2006 USC Season Outlook

TROJANS LOOK TO BUILD OFF SUCCESSFUL 2005 CAMPAIGN

If you were to talk about two unbelievable USC athletes on the same team dominating their sport, both in conference and nationally, setting school records, winning awards, handling themselves with class and dignity and owning an unmistakable desire to compete, most would have thought of Matt Leinart and Reggie Bush of the football team. Well, there was a pair of track and field athletes that fit into that same mold – hurdler Virginia Powell and high jumper Jesse Williams. Both of these athletes, like Leinart, could have left early to turn pro, but the good news for USC fans is that they have returned for the final season of competition. Powell and Williams won every major meet they competed in, including Powell winning NCAA championships in the 60m indoor hurdles and 100m outdoor hurdles, while Williams won both the NCAA indoor and outdoor high jump championships.

As impressive as their seasons were last year, they are just a part of a solid track and field team that saw the men finish sixth and the women seventh at the 2005 NCAA Finals. The Trojans were one of two schools in the country (along with Stanford) to have both the men's and women's track and field teams to finish in the top seven in the nation.



Coach Ron Allice on the Men's Team:

Sprint-wise the Trojans return two very good sprinters in Philip Francis and Garry Jones. Both were members of USC's 4x100m relay team last year that ran 38.9. Joining in the sprint department is sophomore Lionel Larry, a good 200-400m runner who should improve with a year of experience under his belt. The Trojans are looking for a fourth person in the 4x100m relay team as they approach the 2006 season. Both Francis and Larry are sub-21-second guys in the 200m.

Also adding to the sprints is Christopher Peart who has been working hard and getting some relay development. Newcomer Matthew Palmer can also contribute here in the 100m, 200m and 400m as well as the hurdles.

Coach John Henry Johnson on the sprinters:

"We should be strong. I look for Phillip Francis and Garry Jones to take a step forward now that they are seniors. Roy Alugbue and Chris Peart are new guys that we look to make an impact. We are strong in the 100m and the relays. We have two of the four members of the 4x100m team that ran a 38-second relay. We are looking for Roy or Chris to fill into those spots."

At 400m, Larry proved to be one of the best quarter-milers as a freshman at 45.7, then got hurt. If he remains healthy, he could definitely be a point-getter at the NCAAs.

Also in the 400m, Jeff Garrison returns and has run a high 46s and we hope he will continue to improve on that mark. If a couple of others step up, we should be alright in the 4x400m relay.

In the 800m, we have all-NCAA Regional qualifiers Duane Solomon and Raphael Asafo-Agyei. Both have run under 1:48.

In the 1500m, we return two-time all-Pac-10 performer Tomasz Babiszkievicz. He ran a 3:43 which is a good time. We hope his senior year is a stellar one. He can reach the NCAAs and did last year.

We fall off at the distances, in the 5000m and 10000m. It is a distinct weakness in the program.

Coach Tom Walsh on Babiszkievicz:

"Tomasz had a very good fall. Physically he is getting stronger and is motivated to have a successful senior season. He has a good chance to challenge for the Pac-10 title and All-American honors are within his reach."

The hurdles on the men's side should also be a strength. We return two Pac-10 and NCAA qualifiers in Blake Frazier and Kai Kelley. Kelley just came in at mid-year and did a great job as one of the best freshman in the country. Frazier was one of the most improved hurdlers in the country, certainly the Pac-10. We also have brought in Matthew Palmer, who if he can remain healthy could definitely help out in this area.

The horizontal jumps have been one of our strengths regionally and nationally since I've been here. We lost

the great Allen Simms from last season and the previous season lost Julien Kapek. We are going to look to our high jumpers to help fill that void. Jesse Williams will work in the long jump and Manjula Wijesekara will compete in the triple jump.

Then you go to their specialty. Williams is the NCAA high jump champ, school record-holder and member of the US National Team in the event. Wijesekara had the best freshman mark in school history.

Coach Mike Pullins on the jumpers:

"We have won the Pac-10 triple jump five consecutive times and we are going to work with Manjula on it. Since I started in 1998, we have not finished less than second at the Pac-10s. Jesse is going to long jump. He was a NCAA qualifier in the event last season, but we elected not to have him compete in the event. We have really good men on the jumps. We are excited about our chances and have our eyes focused on the record books. Phillip Allen, Clark McGuire and Inman Breaux, who qualified for the NCAA West Regional before getting hurt, all will try to fill the shoes of Allen Simms. Our new jumper is Nathan Gwozdz who was the California state high jump runner-up at 6-10 ¾ and won the Mt. Sac Meet for high schoolers last season. With this group and Jesse Williams in the long jump and Manjula Wijesekara in the triple jump, we have a chance to sneak up on some people".

