## THE SIX EVENTS

The No. 2 Oregon acrobatics and tumbling team returns home for its last home meet of the season after a two-week hiatus in a rematch against No. 3 Azusa Pacific inside Matthew Knight Arena on Saturday, March 30, at 5:00 p.m. For updates throughout the meet, fans can follow @OregonAcroTumb on Twitter and watch the live stream on GoDucks.com.

**Compulsory** - The Ducks have a seven-straight win streak and overall record of 15-1 over the Cougars. Oregon defeated Azusa Pacific by just over one point, 280.900-279.875, on the road in its last meet on March 12. The Ducks' team score of 280.900 marked a season-best.

**Acro** - Senior **Casi Jackson** received NCATA Athlete of the Week honors for the second time in her career following UO's win at Azusa Pacific. Jackson competed in 11 heats and the team event and led the Ducks to nine scores of 9.50 or higher. Her performance was highlighted by a score of 9.80 in the aerial pass of the tumbling event. She also helped the Ducks to a 9.90 in the compulsory toss, scores of 9.85 in the compulsory and six-element pyramids and a 9.80 in the five-element acro heat.

**Pyramid** - Two others Ducks have earned NCATA Athlete of the Week honors this season. Sophomore **Addie Lacewell** was named the NCATA Athlete of the Week for the first time in her career on Feb. 21 after her performance in Oregon's win over then-No. 3 Quinnipiac. Lacewell competed in five of the six events and in 10 different heats at Quinnipiac, helping the Ducks to their first perfect-10 of the season in the compulsory toss. Sophomore **Yeelena Faustino** also earned her first career NCATA Athlete of the Week honors on March 1 after leading the Ducks to a 277.755-247.745 victory over Arizona Christian. Faustino helped Oregon to a trio of perfect-10's in the compulsory pyramid, compulsory toss and five-element acro heats.

**Toss** - Oregon remained at No. 2 in the latest NCATA ranking on March 27, after initially being ranked No. 2 in the preseason poll. The Ducks are 4-1 so far this season with a scoring average of 275.959. UO has faced four other ranked opponents in 2019, defeating No. 3 Azusa Pacific, No. 4 Quinnipiac and No. 7 Hawaii Pacific and falling only to No. 1 Baylor.

**Tumbling** - The Ducks put up two season-high scores in the tumbling and team events at Azusa Pacific on March 12. Oregon earned a tumbling score of 56.950 after putting up four season-best heat scores in the duo pass, quad pass, aerial pass and open pass. Senior **Hannah Blair** registered the highest score of the event with a 9.90 in the open pass. The Ducks went on to earn a 98.40 in the team event, improving from their previous season-best of 95.43.

**Team** - Oregon will honor its seven seniors during Saturday's meet against Azusa Pacific. **TJ McCourt**, **Megan Barney**, **Hannah Blair**, **Casi Jackson**, **Samantha Little**, **Caroline Matos** and **Tia Thomas** will be performing in their final meet at MKA.

## KEY STORYLINES

### TEAMMATE TO COACH

Taylor Galvin transitioned from teammate to coach this season. Galvin was named Oregon's new assistant coach on July 31, 2018, after graduating from Oregon in June 2018. She helped the Ducks to reach the NCATA Championships three times, while compiling a 31-13 career record over that span. Galvin was a three-time All-American (2016-18), two-time open tumbling champion and two-time 6-element tumbling pass national champion (2016 & 2017). She captured her second open tumbling national title in 2018 behind a perfect score of 10.00. As a senior, Galvin was twice named the NCATA Player of the Week.

### POLL POSITION

The Ducks are ranked second in the latest NCATA National Championship Team Rankings. The rankings, released on March 27, show where the teams stand in terms of postseason seeding heading into the final week of competition. Final rankings and NCATA tournament seeding will be released on Monday, April 15.

### NCATA National Championship

The NCATA National Championship will be held at Baylor University in Waco, Texas, from April 25-27. Tickets are currently on sale on [thencata.org](http://thencata.org).

