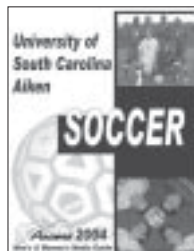

THIS IS USC AIKEN

The University of South Carolina Aiken was chartered under authority granted by the General Assembly of South Carolina and the Aiken County Commission for Higher Education in 1961 after entering into an agreement with the University of South Carolina to establish a two-year center in Aiken.

The Aiken Center opened its doors in September 1961 to 139 students. Temporarily housed in Banksia, a renovated mansion in the City of Aiken, the Center consisted of three full-time faculty members (one of whom served as Director of the Center) and one secretary.

Initially, the school offered only freshman and sophomore level courses but throughout the sixties, the size and reputation of the Center grew as word of its excellence spread among its constituents. In 1968, the Center underwent an institutional self-study and was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as a branch of the University of South Carolina and as a junior college. The first associate degrees were awarded in June 1968.

The campus of USC Aiken moved from Banksia to its present site in 1972



and physical changes began to occur rapidly. At first, the permanent campus consisted of 100 acres and one multipurpose building which housed all university operations. A library was completed in 1975 and additional land was donated increasing the campus to 144 acres. In October 1977, a Student Activities Center was opened. A classroom building was occupied in 1978 and one year later, an auxiliary services building was added.

An apartment complex for

students, Pacer Downs, was ready for occupancy in fall of 1984. More constructional additions to the campus included completion of the Etheredge Center, Ruth Patrick Science Education Center, the Business and Education Building and the Alan B. Miller Nursing

Building. Additional land was acquired increasing the campus to 400 acres.

Academic and organizational changes also occurred rapidly. The faculty formalized its organizational structure and redefined its role in the governance of the institution in 1974-75. Also, the students reorganized their governing body and more precisely defined their role on campus; the administration and staff structures were overhauled and expanded to meet the demands of the growing academic programs.

When the full-time equivalent student enrollment reached 1,066 in the fall of 1975, the Aiken Campus was permitted to plan for senior level courses, as well as create a number of baccalaureate degree programs. In that same year, USCA received approval as a four-year branch campus by the Board of Trustees of the University of South Carolina and USCA was designated a Recognized Candidate for Senior College Accreditation. In September 1976, the Board of Trustees granted academic autonomy to the Aiken Campus. The first bachelor's degrees were granted in May 1977 and USCA became a fully accredited senior college.

Presently, the college community is comprised of more than 3,300 students, over 100 full-time faculty, approximately 110 staff members, and 28 administrators. USCA awards bachelor's degrees in more than 20 major areas of study, an associate degree in nursing, master's degrees in



two areas, and offers a varied program of continuing education courses for the wider community.

Today USC Aiken offers students a liberal education designed to develop an understanding of human experience which will equip them for life in a free society. To accomplish this, the University provides students with an opportunity to discover learning processes which enable them to grow personally and socially. It promotes students' interaction within a community of active scholars and artists, and it encourages students to use the knowledge which they gain to deal with the problems of a changing world.

USC AIKEN CHANCELLOR

Tom Hallman is in his fourth full year as Chancellor at USC Aiken. He was born in Charleston, S.C., and earned a Bachelor's of Arts in Political Science from The Citadel in 1969. He later earned a Master's of Education degree from The Citadel, and was awarded a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration from the University of South Carolina in Columbia in 1993.

Professionally, his resume includes a diverse set of experiences. Dr. Hallman has served as an Infantry officer in the 82nd Airborne Division, a high school teacher and coach, co-owner and creative director of an advertising agency, executive director of a school-to-work initiative, and 23 years of work in public higher education in South Carolina.

Since 1983, he has worked in various administrative roles at USC

Aiken. Dr. Hallman most recently served as Interim Chancellor as the University conducted its search for a new chancellor following the retirement of Dr. Robert Alexander in June 2000. Dr. Hallman has also served as Vice Chancellor for Administration. In that job, he was responsible for the Enrollment Services and Institutional Planning Division. Additionally he serves as institutional liaison with several regional groups in matters related to sponsored research and local economic development.

