TALKING POINTS

OPPONENT NOTE

Oregon is 3-6 all-time against Wisconsin and 1-3 under Altman.

» UW won the most recent meeting 61-58 in the 2023 NIT in Eugene. UO advanced in the 2019 NCAA tournament after defeating Wisconsin 72-54 in the round of 64.

NAIL BITER OVER IOWA

UO escaped Iowa City with an 80-78 win on 2/19 in a game that saw seven lead changes and five ties.

» The Ducks outrebounded Iowa 36-27, resulting in a 19-5 second chance points advantage.  
» UO scored 26 bench points, led by Evans Jr. (8 points), Tracey (8) and a season-high six points from Ra'Heim Moss.

DEFENSE LIFTS UO OVER RUTGERS

The Ducks allowed a conference opponent season-low 57 points in the 75-57 victory over Rutgers on 2/16 in Eugene.

» Jackson Shelstad net a game-high 19 pts (8-13 FG), while Nate Bittle added a double-double (15 pts, 10 reb) with 5 blk.  
» TJ Bamba tied his career-high with 6 ast, adding 11 pts.  
» The Ducks net a season-high 13 three-pointers on a season-best 59.1 percent from three-point range.

NORTHWESTERN WIN

UO got back on track with an 81-75 victory over Northwestern on 2/11 in Eugene.

» Jackson Shelstad net a career-high 26 points, connecting on 8-of-11 field goals and 4-of-6 three-point attempts.  
» Keeshawn Barthelemy made his fourth start of the season and net 19 points on 4-of-6 three-pointers.  
» The Ducks dished out 16 assists on 24 field goals, the most since recording 22 against Penn State.  
» TJ Bamba led the team in steals for the 15th time this season, with a career-high-tying four thefts.

AMONG THE BEST OF THE BIGS

Nate Bittle was named one of the top 10 candidates for the 2025 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, given annually to college basketball's top center by the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

» First in the Big Ten in blocks (55) and 8th in rebounds (193).  
» Four of the top 10 candidates play in the Big Ten (Derik Queen - Maryland, Vladislav Goldin - Michigan, Dawson Garcia - Minnesota)  
» Would become the first Duck to ever win the award.

Nate Bittle recorded his third 20-10 game of the season against Iowa, finishing with 21 points, 10 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 blocks. His third block sealed the win for Oregon as time expired.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

6 TJ Bamba finished with 10 points and a career-high-tying six assists. He's dished out six assists three of the last four games.

Bittle leads the Big Ten in total blocks with 55, ranking second in blocks per game at 2.0.

1K Supreme Cook grabbed his 1,000th career rebound against Rutgers, his 146th career game for Fairfield, Georgetown and Oregon.

Jackson Shelstad scored a career-high 26 points vs. Northwestern, his fifth 20-point game of the season, all coming in Big 10 play.

57 Rutgers' 57 points were the fewest by an Oregon opponent in conference play since Cal was held to 51 on 3/2/23.

## 2024-25 GAME NOTES continued

**AGAINST THE TOP 25**

The Ducks have taken on a ranked opponent six times this season, going 2-4 in such games so far. Oregon sports two of the nation's best wins in 2024-25, knocking off now-No. 3 Alabama and No. 10 Texas A&M.

- » The Ducks secured their first Big Ten win at Matthew Knight Arena against Maryland, who now sits at No. 20 in the AP poll.
- » Dana Altman's Ducks are 40-45 against ranked opponents.

**LATE SURGE LEADS DUCKS PAST UW**

Oregon beat Washington for the third game in a row on 1/21.

- » TJ Bamba posted his second 20-plus point game of the season, one of five Ducks in double-figures.
- » UO held the Huskies to just 4-of-21 shooting from three-point range, the second-consecutive game Oregon has held their opponent to under 20% from deep.

**TEAM WIN OVER PSU**

Oregon defeated Penn State 82-81 on 1/12 in the second-ever meeting between the two squads and improved to 4-0 on the road so far this season.

- » Six Ducks scored in double-figures in a game for the first time since the 2021-22 season, led by 17 points from Jackson Shelstad.
- » The Ducks shot 31-of-57 from the field (54.4%).
- » Oregon's bench outscored Penn State's bench 28-4.

**DUCKS TRUMP BUCKS**

Oregon beat Ohio State 73-71 in come-from-behind fashion to stay unbeaten in true road games so far this season.

