## KEY STORYLINES

### DUCKS HOST NO. 7 WASHINGTON IN FIRST PAC-12 HOME SERIES

The Ducks return to Jane Sanders Stadium this weekend to host No. 7 Washington in their first Pac-12 home series of the 2019 season. Looking to snap a nine-game losing streak and pick up its first conference win, Oregon will open the three-game series against the Huskies on Saturday (1 p.m.) before playing game two on Sunday (4 p.m.) and the series finale on Monday night (6 p.m.).

### HOW TO FOLLOW

Saturday's series opener will be broadcast live on ESPNU and will be available to stream through the WatchESPN app. Trey Bender (PXP) and Danielle Lawrie (Analyst) will be on the call for ESPNU. Sunday and Monday's games will be aired on Pac-12 Network and will be called by Ann Schatz (PXP) and Amanda Freed (Analyst). Matt Tyra and KWVA Sports will have the radio call for all three games at 88.1 FM or kwvaradio.org/listen-live, and live stats can be found at Oregon.Statbroadcast.com.

### ABOUT NO. 7 WASHINGTON

The Huskies come to Eugene with an 0-3 Pac-12 record after getting swept at home by No. 1 UCLA last weekend to open conference play. Washington, which ranks last in the Pac-12 in slugging percentage (.388) and eighth in on-base percentage (.367), has relied heavily this season on its pitching staff, which leads the conference in strikeouts (259) and ranks fourth in ERA (1.85). Sophomore Gabbie Plain is second with a 1.13 ERA and threw back-to-back no-hitters two weeks ago, and senior Tara Alvelo leads the Pac-12 in strikeouts (132) and is tied for second in wins (11). Taryn Atlee leads the UW offense and ranks seventh in the league with a .407 batting average.

### DAIL ESTABLISHING WORKHORSE REPUTATION

SO LHP **Jordan Dail** has been an absolute workhorse so far in 2019 for the Ducks after transferring to Oregon from Virginia Tech. Dail (9-7, 3.64 ERA) is fourth in the nation with 109.2 innings pitched, 28.1 more than any other pitcher in the Pac-12, and ranks fourth in the conference and 21st nationally with 110 strikeouts. The Forest, Va., native has thrown 10 complete games and two shutouts, including her first career no-hitter on Feb. 16 against Florida Atlantic, and she leads the Pac-12 in games started (15) and is second in appearances (20). ### YOUNG DUCKS FLASHING THE LEATHER

Oregon's defense, which has often been comprised of all underclassmen around the infield, has been incredibly solid so far this season. The Ducks lead the Pac-12 and are eighth nationally in fielding percentage (.979), committing a conference-low 10 errors through the first 21 games. SR OF **Cherish Burks** was tremendous in left field in Oregon's first home series vs. Oklahoma State with three highlight-reel diving catches, and both FR IF **Rachel Cid** and JR OF **Haley Cruse** made diving defensive plays last weekend in Tucson. Oregon also leads the conference in runners caught stealing (11), led by SO UT **Shaye Bowden's** Pac-12-best nine from behind the plate.

### UP NEXT

Oregon will have a quick turnaround after its series with the Huskies, as the Ducks will leave Tuesday morning to head to California for a Wednesday game at Pacific. The Ducks will then go to Stanford for a three-game weekend series against the Cardinal.

## GAME NOTES

### BUNKER STREAKING INTO FIRST PAC-12 HOME SERIES

FR IF **Allee Bunker** has started to heat up at the plate over the last couple weekends, bringing a team-best five-game hitting streak into UO's series against Washington. Bunker hit .444 (4-for-9) last weekend against No. 12 Arizona in Tucson, including a two-hit game with a double on Sunday. Bunker (.307) is one of four Ducks hitting better than .300, and she has a team-low five strikeouts in a team-high 75 at-bats.

