2009 USC Season Outlook

YOUNG TROJAN SQUADS LOOK TO MAKE SOME NOISE

The Trojans believe their 2009 track and field teams are very talented, but they are young and will have to fill some very big shoes of the graduated class which included All-Americans and school record-holders like Kate Hutchinson, Kai Kelley, Lionel Larry, Jessica Onyepunuka, Carol Rodriguez and Duane Solomon.

Still, the Trojans return three All-Americans in hurdler Shalina Clarke, hammer thrower Eva Orban and javelin specialist Corey White. Add to that the return to health of some key performers and a women's recruiting class ranked No. 3 and a men's class ranked No. 5 and you can see where the optimism for the 2009 season stems.

White in his first season with the Trojans was nothing short of spectacular, re-writing the Trojan record books, earning a second-place finish at the NCAA Championships and a berth at the Olympic Trials. He won every meet in which he competed, until placing second in the NCAA finals, to earn NCAA West Regional and Pac-10 Field Athlete of the Year honors. He broke the USC school record by more than 12 feet with a throw of 256-10 at the Texas Relays and then broke his own record with an amazing throw of 267-10 in winning the javelin competition at Mt. SAC Relays.



Other Trojan males expected to be strong contributors this season in the throws include Aaron Dan in the discus (5th at the Pac-10), Trey Henderson (10th at the Pac-10s), Mike Curiel (13th at the Pac-10s) and Brian Wilhelm (11th at the Pac-10s) in the hammer, Stenn Parton (12th at the Pac-10s) in the javelin and Colin Campbell (11th in the discus at the Pac-10s) who made great strides in the learning to throw the discus last season.

The staple of a Ron Allice team has always been the sprints and

middle distances and this is where USC will need a return to health of some key athletes and a quick maturation process by the freshmen. Ahmad Rashad has looked good this winter and hopes to return to his freshman form which saw him earn All-America honors, win both the 100m and 200m at the conference meet and earn the Pac-10 Newcomer of the Year award. He was hobbled by a hamstring all last season, but in the few races he was able to run again demonstrated that he is one of the elite sprinters on the West Coast.

Another key the Trojans hope will be a return to health of sprinter Matthew Palmer. The senior had a limited role last season, but hopes to get back to being a crucial component on the relay teams and providing USC with a second experienced sprinter. The Trojans will also be looking to some of the newcomers like Devin Forte', Joey Hughes and Duane Walker as well as hurdlers Brendan Ames and Oscar Spurlock, as well as long jumper Desmond Hamilton, who posted USC's second-fastest 100m time in 2008.

Speaking of Hamilton, he had a season best of 24-9 3/4 and then fought through a leg injury to place 14th at the Regionals. Also a major part of the Trojans' jumping efforts is Aven Wright. He placed sixth in the triple jump at the Pac-10 Championships and posted a PR of 50-3 in winning the Dual Meet.

The pole vault is another area where the Trojans could be strong as Derek Scott tied for seventh at the Pac-10s and set a new PR with a pole vault of 17-2 3/4 at the Trojan Invitational and Brandon Estrada returns following a redshirt season. Both jumpers have cleared 17 feet and are taking aim at USC's all-time top 10 list.

The hurdles is an area where USC has been excelling over the last few seasons. Even with the graduation of Kai Kelley, who scored at the NCAAs in both hurdles events, hurdling should be in good hands. Spurlock had a very good freshman season and the coaches believe it is just the beginning for him. Spurlock placed sixth at the Pac-10s and 10th at the West Regional in the 110m HH. Also, the transfer Ames from Kentucky has the potential to be one of the top sprint hurdlers on the West Coast as he was a 2007 U.S. Junior National Team member and his time of 13.15 that season ranked best in the world among high schoolers.

Irek Sekretarski was granted another year of running by the NCAA and he hopes to make the most of it. He is the school record-holder in the mile and looks to establish new PR in the 1500m and 800m this season as he returns to full health. Freshman Blake Shaw is expected to make an immediate impact. He is an outstanding athlete who starred in track, cross country and football in high school and has a career best of 1:49.41 in the 800m and 4:11.18 in the 1600m.

Eva Orban again anchors the women's team and it would be hard to imagine a more consistent track and field athlete over the past three seasons. Last year she won USC's first national title in the women's hammer with a throw of 225-5 on June 13. With that victory, Orban has finished no lower than third place in any of the nine postseason competitions she has entered. She also bettered her school and Pac-10 record in the hammer with a throw of 230-3 on March 15 at the Northridge Invitational.

Kristine Busa also burst onto the scene for USC as a freshman last season in the women's javelin, placing fifth at the Pac-10 and West Regional Championships and advancing to the NCAA Championships. She also recorded the second-farthest throw ever by a Trojan female of 169-7 and aims to improve on that and looks to approach Inga Stasiulionyte's school record.



Also expected to contribute in the throws are Lauren Guerrieri who reached the finals in the discus at the Pac-10 Championships last year as a freshman and transfer Katalin Mate who threw the discus 178-7 last season at Auburn.

Shalina Clarke was "Miss Everything" for USC again last season, giving the Trojans a potential scorer in both hurdles races and contributing on both of the relay teams. She won the 400m IH at the Pac-10 Championships and took first in the 100m HH at the West Regional last season, culminating her season with a 8th place finish in the 100m hurdles at the NAAs to earn All-America honors.

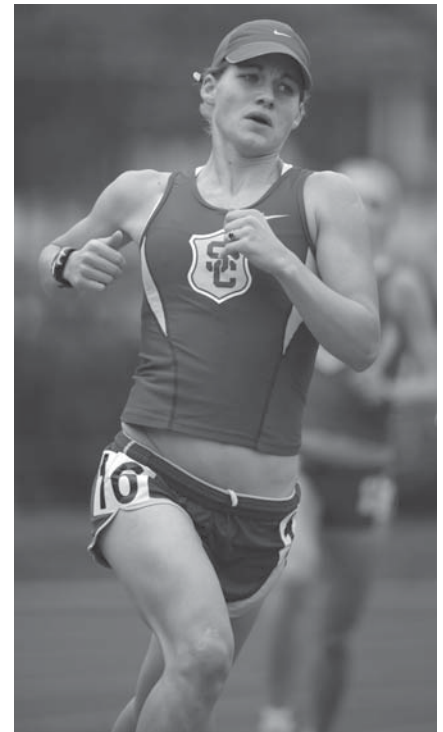


Joining Clarke in the hurdles and really everything else are heptathletes Nia Ali and Shana Woods. Ali posted a time of 13.14 in

the 100m HH last year, tying for the fourth-fastest time in USC history. Woods had a 13.76 100m HH time at the Dual Meet last season and appears poised to crack the Trojans all-time top 10 in the event. Both Ali and Woods will be taking aim and Wendy Brown's school record in the heptathlon. Ali was on pace for the school record last season at the Pac-10 Championships before withdrawing due to injury and Woods already stands third on USC's all-time list.

Another All-American is Brysun Stately who achieve that honor in 2007 at Nebraska, before transferring back to USC where she had spent her freshman season in 2006. Stately is the record holder in the pole vault at both schools and the Trojans are anxious to have her on their side again competing in 2009.

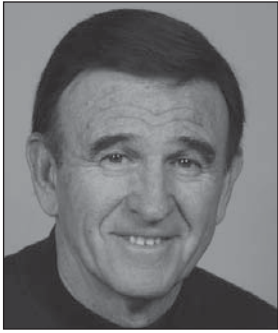
Zsofia Erdelyi gives USC a strong presence in the distance races, finishing ninth at the NCAA Championships in the 3000m steeplechase after finishing 2nd at the West Regional and fourth at the Pac-10s. She set the USC record in the steeplechase and posted the fourth-best 3000m race and the third-fastest 5000m race by a Trojan female in history.



The most interesting aspect of USC's women's team may be its No. 3 ranked women's recruiting class. These women will be asked immediately to fill the major void due to the graduation of All-Americans Carol Rodriguez and Jessica Onyepunuka. The group may be young, but they are extremely talented and expected to be key components to this year's team. The group includes Erica Alexander (11.40 - 100m, 23.53 - 200m, 53.29 - 400m), Frida Flodstrom (2:05.76 - 800m, 4:27.82 - 1500m, 55.83 - 400m), Elan Hilaire (11.68 - 100m, 24.27 - 200m, 53.97 - 400m), Anniya Louis (2:09.16 - 800m), Dalilah Muhammad (54.23 - 400m, 39.99 - 300m, 57.09 - 400m IH) and Aereon Payne (11.48 - 100m, 23.65 - 200m, 55.88 - 400m).