- » Jackson Shelstad (24 pts) and Nate Bittle (21 pts) became the first UO teammates to each score 20+ in 2024-25.
- » Keeshawn Barthelemy scored his 1,000th-career point on a three that kicked off Oregon's 11-4 run in the final three minutes.

**BOUNCE BACK TERPS WIN**

Oregon defeated Maryland 83-79 on 1/5 in the first-ever meeting between the teams.

- » Oregon improved to 5-1 when trailing at halftime, coming back from down 13 in the first half with a 14-point run to start the second half.
- » Jackson Shelstad recorded his second 20-point game of the season on a career-high five made three-pointers.

**BALANCED WEBER STATE WIN**

The Ducks defeated Weber State 89-49 on 12/29.

- » Five Ducks scored in double-digits, led by Jackson Shelstad with 16. Brandon Angel went 5-5 for 14 points.
- » The Wildcats were held to 33.3% from the field, hitting just 3-of-22 three point attempts.

**FAMILIAR FOE VICTORY**

UO defeated Stanford 76-61 on 12/21 in San Jose.

- » UO led for 37:22 of the contest, with eight players scoring seven or more points.
- » Stanford was held to 37% from the field and 26.7% from three-point range.
- » The Ducks were led by Kwame Evans Jr., who net 13 points, including a career-high 10 made free throws (10-12 FT).

**DEFEATING SFA**

UO led Stephen F. Austin wire-to-wire on 12/15, defeating the Lumberjacks 79-61.

- » The Ducks held SFA to 15% from three point range (3-20) and scored 26 points off of 22 SFA turnovers.
- » Brandon Angel led the team with 15 points (4-5 FG, 6-7 FT), while Nate Bittle added 13 points in 18 minutes.

**FIRST BIG TEN WIN**

UO defeated USC 68-60 on 12/4, earning their first Big Ten Conference win.

- » The Ducks trailed by 10 points with 15 minutes left before outscoring USC 40-22 in the final 15.
- » Jackson Shelstad net a career-high 24 points, including a career-best 12 free throws on 14 attempts.
- » Keeshawn Barthelemy provided 18 points and five assists off the bench.

**PLAYERS ERA FESTIVAL CHAMPS**

Oregon defeated No. 9 Alabama 83-81 on 11/30 to win the first-ever Players Era Festival tournament title.

- » Keeshawn Barthelemy scored a career-high-tying 22 points (7-11 FG) off the bench, adding four assists.
- » Nate Bittle net the go-ahead basket with 4 seconds to play, finishing with 19 points, 9 rebounds and 3 assists.

**VICTORY OVER SDSU IN VEGAS**

UO defeated SDSU 78-68 on 11/27, advancing to the finals of the Players Era Festival.

- » T.J. Bamba recorded his first 20-point game as a Duck with a team-high 22 points and five assists.
- » Keeshawn Barthelemy added 16 points (3-4 3FG) and a career-high five steals.
- » Brandon Angel and Jackson Shelstad each added 12 points.

**TOP 20 WIN OVER TEXAS A&M**

Oregon picked up their first ranked win of the season on 11/26, defeating No. 20 ranked Texas A&M 80-70 in Las Vegas.

- » The Ducks went on two separate 10-point scoring runs, including a 16-0 run to regain the lead in the second half.
- » T.J. Bamba scored a season-high 18 points (10-12 FT), followed by Brandon Angel (16 points, 5-6 FG) and Jackson Shelstad (16 points).
- » UO forced 13 turnovers, scoring 20 points off turnovers.
- » A&M was held to just 27% shooting in the second half.

**EIGHTH IN A ROW OVER THE BEAVS**

The Ducks defeated their in-state rivals 78-75 on 11/21, despite trailing by as many as 12 points late in the 2nd half.

- » Nate Bittle paced UO with career bests in points (24) and rebounds (14), netting 17 second-half points.
- » Jackson Shelstad scored a season-high 15 points, along with six assists.
- » It was the eighth victory in a row for UO over OSU and the fourth-straight one-score victory at Gill Coliseum.

**WIRE-TO-WIRE WIN VS. TROY**

UO defeated Troy 82-61 on 11/17 and did not trail in the game.

- » The Ducks net 41 bench points, led by Keeshawn Barthelemy (15 pts, 4-6 FG) and Supreme Cook (11 pts, 4-5 FG).
- » Barthelemy has 10+ points the last two games, with three made three-pointers in each contest.
- » UO shot 51.8% from the field, while holding Troy to 37.3%.

**OT WIN OVER PORTLAND**

The Ducks defeated Portland 80-70 in OT on 11/12, outscoring Portland 13-3 in overtime.

- » Keeshawn Barthelemy sparked the win with 13 points, including 11 in the second half.
- » Jadrian Tracey net a team-high 19 points (8-11 FG), with a career-high four steals.

**30-POINT MONTANA WIN**

UO defeated Montana 79-48 on Nov. 8, limiting the Grizzlies to 34% shooting from the field and 15.8% from three.

- » Nate Bittle narrowly missed a consecutive double-double with a team-high 17 points and nine rebounds.
- » TJ Bamba added 14, while Jadrian Tracey was a spark off the bench with 12 points.
- » The Ducks scored 14 fast break points, while holding the Grizzlies to zero. UO won the points off turnover battle 19-9, forcing 14 Montana turnovers.

**GAME ONE**

The Ducks defeated UC Riverside 91-76 to improve to 13-2 in season openers under Coach Altman.

- » Kwame Evans Jr. net a career-best 23 points (8-15 FG), along with six rebounds.
- » Brandon Angel tied a career high with 7 free throws, while Nate Bittle recorded a double-double (16p, 11r).
- » Angel eclipsed 1,000 career points in the game.
- » UO outscored Montana 48-22 in the paint, 18-1 in fast break points and 14-2 in second chance points.

### FAMILIAR FACES

UO returns three players that started during last year's postseason run: Jackson Shelstad, Kwame Evans Jr. and Jadrian Tracey.

- » Shelstad averaged 12.8 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists, earning Pac-12 All-Freshman team honors.
- » Evans Jr. played in all 36 games, making 29 starts. He notched 7.3 pts, 4.9 reb, 1.2 stl, 1.1 ast and 1.0 blk per game.
- » Tracey scored 7.6 pts per game, adding 3.6 reb and 1.8 ast in 26.9 min.
- » Keeshawn Barthelemy, Nate Bittle and Mookie Cook look to bounce back from 2023-24 injuries.

### IMPACT ADDITIONS

The Ducks added experienced DI players in Ra'Heim Moss, TJ Bamba, Supreme Cook and Brandon Angel.

- » Moss was named to the All-MAC First Team and MAC All-Defensive team for Toledo last season.
- » Bamba has played 119 career games for Washington State and Villanova, making 84 career starts.
- » Cook started all 32 games for Georgetown last season, notching 10.1 points and 7.6 rebounds per game.
- » Angel finished with shooting percentages of .567 FG, .447 3FG and .816 FT, the only player in the country with those numbers.
- » UO also adds JuCo transfer Dezdrick Lindsay, freshman Jamari Phillips and international prospect Oleksandr Kobzystyi.

