## 2018-19 DUCK MEN'S BASKETBALL

OREGON (25-13, 10-8 PAC-12 (t-4th))

### THE STARTING 5

In 2018-19, Oregon advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the third time in the last four seasons and won the Pac-12 Tournament for the third time under coach **Dana Altman**.

- 1 – Oregon has now won at least one game in its last six NCAA Tournament appearances. This was Oregon's sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in the last seven years, and overall it was the Ducks' ninth straight postseason appearance.
- 2 – The Ducks' last six NCAA Tournament losses have all come to teams that made the Final Four, and half of those six losses have come to teams that have won the national title: Louisville (2013); North Carolina (2017) and Virginia (2019).
- 3 – **Dana Altman** finished the season tied with **Ernie Kent** as the winningest coach in Oregon history. Altman and Kent (1997-10) both own 235 wins on the Oregon bench. The Ducks are averaging 26.1 wins per season during Altman's tenure.
- 4 – A turnaround for the ages. On Feb. 23, Oregon was 15-12 (10th place in the Pac-12 at 6-8). What followed was a remarkable streak of 10 wins in a row - four to end the regular season and six consecutive win-or-go-home games (four in the Pac-12 Tournament; two in the NCAA Tournament), before a four-point loss to eventual NCAA champion Virginia.
- 5 – After allowing UCLA to score 62 points *in the second half* of their last regular season loss on Feb. 23, the Ducks held 10 of their last 11 opponents to less than 62 points *for the entire game*. On the season, Oregon ranked 12th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 62.2 points per game, and fifth in three-point field goal percentage defense (.290).

### 5 OFF THE BENCH

- 1 – During the 10-game winning streak, the Ducks outscored their opponents by nearly 18 points per game (72.1 to 54.2). Opponents shot just 34.9 percent from the field and 23.0 percent from three during that span.
- 2 – While Oregon's defensive surge was directly linked with the switch to the "big" starting lineup (four players standing 6-9), the play of Pac-12 Tournament MOP **Payton Pritchard** shouldn't be overlooked. During the 10-game winning streak, he averaged 16.3 points per game with 54 assists, 25 steals and just 19 turnovers.
- 3 – **Payton Pritchard**, who played more minutes in 2018-19 than anyone else in Division I (1,349), has compiled some career numbers that rank among the best ever at Oregon. He's just the third player in program history with 1,000 career points, 400 career rebounds and 400 career assists. UO Hall of Famers **Ron Lee** and **Luke Jackson** are the other two. He will enter his senior season ranked second all-time in steals (164) and fourth all-time in assists (487), with the career marks in both those categories (213 and 614, respectively, both held by **Kenya Wilkins**) well within his reach.
- 4 – **Kenny Wooten** will enter his junior season within shouting distance of the UO career blocks record of 235 (**Jordan Bell**). Wooten is third all-time with 166 blocks through his first two seasons at Oregon.
- 5 – Oregon earned its ninth consecutive 20-win season in 2018-19. The Ducks are one of only 12 schools nationally that have won 20 games in a row for at least nine consecutive seasons. This is also Oregon's ninth straight winning season, something that hasn't happened in Eugene in 87 years. The Ducks established program records for wins over a nine-year period (235), an eight-year period (214) and a seven-year period (190).
- 5 – **Dana Altman** is now one of six active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for the last 22 consecutive seasons (the other five - Roy Williams, Jim Boeheim, Tom Izzo, Bill Self and Mike Krzyzewski - are all in the Hall of Fame).

## ALTMAN TIES KENT ATOP OREGON'S WINS LIST

**Dana Altman** needs one more win to become the school's all-time winningest coach. With 25 wins in 2018-19, Altman tied **Ernie Kent**, who won 235 games in 13 seasons (1998-2010) with the Ducks. With Oregon's 80-65 defeat of No. 15 Syracuse on Nov. 16, Altman passed Basketball Hall of Famer **Howard Hobson** for second in UO coaching victories. Hobson, the head coach at Oregon for 11 years (1936-47) including the 1939 NCAA Championship, won 212 career games with the Ducks.

## OREGON ANNOUNCES CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR ALTMAN

University of Oregon Director of Athletics Rob Mullens announced that the UO has agreed to terms and is finalizing a contract extension with head men's basketball coach **Dana Altman**, pending Board of Trustees approval. The agreement runs through the 2025-26 season and is intended to be funded through philanthropy.

## DUCKS EARN NINTH STRAIGHT 20-WIN SEASON

Oregon earned its ninth consecutive 20-win season in 2018-19. The Ducks are one of only 12 schools nationally that have won 20 games in a row for at least nine consecutive seasons.

## OREGON SECURES NINTH STRAIGHT WINNING SEASON

This was Oregon's ninth straight winning season, something that hadn't happened in Eugene in 87 years. The only other time Oregon has had nine or more winning seasons in a row was the decade between 1923-32, when the program posted 10 consecutive winning seasons under coaches **William Reinhart** and **George Bohler**.

## OREGON SETS SEVEN- EIGHT- AND NINE-YEAR WIN RECORDS

Oregon established program records for wins over a nine-year period (235), an eight-year period (214) and a seven-year period (190).

## DUCKS REACH 100 WINS AGAIN

The Jan. 31 win at Utah was Oregon's 100th victory over the last four seasons. It marked the fifth time in a row that Oregon has won 100 games over a four-season span, all of which have come during the **Dana Altman** era. Those are also the only five times in program history that Oregon has won 100 games over a four-season time span.