RON ALLICE

USC Director of Track & Field • 15th Season

Director of Track and Field Ron Allice enters his 15th season at the helm of the USC program. With the outstanding coaching staff he has assembled, the Trojans have returned to prominence on a national level once again. Last season, the men's team

tied for seventh and the women's team placed 11th at the NCAA Championships, the first time in four years that USC did not have a Top 10 finish for both squads. The Trojans had been the only program in the country to have both teams finish in the Top 10 in each of the previous three years.

Under his guidance, the Trojan men's team has finished in the top 10 at the NCAA finals in 11 of his 14 seasons. The Women of Troy won their first-ever national championship in 2001 under Allice, who has guided the women's track and field team to a top 10 finish nine times in 14 seasons, including being the national championship runner-up in 2006.

The men's squad placed fifth in 2007, ninth in 2006 and sixth in 2005 at the NAAs, running Troy's current streak to four consecutive top-10 finishes. The men's track and field team went on a run of six consecutive top-10 finishes under Allice from 1995-2000, a feat not accomplished since the early 70s under Vern Wolfe. The men have also won four Pac-10 titles in the last 11 years, including the 2006 season when they also won the NCAA West Regional for the second consecutive season.

The hallmark of an Allice team is balance--after all, the sport he coaches *is* called track and field--and his tenure has been marked by squads that have been able to compete for championships at the national, conference and dual meet level. In 2003, his men's team won the Pac-10 championship and placed third at the NCAA meet. The year before, his young men's team finished third in the Pac-10 and tied for 11th at the NAAs. The previous season--2001--the Trojans were 12th at the NCAA meet and second in the conference, while snapping crosstown rival UCLA's dual-meet win streak at 22. The seven seasons prior to 2001, Troy finished no lower than seventh at the NAAs (including three top-5 finishes) and won three Pac-10 titles.

During his tenure, Trojan men have won 10 NCAA individual titles, garnered All-American acclaim 96 times and set 10 school records--not an easy task considering the glorious track and field history at USC.

Allice also runs one of the top women's program in the country, last year placing 11th, snapping a streak of three consecutive Top 10 finishes. However, the Women of Troy have finished in the Top 10 eight of the last 11 seasons. In 2006 the women placed second to Auburn at the NCAA Championships, behind Virginia Powell's record-setting performance in the 100m hurdles. Before 2004's 12th-place and 2003's 13th-place finish at the NCAA meet, the Women of Troy were the only team in the country to finish in the NCAA top three each of the previous four years while winning at least one NCAA team title. In 2002, his squad finished third at the

NAAs. It was led by the most celebrated sprinter in collegiate history, Angela Williams, who won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title and later was awarded the Honda/Broderick Cup given to the nation's top female collegiate athlete.

In 2001, the Women of Troy put on a near-perfect meet to win their first NCAA team title. In 2000, USC took second--at the time, their best-ever showing at the NAAs. In 1999, USC was the only program that finished in the top five in both men's and women's track and field, as the women were third and the men fifth. In 1998, the women's team finished in fifth place. In 1997 they placed 14th, but that came on the heels of their first-ever Pac-10 title and a seventh-place NCAA finish in 1996. Allice's women's teams feature powerhouse athletes who go on to shine on the national and world stages, including such stars as Williams, Powell, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholm and Torri Edwards.

USC's past successes in track and field are well known: 29 NCAA championships (including two indoor titles), 61 world records, 98 Olympic team members, 41 Olympic gold medals and 16 inductees in the U.S. National Track and Field Hall of Fame - all encapsuled in 107 years of a rich and storied tradition.

And now, with the second century of Trojan track and field already well underway, Ron Allice and his staff continue to work hard to

maintain the luster of USC's most successful athletic program.

Alice, a prep standout at Long Beach (Calif.) Poly High, is well known for his ability to win. His overall dual meet coaching mark is 213-47-1 in 36 years at five schools, including 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach City College, his previous stop before landing at Troy. Alice's programs have produced more than 284 All-Americans, plus 27 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He has coached at his high school, junior college and college alma maters on the way to compiling his outstanding coaching statistics.

Alice has certainly reached the top echelon of his career, although he has not forgotten the beginnings of his coaching days. In his first coaching job, he guided the Long Beach Comets, a girls' and women's AAU program, for four years (1964-68), expanding the squad from just five girls to more than 150 competitors. During that time, he was also a graduate assistant at Long Beach State in 1964, an assistant at Compton (Calif.) High in 1966 (the team was second at the CIF championships) and the head coach for track and cross country for two years (1967-68) at Wilson High in Long Beach.

The next three seasons (1969-71), he was the track and cross country coach at Poly High in Long Beach. His track teams went 23-4 and captured the Moore League title each year. His 1971 squad was ranked as California's top dual meet team and was fifth at the state meet.

Alice was then Cal Poly Pomona's track and cross country head coach for two years (1972-73). Again, the success he had enjoyed at previous stops followed him — the Broncos lost only one dual meet, won two CCAA titles (a first in school history) and finished fifth in 1972 and sixth in 1973 at the NCAA College Division championships.

He spent the next five seasons (1974-78) as the track and cross country head coach at Long Beach State. Despite being a new Division I program and having just three scholarships, four of his squads placed among the nation's Top 15 dual meet teams. He won one Pacific Coast Athletic Association title and his teams finished second twice. Two of his cross country teams won the PCAA crown (two others were runners-up).

In 1979, Alice went to Long Beach City College. During his tenure (1979-94), his men's teams won the conference championship all 16 years and lost only one dual meet (78-1) in that time. Besides the 11 state crowns (including five in a row), his Vikings had five state runner-up finishes and won 14 Southern California championships (with two second-place finishes). In 1980, his team was selected by Track & Field News as the best junior college team in history. He was named the 1992 Coach of the Year by both the California Community College Coaches Association and the California Coaches Association (CCA). He also coached LBCC's cross country teams, including the 1990 state titlist and the 1991 state runner-up. He was the 1992 CCA Cross Country Coach of the Year.

Alice's achievements have not only been limited to the coaching ranks. He prepped at Long Beach Poly High (where he was a CIF finalist in the 440-yard dash), then went to Long Beach City College before attending Long Beach State, where he set the school record in the 440-yard dash. He was inducted into Long Beach State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993.

Alice received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1962 and his master's in physical education in 1970, both from Long Beach State.

Women's Sprints, Assistant Coach



Tina Fernandes is in her 10th year as the women's sprints assistant coach at USC. She was the 2008 Olympic coach and Team Leader representing Puerto Rico at the Beijing Games.

Under her guidance, USC's sprint team has been one of the best in the nation the past several years. That fact has

not gone unnoticed as Fernandes was named the West Region Sprints Assistant Coach of the Year by the USTFCCCA two of the last four seasons (2005 & 2007).

Her sprinters once again were a force on the national scene in 2008 as Jessica Onyepunuka placed fifth in the 100m dash and Carol Rodriguez stretched it out to run the 400m and placed a close third. The pair won the same events at the 2008 West Regional to help lead USC to a third-place finish. Onyepunuka qualified for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 100m and Rodriguez became an Olympian for Puerto Rico in the 200m and 400m.

2007 was a banner year for the sprint corps as Rodriguez and Onyepunuka finished first and second respectively in both the 100m and 200m at the Pac-10 Championships and at the NCAA West Regional. Rodriguez went on to place fourth at the NCAA Championships in the 100m dash, while Onyepunuka took seventh. The pair teamed up with Shalina Clarke and Candice Davis to place third in the 4x100m relay at the NCAAs.

The 2006 women's sprints team also had a stellar campaign for USC as Rodriguez placed third at the NCAAs in the 100m and fourth in the 200m, while the 4x100m relay team of Virginia Powell, Davis, Onyepunuka and Rodriguez took third with a school-record time of 42.96. At the NCAA West Regional, Rodriguez won the 100m (11.09w) and 200m (22.23) and the 4x100m relay team also took first place. Rodriguez winning time in the 200m race set the USC and Pac-10 record. Powell won the 100m, Rodriguez the 200m and the 4x100m relay team won at the Pac-10 Championships.