### DUCKS TAKING PATIENT PLATE APPROACH

Oregon has shown good patience at the plate so far this season, ranking second in the Pac-12 and in the top 20 nationally with 97 walks as a team. JR OF **Haley Cruse** is tied for second in the conference and is 20th in the nation with 19 walks, seven more than she had in 130 at-bats last season, while FR IF **Rachel Cid** (16) and SR C/1B **April Utecht** (15) are tied for fifth and seventh in the Pac-12, respectively. Cruse also ranks 10th in the conference with a team-best .460 on-base percentage.

### FRESHMEN SHOULDERING HEAVY LOAD

The Ducks have relied heavily on freshmen early on in 2019 as IF **Allee Bunker**, IF **Rachel Cid**, UT **Hannah Galey**, IF **Jasmine Sievers** and OF **Lexi Wagner** have all started at least 17 games already, with Bunker, Cid, Sievers and Wagner all starting 20 or more. Sievers leads the Ducks with a .321 batting average, while Cid is first on the team in home runs (4) and tied for the lead in RBIs (16). Cid (3B), Sievers (SS), Bunker (2B) and Galey (1B) have held down the infield for the majority of games, and Wagner has started 23 games and had two huge RBIs in Oregon's comeback win over Texas A&M on Feb. 23.

### WALK-ONS IMPRESS AGAINST TOP-20 COMPETITION

Walk-on freshmen **Kailey Krueger** and **Annalisa Williamson** came through with the biggest moments of their young careers in UO's first home series vs. No. 19 Oklahoma State. Krueger, who joined the team in early February and had not pitched competitively since May 2018, went seven full innings against OSU in Saturday's second game and gave the Ducks a chance to win. Williamson, who joined the team in mid-January, delivered her first career home run to get Oregon within one run with two outs in the seventh inning of the first game on Saturday, a solo shot to center off of OSU ace Samantha Show.

### TOP-25 STREAK COMES TO AN END

Oregon softball's impressive streak of being ranked in the USA Today/NFCA top-25 poll came to end last week when the Ducks were receiving votes in the week five edition of the rankings. Oregon had been ranked in the top 25 for 139 straight weeks (preseason and postseason polls included), dating back to week 10 of the 2010 season.

### BOWDEN WINS PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK (2/26)

SO UT **Shaye Bowden** earned her first career Pac-12 player of the week award after hitting .412 with a home run, double and seven RBIs at the Mary Nutter Classic. Bowden was 7-for-17 over six games, including a two-hit, three-RBI day in the Ducks' 7-5 comeback win over Texas A&M. The Phoenix, Ariz., native also hit her second home run of the year vs. NMSU, and went 3-for-4 with two RBIs in the win over UCSB. The Ducks' super-utility player also continued to thrive at catcher, throwing out three runners trying to steal. Bowden is second among Ducks this season with a .328 batting average and tied for the team lead with 16 RBIs.

### DUCKS ROAR BACK TO BEAT TEXAS A&M

The Ducks went 4-2 at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic (2/21-24), highlighted by a thrilling 7-5 comeback win over Texas A&M. After falling behind 5-2 through five innings, freshmen Allee Bunker and Lexi Wagner came through with big RBI hits in the sixth to tie the game, 5-5. SO UT Shaye Bowden drove in the go-ahead run in the seventh, and an error allowed a second run to score before SO LHP **Jordan Dail** finished off the Aggies in the bottom half for the win. The Ducks opened the MNCC with a 3-1 win over New Mexico State, and also picked up wins over Army and UCSB. Oregon dropped games to Bethune-Cookman and No. 23 Texas Tech.

### DAIL THROWS FIRST CAREER NO-HITTER

SO LHP **Jordan Dail** fired her first career no-hitter on Feb. 16 against Florida Atlantic in Clearwater, Fla., to lead the Ducks to a 2-0 victory. Dail struck out nine batters, including seven of the first nine that she faced, and didn't allow a runner to reach second base after the first inning while scattering four walks. Dail's no-hitter was the first of the season for the Ducks and the 31st in program history.