Dr. Hallman just finished serving a one-year term as Peach Belt Conference President and is a past Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Aiken Chamber of Commerce, past President of the Aiken Kiwanis Club, founding member and past Chairman of the Aiken County Forum, and a former



Chair of Leadership Aiken County.

Tom is married to the former Susan West, of Woodruff, S.C., a Nurse Practitioner with a private practice in Augusta, GA and they have two children, David who is 14 and Caroline who is 12.



Randy Warrick enters his 18th year as Director of Athletics at the University of South Carolina Aiken. He was hired at USCA in 1978 as head baseball coach and intramural director and has served many different duties during his tenure.

While coaching baseball for 11 years, Warrick also served as an assistant basketball coach during the

1978-79 season and acting golf coach in 1989-90. As baseball coach, Warrick compiled a 310-125 record, while earning various coaching awards. In 1986 his team advanced to the College World Series, the highlight of his coaching career.

Warrick was born in Rocky Mount, NC and attended Rocky Mount High School. He was an All-Conference player in football, basketball, and baseball. Upon graduation from high school, Warrick went to Louisburg Junior College where he played baseball for two years.

In 1975, Warrick earned his Associate of Arts degree from Louisburg and was drafted by the Kansas City Royals, but decided to stay in school.

Warrick then moved on to the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he received a two-year baseball scholarship. While at North Carolina he earned Atlantic Coast

Conference All-Academic honors two straight years. He earned his Bachelor's of Arts degree in Education in 1977 and then his Master's of Arts in Teaching in 1978. While earning his master's degree, he served as a graduate assistant baseball coach. In the same season, the team advanced to the College World Series.

Warrick is a member of the College Athletic Management's Editorial Board, National Association of Athletic Development Directors, PBC Athletic Director's Council, PBC Strategic Planning Committee, PBC Awards Committee, NCAA Division II AD's Association Board of Directors, Greater Augusta Sports Council Board, and the NCAA Division II National Golf Committee.

Warrick is married to Martha Blankenship Warrick of Augusta, GA. They have one child, Tripp, who is 13 years old. The Warrick family resides in North Augusta, SC.

Prior to coming to USC Aiken, Britton worked as a sports information assistant at Union College in Barbourville, Ky. Before his stop at Union, Britton served as a student assistant in the sports information offices at Cumberland College (Ky.) and Eastern Kentucky University. While at ECU, Britton worked under the direction of sports information veteran Karl Park, who served 34 years as Eastern's SID.

Britton earned his Bachelor's of Arts degree in Public Relations and a minor in History in December 2000 from Eastern Kentucky University. The Corbin, Ky., native is a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), Kapa Tau Alpha (the mass communications national honor society), the United States Basketball Writers Association and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Ike Ofoje enters his ninth season as the head men's soccer coach and eighth as the head women's soccer coach at USC Aiken. Ofoje, a 1991 graduate of New Hampshire College, was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American and was named Most Valuable Player for his 1989 National Championship team.

In his eight seasons at the helm of the Pacers, Ofoje has compiled a 42-97-7 overall record.

Although last year's team suffered through a tough 0-11 season, Ofoje's squad remained competitive throughout, losing six games by just one goal, including a 2-1, double overtime loss to 10th ranked UNC Pembroke.

In 2002 the Pacers entered the Peach Belt Conference Tournament as the seventh seed, but Andre Joseph's game winner with four minutes to play lifted USCA to a stunning 2-1 upset over #8 North Florida and gave the program its first-ever PBC Tournament victory.

On the women's side, Ofoje, who started the program in 1997, has amassed a 49-65-8 mark in seven seasons. After struggling through a 1-14-1 inaugural season, the Lady Pacers went 45-39-7 over the next five seasons.