The throws are also solid. Noah Bryant had a tremendous Fall and is on target to return after the injury he suffered last season when the hammer ricocheted off the fence and hit him in the face. He was an All-American and Will Denbo is still improving and we look for him to better his career best which is 10th best in school history.

In the hammer, Adam Midles returns after finishing sixth in the NCAAs last year. With the shot and hammer we are pretty good and Bryant is strong in the hammer too. In the discus we recruited Aaron Dan (who finished second in the state among high schoolers in the discus and third in the shot put), but he will be redshirted this season and build up for the 2007 season.



We probably had our best Fall in the pole vault. Coach (Brooks) Morris did a great job with the group of Graham Bockmiller and the rest. Also, throw in Derek Scott, who before injury was one of the top high school pole vaulters in the country.

Coach Allice on the Women's Team -

Two of our strongest suits are the hurdles and the horizontal jumps. We probably are one of the best one through three in both of those events. Naturally, we are led by Virginia Powell, who tied the fastest-ever time in the hurdles by a collegiate runner (Gail Devers). She is followed by a girl who had a fantastic season last year as our most improved runner, Candice Davis. Add in talented youngster Talia Stewart and we should be quite strong in the hurdles. Michelle Sanford and Katarzyna Klisowska were injured last year. Klisowska came back late in the year and has the potential for great things. Sanford was out all last season, but was one of the top jumpers in the country coming into USC and had a great freshman season. Add to these two Brittany Daniels, the National High School record-holder and Gatorade National Women's Track and Field Athlete of the Year and we could see some great things.

Coach Mike Pullins on the women's jumpers:

"The women have a three-headed monster with Michelle Sanford, Katarzyna Klisowska and Brittany Daniels. The Pac-10 is going to be really strong this year, but I like our chances with those three. All will compete in the long jump and triple jump. Sanford was a Pac-10 champion as a freshman, but had injuries that kept her out of action last season. She ranks third in school history in the triple jump and fourth in the long jump. Really, Michelle could be unstoppable. Klisowska is the Polish junior record-holder in women's long jump. Last year she had knee surgery in November, but was still able to jump 19-5. There are huge expectations around Daniels. Everybody has their eye on her. She was fourth at the U.S. Championships at the age of 16. The coach in me has to make sure those expectations fit into our system. Those three have a great deal of pressure on them to produce".

In the sprints, along with Powell who ran an 11.28 in the 100m last season for the sixth-fastest mark in school history, sophomore Jessica Onyepunuka demonstrated as a freshman the potential to be a good scorer for us. Carol Rodriguez has improved and could swing anywhere from the 100m to 400m. She has great range in which to excel in and had an excellent showing in our annual Challenge Relays. Onyepunuka will most likely be a 100-200m person for us.

Coach Tina Fernandes on the women's sprint corps:

" We are returning a great sprint corps that has the potential to place in the top three at the NCAAs. Virginia Powell has set the standard, which has generated a positive energy for our whole team to strive for greatness. Last season we had two freshmen (Carol Rodriguez and Jessica Onyepunuka) who did a great job of adjusting to the life of a student-athlete at USC, while performing at a high level despite nagging injuries. Rodriguez ran a 23.76 in the 200m on a stress fracture. She has opened up the indoor season very strong, coming off a strong Fall. She is a champion and loves to prove her ability on the track. Onyepunuka has the potential to become one of the great ones at USC. In the Fall, she ran the second fastest 400m, too. She has committed herself to excellence and I believe that she will exceed her goals.



Our next best event may be the throws. In the shot and hammer we will be solid with All-American Florida transfer Karen Freberg. She brings us up in the shot. We also bring back All-American Julia Rozenfeld and bring in Eva Orban, who would rank number two collegiately coming in with her distance. Kate Hutchinson was solid for us in the discus, so we are set with the throws. Also, Andrea McBride played volleyball this year and appears to be fit and hopefully that translates into an improvement for us in the javelin.



Treani Swain will run the 400m and 800m for us. She was All-Pac-10 in the 800m last year and was vastly improved. She will also be an important part of our 4x400m relay team.