With Rodriguez' win in the conference 100m dash race in 2007, she became the eighth Trojan in nine seasons to win the event. She followed three-time winner Powell (2004-06), only the second Pac-10 runner to win the event three straight seasons.

In 2003, Miya Edmonson won the NCAA West Region 200m title and qualified for both the 100m and 200m at the NCAA Championships, while Natasha Mayers finished ninth in the NCAA 100m final. USC has

had a Women of Troy sprinter reach the NCAA 100m final in 10 of the last 11 seasons.

The year 2002 was a special season as senior Angela Williams won an unprecedented fourth NCAA 100m title. Williams also went on to win the prestigious Honda/Broderick Cup honoring the nation's top female collegiate athlete, joining basketball's Cheryl Miller as the only USC athlete to win the award. But it wasn't just Williams who achieved excellence in 2002. Mayers became the first USC woman ever to win the NCAA 200m title and then placing second to her teammate in the 100m. Kinshasa Davis finished eighth in the 200m, while the 400m relay squad finished third at the NCAAs. At the 2002 Pac-10s, five USC sprinters made the final of the 100m—a dominating tour de force for the Women of Troy sprint corps.

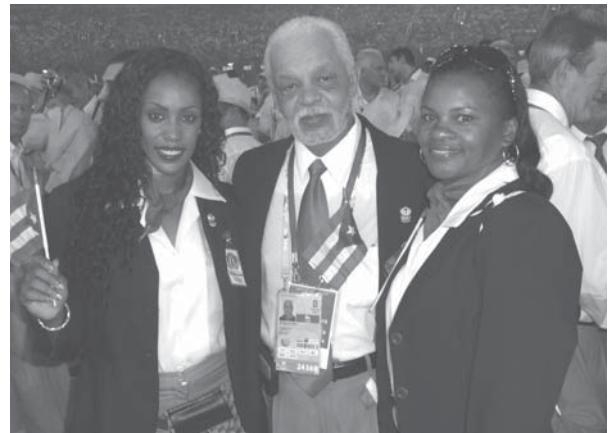
In 2001, Angela Williams won her unprecedented third consecutive NCAA 100m title, while Kinshasa Davis took third in the 200m at the NCAAs and the women's 400m relay placed second. At the 2000 NCAAs, the 400m relay squad finished undefeated on the season by winning the NCAA title with a then school-record time of 43.14, while Davis, who had run a nation-leading 22.69 earlier in the year, took second in the 200m. Williams won her second-straight NCAA 100m title. As well as Powell's exploits in the NCAAs in 2005, Alexis Weatherspoon placed third in the 200m and 4th in the 200m. The 4x100m relay team won the West Regional and were Pac-10 champs.

A fine sprinter herself in college, Fernandes competed at Long Beach City College and later at Fresno State. She has a Masters Degree in Education and a teaching credential in Physical Education. Chosen as one of the 2006 sprint coaches for the Puerto Rican NACAC and Pan American Championships. Fernandes also was selected to be a Mentor for Women in Coach by the USOC. She also was chosen for 2007 and 2008 Marquis Who's Who for Women.

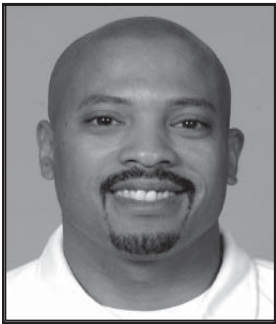

JOHN HENRY JOHNSON, Jr.

Sprints/Recruiting Coordinator

John Henry Johnson enters his 15th year as one of the top assistant coaches in the nation. He works specifically with USC's sprinters and is the team's strength coach, but it is his prowess on the recruiting trail that has been the most instrumental in putting Troy back on the map.

Each of USC's past 13 men's and women's recruiting classes have ranked among the best in the nation, with the 2008 men's class being rated No. 5 and the women's group No. 3. In 2007, the men's class was rated No. 2 and the 2006 women's recruiting class was tabbed No. 1 by Track and Field News. Johnson has brought into the Trojan fold such superstars as Jerome Davis, Felix Sanchez, Denis Kholev, Charles Lee, Ryan Wilson and Julien Kapek on the men's side, and Angela Williams, Natasha Danvers, Brigita Langerholc, Grezyna Penc and Inga Stasiulionyte on the women's side. His extensive knowledge of the world amateur track scene--bouyed by a degree in international relations--has proved invaluable to USC and has established Johnson as perhaps the preeminent recruiter of foreign track and field athletes in the last quarter century.

Johnson has coached USC's last six sprint All-Americans, with Ahmad Rashad earning the honors in the 200m in 2007. In 2006, senior Philip Francis captured All-American honors in the 100m, as did Sultan McCullough in 2000 and Jason Shelton in 1996. In the 200m, Charles Lee was an All-American in 1998 and 1999.

Sprinter Wes Felix won back-to-back Pac-10 200m titles in 2004 and 2005--the first Trojan to do so since the late 1970s. Felix also placed second in the 100m race at the 2005 NCAAs.

In the 2006 season, not only did Francis gain All-America honors in the 100m, but the entire sprint crew excelled. At the NCAA West Regional Gary Jones won the 100m and set a meet record with a time of 10.23, tied for 10th all-time at USC. Francis placed second in the 100m and won the 200m. At the Pac-10s, Francis was a three-time winner, taking the 100m, 200m and was part of the meet-winning 4x400m relay team. For good measure, he also ran a leg in USC's second-place 4x100m relay team. In 2007, Rashad almost matched Francis' feat, winning the 100m, 200m and running a leg on USC's winning 4x100m relay team.

Johnson, who was a state champion in the decathlon for Ron Alice at Long Beach City College (1987), also earned All-Pacific-10 Conference honors while competing at UCLA. After surpassing the 7,000-point mark in the decathlon for the Bruins, he graduated with a degree in international relations in 1990.

A track and football star at West Technical High in Cleveland, Ohio, Johnson--who is the son of NFL Hall-of-Famer John Henry Johnson--became an assistant coach at Long Beach State from 1990-92, where he worked with sprinters and throwers. He also served as a strength coach for the 49ers.

In 1993, Johnson studied abroad, spending time in Mexico and Spain, as well as the Center for Intensive Language Studies in Costa Rica. His hobbies include writing, playing and recording music.

DAN LANGE

Throws/Heptathlon

After 19 years of coaching the Trojan throwers, Dan Lange is one of the nation's most respected teachers, having coached his athletes to All-American honors 43 times. In 2008, Lange helped guide Eva Orban to the NCAA title in the women's hammer, while Corey White took second in the men's javelin. For his work with the

USC throwers in 2007, highlighted by Noah Bryant's indoor and outdoor NCAA shot put championships, Lange was named the West Region top assistant coach in men's throws for the second consecutive season.

The 43-year-old Lange guided former Trojan and 1996 Olympic gold medalist Balazs Kiss to four consecutive NCAA hammer throw championships (and a collegiate record) and aided USC throwers across the board with his vast knowledge in the sport. In 1997, despite the departure of Kiss, Lange made it five in a row, coaching Bengt Johansson to the 1997 NCAA hammer title. Johansson was runner up in the hammer in 1998, as was Norbert Horvath in 1999 (Horvath also finished fifth in 2000 and third in 2001). At the 2000 Pac-10 Championships, USC continued its men's hammer domination, sweeping the top four spots to key the Trojans' title run. In 2001, Horvath captured his third straight Pac-10 hammer title and third straight All-American honor. In 2002, Lange guided walk ons Michael Murray and Harrison Lee into the Pac-10 finals. In 2004, Murray earned USC's 12th All-American honor in the hammer, while Noah Bryant became Troy's first shot put All-American since 1984. In 2005, Adam Midles placed sixth in the hammer at the NCAAs. In 2006, Lange guided two male Trojans to All-American honors as Noah Bryant placed seventh in the shot and Adam Midles seventh in the men's hammer.

The 2007 season could have been Lange's finest work with the men's throwers as Bryant set the school record in the shot, a record that had stood for 35 years, and won the NCAA indoor and outdoor shot titles. In addition, Adam Midles was an All-American and had the fourth-best hammer throw in school history, Bryant had the eighth best hammer mark, William Denbo the sixth best shot put and Stenn Parton the ninth farthest javelin throw by a Trojan.

