SEASON OUTLOOK

USC men's tennis is a program rich in tradition and historical success, but last year's team proved that there is always more history to be made.

The 2004 Trojans, coming off the worst season in program history, erased all doubt last year when they climbed their way back to the top of the tennis ranks. The team, led by then-second year head coach Peter Smith, compiled a 23-4 overall record, a 6-1 Pac-10 mark for a share of the conference title (USC's 14th Pac-10 title overall), advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Tournament and earned a final No. 4 ITA ranking.

"We felt we accomplished great things last season," said Smith, who enters his third year at Troy. "We put the program back where it belongs thanks to a total team effort."

After going 14-12 in 2003, it marked the greatest turnaround in Trojan history. USC climbed from sixth place to first place in the conference in a one-year span. For the accomplishment, Smith was honored as the Pac-10 Coach of the Year - his seventh career conference honor. USC's NCAA semifinal appearance marked the first of Smith's 17-year career.

But last season's victories are now but a page in the history books and it's time for this year's Trojan tennis team to make its own historical mark.

"Our players are driven to maintain USC's position among the country's top teams," said Smith, who boasts a 307-151 (.670) career record. "Every year we set the same goals - go undefeated at home, win a Pac-10 Championship and compete for another national title. I believe we are capable of accomplishing all three goals."

USC returns seven letterwinners and must incorporate five newcomers this season. The majority of the responsibility lies on the returning members of the starting lineup, including sophomore Jamil Al-Agba (Camarillo, Calif.), senior Johan Berg (Stockholm, Sweden) and senior Drew Hoskins (Rossmoor, Calif.). All three earned All-Pac-10 honorable mention honors in 2004.

Al-Agba joined the team in January of 2004 and provided needed depth by competing at the top three positions throughout the season. He played primarily at No. 2 (4-4) and No. 3 (11-3) singles, compiled a 21-9 overall record and finished the year ranked 81st in the ITA. This season he begins the year ranked 86th in the ITA Preseason Poll.

Berg alternated at the Nos. 1 (4-3), 2 (4-5) and 3 (10-0) spots in 2004, finishing the season ranked No. 78 with a 24-14 overall singles record. He also earned a final No. 41 doubles ranking with then-senior Adriano Biasella. Berg was a big factor in the Trojans' NCAA Tournament success, winning four singles matches en route to the semis. He enters this year ranked No. 97 in singles.

Hoskins, who is ranked No. 116 in singles in the preseason poll, was also integral in the Trojans success last season as he compiled one of the team's best singles and doubles records. He earned a 28-8 overall singles mark, a 20-5 record in dual matches and a 9-3 record against Pac-10 opponents, playing primarily at the No. 5 (6-0) and No. 6 (10-3) spots. In doubles, he compiled a 16-5 overall record and was ranked No. 20 in the final ITA rankings with then-senior Daniel Langre.

"It is really important for Jamil, Johan and Drew to continue to step-up their game," said Smith. "They have all made great strides at practice and have been hitting the ball well. We need them to turn these practices into good performances once the dual match season begins."

One key factor to the Trojans' success will be finding comparable replacements for the four vacant positions left behind by last year's seniors - Biasella, Langre, Ruben Torres and Parker Collins. Biasella played No. 1 in 2004 and was ranked 29th at season's end, Langre and Torres carried the Trojans' with great success at the 4 and 5 spots, and Collins and Torres made big contributions at No. 3 doubles.



To fill the roles, USC will look to players such as redshirt junior **Brian Wright** (Fresno, Calif.), who transferred from Pepperdine in 2002 but has been sidelined with knee and elbow injuries the past two seasons, redshirt freshman **Adam Loucks** (Irvine, Calif.) and newcomer **Kaes Van't Hof** (Newport Beach, Calif.), the son of former Trojan tennis great Robert Van't Hof.

"These three players have been working as hard as you could possibly expect to be ready for the start of the season," said Smith. "They are eager to compete, they continue to improve every day and we know that they have what it takes to make outstanding contributions to our lineup."

Van't Hof, who hails from Newport Beach, Calif., and prepped at Mater Dei High in Santa Ana, enjoyed great success at the prep levels. As the 2004 CIF Southern Section Singles Champion, he was named the 2004 *Los Angeles Times* Player of the Year, *Orange County Register* Player of the Year and CIF Player of the Year. He was ranked as high as No. 4 nationally (USTA) and No. 1 regionally (SCTA) in Boys 18 singles and captured tournament victories such as the 2002 B18 USTA Super National Winter Doubles Championship, 2002 B16 USTA National Open Doubles Championship and 2001 Pasadena Rose Bowl Singles Championship.

Despite playing only five singles matches last season, Loucks earned a No. 59 preseason doubles ranking this year with Hoskins thanks to notable victories this Fall.