Brysun Stately enters USC as the California state high school champion in the pole vault. She was injured in the Fall, but if she comes back strong should give us the stability in the pole vault.

The men's team should be a good dual meet team and may

Coach Walsh on the women's distance runners:

"Treani Swain is going to be the cornerstone of our distance runners. She will run the 800m and the 4x400m relay. She made a tremendous jump last year winning the UCLA Dual Meet and we look for her to continue improving and to make an impact in the Pac-10 and the NCAA. Kristen Berglas will run the 1500m for us. She has really improved since she got here. We look for her to have a solid season. With departure of Iryna Vashchuk, it give Kristen a chance to step up and shine. Tori Carter will run the 3000m steeplechase for us. She has been a pleasant surprise for us the past two months. I have high hopes that she can make a major improvement for the 2006 season.

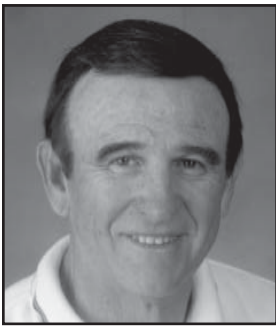
Kate Neeper will also be a cornerstone of our distance runners. She is completely healthy now and I expect her to get back to her old form when she finished fifth at the Pac-10s in the 10000m in 2004. Christina Eads is also moving up to the 10000m this year. This will be her first year running that distance.

develop as a strong NCAA team. The women are a little shallow on the dual meet side, but we should continue to develop and improve by the NCAAs.

Both teams have the potential to be good. We return a lot back from the men's team which finished sixth and the women's team which finished seventh in the NCAAs last year. I feel good about both teams coming into the season.

People forget that we did not have a track to practice on until April, so we didn't come around until later last season. It is too early to tell how we will stack up in the Pac-10s.. We lost only three main scorers from the men's team last year, but they were important. If we can remain health, we have a chance to compete with anyone.





RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field • 12th Season

Esteemed Director of Track and Field Ron Allice enters his 12th season at the helm of the USC program. With the outstanding coaching staff he has assembled,

the Trojans have returned to prominence on a national level once again. In 2005, the Trojans were one of two schools to place both the men's and women's teams in the top seven in the country.

Under his guidance, the Trojan men's team has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA finals in eight of his 11 seasons, including a sixth-place finish last season. The Women of Troy won their first-ever national championship in 2001 under Allice, who has guided the women's track and field team to a top 10 finish seven times in 11 seasons, including a seventh-place finish in 2005.

The men's track and field team went on a run of six consecutive top 10 finishes under Allice (1995-2000), a feat not accomplished since the early 70s under Vern Wolfe. The men have also won three Pac-10 titles in the last eight years and last season won the NCAA West Regional. The hallmark of an Allice team is balance--after all, the sport he coaches is called track and field--and his tenure has been marked by squads that have been able to compete for championships at the national, conference and dual meet level. In 2003, his men's team won the Pac-10 championship (though it was later forced to relinquish the title due to an ineligible athlete) and placed third at the NCAA meet. The year before, his young men's team finished third in the Pac-10 and tied for 11th at the NAAs. The previous season--2001--the Trojans were 12th at the NCAA meet and second in the conference, while snapping crosstown rival UCLA's dual-meet win streak at 22. The seven seasons prior to 2001, Troy finished no lower than seventh at the NAAs (including three top-5 finishes) and won three Pac-10 titles. During his tenure, Trojan men have won eight NCAA individual titles, garnered All-American acclaim 76 times and set seven school records--not an easy task considering the glorious track and field history at USC.

Allice also runs one of the top women's program in the country, last year finishing in seventh place. Before 2004's 12th-place and 2003's 13th-place finish at the NCAA meet, the Women of Troy were the only team in the country to finish in the NCAA top three each of the previous four years while winning at least one NCAA team title. In 2002, his squad finished third at the NAAs. It was led by the most celebrated sprinter in collegiate history, Angela Williams, who won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title and later was awarded the Honda/Broderick Cup given to the nation's top female collegiate athlete. In 2001, the Women of Troy put

on a near-perfect meet to win their first NCAA team title. In 2000, USC took second--at the time, their best-ever showing at the NAAs. In 1999, USC was the only program that finished in the top five in both men's and women's track and field, as the women were third and the men fifth. In 1998, the women's team finished in fifth place. In 1997 they placed 14th, but that came on the heels of their first-ever Pac-10 title and a seventh-place NCAA finish in 1996. Allice's women's teams feature powerhouse athletes who go on to shine on the national and world stages, including such stars as Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc and Torri Edwards.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 29 NCAA championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 87 Olympic team members, 40 Olympic gold medals and 16 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame - all encapsulated in 104 years of a rich and storied tradition.

