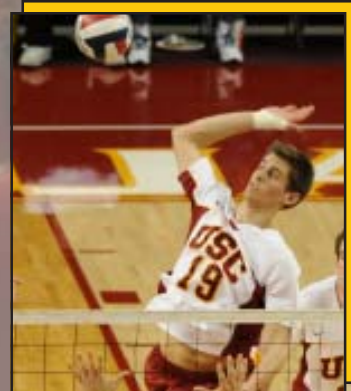

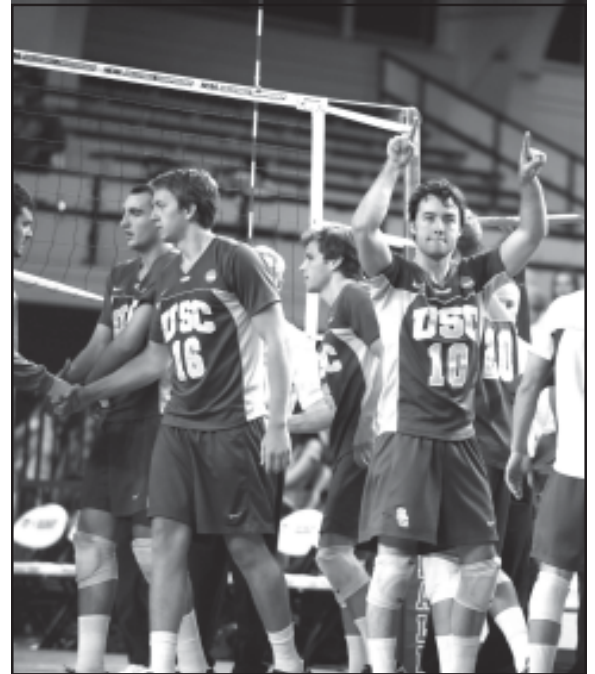


# "We're Back On The Map"

USC: 2009 MPSF Tournament Champions!

Fourth-year USC men's volleyball head coach **Bill Ferguson**, who guided his 2009 team to an amazing, drought-busting run to the NCAA championship match, knows how to stick to a plan.

"When I was hired four years ago, the plan was to get to this point and stay here, where we consistently contend for the NCAA Championship and win it," said Ferguson, who was named the 2009 AVCA and VBall Magazine National Coach of the Year. "Well, we're here, we're back on the volleyball map. Now we've got to close the deal."

Last season, USC—which entered 2009 ranked just seventh in the national poll and sixth in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation poll—won its first-ever MPSF Tournament title. The Trojans went 21-11 overall (their most overall wins since 2001) and tied for fifth-place in the MPSF at 13-9 (their most MPSF victories since 1999). USC advanced to the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991, but lost a 5-set heartbreaker in the final to UC Irvine after defeating defending NCAA champion Penn State in the semifinals.

USC's trip to the MPSF tourney final was its first since 1999 and marked its first back-to-back-to-back appearances in the MPSF playoffs since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001. The squad's No. 2 final national ranking was its highest since 2000.

There were more superlatives in 2009 as the Trojans defeated 7 Top 6-ranked teams. USC's 5-match early-season winning streak was its longest since 2001. USC posted its first back-to-back wins over BYU since 1997-98 and snapped a 14-match losing skid to the Cougars that stretched to 2001. The Trojans posted a third consecutive victory over UCLA, USC's longest such streak over the Bruins since getting 4 in a row in 1980-81. With a 3-0 win over UC Irvine in the MPSF tourney semis, USC also snapped a 10-match losing streak to the Anteaters that dated to 2004 and was the Trojans' first win at Irvine since 2000, ending an 11-match losing string there.

So, it's not a surprise that USC enters the upcoming 2010 season No. 1 in both the AVCA and MPSF coaches pre-season polls (for the first time since 1991). Ferguson believes the top ranking is justified because the Trojans have the horses to win it all.

"We have the experience, size, athleticism and talent to reach our goal of winning the NCAA title," said Ferguson. "As long as we stay healthy, we have as good of a chance as anyone to win it."

"No doubt, we'll have a target on our back this year. We're fine with that, it doesn't scare us."

USC returns 6 tested starters and 13 backups from last year's team. The Trojans only have to replace their libero. There are just 3 seniors on the 22-man roster (none are likely starters), so this squad—which includes 3 heralded true freshmen—should have some staying power.

The Trojans' most decorated player is 6-8 junior opposite hitter **Murphy Troy**, who could contend for National Player of the Year recognition in 2010. The cannon-armed 2-year starter made the All-American first team and All-MPSF first team in 2009, USC's first such honoree in either category since 2000. He hit .319 last spring and led USC in kills (615) and aces (43) while also getting 192 digs and 50 blocks. He set USC rally scoring era season

records for most kills and highest kill average (5.04, eighth best in the nation), as well as for most matches in double figure kills (29) and with 20-plus kills (16). He spent the first half of last season at outside hitter before moving to the opposite hitter spot. After the season, he played on the U.S. Men's Junior National Team that placed eighth at the FIVB World Championships.

"I believe Murphy is going to have a great, great season," said Ferguson. "He very well could be the best player in the country. He's unbelievable at serving and attacking."

USC's duo of imposing 6-8 middle blockers returns and both are honors candidates: senior **Hunter Current** and junior **Austin Zahn**. Current, a 3-year starter with a .366 career hitting percentage, hit .406 in 2009 with 210 kills and had 107 blocks (second on the team), 34 digs and 20 aces. Zahn has hit at a .432 clip as a 2-year starter. Last year, he was an All-American third teamer as he led USC's regulars in hitting (a school rally scoring era season record .446, which was seventh nationally) and had a team-best 115 blocks, plus he added 281 kills, 28 digs and 11 aces. This past summer, he was on the U.S. Men's National A2 team that won a gold medal at the Pan Am Cup.