In 2008, Corey White came up just short of an NCAA title in the javelin, but during the course of the season set a new school standard in the event with a throw of 267-10, more than 23 feet farther than the previous school record.

On the women's side, Lange has coached 2001 NCAA javelin champ and Pac-10 record-holder Inga Stasiulionyte (who in 2004 threw 62.27 to win the Lithuanian Championship and qualify for the World Championships), 2003 NCAA runner-up and former Pac-10 hammer record-holder Julianna Tudja, 2002 hammer All-American and 2004 shot put All-American (and former school record holder) L'Orangerie Crawford, 2001 shot put



Lange was named the West Region top assistant in men's throws in 2006 & 2007.

All-American and former school discus record holder Cynthia Ademiluyi, two-time hammer All-American Jennifer Vail, 1996 Pac-10 heptathlon champion and NCAA runner-up Nicole Haynes and Leslie Coons (a former American record holder in the hammer). In 2006, he had a chance to work with All-American transfer Karen Freberg, who placed seventh at the NCAAs. Freberg during the season set the USC shot put record with a throw of 57-7 1/2 and placed second in the shot at both the NCAA West Regional and the Pac-10 Championships.

Lange also coached two other USC record-setters in 2006 as Eva Orban set the school record in the hammer with a Pac-10 and West Regional record-throw of 226-8 and Kate Hutchinson set the USC record in the discus with a toss of 189-5. Orban won the hammer at the Pac-10s and the NCAA West Regional and place second in the event at the NCAA Championships. Hutchinson placed second at the Pac-10 Championships and won the discus competition at the NCAA West Regional which gave Troy a share of the women's title. In 2007, he helped guide Orban to All-American honors in the hammer again (3rd place), a NCAA West hammer title and a second-place finish at the Pac-10 Championships. In addition to Orban, Julia Rozenfeld placed sixth at the Pac-10 and seventh at the NCAA West Regional in the hammer. Lange then helped Orban reach new heights in 2008, as she became the first Trojan female to win an NCAA title in the hammer and broke her own school record with a throw of 230-3.

Outside of USC, Lange coached hammer thrower Lisa Misipeka to the American Samoa record in that event and to the Olympics. He also worked with Tudja after she left USC and guided her to the Olympics three years ago. He was the coach for No. 1-ranked discus thrower Adam Setliff, three-time U.S. discus champion and two-time U.S. Olympian.

A four-year letterman at Cal State Northridge and three-time NCAA Division II championship meet qualifier, Lange also earned All-American honors in the hammer. Lange studied exercise physiology at Cal State Northridge and also works as a sports fitness consultant and as a human performance consultant for business professionals.

He and his wife Darcy (Arreola), who was one of America's finest middle distance runners and a former NCAA champion, reside in Valencia, Calif., with their two sons, Dylan, age eight, and Dalton three.

MICHAEL PULLINS

Jumps

Mike Pullins is in his 11th year as jumps coach at USC. Coach "Mike," as the athletes like to call him, is responsible for coaching both the women and men's jumpers.

In 2008, Manjula Wijesekara reached the men's high jump finals at the NCAAs, after placing second at the West Regional. Pullins also guided Michelle Sanford,

Akene Anene and Aven Wright to scoring marks at the Pac-10 Championships.

In 2007, Pullins guided Inman Breaux to a seventh-place finish at the Pac-10s and to sixth at the NCAA West Regional in the triple jump. Also, Wright placed eighth in the triple jump at the Pac-10s.

In the last four seasons, Pullins has coached an athlete to four NCAA titles and five scorers overall in NCAA meets, two NCAA West titlists, 10 regional scorers, three Pac-10 Champions and 16 scorers at the conference meet (including seven top three finishers).

Under his tutelage, the USC jumpers have been mainstays on the honors podium at the NCAA Championships. In 2006, he coached Jesse Williams to the NCAA indoor and outdoor high jump titles for the second consecutive season. Williams also won the NCAA West Regional and Pac-10 high jump championships and raised his school record with a jump of 7-7 1/4 at the NCAA finals en route to being named the USTFCCA Male Co-Field Athlete of the Year. This past year, Williams won the high jump at the Olympic Trials and represented USA at the Beijing Olympics.

In 2005, Pullins guided Williams to the same NCAA indoor and outdoor double and Allen Simms to a second-place finish at the NCAAs in the triple jump. Simms won the Pac-10 triple jump, the fifth consecutive season a USC triple jumper claimed that honor.

At the 2003 NCAA Outdoor Championships, Pullins guided Julien Kapek to the triple jump title--USC's first outdoors since 1961--while

Simms placed third. Simms, who also finished seventh in the long jump outdoors, won the triple jump at the NCAA Indoor Championships earlier in the year with a Pac-10-record jump of 56-7 1/2. To cap off a remarkable season for USC jumps, Dawid Jaworski won the NCAA high jump title--Troy's first since 1963--with a school-record jump of 7-5 3/4. All totaled, Pullins' athletes scored an amazing 43 points at the indoor and outdoor NCAA meets.

In 2002, Julien Kapek set a school triple jump record with a jump of 55-8 1/2 and then went on to place third at the NCAAs. The year prior, Djeke Mambo became the first Trojan to win both the long jump and triple jump at the Pac-10s since Luther Hayes in 1961.

On the women's side in 2007, Pullins helped guide freshmen Shana Woods to the seventh-best long jump in school history and Anene to the 10th-best high jump by a USC women. Sanford placed seventh in the long jump and sixth in the triple jump at the 2007 Pac-10 Championships and Woods came in ninth in the long jump.

Pullins guided Sanford as a freshman to the Pac-10 long jump championship in 2004, while Tatyana Obukhova took her third-straight Pac-10 triple jump championship and a fourth-place finish at the NCAAs in 2002. The year before, Obukhova was third at the NCAAs. In his first year, he coached Pam Simpson to a third-place finish at the 1999 NCAAs. He also helped Disia Page and Stephanie Jones land on the USC top 10 charts in the long jump. In fact, four of the 10 women on USC's long jump chart were coached by Pullins as were five of the top 10 women on USC's triple jump chart.

A 1987 graduate of USC, his name is still among the top 10 triple jumpers on the all-time Trojan charts. As a high school senior Mike qualified for the CIF Championships in four individual events and went on to win the triple jump, in which he placed fifth in the 1982 state meet. Mike starred at Cal State Northridge and Pasadena City College before coming to Troy. A three-time USA Track & Field outdoor qualifier (he qualified for the 1992 Olympic trials), he was forced to set track aside due to injuries and four ankle surgeries in 1994.

Mike earned his master's degree in Education Administration from USC in 2005. He is also a Level II USATF certified coach. He and his wife Erin, a former long jumper at USC, live in Pasadena, Calif.

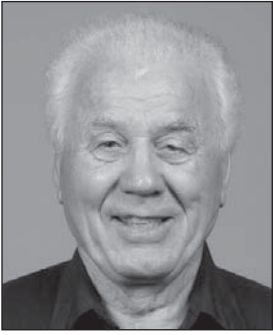

LASZLO TABORI

Men's Distances (Volunteer)

Famed distance great Lazlo Tabori works with the USC men's distance runners and the Men of Troy running club team.

Tabori has a wealth of experience to share with the Trojans. After all, he was the third man to break the four-minute barrier in the mile. He did so on May 28th, 1955 with a time of 3:59, joining Roger Bannister and John Landy in that elite group. That same year he held the 1500m World Record with a time of 3:40.8. He was also a member of the World Record-breaking team in the 4x1500m relay. Among his many accomplishment are such notable feats as being an Olympian at the 1957 Melbourne Games in the 1500m and 5000m races.

Laszlo's coaching methods are well founded. He trained himself by the great middle distance Hungarian coach Mihaly Igloi in Hungary and then later in the United States after the 1956 Olympic Games, Tabori is a great believer in the interval method of training.

He coached Valley Junior College in the 1970s where his team won three state titles and held the national junior record for the 10,000

distance medley and the 4 x 1 mile relay.

Jacqueline Hansen, winner of the Boston and Western Hemisphere Marathons and Miki Gorman, winner of the New York City and Boston Marathons, were two of his athletes who achieved international recognition during the 1970s.