## PAC-12 PRESEASON POLL

## GAME NOTES

### UPSET OF NO. 8 LSU HEADLINES SPC ELITE INVITE

The Ducks came away with a 2-2 showing at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational, headlined by an 8-5 win over No. 8 LSU. The Ducks built an early three-run lead before the Tigers tied the game, 4-4, in the fifth, but SR C/1B **April Utecht** put Oregon right back in front in the sixth with an RBI single. Utecht came through again in the seventh with a clutch three-run home run, her first of the year, giving her four RBIs over the final two innings. SO LHP **Jordan Dail** finished off a gritty complete-game outing in the circle and helped secure the first top-10 win of the Melyssa Lombardi era. Dail led Oregon to its second win in Clearwater the next day with her first career no-hitter in a 2-0 victory of Florida Atlantic, helping the Ducks bounce back from their first loss of the season vs. No. 23 James Madison. Oregon fell to No. 18 Kentucky to close the weekend.

### CID WINS PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK (2/12)

FR IF **Rachel Cid** hit a whopping .471 (8-for-17) with three home runs and a team-high 10 RBIs to help lead the Ducks' offensive attack at the Kajikawa Classic, earning the first Pac-12 freshman of the week honor of the 2019 season. Cid was especially stellar in her collegiate debut vs. Kansas, going 3-for-3 with a home run, four RBIs and two walks, and then added home runs against CSUN and Bradley.

### FRESHMEN COME OUT SWINGING IN TEMPE

**Rachel Cid** wasn't the only Oregon freshman to get their collegiate careers off to hot starts at the Kajikawa Classic. FR UT **Hannah Galey** started all five games at first base and was an impact bat at the plate, hitting .400 with three home runs and nine RBIs. Galey blasted a pair of homers in UO's season-opening win over Kansas, and then added a huge three-run bomb to give Oregon a 6-5 lead over Seattle in the bottom of the fifth inning. FR IF **Allee Bunker** hit .368 on the weekend with three stolen bases and a team-high nine runs scored, including four against Kansas to tie the UO single-game record, and FR OF **Lexi Wagner** drove in six runs while hitting .357. FR IF **Jasmine Sievers** made her collegiate debut vs. Seattle after missing the first four games with an injury, and Oregon's top-ranked recruit went a perfect 3-for-3 with three RBIs, including a two-run homer two batters after Galey's to help the Ducks down the Redhawks. Overall, the five freshmen combined to hit .426 with seven home runs, 29 RBIs and 28 runs scored.

### LOMBARDI BRINGS ELITE RESUME TO OREGON

A new era of Oregon softball officially began on July 9, 2018, as director of athletics Rob Mullens announced the hiring of Melyssa Lombardi as the 12th head coach in program history. Lombardi brought to Oregon an elite championship resume after a highly successful 21-year tenure as an assistant at Oklahoma, including the final 11 years as associate head coach. The 2017 NFCA DI assistant softball coach of the year, Lombardi was responsible for Oklahoma's pitchers and catchers throughout her 21-season stint in Norman, helping lead the Sooners to four national championships, including back-to-back in 2016 and 2017, and a total of 15 Big 12 regular season or postseason tournament titles.

### CRUSE LEADS DUCKS INTO 2019 SEASON AFTER BREAKOUT SOPHOMORE CAMPAIGN

After struggling to the tune of a .190 batting average in limited playing time as a freshman, JR OF **Haley Cruse** reinvented her swing last year as a sophomore and came away with remarkable results. Cruse finished the year leading the Ducks and ranking sixth in the Pac-12 with a .377 batting average, and her .426 mark in conference play led all Pac-12 hitters by more than 70 points. A second-team all-Pacific Region and third-team all-Pac-12 selection, Cruse also ranked ninth in the Pac-12 with a .430 on-base percentage, striking out just 13 times in 130 at-bats. Cruse, who hit .389 over the first five game last weekend in Tempe, is one of five returners for the Ducks on the 2019 squad, along with SO UT **Shaye Bowden**, SR OF **Cherish Burks**, SR OF **Darya Kaboli-Nejad** and SR C/1B **April Utecht**. Kaboli-Nejad will miss her senior season after suffering a knee injury in preseason practice.