"Hunter is one of the better attacking middle blockers in the nation and now has really improved his blocking," said Ferguson. "I think he'll have a big senior year. Austin is coming off an outstanding spring and summer. Look for him to be one of the country's most dominant middles. He's just so big and physical."

**Riley McKibbin**, a heady 6-2 junior, returns for his second campaign as the setter and could be in

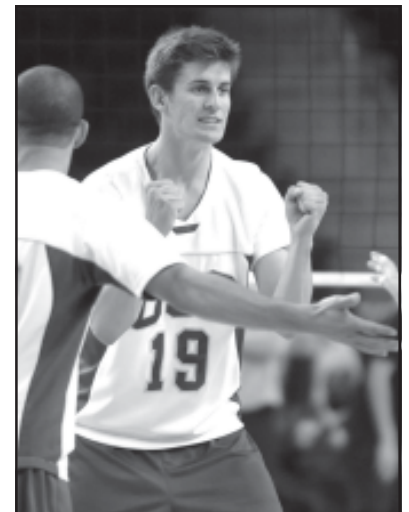
line for post-season honors. His 1,703 assists and 13.85 assists average (third in the nation) in 2009 were USC rally scoring era season standards. He also was second on the Trojans in digs (249), plus he had 69 blocks, 14 aces and 57 kills last year while earning All-American third team notice. He joined Troy and Zahn on the NCAA All-Tournament team.

"Riley is one of the best setters in college and could have an All-American season," said Ferguson. "He's ready to step up his game and put his name among the elite setters in USC history. He's very competitive and instinctive, is a good leader and has a knack for keeping all of our hitters happy."

**Tony Ciarelli**, an explosive 6-6 sophomore honors candidate, is back at outside hitter after a precocious first-year showing last season. The 2009 National Freshman of the Year (USC's first since 1999), he was an All-American second team choice (the first Trojan frosh to make the second team since 1986). He was second on the team in kills (468) and aces (31) and third in digs (195) and blocks (75) last year. He had 27 matches in double kill figures as he hit .277. He was a member of the U.S. Men's Junior National Team that finished eighth at the 2009 FIVB World Championships.

"Tony will carry an even bigger load and make an even greater impact than he did last year," said Ferguson. "We'll ask him to increase his range this year. He's a big-time server and attacker, he has a high volleyball IQ and he's really competitive."

USC is looking to get a full season of play out of its most versatile player, 6-5 junior outside hitter **Tri Bourne**. He missed the first half of each of

his first two seasons because of health issues, but he sparked the Trojans last year when he overcame an early back injury and joined the lineup midseason (allowing Troy to move to opposite hitter). He had 162 kills, 117 digs, 56 blocks and 11 aces while starting the final 14 matches of 2009. He was the third Trojan to spend last summer on the U.S. Men's Junior National Team that was eighth at the FIVB World Championships.

"Tri will be the key to our success in 2010," said Ferguson. "When he joined the lineup last year, that's when our season turned around. The more he's on the court, the better we are. He's our most well-rounded player and he's a very instinctual player."

Another valued contributor from last year, 6-5 junior **Sean Dennis**, returns and is now playing his more natural outside hitter position. He started the first half of 2009 at opposite hitter, but then lost his job when a healthy Bourne returned to the lineup and Troy moved to Dennis' spot. He had 165 kills, 128 digs, 46 blocks and 5 aces while starting the first 17 matches of 2009.

"Sean has taken well to the switch to outside hitter and has done a great job being part of the mix," said Ferguson. "He's a good hitter and defender and is a really positive person. He has a chance to be a big contributor."

Looking to get into the mix at outside hitter is a quartet of high-potential players: 6-4 seniors **Tyler Stevens** and **Matt Knutson**, 6-6 sophomore **Steven Mochalski** and 6-5 first-year freshman **Maddison McKibbin**. Last year, Stevens saw limited action in 9 matches, Knutson in 5 and Mochalski in 6 (mainly as a server). The ambidextrous McKibbin was the MVP of both the 2009 Volleyball Magazine Fab 50 and Mizuno/Volleyball Magazine High School All-American teams as a 3-time All-State choice at Punahou High in Honolulu, Hi. He helped Punahou to 3 state titles. He is the fourth McKibbin to play volleyball at USC, along with his setter brother Riley, an uncle and an aunt.

"Tyler had the best fall showing of any of our players and that puts him very much in the mix for playing time," said Ferguson. "He's good at serving and defense, plus he has great character. Matt also was doing well in the fall, but then was slowed by a back injury. When he gets fully healthy, I expect him to compete for time. Steven also was affected by nagging injuries in the fall and is working his way back. Serving and blocking are his strengths. Maddison will play a big role on this team. He'll compete to not only contribute, but to start on the outside or at opposite. He's that good."

USC must find a new libero, as 4-year starter Luke Morris has graduated. He owns the USC career (1,042) and season (315 in 2009) digs records. He had just 30 reception errors in 965 reception attempts last season.

There are 3 inexperienced liberos vying for Morris' job: 6-3 sophomore **Brad Keenan**, who saw brief action in 14 matches last year, and a pair of players who didn't get on the court in 2009 in 5-10 soph **Andrew Pizula** (he transferred to USC last season from a junior college) and 6-1 redshirt freshman **Clay Knapp**.

"We're still working through the libero position," said Ferguson. "Brad is our best at serve-serve, Andrew is best on defense and setting and

"He had his best fall since he got here, to the point where I expect that he'll contribute at both opposite hitter and middle blocker. Tucker is another great team guy. He has increased his level of play and is in the mix at opposite. Tanner is coming along well in his first year and, although he might redshirt, he should have a nice future here."

