The University of South Carolina Aiken was chartered in 1961 after entering into an agreement with the University of South Carolina to establish a two-year center in Aiken.

The Aiken Center opened its doors in September 1961 to 139 students. Temporarily housed in Banksia, a renovated mansion in Aiken, the Center consisted of three full-time faculty members (one of whom served as Director of the Center).

In 1968, the Center underwent an institutional self-study and was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as a branch of the University of South Carolina and as a junior college. The first associate degrees were awarded in June 1968.

The campus of USC Aiken moved from Banksia to its present site in 1972 and physical changes began to occur rapidly. At first, the permanent campus consisted of 100 acres and one multipurpose building which housed all university operations. A library was completed in 1975, and additional land was donated that increased the campus to 144 acres. In October 1977, the Student Activities Center was opened. A classroom building was occupied in 1978, and one year later, an auxiliary services building was added.

An apartment complex for students, Pacer Downs, was ready for occupancy in the fall of 1984.

More construction additions to the campus included completion of the Etheredge Center, Ruth Patrick Science Education Center, the Business and Education Building, and the Alan B. Miller Nursing Building. Additional land was acquired increasing the campus to 400 acres.

Academic and organizational changes also occurred rapidly. The faculty formalized its organizational structure and redefined its role in the governance of the institution in 1974-75. Also, the students reorganized their governing body and more precisely defined their role on campus; the administration and staff structures were overhauled and expanded to meet the demands of the growing academic programs.

When the full-time equivalent student enrollment reached 1,066 in the fall of 1975, the USC Aiken campus was permitted to plan for senior level courses and to create



a number of baccalaureate degree programs. In that same year, USCA received approval as a four-year branch campus by the Board of Trustees of the University of South Carolina, and USCA was designated a Recognized Candidate for Senior College Accreditation. In September 1976, the Board of Trustees granted academic autonomy to the Aiken Campus. The first bachelor's degrees were granted in May 1977, and USCA became a fully accredited senior college.

Presently, the college community is comprised of more than 3,200 students, over 100 full-time faculty, approximately 110 staff members, and 28 administrators. USCA awards bachelor's degrees in more than 20 major areas of study, master's degrees in two areas, and offers a varied program of continuing education courses for the wider community.

Today USC Aiken offers students a liberal education designed to develop an understanding of human experience which will equip them for life in a free society. To accomplish this, the University provides students with an opportunity to discover learning processes which enable them to grow personally and socially.

It promotes students' interaction within a community of active scholars and artists, and it encourages students to use the knowledge which they gain to deal with the problems of a rapidly changing world.

## STATE-OF-THE-ART FACILITY SERVES AS PACERS' HOME

Following several successful years at J.H. Satcher Field, USC Aiken Baseball began a new chapter in its storied history.

Opened Sept. 18, 2003, the Roberto Hernandez Baseball Stadium

came into existence as a major addition to the facilities at USC Aiken.

This 1,000-seat, state-of-the-art stadium features a beautiful grass surface with all the amenities of a top-notch NCAA Division I ballpark.

A clubhouse, players' lounge, coaches offices, modern press box with separate radio broadcast booth, training facilities, top-of-the-line scoreboard with message center, and 850 covered seats are among the highlights.

But the crown jewel is the Roberto Hernandez Hall of Fame Room. Designed to display the program's rich heritage, generous donations by Hernandez himself got the Hall of Fame off to a roaring start.

"It means a lot to me to give to USC Aiken," said Hernandez, a 17-year veteran and two-time Major League All-Star. "Maybe there will be another Roberto Hernandez to play at USC Aiken. If it wasn't for this school, I would not be where I am today."

The inaugural game was played on January 31, 2004 versus Carson-Newman.

## FORMER USC AIKEN PACER AND 17-YEAR MLB VETERAN

Roberto Hernandez came to USC Aiken as a sophomore after spending one season as a catcher at the University of Connecticut.

Upon his arrival, the USCA coaching staff transformed him into a dominating pitcher.

In his one season, Hernandez posted a 10-2 record with 97 strikeouts in 94.0 innings pitched. At the plate, he belted 19 home runs.

