Before Bob Rukavina took over the men's basketball program in 1989, the Mountain Cats had only four winning seasons from 1969 to 1987. In 18 years, he has turned the Mountain Cats into one of the top Division II programs in the country. Pitt Johnstown has made three NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and has posted six 20-wins seasons.

Rukavina guided Pitt Johnstown to a 23-8 overall record and the WVIAC regular season title with a 17-3 conference record in 2007-08. Rukavina, the 2007-08 WVIAC Coach of the Year, also led the Mountain Cats to their third NCAA Tournament appearance and a spot in the East Region Semifinals following an 83-54 win over #2-seeded Mount Olive (NC) College in the First Round.

Along with the on-court coaching success, Coach Rukavina is also the East Region representative for the NABC national poll, a duty he began during the 2004-05 season.

Rukavina finished his 20th season at Pitt Johnstown with a career record of 303-212 and a 250-134 over the past 14 years. On February 21, 2008, Rukavina earned his 300th win at Pitt Johnstown with an 83-67 win at Salem International (WV) University.

In 1998-99, Pitt Johnstown finished the regular season ranked fifth in the country. The Mountain Cats also tied the school record for wins in the regular season, duplicating the 23-4 mark set in 1997-98. Pitt Johnstown posted an 87-23 record (.791 winning percentage) between 1996 and 2000. 1999-00 also marked the program's sixth straight winning season.

In 1997-98, he guided the Mountain Cats to a 24-5 record, a second consecutive NCAA Tournament bid and a school-record 24 wins, before losing in the East Regional Semifinals by one point to eventual Regional Champion Fairmont State (WV) College.

The previous season, the Mountain Cats earned their first-ever NCAA Tournament bid and finished with a 21-6 record.

In 1992, Coach Rukavina led Pitt Johnstown to its first winning season since 1979, clinching it with a win over Division I Youngstown State University. It was the first win over a Division I opponent in school history.

Rukavina, the "winningest" coach in Pitt Johnstown history, is no stranger to turnarounds. When he took over at South Campus of the Community College of Allegheny County, the team was coming off a disastrous 2-22 season. Two years later, CCAC-South posted a 19-11 record and finished third in the Western Pennsylvania Collegiate Conference. The team also placed second in the NJACC Region XX Tournament, the highest in school history.

A strength of Coach Rukavina's is recruiting. The Mountain Cats have had three players lead the NCAA in statistical categories on five different occasions. They have had five players receive accolades ranging from All-American Honorable Mention to All-East Region performers. Five former Mountain Cats have continued their basketball careers at the professional level in various countries.

One statistic that you won't see posted anywhere may be the most important to Coach Rukavina...the rate at which his players graduate. Since he took over in 1989, the program has graduated over 90% of its players, a rate which will stand up to any institution in the country, especially at an institution with such high academic standards as Pitt Johnstown.

In August 2004, Coach Rukavina was selected to be an instructor with former NBA Coach of the Year Jack McKinney at the MedQuest Coaching Clinic in Beirut, Lebanon. The clinic, sponsored by the Federation of Lebanese Basketball, taught Middle Eastern basketball coaches about the game. Prior to that, Rukavina coached an all-star team that traveled to Madrid and Vigo, Spain in the summer of 1998. The team won four of five games. The trip opened up contacts for recruiting and opportunities for playing professionally after college.

Rukavina, his wife Sharon and their son, Nicholas, reside in Lower Burrell, Pa.

## **ASST. COACHES BILLY CLAPPER & GEORGE SULKOSKY, JR.**

The 2007-08 season marked the first for Billy Clapper as a member of the Pitt Johnstown men's basketball coaching staff.

Clapper came to Pitt Johnstown after spending the 2006-07 season on the coaching staff at Division I Indiana State University, where he coordinated the daily basketball operations for the program and provided assistance with opponent scouting reports and player development. His efforts helped the Sycamores earn victories over three teams that reached the 2007 NCAA Tournament: Purdue, Butler, and Creighton.

Prior to his time at Indiana State, Clapper was an assistant coach at Penn State-Altoona under Head Coach Alan Seretti. He was responsible for recruiting, developing game plans, overseeing team perimeter play, and in-game coaching. While at Penn State-Altoona, Clapper coached Tyler Franklin, the school's all-time career scoring leader and a two-time First Team Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference selection.

