KEY STORYLINES

- Oregon closes out the 2022 season by hosting Oregon State in The Rivalry Friday at 7 p.m. at Papé Field (Pac-12 Network).
- The Ducks have played the second-toughest schedule in the nation according to the NCAA's latest RPI report.
- Oregon will recognize 10 seniors on Friday: **Chai Cortez**, **True Dydasco**, **Kess Elmore**, **Madeline Gravante**, **Zoe Hasenauer**, **Bel Rolley**, **Lexi Romero**, **Caitlin Shaw**, **Croix Soto** and student digital media manager **Scott Boldt**.
- Zoe Hasenauer** became Oregon's career leader in assists with her 19th Oct. 30 at Arizona.
- No one has started more matches in an Oregon uniform than **Zoe Hasenauer**. She earned that distinction in Oregon's Oct. 14 game at WSU when she passed former teammate Chardonny Curran (84, 2017-21) and now shows 89 starts. Hasenauer has played in 91 consecutive matches and ranks among the UO career top 10 in eight different categories.
- Leah Freeman** became Oregon's all-time leader in shutouts when she recorded the 18th of her career Oct. 6 at Utah (1-0). She leads the Pac-12 in saves (108) and saves per game (6.75). Freeman is also currently the Ducks' career leader in goals against average (1.03).
- Leah Freeman's** 108 saves on the season lead all power conference goalkeepers and rank ninth overall in the NCAA. That total is currently fourth on the UO single-season saves list.
- Leah Freeman** made a career-high 14 saves in Oregon's 2-0 upset of No. 15 Washington (Sept. 23). For her efforts, Freeman was named Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Week.
- Senior **Jordan Snyder** broke through in a big way earlier this season by scoring the first two goals of her career. She netted the game-tying goal in the 78th minute versus Texas (Sept. 1) and added another Sept. 4 against Boise State. Prior to those two games, Snyder had played in 15 career games and had attempted two shots in her four seasons in Eugene.
- #ProDuck **Marissa Everett** claimed her first NWSL championship last Saturday when the Portland Thorns defeated the Kansas City Current 2-0 in the title match. Oregon also had a #ProDuck on Kansas City in the form of **Chardonny Curran**.
- Due to a series of injuries that saw the Ducks missing seven starters at one point, 22 different Ducks have started at least once this year.

BACK TO THE QUACK

The matches last month at Utah and Colorado marked the first time this season that Oregon's seven returning starters from 2021 – **Leah Freeman**, **Kess Elmore**, **Zoe Hasenauer**, **Caitlin Shaw**, **Chai Cortez**, **Anna Phillips** and **Croix Soto** – were on the field together. At one point in September, Oregon was missing seven starters. Elmore and Soto, an all-Pac-12 defender, missed the first eight games of the season due to injury, while Shaw sat out the first 11 matches.

RESTOCKING THE SHELVES

As mentioned, at one point in September, Oregon was missing seven starters. Because of that, 22 different Ducks have made at least one start this season, but only two – **Zoe Hasenauer** and **Anna Phillips** – have started every match. The Ducks regained some depth with three starters off the 2021 squad – **Kess Elmore**, **Caitlin Shaw** and **Croix Soto** – finally returning to the field this season. The Ducks also regained the services of starter **Bel Rolley**, who was injured Aug. 27 at Gonzaga. She was able to return for the Sept. 11 Hofstra match after missing two games. The return of those players helps offset the loss of three 2022 starters who are out for the year. Both **Callan Harrington** and **True Dydasco** were taken out in the San Francisco game (Aug. 21) and **Livvy Moore** went out against Boise State (Sept. 4).

WEEK ELEVEN RECAP

The Ducks dropped a pair of matches in Arizona. Oct. 30 at Arizona, **Zoe Hasenauer** assisted on **Kaitlyn Paculba's** first goal of the season in a 4-1 loss. That assist – Hasenauer's 19th – broke the UO career record. Oct. 27 at Arizona State, **Lexi Romero** scored her third goal of the season in a 5-1 defeat.

