The one thing that we try to do is we try to make sure that they understand that they can't do it divided."

This powerful statement from first year head coach **Keidane McAlpine**, the reigning Pac-12 Coach of the Year, stands out. McAlpine, along with his assistants **Jen Klein** and **Jason Lockhart** are trying to instill the idea of family and unity into the talented USC women's soccer side in 2014, and so far it seems to be taking hold.

"Everything we talk about, on and off the field, is about how each decision made individually affects the collective group," said McAlpine, who is entering his first season at Troy since coming from Washington State in December 2013. "We really try to lock that concept into everything that we do. We dance, we sing, we cut up, we laugh, but all of our decisions, what we are trying to get the group to do on and off the field has to come back to the team. I think that is one of the biggest things that they had, but they didn't know how to take it to another level. Now in doing so the fitness is different, the attitude in training is different, and we as a coaching staff try to bring an up-tempo, happy feeling to training. There most definitely is still a standard, but it is still enjoyable."

This new-found, team-above-all attitude for the Women of Troy was instilled during spring training sessions and has definitely carried over into the team's preseason workouts, which started on August 6.

McAlpine said, "They took the message from the spring very personal. They understand what we are trying to accomplish, they understand the challenge in front of them and they rose to it. The majority of them came in and passed the beep test (multi-stage fitness running test) the first time through, which is unbelievable. They smashed it. It is very refreshing as a coach to come in and start work on the X's and O's and the tactical pieces and not having to worry about losing players because they aren't fit enough to make it through training. This might be one of the most athletic teams I have ever had, so that is an exciting part for us."

In 2013, the Women of Troy finished with an overall record of 8-10-2 and were 3-7-1 to finish 11th in the Pac-12. The team was on the verge last year, playing 11 one-goal games, but finishing with a frustrating 3-8 record in those contests. This year's team returns 19 seasoned student-athletes from last year's squad, including seven starters.

The mood surrounding the program is different this year, and it is palpable throughout the Pac-12. In a preseason poll of the coaches around the conference, McAlpine's squad was picked to finish fourth, behind reigning national champion UCLA, and perennial standouts Stanford and California.

On the preseason poll selection, McAlpine said, "We are really flattered by the fourth place preseason ranking, but the reality for us is that we haven't stepped on the field, we haven't proven that that is a reality for us and until we do so, we are still the eleventh place team in the league.

There are a lot of quality teams in this league and as the former coach of Washington State, I believe that team deserves to be ahead of us. Utah and Colorado, they had such great seasons last year and they deserve to be ahead of us. Until we go out and prove that we deserve to be the fourth place team and belong in the upper half of this league, we are still the eleventh place team with a lot of work to do and that is how we are going to go about our business."

And go to work this team has. McAlpine worked in the spring to instill his style of play, while focusing on areas on need from last season, such as shoring up the defense.

"We definitely want to have a style that fans that come can be excited by" McAlpine explained. "Something where we attack teams, we play with a passion and a desire that is worthy of them coming to watch us over and over again. We want to entertain them by showing that we are going to come and compete. It really is an attacking style, although our focus this year has to be taking care of the defensive side. We gave up 27 goals last year and it is something that they are well aware of."

In 2014 the Trojans defense will be shored up by standout goalkeeper **Caroline Stanley**, who will be one of the team's senior leaders.

On Stanley, McAlpine said, "Caroline coming back has been solid. She is the number one today. We have added a couple of goalkeepers to help in training and raise the level, but she still is the standout goalkeeper. We are going to simplify some things for her and I think she is going to have an outstanding season for us. She will definitely lead this team, hopefully as a slightly more focused Caroline."

Despite losing a few players on the back line from last season, the Women of Troy return quite a few from last spring, most notably All-Pac-12 and Freshman All-Pac-12 selection **Mandy Freeman**. According to McAlpine, Freeman has been solid, clean and composed in the preseason. She will be joined on the defensive line by redshirt sophomore Dominique Randle, whose USC career so far has been marred by injury, but finally healthy she is ready to compete in a big way for the Women of Troy.

