TALKING POINTS

THE MATCHUP

Oregon leads the all-time series 172-127, while the Ducks hold a 15-5 advantage under coach Altman.

» UO has dropped the last two and won the previous four in a row.

» The series dates back to 1914, when the Ducks lost the first meeting 24-18.

MOUNTAIN SCHOOL SWEEP

Oregon swept the mountain schools road trip for the first time in program history after defeating Utah 80-77.

» Oregon has now won nine-straight vs. Utah and 18 of the last 19 contests vs. the Utes.

» The Ducks made a season-high 13 three-pointers, behind 5 from Will Richardson and 3 from Quincy Guerrier (both individual season-highs).

» Richardson became the first Oregon player since Payton Pritchard in 19-20 to notch at least 25 points and 5 assists.

BEAT THE BUFFALOES

The Ducks beat Colorado 66-51 on 2/3 for the first-ever road win over the Buffaloes.

» CU's 51 points were a series low, with UO holding them to just 16 points in the second half.

» The Ducks forced 20 turnovers and finished with a season-best 12 steals.

OSU SWEEP

Oregon beat Oregon State 78-56 on 1/29, sweeping the regular season series for the first time since 2016-17.

» The 22-point margin of victory was the largest since defeating the Beavs by 42 points on 1/14/17.

» It was UO's first time holding a Pac-12 team to a field goal percentage of 30% or less, while shooting 55% or better from the field since 2/1/18 vs. Cal.

UW DUB

Oregon beat Washington 84-56 on 1/23. UW scored the first basket, but UO would lead for the remaining 38:16.

» The 28-point margin of victory was the largest in series history, which dates back to 1904.

» UO forced a season-best 23 turnovers, most since 2018-19, scoring 25 points off turnovers.

DID YOU KNOW?



UO became the first Pac-12 team to win at least 8 of their first 11 conference games after starting 0-2, since Stanford in 2005-06.

ALTMAN'S DUCKS...

- » Are 207-28 when outrebounding the opponent.
- » Are 204-23 when holding opponents under 70 points (69 or fewer).
- » Are 178-57 when recording fewer turnovers than the opponent.
- » Are 22-6 in games decided in overtime.
- » Are one of three teams (Gonzaga, Michigan) to make the Sweet Sixteen in four of the last five years.
- » Have won four-straight games vs. conference opponents ranked in the AP top-five.
- » Have a winning record vs. every team in the conference besides Colorado.
- » Have been ranked in 83 AP polls.

WEEK OF WILL

Will Richardson won his second player of the week award on 1/17 after leading the Ducks to a 3-0 week on the road.

- » He won the award twice in January.
- » Richardson scored five of the Ducks 11 overtime points at UCLA, propelling the win.
- » His career-high 28 points helped the Ducks beat USC wire-to-wire. Richardson scored 19 points in the first half and finished with five three pointers and four assists.

HISTORIC ROAD WEEKEND

UO beat No. 3 UCLA on 1/13 and No. 5 USC on 1/15, becoming the first Pac-12 team to beat two top-10 teams in the same road trip.

- » The Ducks became the first team since Clemson in 1975-76 to beat consecutive top-five teams on the road.
- » UO men's and women's basketball each defeated consecutive top-10 opponents over the weekend, becoming the first program since at least 2000 to beat four AP top-ten teams in the span of a week.

GOOD DAY IN LA

UO beat No. 3 ranked UCLA on the road in overtime on 1/13.

- » The Bruins were the highest ranked opponent the Ducks have ever beaten on the road.
- » Jacob Young led the team with a season-high 23 points, with Richardson adding 16.
- » Altman is now 13-9 vs. UCLA, the only active coach (min. 20 games played) with a .500 or better win % vs. the Bruins.

700 CLUB

Dana Altman became the 24th head coach in Division I history with 700 DI wins on 1/13 after defeating No. 3 UCLA.

- » Altman is one of nine active coaches with at least 700.
- » He's one of two coaches in the 700 club with wins as a Pac-12 coach (Lute Olson, Arizona).
- » The winningest coach in school history, Altman also has the most wins in the Pac-12 tournament (20).

RIVALRY SERIES WIN

Oregon closed each half with a last-second three pointer to beat OSU for the 166th time.

- » Jacob Young gave the Ducks a four-point halftime lead with a three as the first half expired.
- » With the game tied at 74, Eric Williams Jr. hit the go-ahead triple with 0:13 remaining.
- » The Ducks have now won consecutive games in Corvallis for the first time since 2012-13.

PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Oregon point guard Will Richardson was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week on 1/3, his first career weekly honor.