And now, with the second century of Trojan track and field already well underway, Ron Allice and his staff continue to

work hard to maintain the luster of USC's most successful athletic program.

Alice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 211-43-1 in 35 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Alice's programs have produced more than 256 All-Americans, plus 16 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Alice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Alice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous stops followed him — the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Alice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Alice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then went to Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Alice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

He and his wife, Sharlene, have three children: Lance (38, who is a lawyer), Melinda (36, a USC graduate in the field of geriatric and special patient care who made Coach Alice a grandfather with the birth of her son, Jay Ron) and Sean (30, a USC graduate of the school of Cinema who is teaching English at Cabrillo High in Long Beach).

Women's Sprints

Tina Fernandes is in her seventh year as the women's sprint coach at USC.

Under her guidance, USC's sprint crew has been one of the best in the nation the past few years. That fact has not gone unnoticed as Fernandes was named the 2005 West Region assistant coach of the year by the USTA.

tant coach of the year by the USTA.

Last season, junior Virginia Powell defended her Pac-10 100m title, becoming the sixth Trojan to win the event in the last seven years. The year before, Miya Edmonson won the NCAA West Region 200m title and qualified for both the 100m and 200m at the NCAA Championships, while Natasha Mayers finished ninth in the NCAA 100m final. It was the sixth year in a row that a Women of Troy sprinter had made the NCAA 100m final. The year 2002 was a banner season as senior Angela Williams won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title. Williams also went on to win the prestigious Honda/Broderick Cup honoring the nation's top female collegiate athlete, joining basketball's Cheryl Miller as the only USC athlete to win the award. But it wasn't just Williams who achieved excellence in 2002. Mayers became the first USC woman ever to win the NCAA 200m title and then placing second to her teammate in the 100m. Kinshasa Davis finished eighth in the 200m, while the 400m relay squad finished third at the NCAAs. At the 2002 Pac-10s, five USC sprinters made the final of the 100m—a dominating tour de force for the Women of Troy sprint corps. In 2001, Angela Williams won her unprecedented

third consecutive NCAA 100m title, while Kinshasa Davis took third in the 200m at the NCAAs and the women's 400m relay placed second. At the 2000 NCAAs, the 400m relay squad finished undefeated on the season by winning the NCAA title in a school-record 43.14, while Davis, who had run a nation-leading 22.69 earlier in the year, took second in the 200m. Williams won her second-straight NCAA 100m title. As well as Powell's exploits in the NCAAs in 2005, Alexis Weatherspoon placed third in the 200m and 4th in the 200m. The 4x100m relay team won the West Regional and were Pac-10 champs.

A fine sprinter herself in college, Fernandes competed at Long Beach City College and later at Fresno State. She is currently Co-Coordinator of the Physical Education Elementary Program at Lynwood Unified school district. She has a Masters Degree in Education and a teaching credential in Physical Education.

Her husband, Sean, coaches defensive backs at Lynwood High School. They have two children: one boy, Twin, age 14, who plays football for the La Mirada, winning the Iron Man Award, and one girl, T'lcis, age 11, who runs for the Long Beach Sprinters.

JOHN HENRY JOHNSON, Jr.

Sprints/Recruiting Coordinator

John Henry Johnson enters his 12th year as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach, but it is his prowess on the recruiting trail that has been the most instrumental in putting Troy back on the map.

Each of USC's past 10 men's and women's recruiting classes have ranked among the best in the nation. Johnson has brought into the Trojan fold such superstars as Jerome Davis, Felix Sanchez, Denis Kholev, Charles Lee, Ryan Wilson and Julien Kapek on the men's side, and Angela Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc, Grezyna Penc and Inga Stasiulionyte on the women's side. His extensive knowledge of the world amateur track scene—bought by a degree in international relations—has proved invaluable to USC and has established Johnson as perhaps the preeminent recruiter of foreign track and field athletes in the last quarter century.

Johnson has coached USC's last four sprint All-Americans. In the 100m, Sultan McCullough captured such honors in 2000 and Jason Shelton did so in 1996. In the 200m, Charles Lee was an All-American in 1998 and 1999. Current sprinter Wes Felix has won back-to-back Pac-10 200m

titles—the first Trojan to do so since the late 1970s. Felix also placed second in the 100m race at the 2005 NCAAs.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Allice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson—who is the son of NFL Hall-of-Famer John Henry Johnson—became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers.