WEEK TEN RECAP

The Ducks went 0-1-1 against a pair of ranked teams from the Bay Area. Oct. 20 versus No. 7 Stanford, the Cardinal made a goal in the sixth minute stand up in a 1-0 victory. Oct. 23 against No. 25 California, **Kess Elmore** scored in the fourth minute for Oregon after **Chai Cortez** found her running down the left side, but the Golden Bears got the equalizer late in the second half for a 1-1 draw.

WEEK NINE RECAP

Trinity Morales scored off a rebound of her own shot in the 10th minute and **Leah Freeman** made 10 saves as the Ducks tied Washington State 1-1 Oct. 14 in Pullman. **Zoe Hasenauer** started her 85th career match to break the UO school record.

WEEK EIGHT RECAP

Leah Freeman became the all-time leader in career shut outs as the Ducks went 1-1 on their trip to the Mountain Schools. Freeman made seven saves, including one on a penalty kick in the 69th minute, as Oregon blanked Utah 1-0 Oct. 6 at Ute Field. It was Freeman's school-record 18th career shut out. On the offensive end, **Lexi Romero's** pressure led to an own goal by Utah in the 54th minute. Coming out of halftime, Oregon pressed for a goal and it paid off when Romero raced Utah goalkeeper Kasey Wardle for a loose ball near the end line. Wardle dove for the ball as Romero kicked it and the ball trickled away from Wardle. That allowed Romero the opportunity she needed to cross the ball to **Kess Elmore** in front of the goal. Elmore redirected the pass at the goal line and the ball deflected off a Utah defender for the score. Oct. 9 at Colorado, Freeman had six saves but the Buffaloes prevailed in a 1-0 defensive tilt.

WEEK SEVEN RECAP

Zoe Hasenauer tied the UO career record with her 18th assist, but the Ducks dropped a pair of games to No. 1 UCLA (3-1) and No. 20 USC (4-0). **Alice Barbieri** scored her first career goal against the Bruins. Freshman **Julia Richards**, starting in net for **Leah Freeman**, had 12 saves against the Trojans.

WEEK SIX RECAP

Kess Elmore scored in her first match of the season and **Leah Freeman** made a career-high 14 saves – one shy of the school record – as Oregon upended No. 15 Washington 2-0 Sept. 23 in front of 807 at Papé Field. The Ducks snapped a six-match losing streak to the Huskies while handing UW its first loss of the season. It was also Freeman's 17th career shutout, tying Abby Steele (2011-14) for the school record. Oregon utilized Freeman's strong leg to initiate a give-and-go goal in the 11th minute. Freeman drilled a goal kick well into Washington territory and **Ajanae Respass** won the ball 35 yard out from the Huskies' goal. She slipped a pass to **Kaitlyn Paculba** who was breaking free down the right side. Paculba carried the ball to the end line before feeding a pass back to Respass, who was crashing down on the near post. Respass then lined a shot across the goal and into the far side of the net. It was her team-leading fourth goal of the season. Oregon got some breathing room in the 70th minute when Elmore feathered a shot through traffic on a set piece. **Chai Cortez** directed a corner kick into the middle of the Huskies' box and the ball ricocheted around before squirting out to Elmore who was waiting just outside the 18-yard line. Her shot split two UW defenders and rolled past the Huskies' keeper for a 2-0 lead. While Respass and Elmore were making the most of their chances at the offensive end, Oregon's defense plugged up the middle, frustrating Washington all night. As a result most of the Huskies' 24 shots, while on frame, came from distance and were easily handled by Freeman. Freeman's 14 saves were the most by a Duck keeper in 19 years. Dominique Lainez tied Sarah Peters' school record when she made 15 saves against Texas A&M back in 2003. It was Oregon's first win over a ranked team since defeating No. 3 Stanford, 2-1, in the 2020 season. This was Oregon's first win against Washington since Nov. 1, 2015 (1-0, OT).