Two years ago the Lady Pacers scored the program's first-ever win over a top 10 team, a 2-1 overtime win over ninth ranked Francis Marion.

As a player at New Hampshire College, Ofoje led his teams to a 72-15-4 record and four NCAA Tournament appearances during. He totaled 58 goals, 36 assists, and 152 points in 75 career matches. He owns the school record for most career points and is tied for most career assists. Ofoje is a member of the New Hampshire College Hall of Fame.

After graduation, Ofoje played professionally in the United Systems of Independent Soccer Leagues for the Boston Storm for two seasons.

Ofoje also played on his native country of Nigeria's junior and senior national teams.

While coaching at St. Joseph's High School in Huntington, W. Va., Ofoje earned his Master's degree in Sports Management at Marshall

University.

Ofoje, who holds a USSF "A" coaching license, served as assistant women's soccer coach at Illinois State University before arriving at USC Aiken.

Anya Heminger enters her first season as Graduate Assistant Coach for Ike Ofoje. After finishing her playing career at Clayton State in 2002, Heminger spent the 2003 season as a student assistant for the Lakers.

The Ontario, Ore., native started all 37 matches in her two-year career at Clayton State. She became the school's all-time assists leader on her way to leading the team to 22 victories in two seasons (2001-02), including a runner-up finish in the 2002 PBC Tournament. She was named to the 2001 Peach Belt All-Conference team and was named the Lakers' Most Valuable Offensive Player that same season.

Prior to playing at Clayton State, she was a two-year starter at Walla Walla Community College and was named to the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges Academic All-Conference team in 2000. Heminger received her undergraduate degree in Applied Biology from Clayton State in May 2004.





HEAD COACH IKE OFOJE

SOCCKER COACH WORKS ON TEAMWORK, CHARITY

AIKEN, S.C.--A Rome, Ga., soccer coach recently called Ike Ofoje with good news.

For Ofoje, the USC Aiken head men's and women's soccer coach, this had nothing to do with recruiting. Instead, this was something bigger, something better.

On the other end of the phone was a man about to send 225 uniforms to Ofoje. In turn, Ofoje will donate those jerseys to his native Nigeria.

"I know in Nigeria that's a hit," Ofoje said.

In his eighth season, Ofoje oversees two teams that are a combined 2-12 overall and winless in conference play. What Ofoje lacks in wins, though, he makes up for with a heart the size of a soccer field.

When a former Nigerian high school coach needed uniforms three years ago, he called Ofoje, who went right to work. He began collecting jerseys and shipping them to Africa on an annual basis. Then he learned of another problem.

Ofoje discovered that college students in Nigeria have to pay for standard classroom handouts. Textbooks?



Too costly. "That just struck me," Ofoje said. So when USC Aiken begins classes

each semester, Ofoje gathers outdated used books. The first year, he shipped 12 boxes back home to his brother, Ambrose, who distributed them to various schools.

"I don't try to publicize (my charity)," he said. "(USC Aiken's media relations) say why don't we do a press release?"

Press releases would not do justice in describing the only soccer coach in the Peach Belt Conference to head up two teams. He wakes at 5:30 every morning to start a 16-hour day, which includes a morning practice for one team and an afternoon practice for the other.

With year-round recruiting and a handful of summer soccer camps to work, Ofoje somehow finds time for his family, which includes his wife, Anne, and two daughters, 5-year-old Avery and 3-year-old Alexys.

"It's like Ike works the hours of two separate people to accomplish the things he has to for two programs," USC Aiken athletics director Randy Warrick said.

When the 35-year-old Ofoje played soccer on the Nigerian junior national team, coaching wasn't on his mind. Neither was coming to the United States. He wanted to play the sport professionally in Europe.

At a junior tournament in Mexico, though, Ofoje met a man who would change his life. New Hampshire College coach

Rob Grabill offered him a scholarship and a chance to get a degree. Ofoje

was sold. "That man could make you run through a wall," Ofoje said.