Backing up McKibbin at setter will be 5-10 soph **Vince Altamura**, who got into 8 matches last season, and 6-3 first-year freshman **Chris Trefzger**, a 2009 All-American second team and All-CIF Division I first team pick from Mater Dei High in Santa Ana, Calif. Another setter, 6-3 sophomore **Jeff Carlson**, likely will redshirt in 2010 after having surgery last fall for a torn rotator cuff. He played briefly in 3 matches in 2009, then played in last summer's FIVB Junior Beach World Championships.

"Vince and Chris are both young, developing players who are battling to be the backup setter," said Ferguson. "Vince has some experience in our system, while Chris has shown good potential. It's too bad that Jeff is hurt this year because he would figure strongly in that mix."

Besides Morris, USC's only other losses from 2009 were opposite hitter C.J. Schellenberg, who started his first 3 years at USC but was hurt most of last season (he had 832 kills, 294 digs, 191 blocks and 58 aces in his career), and outside hitter Matt Pavlovich, who had 15 career starts but was a backup and serving specialist last year.

USC's entire coaching staff returns intact: offensive coordinator **Brad Keller**, defensive coordinator **Chuck Moore** and volunteer assistant **Rocky Ciarelli** (Tony's father), along with technical coordinator **Jonathan Scott** and administrative assistant **Cameron Green**.

The Trojan men's volleyball heritage is strong, with 12 NCAA Final Four appearances since 1977 that resulted in 4 championships, 7 runner-up trophies and a third-place finish.

After last year's promising showing, the 2010 Trojans hope to leave their own legacy by doing something that hasn't happened at USC in 20 years: capture the NCAA crown.

Battling to see time at middle blocker are a pair of 6-7 sophomores: **Steven Shandrick**, who was the first middle off the bench last spring (he hit .405 with 40 kills and 41 blocks in 17 matches, including 3 starts), and **Ian Wright**, whose only Trojan action was briefly in 1 match last season.

"Steven will make an impact in the middle and should get more playing time this year, even battling for a starting job," said Ferguson. "He's a rising force. We always knew Ian was a good player and he proved it this past fall as he saw a lot of action. He'll help us out this year."

Three players will provide depth at opposite hitter. **Jon Hackett**, a 6-8 senior, has played as a backup in 34 matches in his career. He is one of the school's top student-athlete leaders and is serving as a team captain along with Troy and the elder McKibbin. Then there are 6-4 redshirt freshman **Tucker Peleuses** and 6-5 first-year freshman **Tanner Jansen**, a 2009 prep All-American second team selection out of Santa Margarita High in Rancho Santa Margarita, Calif.

"Jon is a rock as a team leader," said Ferguson.

## Bill Ferguson • Head Coach



It took fourth-year USC men's volleyball head coach Bill Ferguson, one of the game's top young coaches, just 3 seasons to put the Trojans back on the volleyball map. He was promoted to lead the USC program on May 16, 2006.

In 2009 in just his third year at USC, he was named the **AVCA and VBall Magazine National Coach of the Year** as he guided the Trojans to a 21-11 overall mark (USC's most overall wins since 2001) and a fifth-place tie in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation stand-

ings at 13-9 (USC's most MPSF victories since 1999). USC won its first-ever MPSF Tournament title. His Trojans defeated 7 Top 6-ranked teams. He guided USC into the NCAA Championships for the first time since 1991, where it lost a 5-set heartbreaker in the final. He also helped USC to the MPSF tourney final for the first time since 1999 and its first back-to-back-to-back appearances in the MPSF tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001, as well as to its highest national ranking (second) since 2000. USC's 5-match early-season winning streak was its longest since 2001. USC posted its first back-to-back wins over BYU since 1997-98 and snapped a 14-match losing skid to the Cougars that stretched to 2001. His Trojans posted a third consecutive victory over UCLA, USC's longest such streak over the Bruins since getting 4 in a row in 1980-81 (he has a 4-2 coaching mark against UCLA). With a 3-0 win over UC Irvine in the MPSF tourney semis, USC also snapped a 10-match losing streak to the Anteaters that stretched to 2004 and was the Trojans' first win at Irvine since 2000, ending an 11-match losing string there (that 2000 victory was also the last time USC beat UCI in 3 sets). USC also won a pair of pre-season tournaments (in Canada and Hawaii).

In 2008 in his second season at Troy, he led USC to its most overall and league wins since 2001 and its first back-to-back appearances in the MPSF tournament since a 3-year streak from 1999 to 2001. USC was 13-16 overall and 10-12 for eighth place in the MPSF. His Trojans swept UCLA, the first time USC defeated the Bruins twice in a row since 1991 and the first time since 1990 that USC recorded consecutive wins at Pauley Pavilion. And his squad had a 5-game victory at Pepperdine (USC's first victory in Malibu since 1999, snapping a 9-match losing streak there).

In 2007, his first season as head coach, he guided USC to its best season in 6 years. The Trojans had their most overall (12-16) and MPSF (9-13) wins, their highest MPSF finish (eighth) and their first appearance in the MPSF tournament since 2001. USC beat UCLA at Pauley Pavilion for the first time since 2000 and the 3-0 win was its first sweep over the Bruins since 1991, giving Ferguson a victory in his debut against legendary UCLA coach Al Scates. Troy also snapped a 12-match losing streak to Hawaii and did so in Honolulu, its first win there since 1999.

Ferguson, 39, was an assistant at USC in 2006, when he also served as Troy's recruiting coordinator and offensive coordinator in addition to coaching the setters.

In the summer of 2006, he was the head coach of the 2006 USA Volleyball Men's Junior National A2 team.

This is Ferguson's second stint at USC, as he was an assistant for 2 years (1997-98) under head coach Pat Powers.

He was one of the nation's most successful junior volleyball coaches and club directors before returning to USC in the summer of 2005. In his 15 years of coaching experience at the club level, he coached teams to 19 medals (including 12 golds) at national championships and the clubs he directed won 31 medals.