The Trojans are deep and talented and expect constant competition at all six singles and doubles positions. Redshirt junior **Jeff Kazarian** (Rolling Hills Estates, Calif.), who has battled injuries the past two seasons, redshirt sophomore **Aaron Badart** (San Marino, Calif.), redshirt freshman **Bruce Aiken** (West Hills, Calif.), as well as junior **Whit Livingston** (Sacramento, Calif.) and freshman **Jarryd Cooper** (La Canada, Calif.), will compete to fill the vacated roles.

USC also expects to welcome freshman **Dejan Cvetkovic** midseason. Cvetkovic hails from Montreal, Canada, where he captured six Canadian National Indoor and Outdoor Championships as a prep. In 2002, he was ranked as high as No. 203 internationally in singles and 230 in doubles. He earned a personal-best No. 605 ATP singles ranking and No. 737 doubles ranking in 2004.

"Our season will depend on the development of our newcomers and the consistent performance of our returners," said Smith. "We have what it takes as long as the players remain healthy and continue to believe in themselves."

The Trojans enter the season ranked eighth nationally according to the ITA's preseason poll and are one of three Pac-10 teams among the top 10, including No. 2 UCLA and No. 7 Stanford. As part of the nation's strongest tennis conference, USC will also have to get past No. 21 Washington, No. 26 Arizona, No. 28 California, No. 31 Arizona State and No. 49 Oregon as it looks to defend its Pac-10 title.

Seven other opponents on USC's schedule are also ranked among the top 50, headlined by top-ranked and defending national champion Baylor which hosts the Trojans in Waco, Texas, on Feb. 3. The other teams include No. 5 Illinois, No. 15 Texas A&M, No. 27 Pepperdine, No. 29 Clemson, No. 36 Texas and No. 71 San Diego State.

USC opens the dual match season with a pair of home matches on Jan. 22 when it hosts San Diego State and Cal Poly in a Saturday doubleheader. All home matches will be played at USC's David X. Marks Tennis Stadium.

The season concludes with the Pac-10 Individual Championship, April 21-24, in Ojai, Calif., followed by the first and second rounds of the NCAA Championships, May 14-15, at sites to be determined. The final four rounds of the NCAA Team Championships will be played May 21-24 at a familiar site. Texas A&M – the site of USC's 2002 national title run – will host the 2005 championships in College Station, Texas.

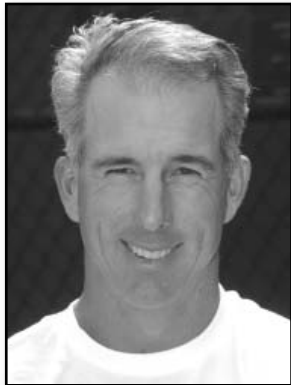

Third Season at USC

Peter Smith, the 2004 Pac-10 Coach of the Year whose teams have now made 11-straight NCAA appearances, enters his third season as head coach of the Trojan tennis program.

Smith was named head coach of the USC men's tennis team in June of 2002, after having guided Pepperdine to conference titles and NCAA Tournament appearances in each of his five years there.

"This is a dream come true for me to have received such an incredible opportunity," said Smith, whose 17-year head coaching mark includes stints at Pepperdine, Fresno State and Long Beach State and stands at 307-151 (.670). "USC has such a prestigious athletic and academic history and I am so proud to have become a part of it."

Smith enjoyed one of the greatest seasons of his career in 2004, leading USC to the NCAA Semifinals and a No. 4 final ITA ranking. It marked the first time one of his teams had ever advanced past the quarterfinals and the highest end-of-year ranking he had ever garnered.

Last season's Trojans completed the year with a 23-4 overall record and a 6-1 Pac-10 mark to claim a share of the conference title - USC's 14th title overall (first since 1994) and the seventh of his career.

What made the Trojans' performance in 2004 even more impressive was their improvement from the previous season. In 2003, Smith's first season at Troy, USC competed with a depleted roster and the Trojans compiled a 14-12 overall record while finishing 2-5 in the Pac-10 for sixth place and advancing to the second round of the NAAs.

The Trojans' outstanding comeback last season earned Smith 2004 Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors - the seventh of his career.

In 2002, Smith left Pepperdine following a 25-6 season in Malibu, in which he led the Waves to the NCAA quarterfinals and a final No. 5 national ranking. He

earned his fifth straight West Coast Conference Coach of the Year honor and was tabbed the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Region VIII Coach of the Year for the second time in the last three years (he also won it in 2000).

In five years at Pepperdine (1998-2002), Smith compiled a 118-31 (.792) dual match record and finished in the Top 20 every year. The Waves won the WCC title and advanced to at least the second round of the NCAA Championships each season. He coached eight All-Americans during his tenure in Malibu (Robert Lindstedt, Kelly Gullett, John Hui, Anthony Ross, Robert Kendrick, Stefan Sutter, Sebastien Graeff and Al Garland).