## ALTMAN ENTERS NCAA CAREER TOP 30

With Oregon's win against California on Feb. 6, **Dana Altman** entered the NCAA's top 30 in all-time Division I coaching victories. He is currently 29th with 645 career wins at the Division I level after passing Hugh Durham (Florida State, Georgia, Jacksonville) and Norm Sloan (Presbyterian, The Citadel, Florida, N.C. State), who both have 634. The next coach Altman will pass is John Wooden, who had 664 career wins for Indiana State and UCLA.

## ALTMAN BECOMES PAC-12 TOURNAMENT'S WINNINGEST COACH

With four wins in the 2019 Pac-12 Tournament, **Dana Altman** became the winningest coach in Tournament history. He finished 2019 with 19 career Pac-12 Tournament wins. This year he passed Sean Miller, Arizona (17), and Lute Olson, Arizona (16), for the all-time lead.

## YOUNG FRESH FELLOWS

Of Oregon's 12-player roster, 75 percent (9) were either freshmen or sophomores. Duck freshmen logged a total of 2,929 minutes (77.1 minutes per game) in 2018-19.

## PRITCHARD, KING, WOOTEN, EARN PAC-12 HONORS

**Payton Pritchard**, **Louis King** and **Kenny Wooten** were selected for Pac-12 honors. Pritchard, from West Linn, Ore., was named the Pac-12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player. King, from Jersey City, N.J., was named to the all-freshman team, the all-tournament team and was also an all-league honorable mention selection. Wooten, a sophomore from Manteca, Calif., was named to the all-defensive team for the second year in a row. King is the Ducks' fourth all-freshman team selection in the last five years, joining **Jordan Bell** and **Dillon Brooks** in 2015, and **Tyler Dorsey** in 2016.

## THE TWELVE SEED

Oregon became the first school to advance to the Sweet 16 as a #12 seed twice, and **Dana Altman** became the first coach to take two #12 seeds to the Sweet 16. The #12 seed matched Oregon's lowest seed in the NCAA Tournament (2013). Oregon is now 4-2 all-time as the #12 seed.

## NOTES

### THE 10-GAME WINNING STREAK

Oregon's 10 game-winning was the program's longest since winning 17 in a row during the 2016-17 season. Some quick facts about the streak.

- Oregon outscored opponents by nearly 18 points per game.
- Just two opponents scored over 54 points while three were held in the 40s.
- The Ducks held 8 opponents under 30 points in the first half.
- UO led or was tied in 335 of the possible 405 minutes during the win streak.
- UO led for 30 or more minutes in six of 10 games.
- UO led by at least 10 points in nine of 10 games and held of 20+ point leads in five games.
- The Ducks out-scored opponents 179-80 (+9.9 per game) in points off turnovers and 312-206 (+10.6 per game) in points in the paint.
- Only two teams shot 40 percent or better from the field.
- Opponents shot 23 percent (53-230) from three.
- Two teams had more turnovers than made field goals.
- UO won the turnover battle seven times.
- Payton Prichard had a positive plus/minus of at least +10 in eight games.
- Four different players had a combined plus/minus of at least +100.

### NCAA THREE DOT NOTES

Oregon was the only school in the nation with both its men's and women's programs in the Sweet 16 ... This was just the fourth time that both the UO men and women have played in the NCAA Tournament in the same year (1995, 2000, 2017) ... **Kenny Wooten's** seven blocks versus UC Irvine were the second-most in UO NCAA history, trailing only **Jordan Bell's** eight against Kansas in 2017 ... Oregon defeated Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in three tries ... **Payton Pritchard's** eight assists against the Badgers were one shy of the UO NCAA record of nine by **Kenya Wilkins** versus Texas in 1995.

### PRITCHARD LEADS NCAA IN MINUTES PLAYED

Junior guard **Payton Pritchard** played in 1,349 minutes in 2018-19 to lead Division I in minutes played. He edged Virginia's Kyle Guy (1,344) by five minutes.

### PRITCHARD REACHES 1,000 CAREER POINTS, ENTERS TOP 20

Jan. 17 at Arizona, **Payton Pritchard** became the 37th 1,000-point scorer in program history. In the NCAA Sweet Sixteen against Virginia, he passed **Charlie Warren** (1,301/1959-62) for 19th and ended the season with 1,303 career points. Pritchard posted back-to-back 20-point games for the first time in his career Feb. 6-10 versus California and Stanford. March 16 against Washington, Pritchard passed **Jamal Lawrence** (194/1994-97) for seventh in UO career three-pointers and now has 200.

### PRITCHARD PASSES BROOKS TO REACH TOP FOUR IN CAREER ASSISTS

**Payton Pritchard** passed **Aaron Brooks** (471/2003-07) for fourth in UO career assists during the Ducks' NCAA First Round game against Wisconsin. Pritchard finished the season with 487 career assists. **Luke Ridnour** (500/2000-03) is third. Pritchard also finished fourth in UO single-season assists list with 175.

### PRITCHARD SOARS UP CAREER STEALS LIST

With 25 steals in the last 11 games of the year, junior guard **Payton Pritchard** leapt from ninth to second on UO's career steals list. March 16 against Washington he passed **Luke Jackson** (160/2000-04) for the No. 2 spot. He finished the year with 164 career steals, trailing only school record holder **Kenya Wilkins** (213/1993-97). On the single-season steals list, Pritchard's 68 ranked third.