He spent 4 years (2002-05) as the co-owner, director and coach of the Southern California Volleyball Club. He was the head coach of the 2004 boys 18s team that won the gold at the Junior Olympics, as well as the 2002 16s and 2005 17s squads that took home bronzes. His SCVC girls 18s teams won a gold in the Junior Olympics Invitational division in 2003 and a bronze in the National division in 2005. Overall, SCVC teams won 9 medals at national championships.

Before that, he was with the Los Angeles Athletic Club for 5 years (1996-2001). He was the head coach of boys 18s teams that captured golds at the Junior Nationals in 1996 and 1999 and a bronze in 2000. He also was the co-head coach of the 2001 LAAC boys 18 team that won a Junior Nationals silver, and an assistant on the 1997 LAAC boys 16s squad that won a gold. He also coached LAAC men's teams at the U.S. Open National Championships, getting a gold in 1999 and 2001, plus a silver in 2000 (in 2001, he doubled as an assistant with a women's team that won a bronze there). In all, LAAC teams won 15 medals in his tenure there. He also served as an assistant with the USA Youth National Team in 2000 and 2001.

Ferguson began his coaching career as an assistant for the Santa Monica Beach Club for 2 years (1991-92). He helped the boys 14s team to the silver medal at the Junior Nationals in 1991 and the 16s squad to the gold in 1992.

In 1993, he resurrected the Reebok Palisades club that was founded in 1983 by his father. He guided the boys to a pair of gold medals (16s in 1993 and 18s in 1994) and a silver (18s in 1995) at the Junior Nationals and also was an assistant on the 1993 18s team that won a bronze. As club director, Reebok Palisades took home 5 medals at the Junior Nationals.

Among the players he has coached are Olympians Misty May, Brook Billings, Donald Suxho, Gabe Gardner, Jeff Nygaard, Ryan Millar, Brett Winslow and Mark Williams, as well as Brandon Taliaferro and Jimmy Killian. Suxho and Taliaferro were National Players of the Year in 2000.

Ferguson played for Palisades High in Pacific Palisades (Calif.), where he was a member of the 1988 L.A. City championship team. He then took a 2-year hiatus from volleyball. While enrolled at Santa Monica (Calif.) College, he pursued a competitive surfing career, where he was a member of the U.S. Surfing Federation's USA National Team in 1991 and 1992. He competed on the Bud Pro Tour from 1991 to 1995.

He comes from a volleyball family. His father, Tom (a USC graduate), was a 2-time (1961-62) All-American at Santa Monica College, which won the USVBA college national championship both years. His mother, Susie, was an avid volleyball player and helped Tom start the Palisades club team. His brother, Bob, played on the Palisades 17s team that won the 1984 Junior Nationals gold medal.

From 1987 to 1991, Ferguson was a familiar face on the Southern California collegiate volleyball scene, where he served as a linesman for men's and women's matches.

He was born Aug. 24, 1970. He was married in the summer of 2008 to the former Brenn Larson, who played at Washington State and UCLA.

## Brad Keller • Assistant Coach



Brad Keller is in his fourth season as an assistant with the USC men's squad after joining the program in the summer of 2006. He was named the offensive coordinator in 2009.

Keller, 30, came to USC after serving as the owner, director and coach of the successful Bay To Bay boys volleyball club in Northern California for the previous 5 seasons (2000-06). His club won a pair of bronze medals at the Junior Olympics and produced 8 Division I players, including 5 players who he coached.

Three of his pupils played on the USA Volleyball Men's Junior or Youth National Teams, including current Trojan Hunter Current. He also ran the Bay To Bay Summer Camp since 1999.

In the summer of 2006, Keller served as an assistant coach with the USA Volleyball Men's Junior National Team. He then was an assistant with the 2008 USA Volleyball Boys Select A1 Team and head coach of the Boys Select A2 team.

His other coaching experience includes 2 seasons (1995-96) as an assistant with the girls team at Del Mar High in San Jose (Calif.), as each squad won a league title and was the state runnerup, and as the head coach in 1999 of the girls junior high team at Harvard-Westlake High in North Hollywood (Calif.).

Keller has also worked in the printing and graphic design businesses.

He played outside hitter and defensive specialist at Loyola Marymount for 2 seasons (1999-2000) before the school dropped the sport. He received his bachelor's degree in graphic design (with a minor in marketing) from Loyola Marymount in 2002.

He prepped at Bellarmine Prep in San Jose, where as a senior he was the 1998 CIF Central Coast Section MVP as his team won the CIF CCS championship.

He played club volleyball with the Los Angeles Athletic Club team, including the 1996 squad coached by current USC head coach Bill Ferguson that won the silver medal at the Junior Olympics.

His brother, Jarod, was a libero at Stanford.

Born Dec. 30, 1979, he is single.

## Chuck Moore • Assistant Coach



Chuck Moore is in his second stint as an assistant men's volleyball coach at USC, having been rehired in September of 2008. Now in the second year of his second stint at USC, he serves as the defensive coordinator.

Moore, 36, has an extensive coaching background at the college, junior club and pro beach levels.

He was a USC assistant under Pat Powers in 1999 and helped the Trojans to a 24-12 record (their best mark in 8 seasons), a tie for second place in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation and a runner-up finish in the MPSF Tournament to eventual NCAA champion BYU.

Moore, who was a fireman with the St. Petersburg (Fla.) Fire Department from 2003 to 2008, spent 2006 and 2007 as a coach for various teams on the AVP tour. In 2003, he was a coach with the Tampa Bay Juniors Volleyball Club, while in 2002 he coached with the Southern California Volleyball Club.

In 2000, he and current USC head coach Bill Ferguson led the Los Angeles Athletic Club Boys 18 and 14 teams to bronze medals at the Junior Olympics. He coached the LAAC's 14 team in 1999.

In 1994 and 1995, he guided the Seaside Volleyball Club 18 team (the 1995 squad was fourth at the Junior Olympics), then he coached the Torrance Volleyball Club's 16 team in 1996.