### SCOUTING REPORT

The No. 3 Azusa Pacific Cougars hold a record of 4-1 this season, losing only to No. 2 Oregon on March 12. The Cougars defeated Arizona Christian twice in February, and outscored ranked opponents No. 7 Hawaii Pacific and No. 10 King in March. Azusa Pacific is led by head coach Colleen Kausrud, who is her eighth year as APU's head coach.

### STORIED HISTORY

Since the NCATA's inception in 2010, the Ducks have won four of eight NCATA National Championships. In that eight-year span, UO tallied a 70-15 meet record, including a total of 46 individual event titles.

## COACHING ROSTER

Keenyn Won is in her second year as head coach of the Oregon Acrobatics & Tumbling Team.

Won led the Ducks to a 5-4 overall record during her first season as head coach. Oregon finished the 2018 season at the NCATA semifinals, where they fell to No. 1 Baylor, 281.410-277.725. However, the Ducks went on to win six titles in the NCATA Event Finals. Won helped Taylor Galvin and Casi Jackson to earn All-American honors.

Won returns to Oregon after starting the varsity program at Hawaii Pacific University, where she served as head coach since 2014.

During her tenure at HPU, Won compiled an overall mark of 17-14 in four seasons at the helm. She was named the NCATA Coach of the Year in 2014 leading Hawai'i Pacific to back-to-back NCATA semifinal trips in 2015 and 2016. This past spring the Sharks matched a program best with six wins (6-2-0).

At Hawai'i Pacific, Won guided eight student-athletes to All-American honors and coached the 2016 NCATA Most Valuable Player and 2017 NCATA Newcomer of the Year.

In 2015, Won notched the then second-year program's biggest win to date defeating the Ducks 282.050 - 280.295.

As a player, Won helped launch Oregon's acrobatic and tumbling program in 2010. Won was part of the Ducks' first two NCATA National Championship teams in 2011 and 2012. All told, she won five individual NCATA national titles during her three seasons at Oregon.

Won graduated from UO in 2012 with a bachelor's degree in sociology. After graduating, she moved to Los Angeles to work at the Staples corporate office before taking the position at HPU.

Originally from Honolulu, Hawaii, Won excelled as a competitive cheerleader before committing to Oregon. She was a four-time Hawaii High School Athletics Association (HHSAA) All-State First Teamer while attending Kamehameha-Kapalama High School.

Her senior year she was the HHSAA Cheerleader of the Year, winning the Universal Cheerleaders Association (UCA) national championship in 2007 and 2008. Won went on to become an instructor for two years for UCA.

Oregon acrobatics and tumbling head coach Keenyn Won announced the addition of recent graduate and three-time NCATA All-American Taylor Galvin to her staff on July 31, 2018.

Galvin will serve as an assistant coach at her alma mater where she helped Oregon reach the NCATA Championship Meet three times while the Ducks compiled a 31-13 record over that span.

The Lake Forest, Calif. native was a two-time open tumbling national champion and two-time 6-element tumbling pass national champion (2016 & 2017). Galvin captured her second open tumbling national title in 2018 behind a perfect score of 10.00. As a senior, Galvin was twice named the NCATA Player of the Week.

# NCATA MEET FORMAT

## FORMAT

An acrobatics and tumbling meet is made up of 6 events: compulsory, acro, pyramid, toss, tumbling and team events. All event competition is in team rotation throughout each event. The rotation order is determined by the home institution prior to the meet's start. The typical meet lasts about 1.5 hours.

## SCORING

Scoring is based upon pre-determined difficulty start values. Each skill performed is valued by the officials of the NCATA prior to the meet. Teams submit their skills one week prior to the meet. Officials perform two primary functions at the meet:

1. Monitor the skills being performed to ensure the element is correctly performed to equate to the posted start difficulty value;
- and 2. Evaluate the execution and technique of the skills performed. Scores are posted immediately following the conclusion of the performance, and overall standings are displayed throughout the meet. Highest combined score after all six events wins the meet. The maximum score of each meet is 300 points.

### EVENT 1: Compulsory (40 possible points)

Four heats construct the Compulsory Event: acro, pyramid, toss and tumbling.