### PRITCHARD MAKES 100TH CONSECUTIVE START

Junior guard **Payton Pritchard** made his 100th consecutive start for the Ducks March 2 against Arizona. Pritchard came off the bench his first four games as a freshman before moving into the starting lineup for the last 109.

### PRITCHARD WITHIN STRIKING DISTANCE OF UO CAREER RECORDS

**Payton Pritchard** will come into his senior season with a chance to break a number of school career records, including steals, assists, wins and games played. He finished 2018-19 with 164 steals and 487 assists. **Kenya Wilkins** (1993-97) currently holds the records in both categories (213 steals, 614 assists) and both are well within Pritchard's reach. During the NCAA Tournament, Pritchard became the ninth member of Oregon's 80-win club (players who have played in at least 80 victories as a Duck) and currently sits at 81 (tied for sixth). The career leader in wins is **Johnathan Loyd**, who won 97 games as a Duck between 2010-14. Prichard has also played 113 games in three seasons at Oregon. Loyd is the Ducks' all-time leader in games played with 144.

## KING LOUIE BREAKS OUT

Freshman **Louis King** opened Pac-12 play with back-to-back double-doubles and scored in double figures 25 of his last 27 games. In conference games, King was the No. 2 freshman scorer (14.5 points per game). He had 17 points and 10 rebounds Jan. 5 against Oregon State, and followed that with 22 points and 10 rebounds Jan. 10 versus UCLA. Jan. 13 against USC, King had 19 points and a season-best six assists. He just missed his third double-double of the season Jan. 17 at Arizona when he had 10 points and nine rebounds. He led Oregon with 19 points Jan. 24 against Washington before matching his career high with 22 points Jan. 27 versus Washington State. King had his third 20-point game Feb. 16 at Oregon State. He led the Ducks Feb. 28 with 19 points against Arizona State and again March 1 versus Arizona with 14 points. He had four double figure games in four days at the Pac-12 Tournament - 12 versus Washington State, 20 against Utah, 18 versus Arizona State and 15 versus Washington. He dropped in 17 points against Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament, added 18 points versus UC Irvine in the second round and 16 against Virginia in the Sweet Sixteen. King made his Oregon debut Dec. 8 against Omaha and made efficient use of his minutes. He scored 11 points on four-of-six shooting from the field (three-of-four 3FG) in 16 minutes. He missed the first seven games of the season recovering from a knee injury he suffered in high school.

## WHITE FILLS IN ON FRONT LINE

With **Bol Bol** out for the season, **Paul White** stepped up his effort, including a career-high 21 points March 6 at Washington State. He scored in double figures 18 times after Bol's injury and averaged a career-best 10.6 points per game. He tallied back-to-back-to-back of then-season highs of 15 points versus Oregon State (Jan. 5), 16 points against UCLA (Jan. 10) and 19 points versus USC (Jan. 13). He scored a team-high 16 points in the Ducks' Jan. 17 59-54 win at Arizona and added 18 points Jan. 27 versus Washington State, as well as 18 points (four three-pointers) Feb. 23 at UCLA. He added 14 points - all in the second half - against Wisconsin in the NCAA Tournament.

## 500th BOARD MEANS EXCLUSIVE CLUB FOR AMIN

Reaching the 500-rebound plateau Jan. 17 at Arizona, **Ehab Amin** was one of only five active college players with 1,000 career points, 500 career rebounds, 200 career assists and 200 career steals during the 2018-19 season. The others were Josh Reaves of Penn State, Chris Clemons of Campbell, Purdue-Fort Wayne's John Konchar and Cortez Edwards of Southern Miss. Amin, who led the NCAA in steals as a junior at Texas A&M Corpus Christi in 2016-17, ranked eighth in the Pac-12 at 1.5 steals per game. Amin showed a burst of offense at times as well. He scored 25 points Nov. 15 against Iowa, 23 points Dec. 29 at Boise State and added 13 Jan. 31 at Utah. He had one of his best all-around games March 24 against UC Irvine in the NCAA Tournament with 12 points (4-of-4 3-pointers), six rebounds and three steals. Amin's 55 steals were tied for 10th on the UO single-season list.

## WOOTEN MOVES INTO TOP THREE IN UO CAREER BLOCKS

**Kenny Wooten** swatted 11 shots during the Feb. 6-10 week against California (4) and Stanford (7). He matched his career high with seven against the Cardinal. With three blocks Jan. 31 at Utah, Wooten passed **Blair Rasmussen** (116/1981-85) for third on the UO career blocks list and now shows 166. His 10 blocks during the Pac-12 Tournament set an all-session record. His seven blocks versus UC Irvine in the NCAA Tournament were one off the UO NCAA single-game mark. On the season, Wooten had 74 blocks, which was sixth in UO single-season history. Wooten matched a career high with 20 points Jan. 27 against Washington State. Prior to breaking his jaw at Baylor, which caused him to miss the next four games, Wooten set a career-high 20 points Dec. 8 versus Nebraska-Omaha. Wooten's 92 blocks as a freshman ranked third on both the UO single-season list, and the Pac-12 freshman list.