FREEMAN NAMED PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After helping the Ducks upset No. 15 Washington 2-0 on Sept. 23, **Leah Freeman** was named the Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Week. Freeman made a career-high 14 saves in the shutout which is the most in the Pac-12 this season and was just one save shy of the Oregon school record. The win snapped the Huskies' six-game winning streak in the series. The 14 saves for the junior from Berkeley, Calif., were the most by a Duck keeper since Dominique Lainez tied Sarah Peters' school record of 15 saves against Texas A&M in 2003. The win also marked the 17th career shutout for Freeman which tied the UO career record. This is Freeman's fourth career Pac-12 Goalkeeper of the Week award (Oct. 11, 2021; Sept. 27, 2021; March 29, 2021).

NEW MARK FOR FREEMAN

Leah Freeman has reached career highs in saves three times this season. She tied her previous career high with nine saves against San Francisco (8-21). She did that one better with 10 saves at Gonzaga (8-27). She then obliterated that mark with 14 saves Sept. 23 against Washington. Freeman leads the Pac-12 in both total saves (102) and saves per game (6.80) and is sixth and ninth nationally in those categories, respectively.

FREEMAN MOVES TO THE TOP OF UO CAREER GAA LIST

The Aug. 27 game at Gonzaga marked **Leah Freeman's** 35th career game, which was significant because 35 games played is the minimum requirement to be eligible for Oregon's career goals against average list. By meeting that requirement, Freeman entered the list at the No. 1 position and now holds it with a 0.94 career goals against average. **Abby Steele** (2011-14) was bumped to second at 1.14 GAA.

WEEK FIVE RECAP

Trinity Morales scored the first goal of her career in the sixth minute and **Leah Freeman** made a number of high-flying saves, but it was an all-around team effort that earned Oregon a 1-1 draw at Portland Sept. 16 in front of 3,062 fans at Merlo Field. Oregon took a 1-0 lead just over five minutes into the match when **Ajanae Respass** blasted a close-range shot that was initially saved by Portland goalkeeper Cadence Rutledge. The ball deflected well outside of the 18-yard box and eventually found Morales, who sent a scorching line drive into the right side of the net from 25 yards out. An extended possession led to the tying goal for Portland off a corner kick in the 60th minute. Other than that, it was Freeman backing a relentless effort from the Ducks. She made leaping saves four times, two in each half. She swatted away a shot that was headed to the upper right corner in the 18th minute, and then got airborne again to push a shot over the crossbar in the 35th minute. She climbed the ladder two more times to make saves in the last 10 minutes of the match and finished with six saves. The two teams played a fairly even match, with Oregon attempting nine shots to Portland's 13. After dropping the first 16 games of the series versus Portland, the Ducks are now undefeated in the last four meetings (2-0-2). **Zoe Hasenauer** and **Chai Cortez** became the first Ducks not to have lost to the Pilots in a four- or five-year career.

WEEK FOUR RECAP

Lexi Romero scored her second goal in as many games and **Leah Freeman** and the Oregon defense made it stand up for a 1-0 win over Hofstra in a match played in a constant downpour Sept. 11 at Hofstra Soccer Stadium. **Ajanae Respass** assisted on Romero's game-winner in the 38th minute. Freeman made six saves and the Oregon defense posted its second shutout of the season. Sept. 8 against Santa Clara, Romero scored her first goal as a Duck, but it wasn't enough as Oregon dropped a 4-1 decision.

WEEK THREE RECAP

Senior **Jordan Snyder** scored the first two goals of her career in Week 3. The first came Sept. 1 in the 78th minute against Texas as Oregon rallied for a 1-1 draw. Freshman **Ainsley Fink**, making her first appearance as a Duck, collected the ball on the right side near midfield. She then chipped the ball 20 yards up the middle to **Zoe Hasenauer** who settled the ball at her feet with a perfect chest trap. Hasenauer pivoted and split the Longhorn defense with a one-hopper that Snyder punched past Texas goalkeeper Savannah Madden from 10 yards out. Snyder scored again in the Sept. 4 3-1 loss to Boise State. Freshmen **Ajanae Respass** and **Caitlyn McCulloch** got their first assists as Ducks on the goal.

