Saturday's game against Morgan State will kick off the 17th season of South Alabama Football. The Jaguars have lost back-to-back season openers, and will look to pick up their first season-opening victory since defeating Nicholls by a score of 48-7 in 2022.

ALL ABOARD THE BLAYNE TRAIN

Jaguar linebacker Blayne Myrick was named the Sun Belt Conference's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. In 2024, Myrick totaled 101 tackles to go with eight tackles for loss, two sacks a pick-six and a forced fumble.

BACK-TO-BACK BOWL CHAMPS

The Jags enter the 2025 campaign fresh off winning the 2024 IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl against Western Michigan. It was South Alabama's second-straight bowl championship as the Jaguars also won the 2023 68 Ventures Bowl.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for South Alabama Football games must be submitted through the credential request portal at USAJaguars.com. This can be found by navigating to the football page, then selecting the media drop-down menu.

Credentials should be requested by Wednesday of the game week for a Saturday game. Credentials can be picked up at the ticket booth on the south side of Hancock Whitney Stadium.

No credentials will be issued to freelance photographers/videographers. Nobody under the age of 18 will be issued a media credential.

The South Alabama strategic communications office reserves the right to approve or deny credential requests at its discretion.

FIELD ACCESS

Media credentials must be visible in order to gain access to the field. All members of the media must have a working purpose in order to be on the sidelines.

Members of the media should never enter the field of play, or the bench area of either the home or visiting team (between the 25-yard lines).

The South Alabama locker room is closed at all times to members of the media.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Only photographers/videographers shooting for accredited media outlets will be issued credentials.

Photographers/videographers with a media credential are not permitted to shoot between the 25-yard lines. Photographers/videographers may not shoot on the playing field until the conclusion of the game, and must stay off the field during pregame activities.

Photographers and videographers are considered working members of the media and must refrain from communicating with players, coaches or game officials.

Failure to follow any of these rules may result in immediate dismissal from the stadium.

POST GAME INTERVIEWS

After a cooling off period, selected players and coaches will be made available to members of the media in a postgame press conference. Interview requests will be taken late in the game and every effort will be made to ensure that requested players are available. Requested players and coaches will be accompanied by a South Alabama strategic communications staff member to the designated interview area (the officials locker room under the northwest corner of the stadium).

There will be no media interviews conducted on the field, except for the television network that is broadcasting the game.

Student-athletes who are injured will not be allowed to participate in post-game media interviews.

The South Alabama locker room is closed at all times to members of the media.

Visiting team postgame media availability will be coordinated through the visiting team's communications staff.

Not conforming to any of the above listed guidelines may result in the loss of credentials for future games.

PRACTICES

The South Alabama strategic communications staff encourages coverage of Jaguar Football in addition to game day. The team's practice schedule and availability will be communicated weekly. Please contact the South Alabama strategic communications office in advance if you plan on attending a practice session.

Certain South Alabama Football practices are open to credentialed members of the media for viewing on the condition that media in attendance do not report on any injuries that take place during practice. Media must also refrain from reporting on any players who do not participate in practice due to injury or any other reason.

Media wishing to report on injuries or players who do not practice must ask Coach Applewhite for a comment on said players during his media availability. If Coach Applewhite chooses not to comment on the player in question, no reporting may take place.

Media who fail to comply with this policy run the risk of losing access to practices.

INTERVIEWS

In-person interviews with members of the coaching staff and student-athletes can be arranged by contacting Tyler Roper at or Seth Whitehouse. Interviews with student-

athletes must be arranged in advance through the media relations office. Players are generally available immediately following practice

Phone interviews are also available, but will be arranged around the student-athlete's class and practice schedules. Student-athletes' phone numbers are not available under any circumstance. All phone interview requests must be made 24 hours prior.

MEDIA MEMBERS SHOULD NEVER CONTACT STUDENT-ATHLETES DIRECTLY AT ANY TIME. Student-athletes have been instructed to immediately terminate any contact initiated by a member of the media.

South Alabama conducts a weekly press conference on Mondays in the team room of the Jaguar Football Facility.

Head coach Major Applewhite, along with both offensive coordinator Paul Petrino and defensive coordinator Will Windham, will address the media at 12:30 p.m. CT

**HEAD COACH | MAJOR APPLEWHITE**

Major Applewhite was named the fourth head coach in the history of South Alabama Football on Jan. 18, 2024.

In his first season at the helm of the program, Applewhite led the Jaguars to a 7-6 record. The season ended just up the road in Montgomery, Ala. where South won the IS4S Salute to Veterans Bowl Championship by defeating Western Michigan by a score of 30-23. It was the program's second-straight bowl championship and Applewhite's first as a head coach. Applewhite became the first South Alabama head coach to make and win a bowl game in his first season with the team.

Under Applewhite's leadership in 2024, the Jags produced 11 All-Sun Belt Conference performers. Wide receiver Jamaal Pritchett and safety Jaden Voisin both earned First Team All-Conference recognition, with Pritchett becoming the third, 1,000-yard receiver South Alabama has produced since Applewhite became offensive coordinator in 2021. Pritchett was also invited to play in the 2025 Reese's Senior Bowl, held at South Alabama's Hancock Whitney Stadium.

