POST-GAME QUOTES

OREGON HEAD COACH RICH BROOKS: "I thought our offense--particularly in the first quarter--was the best its been in a month. Then we started stumbling and stuttering a little bit. Washington State widened their outside linebacker and we couldn't run the sweep as well as we had done earlier. We made a few mistakes on offense. I was extremely pleased we were able to move the ball and score some points, and particularly make the big play. The pass from Nelson to Obee was something that we felt we could get if they were in that coverage because the backside corner went with the flow and we felt we could get by them. For a minute, I didn't think the ball was going to get there because the wind was blowing it. Our defense played extremely well with a couple of exceptions. They ran the option better than anybody has on us all year long. And, we just had a heck of a time containing Rosenbach. He's a great athlete. He scrambled and he hurt us a lot running the football."

BROOKS ON FIRST SCORE: "It was nice getting points on the board early in the contest. The fumble (by WSU at the 4yd. line) was a big play. Washington State was backed up."

BROOKS ON WIND: "I thought it was a big factor in this game. Certainly, we didn't punt as well with the wind at our backs as we did into it. Getting caught on the short end of the field and going into the wind early in the game was a tough thing for Washington State."

DENNIS ERICKSON, WSU HEAD COACH:

"Same old, same old (thing). Two teams who have been turning the ball over. We turn it over and they take advantage of it and they turn it over and we don't take advantage of it. That's what the game boiled down to. We come out and turn it over on the second play and they get the big play (long TD pass) and it is 14- to zip. Not we struggle from behind.

(On long Oregon TD pass) We had a mistake back there. The guy played the ball and miss-played the ball. We were in the right coverage. I'm tired of it (mistakes), to be very honest with you."

(Second half): "Then we come out in the second half and give up three. Then it is four straight possessions we have and we don't do anything. We don't even get a first down. That's when you have to take it, when we are playing good on defense. We don't do anything in the third quarter."

(Oregon defense) "Apparently they covered us good. Obviously they had good coverage. They had a good defensive plan. They planed some five DBs and six DBs. They mixed it up (defense).

(Rosenbach) "Timm didn't play his greatest game, but he didn't play bad either. He did some good things and there's some other things involved. Good defense (by Oregon) was one of them.

"We just come out and we don't feel any sense of urgency. By urgent I mean you come out early in the game and it's urgent for us to score and urgent for us to play great defense early, to get the momentum. There's no sense of urgency whatsoever. Until we get that sense of urgency we are in trouble. It's not lack of effort or anything like that."

"We have to come out and play better on both sides of the ball, but we have to come out and play defense like we did in the second half in the first half."

(First losing season) "I'm not concerned about Dennis Erickson's losing season at all. I'm concerned about a losing season for the football team and for Cougars. As far as me personally it's not that big a deal. It is a matter of when, where and how I old I was going to be."

(Washington game) "If we win that football game obviously we can put a plus to our season. You hate to in this program and hopefully eventually it's not going to happen - have to wait to play the Huskies to have a successful season. It's frustrating for everybody involved, coaches, players, sportswriters.

Oregon is a pretty good club. They beat some good people. Their quarterback played well today and they played well offensively in the first half. They've played good defense all year against just about everybody they've played."

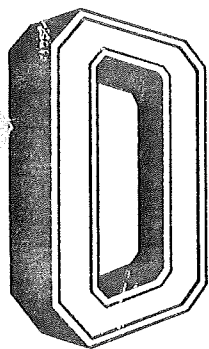

THE GAME'S THEME Oregon has exhausted all of its margin for error in pursuit of its first winning season in three years. The Ducks will start their third different quarterback in as many weeks. Oregon faces a team that has had the benefit of a week off prior to playing host to the Ducks for the second time this season. Oregon also battles for a first-division Pacific-10 Conference finish in the last two Saturdays of the season.

THE SERIES In one of the most offensive series on Oregon's books, the Ducks put a two-game winning streak on the line. Oregon won the last Pullman meeting to open the 1985 season (42-39) and doubled that with a 27-17 triumph at home a year ago. Both teams are averaging better than 36 points in the last three meetings. After 65 meetings, the series is even at 29-29-7, taking into consideration the verdict decided on the field.

THE SEASON Oregon's mid-season tribulations continued in a 37-13 setback at Arizona State. The Ducks were guilty of just three turnovers, but they led to 13 points by the Sun Devils. Oregon's offense bounced back with 302 yards, much after the entrance of sophomore quarterback Pete Nelson in the second quarter, but two quick scores by Arizona State in the third quarter took the wind out of the Ducks' sails. During the current stretch, Oregon has lost at UCLA (41-10), Stanford (13-10) and at home to California (20-6) in addition to the setback at Arizona State. Prior to that, the Ducks had only lost at Ohio State (24-14) in its first five games. Oregon opened by winning at Colorado (10-7) and assembled a three-game winning streak at Autzen Stadium against San Diego State (25-20), Washington (29-22) and USC (34-27). After visiting Washington State, the Ducks close the season at home against Oregon State (2-7, 0-5) the following Saturday.

CONFERENCE CALL Coach Rich Brooks will be available to any interested news media member each Wednesday via conference telephone call. Because of the Civil War luncheon in Portland, the call prior to the game with Oregon State will be conducted Tuesday at the same times. Just notify the Oregon sports information office by 4:30 p.m. Tuesday and then call the Darome Connection in San Francisco (415-896-1609) at approximately 10:30 a.m. for print media and 11:00 a.m. for broadcast members. There is a 30-minute time limit, but Coach Brooks will stay on the line to answer as many questions as possible. Brooks is available in person at practice at other times.

OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY Oregon's offense, which was averaging 347.2 yards after five games, showed more life at Arizona State, particularly in its running attack. The Ducks rushed for 133 yards, the second-best total of the season only behind the 161 yards Oregon gained on the ground against USC. The offensive line was paced by the performances of tight end Joe Meerten and Tim Parker and strong guard Chris Husko, who produced the top efforts in Oregon's grading system. Meerten and Parker were highly involved in the Ducks' running game and cited despite catching only one pass between them. The offensive line also didn't permit the Arizona State defense to sack the Oregon quarterback.

TOP DUCKS Sporting News, the publication that often consults with professional scouts to evaluate collegiate talent, has published its All-America Preview by ranking the top six players in nine offensive and seven defensive regimens on a football team. Oregon nose tackle Rollin Putzier was ranked highest among the six Oregon players on its checklist. Putzier was rated the No. 3 performer and his position and strong safety Anthony Newman was rated fifth among safeties, the only Ducks mentioned among the top six players. Six other Oregon players were listed as either "A Notch Below, Worthy of Mention or Stars of Future" in the section. Defensive end Matt Brock was selected among eight defensive ends in the second group, outside linebacker Scott Kozak drew mention and quarterback Bill Musgrave, tailback Derek Loville, free safety Thom Kaumeyer and offensive guard Andy Sunia were tabbed as players with promise. All of those Oregon starters should receive consideration when the post-season teams are conjured in the next two weeks.

GROUND DUCK Sophomore tailback Derek Loville can reach a milestone of sorts this week with another productive Saturday tucking the ball under his arm. Oregon's leading rusher needs 41 yards to reach the 1,000-yard plateau in career ground gaining. Loville, who has been slowed by toe and knee problems, has rushed for 407 yards in eight games this season to increase his two-year total to 951 yards in 261 carries and 11 touchdowns. Derek has carried the ball in 18 games at Oregon, averaging 50.1 yards per game.

LAST THREE The last three Oregon-Washington State football meetings may go down as the most offensive consecutive trio of contests in history. It all started back in 1984 when Rueben Mayes broke the one-game NCAA rushing record, leading Washington State to 663 total yards. Oregon added 478 yards in a 50-41 loss that day for a two-team total of 1,141 yards. The next year, Washington State had 531 yards and Oregon amassed 450 in the Ducks' 42-39 triumph for a 981 total. The combined yardage went down again last year, but not appreciably. Oregon had 451 yards to 433 for Washington State and the 884 total boosted the three-year total to 3,006 yards. That's an average of 501.0 yards per team per game. That would be hard to match.

COUGAR CAPSULE Washington State enjoyed its second week without a game last Saturday before its final three-game push against Oregon, Washington and California in Japan. The Cougars opened with victories over Fresno State (41-24) and Wyoming (43-28), then have won only once in the last six weeks. In their last four games, Washington State was held to one touchdown in three of them, but the other was a 45-point explosion in an impressive victory over Arizona. The Cougars are 3-1 at home, falling only to Stanford (44-7) and playing their 1987 Pullman finale against Oregon. Washington State sophomore quarterback Timm Rosenbach has passed for 1,821 yards and accounted for 1,962 yards total offense after eight games. The Cougars have been operating with just two healthy running backs, but are hoping of regaining the services of freshman Rich Swinton (rib). Tailback Michael Pringle (broken jaw) and fullback Ed Tingstad (rotator cuff) are sidelined. Washington State has had two defensive players honored as players of the week by the Pacific-10 Conference. Tackle Ivan Cook was cited for his play in the victory over Arizona and linebacker Brian Forde was picked after his performance against Wyoming. Prior to that, a Cougar player had not been so honored in four years.

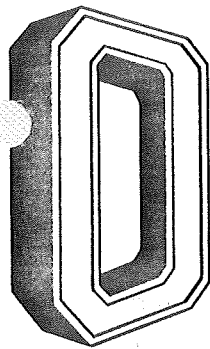

The Last Details Oregon vs Washington State

FIRST DIVISION When the pre-season magazines and the traveling troupes began making their annual predictions, Oregon was forecast for no better than seventh and as low as ninth in the Pacific-10 Conference by the football experts. With two victories and the right circumstances, Oregon can finish in the first division of the league. At 4-4, the Ducks probably would finish behind UCLA, USC, Arizona State and Washington in the conference chase. Arizona (2-2-2) also has a chance to accomplish the same feat, but must beat USC and Arizona State on the road to do it.

SECOND HALF Before the California game, a note was published concerning the percentage of yardage allowed by Oregon's defense in the fourth quarter. During that examination, it was determined that the Ducks were allowing 28.3 per cent of its total yardage in the final period. Taking that one step farther, Oregon has permitted 53.3 per cent of its total defensive yardage after intermission. The Ducks' last meeting with Arizona State contributed to that total. The Sun Devils had just 144 yards at halftime, but amassed 286 yards and 28 points during the last two quarters, including 132 yards in the fourth quarter. Oregon has been outscored, 121-70, in the second half as well.

LAST THREE The last three Oregon-Washington State football games are legendary, particularly those in 1984 and '85. The teams have combined for 3,006 yards in the three games, headed by the contest three years when the teams joined forces for 1,141 yards total offense. Despite all the passing yardage in the three games, the team that rushed for the most yards won all three games. Here's a game-by-game breakdown with highlights:
