## KEY STORYLINES

### DUCKS FLY TO THE DESERT

After opening Pac-12 play at home with a pair of dominant wins over Colorado and Utah last weekend, the No. 2 Ducks will fly south this weekend to take on Arizona State and No. 18 Arizona in the desert, beginning on Friday night against the Sun Devils at Desert Financial Arena in Tempe.

### OFF AND RUNNING IN PAC-12 PLAY

The Ducks opened Pac-12 play with a statement win over Colorado on Jan. 3, using explosive offense and suffocating defense in a 104-46 rout of the then-undefeated Buffs. Oregon was led by its "Big Three" of **SABRINA IONESCU** (21 P, 7 A, 6 R), **RUTHY HEBARD** (21 P, 5 R, 3 B) and **SATOU SABALLY** (17 P, 3 R, 3 S), while also getting 33 points from its bench. The Ducks shot 58.0 percent from the floor while holding the Buffs to just a 26.7 mark, and Oregon matched its season-high with 21 forced turnovers. The Ducks used a similar formula two days later in an 88-51 win over Utah, forcing the Utes into 20 total turnovers and just 37.3 percent shooting. **MINYON MOORE** enjoyed a strong game with a season-high 17 points, Hebard (13 P, 12 R) notched her seventh double-double of the season and Ionescu (17 P, 8 R, 7 A) was on triple-double watch, as usual. Oregon saw 10 different players record at least one assist, and eight Ducks made at least one field goal.

### SERIES HISTORY

The all-time series between the Ducks and Sun Devils is tied entering Friday's game, 34-34. Oregon has won the last four meetings, including both last season. The Ducks beat ASU 77-71 on 1/18/19 in Eugene, behind a 31-point performance by **SABRINA IONESCU**. On 3/3/19, the Ducks went into Tempe and clinched the outright Pac-12 regular season title with a 66-59 win, fueled by 19 points from Ionescu and 18 from **SATOU SABALLY**.

# NO. 1 TOPPLES NO. 1! OREGON KNOCKS OFF TEAM USA

Don't tell the Oregon women's basketball team there's nothing on the line in an exhibition game.

In fact, don't tell the Ducks anything. Because they just might turn around and use it to beat you.

Even if you're the latest iteration of arguably the greatest dynasty in the history of organized team sports.

The top-ranked team in women's college basketball beat the best team in the entire world Saturday evening. Sabrina Ionescu and the UO women's basketball team hosted an exhibition against the United States women's national team before 11,530 fans in Matthew Knight Arena, and won, 93-86.

It had been 20 years since a college team last beat Team USA. The Ducks' fellow Pac-12 preseason favorites, Stanford and Oregon State, had chances earlier this month and couldn't do what the Ducks did. Nor could Texas A&M, earlier this week.

Based on those games, Team USA legend Sue Bird said she knew what to expect Saturday against the Ducks and their raucous home crowd.

"They're gonna come out, they're gonna throw the first punch, it's gonna get loud," Bird said. "I think the difference with Oregon was, they never quit. Some of the other teams, we maybe wore them down a bit. But not this team."

For that, Bird could credit an unlikely source – her own teammate and fellow UConn alum. The night before Saturday's game, Diana Taurasi spoke to the Ducks for nearly an hour. The essence of her message: "Stay mad."

Don't get complacent after making the 2019 Final Four. Don't get caught up in the hype of preseason expectations. Don't lose your will to do more than the other team.

When the Ducks went into halftime Saturday, their deficit was just four, 42-38. Earlier in the week, UO coach Kelly Graves said it would be delusional to think Oregon had a chance to win the game. At halftime, it didn't seem so delusional.

Before leaving the locker room for the second half, the Ducks huddled up and shouted, in unison: "Stay mad!" Then they went out and played mad.

Led by 20 points from Ionescu in the third quarter alone, Oregon took a one-point lead into the fourth period. Then, they gapped Team USA, with a three-point barrage by Ionescu and Satou Sabally.

"Diana told us to stay mad," Ionescu said. "We didn't want to come out complacent. We didn't want to come out excited we were only down four at half. So we came out in the third quarter, and we stayed mad, just like she told us. So, thank you to her for helping us with that win."

The dynamic between Taurasi and Ionescu was apparent from the start Saturday. Just before tipoff, their pregame handshake and quick hug was a little more extended than the others among the two teams' starters. At one point in the first half, Taurasi tipped a pass that Ionescu turned over, and Taurasi grinned as if to say, "I got ya, kid."

Then, in the postgame handshake line, they shared another hug. If you squinted a little bit, you could almost see it as a passing of the torch, from one generation of do-everything American guard to the next.

Ionescu had just led the Ducks in their upset with 30 points, plus seven assists and four rebounds. Sabally added 25 points, including back-to-back three-pointers that forced Team USA coach Cheryl Reeve to call timeout and stanch the bleeding with Oregon up 79-69 early in the fourth quarter.

Reeve is also coach of the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. She can only hope the Lynx has a shot to draft Ionescu or Sabally in the next couple of years. "They're going to be great players," Reeve said. "Not just hanging on – they're going to be great players in the WNBA."

It was Oregon's other high-level pro prospect who led the Ducks in the early going Saturday. Ruthy Hebard, battled-tested after facing current pros Teaira McCowan of Mississippi State and Kalani Brown of Baylor in last year's tournament, was unfazed by going head-to-head Saturday against Team USA's Sylvia Fowles.

Hebard opened each half with a defensive stop against Fowles on the low block. She ran the pick-and-roll with Ionescu with precision, and even put the ball on the floor a couple of times and drove right to the bucket against Fowles.