During each heat, teams perform the exact same skills, allowing officials to compare technique and execution of each team. No athlete crossover rules apply from the compulsories to other events.

Acro Heat (10 possible points): one preset sequence performed by two groups from each team:

- Straight up heel stretch
- Power press (hold stretch on the way down, top changes positions on way up)
- Arabesque
- 270 degree front flip
- 360 degree back salto to below shoulder level.
- Heel stretch
- 720 degree twist dismount.

Pyramid Heat (10 possible points): one preset pyramid performed by one group from each team.

- All feet start on the floor
- 4-2-1. Two shoulder level acros as 2nd level support (2 bases, back, top) built before toss up.

- Toss from back (3 bases tossing, 1 top)
- 3 catchers in front
- 270 degree front flip layout dismount
- Second level dismounts at the same time as the top, to below shoulder level, then floor.

Toss Heat (10 possible points): preset toss performed by two groups from each team.

- 450 degree back salto to tuck position
- 4 bases tossing, 1 top

Tumbling Heat (10 possible points): four synchronized preset skills performed by eight athletes from each team

- Standing back tuck salto;
- Toe-touch back tuck salto;
- Standing back handspring back tuck salto;
- Round-off back handspring back salto layout from left to right

### EVENT 2: Acro Event (30 possible points)

Three heats construct the Acro Event where each team sends a maximum of four athletes to compete a 45 acro

sequence to counts. Athletes may compete in two heats, with no more than two athletes crossing over from one heat to another. Timing begins with the first movement, and exceeding the 45 seconds will result in a time deduction. In each heat, teams must attempt all required number of elements in addition to the required skill. The required skill counts as an element.

- Heat 1: Required 360 degree flipping skill, 5 elements (10 points)
- Heat 2: Required two 90 degree twisting skills, 6 elements (10 points)
- Heat 3: Required 5 release skills, 7 elements (10 points)

### EVENT 3: Pyramid Event (30 possible points)

Three heats construct the Pyramid Event. In each heat, perform one 2.5 high structure, each of which include entry, 2.5 high structure and a dismount. Officials will score each pyramid separately. Separate pyramid scores and totals will be displayed. A maximum of 24 athletes may participate.

- Heat 1: Required flip skill greater than 90 degrees
- Heat 2: Required twisting skill greater than 90 degrees.
- Heat 3: Required release skill

### HALFTIME (15 minutes)

### EVENT 4: Toss Event (30 points)

Three heats construct the Toss Event, each with required elements. A maximum of four athletes may toss. A basing group member (two bases and a back) or a top person may only compete in two heats, of which one must be synchronized toss. Athletes may crossover and compete in two heats, one of which must be synchronized toss.

- Heat 1: 360 degree salto (10 points)
- Heat 2: Two synchronized tosses (10 points)
- Heat 3: Open skill - no requirements (10 points)

### EVENT 5: Tumbling Event (60 possible points)

Six heats construct the Tumbling Event. Athletes may compete in both the synchronized portion and in one single pass, but they can only tumble a maximum of two times.

- Duo - execute synchronized identical tumbling pass (10 points)
- Trio - execute synchronized identical tumbling pass (10 points)
- Quad - execute synchronized identical tumbling pass (10 points)
- Aerial - single pass; one salto before final salto in pass (10 points)
- 6 element singles pass: 6 elements only (10 points)
- Open single pass; no requirements (10 points)

### EVENT 6: Team Event (110 possible points)

One heat constructs the Team Event. Athletes perform synchronized choreographed skills in a 2 minute 30 second routine set to music. Routine has a minimum of 18

athletes, and a maximum of 24 athletes. Routine contains required skills and optional skills. The required skills include:

- 30 acro elements (20 points)
- 5 tosses (20 points)
- 4 pyramids (2.5 high) (20 points)
- One jump/standing tumbling pass per person (20 points).
- One running tumbling pass per person (20 points)
- Additional scored categories:
  - Routine construction (5 points)
  - Dance/Composition/Artistry - 50 percent of the team must perform two eight-counts (5 points)