As a player, he was a member of the men's basketball team at Youngstown State University. He spent three seasons with the Penguins, where he was twice selected to the Horizon League Academic Honor Roll. Clapper also earned the Tony Vivo Hustle Award as a senior. He played his freshman season at Mount Aloysius College in Cresson, Pa. before transferring to Youngstown State.

Clapper has supplemented his playing experience with extensive work at camps and clinics throughout the United States. He has spent the last eight years doing motivational speaking and instructing basketball skills at over 180 basketball camps. His passion for the game has allowed him to start his own company, and develop a basketball training video, in addition to directing his own basketball camps in Pennsylvania.

A native of Saxton, Pa., Clapper earned his Bachelor's degree in Integrated Business Education from Youngstown State in 2005. In addition, he received an Associate degree in Business Administration from Mount Aloysius in 2005 and his Master's Degree in Educational Technology from Indiana State in 2007.

Assistant Coach George Sulkosky Jr. joined Coach Rukavina's staff prior to the 2003-04 season. Prior to coming to Pitt Johnstown, Coach Sulkosky spent 10 seasons as the head coach at Homer Center High School in Homer City, Pa., where he led his teams to nine PIAA Playoff appearances, including PIAA District 6 championships in 1990 and 1991. Coach Sulkosky also spent six seasons as an assistant coach at Indiana University (PA), where the Indians had four NCAA Division II Playoff berths and two National Semifinal appearances.

Along with assisting with the Pitt Johnstown basketball program, Coach Sulkosky is also employed as the Executive Director of the Highridge Water Authority.

He received a Bachelor's Degree in Education in 1978 from Indiana University (PA) and a Master's Degree in Geography in 1984, also from IUP.

Coach Sulkosky and his wife Ruth reside in Blairsville, Pa. They have three children, Anton, Angela and Roman.

## ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Jem Spectar was named the fifth president of the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown in March 2007.

President Spectar, an award-winning professor, previously served as provost and vice president for academic affairs at Western Oregon University. He earned a bachelor of arts in international studies in 1989 from the University of La Verne; a master of business administration in 1992 from The George Washington University in Washington, D.C.; a jurist doctorate in 1992 from the University of Maryland Law School, and a master of arts in politics in 1997 and a doctorate in political science from Claremont Graduate University, Claremont, Calif.

President Spectar recognizes and enthusiastically celebrates our student scholar-athlete accomplishments that add value to the university and enhance campus and community pride. He has published numerous scholarly articles on international law and made presentations on issues involving human rights, the global commons, and international health. With extensive university experience, he holds membership in a number of professional organizations.

Michael F. Castner took over as Interim Athletic Director in September 2001 when long-time Pitt Johnstown Athletic Director Ed Sherlock retired. In June 2002, Castner was named full-time Athletic Director.

Castner earned a Bachelor's degree in Physical Education and Health from Slippery Rock University in 1975. He also received a Master's degree in Education with Athletic Training from the University of Pittsburgh in 1978, prior to becoming a Certified Athletic Trainer.

In 1978, Pitt Johnstown hired him as a building manager and the school's first head athletic trainer. Since then, Castner has also been teaching First Aid and CPR, and in 1987, took over as head coach of the women's Cross Country team.

Castner, originally from Pittsburgh, Pa., has been a resident of Johnstown since his hiring in 1978. He and his wife Ann have three children, Mike, Maureen and Erin.



Johnstown, Pa. native Nikki Babik took over as Assistant Athletic Director on June 1, 2007. Babik also serves as the University's Senior Woman Administrator and CHAMPS/Life Skills Coordinator. In addition, she is responsible for compliance, academic advising and SAAC.

Babik, a graduate of Westmont Hilltop High School, earned a Bachelor's Degree in Sports Management from Bethany (WV) College in 2005 and a Masters in Business Administration from Seton Hill University in 2007. At Seton Hill, Babik was a two year graduate assistant coach with the women's basketball program. She was also an assistant to the Compliance Coordinator in Seton Hill's move from NAIA to NCAA Division II.

Athletically, Babik was a two-year starter on the Bethany women's basketball team. She is ninth on the All-Time Scoring List (1,206 points) and holds the school's career three-point field goals-made record (204). Babik was a Second Team All-President's Athletic Conference (PAC) selection in 2004 and 2005 and an Honorable Mention choice in 2002 and 2003.

Babik is the daughter of Joe and Sue Babik of Johnstown, Pa.