Despite that effort from Hebard, Team USA was looking to pull away early in the second quarter, up 29-20. That's when Graves turned to a lineup that included Sabally, backup post Lydia Gioni, and young wings Taylor Chavez, Jaz Shelley and Holly Winterburn. They kept the Ducks in the game, with energy that was contagious. Ionescu and Hebard fed off it, and closed the gap after re-entering the lineup to get Oregon within 42-38 at halftime.

"Ruthy carried us early in the game," Graves said. "And then, when Sabrina kind of got her legs under her a little bit ..."

The third quarter was nothing short of basketball brilliance, a player at the top of her game looking to prove herself against the team that has won the last six Olympic gold medals. Ionescu drove to the basket, launched three-pointers from all over the floor, dove on the court for loose balls and at one point even flung herself into a row of photographers to keep a possession alive – then retook the court, got the ball back and drew a foul.

Sure, the game wasn't going to count toward Oregon's record. But that didn't matter to a player whose competitive fire Bird cited postgame as the quality in Ionescu she found most impressive.

"We knew they were the best team in the world, the best players in the world," Ionescu said. "We were just wanting to stay within 20. As the game wore on, we started to forget about who they were and what the expectations were."

It was Sabally who hit the biggest baskets down the stretch. After her back-to-back threes that forced the Team USA timeout, she made another bucket to cap an 11-0 run that put Oregon up 81-69. She scored again after Team USA got within five, putting the Ducks up 85-78, and again for an 87-80 lead, and yet again for an 89-84 advantage with just 35 seconds left in the game.

"She's incredible," Graves said. "She was out here going against some of the world's best, and was able to get her shot, create her shot. She was as aggressive as I've ever seen."

For the game, Oregon shot 50 percent. The Ducks won the rebounding battle. Who saw that coming?

Nobody could have predicted the preseason No. 1 team in the country finding a way to exceed expectations. But they did Saturday. It wasn't part of the "unfinished business" that is fueling Ionescu and company after their Final Four loss last season. But as the opening chapter in the 2019-20 season, it made for an unforgettable night.

Arizona State is 1-2 to start Pac-12 play, but the Sun Devils played well in narrow losses to a pair of top-25 teams in Arizona (53-58) and UCLA (66-68). An NCAA Sweet Sixteen team a year ago, the Sun Devils graduated their top two scorers from 2018-19 but brought in USC transfer Ja'Tavia Tapley, who leads the team with 11.5 PPG and 7.3 RPG. Robbi Ryan is second with 8.4 PPG, and six more players are averaging at least 6.0 PPG in a balanced offense. ASU ranks 11th in the Pac-12 with 67.5 PPG, but is 23rd in the nation in scoring defense with just 55.2 PPG allowed.

**MOORE BREAKS OUT AGAINST UTAH**

Minyon Moore has provided a steady presence at the point guard position all season for the Ducks, but the former USC star hadn't put up big numbers in the scoring column until Sunday's win over Utah. The senior scored a season-high 17 points against the Utes while going 7-of-11 from the floor, and she continued to be a bulldog in the defensive end with two steals.

**IONESCU REACHES 900 CAREER ASSISTS**

**SABRINA IONESCU** continued her year of milestones with another big one in UO's win over Colorado on 1/3/20. With seven assists, the senior superstar hit 900 even for her career to become just the 12th player in the history of NCAA women's basketball to join the 900 assists club. Ionescu added seven more on 1/5/20 against Utah to up her total to 907, putting her at No. 10 on the NCAA all-time list entering this weekend's game's in Arizona (full list on page 13).

**HEBARD JOINS 2K CLUB**

**RUTHY HEBARD** reached a big milestone on 1/3/20 against Colorado, becoming just the fifth player in Oregon history to surpass 2,000 career points, along with teammate **SABRINA IONESCU**. Hebard enters the weekend with 2,019 points, and she is the only active NCAA player to have 2,000+ career points and 1,000+ career rebounds (1,106). Hebard is one of only 12 players in Pac-12 history to reach the 2,000/1,000 milestone.

**IONESCU, MOORE LEAD DYNAMIC OFFENSE**

The Ducks boast the nation's most dynamic and efficient offense, which is navigated by senior guards **SABRINA IONESCU** and **MINYON MOORE**. Oregon leads the NCAA with a 1.98 assist-to-turnover ratio, with Moore ranking second nationally at 4.43 and Ionescu third at 3.48. The Ducks are second in the country with 22.7 assist per game behind Ionescu's NCAA-leading 8.8 APG, and Moore is in the national top 60 as well at 4.8 APG. UO leads the Pac-12 and is No. 5 nationally with 11.5 turnovers per game.

**SHOOTING THE LIGHTS OUT**

Oregon is among the nation's most efficient shooting teams entering this weekend's action, ranking No. 2 in the NCAA with a 50.3 field goal percentage. One of the biggest factor's in Oregon's efficiency has been its dominance in the paint, where the Ducks own a 250-point advantage and have outscored their opponents every game so far, including a 56-16 advantage over Colorado and a 50-18 advantage against Utah. Ruthy Hebard has elevated Oregon's field goal percentage a great deal as the senior post ranks No. 2 in the nation individually with a 69.7 shooting percentage.

**RAMPING UP THE DEFENSIVE INTENSITY**

The Ducks are clearly one of the nation's premiere offensive teams, but they have made it a point over the last several games of turning up the intensity on the defensive end as well. Oregon has held six straight teams to under 60 points, including three to 46 points or less, and have recorded 58 total steals and 23 blocked shots while forcing 108 total turnovers over the last six games. The Ducks' defensive improvement was sparked by a new three-quarter court press implemented during the South Dakota State game, when the Ducks held the Jackrabbits to just 37.2 percent shooting while forcing 13 turnovers, including 10 in the first half. Oregon matched its season-high with 21 forced turnovers in its Pac-12 opener against Colorado, and the Ducks are up to No. 20 nationally in scoring defense at 54.9 PPG allowed.