Tabori was instrumental in the development of 800m runner Duane Solomon who earned All-America status, placing seventh at the NCAAs in 2007 and third in 2008. Solomon also ran the second fastest 800m time in USC history (1:45.69) while placing third at the USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships

In 1979, Runners World magazine bestowed upon Tabori the prestigious Paavo Nurmi Award for Coach of the Year. He was inducted into the Hungarian Hall of Fame in Budapest, Hungary in 1995 for his great accomplishments as a world class athlete and Olympian. In 2002, Tabori received the Fair Play Award in Frankfurt, Germany given by the International Olympic Committee for lifetime achievement and outstanding contribution to the sport. He has a book out this year called Tabori Es A Torbiek.

USC's Lionel Larry finished second in the 400m race at the 2008 NCAA Championships with a PR of 44.63, .01 seconds behind winner Andretti Bain of Oral Roberts. It was Larry's second consecutive second place finish in the event at the NCAA Championships by a total of .03 seconds.





TOM WALSH

Distances/Women's Cross Country

Tom Walsh enters his 15th year as middle and long distance coach at USC. He also serves as the head women's cross country coach.

During his tenure at USC, the Women of Troy middle and long distance program has consistently been one of the best in the country. USC has produced two four-time outdoor All-Americans in the 800m and 1500m during the last nine years.

During the last 13 years, USC middle and long distance runners have captured All-American honors 21 times, including an NCAA 800m championship by eight-time All-American Brigita Langerholm in 2001. Langerholm also finished a surprising fourth in the 800m at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney in a school-record time of 1:58.51. Another Walsh product was Grazyna Penc, a four-time All-American in the 1500m. Penc finished third in 1996 and 1998, fourth in 1997 and was runner up in 1999. Emebet Shiferaw was a two-time All-American in the 3000m in 1996-97. Her best NCAA finish was second place. Anna Lopaciuch twice earned All-American honors in the 1500m, finishing fifth in 1998 and third in 2000. In 2002, Aleksandra Deren placed seventh in the 800m at the NAAs. In 2004, school record holder Julia Budniak became the first Women of Troy athlete to earn All-American honors in the 3000m steeplechase as she finished sixth. Iryna Vashchuk finished sixth and seventh at the NCAA Championships in her specialty, the 1500m. Vashchuk also qualified for the NCAA Championships in cross country in 2003 and 2004. USC has qualified a cross country runner for the NCAA Championships in six of the last eight seasons. Brooke Thomas and Sarah Ellis qualified in 2002 and 2001, respectively and the last two seasons Sarah Cocco (2007) and Zsafia Erdelyi (2008) earned a berth. USC middle and long distance runners have also been

a dominant force at the Pac-10 Championships over the last decade, capturing 14 first place finishes. In fact, a Women of Troy athlete has won the Pac-10 1500m title seven times in the last 13 years. Walsh also worked with 1500m runner Tomasz Babiszkiewicz, a four-time Pac-10 scorer and a two-time NCAA championship qualifier.

In 2007, Walsh helped guide Irek Sekretarski to the school record in the one-mile race. The Trojans' 4x800m team of DaSean Cunningham, Raphael Asafo-Agyei, Sekretarski and Duane Solomon also ran the second-fastest time in school history.

This fall Walsh guided the women's cross country team to back-to-back meet wins at Pepperdine and Bakersfield, and Zsafia Erdelyi set the school 5K record and advanced to the NCAA Championships. The Trojans also captured the Lexus Gauntlet points for the second consecutive season as they beat crosstown rival UCLA. In 2007, the young women's cross country team had an impressive season which included a Trojan runner winning four of the five regular season meets. Freshman Sarah Cocco won two meets, set the school 6K record and qualified for the NCAA XC Championships.

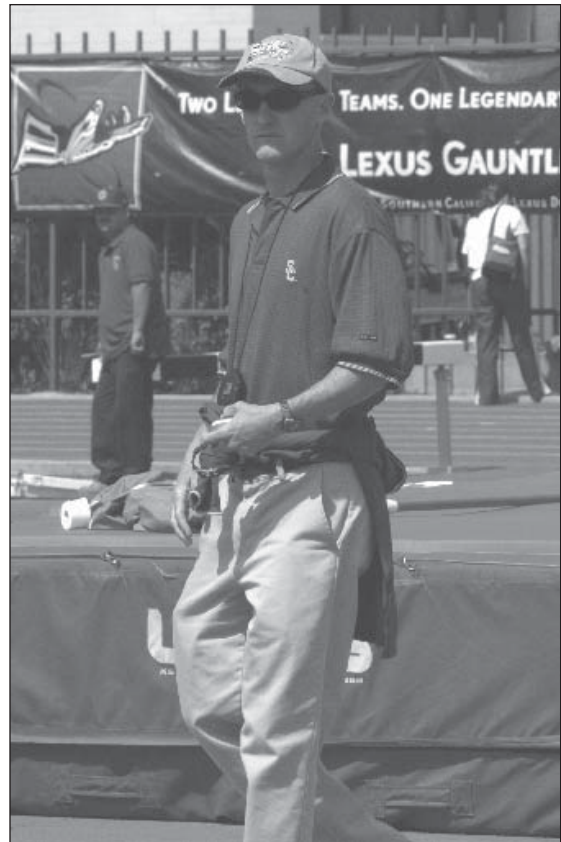
Walsh graduated from USC in 1988, and served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater for three years in the late 1980s. He also served as a track and field consultant for ABC and NBC during the U.S. Olympic Trials.

Dr. TOMMIE LEE WHITE

Hurdles

Dr. Tommie White is in his fifth season coaching the men's and women's hurdles for USC, and you could say he has had a pretty good first four years in his return to Troy. It's the second go-around at USC for White, who coached hurdles for the Trojans in 1980s. In 2006, White was named the West Region top assistant in women's

hurdles as he was instrumental in the development of Honda Award winner and NCAA record-setter Virginia Powell.

Last year White guided sophomore Shalina Clarke to an All-American season, culminating with an eighth-place finish in the 100m HH at the NCAA Championships. Senior Kai Kelley was able to pull off an impressive and difficult double, earning All-America honors in two different events, placing sixth in the 110m HH and seventh in the 400m IH.

In 2007, White guided Candice Davis to a second-place finish in the women's 100m HH at the NCAA Championships. She posted the second-fastest time in school history in the 100m HH, Clarke the eighth best and Talia Stewart the 10th best. Clarke also posted the sixth-best Trojan time ever in the 400m IH and Stewart the seventh best. On the men's side, Kelley earned All-America honors in the 110m HH and had the eight-fastest time in school history.

His hurdling crew has been outstanding since he returned to Troy. It was led in 2006 by Powell who established NCAA records in the 100m hurdles and 60m indoor hurdles and won every race she was in, picking up NCAA outdoor, NCAA indoor, NCAA West and Pac-10 titles. Davis won the 2007 Pac-10s and scored at the NCAA West, Kai Kelley scored at the 2007 Pac-10s and won at the NCAA West Regional, Tunisia Johnson scored at the 2006 Pac-10s and Blake Frazier at the 2006 Pac-10s.

In 2005, White guided Powell to the NCAA 60m indoor hurdle title and to the 100m outdoor hurdles title. He also was instrumental in the development of Frazier and Kelley, who finished second and sixth respectively at the NCAA West Regional.

He was an elite athlete in track and field for over 10 years, representing the U.S. on numerous national teams. For 12 years, he was the coordinator and a consultant in "Promotions for Olympic Sports" for Adidas, USA.

Dr. White graduated from USC with PH.Ds in both psychology and kinesiology. He is a licensed psychologist in practice and a full professor emeritus and former Department Chair of Kinesiology at California State University at Northridge. He is involved in sports psychology consultation with athletes and teams from all levels of competition, including amateurs, high school, university, professional and the Olympics.