### 2006-07 SEASON REVIEW

After recording the first 20-win season in six-years in 2005-06, expectations for **Head Coach Bob Rukavina's** (18th season) Mountain Cats were high entering the 2006-07 season. Pitt Johnstown returned three starters and eight lettermen, including junior forward **Chris Gilliam (Baltimore, MD)**, who led the nation in field goal percentage the previous year, and senior guard **Dwight Hines (Aliquippa, Pa.)**, who returned to the line-up after sitting out a year with an injury.

With experienced leadership on and off the court, the Mountain Cats proved to be one of the top teams in the East Region by posting a 21-9 overall record and marking the second straight 20-win season as they completed their first year as members of the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC).

Pitt Johnstown opened the year with a solid, 82-65, win at Columbia Union (MD) College, before returning home for the annual UPJ Tip-Off Classic. Following a tough overtime loss to Wheeling Jesuit (WV) University in the first round, Pitt Johnstown rebounded to defeat West Liberty State (WV) College, 96-87.

The Mountain Cats then dealt East Region power West Virginia State University a loss in the Sports Center, before handing Lock Haven University a 15-point loss in the First Round of the Gannon University Gary Miller Classic on November 24. However, the Mountain Cats fell, 73-68, the next night to Gannon in the title game. With his 33 points and 11 rebounds in the two games, **Gilliam** was named to the Classic's All-Tournament Team.

The loss didn't slow the team down, as it closed out the first semester with four straight wins, including it's second straight title at the East Stroudsburg University Tournament. **Hines** claimed Most Valuable Player honors after scoring 14 points and grabbing five rebounds in an opening round win over Seton Hill University. **Hines** then scored 23 points and pulled five more rebounds down to lead Pitt Johnstown to a 69-62 win over the host school in the championship game.

At 8-2, the Mountain Cats began the Spring Semester as one of the top teams in the region. However, close road losses to East Region-ranked West Liberty State, Wheeling Jesuit and Shippensburg University to begin the semester knocked the Mountain Cats down in the rankings.

Despite the losses, the Mountain Cats rebounded again by winning 11 of their next 13 games, highlighted by a home win over Concord (WV) University and road wins at the University of the District of Columbia and Mansfield University. **Hines** became the 17th Mountain Cats to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau when he scored 23 points against Mansfield. Then, just three days later, **Gilliam** became the 18th overall player to reach 1,000-points, and just the sixth to do it in less than four years, after scoring 13 points in a home victory over Columbia Union. Unfortunately, key road

losses to regionally-ranked West Chester University and California University (PA) really hurt the team's NCAA Tournament chances.

At 19-7, Pitt Johnstown still clung to hopes of earning the program's third NCAA tournament berth, but a tough, 71-70, loss at Lock Haven University to end the regular season dashed those hopes.

Unlike past years, the loss to Lock Haven would have ended the season, but the team extended its season by competing and placing fifth in the National Independent Tournament in Fort Myers, FL. Following a 70-61 first round loss to Georgia Southwestern State University, the Mountain Cats dealt Palm Beach Atlantic University an 86-71 loss, before defeating the University of the District of Columbia for the third time in 2006-07. This time, Pitt Johnstown scored an 82-65 win to finish the year with a 21-9 overall record.

In the end, the Mountain Cats had another very successful season, and with it came honors and milestones. **Hines**, the team's second leading scorer (13.2 ppg.), wrapped up his career ranked 11th on the Mountain Cat All-Time Scoring List with 1,145 points and eighth on the All-Time Assist List with 294 assists. **Gilliam**, a Second Team All-WVIAC selection, ended his junior year ranked ninth on the All-Time Scoring List (1,154 points), while senior guard **J.J. Schumacher (Castle Shannon, Pa.)** finished fourth on the All-time Assist List with 418 career assists.

In the final NCAA Division II national statistics, **Gilliam**, the Mountain Cats' leading scorer (17.0 ppg.) and rebounder (6.2 rpg.), was second in the WVIAC and third in the country in Field Goal Percentage at 65.2% (189-290), while **Schumacher** finished 45th nationally in Assists Per Game at 4.8. **Quinton Davis' (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** 49.5% Field Goal Percentage paced the conference.