## RICHARDSON RISES

Freshman **Will Richardson** scored in double figures off the bench in back-to-back games when he netted 12 points March 2 against Arizona and 11 March 6 at Washington State. He set a season high with 19 points Jan. 31 at Utah. He also blocked a career-best three shots in that game. He dished out a season-high nine assists Feb. 6 versus California. Earlier in the season, Richardson had 16 points at Houston, and 11 points and a season-high six assists Jan. 10 versus UCLA. On the year, Richardson averaged 2.5 assists per game.

With Oregon's victory over Arizona on March 2, **Dana Altman** earned his 22nd consecutive winning season as a head coach. Altman is one of six active head coaches in NCAA Division I who have posted a winning record for the last 22 consecutive seasons (the other five are in the Hall of Fame). For Altman, that streak runs from the 1997-98 season through 2018-19, and covers his final 13 seasons at Creighton and his first nine in Eugene.

## NOTES

### CONSISTENT COACHING STAFF

Success on the court often goes hand-in-hand with continuity off the court. During the nine-year **Dana Altman** era, Oregon has seen just one change on its coaching staff. That came following the 2013-14 season, when assistant coach **Brian Fish** accepted the head coaching job at Montana State, and was replaced by current assistant **Michael Mennenga**. Oregon's two other assistants, **Kevin McKenna** and **Tony Stubblefield**, have been with Altman at Oregon since day one. The Ducks' continuity extends even beyond the assistant coaches with director of operations **Josh Jamieson** in his 15th year and athletic trainer **Clay Jamieson** in his 21st season in Eugene.

### HEY MAN, NICE SHOT

Oregon has made at least one three-point field goal in 749 consecutive games. The Ducks' last game without a three-pointer was Feb. 6, 1997, versus Washington. The Ducks last held an opponent without a three-pointer in 2015-16 when Cal went 0-for-12 from three-point range on Jan. 6, 2016.

### STARTING ROTATION

Dec. 29 at Boise State, **Francis Okoro** became the 10th different Duck to start a game in 2018-19. That's a single-season high during the **Dana Altman** era, and the most for the Ducks since 2009-10, when 11 different Ducks made at least one start.

### DUCKS IN THE DESERT

No one has won more Pac-12 Tournament games in Las Vegas than Oregon. The Ducks are 17-4 since the league moved the championship to the desert in 2013. In the seven tournaments in Las Vegas, the Ducks have played in five championship games (winning in 2013, 2016 and 2019) and have advanced to the semifinal round six times. The only year the Ducks departed Vegas prior to the semis was in 2014 after a quarterfinal loss to UCLA.

### PAC-12 TOURNAMENT STAYING POWER

Since the conference tournament returned in 2002, Oregon has won at least one game in 14 of 17 appearances and went on to take the conference crown five times (2003, 2007, 2013, 2016, 2019). The Ducks are 30-12 (.714) in 17 appearances since 2002. Oregon's only first round exits during that span came in 2008, 2009 and 2012. Including the conference tournaments from 1987-90, Oregon's overall .667 winning percentage (32-16) is third-best in the conference, while the Ducks' five titles trail only Arizona's seven.

### PRITCHARD, KING SHINE IN PAC-12 TOURNAMENT

**Payton Pritchard's** sublime performance in the Pac-12 Tournament earned him Most Outstanding Player honors. He had 20 points in the quarterfinal against Utah, 18 in the semifinal versus Arizona State and 20 in the championship against Washington. For the Tournament, he had 22 assists, four turnovers and eight steals. **Lou King** was also an all-tournament selection after scoring in double figures in all four games. He had 12 points against Washington State, 20 versus the Utes, 19 against the Sun Devils and 15 versus the Huskies.

### OREGON'S HISTORIC DEFENSIVE STRETCH BEST OF THE SHOT CLOCK ERA

Oregon's defense over the last four weeks of the season was historically remarkable. For the first time in the shot clock era (1985-86 to present), the Ducks held six consecutive opponents to less than 62 points - Arizona State (51), Arizona (47), Washington State (61), Washington (47), WSU (51) and Utah (54). The last time Oregon did that was early in the 1982-83 season: Rutgers (53), San Diego State (49), St. Olaf (39), Montana State (55), Idaho (56) and Lamar (41).

### PAC-12 TOURNAMENT THREE DOT NOTES

Oregon set combined Pac-12 Tournament records for most points (297), most field goals (107), most steals (36) and most blocks (23) ... **Kenny Wooten** set the individual record for most combined blocks in a Pac-12 Tournament with 10 ... Oregon held Washington to 48 points, the lowest total in Pac-12 Championship game history ... In four tournament games, the Ducks allowed just 57.0 points per contest ... Oregon became the second team to win the Pac-12 Tournament by winning four games, joining Colorado in 2012 ... Oregon became the third No. 6 seed to win the Pac-12 Tournament, joining Colorado in 2012 and USC in 2009. The No. 6 seed is now 3-0 in title game appearances ... Three of Washington's four lowest-scoring games in 2018-19 came against Oregon ... **Francis Okoro** tied the Pac-12 Tournament record with six blocked shots against Utah, matching Stanford's Josh Huestis (2013) and Washington's Malik Dime (2017) ... Oregon's 33-point victory over Washington State was the largest margin of victory in Pac-12 Tournament history. It broke the previous record of 32 when Arizona beat Utah, 71-39, on March 13, 2014, and UCLA beat Oregon State, 79-47, on March 9, 2006 ... Oregon tied a season high with 14 steals in the opening round game against WSU, one shy of the tournament record.

## FOR THE DEFENSE

Under **Dana Altman**, Oregon is 163-20 when holding opponents under 70 points, including a 128-12 mark the last six seasons.

## DUCKS ALMOST HIT TRIPLE 20

The Ducks nearly achieved an interesting mark Jan. 27 against Washington State. **Louis King** scored 22 points, **Kenny Wooten** had 20 and **Paul White** added 18. If White would have scored two more points, the Ducks would have had three players with 20 or more points for the first time in 17 years. Oregon last had three players with 20 or more points in the 2002 NCAA Tournament versus Wake Forest when **Luke Jackson** scored 29, **Luke Ridnour** had 28 and **Fred Jones** netted 24.

## NBA DRAFT NOTES

For the first time since 2007, an Oregon Duck was selected in the first round of the 2018 NBA Draft (**Troy Brown Jr.**, No. 15, Washington). Brown Jr. was the highest Duck selected since **Luke Jackson** went 10th to Cleveland in 2004. Brown Jr. was Oregon's first one-and-done player.

## NBA ROSTER NOTES

Oregon had five alums playing in the NBA in 2018-19. World Champion **Jordan Bell** was in his second season with the Golden State Warriors. Other players off the Ducks' 2016-17 NCAA Final Four team in the NBA included second year pros **Chris Boucher** (Toronto), **Tyler Dorsey** (Atlanta/Memphis) and **Dillon Brooks** (Memphis). **Troy Brown Jr.**, the 2018 first round selection of Washington, played his first season with the Wizards. Additionally, **Elijah Brown** was with the G League's Grand Rapids Drive, **MiKyle McIntosh** was with Raptors 905 and **Jay-R Strowbridge** saw time with the Memphis Hustle.

## IN THE GENES

## DUCKS ACCEPT BID TO 2019 BATTLE 4 ATLANTIS

Oregon will make its inaugural appearance in the Bad Boy Mowers Battle 4 Atlantis next season in Nassau, Bahamas. The Ducks will be joined in the 2019 field by Alabama, Gonzaga, Iowa State, North Carolina, Michigan, Seton Hall and Southern Mississippi. This will be Oregon's first appearance in the Battle 4 Atlantis, which will be played over the Thanksgiving holiday in the Imperial Arena at the Atlantis Paradise Island hotel. In addition to the Battle 4 Atlantis, Oregon's 2019-20 non-conference schedule will include games in Eugene versus Baylor, Boise State and Houston.

## DUCKS' SPLIT IN MANHATTAN YIELDS RARE TOP-25 WIN

Graduate transfer **Ehab Amin** led the Ducks with a season-high 25 points and three steals against Iowa in the semifinals of the 2K Empire Classic at Madison Square Garden. Freshman **Bol Bol** then topped that with 26 points in the consolation final against No. 15 Syracuse. Bol also scored 14 points against Iowa and had eight total blocked shots and was named to the all-tournament team. The defeat of No. 15 Syracuse marked the Ducks' first win over a top-15 non-conference opponent during the regular season since Oregon took down No. 14 Kansas, 84-78, on Dec. 7, 2002, in front of 20,762 fans at the Rose Garden in Portland, the biggest crowd to ever watch a college basketball game in the State of Oregon.

## FORMER S-A PHIL KNIGHT PLEDGES \$500 MILLION FOR SCIENCE

UO graduate and former track and field student-athlete Phil Knight, the co-founder of Nike, and his wife Penny made a half-a-billion dollar commitment to scientific research at the University of Oregon. It is the largest gift ever bestowed to a public university. "This act of philanthropy from Penny and Phil Knight is breathtaking," said University of Oregon President Michael Schill. "This is a seminal moment for the University of Oregon, an inflection point that will shape the trajectory of the university and this state for the next century and beyond." The Knight's \$500 million donation will fund the construction of a new science complex, that is currently under construction on the Eugene campus. Research at the new site will focus on life sciences such as biology, microbiology, biochemistry and other disciplines. "While not without risk, we believe the expected societal returns from such investments are high," said Knight. "And here at home in Oregon, we believe the potential to arm our talented young people with the skills and tools they will need to have a lasting impact on the world and to pursue rewarding careers makes such investments essential."

## DUCKS SIGN FOURTH STRAIGHT TOP-12 RECRUITING CLASS

Oregon added a signee from the junior college ranks and three more highly-rated high schoolers as the Ducks landed the nation's ninth-ranked recruiting class (Rivals.com) during the early signing period for National Letters of Intent. Chris Duarte, one of the top junior college players in the nation, and high school standouts Isaac Johnson, Chandler Lawson and C.J. Walker are the newest additions to the men's basketball roster. ## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Ducks are 139-20 (.874) all-time at Matthew Knight Arena since the building opened in 2011.

## PAC-12 AT MKA

The Ducks are 63-16 (.797) in Pac-12 games at Matthew Knight Arena. Two teams have yet to register a win at the eight year-old arena: Washington State (0-8) and Arizona State (0-6). USC and Washington are 1-7, Arizona, Utah and Colorado are 1-5, Oregon State is 2-7, Stanford is 2-5 and UCLA is 3-5. The only Pac-12 opponent with a winning record at MKA is California (4-3).