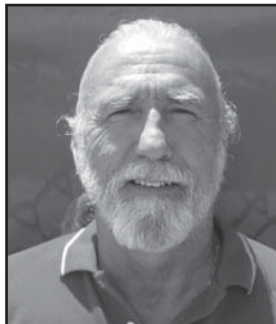

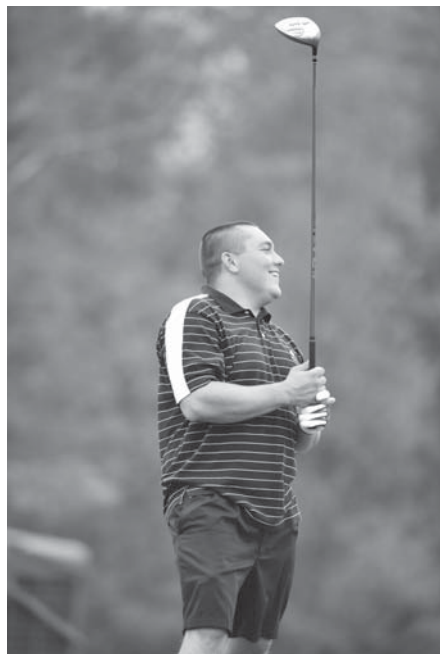

Men Tie For Seventh, Women 11th At 2008 NCAA Track And Field Finals

- Orban Wins Women's Hammer Title -

Junior Eva Orban became the first Trojan female to win the NCAA hammer title to lead USC at the 2008 NCAA Track and Field Championships held in Des Moines, Iowa at Jim Duncan Track and Johnny Bright Field from June 11-14.

The men's team had a pair of second-place finishers in Lionel Larry (400m) and Corey White (javelin) to finish tied for seventh, while the women's team placed 11th. The Trojans narrowly missed extending their nation's best streak of consecutive top 10 finishes for both program from three to four years.

Also scoring points and earning All-America honors for the USC men's team were Duane Solomon in the 800m race (3rd) and Kai Kelley in the 110m HH (6th) and 400m IH (7th).

In addition to Orban winning the NCAA hammer title, other Trojan females who scored points and earned All-America honors were Carol Rodriguez in the 400m (3rd), Jessica Onyepunuka in the 100m (5th) and Shalina Clarke in the 100m HH (8th).

Trojans Strong At West Regional Again

- USC men fall two points short of fourth-straight NCAA West Regional title; Women's team places third -

Corey White won the javelin and Lionel Larry won the 400m race to lead USC's men's team to a second-place finish at the NCAA West Regional held in Northridge, Calif. on May 30-31. The Trojans finished two points behind Arizona State, snapping USC's three-year dominance at the regional. The Trojans have finished no lower than third in the six years of the regional format.

Eva Orban won the hammer, Jessica Onyepunuka the 100m, Carol Rodriguez the 400m and Shalina Clarke the 100m HH to lead the Women of Troy to a third place finish. It was the fourth time in the last five years that the USC women's team has placed in the top three. For Orban it marked a third-straight West Regional hammer title for her.

The men's competition came down to the final event and USC's 4x400m relay team of Nate Anderson, Duane Solomon, Kai Kelley and Lionel Larry needed to place in the top two to pass UCLA (not in the race), while ASU would need to place no higher than seventh. USC's relay team did its part by winning with a season-best time of 3:05.16, but the Sun Devils' quartet placed fourth to earn five points and edge the Trojans, 74-72.

Other strong performances by the Trojans that earned second-place finishes were turned in by Zsafia Erdelyi in the women's 3000m steeplechase, Kelley in the 110m HH, Solomon in the 800m and Manjula Wijesekara in the high jump.

- USC Men Finish Seventh and Women Place Fourth -

Shalina Clarke won the women's 400m IH and had a part in scoring 31 of the USC women's 91 points while Lionel Larry won an electrifying 400m race to lead the USC men at the 2008 Pac-10 Track and Field Championships held at Sun Angel Stadium in Tempe, Ariz. on May 16-17. The women's team placed fourth and the men's team seventh.

The Trojan men began the final day in ninth place with their 11.5 points coming from Corey White's win in the javelin and Derek Scott's tying for seventh in the pole vault competition. The women began the final day in fifth place with 27 points as Eva Orban placed second in the hammer, Zsafia Erdelyi fourth in the steeplechase, Michelle Sanford fifth in the long jump and Kristine Busa fifth in the javelin throw. Shana Woods had earned six points by finishing third in the the heptathlon the previous week. Nia Ali was in second place after the first day of the heptathlon, but was injured and could not finish, after being on a pace to challenge the school record. Ali was one of several Trojans who were injured at or held out of the Pac-10 Championships due to injury.

The women's 4x100m relay team of Clarke, Jessica and Judith Onyepunuka and Carol Rodriguez was the only other Trojan winning effort.

USC Women Win Dual Meet

- Men fall short for sweep of Bruins -

Carol Rodriguez led the USC women's track and field team to an impressive 86-77 victory in the 76th annual USC-UCLA Dual Meet on May 3 to snap a 15-season losing streak while the men's team fell 89-74 despite the efforts by four-time winner Lionel Larry at Drake Stadium in Westwood.

The USC women trailed 71-69 with three events left, but outscored the Bruins 17-6 in those events to win its first Dual Meet title since 1992 and put an end to UCLA head coach Jeanette Bolden's streak of dual meet wins at 73 (73-1). First Zsafia Erdelyi placed first and Sarah Cocco third in the 1500m race to give USC the lead, then behind strong legs from Rodriguez and Myra Hasson in the 4x400m race opened an 80-74 lead with just the triple jump left. Michelle Sanford clinched the meet by winning the TJ, with teammate Ekene Anene placing third for the final of 86-77.

The Trojan men led 64-58 with five events to go, but were done in late by 27 unanswered points, as UCLA swept the discus, 5000m and pole vault.

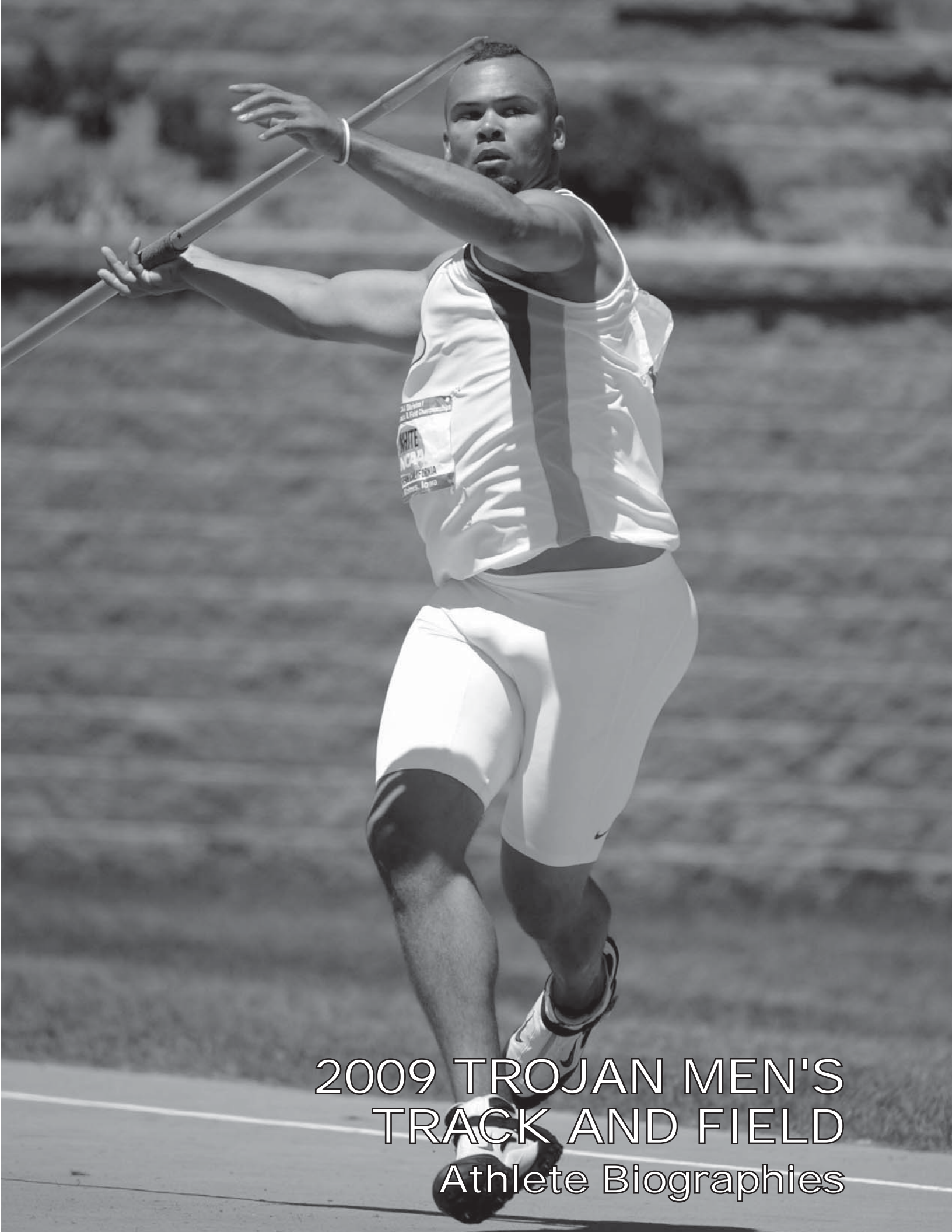
Larry won the 400m, jumped in at the last second to win the 200m and anchored the Trojans' winning 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams.