**STEPPIN' UP AND KNOCKIN' EM DOWN**

The Ducks haven't gotten to the free throw line a ton so far this season, but they have been among the nation's best teams at the stripe when they have. Oregon ranks No. 7 in the nation with a 78.2 free throw percentage as a team, and the Ducks' 188 attempts are the fewest of any team in the top 25.

**SATOU SABALLY** is averaging 14.6 points and 6.6 rebounds per game through nine games so far as a junior. Sabally missed the first three games of the regular season while playing overseas with the German WNT, and she rested on 12/16 with a minor injury.

**NOTES**

**DUCKS BOAST IMPROVED DEPTH**

Depth was one of Oregon's biggest issues in 2018-19, but the Ducks' bench is much deeper in 2019-20. **JAZ SHELLEY** has come on in a big way, erupting for 32 points and a UO record 10 three-pointers on 12/16 against UC Riverside after a 17-point game at Long Beach State. **TAYLOR CHAVEZ** has matched Shelley with four double-figure scoring games, headlined by a career-high 25 points on 11/13 vs. Utah State. **LYDIA GIOMI** is averaging 5.5 points and 3.8 rebounds and had a career-high 18 points in the season-opener, and **HOLLY WINTERBURN** was the Pac-12 freshman of the Week on 12/9 after dropping 17 points against South Dakota State. As a team, Oregon has already had nine different players combine for 49 double-digit scoring performances.

**HEATING UP FROM DEEP**

Oregon struggled a bit from three-point range to open the season, but the Ducks have found their stroke from beyond the arc as of late. After shooting just 32.7 percent (74-226) from deep through the season's first seven games, the Ducks have shot a solid 42.7 percent (56-131) in their last six contests, including a 14-of-24 (58.3%) day on 12/8/19 vs. South Dakota State. As a team, Oregon entered that South Dakota State game ranked 125th in the nation in three-point percentage, and the Ducks have flown up the rankings to No. 31 entering this weekend at 36.4 percent on the season, the No. 2 mark in the Pac-12. Individually, freshman **JAZ SHELLEY** leads the Ducks with a 44.3 mark from beyond the arc, good for No. 28 in the NCAA.

**MAKE IT 21: SAB GOES BACK-TO-BACK**

**SABRINA IONESCU** leads the nation with three triple-doubles this season, raising her NCAA all-time record to 21 as the senior enters the homestretch of her storied career. Ionescu recorded a triple-double in two straight games to close out 2019 - posting 16 points, a career-high 18 rebounds and 12 assists on 12/16/19 vs. UC Riverside before going off for 21 points, 10 rebounds and 11 rebounds on 12/21/19 vs. Kansas State - marking the third time in her career she has reached the milestone in back-to-back games. Ionescu is nearly averaging a triple-double on the season, with marks of 15.6 points, 9.0 rebounds and an NCAA-leading 8.8 assists per game.

**TALK ABOUT HOME COURT ADVANTAGE**

The Ducks are a perfect 8-0 at home this season, and one of the biggest reasons for UO's home success is the team's popularity in and around Eugene. Oregon is No. 1 in the nation in total attendance (78,690) through eight home games and No. 2 in average attendance (9,836), and those figures don't even include the 11,530 fans who came to watch the Ducks take down the USA Women's National Team on 11/9/19, or the 9,447 who attended the 12/28/19 exhibition game against Corban.

**SHELLEY THE SNIPER**

It was a historic day for freshman **JAZ SHELLEY** in Oregon's 84-41 win over UC Riverside on 12/16/19. Making her first career start, the Aussie erupted for a career-high 32 points while breaking the UO single-game record with 10 made three-pointers, including five in the third quarter alone. Shelley became the first UO freshman to score 30-plus points in a game since 2013-14, and her 10-of-14 day from beyond the arc broke the previous record of nine. Shelley's 10 made threes are the second-most in the NCAA this season. Shelley's record-breaking performance earned her Pac-12 Freshman of the Week honors on 12/23/19.

**HEBARD'S STELLAR START**

**RUTHY HEBARD** got her senior season off to a fantastic start, posting five double-doubles and two 30-point games through the Ducks' first five contests. The Fairbanks, Alaska, native poured in 31 points with 13 rebounds on 11/16/19 vs. Texas Southern, and added 30 points while matching her career-high with 18 rebounds on 11/28/19 vs. Oklahoma State. The senior owns 45 career double-doubles, the fifth-most in UO history and second-most among active NCAA players. On the season, Hebard leads the Ducks with 17.0 points and 9.5 rebounds per game while ranking No. 2 in the nation with a 69.7 field goal percentage.

**SATOU RETURNING TO FORM**

**SATOU SABALLY** missed the first three games of the regular season while playing overseas with the German Women's National Team, but the junior made her presence felt immediately with 23 points in her season-debut on 11/24 at No. 17 Syracuse and is rounding back into form with Pac-12 play underway. Sabally is averaging 14.6 points and 6.6 rebounds with six double-digit scoring efforts in nine games so far this season. The junior opened Pac-12 play with 17 points and three steals against Colorado before added seven points, seven rebounds and four assists vs. Utah.



**MINYON MOORE** has provided a steady presence to Oregon's lineup this season since transferring from USC, ranking No. 2 in the nation with a 4.43 assist-to-turnover ratio. As a team, Oregon leads the NCAA with a 1.98 ratio.

## NOTES

### IONESCU NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK (12/16/19)

**SABRINA IONESCU** had nearly completed her 20th career triple-double on 12/16/19 vs. UC Riverside when the conference announced her as the Pac-12 player of the week for her performance on Dec. 14 at Long Beach State. With NBA legend Kobe Bryant sitting courtside, Ionescu racked up a season-high 21 points - including 15 in the first quarter alone - while adding 12 rebounds, seven assists and three steals while going 9-of-14 from the floor. It was the ninth career Pac-12 weekly honor for Ionescu, tying her for the second most of any player in league history.