As a team, Pitt Johnstown led the country in Assists Per Game (19.5 ppg.) and was second in Field Goal Percentage at 52.2% (918-1760). The Mountain Cats were also 25th in Scoring Margin (10.1 ppg.), 27th in Blocks Per Game (4.2 bpg.), 32nd in Field Goal Percentage Defense (41.2%), 36th in Scoring Offense (79.9 ppg.), and 37th in Rebound Margin (4.4 rpg.) In addition, the team also led the WVIAC in Scoring Defense (69.8 ppg.), Field Goal Percentage (52.2%), Field Goal Percentage Defense (41.2%) and Assists per Game (19.5 apg.).

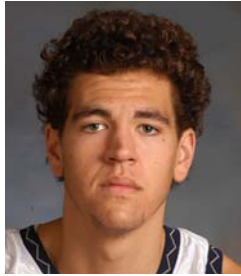

## WVIAC HISTORY

On March 8, 2006, the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) announced it was expanding and voted to induct the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown and Seton Hill University into the conference. On July 1, 2006, Pitt Johnstown and Seton Hill assumed membership into the WVIAC. Each school begins playing league schedules during the 2007-08 academic year.

The Pennsylvania-based schools are the first WVIAC members from outside of West Virginia since Morehead State departed the league in 1933. With the addition of Pitt Johnstown and Seton Hill, the WVIAC became the largest conference in NCAA Division II with 16 members.

Pitt Johnstown will become eligible for conference championships in the 2007-08 season, while Seton Hill will be eligible for WVIAC championships concurrent with the institution's NCAA championship eligibility.

Pitt Johnstown was an NCAA Division II independent. Seton Hill was a member of the NAIA American Midwest Conference.

The WVIAC, entering its 84th season of existence, has been a member conference of NCAA Division II since 1995. The league celebrated the 25th anniversary of women's athletics within the WVIAC in 2006-07.

- 1955**-Bluefield State and West Virginia State join the WVIAC after being members of the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association.
- 1957**-Wheeling College becomes member of the WVIAC.
- 1962**-Bethany leaves the conference.
- 1963**-Potomac State leaves the WVIAC.
- 1977**-Beckley College leaves the conference.
- 1986**-West Virginia Wesleyan leaves the WVIAC for two years.
- 1988**-West Virginia Wesleyan rejoins the conference.
- 1999**-Ohio Valley becomes a WVIAC member.
- 2006**-WVU Tech leaves the conference.
- 2006**-Pitt Johnstown and Seton Hill become the first WVIAC members from Pennsylvania. League membership is at 16, making the WVIAC the largest conference in the NCAA Division II ranks.

Founded in 1924, the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) rates as one of the oldest leagues at the small-college level. The 16-member conference became the largest league in Division II during the 2006-07 academic year.

The current membership includes Alderson-Broaddus College, Bluefield State College, University of Charleston, Concord University, Davis & Elkins College, Fairmont State University, Glenville State College, Ohio Valley University, Salem International University, Shepherd University, West Liberty State College, West Virginia State University, West Virginia Wesleyan College and Wheeling Jesuit University. Pitt Johnstown and Seton Hill University will join the WVIAC for the 2006-07 season. Pittsburgh-Johnstown and Seton Hill are the WVIAC's first out-of-state members since 1932.

The WVIAC moved into the NCAA Division II ranks in 1994 after a long affiliation with the NAIA. The conference was the only one in Division II to place a team in the national quarterfinals in men's basketball, football and baseball during the 1998-99 academic year. In addition, in 2002, the WVIAC, along with two other conferences, became the first league to earn four bids to the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Championship tournament.

Commissioner Barry Blizzard, who has held the post since 1987, led the move into the NCAA. Blizzard, a native of Bramwell, West Virginia, previously served as the athletics director at Bluefield State. The long-time conference chief has served in a variety of national leadership positions, including a two-year term as president of the Division II Conference Commissioners' Association.

Alumni of conference members include West Virginia State's Earl Lloyd (the first African-American to play in the National Basketball Association), Salem International's Cecil Underwood (two-term West Virginia governor) and Wheeling Jesuit's John Beilein (current University of Michigan men's basketball coach).

The conference's basketball tournament is one of the longest running events in collegiate hoops; the 69th annual event was held earlier this year at the Charleston Civic Center. Attendance at the WVIAC tournament ranks among the highest in Division II. The conference also boasts a 12-station radio network for the tournament.

Women's sports were incorporated into the WVIAC during the 1981-82 academic year as the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Association was absorbed. Currently, women's championships are offered in softball, golf, tennis, track, basketball, volleyball, cross country and soccer.