He was the 2007 Gatorade National Boys Track and Field Athlete of the Year and is expected to eventually be a key component of the Trojan sprint corps and challenge the USC all-time top 10 lists.

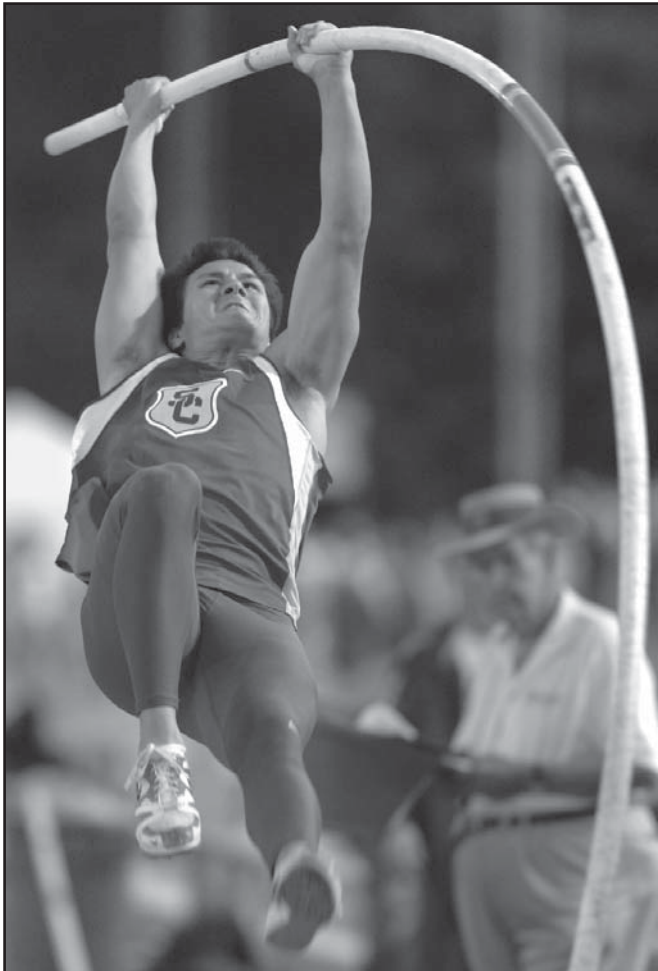

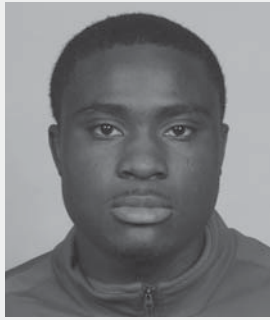

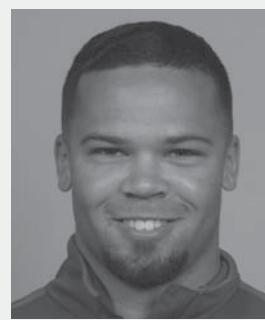

THIS YEAR: Redshirt senior Corey White is coming off an outstanding first season of throwing the javelin for USC in which he set the school record and finished second at the NCAA Championships.

2008: Had a memorable season throwing the javelin for USC, re-writing the record books all season, culminating with a second-place finish in the NCAA Championships, the only meet he did not win. White earned All-American honors and was named USTFCCA West Region Male Field Athlete of the Year and Pac-10 Male Field Athlete of the Year. In his first meet for USC - the Trojan Relays - White won with a throw of 220-1, the third-best mark in school history. He then won the javelin at the Northridge Invitational on March 15 with a throw of 235-5, the second-best mark in USC history and a new PR. He was not done as he won the Trojan Invitational on March 22 with a new PR of 241-8, three feet off the school record. He then took down the school record when he won the javelin at the Texas Relays on April 5 with a throw of 256-10 (78.29m), breaking Nils Fearnley's record of 244-8 which was set in 1995. White was not done yet, as he shattered his own school record at the Mt. SAC Relays with a throw of 267-10 (81.65m). He actually broke his record twice on the day as one of his earlier throws went 257-7. At the time, it was the top collegiate throw in the country by more than 20 feet. White won the javelin at the Dual Meet on May 3 with a throw of 237-11, more than 62 feet farther than the second-place finisher. He then won the Pac-10 javelin title with a throw of 241-8 and the NCAA West Regional javelin crown with a toss of 241-11. At the NCAA Championships it came down to the expected battle between White and Georgia's Chris Hill and the Trojan fell two-feet short, taking second with a throw of 255-2. It was, however, the farthest any Trojan had thrown the javelin in an NCAA competition. Also finished second to Hill at the NACAC Under-23 Championships with a throw of 257-7 1/4. White advanced to the finals at the Olympic trials, but placed ninth with a throw of 226-1 and did not qualify for the U.S. Olympic Team. **2007:** Served his redshirt season. **BEFORE USC:** Attended Redlands for the 2005 and 2006 seasons, winning the 2006 NCAA Division III javelin championship at Benedictine University in Lisle, Ill. with a stadium and school-record throw of 231-7 (70.59m) on May 27..Was ALL-SCIAC both seasons...Finished seventh at the NCAA Div. III Championships as a freshman...Won the gold medal at the USTAF Junior National Championships in the javelin with a throw of 221-4...This advanced him onto the Pan American games in Canada, where he earned the silver medal in the javelin with a throw of nearly 229 feet...Also played defensive end for the Bulldogs' football team. **HIGH SCHOOL:** Attended Mt. USC REMEMBERS KATHERINE B. LOKER

Katherine Bogdanovich Loker who passed away on June 26, 2008 at the age of 92 was associated with USC for more than 60 years. A member of the Class of 1940, she was an English major and a star runner on the track team. She married stage and screen actor Donald P. Loker, whose professional name was Don Terry and who later served as an executive in the StarKist Foods Company, the firm founded by Katherine's father in 1917.

Katherine and her husband gave more than \$30 million to the university, placing them among the top individual benefactors in USC history. Together they were the principal benefactors of what is now the USC Loker Hydrocarbon Research Institute, where their support was instrumental in enabling Distinguished Professor George A. Olah to complete the research that led to his winning the 1994 Nobel Prize in Chemistry. Katherine was also a strong supporter of USC athletics, particularly track and field, which named its new stadium in her honor, and of the USC School of Theatre, where she established the Donald P. Loker Action Fellowship in memory of her beloved husband.

Katherine was elected an honorary trustee of USC in 2000. She received an honorary degree from USC in 1998 and USC's highest honor, the Presidential Medallion, in 2006. She was also the recipient of the Alumni Association's highest honor, and the Dean's Medallion for the USC College of Letters, Arts and Sciences.

She was a Presidential Associate, a member of the Board of Councilors of the USC College of Letters, Arts and Sciences, a life member of Town and Gown, and a member of the San Diego Trojan League. In 2005 she was inducted into the USC Athletic Hall of Fame and received its Spirit Award. In 2006 she received the USC Track and Field Heritage Award.

Katherine Loker's steadfast support of higher education extended beyond the University of Southern California. She served on the Committee of University Resources at Harvard and received the Harvard

Medal in 1995 and an honorary degree in 2000. She also served as a life member of the Advisory Board of California State University, Dominguez Hills, where she received an honorary degree in 1999; a trustee and foundation member of the California Science Center of Los Angeles; a foundation executive board member of the Nixon Presidential Library in Yorba Linda; and a founding member of the Los Angeles Music Center. She was an active supporter of the Donald P. Loker Cancer Treatment Center at the California Hospital Medical Center, Los Angeles.