### SEASON SUPERLATIVES

- » Oregon is 13-4 this season when recording five or more steals and 4-0 when posting double-digit steals in a game.
- » The Ducks outscored Washington 20-9 over the final 5:36 of the game on 1/21, including a 9-0 run.
- » Oregon held Purdue to just 2-of-12 shooting from three-point range, the Ducks' sixth time this season holding an opponent under 20% from deep.
- » Nate Bittle's career-high six blocked shots against Purdue were the most in a game by a Duck since KJ Evans swatted six last season.
- » The Ducks recorded a season-high 22 assists on 31 makes in the win over Penn State on 1/12.
- » Keeshawn Barthelemy eclipsed the 1,000 point marker for his career with his three-pointer late in the second half vs. OSU on 1/9, helping secure the Ducks' come-from-behind win.
- » UO shot 51.8% from the field and 42.9% from three against Maryland on 1/5, along with 86.7% from the free throw line.
- » Supreme Cook scored a season-high 20 points vs. Illinois on 1/2, finishing 8-for-11 from the field.
- » Oregon finished nonconference play 11-0, the first unbeaten nonconference slate since 2013-14.
- » The Ducks shot a season-high 55% from the field vs. Weber State (33-60 FGA) on 12/29, connecting on 9-of-22 three-point attempts (40.9%).
- » Eight Ducks scored seven or more points against Stanford, led by Kwame Evans Jr. with 13 points off the bench.
- » UO combined for 44 bench points vs. SFA, behind 14 apiece from Supreme Cook and Jadrian Tracey, and 8 from KJ Evans.
- » The Ducks led for 37:40 against SFA, leading wire-to-wire with no ties or lead changes.
- » USC was held to 31.0% shooting in the second half on 12/4, hitting just 9-of-29 attempts, and 0 three pointers.
- » UO forced 15 turnovers against Alabama on 11/30, outscoring the Tide 17-5 in points off turnovers.
- » Oregon was a +17 on the glass against SDSU (41-24) on 11/27, outscoring the Aztecs 18-4 in second chance points.
- » TJ Bamba (22 pts), Keeshawn Barthelemy (16), Jackson Shelstad (12), Brandon Angel (12) and Nate Bittle (11) all scored in double figures against SDSU, the first time since 2/1/24 that five Ducks scored 10-plus.
- » Oregon went on two 10-point scoring runs against Texas A&M on 11/26, a 16-point run and a 10-0 run to pull away late.
- » 11 of Jackson Shelstad's then-season-high 15 points came in the second half against Oregon St.
- » Supreme Cook connected on 4-of-5 field goal attempts in his first game of the season against Troy on 11/17, finishing with 11 points.
- » Jadrian Tracey connected on 8-of-11 FGs for 19 points against Portland on 11/12 while recording a career-high four steals; Keeshawn Barthelemy sparked the win with 11 of his 13 points coming in the second half.
- » Kwame Evans Jr. set a new career high against UC Riverside in the season opener, scoring 23 points (8-15 FG, 2-5 3FG, 5-5FT).

### GET BIG

Oregon enters their first season in the expanded 18-team Big Ten Conference.

- » Historically, the Ducks have won eight conference titles and six conference tournament championships.
- » This will be the first conference change for Oregon since joining the then-Pacific Coast Conference in 1918.

### ALTMAN'S DUCKS...

- » Are 214-24 when totaling fewer turnovers than the opponent.
- » Are 245-100 when outrebounding the opponent.
- » Are 245-31 when holding opponents to 69 or fewer points.

### 2023-24 NOTES

#### 2024 NCAA TOURNAMENT

Oregon made their 18th NCAA Tournament appearance and eighth under coach Altman.

- » The Ducks are now 27-17 all time and 15-8 with Altman at the helm. Altman has led the Ducks to five Sweet Sixteen berths.
- » Coach Altman is 7-0 in first round games played as Oregon's coach. The 2021 team advanced in a no-contest.
- » It was the 16th NCAA Tournament for Altman, who has led Kansas State (1), Creighton (7) and Oregon (8) to the tourney.
- » In the 2OT defeat to Creighton, N'Faly Dante recorded a new career high in his final game for the Ducks, netting 28 points along with 20 rebounds. Jermaine Couisnard followed up his career-high 40-point game against South Carolina with 32 points and eight rebounds.

### COUISNARD'S CAREER NIGHT

Jermaine Couisnard set a new Oregon tournament record with 40 points against South Carolina.

- » He joined Steph Curry and Wally Szczerbiak as the only players to score 40+ as a double digit seed.
- » Couisnard became the first player since Hersey Hawkins (Bradley, 1988) to score 40+ with five or more assists in an NCAA Tournament game.
- » It was the most points scored by a Pac-12 player in an NCAA Tournament game since Bill Walton scored 44 in the 1973 title game (UCLA vs. Memphis St.).

### FIRST ROUND WIN

The Ducks improved to 3-0 in first round games as a double-digit seed under Coach Altman with an 87-73 win over South Carolina.

- » Jermaine Couisnard set an Oregon NCAA Tournament record with 40 points (14-22 FG, 5-9 3FG, 7-7 FT).
- » The team's 59.6 FG% was best in an NCAA Tournament game since the tournament went to its current format in 1985.

### PAC-12 TOURNAMENT CHAMPS

Oregon won their sixth Pac-12 Tournament in 2023-24, defeating Colorado 75-68 in the title game. It was Altman's fourth title (tied with Lute Olson, Arizona, for most in Pac-12 history).

- » The Ducks tied a tournament record with just 3 turnovers.
- » N'Faly Dante set a single-game tournament record for most makes without a miss (12-for-12). His 25 points were a career high. He scored 61 points over the three wins and earned tournament Most Outstanding Player honors.
- » Jermaine Couisnard made the All-Tournament Team after three-straight double-digit outings, including 20 points, 7 assists and 6 rebounds vs. No. 6 Arizona.
- » Jackson Shelstad also made the All-Tournament Team, scoring 21 points against Arizona, adding a career-high three blocks. The freshman scored 17 in the title game.

