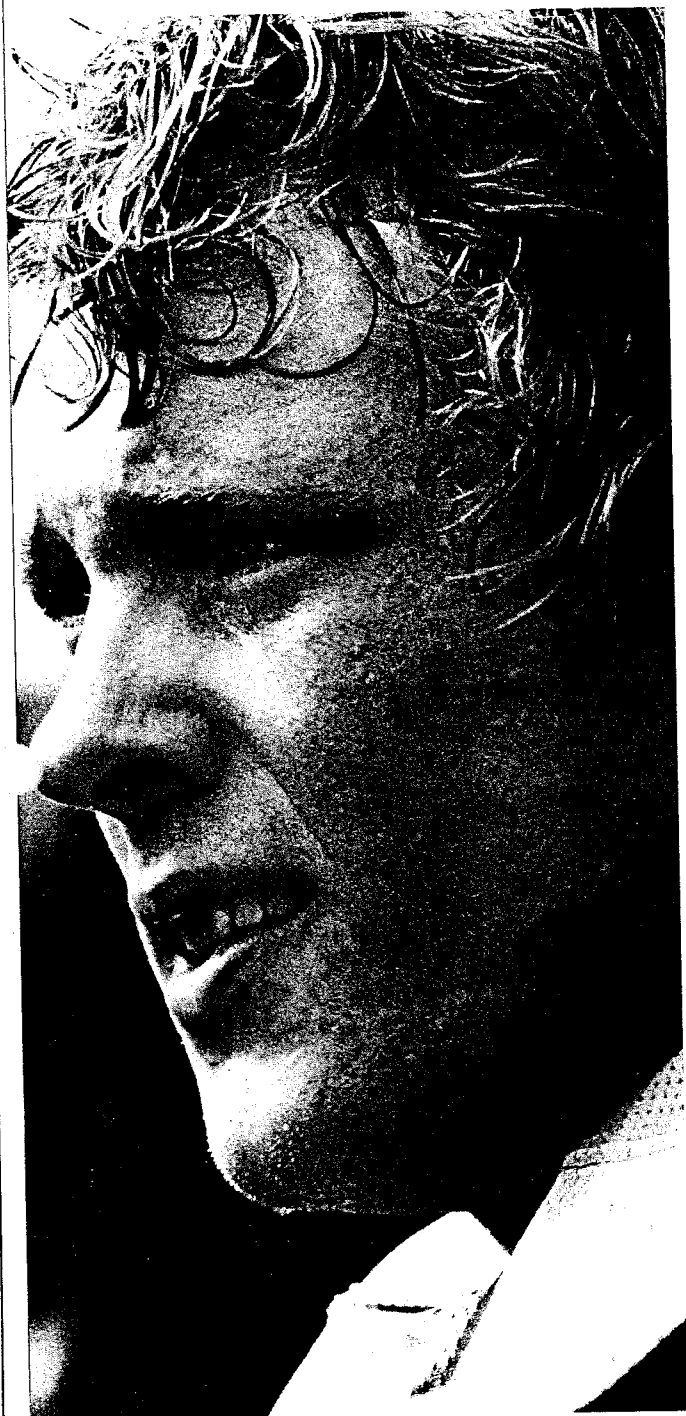

Oregon got all but 82 of its 242 total yards through the air and scored its lone touchdown on a one-yard pitch from Mike Jorgensen to tight end Rich Gaiser in the second quarter.

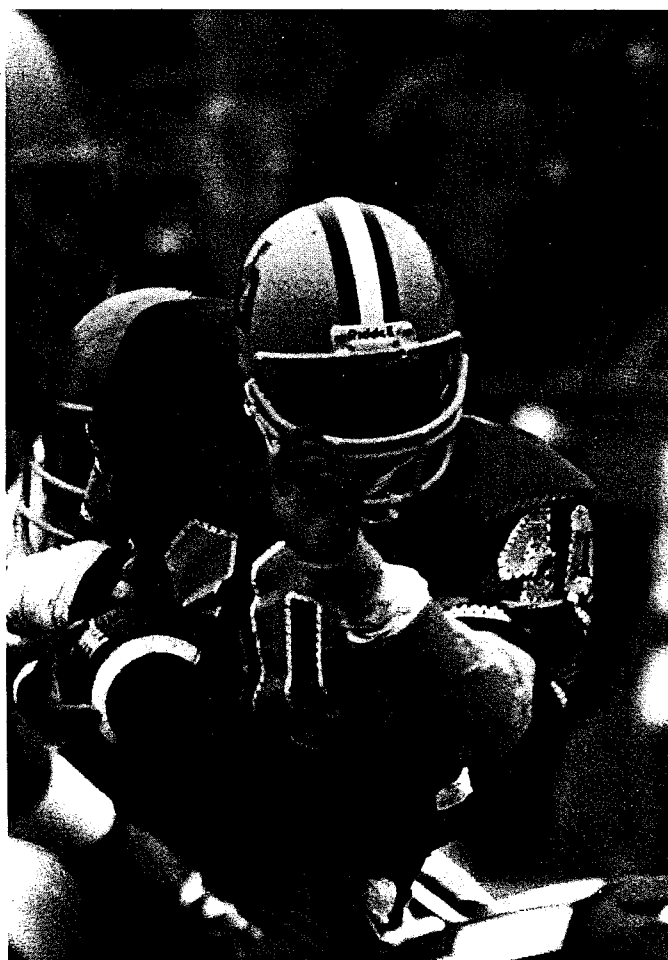

The Ducks trailed the entire way prior to McCall's gamewinner but stayed within reach, never falling more than eight points behind.