## NON-CONFERENCE RECORD AT MKA

The Ducks are 76-4 (.950) all-time in non-conference games at Matthew Knight Arena. The four non-conference teams to defeat Oregon at MKA are Virginia (67-54, Dec. 18, 2011), Mississippi (79-73, Dec. 7, 2014), Boise State (73-70, Dec. 1, 2017) and Texas Southern (89-84, Nov. 26, 2018). UO won 28 non-conference games in a row at MKA between the Virginia and Ole Miss losses.

## HOME OPENERS

After defeating Portland State to open the 2018-19 season, the Ducks have now won 21 straight home openers. Oregon last dropped a home opener at the beginning of the 1997-98 season, 56-54 to Portland State.

## NATION'S LONGEST ACTIVE HOME WIN STREAK ENDS AT 46 GAMES

Oregon's school record winning streak at Matthew Knight Arena came to an end at 46 games on a half-court buzzer beater by Boise State on Dec. 1, 2017. At the time, it was the longest home winning streak in the nation. Two of Oregon's four longest home winning streaks have come under Dana Altman.

## IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREEN

Matthew Knight Arena was selected as one of the nation's 11 greenest college basketball arenas by LawnStarter. Opened in 2011, MKA received LEED Gold certification: Gold. Among the green features cited by LawnStarter were a 50 percent reduction in water use for landscaping, water use for the building as a whole reduced by 30 percent, and indoor air quality was enhanced with low-emitting construction materials like carpet, paint, wood and sealants.

## RECORD ATTENDANCE AT MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA

Oregon had its best home attendance figures in 39 seasons in 2016-17. The Ducks averaged 9,895 fans per home game (17 home games), which was the program's highest since averaging 9,984 in 1977-78. The 2016-17 season average was higher than the final capacity at McArthur Court (9,087). The Ducks also had seven sellouts in season seven at MKA, which matched the total number sellouts in the arena's first six seasons.

Dana Altman is one of only six active coaches in NCAA Division I with 22 consecutive winning seasons. He is part of an exclusive fraternity that includes Hall-of-Famers Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Roy Williams, Bill Self and Jim Boeheim.

He is the 34th head coach to record 600 career wins at the Division I level and is now tied with Ernie Kent as the winningest head coach in Oregon history. In 2016-17, Altman led Oregon back to the Final Four for the first time in 78 years.

In 2019, he became the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history, reaching 19 victories.

The 2013 National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year has won more games in his first nine seasons than any coach in Oregon history. Altman is 235-96 in Eugene, and 645-339 in 29 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

Altman, the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men's basketball program, has led the Ducks to nine consecutive 20-win seasons and nine postseason appearances. He led Oregon to five straight NCAA Tournaments (2013-17) for the first time in school history, winning at least one game in each of those years. Included in those NCAA appearances are a Final Four (2017), two Elite Eights (2016, 2017) and three Sweet 16s (2013, 2016, 2017). Altman now has 21 seasons of 20-plus wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, nine at Oregon, one at Kansas State).

In addition to another 20-win season and a postseason appearance, the 2017-18 season saw another first for Altman when Troy Brown Jr. became his first career NBA first round draft choice (No. 15 overall, Washington).

Oregon entered the 2016-17 season with lofty expectations, and the Ducks lived up to every one of them. The Ducks won the Pac-12 title for the second consecutive season and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since the 1939 Webfoots won the very first NCAA title. Along the way, Oregon won a program-record 33 games and also reached a high-water mark for conference victories with 16. Dillon Brooks was named the Pac-12 player of the year and a consensus all-American, while Jordan Bell was the Pac-12 defensive player of the year and the NCAA Midwest Regional most outstanding player. Jordan, Brooks and Tyler Dorsey were all selected in the 2017 NBA Draft.

The 2015-16 season saw Altman reach new heights as a coach and achieve honors matched only by some of the very best mentors in the history of the Pac-12 Conference. Altman guided Oregon to the Pac-12's regular season and conference title in the same year for the first time in school history. He also reached the NCAA's Elite Eight for the first time and was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four seasons, a feat matched only by Hall of Famer Lute Olson of Arizona. The individual honors won by players under his guidance included all-American Brooks, Pac-12 Tournament MOP Elgin Cook, Pac-12 all-defensive selection Chris Boucher and Pac-12 all-freshman pick Dorsey.

In 2014-15, in one of the finest coaching performances of his career, Altman guided a team that had only three returning scholarship players to a 26-10 record, a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 (13-5) and the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was the runaway choice for Pac-12 Coach of the Year, while Joseph Young tied the school single-season scoring record in being named Pac-12 Player of the Year. Cook was an all-Pac-12 second-team selection, while Bell and Brooks made the Pac-12's all-freshman team.

The 2013-14 season saw Altman win his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19. He also joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons. He guided Oregon to a 24-10 overall record and an NCAA Tournament win. Young was an all-conference second team selection and an all-Pac-12 tournament pick, while Mike Moser was an honorable mention selection by the conference.

Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament. The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament. Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors. Senior E.J. Singler was an all-league first team selection, while Johnathan Loyd was named Most Outstanding Player of the Pac-12 Tournament as the honors were spread around nearly the entire team. Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before going on to become a second round draft choice of the NBA's Philadelphia 76ers.

During the 2011-12 season, Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for a share of second place in the final league standings. The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals. Under Altman's tutelage, Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference, while Singler was named to the all-conference second team.

In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the 12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program. He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play. Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach.

Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines. Oregon participated in the 2011 College Basketball Invitational, defeating Altman's former team - Creighton - in the best-of-three championship series.

