil Knight, the co-founder of Nike, and his wife Penny made a half-a-billion dollar commitment to scientific research at the University of Oregon. It is the largest gift ever bestowed to a public university. "This act of philanthropy from Penny and Phil Knight is breathtaking," said University of Oregon President Michael Schill. "This is a seminal moment for the University of Oregon, an inflection point that will shape the trajectory of the university and this state for the next century and beyond." The Knight's \$500 million donation will fund the construction of a new science complex, that is currently under construction on the Eugene campus. Research at the new site will focus on life sciences such as biology, microbiology, biochemistry and other disciplines. "While not without risk, we believe the expected societal returns from such investments are high," said Knight. "And here at home in Oregon, we believe the potential to arm our talented young people with the skills and tools they will need to have a lasting impact on the world and to pursue rewarding careers makes such investments essential."

Oregon added a signee from the junior college ranks and three more highly-rated high schoolers as the Ducks landed the nation's ninth-ranked recruiting class (Rivals.com) during the early signing period for National Letters of Intent. Chris Duarte, one of the top junior college players in the nation, and high school standouts Isaac Johnson, Chandler Lawson and C.J. Walker are the newest additions to the men's basketball roster. The Ducks' 2019 recruiting class ranks ninth nationally according to Rivals.com. This is the fourth straight top-12 recruiting class for coach Altman and the staff, and the program's second-straight top-10 class.

The Ducks are 139-20 (.874) all-time at Matthew Knight Arena since the building opened in 2011.

## PAC-12 AT MKA

The Ducks are 63-16 (.797) in Pac-12 games at Matthew Knight Arena. Two teams have yet to register a win at the eight year-old arena: Washington State (0-8) and Arizona State (0-6). USC and Washington are 1-7, Arizona, Utah and Colorado are 1-5, Oregon State is 2-7, Stanford is 2-5 and UCLA is 3-5. The only Pac-12 opponent with a winning record at MKA is California (4-3).

## NON-CONFERENCE RECORD AT MKA

The Ducks are 76-4 (.950) all-time in non-conference games at Matthew Knight Arena. The four non-conference teams to defeat Oregon at MKA are Virginia (67-54, Dec. 18, 2011), Mississippi (79-73, Dec. 7, 2014), Boise State (73-70, Dec. 1, 2017) and Texas Southern (89-84, Nov. 26, 2018). UO won 28 non-conference games in a row at MKA between the Virginia and Ole Miss losses.

## HOME OPENERS

After defeating Portland State to open the 2018-19 season, the Ducks have now won 21 straight home openers. Oregon last dropped a home opener at the beginning of the 1997-98 season, 56-54 to Portland State.

## NATION'S LONGEST ACTIVE HOME WIN STREAK ENDS AT 46 GAMES

Oregon's school record winning streak at Matthew Knight Arena came to an end at 46 games on a half-court buzzer beater by Boise State on Dec. 1, 2017. At the time, it was the longest home winning streak in the nation. Two of Oregon's four longest home winning streaks have come under Dana Altman.

## IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREEN

Matthew Knight Arena was selected as one of the nation's 11 greenest college basketball arenas by LawnStarter. Opened in 2011, MKA received LEED Gold certification: Gold. Among the green features cited by LawnStarter were a 50 percent reduction in water use for landscaping, water use for the building as a whole reduced by 30 percent, and indoor air quality was enhanced with low-emitting construction materials like carpet, paint, wood and sealants.

## RECORD ATTENDANCE AT MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA

Oregon had its best home attendance figures in 39 seasons in 2016-17. The Ducks averaged 9,895 fans per home game (17 home games), which was the program's highest since averaging 9,984 in 1977-78. The 2016-17 season average was higher than the final capacity at McArthur Court (9,087). The Ducks also had seven sellouts in season seven at MKA, which matched the total number sellouts in the arena's first six seasons.

- Led Oregon with 7 rebounds vs. Florida A&M.
- Tallied a career-high 3 assists vs. Boise State.
- Earned a career-high 20 points vs. Omaha.
- Registered 8 points, 6 rebounds, and 4 blocks vs. Green Bay.
- Netted 12 points and had 6 rebounds vs. Syracuse.
- Second-highest on team with 9 rebounds vs. Eastern Washington.

Dana Altman is one of only six active coaches in NCAA Division I with 20 consecutive winning seasons. He is part of an exclusive fraternity that includes Hall-of-Famers Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Roy Williams, Bill Self and Jim Boeheim.

He is the 34th head coach to record 600 career wins at the Division I level. He entered the 2018-19 season just 26 wins shy of becoming the winningest head coach in Oregon history. In 2016-17, Altman led Oregon back to the Final Four for the first time in 78 years.