Hernandez led the Pacers to the 1986 NAIA College World Series and was named to the All-Tournament team.

After his one season with the Pacers, Hernandez was the 16th pick of the first round in the 1986 Major League Baseball draft, selected by the California Angels.

Following five plus seasons in the minor leagues, Hernandez made his debut with the Chicago White Sox. In his first full season, he recorded 38 saves and helped Chicago to the AL

West championship.

After six seasons with the White Sox, Hernandez was traded to the San Francisco Giants in 1997 where he went 5-2 with a 2.48 ERA in 28 appearances.

In 1998, Hernandez began his three-year stint with the Tampa Bay Devil Rays and for the 2001 and 2002 seasons, he was the closer for the Kansas City Royals.

Hernandez signed as a free agent with the Atlanta Braves prior to the 2003 season and served as a setup man for closer John Smoltz.

After stints with the Philadelphia Phillies in 2004 and then with the New York Mets in 2005, Hernandez signed a one-year deal with the Pittsburgh Pirates for 2006. He began the 2007 season with the Cleveland Indians before being traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers.

For his career, Hernandez is 67-71 with 326 saves and a 3.45 ERA. He

has appeared in 1010 games, tossed 1071.1 major league innings, and struck out 945 batters.

Currently ranked 11th all-time in saves, Hernandez is second among Latin-born pitchers. He is also a two-time All-Star.

Recognized by "The Sporting News" for three-consecutive years as a "Good Guy in Sports", Hernandez has made a habit of giving back.

Aside from the one-million dollar donation to build Roberto Hernandez Stadium, he has been involved with Gloves for Kids, RBI (Reviving Baseball in the Inner Cities), and an autograph show to benefit the hurricane disaster relief fund for Puerto Rico in the winter of 1998.

Hernandez is married to Ivonne and the couple has three children: Kairy, Roberto, Jr., and Jose.

# Kenny Thomas

## Head Coach

In 10 seasons as head coach of the USC Aiken baseball program, Kenny Thomas has re-established the Pacers as a force in the Peach Belt Conference and a perennial top 25 team in Division II.

USC Aiken's 2009 baseball team ended the 2009 season tied for 10th in the final Collegiate Baseball NCAA Division II Top 30 poll.

The final ranking of 10th was the highest for the Pacers under Thomas, who was chosen as PBC Conference Coach of the Year for his mentoring of the 2009 Pacers. USC Aiken ended the 2008 season ranked 11th, while they concluded the 2005 season 12th.

The Pacers reached as high as No. 2 nationally in 2009 en route to their second ever Peach Belt Conference regular season championship.

The Pacers' prowess during the regular season helped USC Aiken to top honors in the Southeast Region, enabling the program to host its second ever NCAA Division II Tournament regional.

The Pacers advanced to the regional final for the second consecutive season before bowing out to NCAA Division II Baseball Championship semifinalist and Conference Carolinas Tournament champion Belmont Abbey in the first game of the championship round.

USC Aiken (42-19) concluded its season having been a part of its fifth consecutive NCAA Division II Baseball regional.

In 2008, Thomas and his staff guided the Pacers to a school-record 47 wins and a second-place finish in the NCAA South Atlantic Regional. USCA went 47-17 overall and 18-9 in the Peach Belt Conference, finishing just one win behind PBC champion Columbus State.

With 369 career wins at USC Aiken, Thomas trails only current Director of Athletics Randy Warrick (392) on the school's all-time wins list. Thomas, who is third on the school's all-time list by winning percentage

(.628), has led the Pacers to five-straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009) for the first time in school history.

It was April 23, 2006 when USC Aiken knocked off sixth-ranked Francis Marion 5-2 in Aiken to notch Thomas' 200th victory at the helm of the Pacers. The Pacers went 45-19 that season, at the time the most wins in Thomas' USCA tenure.

In 2005, Thomas' Pacers went 40-19 including a 16-14 mark in PBC play to advance to the program's first NCAA South Atlantic Regional in a dozen years.

Three short seasons ago, Thomas notched his 150th win in an 11-2 victory over in-state non-conference foe Claflin University.