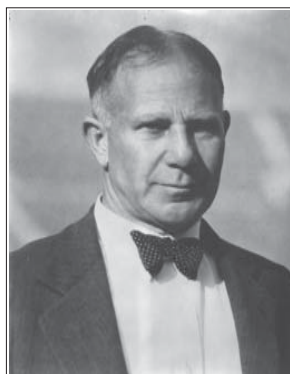
The Story of USC's Unmatched Track & Field History

However, the most dominant force in USC's slate of athletic programs is not the baseball team (12 College World Series titles) or the football squad (nine national championships) but the men's track and field program, with an unprecedented 28 NCAA titles (2 indoor), including nine straight from 1935-43.

Trojan athletes have dominated the track and field scene for decades. From the exploits of sprinter Charlie Paddock and thrower Clarence "Bud" Houser in the 1920s and 1930s, sprinter Mel Patton in the 1940s, thrower Parry O'Brien in the 1950s, sprinter Lennox Miller and pole vaulter Bob Seagren in the 1960s, sprinter Quincy Watts in the 1980s, to four-time NCAA hammer champion Balazs Kiss (only the fifth collegian to win four in a row) in the 1990s and World Champion hurdler Felix Sanchez in the 2000s, USC is synonymous with track and field excellence.

THE CROMWELL YEARS: 1909-1948

The roots of Troy's preeminence date back to 1926, when coach Dean Cromwell brought the first NCAA track and field championship to USC. Cromwell, who led the Trojans from 1909-48, also served as head coach of the football team for five seasons.

However, the foundation he laid was not on the gridiron but the cinderpaths. Cromwell's track squads won 12 NCAA championships and featured 34 NCAA individual champions. In addition, Cromwell was unanimously selected as headcoach of the victorious 1948 U.S. Olympic team, a group which featured five Trojans (Mel Patton, Bob Chambers, Roland Sink, Wilbur Thopson and Cliff Bourland). In fact, Patton, Thomson and Bourland brought home gold medals in their respective events from London, the Olympic site.

From 1935-43, USC experienced a streak of unequalled track and field success. No other university has come close to matching Troy's string of nine consecutive NCAA championships, all under Cromwell's watchful eye. Nicknamed the "Maker of Champions," he fashioned Trojan athletes into a powerhouse. At the 1936 Olympics in Berlin, USC trackmen scored enough points (37 1/2) to have finished among the top five in the world. Cromwell's influence extended

far beyond the USC campus to the corners of the world. He personally tutored champions in every Olympic Games from 1912 to 1948, and upon his retirement in 1949, "The Dean" remained involved as a regular figure in various Southland sporting events until his death in 1962.

TWO JESSES, NINE NATIONAL TITLES: 1949-1961

Jess Hill and Jess Mortensen, both integral parts of USC's proud athletic heritage, carried the track and field torch after Cromwell's retirement. Both men are still considered among the finest all-around athletes in USC history, and their accomplishments did not end after their playing days were over.

Hill, who lettered in three sports at USC (football, baseball and track), served as head coach of Troy's track and field program in 1949 and 1950, leading the Trojans to an undefeated season and national championship in both seasons. From 1951-56, Hill coached the football team, and in 1957, he began his tenure as USC athletic director, a position he held until 1972.

Mortensen's reign at USC also began as an undergraduate. The talented athlete lettered in track, basketball and football, winning the NCAA javelin title as a junior. After a 14-year coaching stint at Riverside Junior College, he returned to become coach of the Trojan track and field team in 1951, leading Troy to seven NCAA championships in his 11-year tenure. Mortensen's Trojan teams never lost a dual meet, going 79-0 between 1951 and 1961. He developed some of Troy's best-known trackmen, including Parry O'Brien and Max Truex. Sadly, "Mort" died suddenly at the age of 54 from complications caused by a blood clot. Hill, his longtime friend and teammate, stepped in as interim head coach for the 1962 season, and a new chapter in Trojan track and field history was about to begin.

THE WOLFE YEARS: 1963-1984

The prospect of succeeding three consecutive coaching legends would be a difficult task for anyone, but Vern Wolfe answered the challenge.

During his 22 years at the helm of the Trojan track and field program, USC captured five outdoor NCAA championships, including back-to-back titles in 1967 and 1968. A pole vaulter for Cromwell's Trojan teams, Wolfe also won indoor titles in 1967 and 1972. At the time of his retirement in 1984, he was the third-winningest coach in U.S. track history, all despite reductions in scholarships and the lack of a top-flight on-campus facility.

Wolfe, who competed in senior events as a pole vaulter, attacked all problems with a straight-ahead approach. He continued to win throughout his career and towards the end oversaw the modernization of Cromwell Field, USC's track facility which served as a training site for the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. And so, after 21 years on the job, Wolfe retired and gave way to Ernie Bullard.

BULLARD AND BUSH: 1985-94

Another in the line of former Trojan athletes to become head coaches at USC, Ernie Bullard came to Troy from San Jose State, where he helped build the Spartans into a national contender. It didn't take long for Bullard to continue Troy's winning ways, recruiting athletes like sprinter Quincy Watts, a two-time gold medalist at the 1992 Olympic Games.

Jim Bush was the man picked to replace longtime friend Bullard in 1991. After all, who better to rebuild the USC program than the man who guided UCLA to five national championships?

Bush helped stabilize the program and recruited some of Troy's stars, like Balazs Kiss of Hungary, the 1993, 1994, 1995 and 1996 NCAA champion in the hammer throw. Consequently, he helped lay the foundation

RON ALLICE, THE NEW ERA: 1995-Present

Ron Allice, who prior to the 1995 season was named the Director of Track and Field for USC's combined men's and women's program, is no stranger to success. He has distinguished himself at every level of competition, all in the Southland, and is well-known not only as a master builder, but a man who can keep a program at the highest level year after year.

Allice came to Troy with impeccable credentials: 11 state championships in 16 years at Long Beach (Calif.) City College, where his 1980 squad was called "the best junior college team in history" by Track & Field News. During his tenure at Long Beach C.C., his teams lost just one dual meet.

He quickly went to work, guiding the USC men's team to a fourth-place finish at the 1995 NCAA Outdoor Championships. In 1996, his Women of Troy won their first-ever Pac-10 title. In 1997, he led the Trojan men's



team to its first Pac-10 title since 1977 and a third-place showing at the 1997 NCAAs. In 1999, the men won their second Pac-10 title in three years. At the NCAAs, the women finished third and the men fifth (as a combined men's and women's program, this was the best finish in school history). In 2000, the men finished seventh--their seventh consecutive top 10 finish--while the women placed second--their highest finish ever. In 2001, Allice guided the Women of Troy to their first-ever NCAA team championship. In 2003, he led the men's team to a third-place finish, with three Trojans winning NCAA titles. In 2005, USC's men's team won the NCAA West Regional and finished sixth at the NCAA finals, while the women placed seventh. Allice's troops continued the winning ways in 2006 as the men won the Pac-10s and NCAA West Regional, while placing ninth at the NCAA Championships. The women placed second at the NCAA Championships, won the NCAA West Regional and came in third at the Pac-10 Championships. The 2007 season saw the USC men's team place fifth and the women's squad take seventh at the NCAA Championships making the Trojans the only school with both programs finishing in the top 10 for the last three years.

Allice has a career dual meet record of 213-44-1 at five schools, and he has coached more than 275 All-Americans, 20 Olympians, four world record holders and seven American record holders. He takes the storied history of USC track and field very seriously.

"I have a mandate to bring this program to its rightful place," Allice said. "This university is a special place to us all, and we are ready to add another chapter to USC's illustrious history."

Now ready to return to the heights of athletic achievement, USC track and field, as has been the case for 108 glorious years, is in good hands.

Trojan long jumper Randy Williams won the Gold Medal at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich with a jump of 27-4 1/4, which is still a USC freshman record.

Early in the spring of 1966, USC assistant track coach Willie Wilson was found to have terminal cancer. USC's two-mile relay of John Link, Dennis Carr, Bruce Bess and Dave Buck vowed to give him something special to remember and ran 7:14.4 to set a world record at the Los Angeles Coliseum on May 13, 1966.