At New Hampshire College, Ofoje was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American, leading his team to a 72-15-4 mark. In 1989, he was the most valuable player of the national championship team.

After he left college in 1991, Ofoje played professional soccer for the Boston Storm and later became an assistant coach at Division I Illinois State. Four months later, he took the men's head coaching position at USC Aiken, never thinking his stay would be long.

"I never knew that Aiken would grow on me like it has," Ofoje said. "It's small. It's safe. You don't have to worry about traffic. It is almost perfect."

His coaching situation, though, is not close to perfect. USC Aiken doesn't have the money to compete with rival colleges three times larger in the Peach Belt. So most of the players he recruits aren't superstars.

"I invest in average players and work with them," he said. "If I have the money, I can invest in above-average players. Most of the time, I'm coaching players and not coaching the team."

His instruction hasn't paid off with his career record at USC Aiken. He entered this season with a 42-86-7 record for his men's squad and a 46-53-8 mark for his women's team.

In the game of life, though, Ofoje is well above .500.

2004 SEASON PREVIEW

Men's Soccer Looks To Rebound From Tough 2003 Season 21 New Players And 8 Returning Players In A Quest For Success

"We had a rough season last year." Those are the words USC Aiken Head Men's Soccer Coach Ike Ofoje chose to describe the 2003 season. When the team steps on the field for the first time this season, they'll be doing it with an 800-pound gorilla on their backs. The Pacers are coming off a winless season in 2003, going 0-11-0.

"The toughest thing I have to do is making sure that psychologically everyone is up," said Ofoje, now in his ninth season with the Pacers. "So far it has been very positive, the majority of the returners see that we don't have anywhere else to go but up, and I see it the same way."

In 2003 Ofoje's team was competitive in nearly every match, losing six times by just one goal and three of those came in overtime. Goalkeeping and defense kept the Pacers in games, but scoring became an issue, totaling just five goals all season.

Eight letterwinners, including six starters, return to form the core of the 2004 squad. They will be joined by a group of 21 new players.

One of the biggest returning players, both physically and figuratively, is 6-foot-6 inch, senior Mamadou Ndoye. Ndoye led the team in scoring in each of the previous two seasons. In 2002 he scored seven goals and totaled 17 points. Last season he scored two of the team's season total of five goals. His scoring will be a 'big' key to the Pacers' success in 2004.

In terms of leadership, Ofoje is counting on seniors Neil Berment and Plamen Peev. In many ways Berment and Peev have been like assistant coaches, helping the new players get acclimated to college life and orienting the new players to the system.

Newcomers to watch include Emmanuel Maduka, sophomore Dennison Scipio and junior Kashetu

Usman. Maduka came on very strong in preseason practice, showing scoring skills. Scipio and Usman look to be factors defensively.

Goalkeepers

The biggest question mark heading into the season is who will replace departed senior Peter Calabrese in goal for the Pacers. Calabrese's play last season allowed USC Aiken to remain competitive in many of its matches. He held the opposition to two goals or less in seven of USA's 11 matches.

The front-runner at this point to gain the starting nod is Harold Tate, a sophomore transfer from St. Andrews Presbyterian College. Marcos Rodriguez and Zac Van Frank are pushing for playing time as well.

Defenders

Berment and junior Benjamin Cawley are the only returning defensive starters. Both should continue to anchor the defense. Cawley started all 11 games last season. A host of newcomers provide depth on defense.

Forwards

Joseph and Ndoye return for their senior seasons and are Ofoje's starting forwards. Maduka, Matt Cawley, Matthew Martin and Juan Sanabria offer the coach a number of options.

Midfielders

Peev and senior Kevon Aberdeen are returning starters at the midfield position. Ofoje says Peev is on a different level than many players that have come through the USC Aiken program, and through the Peach Belt Conference as well.

Mamadou Samba and Tommy Rushing return from last season, but saw only limited playing time in 2003.