On February 12, 2002, USC Aiken knocked off Limestone College 14-8 to hand Thomas his 100th victory at USC Aiken while his 50th win came on April 4, 2001 in a dramatic 8-6 victory over Newberry in 10 innings.

In 2004, the Pacers opened the 1,000-seat Roberto Hernandez Stadium of which Thomas and Athletic Director Randy Warrick were instrumental in securing a one million dollar donation from the 16-year Major League Baseball veteran.

Since the stadium's opening, USCA is 120-48 at the state-of-the-art ballpark for a .714 winning percentage. In addition, USC Aiken hosted the 2006 and 2008 Peach Belt Conference Baseball Tournament.

Thomas has seen his fair share of student-athletes go on to play professionally. Most recently, 2008 Daktronics Player of the Year and 2008 Peach Belt Conference Player of the Year Chad Jacobsen was drafted in the 18th round of the 2008 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft by the Colorado Rockies.

In addition to being chosen as the PBC Coach of the Year in 2009, Thomas was named Coach of the Year in 1989, 1993-96, and 1998 by his fellow coaches and was selected in 1995 and 1999 as the National

Thomas' success has not gone unnoticed by the community. Over the past seven seasons, the Pacers have finished in the top 15 in Division II in home attendance. As part of Thomas' annual Pack-the-Park day promotion a school record 1,316 fans were inside the gates of Roberto Hernandez Stadium for USC Aiken's 11-6 win over PBC rival Lander on Sunday, April 19, 2009.

Thomas has also instilled in his team the confidence needed to win the big games as the Pacers have won 85 games played against ranked opponents in the past 10 seasons, including 36 games in the last three years. The Pacers posted 17 wins over ranked foes in 2009.

As a player, Thomas earned NAIA All-American honors his senior year as a catcher while at Trevecca Nazarene University in Nashville, Tenn. In 2007, Thomas was inducted into the school's hall of fame and saw his number 19 jersey retired.

Following his graduation in 1978, Thomas began coaching a Stan Musial summer league team. In nine summers, he led his team to a



national championship (1985), a runner-up finish (1986) and a third place finish (1984).

Thomas also became a local scout for the New York Yankees (1980-81), Cincinnati Reds (1981-82), and St. Louis Cardinals (1982-88).

After becoming head coach at Volunteer State, Thomas remained with the Cardinals organization in a part time capacity until 1995.

He has served as a hitting instructor at the famous Stan Saleski Baseball Camp in Dayton, Ohio as well as conducting his own Kenny Thomas Winter Baseball Academy. Started in 1990 with 12 kids, Thomas' camps, winter and summer, quickly grew to over 400 students by 1999.

Thomas has coached 48 players who have gone on to be drafted in professional baseball drafts, 83 All-Conference players, six conference Players of the Year, 16 All-Americans, one Southeast Region Player of the Year and two National Players of the Year.

Thomas is also involved in the local community. His work with the Aiken AMBUCS club has garnered him honors by that organization that serves to award college scholarships to physically handicapped high school students.

In the summer of 2003, Holder served as an assistant coach for the Cotuit Kettleers of the prestigious Cape Cod League.

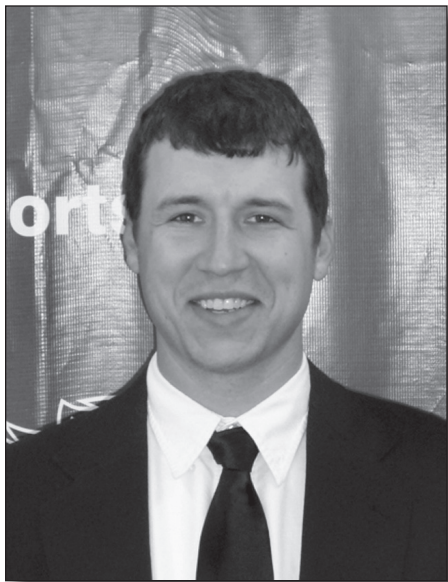

# PACER PREVIEW

## USCA Consensus Top 10 Preseason Choice

The USC Aiken baseball program has become a national power over the last five seasons. The Pacers have won 40 games or more for the past five campaigns and advanced to the last five NCAA Division II Tournaments.