- » Richardson led the Ducks to a comeback win over Utah on New Years Day, netting a career-best 26 points, including 23 in the second half.
- » He net 9-of-12 FGs and 5-of-6 3FGs on the night.

TWO 20-POINT SCORERS

The Ducks defeated Utah on 1/1, with Richardson (26) and Young (22) each scoring 20-plus.

- » The 26 points were a career-high for Richardson, who's played 99 games for the Ducks.
- » It was Young's season-best, he also added three steals and four assists.
- » UO trailed by six at halftime and outscored Utah by 19 points in the second half, the first win of the season after trailing at half.

GOODBYE WAVES

UO defeated Pepperdine 68-59 on 12/21, with Will Richardson scoring a game-high 19 points.

- » It was Richardson's fifth game this season with 17 or more.

- » Nate Bittle blocked four shots, the most by a Ducks player since 2018-19.

DEFEATING THE PILOTS

UO won their third wire-to-wire contest of the season, defeating Portland 96-71.

- » Quincy Guerrier followed his season-high outing at Stanford with 17 points on 8-of-12 FG.
- » N'Faly Dante reached 20 points for the first time this season, finishing one rebound shy of a double-double.

- » De'Vion Harmon also got his season-best, notching 19 points with two steals.

BENCH PRODUCTION

The Ducks finished with 29 bench points vs. Arizona State, the fourth time this season the bench has scored 20-plus.

- » Franck Kepnang scored a career high 17 points (7-9 FG), with four rebounds and a block.
- » Rivaldo Soares also net a career best with 11 points.

RIVERSIDE RECAP

UO defeated UC Riverside 71-65 on 12/1, improving to 3-0 all-time vs. the Highlanders.

- » It was the first game this season decided by 10 points or less, with a season high four lead changes on the night.
- » Eric Williams Jr. finished with 11 pts & a season-high 8 reb. He's scored 10+ in six-of-eight games this season.
- » It was Will Richardson's second game this season with 5 assists.

40-POINT WIN

UO defeated Montana 87-47 on 11/29, the largest win of the season and first 40+ point win since defeating Alabama State 114-56 on 11/17/17.

- » The Ducks shot 66.0% from the field, the highest percentage since making 70% vs. Boise State in 2019.
- » It's the third time under coach Altman that the team has shot above 65%.
- » Twelve Ducks scored in the contest, with 32 bench points.

WIN OVER CHAMINADE

The Ducks got their second 20-point win of the season on 11/22, defeating Chaminade 73-49.

- » UO held an opponent under 50 points for the first time since holding Portland to 41 on 12/19/20.
- » The Ducks dished out a season-high 19 assists, including 14 in the second half.
- » UO notched 42 points in the paint, their second 40-point paint performance of the season (48 vs. SMU).
- » 10 Ducks scored in the contest, with the bench contributing a season-best 36 points.

GAME 2 VS. SMU

UO led SMU wire-to-wire and improved to 97-7 in home non-conference games under Altman.

- » The Ducks shot 45.0 percent from three-point range and have combined for 20+ three's in the first two games of a season for the second time since 2010-11.
- » UO scored 22 points off turnovers and finished +20, allowing just two points off turnovers.
- » Jacob Young finished with 18 points, finishing with 12 first half points for the second-straight game.

SEASON OPENER

UO led Texas Southern wire-to-wire and improved to 10-2 in season openers under coach Altman.

- » The Ducks shot 90.5 percent from the free throw line, it's the team's 10th time shooting over 90% since 2010-11.
- » UO net 12 three pointers and improved to 29-5 under Altman when making 12 or more.
- » Will Richardson led all scorers, recording his fourth career 20-point game (4-0).

2022 DUCK SIGNEE SPOTLIGHT

The class of 2022 signees ranks 15th in the country according to 247Sports, with junior college players not considered for the rating.

- » UO is one of seven schools with two or more 5 star signees.

DIOR JOHNSON:

» Dior Johnson (6-3, 180) is the No. 1 ranked point guard on 247, and the 13th overall player in the country.

» Johnson averaged 23.3 points, 6.5 rebounds, 4.9 assists and 1.7 steals for Mayfair HS last season, before moving to the renowned Prolific Prep for this season. Current Ducks center Nate Bittle was a 5 star out of Prolific Prep last season.

» Altman said of Johnson: *Dior is an ultra-quick and fast point guard. He's a great facilitator that can score at all three levels. He has the ability to make others better and we are excited*

to have him and his family join our program.