Ofoje sees the midfield position as a strength of the team. He has high expectations of Georgi Peev and Eugene Eshun-Philips to go along with Plamen Peev and Aberdeen.

On the opposite side, Ofoje sees one glaring weakness at this point.

"Our biggest weakness right now, because we have so many players, is trying to tie everything together and have everyone playing on the same page," said Ofoje.

The coach figures USC Upstate (formerly USC Spar-

tanburg) is the team to beat in the Peach Belt Conference in 2004. Ofoje's fellow coaches agree, voting the Spartans as the league favorite in their coaches poll. USC Aiken was picked to finish last in the seven-team conference, but Ofoje doesn't necessarily agree with that.

"You can never tell what is going to happen on a give day," said Ofoje. "My goal is to pull some surprises and with the caliber of players we have now, I think we can do that."

With that 800-pound gorilla still firmly attached, at least for right now, Ofoje will continue to work to keep his players positive, knowing the adversity they face now will help them off the field.

"Sometimes you can see that doubt, you can feel that doubt, but overall I think the experience has been very positive for them. Its good to know that they are using this experience in terms of personal growth."

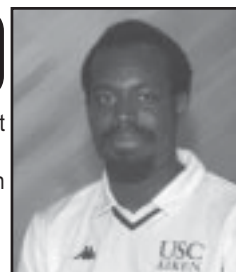

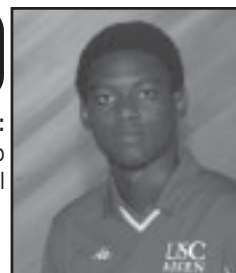

2004 SEASON PREVIEW

Experience & Talent Leads To High Expectations For Lady Pacers USC Aiken Women's Soccer Looks To Return To Form In 2004

Expectations are high this season for the USC Aiken women's soccer team. Head Coach Ike Ofoje will welcome back 15 letterwinners and 10 of 11 starters for the 2004 season. The Lady Pacers will use that blend of experience and talent in their quest for a winning season.

"The fact this team has played together for two years, and so many players are coming back will help boost their team work," said Ofoje, set to begin his eighth season as head coach of the women's team. "They seem to understand each other now."

Many of the juniors on this team helped lead USC Aiken to an 8-8-3 record as freshmen in 2002. Sophomore slumps set in last year as the squad dropped to 3-12-0 overall. The four freshmen on the 2004 team will add a spark that could propel the Lady Pacers up the Peach Belt Conference standings.

"The three new players and Jackie (Mascarin) will definitely give us some fire up front," the coach said of his newcomers.

The new Lady Pacers that Ofoje expects to spark his team are forward Melanie Byars and midfielders Christine Blumberg and Nitza Maldonado, all of which are first year freshmen. Forward Jaclyn Mascarin is a second year freshman after missing last season due to an injury.

Juniors Melissa Schnoering and Jodi Kulinitch, endured tough sophomore seasons but were instrumental in leading the Lady Pacers to a .500 mark as freshmen in 2002. Mascarin and Schnoering finished with five goals each last year, after scoring seven and nine goals respectively in 2002. Kulinitch's production dropped off from nine goals in 2002 to two goals in 2003.

GOALKEEPER

Senior Shannon Hobbs is the only goalkeeper listed on the 2004 roster, but

she has some company from Byars. Ofoje hopes to be able to turn goaltending duties over to his senior keeper and take advantage of Byars' talents in the field. In order for that to happen, Hobbs will have to return to 2002 form. The senior gave up an average of 3.91 goals last season after allowing just 1.67 goals per match two years ago.

DEFENDERS

Ofoje has plenty of experience returning on defense, the key will be the unit's health. Starters Beth Johnston, Andrea Lloyd and Amy Myers return for their junior seasons, as does junior reserves Meg Newton, Brittney Pelt, and Tayo Amos, and senior Jenny Collier.