SNYDER SHINES

Senior **Jordan Snyder** broke through in a big way in week three, scoring the first two goals of her career. She netted the game-tying goal in the 78th minute versus Texas (Sept. 1) and added another Sept. 4 against Boise State. Prior to those two games, Snyder had played in 15 career games and had attempted two shots in her four seasons in Eugene.

WEEK TWO RECAP

Ajanae Respass scored twice and **Leah Freeman** made a huge play on a breakaway in the final seconds as Oregon and Gonzaga played to a 2-2 draw Aug. 27 at Luger Field. Freeman made a career-high 10 saves in the Ducks' first game in Spokane since 2006. Oregon opened the scoring on a counterattack in the 16th minute. From midfield, freshman **Trinity Morales** drove a long pass up the middle to Respass at Gonzaga's 18 yard-line. Respass then slipped the ball through the legs of Gonzaga goalkeeper Lyza Bosselmann for a 1-0 lead. Gonzaga tied the game in the 21st minute when Erin Healy scored on a rebounded shot. The Ducks took the lead again, 2-1, less a minute

into the second half. Respass forced a turnover in the Bulldogs' half and found **Livvy Moore** on the left side of the box. Moore then drew the defense to her before threading the ball back to Respass who hammered a shot to the right side of the net. Gonzaga scored in the 83rd minute to knot the game at 2-2, setting the stage for some late game heroics by Freeman. The junior from Berkeley, Calif., made seven saves in the second half, three of which came in the final 4:30. In the final seconds of the match, Gonzaga got behind Oregon's defense on a breakaway, but Freeman rushed out of the net to smother the Bulldogs' final shot at the top of the box. Both of Oregon's goals and assists against Gonzaga came from freshmen.

WEEK ONE RECAP

Oregon went 1-0-1 on the opening weekend of the 2022 season. In the season opener, **Callan Harrington** scored her first career goal (assisted by **Livvy Moore** and **True Dydasco**) for a 1-0 lead just before halftime. **Ajanae Respass** put the game away with a rebound goal in the 89th minute for a 2-0 win over New Mexico State (Aug. 18). **Leah Freeman** made five saves to earn the shutout versus the Aggies. Three days later against San Francisco, Freeman matched her career high with nine saves as the Ducks rallied for a 1-1 tie. After USF took the lead in the first half, Dydasco knotted the game up with a goal from 35 yards out in the 61st minute (assisted by **Chai Cortez**).

HARRINGTON SCORES IN DEBUT

Callan Harrington made her long-awaited Oregon debut Aug. 18 against New Mexico State and scored on her very first shot attempt. Harrington holds the state of Oregon high school record for career goals with 133, one more than soccer Hall of Famer and U.S. national team star Tiffany Milbrett. Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic and untimely injuries, it had been nearly three years since Harrington last took the field in 2019 in the Oregon 6A state championship match.

TRUE STORY

True Dydasco got her sixth season off to a quick start, assisting on the game-winning goal Aug. 18 versus New Mexico State and scoring the tying goal three days later against San Francisco.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR FREEMAN

Goalkeeper **Leah Freeman** was named to the 2022 Hermann Trophy Watch List. The Hermann Trophy, presented annually by the Missouri Athletic Club, is the nation's highest individual honor recognizing the National Player of the Year as determined by the voting of Division I coaches who are members of United Soccer Coaches. Nine players from the Pac-12 were among the 61 nationally named to the Hermann Trophy preseason list. Freeman was also one of 12 players nationally named to the United Soccer Coaches goalkeeper watch. Additionally, Top Drawer Soccer named Freeman to their Preseason Best XI Third Team as the No. 29 player overall nationally. The first team All-Pac-12 and All-Pacific Region selection led the Pac-12 and tied for 15th nationally with a school-record nine shutouts in 2021. Freeman ranked third in the league in both goals against average (0.87) and save percentage (.839) last season.