Last year, USC Aiken claimed the Peach Belt Conference regular season championship and hosted the 2009 NCAA Division II Southeast Regional, advancing to the championship round of the regional for the second consecutive year.

The Pacers finished the year ranked 10th in the final Collegiate

Baseball NCAA Division II Top 30 poll.

USC Aiken has claimed each and everything possible over the last five seasons that a program can expect for one thing and that is the ultimate goal in the 2010 season.

That goal is to advance to the 2010 NCAA Division II Baseball Championship in Cary, N.C. in May.

The goal is well within reach as the Pacers are a good bet to repeat as PBC champions and advance to the Division II Baseball Championship due to one of the strongest rosters in all of Division II baseball.

The Pacers in total return 20 letterwinners and eight starters in 2010. The Pacers will not only be considered one of the most potent

offenses in all of college baseball, but they will also be thought of as one of the strongest pitching rotations in Division II baseball.

Last year, the Pacers concluded the year ranked in the top 10 nationally in a variety of different categories. The Pacer pitching rotation did their part as well with four Pacer pitchers acquiring five or more wins on the hill. The Pacers return seven senior pitchers in 2010.

“Top-to-bottom, believe it or not, I believe we will be a better offensive team in the 2010 season,” said USC Aiken 11th-year head coach Kenny Thomas, who was honored as the PBC Coach of the Year in 2009. “We are going to put a lot of pressure on the defenses of the teams that we are playing. Even with the offense, I still believe that pitching will be one of our strongest areas. Nothing replaces experience and we return some great pitching in 2010.”

### Offense

You cannot talk about the 2010 Pacer offense without beginning with senior returner Travis Howard (Bonneau, S.C./USC Salkehatchie). A consensus All-America selection after the 2009 season, Howard captured one of the most prolific regular seasons on offense

in 2009 not only in USC Aiken and Peach Belt Conference history, but in NCAA Division II history.

Howard, who was also named to the All-Peach Belt Conference first team as a designated hitter, ended the 2009 season with 103 RBIs to tie Jason Jones' (Kennesaw State) PBC record of 103 originally set in 1998. He just missed out on tying the all-time NCAA Division II record of 104 set by Jarred McAlvain of Central Oklahoma in 1997.

Howard's proclivity to bring in runs in 2009 left him ending the year atop the NCAA Division II landscape in runs batted in and runs batted in per game. He is overall in the top 100 in NCAA Division II in 11 different offensive categories.

Howard had an incredible 38 extra-base hits in the 2009 regular season, finishing the regular season with 19 home runs, 16 doubles and three triples. The power numbers helped Howard own a slugging percentage of .694. The only player to be named the Peach Belt Conference Player of the Week three times in 2009, Howard ended the year in the top 10 in the Peach Belt Conference in 10 different offensive categories, including hits, runs scored, home runs, doubles, RBIs, total bases, slugging percentage, total plate appearances, at-bats and sacrifice flies.



Nick Aranas

Howard was a designated hitter last year for the majority of the season for the Pacers, but in 2010 he will see a lot more time in the field, particularly at first base.

Howard is not the only Pacer returning with some pop in his bat. Junior Nick Aranas (Lexington, S.C./Lexington) returns to man third base for the Pacers in the 2010 season.

A true PBC Player of the Year candidate along with Howard in 2010, Aranas has just scratched the surface of his potential. Last year, Aranas played in and started in all 61 games for the Pacers. He hit .351 with 18 doubles, four triples and seven home runs. Aranas slugged .545 and collected 48 RBIs.

Alex Franklin (North Augusta, S.C./North Augusta) played a variety of positions in the field last year for the Pacers. This year he is slated to replace Cody McMorris (Canton, Ga./Southern Union CC) in centerfield and in the batting lineup at lead-off. Franklin brings the tools to do both successfully. Last year, Franklin tied Howard for the team-high in batting average at .384. He was 34-for-37 on his stolen base attempts and he secured 50 RBIs from his the second spot in the Pacer lineup.