He was also an accomplished player.

From 2000 to 2007, he played in various pro beach tournaments, including 9 AVP events. His best AVP finish was 17<sup>th</sup> place at the 2002 Huntington Beach tourney with partner Ed Rattledge.

He was a member of the Los Angeles Athletic Club's national championship team at the 1999 USA Volleyball Men's Open Championships and the silver medalist squad in 2000. Both teams were coached by Ferguson.

He was a back row specialist at Long Beach State in 1995 and 1996 (the 1996 team was ranked second nationally).

Before that, Moore starred at Grossmont College in El Cajon, Calif., earning All-Conference honorable mention notice in 1993 and J.C. All-American first team honors in 1994 as a middle blocker (he captained the 1994 team).

A native of Clearwater, Fla., where he attended Largo High, he was the 1992 Florida Player of the Year while playing for the Florida Asics club team. He also played baseball at Largo.

He earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from Long Beach State in 1997. He also did work towards a master's degree in education while at USC in 1999.

Before his first stint at USC, he worked in private business for a year.

He was born on Aug. 18, 1973. He and his wife, Kim (a cousin of former Trojan volleyballer Eric Seiffert), have a daughter, Hunter, 3.

# Rocky Ciarelli • Volunteer Assistant Coach



Rocky Ciarelli is in his second year as a volunteer assistant coach with the USC men's team.

He coached boys and girls high school volleyball for 27 years, including 24 (1985-2008) at Huntington Beach (Calif.) High after 3 seasons (1982-84) at Edison High in Huntington Beach. He had a career record of 353-157 with the boys and 194-99 with the girls. He won the CIF title with the boys in 1993 and 1994 and the CIF and state crowns with the girls in 1996.

He also coached on the club level, twice winning the gold medal in the boys 18s at the Junior Olympics (in 1979 with TD Properties and in 2008 with Balboa Bay Club).

He was an All-CIF player at Huntington Beach High before playing at Long Beach State (1977-79). He was inducted into the LBSU men's volleyball's inaugural Wall of Honor class in 2006. He also was an assistant coach there in 1980.

He played some pro beach volleyball in the 1980s and competed in numerous indoor USVBA Opens.

His son, Tony, is a sophomore outside hitter at USC. His wife, Cammy (Chalmers), played at UCLA (1979-82) and then won 14 pro beach tournaments in the early 1990s (mainly with Holly McPeak) before coaching the sport at Huntington Beach (Calif.) High.

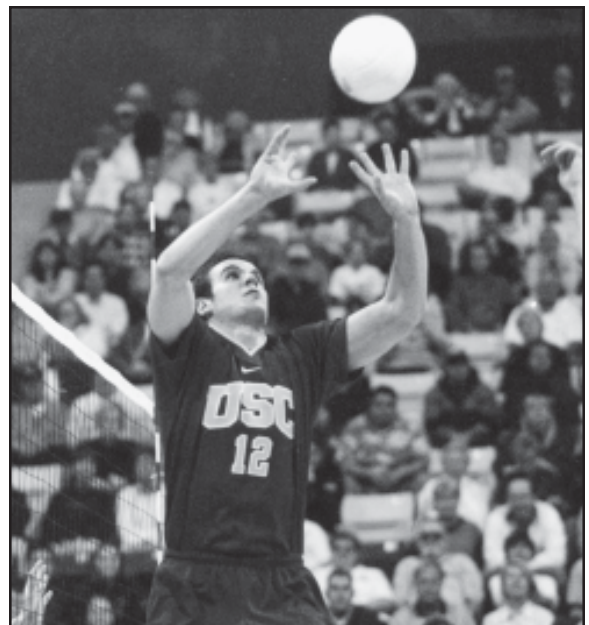
**Tom Duke**

## AN ERA OF EXCELLENCE

Since volleyball scholarships were first awarded at USC in 1976-77, the USC men's and women's teams have combined to become a dominant force in the sport. The men have captured 4 national titles and played in 12 Final Fours in the last 33 years, while the women have won 6 national crowns and played in 10 Final Fours since 1976. The men have a winning percentage of .621 in that span (633-386), while the women are at .740 (801-281-4).

**1976-77:** After the Trojan women won the national title in the fall of 1976, the men made it a USC sweep when they won the NCAA championship in the spring. The Trojans finished 18-1 with a team that included future Olympians Celso Kalache and Dusty Dvorak, and future coach Bob Yoder. This was the year that volleyball scholarships were first awarded at USC.

**1977-78:** Though the women won their second straight national crown, the men fell short of a second straight title when they were stopped by Long Beach State in the NCAA regionals and finished 14-7.

**1978-79:** Ernie Hix's squad rebounded to reach the Final Four again, where Troy downed Rutgers-Newark but fell to host UCLA in the final. USC began the season with wins in its first eight matches and finished 23-5 overall.

**1979-80:** The Trojans avenged the previous season's NCAA final loss to UCLA by beating the Bruins in the title game this time. Tim Hovland, Dusty Dvorak and Pat Powers all were named first team All-Americans as the Trojans won their second NCAA crown in four years. Troy was 22-6 overall.

**1980-81:** For the third straight year and the fourth time in five seasons, the Trojans made an appearance in the NCAA title match. Their bid for a second straight crown fell short, though, when UCLA won in five games, the fifth 15-13. The Trojans were 21-5 overall in Ernie Hix's last season as coach, winning the California Intercollegiate Volleyball Association title along the way. USC's women won the national title that season.

**1981-82:** Under new head coach Bob Yoder, himself a former player at Troy, USC reached the Final Four for the fourth straight year. Though the Trojans were stunned by host Penn State in the semifinals, Yoder's first team still finished 22-10 overall and third in the nation. The Women of Troy, meanwhile, captured a second straight national championship.