The midfield is set to be anchored by juniors **Erin Owen**, **Jamie Fink** and **Natalie Donaldson**, who have impressed McAlpine with their chemistry and ball movement since the spring.

Up front, McAlpine projects the team's goals to come by committee, as there are a slew of capable goal scorers in the stables.

"**Katie Johnson** has been the player with probably the most accolades as far as playing up top, but **Megan Borman** can add goals and **Savannah Levin** can add goals. Probably the surprise of preseason has been **Tamara Mejia**. She has done her business this preseason and she will get some good minutes up there, which will be exciting," McAlpine added.

Two other senior leaders for the Trojans, **Alex Quincey** and **Jessica Musmanno**, offer versatility for the Trojans and are expected to be impact players in 2014.

"Quincey is one of those players that can play pretty much anywhere,



so we just have to fit her in with what we are doing. We are training her in all three lines," said McAlpine. She will definitely play and she will be a leader. Same thing with another senior, Jessica Musmanno. She will play and be a leader for us; it just depends on what line. They are so versatile, it makes it easy for us as coaches to put the rest of the pieces out there and then figure out how to fit them in, and that is how we are going to use them."

McAlpine has another versatile piece in standout sophomore, **Kayla Mills**, who was the team leader in points in 2013 with 16 (4 goals, 8 assists) and earned Pac-12 All-Freshman team honors.

"Kayla is such a dynamic player. She is so versatile as well, and we have tried her in the back line and in the middle. She is another one that will contribute in a big way, we will just have to figure out where she comes from."

Joining the 19 returners are 10 newcomers, led by UNC transfer **Reilly Parker**, who gives the team another dimension with her pace and experience. The nine true freshmen are finding their way, with three freshmen that have really stepped up at the beginning being **Nicole Molen**, **Sydney Sladek** and **Sydney Johnson**.

This year's schedule allows for Coach McAlpine to see the makeup of the team right away, as they will be battle-tested with two-straight weekends on the road to open up the season. The Trojans will compete in the USD Tournament, opening up play on August 22 against southern California power Long Beach State, before facing host and recent-rival USD on August 24. The team then heads out to play in the Notre Dame Tournament, where they will face an up-and-coming Iowa State team and perennial power Notre Dame.

"It's a perfect way to start to be fair. We just went on our retreat and I think that was a chance for us to learn how to travel together. I think for this group, the reality is they need how to compete. And sometimes that uncomfortable feeling of the road is a great place to do it," explained McAlpine."

"Looking at the caliber of opponents, Long Beach has been one of the best teams in So Cal for a number of years and USD against USC always seems to be a rivalry that has played. That weekend and its intensity will prepare us for the next weekend where we go to Notre Dame and play an Iowa State team that is rebuilding itself like us and a Notre Dame team that is strong and always has been, even though they have a new coach. It will tell us a lot about ourselves. The way we start on the road against tough competition will definitely be the building block for what we do over the back end of the season."

Along with the new team-first mantra, McAlpine and his staff understand that this road won't be without its challenges and tribulations, and they are quick to remind the team that soccer is a game of mistakes.

"Mistakes happen, but how are you going to respond to them? We equate that to life too, said McAlpine. "You are going to make mistakes,

it happens, but there is a way to set the bar extremely high and push everyday to really get better and achieve at a very high rate."

"I think they are hungry to take USC to the level that they perceive it to be and want it to be, stated McAlpine. "Everything that they have done to this point and what we have brought to them has been to bring this program back to where it should be. And it starts with this team. I think with the senior leadership group, they have been very focused and really enjoying the challenge."



McAlister Field

Beginning with the 1998 season, the USC women's soccer team no longer had to share a practice field with the football team, as the Women of Troy received a field all their own. Thanks to a \$150,000 donation from Hobart and Soni McAlister, a new field was built on the corner of 30th and Hoover. During the 2000 season, a permanent scoreboard was installed.