Stephen Carmon (Camden, S.C./Camden) was one of the biggest surprises in all of 2009 for the Pacers. Originally slated to redshirt, Carmon was pulled off his redshirt very early in the 2009 campaign by Thomas and his managerial exploits worked beautifully with Carmon ending the year as the Peach Belt Conference Freshman of the Year. Carmon hit .335 for the Pacers last year, while holding down the shortstop spot for almost the entire season.

With Howard at first, Aranas at third and Carmon at shortstop, Chris Grandinetti (Broomfield, Colo./Broomfield) returns for his junior campaign after an injury-plagued 2009. The Pacer starter at second

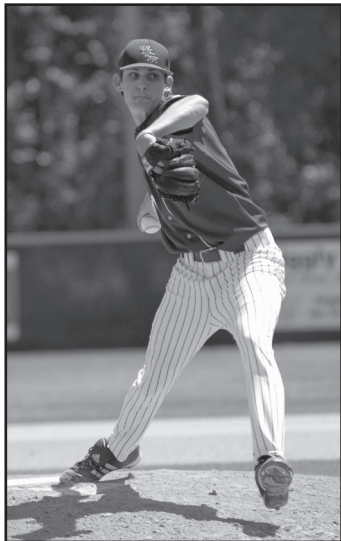
base in 38 games in 2009, Grandinetti hit .328 last season.

Gary Asbill (Batesburg, S.C./Batesburg-Leesville) will line up as the starting catcher in 2010. Asbill hit .378 last season in 26 starting assignments as the Pacer backstop.

Despite the returning talent, USC Aiken still has some holes to fill, particularly having to replace Ken Raborn (Evans, Ga./Evans), Jamie Benjamin (Alpharetta, Ga./Southern Union CC) and McMorris.

Benjamin was the Pacers primary leftfielder in 2009. He will be replaced there in 2010 by Aiken native Jowan Gray (South Aiken). Gray hit .286 in 14 appearances last season, but Thomas expects a great deal from him in 2010 as he was one of the team's brightest spots in the fall of 2009.

Franklin as noted will replace McMorris in centerfield, but that leaves the rightfield spot open. Thomas right now believes the spot has been filled by Bill Rice, who makes his way to Roberto Hernandez Stadium after one year at Gloucester Community College in Sewell, N.J. Strong at the plate, Rice, who played his freshman season at the University of Maryland, is described by Thomas as a "hitting junior college outfielder, who is hopefully just what we are looking for right now."



**Steven Spire**

Raborn will not be easily replaced as he was just as adept at second base as he was at first base for the Pacers. The Pacer Most Valuable Player in 2009, Raborn's production at the plate will also be dearly missed as he ended his career holding the school record in seven different offensive categories.

### Pitching

The Pacer pitching staff is an embarrassment of riches. The Pacers welcome back a talented stable that includes seven senior pitchers.

To go along with the strong returning pitchers, USC Aiken's coaching staff also signed one of the best pitching classes in school history. The Pacers not only return quality starting pitching, but a strong returning nucleus in the bullpen.

Senior Steven Spire (Swansea, S.C./Swansea) returns in 2010 after a junior campaign that saw him finish as a second team All-PBC pitcher. Spire tied for the team lead in total wins with seven. The right-handed pitcher struck out 44 in 76.2 innings pitched.

Clayton Knight (Goose Creek, S.C./Limestone) returns for his senior season in 2010 primed to start the year the same way that he concluded the previous season. Knight dealt a team-best 77 strike-

outs in 2009 to go along with a 5-3 record in a team second-best 82.1 innings pitched.

Jason Cochcroft (Gilbert, S.C./Gilbert) tied Spire for the team lead with seven wins. He concluded the year 7-3 overall in a team-best 84 innings on the mound.

Sophomore lefty Tyler Stephan (Louisville, Ky./Trinity) pitched in 15 games as a true freshman in 2009. Stephan went 4-2 in the 15 appearances, which included four starts. The Pacer coaching staff expects even more from him in 2010 as a starting pitcher and in the bullpen.