In 1993, Johnson studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. His hobbies include writing, playing and recording music.

DAN LANGE

Throws

After 16 years of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers, having coached his athletes to All-American honors 35 times.

The 40-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships (and a collegiate record) and aided USC throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. In 1997, despite the departure of Kiss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA hammer title. Johansson was runner up in the hammer in 1998, as was Norbert Horvath in 1999 (Horvath also finished fifth in 2000 and third in 2001). At the 2000 Pac-10 Championships, USC continued its men's hammer domination, sweeping the top four spots to key the Trojans' title run. In 2001, Horvath captured his third straight Pac-10 hammer title and third straight All-American honor. In 2002, Lange guided walk ons Michael Murray and Harrison Lee into the Pac-10 finals. In 2004, Murray earned USC's 12th All-American honor in the hammer, while Noah Bryan became Troy's first shot put All-American since 1984. In 2005, Adam Midles placed sixth in the hammer at the NAAs.

On the women's side, he has coached 2001 NCAA javelin champ and Pac-10 record-holder Inga Stasilionyte (who last year threw a 62.27 to win the Lithuanian Championship and qualify for the World Championships), 2003 NCAA runner-up and former Pac-10 hammer record-holder Julianna Tudja, 2002 hammer All-American and 2004 shot put All-American (and school record holder) L'Orangerie Crawford, 2001 shot put All-American and school discus record holder Cynthia Ademiluyi, two-time hammer All-American Jennifer Vail, 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA



BROOKS MORRIS

Volunteer Pole Vault Coach

Brooks Morris is in his second year as a volunteer pole vault coach for Ron Alice's program.

Last year the Trojans had three females qualify for the NCAA West Regionals (Melissa Astete, Brittani Bernhard and Shannon Lewallen), after having only one female pole vaulter in school history qualify prior to last season. Astete finished eighth at the Pac-10s to earn USC's first-ever point in that event.

Morris has previous experience as pole vault coach at Fresno City College, Harvard Westlake High and even had a stint coaching the Trojans in the mid-1990s. He also served as director of the USATF Junior Elite Pole Vault Camp at the Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista, Calif. in 1997.

Morris vaulted for the Trojans and had a best of 16-5 while at USC. He had an injury-riddled career at Troy, yet still managed to qualify for the Pac-10s in 1989 and had the third-best mark in the Pac-10 during the indoor season.

After leaving USC, he jumped a career best of 17-5 1/4. He also won the U.S. Pole Vault Summit men's open in 1996 and set a national soils pole vault record in the Phillipines of 17-1 1/4.

runner-up Nicole Haynes and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer). This year he will get to work with All-American transfer Karen Freberg.

Outside of USC, Lange coached hammer thrower Lisa Misipeka to the American Samoa record in that event and to the Olympics. He also worked with Tudja after she left USC and guided her to the Olympics to years ago. He was at one time the coach for NO. 1-ranked discus thrower Adam Setliff, three-time U.S. discus champion and two-time U.S. Olympian.

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant and as a human performance consultant for business professionals.

He and his wife Darcy (Arreola), who was one of America's finest middle distance runners and a former NCAA champion, reside in Valencia, Calif., with their two sons, Dylan, age five, and newborn Dalton.

MICHAEL PULLINS

Jumps

Mike Pullins is in his eighth year as jumps coach at USC. Coach "Mike," as the athletes like to call him, is responsible for coaching both the women and men's jumpers.

Under his tutelage, the USC jumpers have been mainstays on the honors podium at the NCAA Championships. Last year, he coached Jesse Williams to the NCAA indoor and outdoor high jump titles and Allen Simms to a second-place finish at the NCAAs in the triple jump. Simms won the Pac-10 triple jump, the fifth consecutive season a USC triple jumper has claimed that honor.

At the 2003 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Pullins guided Julien Kapek to the triple jump title--USC's first outdoors since 1961--while Simms placed third. Simms, who also finished seventh in the long jump outdoors, won the triple jump at the NCAA Indoor Championships earlier in the year with a Pac-10-record jump of 56-7 1/2. To cap off a remarkable season for USC jumps, Dawid Jaworski won the NCAA high jump title--Troy's first since 1963--with a school-record jump of 7-5 3/4. All totaled, Pullins' athletes scored an amazing 43 points at the indoor and outdoor NCAA meets.