7 STARTERS RETURN

Oregon returns seven starters from a 2021 squad that went 9-4-6 overall and tied for fifth in the Pac-12 (4-4-3). The Ducks have all-conference goalkeeper **Leah Freeman** (1st team) and all-league defenders **Croix Soto** (2nd team) and **Chai Cortez** (3rd team), as well as sophomore **Anna Phillips** returning on defense. Fifth-year senior **Zoe Hasenauer**, a 2021 United Soccer Coaches all-region selection, and senior **Caitlin Shaw** anchor the midfield. Up front, sixth-year senior forward **Kess Elmore** scored three goals in 2021.

NOTES

12 NEWCOMERS IN DUCKS' No. 25 RECRUITING CLASS

The Ducks signed 12 newcomers for the fall of 2021. The class was ranked 25th nationally by Top Drawer Soccer. It features four-star recruits **Kristen Conti** (Tustin, Calif.), **Trinity Morales** (Tucson, Ariz.) and **Ajanae Respass** (Highlands Ranch, Colo.). Other freshmen include **Anna Emperador** (Elk Grove, Calif.), **Ainsley Fink** (Las Vegas, Nev.), **Kate Fuetterer** (Glendale, Calif.), **Caitlyn McCulloch** (Orinda, Calif.), **Livvy Moore** (Deer Park, Wash.), **Rieleigh Petkovich** (Prescott, Ariz.), **Julia Richards** (Portland) and **Anna Solomon** (Lafayette, Calif.), as well as USC transfer **Bel Rolley**, a redshirt junior.

#PRODUCKS

Two Ducks are currently rostered in the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL). **Marissa Everett** is in her fourth season with the Portland Thorns and had one goal in 10 matches (four starts) in 2022. **Chardonay Curran** had 17 appearances and one start in her rookie season with the Kansas City Current. Everett became the first Duck to win a NWSL championship when the Thorns defeated Kansas City, 2-0, in the 2022 championship match.

CURRAN DRAFTED 17TH OVERALL BY KANSAS CITY

Chardonay Curran, the player who appeared in the most games in UO history (92), added another program milestone when she became the highest-ever draft pick for the Ducks. Curran was selected with the 17th overall pick by the Kansas City Current in the second round of the 2022 National Women's Soccer League Draft. She is the first player in program history to be drafted in the first two rounds of the NWSL Draft.

NOW THAT'S RECYCLING

Oregon is known for being a green campus, but this takes repurposing to another level. In 2019, the athletic department doubled the candle wattage of the stadium lights at Pape' Filed with the addition of four new light towers that used to stand at historic Hayward Field. With Hayward Field undergoing a total reconstruction in advance of hosting the IAAF World Track & Field Championships in 2022, the athletic department was able to repurpose four of the light towers, which make night games at Pape' Field brighter both in person and for those watching on television or online.

FORMER S-A PHIL KNIGHT PLEDGES \$500 MILLION FOR SCIENCE

UO graduate and former track and field student-athlete Phil Knight, the co-founder of Nike, and his wife Penny made a half-a-billion dollar commitment to scientific research at the University of Oregon. It is the largest gift ever bestowed to a public university. The Knight's \$500 million donation funded the ongoing construction of a new science complex that opened in December of 2020. Research at the new site focuses on life sciences such as biology, microbiology, biochemistry and other disciplines.

Graeme Abel was named the fourth women's soccer head coach of the modern era on Dec. 30, 2019, and has made an immediate impact on the program.

Now in his third season at the helm, he is 19-17-17 and coached the Ducks to consecutive winning seasons (2020-21) for the first time in 40 years.