Smith spent the previous six seasons (1992-97) as men's tennis head coach at Fresno State, transforming the Bulldogs into a Top 20 program. His dual match record at Fresno State was 102-57 (.642). He led the Bulldogs to their first-ever NCAA tourney in 1994 and coached the program's first-ever All-American (Fredrik Bergh) in 1995. In all, he guided the Bulldogs into the NAAs in his last four seasons and coached four All-Americans (Gullett, who followed him to Pepperdine, Fredrik Berg, Fredrik Giers and Robert Lindstedt).

Smith enjoyed his greatest success at Fresno State in 1996 when the team won its first Western Athletic

Conference title, posted a 23-5 dual-match record (the best in school history) and earned its third-straight NCAA berth with a No. 6 national ranking. That season, he was named ITA Region VII and Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year.

Smith remains the only men's coach to take two different schools to the quarterfinal round of the NCAA Championships in the 1990s -- doing so at Fresno State in 1996 and Pepperdine in 1998. Additionally, Smith and Duke's Jay Lapidus were the only two men's coaches whose teams did not lose a match in NCAA regional play in the last decade.

Smith, 39, earned a bachelor's degree in liberal studies from Long Beach State in 1987 and was a four-year letterwinner for the 49ers. After playing professional tennis for 15 months and competing in such prestigious events as the U.S. Open and Wimbledon, Smith returned to Long Beach State and became the youngest Division I men's tennis head coach at age 23. He served as the 49ers' head coach for four years (1988-91), compiling an overall record of 50-47 (.515). In 1989, Long Beach State posted a 15-11 dual match record and completed the season ranked No. 25 nationally.

Smith was born on Aug. 15, 1964. He and his wife, Tammie, have three sons, Tanner (9), Riley (7) and Colter (4).

Second Season at USC

**K**yle Spencer enters his second season as assistant coach to the USC men's tennis program. A former Olympian and USC All-American, he brings with him international playing and coaching experience.

Spencer helped lead the Trojans to their first Pac-10 title since the 1994 season and an NCAA Semifinal appearance in just his first season as an assistant coach. With his help, the 2004 squad finished the year ranked No. 4 in the ITA.

In a short time span, Spencer, 29, has accumulated many credits to his name. At the 2000 Olympic Summer Games in Sydney, Australia, he competed for his native country of Great Britain. That same season, Spencer reached the doubles final at the ATP Championship in Newport, R.I. In his playing career, he competed at Wimbledon three times, two U.S. Opens, represented Great Britain at the 1997 World University Games, represented Scotland at the 2002 Four Nation's Cup and reached a personal-best ATP ranking of No. 110 in doubles.

After retiring from his professional career in 2002, Spencer spent the last year coaching the ATP's top 100-ranked Cecil Mamiit - a former USC NCAA Singles Champion and teammate of Spencer's at Troy.

Spencer was a four-year letterwinner at USC (1995-1998), who helped the Trojans to a seventh-place national finish in 1996 and an eighth-place finish in 1998. He earned doubles ITA All-America honors in 1997 with partner George Bastl after finishing No. 1 in the Rolex/ITA doubles rankings and advancing to the finals of the NCAA Individual Doubles Championship.

Though he enjoyed great success in doubles, Spencer also captured the singles title at the 1997 Rolex/ITA Southern California Regional. He was named to the All-Pac-10 honorable mention team in 1997 and 1998, and the Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention team in 1995.

Spencer graduated from USC in 1998 with a bachelor's degree in international relations and a minor in political science.

**B**rett Masi enters his first season as a volunteer assistant coach to the USC men's tennis program.

In addition to coaching, Masi is an adjunct faculty member for the USC College of Arts and Sciences Physical Education Department and teaches two courses. He also works as an instructor for Long Beach (Calif.) Tennis.

Born Nov. 2, 1978, in Riverside, Calif., Masi prepped at Riverside Poly High. He recently married Desiree Wood on Jan. 16, 2005. The couple resides in Orange.

DAVID X. MARKS TENNIS STADIUM



The David X. Marks Tennis Stadium on the USC campus is one of the finest collegiate tennis facilities in the country.

A new and much-anticipated addition was made last May with the installation of a \$300,000 LED Daktronic interactive scoreboard. Fans can now follow each match point-for-point from their stadium seat and online at [www.usctrojans.com](http://www.usctrojans.com).

The stadium also underwent renovations during the summer of 2002. Seven hundred chair-back seats were added to replace the bleachers on the baselines and all five courts were repainted and lined.