In 2002, Julien Kapek set a school triple jump record with a jump of 55-8 1/2 and then went on to place third at the NCAAs. The year prior, Djeke Mambo became the first Trojan to win both the long jump and triple jump at the Pac-10s since Luther Hayes in 1961.

On the women's side, he guided freshman Michelle Sanford to the Pac-10 long jump championship in 2004, while Tatyana Obukhova took her third-straight Pac-10 triple jump championship and a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs in 2002. The year before, Obukhova was third at the NCAAs. In his first year, he coached Pam Simpson to a third-place finish at the 1999 NCAAs. He also helped Disia Page and Stephanie Jones land on the USC top 10 charts in the long jump. In fact, four of the 10 women on USC's long jump chart were coached by Pullins.

A 1987 graduate of USC, his name is still among the top ten triple jumpers on the all-time Trojan charts. As a high school senior Mike qualified for the CIF Championships in four individual events and went on to win the triple jump, in which he placed fifth in the 1982 state meet. Mike starred at Cal State Northridge and Pasadena City College before coming to Troy. A three-time USA Track & Field outdoor qualifier (he qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials), he was forced to set track aside due to injuries and four ankle surgeries in 1994.

Mike earned his master's degree in education a year ago.

LASZLO TABORI

Distances

Famed distance great Lazlo Tabari works with the USC men's distance runners. He also works with the Men of Troy distance running club team.

Tabari has a wealth of experience to share with the Trojans. After all, he was the third man to break the four-minute barrier in the mile. He did so on May 28th, 1955, joining Roger Bannister and John Landy in that elite group.

Laszlo's coaching methods are well founded. Trained himself by the great middle distance Hungarian coach Mihaly Igloi in Hungary and then later in the United States after the 1956 Olympic Games, Tabori is a great believer in the interval method of training.

He coached Valley Junior College in the 1970s where his team won three state titles and held the national junior record for the 10,000 distance medley and the 4 X 1 mile relay.

Jacqueline Hansen, winner of the Boston and Western Hemisphere Marathons and Miki Gorman, winner of the New York City and Boston Marathons, were two of his athletes who achieved international recognition during the 1970s.

TOM WALSH

Distances/Women's Cross Country

Tom Walsh enters his 12th year as middle and long distance coach at USC. He also serves as the head women's cross country coach.

During his tenure at USC, the Women of Troy middle and long distance program has consistently been one of the best in the country. In fact, in the

last decade, USC is the only middle distance program in the country to have two four-time outdoor All-Americans in both the 800m and 1500m at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

During the last 10 years, USC middle and long distance runners have captured All-American honors 20 times, including an NCAA 800m championship by eight-time All-American Brigita Langerholc in 2001. Langerholc also finished a surprising fourth in the 800m at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney in a school-record time of 1:58.51. Another Walsh product was Grazyna Penc, a four-time All-American in the 1500m. Penc finished third in 1996 and 1998, fourth in 1997 and was runner up in 1999. Emebet Shiferaw was a two-time All-American in the 3000m in 1996-97. Her best NCAA finish was second place. Anna Lopaciuch twice earned All-American honors in the 1500m, finishing fifth in 1998 and third in 2000. In 2002, Aleksandra Deren placed seventh in the 800m at the NAAs. In 2004, school record holder Julia Budniak be-

came the first Women of Troy athlete to earn All-American honors in the 3000m steeplechase as she finished sixth. Iryna Vashchuk finished sixth and seventh at the NCAA Championships in her specialty, the 1500m. Vashchuk also qualified for the NCAA Championships in cross country in 2003 and 2004. It was the fourth year in a row that a Women of Troy cross country runner qualified for the NCAA Championships. Brooke Thomas and Sarah Ellis qualified in 2002 and 2001, respectively. USC middle and long distance runners have also been a dominant force at the Pac-10 Championships over the last decade, capturing 14 first place finishes. In fact, a Women of Troy athlete has won the Pac-10 1500m title seven times in the last 10 years.

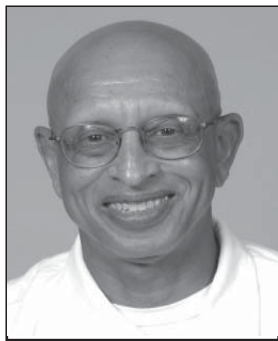

Hurdles

Dr. Tommie White is in his second season coaching the men's and women's hurdles for USC, and you could say he had a pretty good first year in his return to Troy. It's the second go-around at USC for White, who coached hurdles for the Trojans in 1980s.