KEL'EL WARE:

- » Kel'el Ware (7-0, 215) is the No. 6 rated center in the class and the 20th highest rated player in the class.
- » Ware led North Little Rock to a state championship last year, with 16.4 points, 8.8 rebounds and 4.6 blocks per game.
- » He has a season-high eight blocks already this season, with the Wildcats favored to repeat as state champs.
- » Altman said of Ware: *Kel'el is a seven-footer with great mobility and versatility. He has skill to both step out and score at the rim and is a very good shot blocker. We are excited to have Kel'el and his family join our program.*

TYRONE WILLIAMS:

- » Tyrone Williams (6-5, 200) was a second team NJCAA All-American last season, leading Grayson CC to a 19-3 record.
- » Williams was the nations leading JUCO scorer with 27.6 points per game.
- » He has already eclipsed 1,500 career points in his time at Grayson.
- » Altman said of Williams: *Tyrone will bring length and scoring to our program. He's a lefty scorer guard that has a knack for scoring at different levels.*

DISTINGUISHED DUCKS

- The Ducks started the season as one of two Pac-12 programs ranked in the AP top 25 poll.
- » It was the eighth time Oregon has been listed in the preseason poll and the 155th overall appearance.
- » The Ducks were picked to finish second in the Pac-12. It's the team's seventh consecutive preseason top four ranking.

PG1

- Guard Will Richardson was named to the Pac-12 preseason all-conference first team, his second-straight season earning preseason all-conference honors.
- » He is the only player in the conference to be named to each of the last two preseason all-conference teams.
- » Richardson is one of three Pac-12 players to shoot 40% or better from three in each of the last two seasons.
- » He was also named to the preseason watch lists for the Wooden Award as well as the Naismith Trophy.

RETURNERS

- In addition to Richardson, UO returns key contributors in redshirt senior Eric Williams Jr., junior N'Faly Dante and sophomore Franck Kepnang.
- » Williams is one of 36 players in program history to record 1,000 career points.
- » Dante saw action in six games last season and shot 65.5 percent from the field.
- » He holds the Matthew Knight Arena record for FG%, hitting 10-of-10 field goal attempts on Dec. 9, 2020 versus Florida A&M.
- » Kepnang shot 67.9% from the field last season and led the team in blocks nine times.

ALL-CONFERENCE ADDITIONS

- UO added two junior transfers this offseason, forward Quincy Guerrier (Syracuse) and guard De'Vion Harmon (Oklahoma).
- Both players were named to the Pac-12 preseason all-conference second team.
- » Guerrier helped Syracuse to last year's Sweet Sixteen and was named All-ACC third team.
- » He is one of 20 players nationwide to be named to the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year watch list.
- » Harmon earned Big 12 honorable mention at Oklahoma last year and notched four 20-point games.
- » Named to the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year watch list.

TALENTED TRANSFERS

- The Ducks added two additional transfers to this season's roster; guards Rivaldo Soares and Jacob Young.
- » Soares was the WJCAC player of the year and a NJCAA All-American at South Plains College.
- » Young ranked second in the Big Ten in steals (1.71) last season. He's played in 121 games for Texas and Rutgers.

TALL FIRS 2.0

- Oregon starts the season with two seven-foot freshmen, both native Oregonians.
- » Nate Bittle (Central Point, Ore.) was a five star recruit and is the eighth Oregon player named a McDonald's All-American.
- » Isaac Johnson (Nyssa, Ore.) was a four star recruit in 2019 and led American Fork (Utah) to the 6A state championship.

ALL-TIME ALTMAN

- Head Coach Dana Altman recorded his 700th career DI on 1/13 at UCLA.
- » He is the ninth active coach with at least 700 career DI wins.
- » Altman is one of five active coaches with 24-straight winning seasons (Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Bill Self and Jim Boeheim).

#PRODUCKS

- Eight UO alums started the NBA season on an opening day roster; Bol, Bol (Denver Nuggets), Dillon Brooks (Memphis Grizzlies), Troy Brown Jr. (Chicago Bulls), Chris Boucher (Toronto Raptors), Chris Duarte (Indiana Pacers), Lou King (Sacramento Kings), Eugene Omoruyi (Dallas Mavericks) and Payton Pritchard (Boston Celtics).

