



GAME 35 – Pac-12 Championship: #6 Oregon (22-12, 10-8) vs. #1 Washington (26-7, 15-3)
Saturday, March 16, 7:40 p.m. PT, ESPN (Dave Pasch, Bill Walton, Molly McGrath); Oregon Sports Network (Joey McMurry, Jerry Allen);
Westwood One (Ryan Radtke, P.J. Carlesimo)

The Ducks have advanced to the Pac-12 Tournament championship game for the fifth time in the last seven years. Oregon has won
four previous Pac-12 Tournament championships (2003, 2007, 2013 and 2016). The Ducks will face #1 seed Washington. The Ducks
are 4-2 all-time against the Huskies in Tournament play. This will be the first time Oregon and Washington will play in the title game.

OREGON GAME NOTES: THE STARTING FIVE

- 1 – Friday’s semifinal win against Arizona State made Dana Altman the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history. Altman has
now won 18 games in the Pac-12 Tournament, one better than Sean Miller (Arizona) and two more than Lute Olson (Arizona).
• 2 – No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 16-4 in Sin City with two
championships (2013, 2016), five title game appearances and six semifinal appearances.
• 3 – During the regular season, senior Ehab Amin averaged 5.4 points per game and made 25.6 percent of his attempts from three-
point range. In the Pac-12 Tournament, Amin is averaging 11.7 points per game and draining 52.4 percent (11-21) from downtown.
• 4 – In Oregon’s current seven-game winning streak, the Ducks are outscoring the opposition 72.6 to 55.1, and have forced 107
turnovers, while yielding just 125 field goals.
• 5 – While Oregon’s recent defensive surge can be directly linked with the switch to the “big” starting lineup (four players standing
6-9), the play of Payton Pritchard shouldn’t be overlooked. He’s got 19 steals in the last eight games to go along with 40 assists.
• BENCH – Dana Altman is now one of six active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for the last 22
consecutive seasons (the other five - Williams, Boeheim, Izzo, Self and Coach K - are all in the Hall of Fame).
• BENCH – Oregon’s opening round victory over Washington State was the Ducks’ 20th win of the season. That makes Oregon one of
only 11 schools nationally with an active streak of nine or more consecutive 20-win seasons.

FRIDAY NIGHT THREE DOT NOTES

Oregon blocked 10 shots in the semifinal matchup with Arizona State, which was one shy of the tournament's single-game record ... With his sixth assist of the night, Payton Pritchard passed Johnathan Loyd (458-2010-14) for fifth in UO career assists. Pritchard finished the night with 461 career assists ... Oregon scored 25 points off 14 ASU turnovers, including 15 in the first half ... ASU was the first team to score more than 61 points against the Ducks in seven games.

THURSDAY NIGHT THREE DOT NOTES

Francis Okoro tied the Pac-12 Tournament record with six blocked shots against Utah, matching Stanford's Josh Huestis (2013) and Washington's Malik Dime (2017) ... Head coach Dana Altman tied Sean Miller for the most Pac-12 tournament wins with 17.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT THREE DOT NOTES

Oregon's 33-point victory over Washington State is the largest margin of victory in Pac-12 Tournament history. It broke the previous record of 32 when Arizona beat Utah, 71-39, on March 13, 2014 and UCLA beat Oregon State, 79-47, on March 9, 2006 ... Payton Pritchard notched three steals in the win and moved into third place in program history for most steals ... Three-of-four Oregon freshmen scored in double figures in the opening round win against Washington State, including Miles Norris, who scored a career-high 14 points against the Cougars ... Oregon tied a season high with 14 steals in the opening round, one shy of the tournament record ... Oregon had 26 points off 20 WSU turnovers ... Four Ducks scored in double figures, led by Ehab Amin's 17 points ... It was the most points by Amin since scoring 23 at Boise State on Dec. 29.

PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STAYING POWER

Since the conference tournament returned in 2002, Oregon has now won at least one game in 14 of 17 appearances. The Ducks have gone on to take the conference crown four times (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016). The Ducks are 29-12 (.707) in the previous 16 appearances since 2002. Oregon's only first round exits during that span came in 2008, 2009 and 2012. Including the conference tournaments from 1987-90, Oregon's overall .660 winning percentage (31-16) is third-best in the conference, while the Ducks' four titles trail only Arizona's seven.

DUCKS EARN NINTH STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASON

Oregon earned its ninth consecutive 20-win season on Wednesday night. The Ducks are one of only 11 schools nationally that have won 20 games in a row for at least nine consecutive seasons.

Teams with 9+ 20-Win Seasons:

Belmont, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisville, North Carolina, **Oregon**, Saint Mary's and Vermont.

There are another four programs that could join that group this season:

BYU (19-13), Arizona (17-14), Wichita State (17-13) and Iona (17-15).

OREGON'S HISTORIC DEFENSIVE STRETCH BEST OF THE SHOT CLOCK ERA

Oregon's defense over the last three weeks has not only been good, it is historically remarkable. For the first time in the shot clock era (1985-86 to present), the Ducks held six consecutive opponents to less than 62 points. The last time Oregon did that was early in the 1982-83 season: Rutgers (53), San Diego State (49), St. Olaf (39), Montana State (55), Idaho (56) and Lamar (41).

OREGON SECURES NINTH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

This is Oregon's ninth straight winning season, something that hasn't happened in Eugene in 87 years. The only other time Oregon has had nine or more winning seasons in a row was the decade between 1923-32, when the program posted 10 consecutive winning seasons under coaches William Reinhart and George Bohler.

OREGON SETS NINE-YEAR WIN RECORD

Not surprisingly, Oregon has set the program record for wins over a nine-season period, now with 232. The Ducks passed the previous mark of 226, which was set just last year (2009-18).

ALTMAN ENTERS NCAA CAREER TOP 30

With Oregon's win against California on Feb. 6, Dana Altman entered the NCAA's top 30 in all-time Division I coaching victories. He currently 29th with 642 career wins at the Division I level after passing Hugh Durham (Florida State, Georgia, Jacksonville) and Norm Sloan (Presbyterian, The Citadel, Florida, N.C. State), who both have 634. The next coach Altman will pass is John Wooden, who had 664 career wins for Indiana State and UCLA.