The 2013 National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year has won more games in his first eight seasons than any coach in Oregon history. Altman is 210-83 in Eugene, and 620-325 in 29 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

Altman, the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men's basketball program, has led the Ducks to eight consecutive 20-win seasons and eight postseason appearances. He led Oregon to five straight NCAA Tournaments (2013-17) for the first time in school history, winning at least one game in each of those years. Included in those NCAA appearances are a Final Four (2017), two Elite Eights (2016, 2017) and three of Sweet 16s (2013, 2016, 2017). Altman now has 20 seasons of 20-plus wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, eight at Oregon, one at Kansas State).

In addition to another 20-win season and a postseason appearance, the 2017-18 season saw another first for Altman when Troy Brown Jr. became his first career NBA first round draft choice (No. 15 overall, Washington).

Oregon entered the 2016-17 season with lofty expectations, and the Ducks lived up to every one of them. The Ducks won the Pac-12 title for the second consecutive season and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since the 1939 Webfoots won the very first NCAA title. Along the way, Oregon won a program-record 33 games and also reached a high-water mark for conference victories with 16. Dillon Brooks was named the Pac-12 player of the year and a consensus all-American, while Jordan Bell was the Pac-12 defensive player of the year and the NCAA Midwest Regional most outstanding player. Jordan, Brooks and Tyler Dorsey were all selected in the 2017 NBA Draft.

The 2015-16 season saw Altman reach new heights as a coach and achieve honors matched only by some of the very best mentors in the history of the Pac-12 Conference. Altman guided Oregon to the Pac-12's regular season and conference title in the same year for the first time in school history. He also reached the NCAA's Elite Eight for the first time and was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four seasons, a feat matched only by Hall of Famer Lute Olson of Arizona. The individual honors won by players under his guidance included all-American Brooks, Pac-12 Tournament MOP Elgin Cook, Pac-12 all-defensive selection Chris Boucher and Pac-12 all-freshman pick Dorsey.

In 2014-15, in one of the finest coaching performances of his career, Altman guided a team that had only three returning scholarship players to a 26-10 record, a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 (13-5) and the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was the runaway choice for Pac-12 Coach of the Year, while Joseph Young tied the school single-season scoring record in being named Pac-12 Player of the Year. Cook was an all-Pac-12 second-team selection, while Bell and Brooks made the Pac-12's all-freshman team.

The 2013-14 season saw Altman win his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19. He also joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons. He guided Oregon to a 24-10 overall record and an NCAA Tournament win. Young was an all-conference second team selection and an all-Pac-12 tournament pick, while Mike Moser was an honorable mention selection by the conference.

Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament. Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors. Senior E.J. Singler was an all-league first team selection, while Johnathan Loyd was named Most Outstanding Player of the Pac-12 Tournament as the honors were spread around nearly the entire team. Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before going on to become a second round draft choice of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers.

During the 2011-12 season, Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for a share of second place in the final league standings. The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals. Under Altman's tutelage, Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference, while Singler was named to the all-conference second team.

In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the

12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program. He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play. Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach.

Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines. Oregon participated in the 2011 College Basketball Invitational, defeating Altman's former team – Creighton – in the best-of-three championship series.

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, including back-to-back MVC coaching honors while he was at the Omaha, Neb., school in 2001 and 2002. Altman was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.

Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons. He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01 – its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.

Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327), trailing only Basketball Hall of Fame coaches Henry Iba (486) and Eddie Hickey (337). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team. His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference post-season tournament titles. Creighton inducted Altman into its athletics hall of fame in 2018.

Student-athletes under his direction at CU earned six All-America honors on the court and four Academic All-America laurels in the classroom. Three players he coached at Creighton – Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver – have played in the NBA.

Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State. During that time, Altman led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tourneys and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17, 1994. K-State eventually advanced to play in the NIT Final Four. Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

While head coach at Southeast Junior College in Fairbury, Neb., his first team (1982-83) rolled to a 29-6 record and a third-place finish in the junior college national tournament and Altman was honored as both Region 9 and the Nebraska College Coach of the Year.

In 1983, Altman accepted the head coaching position at Moberly (Mo.) Junior College, with a three-year run resulting in a staggering 94-18 record (25-9 in 1983-84; 35-5 with a third-place finish at the national tourney in 1984-85; and a 34-4 mark in 1985-86 with a sixth-place finish at nationals).

He was named Region 16 Coach of the Year in both the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons, and was also a finalist for 1986 National Junior College Athletic Association Coach of the Year accolades.

Altman's playing career began at Southeast Junior College in 1976, where he captained teams to a 22-10 mark in his freshman year and a 26-5 record in his sophomore season.

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.

At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball. Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.