### WIN OVER THE WILDCATS

The Ducks handed Arizona their first conference tournament loss under Tommy Lloyd on 3/15, defeating the No. 6 ranked Wildcats 67-59.

- » UO held Arizona to their season low in points, improving to 4-2 all time against UA in the tournament and 3-2 against the No. 1 seed.
- » The 14 point comeback was the second largest of the season (18 vs. Cal).

## MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA

### MATTHEW KNIGHT ARENA FACTS

- Matthew Knight Arena was the first LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold certified Arena in the NCAA. LEED provides standards to recognize Green buildings.
- » Opened January 13, 2011 with a 68-62 victory over USC.
  - » The lower bowl of Matthew Knight Arena is closer to the floor and steeper than Mac Court.
  - » Over 50 Point of Sale lines are available to purchase food and beverage in 20 different locations.
  - » Over 200 TVs located in the arena and over 100 of these are located throughout the concourses.
  - » There are four times as many toilets as in Mac Court with over 130 women's toilets, 65 men's toilets and 4 family toilets.
  - » There are four loading dock bays with room underground to turn a 70" truck 360 degrees.
  - » The clean span roof trusses are over 260' long.

### CONSTRUCTION FACTS

- » 1,890 employees worked at the site.
- » 330,000 cubic yards of dirt were excavated (that's 30,000 dump truck loads).
- » 50,000 cubic yards of rock.
- » 39,000 cubic yards of concrete were poured in the arena and the garage (that's 3,900 mixers full).
- » 4,840 tons (over 9 million lbs.) of reinforcing steel was placed in the concrete.
- » 580,000 lbs. of precast concrete forms the seating bowl.
- » Over 2,900 tons of structural steel were placed.
- » Over 800,000 man hours.

### KILKENNY FLOOR & MATT LOGO

- » The court at Matthew Knight Arena has a fresh new look for Oregon's first season in the Big Ten Conference.
- » Highlighting the new Kilkenney Court surface are a more prominent 'O' logo at center court, a reimagining of the tree design reminding opponents they're playing "Deep in the Woods" when they come to Eugene, and other touches conceptualized by the design team at Van Horne Brands.
- » Floor design and concept is a nod to the Tall Firs, the nickname of Oregon's 1939 national championship winning men's basketball team, and three logos on the floor are an homage to the family of former Oregon athletic director Pat Kilkenney.
- » More than 270 photos of trees from around the Northwest were taken to incorporate in the design, reinforcing the deep roots of the university in the region.
- » The Killkenney Court mark at each end includes a new image blending a shamrock with the Duck foot, honoring the "Lucky Duck" charitable foundation started in 2005 by Stephanie and Pat Kilkenney.
- » The unique logo, located near the sideline on each half, spells out "MATT" in a toothy grin reminiscing Matthew Knight - the late son of Nike founder Phil Knight - as a child.
- » The surface incorporates a tribute to the arena's namesake, who passed away in 2004. Near each baseline are images of Ducks flying in a "missing man" formation, with a gap in the flying-V formation to symbolize the legacy and memory of Matthew Knight.

## HEAD COACH DANA ALTMAN

Dana Altman is one of only three active coaches in NCAA Division I with 28 consecutive winning seasons. He is part of an exclusive fraternity that includes Hall-of-Famers Tom Izzo and Bill Self.

Altman became the 24th head coach to record 700 career wins at the Division I level in 2021-22 and is the winningest head coach in Oregon history. In 2016-17, Altman led Oregon back to the Final Four for the first time in 78 years and coached the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2020 and 2021.

Oregon has won 20 or more games in all 14 seasons with Altman as head coach. The Ducks are one of four DI program with 20-plus wins in 14-straight seasons, alongside Belmont, Gonzaga, and Kansas. Coach Altman is one of three coaches to have been named a DI conference coach of the year at four schools, joining Kermit Davis and Cliff Ellis. In 2019, he became the winningest coach in Pac-12 Tournament history and joins Lute Olson (Arizona) as the only coaches to win the conference tournament four times.