**1982-83:** USC found itself in the unusual position of rebuilding, and for the first time in the decade failed to make the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season 14-13. The Trojan women were second in the country.

**1983-84:** USC rebounded from its mediocre 1983 season, winning its first six matches en route to a 29-13 overall mark. Only a loss in the finals of the NCAA Western Regional kept the Trojans from another Final Four trip.

**1984-85:** After a two-year hiatus, the Trojans returned to the Final Four and finished second in the nation. First team All-Americans Bill Yardley and Adam Johnson led USC to a 28-9 record and a spot in the NCAA title game, where Troy was stopped by Pepperdine, 15-13, in the match's deciding game.

**1985-86:** After the Women of Troy finished third nationally, Yoder's squad began its season with a loss at UCLA in the Kilgour Cup, then ran off 27 straight victories, including an unprecedented 20 without a blemish in the CIVA. Only a heartbreaking five-game loss to Pepperdine in the closest NCAA final ever (the fifth and deciding game was 16-14) kept the Trojans from a national title in a 27-2 season. College Player of the Year Adam Johnson led Troy, which was in the Final Four for the seventh time in 10 years.

**1986-87:** For the third year in a row, USC was the NCAA runner-up, losing in the final to UCLA (no other school in the country had been to the Final Four each of those years). Featuring 3-time All-American Adam Johnson and second team All-American Dave Yoder (the coach's brother), USC's 29 victories (29-11) equalled a school season record.

**1987-88:** After three straight second-place finishes in the NCAA tourney, USC won the national championship (the school's third). The Trojans set a school victory record by going 34-4 and were led by the likes of College Player of the Year Tom Duke, All-American Jen-Kai Liu, College Freshman of the Year Bryan Ivie and third team All-American Chris Martz. The Women of Troy, after a year layoff, advanced into the NCAA tourney.

**1988-89:** For the first time in 5 years, USC didn't advance to the NCAA Final Four. The Trojans, 28-11 overall, finished tied for fourth in the WIVA and lost to Stanford in the NCAA regional. Although all but one player returned from the 1988 NCAA titlists, injuries to 3 starters hampered Troy's hopes.

**1989-90:** Although it lost in the semifinals of the WIVA Tournament, USC was selected to an NCAA tourney berth ... and made the most of it. The Trojans, 26-7 overall, won their fourth NCAA title. Under the guidance of first-year coach Jim McLaughlin, USC's senior-less team was led by College Player of the Year Bryan Ivie, second team All-Americans Dan Greenbaum and Kevin Shepard, and Freshman All-American Jason Perkins. The women also had a new coach, Lisa Love, who led them into the NCAA playoffs.

**1990-91:** USC spent all year ranked No. 1 nationally and had a school-record 30-match win streak en route to a 34-2 record (tying the Trojan season win mark), but Troy lost in the NCAA final to Long Beach State. USC, the nation's top hitting team, lost only 21 games. Bryan Ivie won College Player of the Year honors again and Dan Greenbaum was a first team All-American.

**1991-92:** For the first time since scholarships were awarded in the sport at USC (1977), the young (no seniors, four frosh/soph starters) Trojans finished with a sub-.500 record (11-13). It was USC's fewest wins since 1976. The Women of Troy, however, went 23-8 to advance into the NCAAs.

**1992-93:** For the second consecutive year, USC didn't advance to the NCAA Final Four (only the second such two-year occurrence since scholarships were awarded in the sport at Troy in 1977). But the Trojans were improved, posting an 18-12 overall mark. Sophomore Jason Mulholland, who set NCAA records for most kills in a match (55) and highest kill average in a season (7.67), was a second team All-American, while Jason Perkins closed out his career with USC's highest all-time hitting percentage (.430). USC's women went 21-9 and were an NCAA tourney team.

**1993-94:** USC started off 10-0 and ranked No. 2 nationally, but leveled off to finish with a 17-7 NCAA mark (23-8 overall). It was the first time in the school's scholarship-era history that it went three years without a Final Four visit. Jason Mulholland and Chris Underwood were first team All-Americans. The Women of Troy, 22-9 overall, advanced to the NCAA second round.

**1994-95:** USC — with just one senior — began the season at 11-5, but won just five of its next 17 matches to finish at 16-17 overall (11-14 NCAA). USC's women went 22-8 and made it to the NCAA regional finals.

**1995-96:** For the first time since 1983, USC didn't qualify for a berth in the conference tournament. The Trojans were 14-16 overall (10-12 NCAA). The Women of Troy were 18-9 and advanced to the NCAA regional semis.

**1996-97:** Pat Powers — the one-time USC All-American, Olympic gold medalist and pro beach star — took over as Troy's head coach. He guided the Trojans to an 18-14 record (12-12 NCAA), but they failed to advance to the conference tourney for the second year in a row. USC's women went 21-9 and made it to the NCAA regional semifinals.

**1997-98:** In Powers' second season, USC finished 17-17 (11-15 NCAA) but missed out on the MPSF Tournament by one game. In the fall, the Women of Troy made it to the NCAA Pacific Region semifinals and had a record of 23-6, the squad's most wins since 1991.

**1998-99:** A senior-less USC team came within a victory of advancing to the NCAA Final Four, losing in the MPSF Tourney championship to host and top-ranked BYU. But the Trojans finished strong with wins over No. 7 Hawaii, No. 4 Pepperdine and No. 2 Long Beach State before the BYU loss. USC finished 24-12 (17-11 NCAA) and ranked No. 7. All-American setter Donald Suxho's 63 aces was a school season record and Brook Billings was the MPSF Freshman of the Year. USC's women went 24-6 in the fall and made the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

**1999-2000:** For the second straight year, USC was 1 win away from the NCAA Final Four, losing in the MPSF Tourney semis to Pepperdine. Troy went 26-6 overall (No. 4 in final poll) and, for the first time since 1991, won a share of the MPSF Pacific Division title at 16-3. USC went 14-0 at home, was ranked No. 1 nationally for 2 weeks near season's end, twice beat a No. 1 team (Long Beach State and UCLA, to break a 13-match losing streak to the Bruins). The Women of Troy went 21-9 and got into the NCAA's second round.