The 1,000-seat stadium features five oversized hard courts. Two of the courts are named after famous USC alumni and Wimbledon singles champions, Alex Olmedo and Stan Smith. The center court is named for USC's 13 Grand Slam doubles champions—Byron Black, Bob Falkenburg, Luke Jensen, Murphy Jensen, Rick Leach, Bob Lutz, Gene Mako, Olmedo, Rafael Osuna, Dennis Ralston, Raul Ramirez, Ted Schroeder and Smith.

Underneath the stadium is the beautiful Leonard Andrews Varsity Lounge and Team Room, along with two locker rooms. The locker rooms were recently renovated through a generous gift made by John and Michelle Katnik of Diversified Development. Each lockerroom features the program's recent conference championship trophies, Hall of Fame walls with past NCAA singles and doubles champions, as well as the men's and women's national championship trophies.

At the entrance to the stadium is a list of all 16 of the USC men's national champion years and seven women's tennis national championships, including a newly-added 2002 for last year's men's tennis title squad.

The stadium was dedicated in 1973 when former Trojan stars Alex Olmedo, Stan Smith, Dennis Ralston and Bob Lutz held a tennis exhibition.

The 1974 men's NCAA Tournament was held at Marks Stadium (USC finished second).

USC LEADS WITH 14 PLAYERS AND COACHES IN THE ITA MEN'S TENNIS HALL OF FAME

In 2003, the Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) inducted six new members into its ITA Men's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame at the NCAA Division I Men's Tennis Championships in Athens, Ga.

The Class of 2003 was headlined by USC's **Bill Bond**, **Dick Leach** and **Robert Van't Hof**, as well as George M. Church of Princeton, Bob McKinley of Trinity (Texas) and longtime NCAA Referee Jim Russell. Church was inducted posthumously.

Players are eligible for election to the ITA Hall of Fame 15 years after their last collegiate match and coaches are eligible following retirement. The main criteria for election are college accomplishments as well as honors earned after college. College tennis legend Dan Magill serves as curator for the ITA Hall of Fame, which is housed at the University of Georgia.

USC's three inductees in 2003 gave it 14 members in the ITA Men's Hall of Fame. Three is most to be inducted from one school in the same year since Yale sent a trio into the Hall Fame in 1993.

The ITA Men's Tennis Hall of Fame, which includes over 1,800 rare photos, was inaugurated in 1983 and has inducted more than 160 players, coaches and contributors. Members include the late Arthur Ashe (UCLA), Jimmy Connors (UCLA), John McEnroe (Stanford) and Stan Smith (USC). The ITA Women's Collegiate Tennis Hall of Fame is located at the College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, Va.

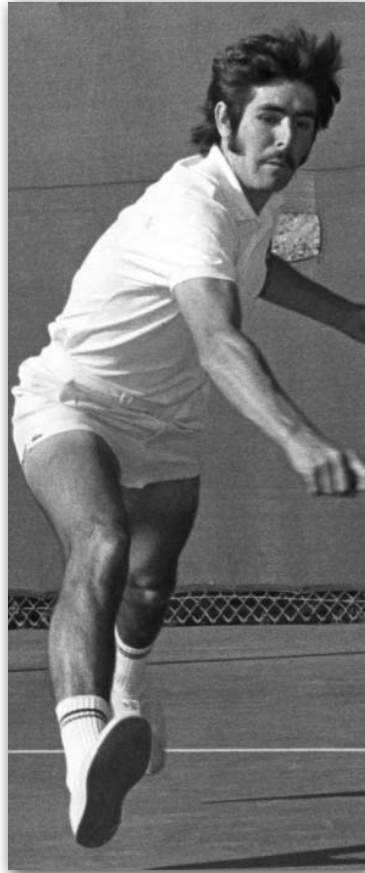

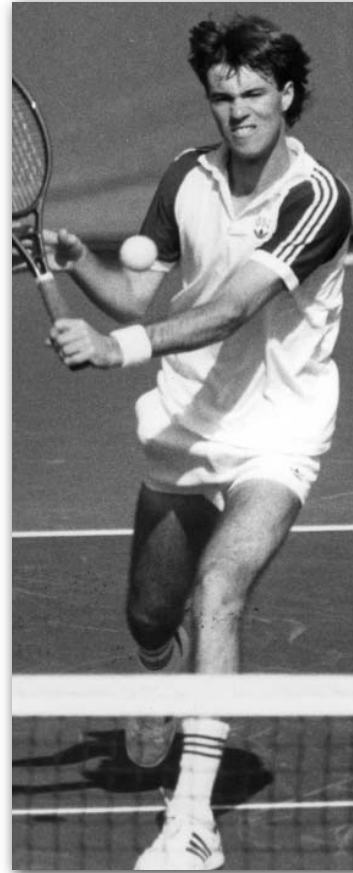