The bad news is Johnston, Pelt and Amos are nursing injuries. Their health will significantly factor into USCA's success in 2004. With the injury situation, Schnoering will likely see a lot of time on defense, at least in the early part of the season.

FORWARDS

Another deep position for Ofoje. Starters Audie Beckman, Amanda Faulkham, both seniors, along with junior Kulinitch are all back in 2004. Byars and Jaclyn Mascarin add to an already strong group.

Kulinitch had the second most shot attempts on the team last season, 21, but only found the net on two occasions. Faulkham scored three times in 2003 and added two assists while Beckman had one goal and two assists as well.

MIDFIELDERS

Two of three starters return in Natasha DaCosta and Jen Mascarin. DaCosta made an immediate impact last season as a freshman, tying for the team lead with five goals and 12 points.

"Natasha is one of the toughest

players we have, she's tough, she's perseverant, she's everything you can imagine," Ofoje said. "She came back in very good shape, the toughest thing will be keeping her within boundaries so she doesn't lose her cool, I'm looking forward to seeing what she can do this year."

Mascarin finished with five goals to go along with two assists for a total of 12 points. Maldonado, the only left-footed player on the team, and Blumberg will compete for playing time.

Ofoje sees North Florida and Francis Marion as the teams to beat in the Peach Belt Conference in 2004. The

league loses defending conference and national champion Kennesaw State, which is making the jump to NCAA Division I this season, but with the addition of two teams, Columbus State and Georgia College & State University the PBC will remain one of the toughest conferences in Division II soccer.

"In the last two years the gap has closed tremendously on the women's side in the Peach Belt," said Ofoje. "Without Kennesaw State it's going to be an open season."

With a roster full of experience and talent, the Lady Pacers will play a key role in the PBC in 2004.

"Having all of our returnees coming back in good shape is a big plus, I can't wait to see how well they will play this year," Ofoje added. "The addition of the three new players will bring a different dynamic to the group. They're playing well, they're working real hard, I think it will be an exciting year."