**2000-01:** The Women of Troy went 29-3 and advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the first time since 1985, losing in the semifinals. The Trojan men, with 5 starters returning, then went 15-11 and qualified for the MPSF tourney with a 10-7 record.

**2001-02:** USC's women were 25-4 and got to the NCAA regional final. USC's men struggled through their most difficult season, going 6-22 overall (and finished 11th in the MPSF with a 3-19 mark). Troy set school records for most losses, as well as most consecutive overall and MPSF losses (11).

**2002-03:** The Women of Troy went 31-1 and captured their fifth national championship, while Turhan Douglas took over the men's program and went just 6-25 (a school record for losses in a season) in his first year.

**2003-04:** USC's women had a perfect 35-0 season en route to their sixth national title (second consecutive). The Trojan men posted their third straight 6-win season (this time 6-23) while tying school records for most consecutive overall and MPSF losses (11) and setting the consecutive home loss mark (8).

**2004-05:** The Women of Troy went 23-6 and advanced to their third consecutive NCAA Final Four, losing in the semis. USC's men, hampered by injuries throughout the year, were 7-23.

**2005-06:** After USC's women forged a 17-11 record and advanced to the NCAA second round, the Trojan men posted an 11-18 mark (their best since 2001), including wins over UCLA and Pepperdine to break 6- and 5-year losing streaks to those teams.

**2006-07:** The USC women went 27-5 and made it to the NCAA third round. The Trojan men, under new head coach Bill Ferguson, had their best season since 2001, going 12-16 overall and 9-13 in the MPSF for eighth place to qualify for the conference tournament. Along the way, Troy had its first 3-game win over UCLA since 1991 and first win at Hawaii since 1999.

**2007-08:** The Women of Troy made it to the NCAA Final Four (losing in the semifinal match), finishing at 29-5. USC's men had their most overall (13) and league (10) wins since 2001, their first repeat MPSF tourney visit since 2001, their first victory at Pepperdine since 1999 and their first consecutive wins over UCLA since 1991 (and first consecutive wins at UCLA since 1990).

**2008-09:** The USC women went 17-12 and got to the NCAA second round. The Trojan men, after tying for fifth in the MPSF, re-emerged onto the volleyball map by winning their first MPSF Tournament and advancing to the NCAAs for the first time since 1991 (they lost in the final to UC Irvine, 3-2).

### USC'S SETTERS AND THE 5-1 SYSTEM

USC was one of the earliest proponents of the 5-1 offense in college volleyball. Much of the Trojans' success over the years — four NCAA crowns, seven runners-up placings and a third-place finish — can be attributed to the 5-1 offense.

The 5-1, which features only one setter handling the entire offensive scheme, has long been recognized internationally as the premier offensive system. With the success of the U.S. men's National Team, which uses the system, all of today's college teams have gravitated to the 5-1.

USC began with the system in the early 1970s with Carlos Fonseca at setter (1973-74-75). Although three players shared the setting position in 1976 (Gary Fiset, Brent Peterson and Alan Rosehill), the Trojans have had only 13 setters since then: Dusty Dvorak (1977-78-79-80), Bill Stetson (1981-82), Rudy Dvorak (1983-84-85-86), Mike Lauterman (1987-88), Dan Greenbaum (1989-90-91), Ty Price and Aaron Boone in 1992, Price and Steve Loeswick in 1993, Loeswick in 1994-96, Donald Suxho in 1997-2000, Miles McGann in 2001 and 2003, McGann and J.T. Gilmour in 2002, Gilmour in 2004, Jimmy Killian in 2005-08 and Riley McKibbin in 2009.

The accomplishments of these setters are a testament to the efficiency and effectiveness of the system as employed by USC. During Dusty Dvorak's tenure, the Trojans won two national championships (1977-80). Under the guidance of coach Ernie Hix, and with the talent and creativity of Dvorak, much of the playset offense and quick transition attack was developed. The USC system combined the quickness of the Japanese and the playset options and back-row attack of the Polish teams (both were Olympic gold medal winners). The USA National Team adopted the system when Dvorak moved there. As the setter, Dvorak led the U.S. to international dominance and an eventual gold medal in the 1984 Olympics. He is still recognized as perhaps the best setter ever produced in the U.S.

Bill Stetson set the Trojans to the NCAA Final Four in 1981-82. He proved himself internationally as the setter for West Germany's 1988 national champions. And Stetson was the starting setter for this country's most successful club team, Molten America, guiding his squad to several national championships. Rudy Dvorak, an All-American in 1986, brought USC back to collegiate volleyball prominence with two NCAA runners-up finishes in 1985-86. He has since trained with the U.S. National Team, and played internationally in Italy and professionally on the beach. Mike Lauterman, a walk-on surprise, set USC in the 1987 and 1988 NCAA Finals, guiding Troy to its third NCAA title (1988) when he was named to the NCAA All-Tournament team.

Dan Greenbaum took over the setting reins in 1989 and helped the Trojans win the 1990 NCAA crown. He was an All-American for the 1991 NCAA runners-up and then was with the U.S. Olympic team. First-time Trojan Ty Price handled most of the setting duties in 1992, while first-year freshman Steve Loeswick took over for Price in mid-1993 and continued on solely in 1994, 1995 and 1996. Donald Suxho of Albania started at setter for 4 years (1997-2000), earning National Player of the Year honors in 2000 before joining the U.S. Olympic squad. He was succeeded in 2001 and 2003 by Miles McGann (McGann and J.T. Gilmour handled the duty in 2002). Gilmour (along with Gio Altamura at times) was the 2004 setter. Jimmy Killian took over in 2005 through 2008 (Gilmour filled in at times in 2005). Riley McKibbin inherited the job in 2009, getting the Trojans their first NCAA berth since 1991.