Men's championships are conducted in football, cross country, soccer, basketball, baseball, golf, tennis and track.

The WVIAC is headquartered in Princeton, West Virginia.

## 2007-2008 Pitt Johnstown Mountain Cat Basketball

### SEASON PREVIEW

There's reason to celebrate at Pitt Johnstown. 2007-08 is the University's 80th Anniversary and the 2007-08 season ushers in the beginning of a new era in Pitt Johnstown Mountain Cat basketball as **Head Coach Bob Rukavina's** (19th season) team will play its first West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) schedule in pursuit of a conference title.

**Coach Rukavina** welcomes back three starters and a total of eight lettermen, including Second Team All-WVIAC selection **Chris Gilliam (Baltimore, MD)** off of a team that posted an impressive 21-9 record a year ago. Along with the returning nucleus, **Coach Rukavina** also added **Rashad Mintz (Washington, D.C.)**, a talented point guard who transferred to Pitt Johnstown from Division I Texas A&M-Corpus Christi.

**Gilliam**, a senior forward who enters the season ranked ninth on the Mountain Cat All-Time Scoring List with 1.154 points, returns to anchor the middle after leading the team in both scoring (17.0 ppg.) and rebounding (6.2 rpg.) in 2006-07. **Gilliam** also led the WVIAC and finished third in NCAA Division II in field goal percentage at 65.2%.

Joining **Gilliam** inside are **Marcus Tullis (Johnstown, Pa.)**, **Steve Heidenthal (Clymer, Pa.)** and **Tim McGuire (Nazareth, Pa.)**.

**Tullis**, a returning starter and one of the most athletic Mountain Cats, averaged 9.6 points and 4.3 rebounds per game. **Tullis** also dished out 49 assists and finished second on the team with 34 blocked shots.

After earning a roster-spot as a walk-on, **Heidenthal** saw his minutes increase as the season went on. In 14 games-played as a true freshman, **Heidenthal** chipped in 2.4 points and nearly two rebounds per game.

The Mountain Cats also welcome back the 6'5', 225-lb. **McGuire** after he spent a year away from basketball. **McGuire** should provide some added depth in the paint.

While **Gilliam**, **Tullis**, **Heidenthal** and **McGuire** should take care of the inside attack, **Mintz** a senior from Washington, D.C. is expected to take over at the point guard spot vacated by **J.J. Schumacher (Castle Shannon, Pa.)**, who graduated last spring. **Mintz** comes to Pitt Johnstown after two seasons at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi where he posted a season-best 11 assists against Oklahoma State University.

Junior guard **Quinton Davis (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** could have a break-out season. **Davis** joined **Coach Rukavina's** starting line-up last year and led the WVIAC in three-point field goal percentage at 49.5%. His 51 three-

pointers-made paced the team, while his 11.4 points and 5.0 rebounds per game were both third on the team.

Along with **Davis**, the Mountain Cats have several other returning sharp shooters from the outside in juniors **William Sharpe (Johnstown, Pa.)** and **Matt Ionadi (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** and red-shirt sophomore **Andy Byer (Tire Hill, Pa.)**. This trio combined for 53 three-point field goals off of **Coach Rukavina's** bench a year ago. **Sharpe** also finished second on the team with 78 assists. Red-shirt sophomore **Jordan Medich (North Huntingdon, Pa.)**, red-shirt junior **Dan Hirsch (Mechanicsburg, Pa.)** and true-freshman **Danny Branch (Washington, D.C.)** will also provide additional depth at the guard spot. The 6'4", 175-lb. **Branch** averaged 13.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists per game as a senior at Washington, D.C.'s Archbishop Carroll High School. True freshman **Travis King (Washington, D.C.)** will take a red-shirt this season.

Pitt Johnstown just might be the best passing team in the country. The Mountain Cats led the nation in assists last year at 19.5 assists per game. In addition, the team finished second in the country in field goal percentage at 52.2%, just .02 of a percent shy of the NCAA Division II lead.