### TRANSFER SOUTHPAWS HEADLINE FLURRY OF 2019 ROSTER ADDITIONS

An offseason of transition saw 14 new faces join the Ducks, including three transfers and 10 total freshmen. Oregon added SO LHP **Jordan Dail** (Virginia Tech) and SO LHP **Maddie MacGrandle** (Texas A&M) by way of transfer to headline its 2019 pitching staff, while also signing FR C **Terra McGowan** (Arizona State). Dail was 12th in the ACC last year as a freshman with 116 strikeouts and fifth with a .209 opponent's batting average, while MacGrandle posted a 5-1 record with a 2.60 ERA and two complete games in eight appearances. The Ducks added the trio of transfers to their five returners and a highly-regarded freshman class, and then filled out the roster with a flurry of walk-on additions, including SR UT **Bayley Bruner**, JR UT **Bailey Cook**, FR IF **Katelyn Howard**, FR RHP **Kailey Krueger**, FR OF **Anna Mills** and FR C **Annalisa Williamson**. Bruner was a four-year letterwinner for Oregon soccer and gives the Ducks a big speed threat on the bases.

### HIGHLY-RANKED FRESHMEN CLASS

Five of Oregon's freshmen were ranked in the top 100 of FloSoftball's recruiting rankings for the 2018 class, including IF **Jasmine Sievers** (No. 10), IF **Rachel Cid** (No. 11), C **Terra McGowan** (No. 20), OF **Lexi Wagner** (No. 73) and IF **Allee Bunker** (No. 96), and UT **Hannah Galey** was also highly regarded after a dominant career at Scappoose HS. McGowan is currently ineligible after transferring from Arizona State.

### LOMBARDI HIRES ALL-STAR STAFF

Head coach **Melyssa Lombardi** made headlines around the softball world with the hiring of three highly-regarded coaches to her 2019 staff in assistants **Megan Langenfeld** and **Justin Shults** as well as volunteer assistant **Sierra Romero**. Shults, an all-American at UC Riverside and a 2011 MLB Draft pick by the Houston Astros, takes over as the Ducks' hitting coach. Langenfeld is Lombardi's "utility" coach, working with both the Ducks' pitchers and hitters, after a dominant two-way career at UCLA, where she won a national title in 2010. Romero, a four-time all-American at Michigan (2013-16) and one of the sport's biggest names, works primarily with UO's infielders.

Melysa Lombardi was named the 12th head coach in Oregon softball history on July 9, 2018, bringing with her an elite championship resume after a highly successful 21-year tenure on the staff of Oklahoma head coach Patty Gasso, including the last 11 seasons as associate head coach.

The 2017 Division I Assistant Softball Coach of the Year, Lombardi was directly responsible for the Oklahoma pitchers and catchers throughout her 21-season stint in Norman that saw the Sooners win four national championships, including back-to-back in 2016 and 2017, and a total of 15 Big 12 regular season or postseason tournament titles.

Oklahoma played in the postseason every year during Lombardi's 21 seasons, advancing to 17 Super Regionals and 12 Women's College World Series appearances. The Sooners made Super Regionals each of the last nine seasons with Lombardi on staff, and the WCWS seven times in her last eight seasons.

A former all-conference catcher for the Sooners, Lombardi coached the Oklahoma battery to a combined 20 All-America honors, 37 All-Region accolades and 77 All-Big 12 honors over her 21 seasons at OU. Her pitchers racked up six Big-12 Pitcher of the Year awards, and she mentored OU aces such as Paige Parker, Pagie Lowary and Keilani Ricketts.