Oregon's 2021 team posted the program's best record (9-4-6) since 2006 and its tie for fifth in the Pacific-12 Conference was the Ducks' best finish in 15 years. Oregon held No. 3 UCLA scoreless on its home field for the first time in three years. The Ducks' 0.97 goals against average was the fourth-best in program history. On the offensive side of the field, the Ducks' 86 points (29 goals, 28 assists) were the second-most in program history.

The Ducks set program records for the most all-Pac-12 picks (four) and United Soccer Coaches all-Pacific Region selections (four). Leah Freeman became the first Duck goalkeeper named to the first team for both the Pac-12 and the Pacific Region. Ally Cook was a second team all-region pick and a third-team member for the Pac-12, while Croix Soto was a second team selection for the Pac-12 and a third-team regional honoree by the coaches. Zoe Hasenauer was a second-team all-region pick and Chai Cortez was named to the all-Pac-12 third team.

Abel's first squad in 2020 (played in the spring of 2021) broke through with Oregon's first winning record (6-5-5) since 2006. During that season, the Ducks defeated Stanford, the defending NCAA champions, for the first time in program history and also won at California, another UO first.

His team broke a 40 year-old record for goals against average, as the Ducks allowed just 0.69 goals per game. Three players made the all-Pac-12 third team, Hasenauer, Soto and Freeman. Freeman was also named to the Pac-12 all-freshman team.

Abel came to Oregon after serving as an assistant coach for the 2015 and 2019 FIFA World Cup champion U.S. Women's National Team.

Abel joined the staff of U.S. head coach Jill Ellis as an assistant coach in February of 2015 and helped Team USA navigate through seven World Cup matches, eventually setting numerous records in defeating Japan, 5-2, in the championship match to win the United States' first World Cup title in 16 years.

The team went 6-0-1 during the course of the tournament, which was played on artificial turf in Canada, and allowed opponents just three goals.

The 2019 World Cup in France marked one of the most dominant performances by any nation. Team USA went undefeated, 7-0, and outscored the opposition 26-3. The Americans defeated the Netherlands 2-0 in the championship match to claim back-to-back World Cup titles.

Abel was also on the staff of the U.S. Women's National Teams that won the 2016 and 2018 CONCACAF titles and was part of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro.

Abel worked extensively with numerous women's national youth programs during his time with Team USA. He was an assistant for the U-20 U.S. Women's National Team at the 2016 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in Papua New Guinea and also served as an assistant for the U-17 U.S. Women's National Team from 2012 to 2015.

Prior to joining U.S. Soccer, Abel spent eight seasons coaching collegiately. He was an associate head coach for Oklahoma's 2014 NCAA Tournament team, part of his two stints with the Sooners from 2008 to 2010 and 2012 to 2015. He helped lead Washington State to the 2011 NCAA Tournament during his tenure as an assistant coach from 2010 to 2012. Before Oklahoma and Washington State, Abel worked three years as an assistant for Nevada from 2005 to 2007.

Abel began his coaching career as a graduate assistant in 2004 at his alma mater, Brescia University in Owensboro, Ky.

During his youth soccer years in England, Abel was on the books at Everton FC from 1994 to 1997. He also played with Stockport County FC from 1997 to 1999 before coming to the United States to attend college at Lindsey Wilson College in Columbia, Ky. He was an NAIA All-American as a freshman at Lindsey Wilson and named the 1999 NAIA National Tournament MVP after leading the Blue Raiders to the national championship.

In 2001, he went back to England to play for Chester City FC, but then returned to college, this time at Brescia where he was once again an NAIA All-American and a two-time Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Association Player of the Year.

Abel has a USSF "B" Coaching License and an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma.

Abel and his wife, the former Katie Schoene, who played collegiately under Tara Erickson at Portland State and was a volunteer assistant coach under Erickson at Oregon in 2007, have three children - son, Kian and daughters Lila and Ava.