### WINTERBURN WINS PAC-12 FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK (12/9/19)

One of Oregon's biggest keys to success from three-point range against South Dakota State (12/8/19) was **HOLLY WINTERBURN**, who went 5-of-7 for a season-high 17 points en route to being named the Pac-12 freshman of the week. Winterburn was Oregon's first Pac-12 FOW since **SATOU SABALLY** won it four times in 2017-18.

### TWO RECORDS IN ONE DAY FOR IONESCU

Breaking records has become a daily occurrence for **SABRINA IONESCU**, and the senior superstar enjoyed a 2-for-1 day on 12/8/19 against South Dakota State. Ionescu posted 12 points for the 109th double-figure scoring game of her career, breaking the previous UO all-time record of 108 held by Allison Lang (1980-84). The Walnut Creek, Calif., native also sunk a pair of three-pointers to give her 285 for her career, moving her past former teammate Lexi Bando (283, 2014-18) for the most in program history.

### IONESCU BREAKS PAC-12 ASSISTS RECORD

**SABRINA IONESCU** added yet another record to her storied career at the Paradise Jam, breaking the Pac-12 all-time women's assist record with six on Nov. 28 vs. Oklahoma State. Ionescu broke the previous record of 831 held by Jordin Canada (UCLA). The senior superstar now has her eyes on the Pac-12 men's record of 938 held by Gary Payton.

### GRAVES SIGNS NATION'S NO. 1 CLASS

[Kelly Graves announced the signing of five elite student-athletes to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 18](#), officially securing the nation's top-ranked 2020 recruiting class. All five of the Ducks' signees are regarded as five-star talents ranked the top 35 of ESPN's 2020 top 100, and all five are also rated as top 30 prospects by both Blue Star Basketball and ASGR Basketball. Oregon's group is ranked No. 1 in the nation by ESPN, giving the program its first-ever top-ranked recruiting class. The Ducks' five players in the ESPN top 35 are the most in the country, with no other team signing more than three.

### MORE MILESTONES FOR IONESCU, HEBARD

Oregon's star senior duo of **SABRINA IONESCU** and **RUTHY HEBARD** reached more impressive milestones in Oregon's Nov. 13 victory over Utah State. Ionescu became the fourth Duck in program history to eclipse 2,000 career points while finishing one rebound shy of another triple-double (16 P, 12 A, 9 R), and Hebard became the fourth UO player to surpass 1,000 career rebounds in a double-double performance (19 P, 15 R). Ionescu also eclipsed 800 career assists in the victory, becoming the first Duck and just the second Pac-12 women's player ever to reach that mark.

### SPLASH CITY

**KELLY GRAVES** has established Oregon as one of the most dangerous three-point shooting teams in the country over his five-plus seasons in Eugene. The Ducks led the nation in three-point percentage in 2018-19, the second time Oregon has paced the NCAA under Graves.

**CONSENSUS PRESEASON NO. 1**

The Ducks opened the 2019-20 season with the first Associated Press No. 1 national ranking in program history, and remained on top of the poll for three weeks before moving to No. 3 in each of the last two weeks. Oregon sat atop both the preseason AP poll and the USA Today coaches poll, and the Ducks also received preseason No. 1 rankings from espnW, NCAA.com, Sports Illustrated and SLAM, among others.

**PICKED TO THREE-PEAT**

For the second straight season, the Ducks were picked to win the Pac-12 in the preseason vote of the conference's coaches. Oregon received the maximum 11 first-place votes and 121 points, with Stanford picked to place second with 111 points and one first-place vote. Oregon State (99), UCLA (93) and

Arizona State (77) rounded out the top five of the preseason poll. Oregon has won the Pac-12 regular season title each of the last two seasons - the first two in program history - and the Ducks also won the Pac-12 Tournament in 2017-18.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

Widely considered the top WNBA prospect in the nation following her historic junior season, two-time Pac-12 player of the year **SABRINA IONESCU** put her professional career on hold to return to the Ducks for her senior campaign. Ionescu announced her decision in the Players' Tribune, saying she and the Ducks had "unfinished business" following last April's Final Four loss to Baylor. "We're building something here in Eugene. We're building something - together - that's going to last for a long time after we've all graduated."

**BRINGING THE BAND BACK TOGETHER**

Highlighted by the return of **SABRINA IONESCU**, the Ducks bring back four of five starters and seven total letterwinners from last year's Final Four team. Ionescu is joined by returning starters **RUTHY HEBARD** (16.1 PPG, 9.1 RPG, 67.0 FG% in 2018-19), **SATOU SABALLY** (16.6 PPG, 6.2 RPG, 50.5 FG%), and **ERIN BOLEY** (12.4 PPG, 43.0 3PT%). The Ducks also bring back three more letterwinners from last season in **TAYLOR CHAVEZ**, **LYDIA GIOMI** and **MORGAN YAEGER**. **NYARA SABALLY**, the younger sister of Satou, is back as a redshirt freshman, but she will have to sit out once again after reinjuring her knee over the offseason.

**THE NEWBIES CAN BALL, TOO**

In addition to bringing back 80 percent of last season's roster, the Ducks added a pair of transfers and three talented freshmen to bolster the team's depth in a big way. **MINYON MOORE** is expected to play a big role for Oregon after coming to Eugene in the offseason as a graduate transfer from USC. Moore is a two-time Pac-12 all-defensive selection and led the Trojans last season with 14.8 points, 5.5 rebounds and 5.9 assists per game. **SEDONA PRINCE**, the No. 8 ranked recruit in the nation two years ago, also joined Oregon via transfer after sitting out as a true freshman last year at Texas. Joining Moore and Prince as newcomers this year is a trio of highly-touted international recruits in **JAZSHELLEY** (Moe, Australia), **HOLLY WINTERBURN** (Northampton, England) and **LUCY COCHRANE** (Melbourne, Australia).