In addition to being named the nation's top assistant in 2017, Lombardi was a part of four NFCA National Coaching Staffs of the Year (2000, 2013, 2016 and 2017), and 11 Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year (1999, 2000, 2001, 2004, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018).

Under Lombardi's guidance, the Sooner pitchers led the nation in 2018 with a team ERA of 1.12, paced by four-time Big 12 Pitcher of the Year Paige Parker, who was a finalist for USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, and Paige Lowary, who led all active pitchers in the nation in career saves and was the first overall selection in the National Pro FastPitch League Draft. Parker ranked second in the country with a 0.82 ERA, while Lowary was sixth at 1.09.

The 2017 season featured one of the deepest staffs in program history as three pitchers threw at least 100 innings and all five members of the staff had ERAs at 2.08 or lower. The staff ERA was 1.55 on the season with 510 strikeouts in 482.2 innings and an opponents' average of .177. Parker was tremendous for a third straight season, earning Big-12 Pitcher of the Year for the third time with a 1.43 ERA and 8.72 strikeouts per seven innings. Lombardi immediately took Lowary, who transferred from Missouri, under her wing and helped her become a dominant relief pitcher with 11 saves.

As a sophomore in 2016, Parker tied the school record and led the country with 38 wins while posting a 1.64 ERA and notching 269 strikeouts in 252.1 innings with

14 shutouts. The WCWS Most Outstanding Player for the national champion Sooners, Parker was a perfect 10-0 with a 2.13 ERA in the postseason. OU threw 22 total shutouts throughout the 2016 season. Catcher Lea Wodach earned second-team All-Region honors as she hit .315 with seven home runs and 32 runs batted in. Taking over primary catching duties in mid-March, she threw out 11 of the 16 stolen base attempts against her.

Parker burst onto the scene as a freshman in 2015, throwing four perfect games and nine solo shutouts with a 1.65 ERA. She became just the third pitcher in NCAA DI history to throw at least four perfect games in a career, and just the 16th to have four perfectos in a career. Behind the plate in 2015, catchers Whitney Ellis and Lea Wodach limited baserunners to just four stolen bases, the fewest in the nation. In addition, they threw out 8 of 12 would-be basestealers for a nation's base caught stealing rate of 75 percent.

The 2014 season was one of Lombardi's best coaching jobs as OU's returning pitchers combined for three wins, one start, 13.2 innings and 13 strikeouts from 2013. Nevertheless, Stanford transfer Kelsey Stevens joined the squad and proceeded to tie for the nation's lead in wins with 38 to earn All-Region and All-Conference honors. In addition, sophomore catcher Whitney Ellis, who had to replace three-time All-American Jessica Shults, threw out a nation's best 61.5 percent (16 of 26) of would-be basestealers.

Lombardi also developed two-time USA Softball Player of the Year Keilani Ricketts, a four-time All-American who led the Sooners to the 2013 national title while finishing 35-1 and throwing six no-hitters. Ricketts finished her career in the NCAA top 12 in multiple categories, including ninth with 133 career victories and 11th with 1,605 career strikeouts.

In 2013, Ricketts and Michelle Gascoigne combined to give the Sooners one of the most dominant seasons in program history. Ricketts went 35-1 and Gascoigne was 18-3, while each had an ERA under 1.23 and held opponents' batting averages under .160. Ricketts threw 16 shutouts, Gascoigne threw eight and the pair combined on three more. As a team, the Sooners led the country in earned run average at 1.16, the lowest by a staff since Florida's 0.69 mark in 2009. It was also the second year in a row that OU boasted the country's top ERA, the first time a program led in back-to-back years since 2005-06.