Known for orchestrating explosive offenses, Applewhite's impact as head coach was noticeable from his very first game as the Jaguars quickly started breaking records. In the 2024 season opener against North Texas, quarterback Gio Lopez set the program's single-game record for total offense with 494 total yards on 432 yards passing and 62 yards rushing. A few weeks later, the Jags put up 87 points in a victory over Northwestern State, which was the most points scored by an FBS team since the 1991 college football season, and set a new program record. The Jags ended the year with the most rushing touchdowns in the Sun Belt Conference (32), and finished second in the league in total offense per game at 441.8 yards per contest.

In year one at South, Applewhite continued the trend of providing his players with professional opportunities. Wide receiver Jamaal Pritchett, tight end DJ Thomas-Jones, defensive lineman Wy'Kevious Thomas and wide receiver Jeremiah Webb all signed free agent contracts at the conclusion of the 2025 NFL Draft.

Before earning to promotion to head coach, Applewhite spent three seasons with the Jaguars as the team's offensive coordinator. South Alabama went 22-16 during those three years, including a 10-win season in 2022 and a 2023 campaign that resulted in the first bowl championship in school history.

One of the best offensive minds in all of college football, Applewhite has elevated South's offensive attack since arriving on campus. In his role as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Applewhite's star pupil at USA has been Carter Bradley, who became the winningest quarterback in program history and broke multiple school records along the way. Bradley received All-Sun Belt honorable mention recognition in 2023, and accepted invitations to both the Hula Bowl and Senior Bowl at season's end.

Under Applewhite's leadership, the 2023 Jaguar offense set a program record for points in a single season with 430 in the year. South Alabama scored 55 points or more in three games throughout the course of the season, including 59 in the team's win over Eastern Michigan in the 68 Ventures Bowl. That number set a program record for points against an FBS opponent. The Jags also scored 55 points in back-to-back wins over ULM and Southern Miss.

Applewhite settles into his new role at South Alabama having already spent two seasons as the head coach at Houston. In two seasons at the helm, Applewhite guided the Cougars to a record of 15-11 with two bowl game appearances. In his first season leading the program, UH defeated nationally-ranked South Florida during the regular season on the way to a 7-5 finish and an appearance in the Hawai'i Bowl. The Cougars then improved to 8-5 the next fall while earning an invitation to the Armed Forces Bowl.

Between stops at Houston and South Alabama, Applewhite spent two seasons as an analyst on Nick Saban's staff at Alabama. In 2020, he helped guide the Crimson Tide to a perfect 13-0 season and subsequent College Football Playoff National Championship. It was Applewhite's second of two stints at Alabama, his first coming in 2007 when he served as the program's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

From 2008-2013, Applewhite coached at his alma mater, Texas, in various roles. Starting as the program's assistant head coach working with the running backs in 2008, Applewhite was eventually elevated to offensive coordinator in 2011 and served in that capacity for three seasons with the Longhorns. While working for legendary head coach Mack Brown, Applewhite helped Texas win the 2008 Fiesta Bowl and make an appearance in the 2009 BCS National Championship game.

After starting his coaching career at Texas in 2003 as a graduate assistant, Applewhite went to Syracuse in 2005 as quarterbacks coach. Following a year in New York, he returned to the state of Texas to serve as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Rice for the 2006 season.

Before transitioning into coaching, Applewhite played quarterback at Texas for four seasons. During his playing career, Applewhite was named Big 12 Freshman of the Year and the league's co-Offensive Player of the Year in 1999. In his final appearance for the Longhorns, he was named Most Valuable Player of the Holiday Bowl after throwing for 473 yards and four touchdowns in a four-point victory over Washington.

Applewhite owns a bachelor's degree in sport management from Texas. He resides in Mobile with his wife, Julie, and children, Lila and Nash.

"I want to make this our city's team. I want to create an atmosphere here in our stadium where it's full. Where people are here early, they're loud, and they stay late. I want to see 50, 60 smokestacks coming up. I want to see the top of RV's. I want to create a situation where this stadium represents our entire city."

THE LEGACY OF NO. 5

There are many special numbers throughout college football and college athletics whether it be No. 12 for the 12th Man at Texas A&M or No. 38 at Ole Miss to remember former Rebel Chucky Mullins, but for South Alabama, the No. 5 will forever hold a significant place in the hearts of every Jaguar.

On June 13, 2010, the University of South Alabama lost a member of the football program when Anthony Mostella (1988-2010), a member on the inaugural Jaguar squad, passed away near his home of Oneonta, Ala., in a traffic accident. Mostella, who would have been a senior that fall, was loved and respected by all his teammates and coaches, someone whose contributions to the program on the field were exceeded by what he was able to accomplish away from the game.

Voted a team captain during the 2009 season, Mostella – a running back who came to South Alabama in order to continue his relationship with then head coach Joey Jones – displayed his selfless nature with his contributions on special teams and in the locker room, while fellow teammates racked up more yardage running the ball. In his one season, Mostella rushed for 180 yards and three touchdowns, and was also credited with seven tackles on special teams coverage units.

He came to USA and Mobile after playing for Jones at Birmingham-Southern in 2007, sacrificing a season of collegiate eligibility in order to help build the Jaguar program by taking part in its first-ever spring practice in March and April of 2009. During that time he established himself not only as a leader, but as an ambassador for the program as it established its roots in the community.

Beginning during the 2010 season, the Jaguars honored Mostella each fall as one member of the senior class was chosen by his teammates and coaches to wear his No. 5 jersey for their final season.

After a brief break from 2018-2020, the tradition was brought back, but with a new twist. Instead of a selected senior being able to wear the jersey for the entire season, it was awarded to a different individual each week throughout the season.