▶ TOP-25 STREAK

» Oregon has been ranked in the AP top 25 for 48 straight weeks, the eighth longest active streak in the NCAA.

» Oregon's top-25 streak began with the 2017-18 preseason poll, where the Ducks opened at No. 11 before going on to win the Pac-12 regular season and tournament championships en route to their second straight Elite Eight.

» Prior to the start of the streak, Oregon entered the AP poll once in 2016-17 (#25, 12/12/16), earning the program's first national top-25 ranking since Dec. 15, 2003.

» No. 11 is UO's lowest ranking throughout the streak, and the Ducks have been in the top 10 for 47 straight weeks.

» Oregon was ranked as high as No. 2 throughout the 2018-19 season, the highest in program history prior to the Ducks' 2019-20 preseason No. 1 ranking.

» Under Kelly Graves, Oregon has picked up 28 wins over top-25 teams, including seven against top-10 foes and three against teams ranked in the top five.

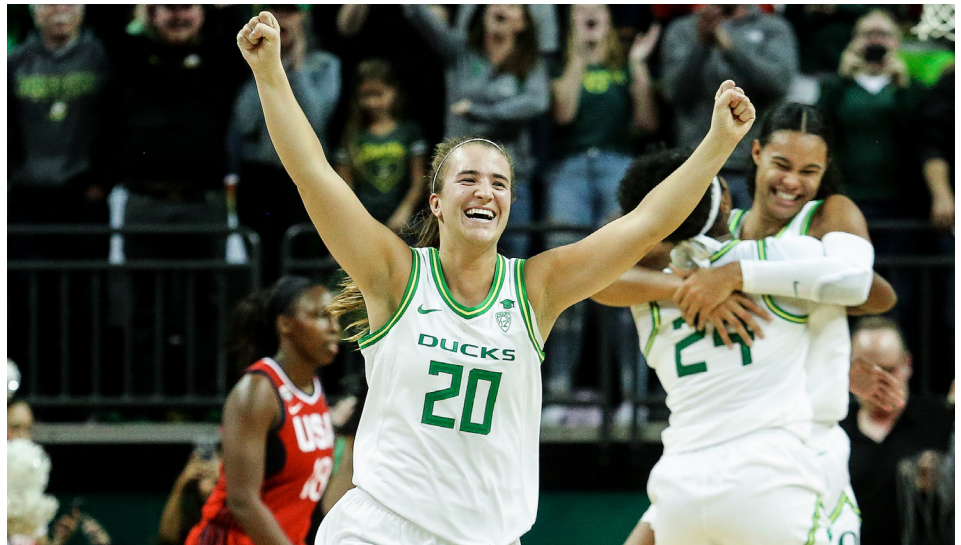

**TRIPLE-DOUBLE QUEEN**

**SABRINA IONESCU** is the NCAA all-time leader, men's and women's, with 21 career triple-doubles. Ionescu broke the all-time record last season as a junior with an NCAA single-season record eight triple-doubles, and she has three so far as a senior, including one in each of the last two games. Ionescu is the only player to ever have a triple-double in four different seasons.

## #20 SABRINA IONESCU

### CHASING MORE HISTORY

With 2,187 points, 907 assists and 873 rebounds, Ionescu has the chance to become the first player in NCAA men's or women's basketball history to reach 2,000+ career points, 1,000+ career assists and 1,000+ career rebounds. Only Gonzaga's Courtney Vandersloot, also coached by Kelly Graves, has reached 2,000+ points and 1,000+ assists. Ionescu will be the second active NCAA player to reach 2,000 career points and 1,000 rebounds this season, with teammate **RUTHY HEBARD** reaching that milestone on Jan. 3 vs. Colorado. Only four players (Alleyne, Hebard, Lang, Smith) in Oregon history have reached 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds.

### 900 ASSISTS CLUB

Ionescu became just the 12th player in NCAA women's basketball history to reach 900 career assists on 1/3/20 against Colorado. With 907 entering Friday's game, Ionescu currently ranks No. 10 in NCAA WBB history.

### NATION'S BEST

Ionescu was honored as the nation's best player in 2018-19 with both the Wade Trophy and the Wooden Award, becoming the first Duck ever to win either national award. A unanimous first-team all-American for the second year in a row, Ionescu was also the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year for the second straight year, and she has the chance to join the legendary Sue Bird as the only players to ever win that award three times. Entering the 2019-20 season, Ionescu was tabbed as the ESPNW preseason player of the year while also coming in at No. 1 in the ESPNW preseason player rankings for the second straight year.

### PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR - AGAIN

Ionescu was named the Pac-12 player of the year for the second straight season in 2018-19, becoming just the seventh player in league history to win the conferen's top honor in back-to-back seasons. Ionescu is the first player in UO history to win the league's top honor more than once, and the third player from Oregon overall. Ionescu also earned all-Pac-12 honors for the third straight year, giving both her and **RUTHY HEBARD** the chance to join Jillian Alleyne as the only four-time selections in program history.

### SABRINA STANDS ALONE

Ionescu averaged 19.9 points, 7.4 rebounds and 8.2 assists as a junior in 2018-19, making her the only player in the nation to average 15+ points, 7+ rebounds and 7+ assists. The last time anyone in the NCAA posted a balanced stat line even close to that was in 2014-15, when California's Brittany Boyd averaged 13.4 points, 7.7 rebounds and 6.8 assists per game. So far in 2019-20, Ionescu is averaging 15.6 points, 9.0 rebounds and an NCAA-leading 8.8 assists per game.