Ricketts earned the first of two straight USA Softball Player of the Year honors in 2012 after bettering her own program single-season strikeout record with 457. She was second nationally in strikeouts, strikeouts per seven innings (11.0), ERA (1.08) and wins (37), and was third with 15 shutouts. As a staff, the 2012 Sooners set program records for both strikeouts and strikeouts per seven innings.



## MELISSA LOMBARDI - CONT.

Lombardi's battery of Ricketts and Shults each earned All-American honors in 2011, with Ricketts striking out a then-school-record 452, including a OU single-game record 19 against Iona. Lombardi guided Ricketts to second team All-America honors as a freshman in 2010, while senior catcher Lindsey Vandever earned Big-12 Defensive Player of the year honors. With a pitching staff of two sophomores and two freshmen, Lombardi aided OU in producing a 1.39 ERA, a mark that was No. 2 in the nation.

Catcher Heather Scaglione earned two straight All-America first team honors in 2004 and 2005 under Lombardi's tutelage. The only two-time first team All-American in school history was also named the Big 12's Defensive Player of the Year in those same years. Scaglione remains the only player in Big 12 history to receive the honor twice.

During Oklahoma's 2000 national championship run, Lombardi's staff registered a 1.44 ERA to rank second in the Big-12 and 25th in the nation. The staff posted 24 shutouts and 301 strikeouts.

In her first year on the coaching staff as a student assistant in 1997, the OU pitching staff produced one of the lowest earned run averages in school history and in the country.

The Glendale, Ariz., native ended her two-year Sooner playing career with a spectacular senior season in 1996, when she hit .345 to lead OU during its Big 12 Conference championship run.

She was also instrumental in helping Jill Most and Jennifer Jaime record two of the best pitching seasons in school history. Lombardi caught all three of

Most's wins in OU's conference tournament games and was named to the all-tournament team after going 3-for-8 (.375) at the plate with a triple, four RBIs, two runs scored and a stolen base.

Lombardi graduated from Oklahoma in 1997 with a degree in health and sports science. She and her husband, John, were married on Nov. 10, 2000. The couple has one son, Gianni.

## 2018 RECAP NOTES

### BACK ON TOP - OREGON RECLAIMS PAC-12 TITLE

After narrowly missing out on a fifth straight conference title in 2017, the Ducks returned to Pac-12 supremacy in 2018 with their fifth conference championship in the last six years. Oregon went 21-3 in Pac-12 play, finishing a game ahead of UCLA for the conference title. The Ducks did not lose a Pac-12 series all season, sweeping Washington, Arizona, California, Utah and Stanford while taking two out of three from UCLA, Arizona State and Oregon State. Oregon swept Cal on the road to finish the regular season and secure the outright conference championship.

### DUCKS MAKE SIXTH NCAA WCWS APPEARANCE

The Ducks qualified for the NCAA Women's College World Series for the sixth time in program history in 2018, going to Oklahoma City as the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. Oregon got its WCWS stint off to a great start with an 11-6 win over Pac-12 rival and No. 8 seed Arizona State, racking up 14 total hits and two home runs, including a two-run bomb by **Haley Cruse**. But the bats fell quiet the next day in a 6-2 loss to No. 5 Washington, and the Ducks were again unable to break through against No. 6 seed and eventual national champion Florida State in a 4-1 loss that brought their WCWS run to an end.

### THRILLING COMEBACK BOOKS WCWS TICKET

Hosting Kentucky in the NCAA super regionals for the second straight year, the Ducks bounced back from a game-one loss to the No. 16 seed Wildcats to win the next two games and book their ticket to Oklahoma City. After a 9-6 loss to open the supers, Oregon rebounded to win game two, 6-1, and force a winner-take-all game three. The Ducks erupted for a seven-run second inning, highlighted by a DJ Sanders grand slam, to take early control in game three before cruising to an 11-1 run-rule victory and earning their spot in the WCWS. Oregon has qualified for the super regionals in each of the last nine seasons, and the Ducks have hosted the second weekend of NCAA play six straight years.