QUACK FACTS

- » Richardson recorded his 1,000th career point on 1/23 vs. UW. He became the 37th 1K scorer in school history.
- » Coach Altman won his 700th career game on 1/13 at UCLA.
- » The 35-point halftime lead vs. UW was the largest by UO over a Pac-12 opponent since 3/3/12 vs. Utah. (38)
- » With wins over No. 3 UCLA and No. 5 USC, UO became the first team since 1976 to beat consecutive top-5 teams on the road.
- » UO joins UConn (1990) and Illinois (2001) as the only teams to beat three-straight reigning Elite 8 teams since 1980 (beat OSU, UCLA, USC).
- » On 1/10 vs. OSU, Dante and Williams Jr. became the first pair of Ducks to record a double-double in the same Pac-12 game since Brown and Pritchard in 17-18.
- » UO trailed by six at halftime on 1/1 and outscored Utah by 19 points in the second half, the first win of the season after trailing at half.
- » Despite the 78-71 loss to Baylor, the Ducks were the first team to score 70 points vs. the defending champions this season, and the first team to lead the Bears at halftime.
- » The overtime contest vs. ASU was the 27th under coach Altman. The Ducks are 21-6 in that span.
- » UO grabbed a season-high 41 rebounds vs. Montana, finishing with a +26 rebound margin, most since 11/17/17.
- » The 40-point win over Montana was the 8th such win in the Altman era.
- » Eric Williams Jr. has now played in over 3,000 career minutes, most on the team.
- » Jacob Young recorded his 1,000th career point vs. BYU.
- » The following programs had three or more players listed on one of the five watch lists; UO, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Memphis, Michigan, UNC, Texas, UCLA and Villanova.
- » Eric Williams joins Richardson as the two returning starters from last year's Sweet Sixteen team.
- » All three of the DI transfers joining the Ducks (Harmon, Guerrier, Young) have NCAA Tournament experience.

MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA

Matthew Knight Arena was the first LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold certified Arena in the NCAA. LEED provides standards to recognize Green buildings. A kiosk explaining Matthew Knight Arena's LEED features is located on the main concourse near the West entrance.

- » The lower bowl of Matthew Knight Arena is closer to the floor and steeper than Mac Court.
- » Over 50 Point of Sale lines are available to purchase food and beverage in 20 different locations.
- » Over 200 TVs are located in the arena and over 100 of these are located throughout the concourses.
- » There are four loading dock bays with room underground to turn a 70" truck 360 degrees.
- » The clean span roof trusses are over 260' long.

CONSTRUCTION FACTS

- » 1,890 employees worked at the site, each earning a wage during one of the worst economies in Oregon history.
- » 330,000 cubic yards of dirt were excavated (that's 30,000 dump truck loads).
- » 50,000 cubic yards of rock.
- » 39,000 cubic yards of concrete were poured in the arena and the garage (that's 3,900 mixers full).
- » 4,840 tons (over 9 million lbs.) of reinforcing steel was placed in the concrete.
- » 580,000 lbs. of precast concrete forms the seating bowl.
- » Over 2,900 tons of structural steel were placed.
- » Over 800,000 man hours.

BASKETBALL FLOOR

- » A nod to the Tall Firs, the nickname of Oregon's National Championship Basketball team in the 1939.
- » A unique perspective looking up from a clearing in the forest that celebrates Oregon's beautiful environment.
- » Deep in the Woods - Where opponents will find themselves as they play Oregon in this new arena.
- » The Oregon "O" combined with the Matt Arena Logo at center court.

MATT ARENA LOGO

- » Unique letter forms spell out "MATT" in a toothy grin reminiscing Matthew Knight as a child.
- » A smile, and a Japanese-inspired Torii gate shape, (A Torii gate is a symbol of a sacred place in Japanese culture).
- » Curved arena forms that connect the Oregon Graphic Identity with the heroic proportions of the arena architecture.

24 Altman ranks **24th all-time** in career D1 victories and is the 8th active coach with 700 career D1 wins.

Altman has led the Ducks to 20+ wins in **11 straight seasons**, one of four D1 programs with 20+ wins in at least 10-straight years.

154 With Altman at the helm, the Ducks are **154-48** against non-conference opponents.

9 Ducks have been drafted to the NBA since Altman's arrival in 2010. Oregon has had a first round pick in three of the last four NBA drafts.

HEAD COACH DANA ALTMAN

Dana Altman is one of only five active coaches in NCAA Division I with 24 consecutive winning seasons. He is part of an exclusive fraternity that includes Hall-of-Famers Mike Krzyzewski, Tom Izzo, Bill Self and Jim Boeheim.

He is the 34th head coach to record 600 career wins at the Division I level and is the winningest head coach in Oregon history. In 2016-17, Altman led Oregon back to the Final Four for the first time in 78 years.

In 2019, he became the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history and now has 20 victories.