### EYES IN THE BACK OF HER HEAD

Ionescu has wowed fans with highlight-reel passes throughout her career while establishing herself as the greatest passer in program history. The senior is UO's all-time assists leader with 907, 216 more than any other Duck in history, and her NCAA-best 311 assists in 2018-19 broke her own UO single-season record. Ionescu surpassed Jordin Canada (831, UCLA) on Nov. 28 as the all-time assist leader in Pac-12 women's history, and she is only 32 shy of Gary Payton's (938, Oregon State) all-time Pac-12 record for both men and women. Ionescu also broke her own UO single-game assists record as a junior, racking up 17 on 12/2/18 against Long Beach State, and she matched her own Pac-12 Tournament assists record with 13 against Arizona (3/8/19).

### 17-OF-17 AT THE STRIPE

In Oregon's thrilling win over No. 4 Mississippi State on Dec. 18, 2018, Ionescu went a perfect 17-of-17 at the free-throw line to break both the UO and Pac-12 free-throw percentage records. The previous Oregon record was 14-of-14, set by Jessica Schutt at Washington on Feb. 19, 1995. The previous Pac-12 record was 15-of-15, set three different times, most recently by UW's Kristi Kingma against OSU on Jan. 25, 2013.

### DOUBLE-DOUBLES ARE NICE, TOO

Ionescu's NCAA-record 21 triple-doubles will make the headlines, but that number is also part of 44 career double-doubles for the senior star, the sixth-most in program history. Ionescu had a season- and team-high 16 double-doubles in 2018-19, including an NCAA single-season record eight triple-doubles, and she has six double-doubles so far in 2019-20 after recording triple-doubles in each of the Ducks' last two games entering Pac-12 play.

### DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING MACHINE

With 114 in her career, Ionescu is Oregon's all-time leader for double-figure scoring games. Ionescu scored in double digits in 76 straight games before finishing with seven points on 11/29/19 vs. UT Arlington, ending a streak that began with the fifth game of her sophomore season (11/21/17).

A three-time all-Pac-12 selection, Hebard surpassed 2,000 career points in the Ducks' Pac-12 opener against Colorado on 1/3/20. Hebard is just the fifth Duck to eclipse 2,000 career points, and only the 12th player in Pac-12 history to record 2,000+ points and 1,000+ rebounds. Hebard is the only active NCAA player in the 2,000/1,000 club, and she and **SABRINA IONESCU** are the only two active 2,000-point scorers entering Sunday's game.

**33 STRAIGHT MAKES**

Hebard announced herself to the nation as a sophomore in 2017-18 while breaking one of the game's most impressive records. The Fairbanks, Alaska, native **made 33 straight field goals** from Feb. 9 at Washington State to Feb. 19 against No. 10 UCLA, setting a new NCAA record for both men and women. Hebard was a perfect 12-of-12 in back-to-back games at WSU and against USC, breaking the UO single-game record for field goal percentage. The incredible run helped Hebard shoot 66.0 percent from the field in 2017-18, second-best in the nation.

## #24 RUTHY HEBARD

### SHE JUST DOESN'T MISS

Hebard has established herself as one of the most efficient players in NCAA history through her three-plus seasons in Eugene. With a .647 career field goal percentage, Hebard is on pace to shatter the Oregon all-time record of .590 set by Allison Lang (1980-84), and her current mark would also break the Pac-12 all-time record of .644 set by Kristin Folk (Stanford). The NCAA all-time record is .703 (Tamika Williams, UConn). So far in 2019-20, Hebard ranks No. 2 in the nation with a .697 (99-142) mark from the field.

### DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

Hebard ranks fifth in Oregon history and is tied for second among active NCAA players with 46 career double-doubles. The 6'4" forward has had 14 double-doubles in each of the last two seasons after notching 11 as a freshman in 2016-17, and she has posted a double-double in seven of Oregon's first 13 games so far in 2019-20, including five straight to open the season.

Hebard tied the Oregon single-game record with 16 made field goals while notching the second 30-point game of her career. Sabally was brilliant in a 25-point performance in Oregon's exhibition win over Team USA on Nov. 9, but then missed the Ducks' first three regular season games as she traveled overseas to play for the German Women's National Team in the FIBA women's Eurobasket 2021 qualifiers. Sabally posted 23 points, nine rebounds and six assists in a win over North Macedonia before going an astounding 21-of-21 from the free-throw line for 33 points while adding 10 rebounds in a narrow loss to Croatia.

**WELCOME TO OUR SIDE, MINYON**

Minyon Moore has been a familiar face for the Ducks over the last three seasons as a standout guard for the Pac-12 foe USC Trojans. Moore graduated from USC in three years and used the NCAA's graduate transfer rule to join the Ducks for her final season of eligibility, and she owns career totals of 1,281 career points, 512 assists and 240 steals in 102 career games (76 starts).

Moore had five steals on five different occasions in 2018-19, and she has recorded eight steals in a game twice so far in her career.

**WAIT ... HOW MANY FREE THROWS?**

The best offensive game of Moore's career came on 12/1/17, when the guard poured in a career-high 34 points in a win at Loyola Marymount while going an astounding 21-of-23 from the free-throw line. Moore's 21 made free throws matched the USC single-game record. The UO single-game record is 17 (Ionescu).

In her official Oregon debut on Nov. 11 vs. Northeastern, Moore racked up nine points, six rebounds and a team-high 10 assists.

Kelly Graves is in his sixth season at the helm of the Oregon women's basketball program. He was named the seventh head coach in program history on April 7, 2014. On March 20, 2019, Graves and UO agreed to terms on a contract extension that will keep him in Eugene through the 2025-26 season.