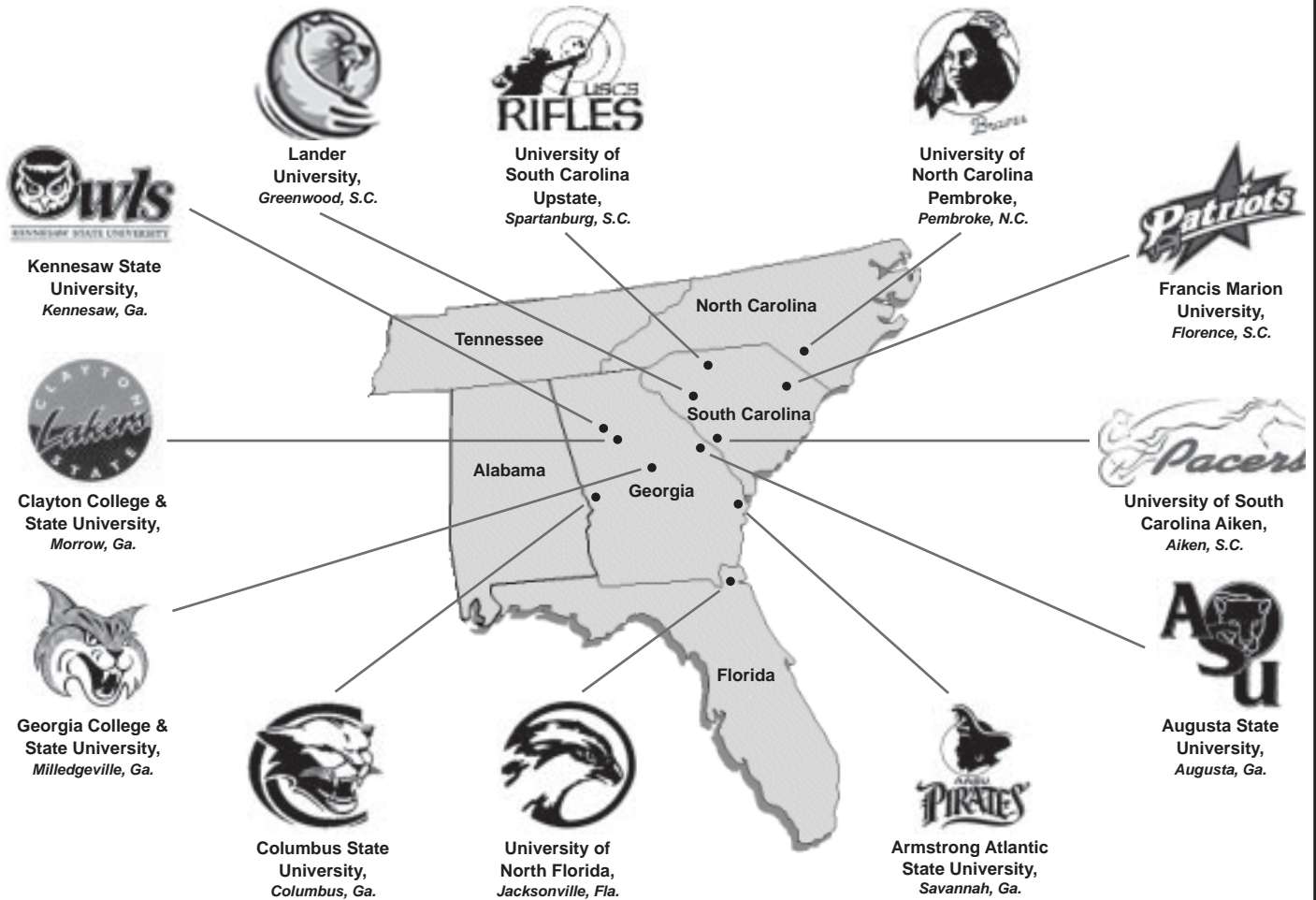

PEACH BELT CONFERENCE



The Peach Belt Conference is in its 14th full year as an all-sports conference. In 1991, the conference held championships in men's and women's basketball then expanded to 11 championships in 1991-92. With the addition of women's soccer in 2000, the PBC now sponsors championships in 12 sports, six for men and six for women.

The idea for the formation of an NCAA Division II conference was discussed in November, 1988, in Greenville, S.C., with 11 schools represented at the meeting. Five of the colleges at that first meeting, along with two other schools, formed the new conference when USC Aiken hosted another meeting on December 3, 1989.

The seven charter members were Armstrong State College (Armstrong Atlantic State University), Columbus College (Columbus State University), Francis Marion College (Francis Marion University), Georgia College (Georgia College & State University), Lander College (Lander University), USC Aiken, and USC Spartanburg (USC Upstate). The name Peach Belt Athletic Conference was adopted in January 1990 and revised to Peach Belt Conference in June 2000.

Augusta College (Augusta State University) applied and was accepted in November 1990, with the effective date of membership on July 1, 1991. With the addition of Augusta College, the Peach Belt Conference had four members each in Georgia and South Carolina. Another college joined the Peach Belt Conference on July 1, 1992, when Pembroke State University (UNC Pembroke) officially became a member. Kennesaw State College (Kennesaw State University) became the tenth full member of the conference on July 1, 1994 and Clayton State College (Clayton College & State University) joined the league on July 1, 1995. The conference expanded to 12 members with the addition of the University of North Florida on July 1, 1997.

Former Augusta College basketball coach and athletic director Marvin Vanover was named interim commissioner in April 1990, and served in that capacity until his appointment as the conference's first full-time commissioner in July 1991. The conference has established an office in Augusta, Ga., which houses the commissioner and his staff.

The conference conducts championships in 12 sports. Men's champions are declared in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, and tennis. Women's champions include those in basketball, cross country, softball, tennis, volleyball, and soccer.