USC boasts a 76-34-11 (.674) record at McAlister Field, with the 2002 season representing the first time that every regular-season home game was played at the facility. Before 2002, several games were held at the Los Angeles Coliseum, and the Trojans have played a few select games at the Coliseum as well in the past six years.



Keidane McAlpine



Keidane McAlpine, the 2013 Pac-12 and NSCAA Pacific Region Coach of the Year, was named the new head coach of the USC women's soccer team on Dec. 16, 2013.

McAlpine comes to Troy after serving the past two seasons (2012-13) as head coach at Washington State, where he guided the Cougars to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances and a program-best second place finish in the Pac-12 in 2013.

"We conducted a national search with a great pool of candidates, and Keidane really stood out with his vision of what he wants to bring to the USC soccer program," USC athletic director Pat Haden said of McAlpine. "He has already shown his ability to coach and succeed at the highest level, and his experience as a head coach in the Pac-12 is a big plus. We believe he is uniquely qualified to lead USC back to the successful level that we expect for our soccer program."

"Thank you to Pat Haden, Max Nikias and Steve Lopes for the opportunity to come to such a prestigious institution," McAlpine said. "I'm excited to get to work and be a part of the Trojan family. I thank (WSU president) Elson Floyd, (WSU Director of Athletics) Bill Moos and (WSU Senior Associate AD/SWA) Anne McCoy for all their wonderful support and guidance. It was great to work with the student-athletes at Washington State, and I thank them for their hard work and dedication. I'm looking forward to working with a new set of women with the goal of bringing the national championship back to USC."

Keidane (kuh-DAWN-ee) McAlpine (mik-AL-pine) becomes the fourth USC women's soccer head coach, replacing Ali Khosroshahin, who spent the past seven years (2007-13) at Troy. The Women of Troy won the 2007 NCAA Championship and have made 12 NCAA appearances, but have not reached the postseason since 2010.

This past season at Washington State, McAlpine's Cougars tied the program record for victories with a 14-3-4 mark. His team and players set or tied 27 school records. In his first season at WSU, McAlpine went 6-4-1 in Pac-12 play and finished up 12-6-2 overall in reaching the 2012 NCAA Tournament. In his two years in Pullman, McAlpine saw one Cougar named an NSCAA All-American and Pac-12 Player of the Year while picking up his own selection as the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year. In those two years, McAlpine coached six Cougars to All-Pac-12 honor rolls. Considered an offensive-minded coach, McAlpine showed his defensive savvy while at WSU as the Cougars finished 2013 ranked No. 7 in the nation with only 11 goals allowed.

Prior to Washington State, McAlpine spent six years (2006-11) as an assistant at Auburn, helping the Tigers to NCAA appearances each season along with three SEC West titles.

A 1997 graduate of Birmingham-Southern College, he spent three seasons (1998-2000) as an assistant women's coach before taking over as his alma mater's head women's coach in 2001 for the program's first season of NCAA competition following participation at the NAIA level. In 2004, McAlpine's fourth season as head coach at Birmingham-Southern, the team won the Big South championship and reached the NCAA Tournament, helping secure McAlpine honors as the Big South Coach of the Year. He helped develop 12 all-conference selections and a

Big South Freshman of the Year recipient as the Panthers went 40-48-11 (.460) in the first five seasons (2001-05) in NCAA play. As an assistant at BSC during the Panthers' NAIA years, he helped the team to its first NAIA Tournament in 2000.

In all, McAlpine has spent seven seasons as a head coach (five at Birmingham-Southern, two at Washington State), having accumulated a 66-57-17 (.532) record at the helm of those two programs, with three NCAA appearances.

Active in Olympic Development Program for many years, McAlpine is currently on the Region IV staff with the '99 age group. He also worked in Region III as head coach for the U-13 group and was on the U-14 staff in the summer of 2010 after joining the U-13 staff in the summer of 2009. McAlpine holds a National "A" Coaching License from the United States Soccer Federation and a National Goalkeeping License. He was actively involved as a coach with the Alabama Youth Soccer Association Olympic Development Program and several club teams. In the summer of 2004, he was selected as a staff coach for the USYSA Region III squad.