Last season, White helped guide All-American hurdler Virginia Powell to the NCAA 60m indoor hurdle title and to the 100m outdoor hurdles title. He also was instrumental in the development of Blake Frazier and Kai Kelley last season, who finished second and sixth respectively at the NCAA West Regional.

He was an elite athlete in track and field for over 10 years, representing the U.S. on numerous national teams. For 12 years, he was the coordinator in "Promotions for Olympics" for Adidas, USA.

Dr. White is a licensed psychologist in practice and a full professor and former Department Chair of Kinesiology at California State University at Northridge. He has been involved in sports psychology consultation with athletes and teams from all levels of competition, including amateurs, high school, university, professional and the Olympics. He graduated from USC with PH.Ds in both psychology and kinesiology.

He won every meet he competed in, including the Pac-10s with a jump of 7-5 3/4 (breaking the Pac-10 record which had stood 18 years) and the NCAA West Regional with a jump of 7-4 1/2...Won the NCAA Indoor title with a jump of 7-5. He was also named the Pac-10 Male Field Athlete of the Year. **2004:** Williams earned indoor All-American honors for the second-straight year by placing seventh at the 2004 NCAA Indoor Championships with a jump of 7-1 1/2...He had a fine outdoor season as well, finishing second at both the Pac-10 meet and the NCAA West Regional meet...He won the high jump at the UCLA dual meet with a season-best 7-3...He tied for 15th at the NCAA meet with a jump of 7-0 1/4. **NORTH CAROLINA STATE:** As a freshman for the Wolfpack, Williams was second at the 2003 NCAA indoor meet and was seventh outdoors...Was also second at both the indoor and outdoor ACC Championships...Had a best jump of 7-4 1/4. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Williams prepped at Broughton High in Raleigh, N.C., where he won the high jump at the North Carolina 4-A state meet three years in a row...He is the state indoor and outdoor prep record holder in the high jump at 7-3...He won the Adidas Championship in 2002 and was fourth at the 2002 World Junior Championships, as well as the Penn Relay champion...He also long jumped, hurdled and wrestled in high school and was fifth at the North Carolina state wrestling championships as a senior. **PERSONAL:** Jesse was born on Dec. 27, 1983 in Modesto, Calif....He is an undeclared major at USC.

2006 USC TRACK AND FIELD HERITAGE INDUCTEE DREW TO BE RECOGNIZED IN EXHIBIT AT HERITAGE HALL

A season-long exhibition featuring Howard P. Drew (1890-1957), an athlete, scholar, journalist, humanitarian and true Trojan legend who attended USC from 1914-17, is being presented by the University of Southern California's Black Alumni Association. The exhibition is titled the 10th Annual Trojans of Ebony Hue Exhibition: Howard P. Drew: Record Breaker...Rule Maker and will open on February 27, 2006 in Heritage Hall.

On display will be more than 100 items of memorabilia, including original championship medals from Drew's highly-accomplished track and field career, certificates earned, and rare photos of Drew and his fellow track team members.

In addition to his accomplishments as an athlete, which include participating in the 1912 Olympic Games held in Stockholm Sweden, and being titled the Fastest Man in the World in 1914-16, he was also a gifted scholar, earning straight A's during his USC career. He was the first black man to write for the university's newspaper, then titled the Daily Southern California, as well as being the first black man inducted into the Skull and Daggers.

Drew enlisted and became a sergeant in the Supply Company, 809th Pioneer Infantry Regiment, and the Eighty-Eight Division of the U.S. Army during World War One. While there he ran and coached the Army track teams in Nice, France. After the war, Drew finished Law School at Drake University; he passed the Connecticut State Bar exam in 1920. He then became an assistant clerk and a judge in the city of Hartford, Conn. And was elected to Justice of the Peace several times during the 1940s. All of these positions were first for a black man in the state of Connecticut.

Angela Williams will also be inducted into USC's Track and Field Hall of Fame this season. Williams. She is the only college athlete - male or female - ever to win four consecutive NCAA 100-meet dash championships. She is the USC female record-holder in the 100m with a time of 11.04 set on June 5, 1999. She scored 48 points at the NCAAs, the second-most by any Trojan female athlete. She ran in the 2004 Athens Olympics in the 400m relay, but did not medal. She is a two-time World Indoor 60m silver medalist (2001, 2003), 2001 World Outdoor gold medalist in the 4x100m relay and the 2003 USA 60m champion among her many honors and awards.