Graves entered the 2019-20 campaign with a record of 124-52 in his previous five seasons with the Ducks and a 551-254 overall head coaching mark over 25 seasons, which includes three years at Big Bend CC. He is 506-214 all-time as a Div. I head coach, with stops at Saint Mary's, Gonzaga and Oregon. As a head coach, Graves has won 12 regular season conference titles and reached the NCAA Tournament 11 times. In tournament play, he boasts one trip to the Final Four, four career trips to the Elite Eight and six total Sweet 16 appearances. His teams have won 20-plus games in 12 of the last 13 seasons and 17 total times. Graves has coached seven all-Americans, including three-time selections Courtney Vandersloot (Gonzaga) and Jillian Alleyne (Oregon). Sabrina Ionescu enters her senior season in 2019-20 as a two-time unanimous first-team all-American.

In 2018-19, Oregon won a second straight Pac-12 regular season title after going 16-2 in conference play. Graves and the Ducks were ranked as high as No. 2 in the AP poll and earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament for a second consecutive year. Sabrina Ionescu was named the Pac-12 player of the year for a second straight season as well, before earning the first national player of the year recognitions in program history, from the WBCA (Wade Trophy) and the Wooden Award. The Ducks went 33-5 for a second straight year in 2018-19, capped by the program's first-ever trip to the Final Four. UO upset No. 1 seed Mississippi State, 88-84, in the Elite Eight in front of a raucous crowd of 11,538 at the Moda Center in Portland, Ore. The Ducks are 10-3 in the NCAA Tournament over the last three seasons, after winning just five total NCAA Tournament games previously in program history.

The 2017-18 campaign will always be a special one, as Oregon won its third ever Pac-12 regular season championship and the first Pac-12 Tournament title in program history. Graves and the Ducks went a program-record 33-5 on the season, including a record 16-2 in league play. The Ducks clinched the title over Stanford by sweeping the Arizona schools on the road in the final weekend of the regular season. Oregon also topped Stanford, 77-57, in the tournament championship game at KeyArena in Seattle.

Oregon earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosted games in Eugene for the first time since 2000, and reached the Elite Eight for a second straight season before falling to eventual national champion and No. 1 seed Notre Dame in the Spokane regional final.

Sophomores Sabrina Ionescu and Ruthy Hebard each earned a multitude of awards at the conclusion of the season. Ionescu was a unanimous first team All-American and was named the Nancy Leiberman national point guard of the year. Vandersloot won the Lieberman award in 2011 under Graves. Hebard was an honorable mention All-American and was named the Katrina McClain national power forward of the year. After earning Pac-12 player of the year honors in the regular season, Ionescu was also named the Pac-12 Tournament MVP after scoring a championship game record 36 points. The Walnut Creek, Calif., native also broke the NCAA career triple-doubles record in 2017-18. The Ducks were, statistically, one of the best shooting teams in the nation in 2018-19. Oregon finished the season ranked fourth in the NCAA in field goal percentage (50.0), third in three-point percentage (40.1) and seventh in the country in scoring (82.4 points per game).

Prior to the Ducks' incredible 2018-19 season, 2016-17 was considered the best year in program history. Oregon not only reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2005, but Graves and the No. 11 seed Ducks shocked the college basketball world by reaching the program's first ever Sweet 16 and Elite Eight.

With three true freshmen in the starting, the most in the tournament that year, the Ducks defeated No. 7 seed Temple, No. 2 seed Duke and No. 3 seed Maryland before falling to No. 1 seed UConn in the Bridgeport regional final. Graves became the only coach in NCAA history to take two double digit seeds (Gonzaga in 2011, Oregon in 2017) to the Elite Eight. The Ducks' exciting tournament run was fueled by Graves' work on the recruiting trail the year prior, as he signed the No. 3 ranked class in the nation, highlighted by USA Today national high school player of the year, Ionescu. The lead guard would go on to be named the ESPNW and USBWA national freshman of the year, in addition to all-Pac-12 and Pac-12 freshman of the year. Oregon's offense under Graves was typically efficient in 2016-17, ranking in the top-30 of the NCAA in field goal percentage (45.0), three-point percentage (39.2) and assists (16.5 assists per game).

Graves guided the Ducks to a 24-11 record and an appearance in the semifinals of the WNIT in 2015-16. Oregon's 24 wins was just one shy of the previous program record of 25, set in both 1980-81 and 1998-99. UO's 33 wins in 2017-18 is now the record. The Ducks began the season with a perfect 11-0 record, the second-best start in program history. The Ducks led the NCAA in three-point shooting at 42.1 percent and ranked sixth overall in field goal percentage, shooting 46.6 percent. At the end of the 2016 season, star forward Alleyne, a two-time third team All-American under Graves, was selected in the second round of the WNBA draft, the Ducks' first player drafted since 2012.

Graves went 13-17 in his first season with the Ducks in 2014-15, taking a team built to run-and-gun under former head coach Paul Westhead and instilling strong fundamentals and a tough defense-first philosophy. Oregon held their opponents under 70 points 14 times in 2014-15 after allowing an NCAA-worst 89.1 points per game in 2013-14. The new offense also got going as Graves led his Ducks to a 66-64 win over No. 19 ranked Stanford in the regular season finale, UO's first win against the Cardinal since 2004. Alleyne was named a third team All-American and first team all-Pac-12 following the season, making the jump from honorable mention in both as a sophomore.

Oregon is Graves' fourth head coaching position, previously leading the programs at Big Bend Community College (1989-92), Saint Mary's (1997-2000) and Gonzaga (2000-14).

Graves' coaching career started at Big Bend CC in Moses Lake, Wash., where he accepted an assistant coaching position on the men's team, but after the women's coach left, he moved over to lead the women's program instead.

In three seasons (1989-90 through 1991-92) Graves took a four-win team his first season to a 23-10 record in his final year, the first 20-plus win year in program history. Graves was inducted into the Northwest Athletic Conference Hall of Fame in 2018.

Graves left Big Bend CC to become an assistant coach under Jim Sollars at the University of Portland prior to the 1992-93 season. Following four years with the Pilots, Graves was named the head coach at Saint Mary's for the 1997-98 campaign. Graves advanced to his first NCAA Tournament with the Gaels during the 1998-99 season, his second of three seasons at Saint Mary's, and went to seven more over 14 seasons at Gonzaga.