McAlpine was a four-year starter at Birmingham-Southern and was team captain in 1996. During that season, the Panthers finished as runners-up in the NAIA Tournament after advancing to the semifinals the previous season. After graduation, McAlpine spent the 1999 season playing for the Tennessee Rhythm of the A League.

A native of Huntsville, Ala., McAlpine earned a bachelor's degree in music business with a minor in computer science from Birmingham-Southern in 1997.

Jen Klein



USC's new head women's soccer coach Keidane McAlpine has added Jennifer Klein as an assistant coach to his staff for the upcoming 2014 season.

Klein comes to Troy after spending the past two seasons as an assistant at Washington State under McAlpine, where the program twice advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

"I'm super excited to bring such a highly qualified coach and person to USC with me," McAlpine stated. "Her teaching ability and her experience in this conference will go a long way in bringing us success. Jen was a perfect fit in my coaching staff when she first joined me, and I'm so happy that she is coming back for more."

In 2013, the Cougars tied the program records for victories with a 14-3-4 mark, as the team and players set or tied 27 school records. Under McAlpine and with the help of Klein, the Cougars finished the season ranked No. 7 in the nation with only 11 goals allowed. In 2012, the Cougars went 6-4-1 in Pac-12 play and finished up 12-6-2 overall.

Prior to her time in Pullman, Klein spent five seasons at UNLV, assuming the post of head coach for her final two seasons. At the time she was named head coach prior to the 2010 campaign, Klein was the youngest head coach in NCAA Division I women's soccer.

In Klein's first year as the head coach at UNLV, the Rebels improved their win total from the previous season from five to 11 and set a school record for goals scored with 38. The Rebels were 19-18-4 during Klein's tenure.

Klein's collegiate-coaching career began as a volunteer assistant at Arizona, her alma mater, during the 2006 season.

Klein also brings experience with the youth soccer ranks, having coached club teams and regional ODP teams during her tenures at UNLV and Arizona. She received her National "A" License in the summer of 2011.

She was a four-year student-athlete for the Wildcats from 2002-05 and was a team captain as a junior and senior. She helped the Wildcats capture their first Pac-10 Championship (2004) and was a starter on the 2005 squad that advanced to the third round of the NCAA Championship. Klein appeared in 78 games in her career, with 60 starts as a midfielder and outside back. Klein was also a member of the Arizona Heatwave in the semi-professional W-League from 2003-05.

Klein received her bachelor of science degree in biology from Arizona in May of 2006 and her master's degree in athletic administration at UNLV in May of 2011.

Jason Lockhart



USC women's soccer head coach Keidane McAlpine has chosen his second assistant coach, Jason Lockhart, to be a part of the new Trojan soccer dynasty for the upcoming 2014 season.

Lockhart saddles up for USC after previously serving under McAlpine at Washington State, where the Cougars advanced to the NCAA Tournament twice in his two-year span as volunteer assistant coach.

Head coach McAlpine and assistant coach Jen Klein are both looking forward to the addition of Lockhart to the Trojan coaching staff.

"Jason has a very good ability to simplify the game for players," McAlpine said. "His talent as a teacher will definitely help raise the standard of our team."

Under the command of McAlpine and his Washington State coaching staff, which included Klein and Lockhart, the Cougars tied the program record for victories with a 14-3-4 mark, while the team and players set or tied 27 school records. The Cougars finished the season ranked No. 7 in the nation defensively with

only 11 goals allowed. In 2012, the Cougars went 6-4-1 in Pac-12 play and finished up 12-6-2 overall.

Lockhart has coached at many levels. A few of his previous clubs include Birmingham United Soccer Association, where he worked alongside McAlpine. The two Alabama natives have known each other since childhood, and have climbed the coaching ranks through the club and collegiate coaching levels as both colleagues and as rivals.

"We have been friends our entire lives, and we started coaching together just after college with youth teams, and working in the same club team," McAlpine said. "It's special to have a friend and such a quality teacher of the game come with us from WSU to USC. There's a level of comfort there that can't be matched."