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, including back-to-back MVC coaching honors while he was at the Omaha, Neb., school in 2001 and 2002. Altman was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.

Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons. He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01 - its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.

Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327), trailing only Basketball Hall of Fame coaches Henry Iba (486) and Eddie Hickey (337). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team. His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference post-season tournament titles. Creighton inducted Altman into its athletics hall of fame in 2018.

Student-athletes under his direction at CU earned six All-America honors on the court and four Academic All-America laurels in the classroom. Three players he coached at Creighton - Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver - have played in the NBA.

Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State. During that time, Altman led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tourneys and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17, 1994. K-State eventually advanced to play in the NIT Final Four. Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

While head coach at Southeast Junior College in Fairbury, Neb., his first team (1982-83) rolled to a 29-6 record and a third-place finish in the junior college national tournament and Altman was honored as both Region 9 and the Nebraska College Coach of the Year.

In 1983, Altman accepted the head coaching position at Moberly (Mo.) Junior College, with a three-year run resulting in a staggering 94-18 record (25-9 in 1983-84; 35-5 with a third-place finish at the national tourney in 1984-85; and a 34-4 mark in 1985-86 with a sixth-place finish at nationals).

He was named Region 16 Coach of the Year in both the 1984-85 and 1985-86 seasons, and was also a finalist for 1986 National Junior College Athletic Association Coach of the Year accolades.

Altman's playing career began at Southeast Junior College in 1976, where he captained teams to a 22-10 mark in his freshman year and a 26-5 record in his sophomore season.

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.

At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball. Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.

**FIRST NCAA CHAMPIONS -- THE TALL FIRS**

Oregon's 1939 basketball team earned a niche in sports history by winning the first NCAA championship basketball tournament ever held.

With a first unit composed of four native Oregonians and one Washingtonian, Coach Howard Hobson guided the Tall Firs to a 29-5 season record and Oregon's only NCAA basketball title.

The starting five listed three All-Americans in 6-foot 8-inch Urgel 'Slim' Wintermute from Longview, Wash., sharp-shooting Laddie Gale, a 6-4 forward from Oakridge and 5-8 guard Bobby Anet from Astoria. In addition, John Dick, a 6-4 forward from The Dalles, earned All-America honors the following season.

The guard spots were manned by Astorians Anet and 5-11 Wally Johansen. The two had teamed since their grade school days in Astoria.

For reserve strength, Hobson called on the likes of Bob Hardy, Red McNeely, Ford Mullen, Matt Pavalunas, Earl Sandness and Ted Sarpola. Gale, Wintermute, Anet, Johansen and Mullen played on three consecutive Northern Division championship teams.

The Ducks posted a 10-3 non-conference record, highlighted by a two-week Christmas tour that opened in Madison Square Garden with a 38-36 loss to CCNY and concluded with a 50-46 defeat at the hands of Stanford.

In between, however, the Tall Firs won six of seven games giving them a highly respectable 6-3 road mark against some of the nation's finest teams.

Oregon powered to the Northern Division title with a 14-2 record, sweeping four-game series from Idaho and Washington and capturing three of four battles each with Oregon State and Washington State.

That set the stage for a best-of-three playoff with Southern Division champion California at McArthur Court. Before capacity crowds, the Ducks captured the Pacific Coast Conference title in two games. Gale scored 18 points and Wintermute added 11 as the Ducks won the opener, 54-40, and Wintermute and Dick each tallied 16 points in the 53-47 triumph that put Oregon in the NCAA Western Playoffs.

Oregon quickly went to work in the Western Playoffs at Treasure Island, knocking off Texas, 56-41, and dumping Oklahoma, 55-37.

On March 27, the Tall Firs faced Ohio State on the neutral Northwestern University court at Evanston, Ill., for the national title. Dick scored 13 points and Gale and Anet contributed 10 apiece as the Ducks rolled to a 46-33 victory and the NCAA crown.

Huge crowds welcomed them in Portland and Eugene to climax one of the legendary events in the state's athletic history.

**ROB MULLENS**  
**DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**  
**9TH YEAR**

A highly respected industry leader who has guided University of Oregon athletics to unprecedented heights, Rob Mullens is entering his ninth year as the Ducks' athletic director. Under his leadership, Oregon student-athletes have produced one of the most successful eras in UO history, including all-time best finishes for the Ducks in the NACDA Directors' Cup of ninth place in 2016-17 and 10th place in 2015-16, the only two top 10 finishes in Oregon history and a record point total in 2016-17. The Directors' Cup is a national assessment of an athletics department's overall achievements, and the Ducks have finished in the top 25 nationally in a school-record seven consecutive years.

Providing an exceptional student-athlete experience is at the core of the mission of Oregon Athletics, and Duck student-athletes are achieving excellence in the classroom and in competition. The academic standards have improved during Mullens' tenure, and the Ducks have produced 30 Academic All-Americans since the 2010-11 academic year while averaging more than 100 All-Pac 12 Academic selections annually. The student-athlete GPA for Spring 2018 was 3.12, while there is currently a 91% graduation rate for Oregon student-athletes who exhaust their eligibility.

Competitively, the Ducks have won 17 national championships during this decade, a total that led the nation from 2010-17. Oregon was the only school with multiple national championships during a five-year stretch from 2013-17 as well as one of only three schools (Penn State, Stanford) to win at least one national title in eight consecutive years from 2010-17.