In addition, to the four returners mentioned, the USC Aiken coaching staff feels that newcomer Steve Owens gives the Pacers an imposing presence on the mound. The 6-foot-9 right-handed pitcher was a late summer pickup by the USC Aiken coaching staff. A senior from Sykesville, Md., Owens was 3-2 last year for the University of Richmond, dealing a team second-best 53 strikeouts in 61 innings on the mound. Owens started all 11 games in which he appeared in the spring of 2009.

Out out of the bullpen, Chad Benefield (Dallas, Ga./Southern Union CC) fanned 44 batters in 17 appearances for the Pacers last season. The senior right-handed pitcher held his opposition to a .255 batting average against him.

### Outlook

The 2010 Pacer baseball season begins and ends with what may truly be one of the toughest schedules in all of college baseball.

The 2010 USC Aiken baseball schedule features one of the strongest non-conference schedules in school history coupled with a full Peach Belt Conference slate.

The Peach Belt Conference schedule will be a little different from the past though with baseball moving to divisions. USC Aiken will be joined in the East division of the PBC

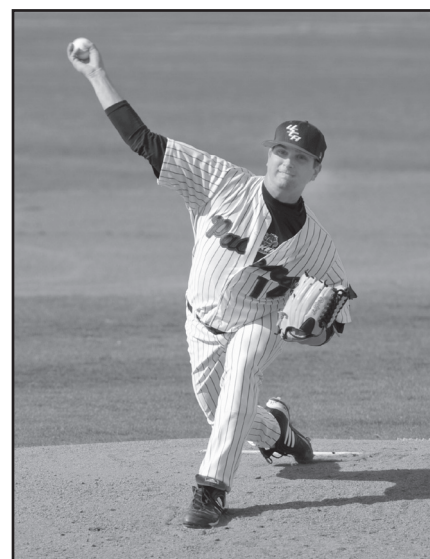
by UNC Pembroke, Armstrong Atlantic State, Lander, Francis Marion and Flagler. The West portion of the PBC for baseball will feature Montevallo, Georgia Southwestern, Columbus State, North Georgia, Georgia College & State and Augusta State.

USC Aiken is playing five teams in 2010 that concluded the 2009 campaign in the final NCAA Division II Collegiate Baseball Top 30 poll. In total, the Pacers are squaring off against 10 programs that were ranked in the top 30 at one point last year.

Last year, USC Aiken opened the year sluggishly, but according to Thomas for the 2010 Pacer baseball campaign to be a success "we just cannot start off like we did last year. We cannot afford to not be on all cylinders. We have to start off strong; if only for my sanity."

Nevertheless, Thomas believes that putting together such a strong schedule will be good for his team.

"If we play some of the best teams in the region and nation early, it can only prepare us for the latter part of the season," noted Thomas. "If we're going to compete for the national championship, we need to play a tough schedule like this. We'll see how smart I am (for making this schedule) next May."