The Mountain Cats return a wealth of talent, but there are some holes that need filled. Starting guards **Dwight Hines (Aliquippa, Pa.)** and

**Schumacher** both graduated after finishing their careers ranked among the all-time assist leaders in Pitt Johnstown history. **Hines** was also the team's second leading scorer at 13.2 points per game. The Mountain Cats have the talent to be a contender for a WVIAC conference championship and a third trip to the NCAA Division II Tournament. If Pitt Johnstown is able to navigate a 20-game conference and a difficult seven-game non-conference schedule that features WVIAC rival West Virginia State and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) perennial powers California University (PA), Bloomsburg University and Shippensburg University, the 2007-08 could prove to be the start of something special in a new conference.

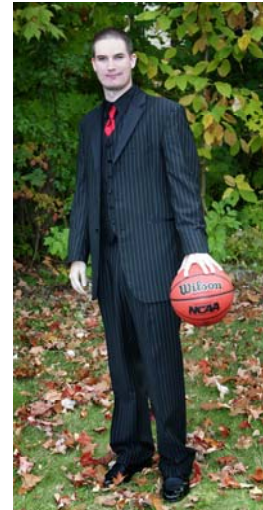

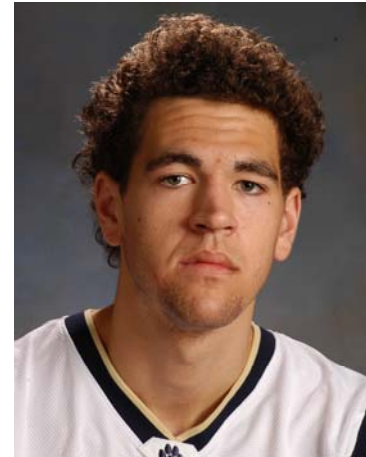

### At Pitt Johnstown

#### 2006-07 Season

Chris led the team in scoring (17.0 ppg.) and rebounding (6.2 rpg.) on his way to being named Second Team All-WVIAC. His 65.2% (189-290) field goal percentage ranked him second in the WVIAC and third in NCAA Division II. Chris' 74.3% (113-152) free-throw percentage and 16 blocks were third on the team, while his 27 steals were fourth. On January 27, he became the 18th Mountain Cat to reach the 1,000-point plateau and just the sixth to do it in less than four years when he scored 13 points against Columbia Union (MD) College. Chris ranks ninth on the Pitt Johnstown All-time Scoring List with 1,154 points. He also has 431 career rebounds. He led the team in scoring 12 times and rebounding 11 times. Gilliam, an All-Tournament Team selection at the UPJ Tip-Off Classic and Gannon Gary Miller Classic, scored in double figures 26 times and grabbed seven or more rebounds 14 times. He matched his career-high set in 2005-06 when he scored 31 points against West Liberty State (WV) College on 11/18/06 at 31 points at Mansfield University on 01/24/07. Chris also has career-highs of 13 rebounds against the University of District of Columbia on 11/19/05 and four assists at Columbia Union on 11/15/06.

#### 2005-06 Season

Chris joined the Mountain Cat starting line-up and led the team in scoring at 18.6 points per game on his way to being named Independent Collegiate Athletic Association Co-Player of the Year. He became the third Pitt Johnstown player to lead NCAA Division II in a statistical category. Gilliam's 68.6% (199-290) field goal percentage not only broke the Mountain Cat single-season record, but led the entire country. He finished second on the team in rebounding (6.3 rpg.), tied for third in blocks (15 blocks) and fourth in steals (30 steals). Gilliam earned MVP honors at the Gannon University Gary Miller Classic in November after scoring 47 points and pulling down 14 rebounds in two games. He was also named to the All-Tournament Team of the 2005 UPJ Tip-Off Classic. He led or tied for the team lead in scoring 20 times, including pacing the team in its first 11 games of the season. He scored in double-figures in 24 of 27 games and scored 20 or more points 11 times. Gilliam led the team in rebounding eight times. He also established his career-highs of 31 points at Glenville State (WV) College on 12/03/05 and 13 rebounds against the University of District of Columbia on 11/19/05.

#### 2004-05 Season

Chris saw action in all 25 games and made an immediate impact as a true freshman. In just under 15 minutes per game, Chris averaged 6.4 points and 3.2 rebounds per game on his way to being named Independent Basketball Freshman of the Year. He finished third on the team in blocked shots (11) and fourth in rebounding (3.2 rpg.). He shot a team-high 64.8% (68-105) from the field, while converting 64.9% (24-37) from the free-throw line. Chris led or tied for the team lead in scoring two times and rebounding three times during his freshman season. He scored in double-figures six times and pulled down five or more rebounds in a game seven times.