Katherine B. Loker, whom USC's Track & Field Stadium is named will also be inducted into the USC Track and Field Hall of Fame. It was through a generous gift by Loker that the beautiful 3,000-seat track and field stadium was able to open in 2001. Loker Stadium was dedicated on May 5, 2001 during the USC-UCLA dual meet. In 2003, for the first time ever, the Pac-10 Championships were held on the USC campus. Loker, a USC alumna, along with her late husband, Donald, gave the \$2 million donation for the track stadium as part of a larger donation of \$17 million to the university to support hydrocarbon research at the Loker Hydrocarbon Research Institute.

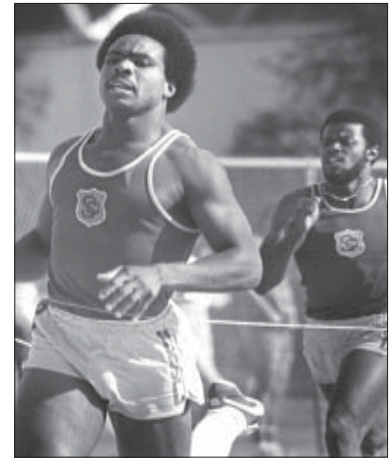

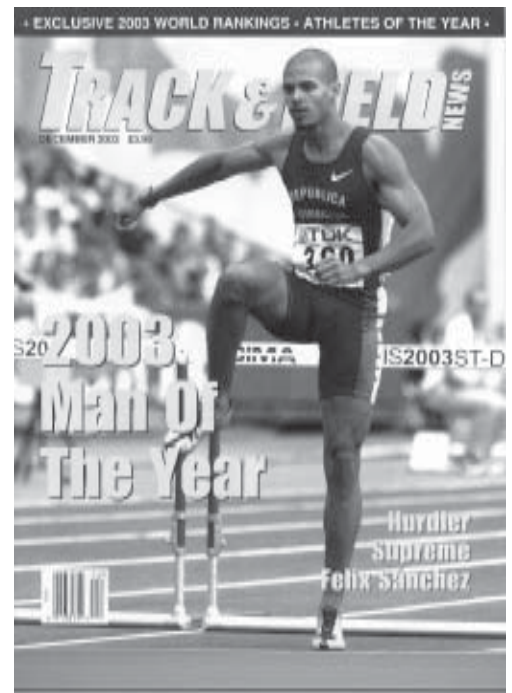

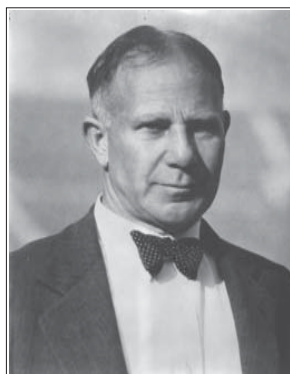
The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

USC is well known as one of the most successful athletic programs in the history of the NCAA, with 100 men's and women's national championships. The Trojans have won far more NCAA team and individual titles combined than any other university. However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (including nine straight, 1935-43).

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s and World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez in the 2000s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons.

However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as headcoach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thopson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thomson and Bourland brought home gold medals in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five

in the world. Cromwell's influence extended far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 22 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw. Consequently, he helped lay the foundation

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995-Present

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.

He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In 1996, his Women of Troy won their first-ever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's

team to its first Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NCAAs. At the 1998 NCAAs, he led the USC men's team to seventh-place and the Women of Troy to fifth. In 1999, the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NCAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history). In 2000, the men finished seventh--their seventh consecutive top 10 finish--while the women placed second--their highest finish ever. In 2001, Allice guided the Women of Troy to their first-ever NCAA team championship while the men tied for 12th. In 2002, the women were third and the men tied for 11th at the NCAAs, then in 2003, the men finished third (as three Trojans won NCAA titles) and the women tied for 13th. In 2005, USC's men's team won the NCAA West Regional and finished sixth at the NCAA finals. The women placed seventh at the NCAAs.

Allice has a career dual meet record of 211-44-1 at five schools, and he has coached more than 252 All-Americans, 20 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.

"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," Allice said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for 106 glorious years, is in good hands.



Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer. USC's two-mile relay of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remember and ran 7:14.4 to set a world record at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 13, 1966.