With just slightly more than 1½ minutes left in the opening half, Oregon flanker Lew Barnes beat the defense and hauled in a 53-yard scoring pass from Mike Jorgensen. Barnes caught three other passes on the day and finished with 124 yards receiving. Oregon middle linebacker Lerry Wilson spearheaded the Duck defense with 20 tackles and was named the Pacific-10 defensive player of the week for his efforts.

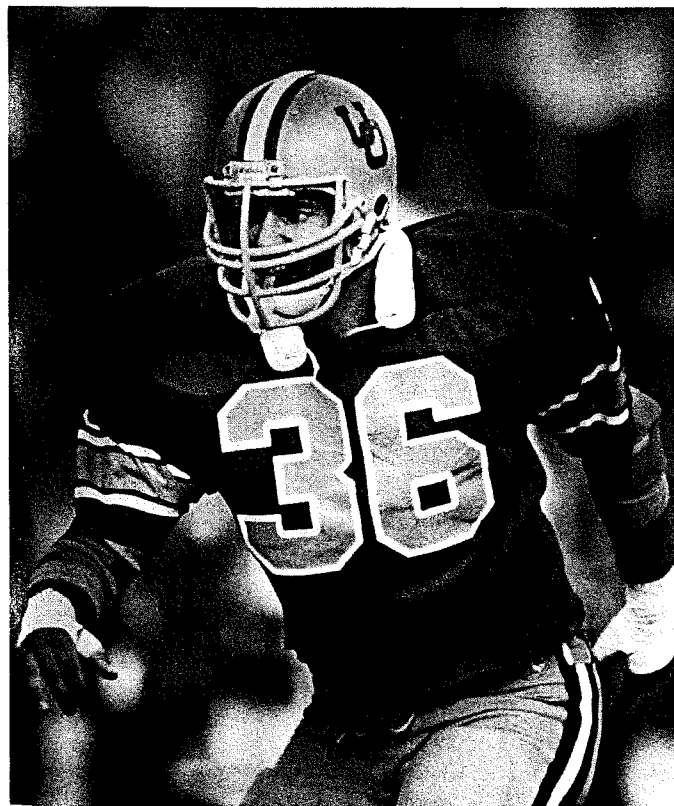

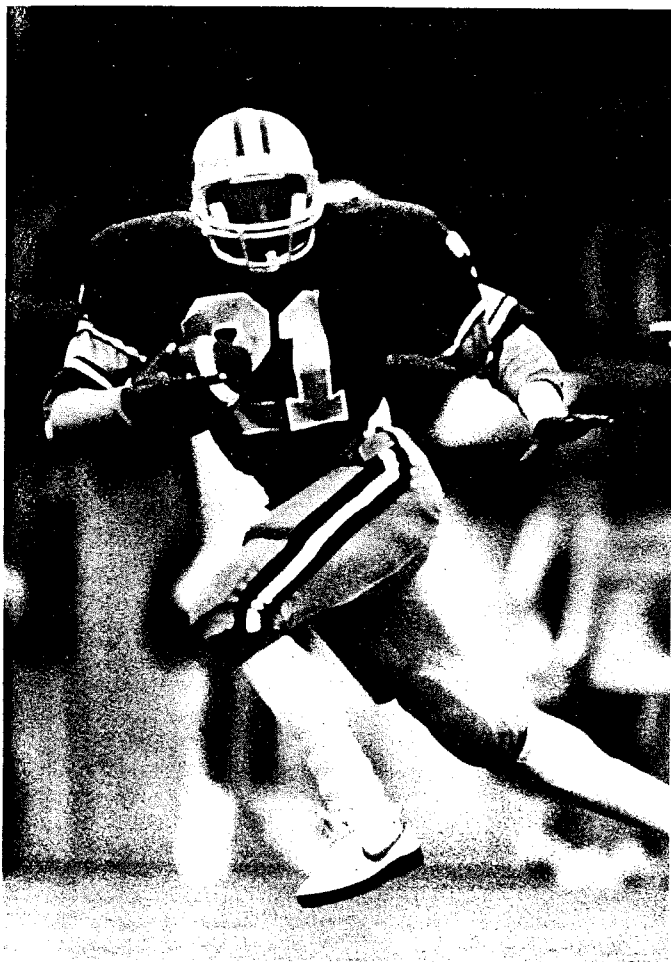

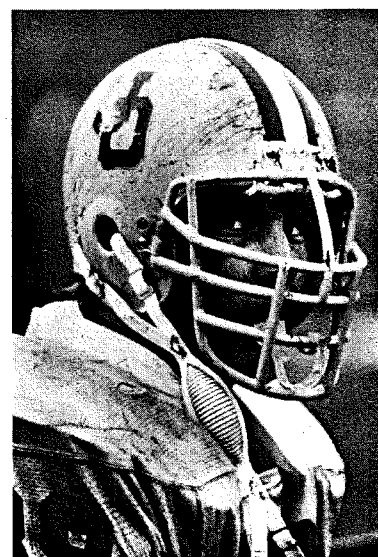