The 2013 National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year, Altman is 280-110 in Eugene, and 690-353 in 32 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

Altman, the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men's basketball program, has led the Ducks to 11 consecutive 20-win seasons and 10 postseason appearances. He led Oregon to five straight NCAA Tournaments (2013-17) for the first time in school history, winning at least one game in each of those years. Included in those NCAA appearances are a Final Four (2017), two Elite Eights (2016, 2017) and three Sweet 16s (2013, 2016, 2017).

The Ducks made their fourth Sweet 16 appearance under Altman in 2019 and were named the Pac-12's automatic qualifier for the 2020 NCAA Tournament before the worldwide Coronavirus epidemic canceled the postseason. The Ducks' fifth Sweet Sixteen appearance under Altman came in 2021. Altman now has 23 seasons of 20-plus wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, 11 at Oregon, one at Kansas State).

2020-21 season:

- » Oregon garnered its second consecutive national position player of the year honor under Altman when Chris Duarte was named the 2021 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year.
- » Duarte was a seven-time All-American and was named to the all-Pac-12 team along with Eugene Omoruyi.

2019-20 season:

- » Altman helped Payton Pritchard earn the Bob Cousy National Point Guard of the Year award for the first time in program history.
- » The Pac-12 player of the year was Oregon's first consensus first team All-American in 80 years as the Ducks won the Pac-12 regular season title for the third time in the last five years.
- » The Ducks' win at No. 5 Michigan was the highest-ranked nonconference win in program history as Oregon went 6-2 against ranked foes in 2019-20.

2018-19 season:

- » Oregon's 2018-19 season will be remembered for the Ducks' winning four games in four days to claim the Pac-12 Tournament title.
- » Oregon rode that momentum to a Sweet 16 appearance, losing to eventual national champion Virginia.

2017-18 season:

- » The Ducks finished 23-13, advancing to the second round of the NIT.
- » In addition to another 20-win season and a postseason appearance, the 2017-18 season saw another first for Altman when Troy Brown Jr. became his first career NBA first round draft choice (No. 15 overall, Washington).

2016-17 season:

- » Oregon won the Pac-12 title for the second consecutive season and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since the 1939 Webfoots won the very first NCAA title.
- » The Ducks won a program-record 33 games and also reached a high-water mark for conference victories with 16.
- » Dillon Brooks was named the Pac-12 player of the year and a consensus all-American, while Jordan Bell was the Pac-12 defensive player of the year and the NCAA Midwest Regional most outstanding player.
- » Jordan, Brooks and Tyler Dorsey were all selected in the 2017 NBA Draft.

2015-16 season:

- » Altman guided Oregon to the Pac-12's regular season and conference title in the same year for the first time in school history.
- » He also reached the NCAA's Elite Eight for the first time and was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four seasons, a feat matched only by Hall of Famer Lute Olson of Arizona.
- » The individual honors won by players under his guidance included all-American Brooks, Pac-12 Tournament MOP Elgin Cook, Pac-12 all-defensive selection Chris Boucher and Pac-12 all-freshman pick Dorsey.

2014-15 season:

- » Altman guided a team that had only three returning scholarship players to a 26-10 record, a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 (13-5) and the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was the runaway choice for Pac-12 Coach of the Year.
- » Joe Young tied the school single-season scoring record in being named Pac-12 Player of the Year.
- » Cook was an all-Pac-12 second-team selection, while Bell and Brooks made the Pac-12's all-freshman team.

2013-14 season:

- » Altman won his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19.
- » He joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons.
- » Young was an all-conference second team selection and an all-Pac-12 tournament pick, while Mike Moser was an honorable mention selection by the conference.

2012-13 season:

- » Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament.
- » The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament.
- » Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors.
- » Senior E.J. Singler was a Pac-12 first team selection, while Johnathan Loyd was named MOP of the Pac-12 Tournament
- » Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before being drafted as a second round pick to Philadelphia.

2011-12 season:

- » Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for a share of second place in the final league standings.
- » The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals.
- » Under Altman's tutelage, Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference, while Singler was named to the all-conference second team.

2010-11 season:

- » In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the 12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program.
- » He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play.
- » Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach. Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines.

Creighton:

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

- » He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.
- » Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons.
- » He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01 - its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.
- » Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team.
- » His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference post-season tournament titles.
- » Creighton inducted Altman into its athletics hall of fame in 2018.
- » Three players he coached at Creighton - Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver - have played in the NBA.

Creighton:

Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State and led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tourneys and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

- » Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17.

Marshall:

Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

Personal:

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

- » Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.
- » At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball.
- » Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.