**USC IN THE NCAA AND MPSF**

USC has been one of the most successful teams in college volleyball over the last 33 years. The Trojans won the NCAA title in 1977, 1980, 1988 and 1990, finished second in 1979, 1981, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1991 and 2009, and placed third in 1982.

Four teams are selected each year to compete in the NCAA Championship. A representative is selected from the East, Midwest and West, plus one at-large team.

The 12-member men's volleyball version of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation was a merger of the three largest conferences in the West — the Pac-10, Big West and Western Athletic — along with several independents. The MPSF, formerly the Western Intercollegiate Volleyball Association, was formed in 1993 to pool resources in several non-revenue sports and yet maintain a high level of competition.

Schools play a 22-match MPSF schedule, playing each team twice, with overall records against MPSF teams counting toward selection to the postseason eight-team MPSF Tournament. The teams are seeded, with the tourney winner getting the West Region's automatic NCAA berth.

In all but 3 of the 40 years of the NCAA tourney, the national champ has come from the MPSF (or its predecessor conferences)!

**USC'S 1949 AND 1950 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS**

In 1949 and 1950, USC fielded a men's volleyball team (although not under the athletic department's jurisdiction)...and those squads won the first two USVBA Collegiate National Championships ever held. In the 1949 event in Los Angeles, the Trojans defeated Stanford in the final, 15-4, 15-2. Then, in 1950, Troy beat the University of Mexico for the title in Knoxville, Tenn., 13-9, 14-8. Hans Vogel coached USC to both crowns. USC's Dick Archer and Ray Solari were named All-American first teamers in 1949 and Robbie Duron and Don Patterson were so honored in 1950. The team disbanded in 1951.

**USC'S 1949 USVBA CHAMPIONS**

USC's 1949 men's volleyball team, although not under the jurisdiction of the athletic department, captured the first-ever USVBA Collegiate National Championship. The event was held in Los Angeles that year and the Hans Vogel-coached Trojans beat Stanford in the final, 15-4, 15-2. Dick Archer and Ray Solari were named All-American first teamers.

**USC'S 1950 USVBA CHAMPIONS**

USC followed up its 1949 USVBA Collegiate National Championship with a repeat title in 1950. Hans Vogel took his Trojans (still not under the auspices of the athletic department) to the final in Knoxville, Tenn., where they beat the University of Mexico, 13-9, 14-8. Robbie Duron and Don Patterson made the All-American first team. The team disbanded in 1951.

### USC'S 1977 NCAA CHAMPIONS



In the year that USC first awarded volleyball scholarships, head coach Ernie Hix's Trojans went 18-1 with a team that featured future Olympians Celso Kalache (Brazil) and Dusty Dvorak (USA) and future USC head coach Bob Yoder. After beating Rutgers Newark in the NCAA semifinal, USC defeated Ohio State in 4 games (15-11, 9-15, 15-10, 15-12) to win its first NCAA Championship. Kalache and Yoder were All-American first team picks, while Dvorak and Steve Obradovich were All-American second teamers. Kalache was the NCAA All-Tournament team MVP.

### USC'S 1980 NCAA CHAMPIONS



The Trojans and head coach Ernie Hix found themselves in their third Final Four in 4 years. USC defeated UCLA in four games (15-7, 6-15, 15-13, 15-8) to win its second NCAA Championship. Troy (22-6), one of the best teams in college volleyball history, featured 3 future Olympic gold medalists (Dusty Dvorak, Steve Timmons and Pat Powers) and a 3-time All-American first teamer (Tim Hovland). Powers went on to coach the Trojans from 1997 to 2002. Hovland, Dvorak and Powers were All-American first team selections that year, with Dvorak earning NCAA All-Tournament team MVP honors.

**USC'S 1988 NCAA CHAMPIONS**



After being down two games to none in the NCAA Championship match, USC head coach Bob Yoder subbed Lawrence Hom into the lineup...and Hom sparked one of the greatest comebacks in NCAA history as Troy won the next three games to defeat UC Santa Barbara, 15-17, 14-16, 15-10, 15-11, 15-9, en route to the school's third NCAA Championship (after three straight NCAA Championship runnerup seasons). The Trojans (34-4) were led by All-American first teamer and NCAA All-Tournament team MVP Jen-Kai Liu, All-American first teamer and College Player of the Year Tom Duke and College Freshman of the Year Bryan Ivie.

**USC'S 1990 NCAA CHAMPIONS**



The Trojans (26-7), under the guidance of first-year head coach Jim McLaughlin, were in their 10th Final Four in 13 years. Troy's lineup of future Olympians Bryan Ivie, Dan Greenbaum and Nick Becker defeated Long Beach State, 15-10, 12-15, 15-4, 15-6, to win its fourth NCAA Championship. Ivie was honored as an All-American first teamer, College Player of the Year and NCAA All-Tournament team MVP. Greenbaum, Kevin Shepard and Freshman All-American Jason Perkins joined Ivie on the NCAA All-Tournament team.

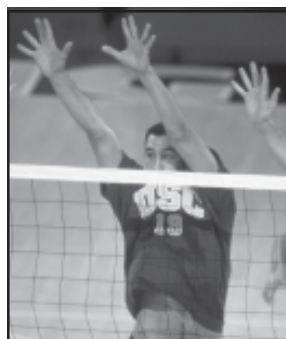

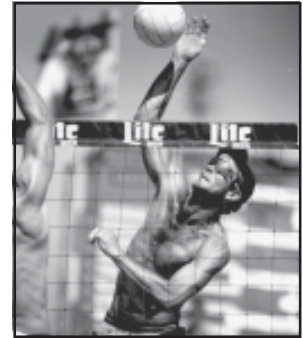
**ALL-ERA TEAMS**