Mullens serves in critical leadership roles nationally in both football and men's basketball, and he was named chairman of the College Football Playoff Committee in 2018. This season will be his third overall on the CFP Committee. In October 2017, Mullens was named to the initial Collegiate Advisory Council, the mission of which is to guide and strengthen Olympic sport programming at the collegiate level. The 11-member council is the first of its kind and represents the latest step taken by the USOC to increase collaboration with NCAA member institutions and conferences to elevate national engagement and support of Olympic sport opportunities.

Mullens also serves on the committee responsible for implementing the sweeping changes recommended in men's basketball by the Committee on College Basketball, a project that was chaired by Condeleeza Rice.

Since Mullens' arrival in Eugene, the Duck football team has claimed three conference championships and played in the inaugural College Football Playoff Championship Game, appearing in the national title game twice, while

also winning the Rose Bowl twice, in 2012 over Wisconsin and in 2014 over Florida State. Quarterback Marcus Mariota also became the school's first Heisman Trophy winner in 2014, and the Ducks are 80-26 overall on the gridiron, including three Pac-12 titles, five 10-win seasons and the highest scoring offense in the nation, during Mullens' tenure.

Oregon's basketball teams have also enjoyed considerable success lately, as the women's team led by head coach Kelly Graves, hired by Mullens in 2014, has advanced to consecutive Elite Eights (the 2017 appearance was the first in program history) and won both the Pac-12 regular season and tournament championships in 2018. The Oregon men's hoops squad advanced to the Final Four in 2017 for the first time since 1939. During the school-record 9th place Directors' Cup finish year of 2016-17, Oregon became the first college in the country to win the "triple crown" in women's track and field and cross country. The Women of Oregon captured the 2016 cross country title by a single point, scored a record number of points in winning the indoor track and field title, and then pulled off a stunning comeback to win the outdoor track and field title on the final event. This year, the Men of Oregon won their 12th consecutive Pac-12 title.

The Oregon's men's golf program won the national championship in 2016 and won the Pac-12 title in 2017 while also finishing as the national runner-up. The 2018 Ducks softball squad played in the College World Series for the fifth time this decade, and Oregon softball has won five Pac-12 titles in the last six years while also winning eight consecutive regional titles. Additionally, construction of Jane Sanders Stadium was completed in 2016, a facility considered one of the best for student-athletes and fans in all of college softball.

During the 2017-18 academic year, volleyball, women's tennis, men's tennis, women's golf, and men's golf also advanced to NCAA tournament postseason play, while women's tennis won their first-round match for the first time since 2014. Acrobatics and tumbling also recorded another top 10 finish.

In addition to Jane Sanders Stadium, the following facilities completed construction under Mullens' watch: Pape Field (2012), the Hatfield-Dowlin Football Complex (2013), and the Marcus Mariota Sports Performance Complex (2016). The new Hayward Field, slated to be the finest track and field stadium in the world, will finish construction in the spring of 2020.

Oregon's philosophy of fiscal efficiency during Mullens' tenure has also been recognized nationwide. Oregon athletics is one of only a handful of departments nationally that is self-sufficient as the Oregon brand continues to grow. That is a direct reflection of our generous donors who continue to help us achieve important fundraising results. Those three pillars — student-athlete experience, academic excellence and broad-based competitive excellence — comprise the foundation of Mullens' core beliefs as he oversees nearly 500 student-athletes and a budget of \$110 million. Mullens was named the University's 12th director of intercollegiate athletics on July 15, 2010, after arriving from the University of Kentucky, where he served as deputy director of athletics and managed day-to-day operations for Kentucky's 22-sport athletics department, with an annual operating budget of \$79 million. The 49-year-old Mullens earned a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's in sport management from West Virginia University in 1991 and 1993, respectively. He and his wife, Jane, have two sons — Cooper and Tanner.



**MICHAEL SCHILL**  
**UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT**  
**4TH YEAR**

Michael H. Schill is the 18th president of the University of Oregon. He began his tenure on July 1, 2015. He previously served as the dean and Harry N. Wyatt Professor of Law at the University of Chicago Law School.

Prior to joining the University of Chicago in 2010, Schill served as the dean of the University of California, Los Angeles School of Law from 2004 to 2009. His other faculty appointments include tenured positions as professor of law and urban planning at New York University and professor of law and real estate at the University of Pennsylvania.

A nationally recognized expert in property, real estate, and housing law and policy, Schill is the author or co-author of three books and

more than 40 scholarly articles. His work includes studies of the determinants of value in condominium and cooperative housing, the impacts of housing programs on property values, the enforcement of Fair Housing laws, mortgage securitization, and the deregulation of housing markets. His casebook, *Property*, co-authored with James Krier, Greg Alexander, and Lior Strahilevitz is one of the best-selling casebooks used in American law schools.

In 2004, Schill founded the Furman Center for Real Estate and Urban Policy at New York University. Under his and subsequent leadership, the Furman Center has become one of the nation's leading research centers on housing and the built environment.

In addition to serving as the president of the University of Oregon, Schill is a member of the Board of Governors of Argonne National Laboratory, a member of the Board of Trustees of Ithaca, the nonprofit organization that owns JSTOR, and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Schill graduated with an AB in public policy from Princeton University in 1980 and a JD from the Yale Law School in 1984.

Schill also holds a tenured faculty appointment in the University of Oregon School of Law.