### ANOTHER YEAR, ANOTHER REGIONAL SWEEP

Oregon continued its recent dominance in the NCAA regionals in 2018, sweeping its way through the opening round of NCAA play for the ninth straight year. Playing as the No. 1 overall seed for the second time ever (2014), the Ducks opened postseason play with a 4-0 win over Albany before blanking Drake the next day, 5-0. Looking to avoid a win-or-go-home game, the Ducks once again shut out Drake, 3-0, to book their spot in the super regionals. Oregon has won 27 straight regional games, outscoring opponents 156-29, and is 52-21 all-time in the regional round.

### PACKED FOR POSTSEASON

The Ducks welcomed over 15,000 fans to Jane Sanders Stadium for six NCAA postseason games in 2018. The Jane was packed with a sellout crowd of 2,522 for all three days of regionals and all three super regional games vs. Kentucky.

### #BACKTHEPAC

The Pac-12, which sent seven of its nine teams to the NCAA Tournament in 2018, made up half of the eight-team field in Oklahoma City as Oregon, UCLA,

Washington and Arizona State all reached the WCWS. The Pac-12 has now had five or more teams reach the postseason in 23 straight seasons, and 2018 marked the fifth time in seven years that seven teams from the Conference of Champions qualified for the postseason.

### DUCKS ALL OVER 2018 ALL-PAC-12 TEAMS

Led by four all-Pac-12 first-team selections, including senior standouts Jenna Lilley and Gwen Svekis, the Ducks landed a total of nine student-athletes on the first, second or third all-conference squads to tie for the most in program history (2016). Haley Cruse (3rd) will be the returning all-Pac-12 selection for Oregon in 2019, and she was also a second-team all-academic honoree. UO's eight NFCA all-Pacific Region selections also tied for the most in program history (2015, 16).

### DOMINANCE IN THE CIRCLE

The Ducks enjoyed a dominant year in the circle in 2018, leading the nation in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.56) while ranking second in total strikeouts (537) and fifth in team ERA (1.38). The Ducks' 537 shattered the previous program record (470, 2010), and they finished with 24 shutouts for the second year in a row to tie for second in program history.

### POTENT OFFENSE

Fueled by 2019 returnee Haley Cruse (.377 BA), the Ducks boasted one of the nation's most efficient offenses in 2018 with a .322 team batting average, good for No. 7 in the NCAA. Oregon used a great combination of power and efficiency, ranking fifth nationally in slugging percentage (.524) and 14th in on-base percentage (.401).

### DIGGING THE LONG BALL

Led by 17 home runs by first-team all-American Gwen Svekis and 16 from shortstop DJ Sanders, the Ducks racked up 78 total long balls in 2018 to lead the Pac-12 and rank fourth in UO single-season history. Svekis tied for second in UO single-season history with her career-high 17 bombs, while Sanders' 16 dingers tied for fourth.

### GOLDEN GLOVED DUCKS

Oregon put together one of the best defensive seasons in program history in 2018, ranking 20th in the nation and second in UO single-season history with a .973 team fielding percentage. The Ducks committed only 47 errors with 1,251 total putouts and 470 assists, led by Pac-12 all-defense selections Jenna Lilley and Lauren Lindvall.

### NPF DRAFT

The Ducks had three players selected in the 2019 National Pro Fastpitch Draft, led by catcher Gwen Svekis. Svekis was taken No. 3 overall by Chicago, becoming the highest NPF pick in program history. Shortstop DJ Sanders also went to Chicago at No. 21 overall, and third baseman Jenna Lilley was taken by Cleveland with the No. 22 pick. Lilley was then traded from Cleveland to Chicago and will join her former teammates Svekis and Sanders on the Bandits for the 2019 season. The Ducks have had 15 players taken all-time in the NPF Draft, with 12 coming since 2010.