The 2013 National Coach of the Year and three-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year is 345-152 in Eugene, and 755-395 in 35 seasons as a head coach at the NCAA Division I level in stints at Oregon, Creighton, Kansas State and Marshall.

### 2023-24 season:

- » Reached the NCAA Tournament for the 16th time in his career and eighth time at Oregon. Won his fourth Pac-12 Tournament Title and improved to a perfect 7-0 in NCAA opening round games, defeating the higher-seeded South Carolina Gamecocks.
- » N'Faly Dante, Jermaine Cousinard and Jackson Shelstad all earned all-conference and All-Pac-12 Tournament honors. Dante was named conference tournament MOP and made the all-conference first team for the second year in a row.
- » Cousinard set the school record for points in an NCAA Tournament game with a career-high 40 points against South Carolina.

### 2022-23 season:

- » Became the sixth-fastest Pac-12 coach to 150 conference wins (229 games). Altman also eclipsed 1,100 DI games as head coach, one of 7 active coaches and the 24th all-time to reach the mark.
- » N'Faly Dante earned first team All-Pac-12 honors, the first true center at UO to earn all-conference honors since Jerry Adams in 1986.
- » The Ducks extended their 20-game winning season streak to 13 consecutive seasons.

### 2021-22 season:

- » Coach Altman won his 700th career game on Jan. 13, picking up a win over No. 3 UCLA in Los Angeles.
- » The Ducks extended his Altman's 20-win season streak to 12. The 20th win gave Altman his 300th win at Oregon.

### 2020-21 season:

- » Oregon garnered its second consecutive national position player of the year honor under Altman when Chris Duarte was named the 2021 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year.
- » Duarte was a seven-time All-American and was named to the all-Pac-12 team along with Eugene Omoruyi.

### 2019-20 season:

- » Altman helped Payton Pritchard earn the Bob Cousy National Point Guard of the Year award for the first time in program history.
- » The Pac-12 player of the year was Oregon's first consensus first team All-American in 80 years as the Ducks won the Pac-12 regular season title for the third time in the last five years.
- » The Ducks' win at No. 5 Michigan was the highest-ranked nonconference win in program history as Oregon went 6-2 against ranked foes in 2019-20.

### 2018-19 season:

- » Oregon's 2018-19 season will be remembered for the Ducks' winning four games in four days to claim the Pac-12 Tournament title.
- » Oregon rode that momentum to a Sweet 16 appearance, losing to eventual national champion Virginia.

### 2017-18 season:

- » The Ducks finished 23-13, advancing to the second round of the NIT.
- » In addition to another 20-win season and a postseason appearance, the 2017-18 season saw another first for Altman when Troy Brown Jr. became his first career NBA first round draft choice (No. 15 overall, Washington).

### 2016-17 season:

- » Oregon won the Pac-12 title for the second consecutive season and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since 1939.
- » The Ducks won a program-record 33 games and also reached a high-water mark for conference victories with 16.
- » Dillon Brooks was named the Pac-12 player of the year and a consensus all-American, while Jordan Bell was the Pac-12 defensive player of the year and the NCAA Midwest Regional most outstanding player.
- » Jordan, Brooks and Tyler Dorsey were all selected in the 2017 NBA Draft.

#### 2015-16 season:

- » Altman guided Oregon to the Pac-12's regular season and conference title in the same year for the first time in school history.
- » He also reached the NCAA's Elite Eight for the first time and was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the third time in four seasons, a feat matched only by Hall of Famer Lute Olson of Arizona.
- » The individual honors won by players under his guidance included all-American Brooks, Pac-12 Tournament MOP Elgin Cook, Pac-12 all-defensive selection Chris Boucher and Pac-12 all-freshman pick Dorsey.

#### 2014-15 season:

- » Altman guided a team that had only three returning scholarship players to a 26-10 record, a runner-up finish in the Pac-12 (13-5) and the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He was the runaway choice for Pac-12 Coach of the Year.
- » Joe Young tied the school single-season scoring record in being named Pac-12 Player of the Year.
- » Cook was an all-Pac-12 second-team selection, while Bell and Brooks made the Pac-12's all-freshman team.

#### 2013-14 season:

- » Altman won his 500th game as a Division I head coach when Oregon defeated Washington on Feb. 19.
- » He joined Basketball Hall of Famer Howard Hobson as the only men to lead Oregon to four consecutive 20-win seasons.
- » Young was an all-conference second team selection and an all-Pac-12 tournament pick, while Mike Moser was an honorable mention selection by the conference.