Graves left Saint Mary's for Gonzaga for the 2000-01 season. His first year with the Bulldogs, his team went 5-23, including 0-14 in WCC play. But by his third year at Gonzaga, the Bulldogs went 18-12 overall and went to the WNIT the following season. Gonzaga won the first 10 straight WCC titles under Graves during the 2004-05 campaign when his squad went 28-4 overall and 14-0 in league play. Including that year, Graves and Gonzaga lost just 12 total conference games over his final 10 years leading the program.

Gonzaga's first NCAA Tournament appearance came in 2006-07, when the Bulldogs went 24-10 and 13-1 in WCC, and after a WNIT bid in 2007-08, Gonzaga advanced to six straight NCAA Tournaments. Graves and the 'Zags advanced to the Sweet 16 for three straight years (2010, 2011, 2012) and went to the Elite 8 in 2011. Overall, Graves brought eight West Coast Conference Coach of the Year awards and a 382-162 (.696) Div. I head coaching record to Eugene in 2014, with a 427-202 record overall before joining the Ducks.

"Kelly Graves is a great guy and one of the best coaches in America," said UConn head coach Geno Auriemma when Graves was hired in 2014. "Oregon is a place with tremendous women's basketball potential and Kelly is the perfect person to lead the Ducks to the next level. I won't be surprised when Oregon is competing for Pac-12 championships, and contending on a national level, in the near future."

Graves added USA Basketball to his resume in the summer of 2012, becoming an assistant coach with the U18 women's basketball squad and helping the team to a gold medal at the 2012 FIBA Americas. He again coached for USA Basketball in the summer of 2013. As an assistant, he helped the USA U19 squad win the FIBA Women's World Championship.

Graves and his wife Mary have three sons - Max (1995) Jackson (1997) and Will (2000). Max graduated from UO in 2017 and is now working with the Dallas Mavericks. Jack is an assistant coach with the Lane CC women's basketball team and Will graduated from South Eugene HS in 2018 and is a member of the Gonzaga men's basketball team.

**ELITE EIGHT: #2 Oregon 88, #1 Mississippi State 84**

- » Set new single-season program records for team points scored (3,227) and free-throw percentage (.766).
- » Shattered the program's single-season record for attendance at Matthew Knight Arena with an average of 7,148 per game.

**DUCKS REPEAT AS PAC-12 CHAMPS**

- » Oregon went 16-2 in conference play for the second straight season in 2018-19 en route to its second consecutive Pac-12 regular season championship.
- » Fourth Pac-12 title in program history.
- » Joined Stanford as the only Pac-12 programs to win the regular season conference championship outright in back-to-back seasons.
- » Only Stanford (3 times) has won the outright Pac-12 regular season title three or more years in a row.

**OREGON ALL OVER PAC-12 AWARDS**

- » **SABRINA IONESCU** was named the Pac-12 player of the year for the second straight season, becoming the seventh player in league history to win back-to-back POY honors.
- » Ionescu is the first player in UO history to win the league's top honor more than once, and the third player overall.
- » Ionescu was joined on the all-Pac-12 team by **MAITE CAZORLA**, **RUTHY HEBARD** and **SATOU SABALLY**, giving UO the most all-conference selections in program history.
- » Ionescu and Hebard joined Jillian Alleyne, Shaquala Williams and Stefanie Kasperski as three-time all-Pac-12 selections from Oregon.
- » **KELLY GRAVES** was named Pac-12 coach of the year for the first time in his career.
- » Graves joined Jody Runge (1994, 99) as the only UO head coaches to ever earn conference coach of the year honors.

**RECORD-SETTING BLOWOUTS**

- » Oregon posted its largest-ever conference win in a 102-43 victory over Colorado on Feb. 3; the 59-point blowout shattered the previous record of 46 (1987 at WSU).
- » The Ducks handed No. 11 Stanford an 88-48 loss on its home floor on 2/10/19, giving legendary head coach Tara VanDerveer her worst ever loss with the Cardinal.
- » UO's 40-point win over the No. 11 Cardinal snapped Stanford's 22-game home winning streak and the Ducks' 29-game losing streak in Maples Pavilion.

**SMOTHERING DEFENSE**

- » Oregon held its opponents to four points or less in a quarter on four different occasions in 2018-19.
- » The Ducks blanked Arizona in the fourth quarter on 3/1/19 in Tucson, outscoring the Wildcats 19-0 while holding UA to 0-of-13 shooting without a free-throw attempt.
- » UO's shutout fourth quarter against Arizona was the first for the program since the NCAA moved to quarters in 2015-16.
- » The Ducks limited Colorado to only two points, both coming via free throws, on 0-for-13 shooting in the opening quarter on 2/3/19 in Eugene; UO led 27-2 after the first.
- » Oregon held opponents to just four points in a quarter twice last season - 12/2/18 vs. LBSU (20) and 1/20/19 vs. Arizona (10).

**PILLARS OF THE PROGRAM**

The Ducks said goodbye to two of the most influential players in program history following the historic 2018-19 season in **MAITE CAZORLA** and **OTI GILDON**. Cazorla finished her career as Oregon's all-time leader with 146 games played (all starts), and Gildon is second at 143. Cazorla also ranks second in UO history in career assists (691), fourth in steals (201), fourth in made three-pointers (211) and seventh in free-throw percentage (.790). "They're ones that really got this thing started," said **KELLY GRAVES**.

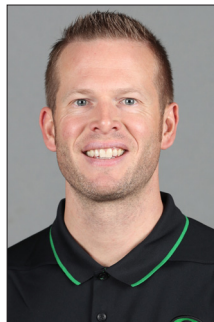