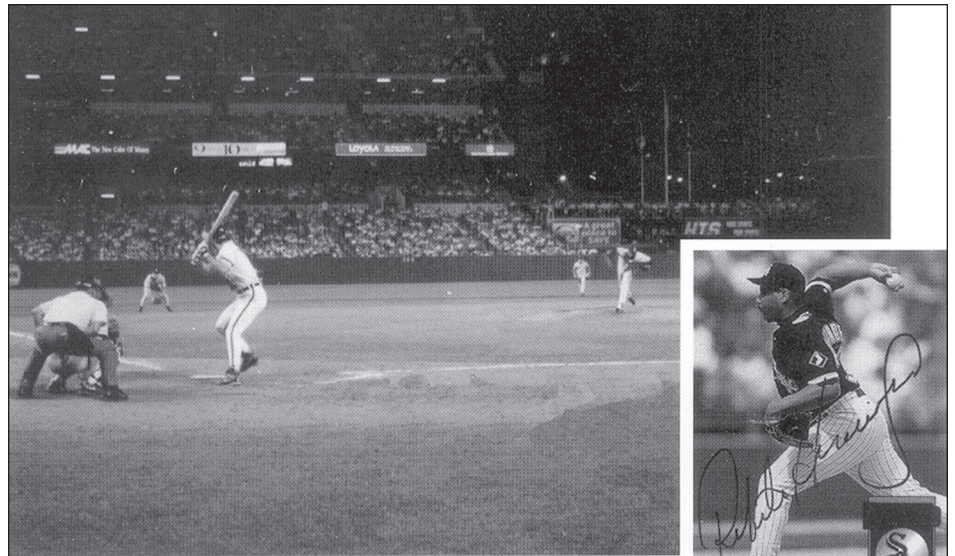

**Vision Statement:**

The Peach Belt Conference is committed to providing through its dependent collegiate members, a forum for student participation in athletic, academic and co-curricular events under the auspices of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division II.

We will exemplify the characteristics of a premier intercollegiate conference that prides itself on the inclusion of students of all demographic groups who wish to participate in a well-rounded sports program. Our institutions, our academic goals, our athletic aspirations reflect a communitarity of purpose and a commitment to excellence in the classroom and on the playing field.

**History:**

Now entering its 20th year of existence in 2009-10, the Peach Belt Conference has become one of the elite Division II conferences in the nation. Since its inception in 1990-91, the Peach Belt has developed a consistent history of excellence which continues to this day with 28 national championships and 25 national finalist

Starting with only two championships in 1991, in men's and women's basketball, the conference has expanded to 13 championship sports with the addition of women's golf in the fall of 2009.

The conference traces its roots back to November of 1988 when 11 schools first met in Greenville, S.C. to form a Division II conference. Following a second meeting on Dec. 3, 1989, five of those 11 schools, plus two others, formed the Peach Belt and begin play in fall 1990.

The Peach Belt was less than a year old before capturing a national championship. The Columbus State golf team took the honor by winning the 1992 national crown, the first of three golf championships the Cougars own. One year later, the Lander men's tennis team began their record-breaking run of eight straight national titles, the first PBC dynasty. Since then, USCA men's golf has won three straight national titles from 2004-06 while AASU women's tennis has captured four titles overall.

The 2008-09 season was among the conference's most memorable.

The Armstrong Atlantic State men's and women's tennis teams both won their respective national championships – for the second year in a row; a feat only done once before in college tennis. In addition, the Augusta State men's basketball team became the first conference program to make back-to-back trips to the NCAA Elite Eight, Armstrong Atlantic became the first PBC volleyball team ever to advance to the Elite Eight and the North Georgia softball team was ranked #1 in the nation and reached the World Series.

The seven charter members of the conference were Armstrong Atlantic State University, Columbus State University, Francis Marion University, Georgia College & State University, Lander University, USC Aiken and USC Upstate. The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January of 1990 and modified to Peach Belt Conference in May of 2000.

Augusta State joined the conference in 1991 and UNC Pembroke became the ninth member on July 1, 1992. They were followed by Kennesaw State University on July 1, 1994, Clayton State University on July 1, 1995 and the University of North Florida on July 1, 1997. Kennesaw State and North Florida departed for the Division I ranks in 2005, USC Upstate did the same in 2007, and the conference welcomed in North Georgia College & State University in 2005 and Georgia Southwestern State University in 2006.

For 2009-10, the Peach Belt has grown once again with the addition of the University of Montevallo and Flagler College, giving the PBC 13 members, the most the league has ever had. The addition of the two schools returns the PBC to the state of Florida and expands the league into Alabama for the first time.

David Brunk was named the second PBC commissioner in May of 2007. Brunk replaced Marvin Vanover, who was the first PBC commissioner from 1991 to 2007. Brunk is charged with continuing the strong growth of the conference as its second era begins.

Dr. David Potter, president of North Georgia College & State University, returns as the president of the Peach Belt in 2009-10.

The conference currently holds

championships in 13 sports, six for men and seven for women. They are men's and women's cross country, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's tennis, baseball, softball and men's and women's golf.

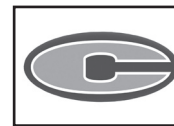