#### 2012-13 season:

- » Altman's 2012-13 Oregon Ducks became the first UO team since 2008 to qualify for the NCAA Tournament.
- » The Ducks finished the season 28-9 and won the Pac-12 Tournament.
- » Altman was named the Pac-12 Coach of the Year before going on to earn Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year honors.
- » Senior E.J. Singler was a Pac-12 first team selection, while Johnathan Loyd was named MOP of the Pac-12 Tournament
- » Senior Arsalan Kazemi was a Pac-12 all-defensive pick before being drafted as a second round pick to Philadelphia.

#### 2011-12 season:

- » Altman led the Ducks to a 24-10 overall record and a 13-5 Pac-12 Conference mark which was good for a share of second place in the final league standings.
- » The Ducks earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament and recorded victories over LSU and Iowa before falling at top-seed Washington in the tournament quarterfinals.
- » Under Altman's tutelage, Devoe Joseph became the first Duck since the 2006-07 season to be named first team all-conference, while Singler was named to the all-conference second team.

#### 2010-11 season:

- » In his first season at Oregon, Altman led the Ducks to just the 12th season of 20+ victories in the history of the program.
- » He became just the third UO head coach to tally 20+ wins in his first season on the job. Oregon went 21-18 overall and 7-11 in Pac-12 play.
- » Altman posted the second-highest win total of any first-year UO head coach. Only John Warren (30 wins in 1944-45) posted more in his first year on the sidelines.

#### Creighton:

Altman arrived at UO after spending 16 seasons at Creighton where he became the school's all-time winningest coach with a record of 327-176 (.650). He led the Blue Jays to 13 consecutive postseason appearances, a stretch of 11 straight seasons with 20-plus wins, all while producing 10 or more league victories in each of the last 14 seasons. Those three feats were unmatched in the 103 years of the Missouri Valley Conference.

- » He won four Coach-of-the-Year awards from three different conferences in a span of 13 seasons, was a finalist for the Naismith National Coach of the Year Award and was named the NABC District 12 and USBWA District VI Coach of the Year following the 2002-03 campaign.
- » Creighton participated in seven NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and five National Invitation Tournaments under Altman, advancing to the second round of the NCAA championships in both the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons.
- » He led the school to a MVC regular-season title in 2000-01 - its first in 10 years. The Bluejays posted a school-record 29 wins in 2002-03, finishing the season 15th in the Associated Press poll and 23rd in the coaches' voting.
- » Altman finished his career at Creighton ranking third all-time on the MVC list of all-time wins (327). In 2007, he was one of 10 coaches named as part of the MVC's All-Centennial Team.
- » His teams claimed shares of three regular-season Missouri Valley Conference championships (including the 2008-09 crown) and six conference post-season tournament titles.
- » Creighton inducted Altman into its athletics hall of fame in 2018.
- » Three players he coached at Creighton - Kyle Korver, Rodney Buford and Anthony Tolliver - have played in the NBA.

#### Kansas State:

Altman compiled a 68-54 record in four seasons (1990-94) at Kansas State and led the Wildcats to three straight postseason tourneys and was named the Big Eight Conference Coach of the Year after leading KSU to a 19-11 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

- » Altman's final Kansas State club turned heads nationally with a 68-64 win at No. 1 Kansas on Jan. 17.

#### Marshall:

Altman's success at KSU followed him from a brief head coaching stint at Marshall where he was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year in 1990.

#### Personal:

Altman completed his undergraduate education and playing career at Eastern New Mexico University. After earning his associate degree in business administration from Southeast in 1978, Altman graduated magna cum laude from Eastern New Mexico in 1980 with his bachelor's degree in the same field.

- » Altman received his master of business administration degree from Western (Colo.) State in 1981. He served as an assistant coach on the Western State staff from 1980-82.
- » At Wilber (Neb.) High School, Altman was a two-sport letterman, earning all-conference honors as a quarterback on the football team and as a guard in basketball.
- » Elected to the Eastern New Mexico Hall of Honors in 2023.
- » Altman was born June 16, 1958, in Crete, Neb. He and his wife, the former Reva Phillips of Stanton, Neb., have three sons, Jordan, Chase and Spencer, and one daughter, Audra.
- » He is a proud grandparent of three.
